Pak Shells LoC In Poonch, Rajouri: Army

Jammu: Pakistani troops shelled forward areas along the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch and Rajouri districts on Monday, prompting strong retaliation by the Indian Army, a defence spokesperson said. The shelling from across the border at Shahpur, Kirni and Qasba sectors in Poonch and Sunderbani in Rajouri was "unprovoked" and in violation of the ceasefire agreement between the two sides, according to the official. The Pakistani troops first initiated ceasefire violation around 2.30 pm in the three sectors of Poonch by shelling mortars and firing from small arms. **● P-02**

Srinagar: An 8-year old girl died after she got strangulated in a home-made cradle in north Kashmir's vilgam area of Kupwara district on Monday. The girl was rushed to Public Health Centre (PHC) Vilgam where doctors declared her brought dead on arrival. Two-Year-Old Falls Into Tub, Dies

HC Quashes SFC Orders Disengaging Grading Assistants, Attendants

SRINAGAR: Observing Jammu and Kashmir High Court on Monday quashed two orders passed by Managing Director J&K State Forest Corporation in February 2012 by virtue of which grading assistants and attendants were disengaged, two years after they were appointed. The court had already stayed both the orders in March 2012, as a consequence of which the appointees were continuing to discharge their duties in the Corporation. Allowing a petition filed by aggrieved persons, a bench of Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey observed that the

principles of natural justice "appear to have been violated with impunity." "From the perusal of the pleadings placed on record by both the parties, it can be seen from a naked eye that no opportunity of being heard, as provided under the rules, appears to have been given to the petitioners before issuing the impugned orders of disengagement of (their) services which stood already regularized by the Corporation itself," court said. The petitioners, the court observed, have been simply thrown out by two orders of disengagement without following the due procedure of law, "with a premeditated design to divest them of **▶▶PAGE 02**

Corps Commander Level Meet Fails To Defuse LAC Tension

NEW DELHI: India on Monday pressed for an early and complete disengagement of Chinese troops from friction points in eastern Ladakh as their senior army commanders held a sixth round of talks that primarily focused on implementing a five-point bilateral agreement to ease the prolonged border standoff, government sources said.

The latest round of Corps commander-level talks that began at around 9 am in Moldo on the Chinese side of the Line of Actual Control (LAC) across India's Chushul sector in eastern Ladakh went on for over 12 hours and was still underway at 9 pm, the sources said.

It is learnt that the Indian delegation insisted on a time-bound implementation of the agreement finalised during the extensive talks between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi in Moscow on September 10 on the sidelines of a Shanghai Cooperation Organisation(SCO) meet. The Indian delegation is headed

Soldier Injured In Char-e-Sharif Gunfight

Twin Militant Attacks In Srinagar, Anantnag

SRINAGAR: An army man was injured Monday in an ongoing gunfight between state forces and militants in Char-e-Sharif area of Central Kashmir's Budgam district, prompting authorities to snap internet services in the district.

According to the officials, army's 53 RR, special operations group (SOG) of police and CRPF181 Battalion launched a cordon and search operation in Nowhar of Char-e-Sharif after receiving inputs about the presence of militants in the village.

As the joint team started advances, the militants hiding in the village opened fire upon them in a bid to break the cordon. In the initial exchange of fire, the official said a soldier was injured. He said the injured soldier was removed to army's 92 base Badami Bagh hospital for treatment.

"The joint team retaliated after coming under fire from the militants. The exchange of fire continued for some time," the official said. He said that the intermittent exchange of fire was going on. Covid-19 Claims 21 More Lives, J&K Toll 1026

SRINAGAR: At least twenty one people, including a Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personal succumbed to coronavirus in Jammu and Kashmir on Monday, taking the number of fatalities due to the deadly infection in the Union Territory to 1026.

While fourteen people died of coronavirus in Jammu division, seven others succumbed to the infection in Kashmir valley, officials said Monday.

Among those who died in Valley due to Covid-19 included a

75-year-old woman from Chanapora Srinagar who breathed her last at SKIMS Soura, a week after she was admitted to the tertiary care hospital, officials said.

They said four other persons also died at SKIMS Soura including a 65-year-old woman from Nehru Park, a 55-year-old woman from Larkipora

Anantnag, a 35-year-old from Rainawari here and a 37-year-old CRPF trooper from 35 battalion Humhama.

Officials said that two other deaths from Valley occurred at SMHS hospital and includes a 65-year-old from Salam **▶▶PAGE 02**

Journalist Summoned Over Story, Beaten In Police Station

SRINAGAR: Auqib Javeed, a young journalist has accused the cyber police in Kashmir of assaulting and harassing him over a story he had filed about alleged intimidation of social media users critical of the government by the police.

The story titled, 'The real cyber-bully: Police in Kashmir question Twitter Users' which appeared in 'Article 14' a New Delhi based web portal mentions about the actions taken by Cyber Cell of J&K Police against many social media users for their posts on Article 370, Internet ban and an alleged extrajudicial killing in Kashmir".



Auqib, an accredited journalist with Kashmir Observer, was verbally summoned by the Cyber Police station on September 18. According to his account of the

incident which was published by the "Article 14", Javeed states that since he was satisfied by his balanced and fair work, he informed about the incident to his colleagues at the Kashmir Press Club, where he is an executive member besides the editors of "Article 14".

He was accompanied by two fellow journalists to the police station. In the account, Javeed alleges that he was slapped twice by a masked cop outside the room of Superintendent of Police of the Cyber Wing, Tahir Ashraf Bhatti.

"As we entered the Cargo Centre, our phones were taken. We were frisked and allowed in... I was now anxious. **▶▶PAGE 02**

Centre Tells Apex Court

'Print Media Rarely Crosses Line, Digital Media Uncontrolled'

NEW DELHI: The print and electronic media rarely cross the line by the very nature of their composition but the digital media is completely uncontrolled and remains unregulated by and large, the Centre has told the Supreme Court.

The government said if the apex court considers it necessary to lay down guidelines for mainstream electronic and print media, it is the need of the hour that the exercise should start first with web based digital media.

In a fresh affidavit filed by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting the top court may leave wider issues to be decided the central govern-



ment and the competent legislature or start the exercise with digital media. The affidavit was filed in a pending matter in which the apex court is hearing a petition which has raised grievance over Sudarshan TV's Bindas Bol' programme whose promo had claimed that channel would show the 'big expose on conspiracy to infiltrate Muslims in government service'.

The Centre had last week filed a short affidavit in the matter and said that if the Supreme Court decides on the issue of media regulation then such an exercise should be undertaken with the digital media first as it has faster reach and information has the potential to go viral due to applications like WhatsApp, Twitter and Facebook.

The fresh affidavit further said: By the very nature of its composition, the print and electronic media would rarely cross the line which may need intervention of this courts frequently. As against that, by its very nature the web based digital media, by and large, remains unregulated.

PDP Leaders Meet For First Time After Aug 5, 2019

SRINAGAR- The Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) on Monday held a meeting of its senior leaders here for the first time since Jammu and Kashmir's special status was revoked by the Centre in August last year, the party said. The meeting was chaired by party's vice president Abdul Rehman Veeri in the absence of party president Mehbooba Mufti, who is under detention, at the PDP headquarters here.

The party held its first meeting post the release of party leaders who were detained in August last year when the Centre abrogated Article 370, a PDP spokesman said. The meeting was attended

by senior leaders of the party, including former ministers and legislators, he added.

Mufti, who is also a former chief minister, continues to remain in custody under the stringent Public Safety Act (PSA). She is currently lodged at her 'Fairview' residence on Gupkar road, which has been turned into a sub-jail.

Mufti and most other mainstream leaders, including former chief ministers Farooq Abdullah and Omar Abdullah, were taken into custody, and later booked under the PSA, on August 4 last year shortly before the Centre's move.

While the Abdullah father-son duo and most other mainstream leaders were gradually released from custody, the PDP

Thin Attendance As Schools Reopen In Kashmir

SRINAGAR: An extremely thin attendance was registered on Monday as the schools reopened after remaining closed since March owing to COVID-19 induced lockdown. "Schools are not for regular classes but consultation", Principal Secretary, School Education & Skill Development Dr Asgar Hassan Samoon said.

All educational institutions in the Kashmir valley were closed in March this year due lock down and restrictions imposed by the government due to COVID 19 pandemic.

Unlock 4 guidelines by the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) allow schools to partially reopen from



September 21, stating that students from Classes 9 to 12 will be allowed to visit teachers for a limited time to seek guidance. The guidelines said parent consent is mandatory,

and the relaxation does not apply to containment zones.

Militancy Incidents Down By Half After Art 370 Revocation: Govt

NEW DELHI: There has been a drastic decline in terrorist incidents in Jammu & Kashmir after the abrogation of Article 370 from the erstwhile state on August 5 last year, the Ministry of Home Affairs informed Parliament on Monday comparing the last two years' data.

The terrorist incidents from July 7, 2018 to August 4, 2019 (in 393 days) were 443 while the number from August 5, 2019 to August 31, 2020 (393 days) reduced to 206. Similarly, the number of stone pelting cases reduced from 703 to 310. A total of 54 civilians were killed from July 7, 2018 to August 4, 2019

while the number went down to 45 from August 5, 2019 to August 31, 2020, Minister of State for Home G Kishan Reddy informed the Rajya Sabha in a written reply.

As per the data shared by the minister, a total of 125 security personnel were killed in the 393 days before August 5 while the number reduced to 49 - almost one-third - during the same number of days after August 5.

The government on August 5, last year scrapped Article 370 from Jammu & Kashmir which gave it special status and later bifurcated it into two Union Territories - Jammu & Kashmir with an Assembly and Ladakh without one. **▶▶PAGE 02**
