### **Ram Madhav To Visit Bandipore On Sunday**

Srinagar: Bhartiya Janata Party national General Secretary Ram Madhav is all set to visit Kashmir on Sunday to offer condolence

to the bereaved family members of slain BJP leader from north Kashmir's Bandipora district Waseem Bari. Sources in the BJP tsaid that Madhav has confirmed his visit to Kashmir with a sole aim of visiting Muslimabad residence of slain Bari in Bandipora district. Later, Madhav will also meet party workers in Srinagar," they said, adding that the BJP General Secretary will reach Kashmir on Sunday morning and right away travel to Bandipora district. "A meeting with the BJP workers from Srinagar and other districts is also on cards with Madhav," sources said. # **Cases Surge As J&K Records 387 New Covid-19 Infections**

Fresh Cases Include 50 Security Men, 2 Doctors, Baby; 91 Discharged

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Friday recorded 387 Covid-19 cases, including 97 from Jammu and 290 from Kashmir valley and with this the number of cases in J&K went up to 9888. The fresh cases include 50 CRPF, SSB, BSF and army personnel, two doctors and a 8-months old baby.

Giving the breakup of the cases, officials said that Srinagar reported 94, Baramulla 36, Kulgam 33, Shopian 14, Annatnag 11, Kupwara 34, Pulwama 47, Budgam 6, Bandipora 8, Ganderbal 7, Jammu 23, Kathua 7, Ramban 11, Rajouri 51, Samba 1, Poomch 2, Doda 1 and Reasi 1.

According to Dr. G H Yatoo, Nodal Officer Coronavirus Control Measures at SKIMS Soura, out of 2659 samples which were processed at the viral diagnostic laboratory of the institute today, 132 returned positive for the virus.
