Covid-19 Death Toll Reaches 171

11 More Deaths In 24 Hours, J&K Sees Record Surge

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Saturday recorded eleven more Covid-19 related deaths, the highest single day spike in fatalities so far. The deaths-nine from Valley and two from Jammu, took the fatality count due to the deadly virus in J&K to 171. Also, 102 people have died in little over three weeks in J&K as the death toll stood at 69 on June 18.
