### **Drone Shot Down Along LoC: Army**

Srinagar: A surveillance drone of Chinese make was on Saturday shot down by Army troops shortly after it crossed into this side of the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district, officials said. The DJI Mavic 2 Pro drone, fitted with cameras, was spotted hovering in air by the alert troops in Keran sector and subsequently shot down, the officials said. ### **Massive Forest Fire** Rages In Bandipora

Srinagar: A massive fire broke out in a forest near Khayar village of north Kashmir's Bandipora district on Saturday evening. Officials said that the fire broke out in compartment number 22 of Khuihama forest range during which dozens of trees got destroyed.

A police officer said that a motorcycle bearing registration number JK02BF-7299 met collided with a tipper bearing registration number JK01H-1255 at Manzgam road, leaving the biker dead on the spot and his pillion rider wounded. ### **Drugs Racket Busted In** Jammu. 7 Held: Police

Jammu: Seven people, including 2005 Delhi blast case, were arrested in connection with the seizure of 62 kg of heroin and opium last month near the Indo-Pak border here, police said on Saturday. The seizure was made on the intervening night of September 19 and 20 by a joint team of the Jammu Police and the Border Security Force (BSF) near the Budhwar Post, Inspector General (IG) of Police, Jammu Zone, Mukesh Singh, told reporters here. ### **Ladakh Records 28 New Covid-19 Cases**

Leh: With 28 fresh cases, the CO-VID-19 tally of the Union Territory of Ladakh has shot up to 5.840. an official bulletin said on Saturday. Ladakh has so far recorded 68 deaths due to COVID-19, while the number of cured patients has gone up to 4,984 with 82 people being discharged from various hospitals in the last 24 hours, the bulletin released by the Directorate of Health Services said. Of the new cases, 18 were reported from Leh district and 10 from Kargil district.

The bulletin said 72 patients were discharged in Leh and 10 in Kargil, bringing down the number of active COVID-19 cases in the Union Territory to 788 -- 650 in Leh and 138 in Kargil. ● P-02

Three more people succumbed to the deadly infection in Jammu division while one death due to coronavirus was reported in the Kashmir valley, officials said. Among the three victims from Iammu region, two were residents of Jammu district and one Doda.

"We will sacrifice every drop of our blood for our flag, country and motherland. Jammu and Kashmir is an integral part of our country, so only one flag can be hoisted in Jammu and Kashmir and that is the national flag," he said.

Raina said the saffron party will not tolerate such "nefarious designs" aimed at instigating the people of Kashmir.

"I warn leaders like Mehbooba Mufti not to instigate the people of Kashmir. We will not allow anyone to disturb peace, normalcy and brotherhood. In case anything wrong happens, she will have to face the consequences." he said. If Kashmiri leaders are feeling insecure in India, they can go to Paki-

stan and China, he added. Referring to the Centre's move to abrogate Article 370 on August 5

last year, Raina said no decision taken by the government can be reversed.

He said Article 370 gave rise to separatism, militancy and was instrumental behind thousands of killings.

"As the government has permanently scrapped Article 370, no power on earth can restore it. No power on earth can hoist any flag other than the national flag in Jammu and Kashmir," the BJP leader said. Raina also said that "conspiracies of the Gupkar Gang" would not be tolerated and anyone challenging the unity and integrity of the country would be jailed.

This time we have Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Home Minister Amit Shah and those conspiring against the country will not be forgiven. We will give our blood and our lives for our motherland and the tricolour, Raina, holding the national flag in his hand, told reporters here.

Referring to the National Conference and PDP leaders, he claimed that when they are in power, they praise India, but when out of power, they remember Pakistan and China.

They will not be allowed to take forward an anti-India agenda. Let them try, this Gupkar Gang is getting strengthened from six parties to 600, we will not allow them to fulfil their dreams. They are a bunch of power hungry people and the people of Jammu and Kashmir know them very well...," Raina alleged.

"What if Mehbooba does not hold the tricolour in her hand, there are crores of people in Jammu and Kashmir who love and respect the national flag from the core of their hearts," he said.

We will celebrate October 26, the day when Maharaja Hari Singh signed the instrument of accession, as 'Villai Diwas' like Diwali and freedom celebration," the BJP leader asserted.

on August 5 last year were rolled back.

She said she would hold the tricolour only when the separate flag of the erstwhile state is restored.

Prasad asserted that Article 370, which gave the erstwhile state a special status and was revoked last year, will not be restored.

It was removed following a proper constitutional process and both Houses of Parliament approved it with overwhelming numbers, he said. Revoking it was our commitment to the nation and people have appreciated it, he said

In many ways, Mufti has shown serious disrespect to the very image of India which the tricolour represents, he added.

The minister also hit out at other opposition parties, saying they have maintained a stony silence at her remarks showing serious disrespect to the national flag, even as they criticise the saffron party at the "slightest of issues".

"This is hypocrisy and double standard," Prasad said.

kutumbakam" or the world is one family, the culture of the country teaches it to worship both "shastra and astra" or sacred scriptures and weapons at the same time.

"This has taught us that the enemy can raise its head anytime, anywhere and we should be fully prepared to face any possibility. The ITBP is an important pillar of that preparedness of the country," Reddy said.

"The armies of some countries had a myth that they were among the powerful armies of the world, but during the developments in the past few months, the ITBP has broken that myth," he added. The country and its citizens are proud of the ITBP's valour and dedica-

tion, the minister said. The ITBP is the designated force to guard the 3,488-km-long Sino-India Line of Actual Control (LAC) that runs from Ladakh to Arunachal

Pradesh in the northeastern flank of the country. The Army and the border-guarding force are engaged in a military standoff in the Ladakh region for the past few months. The ITBP had sometime ago said it "fought the whole night" and gave a befitting reply to the Chinese PLA troops during a violent clash between the two sides on June 15-16.

Reddy said the force not only mans the borders and ensures the internal security of the country, but also protects its economic interests. "India is surrounded by a hostile neighbourhood and our enemy, time and again, puts obstacles to stop our economic development. When you defeat these designs of the enemy, you ensure the country's economic development," he said.

Reddy said the Narendra Modi government is "determined" to strengthen and "modernise" the force, and informed about certain sanctions given to it in the recent past.

"I am happy to inform that the ITBP has been given the approval by the Ministry of Home Affairs to establish 47 border posts, uniform special clothing and mountaineering equipment for high-altitude locations, latest weapons are being provided and work is on to prepare priority border roads for the force," he said.

The minister said the Centre had approved a budget of Rs 7,223 crore for the force for financial year 2019-20. "I assure you that there will be no dearth of funds for the ITBP," Reddy

ITBP Director General (DG) Surjeet Singh Deswal also spoke at the event as he lauded the bravery displayed by the troops recently in

Ladakh under "very challenging circumstances". Deswal said he toured the Ladakh border front recently and himself honoured the gallant personnel, while adding that recommendations have been sent to the government for awarding gallantry medals to

some of them who fought against the Chinese troops. The force has left no stone unturned to guard this border, faced with challenges of weather, low temperatures and oxygen levels and a dif-

Deswal said the force has finalised and sent to the home ministry a proposal for constructing "phase-2 of India-China border roads". "A proposal has also been sent to the high-level empowered committee for the creation of 18 foot-tracks in Arunachal Pradesh. We hope that the work on this will begin soon," the ITBP chief said.

He added that the force is providing better vehicles, bullet-proof jackets and helmets, clothing and ration to its troops on the border. New systems for better communication have been installed, Deswal said. The ITBP was raised in the aftermath of the 1962 Chinese aggression and it has a strength of about 90,000 personnel with 60 battalions

"We as a government are covering the situation in the Himalayas closely, and understandably. We certainly want to ensure that the situation doesn't escalate," the official said.

"These are all areas where we cooperate with the Indians on, and not just as it relates to the tensions in the Himalayas," the official said. India and China are locked in a bitter border standoff in eastern Ladakh since early May that has significantly strained the bilateral ties. Both sides have held a series of diplomatic and military talks to resolve the row. However, no breakthrough has been achieved to end the standoff.

China unsuccessfully attempted to occupy Indian territory on the southern bank of Pangong Lake in the last week of August.

In response to a question, the official, who spoke on the condition of anonymity, said that the US was having an ongoing dialogue with Indian about increased cooperation in Southeast Asia, and not simply about the South China Sea.

"And we encourage their involvement. That cuts across development investments, it cuts across security cooperation, and then it also involves presence. So, we welcome greater Indian participation in Southeast Asia across all three of those areas," said the official. The senior official's remarks came in the midst of a growing global

concern over China's expansionist behaviour. The evolving situation in the Indo-Pacific region in the wake of China's increasing military muscle-flexing has become a major talking

point among leading global powers. The US has been favouring making Quad a security architecture to

check China's growing assertiveness. China is engaged in hotly contested territorial disputes in the South and East China Seas. Beijing has also made substantial progress in

militarising its man-made islands in the past few years. Beijing claims sovereignty over all of the South China Sea. But Vietnam, Malaysia, the Philippines, Brunei and Taiwan have counterclaims. In the East China Sea, China has territorial disputes with Japan. The South China Sea and the East China Sea are stated to be rich in minerals, oil, and other natural resources. They are also vital to global trade. Although the US lays no claims to the disputed waters, it has challenged China's growing territorial claims in the South China Sea by deploying warships and fighter jets to assert freedom of navigation and overflight patrols in the strategically vital region

Chander of SaiPhagala, Sham Lal of Arnia, Gurbakash Singh of Bhour Camp Satwari, BishanDass alias Raju of Akhnoor, Ajeet Kumar alias Kala of Khour and Guru Partap Singh of TaranTaran ir adding that Ajeet Kumar and Dass were accused in the 2005 blast case. During investigation, it was found that Jash Raj Singh and Chander, at the behest of Lal, had gone to the zero-line on the International Border near the Budhwar post to collect the consignment dropped from across the border by unidentified Pakistani smugglers. Singh

Their suspicious movement was noticed and exchange of fire started at the spot, and these two persons, taking the advantage of darkness, managed to escape leaving behind the huge consignment which was recovered by the joint teams of police and the BSF, he said.

The Jammu police chief said it was completely a blind case and no lead was available as the recovery had taken place near the border fence and there was no information about the sender or the receiver. Working on technical and human intelligence, a special team of the police analysed old records and after hectic efforts busted the gang of international drug traffickers with the arrest of seven accused so

Both Dass and Ajeet had a history of drug cases and were earlier arrested in the 2005 Delhi blast case. Ajeet's brother, Sarfu is based outside India and is wanted in various heroin smuggling cases in Jammu and Kashmir, Singh said.

He said preliminary investigations revealed that this racket has two parts one based in India and the other based in Pakistan and Dubai. "On our side, there were three sub-groups working in tandem with each other. First group used to visit border villages to identify possible receiving points and then collect the consignment to deliver it to the second group based in Jammu, the main supplier who further dispatched the consignment to Punjab, where it was received and sold by the third group, the officer said.

Lal, who was found to be involved in drug cases in Punjab, was the assigned the task of identifying the location along the border for smuggling of drugs from Pakistan, Singh said.

He said Ajeet was behind a failed attempt to smuggle 11 kgs of heroin from the same sector in 2014 while another consignment of 10 kgs of heroin was smuggled through the sector to Punjab in early September. The IG said the Jammu police over the past one year has launched a war against drugs and efforts are on to identify and arrest the main suppliers to root out the drug menace.

Earlier, he said, 12 kgs of heroin was recovered about three months back from Rajouri district, while another consignment of three kg heroin was seized in the Mendhar sector of Poonch district a few days back. To a question, Singh said there is a possibility of terrorists using

Older adults with higher physical activity and lower sitting time have better overall physical and mental health, according to a new study from the American Cancer Society (ACS).

The study, appearing in the journal, CANCER, suggests that higher amounts of regular moderate- to vigorous-intensity physical activity (MVPA) and lower duration of sedentary time is associated with higher global mental and physical health for older cancer survivors and older adults, in general.

# Consuming dietary soy may reduce dementia risk: Study

Researchers have found that metabolite produced following consumption of dietary soy may decrease a key risk factor for dementia--with the help of the right bacteria.

The study, published in the journal Alzheimer's iamp; Dementia TRCI, reported that elderly Japanese men and women who produce equol--a metabolite of dietary soy created by certain types of gut bacteria--display lower levels of white matter lesions within

"White matter lesions are significant risk factors for cognitive impact levels of amyloid-beta dedecline, dementia and all-cause posited within the brain, it was asmortality," said lead author Akira Sekikawa from the University of Pittsburgh in the US.

# **Are You the 'Loud Minority'?**

There is a clear attempt to stereotype the activist as an unruly delinquent and thereby curb basic freedoms of political expression that unsettles those in power.

he Supreme Court of India recently, delivered its judgment in the case of Amit Sahni v. Commissioner of Police. The decision effectively transforms the "reasonable restriction" exception to Freedom of Speech and Expressionas the new norm, and conversely alters the right itself into an exception. This is stated to have wide-ranging repercussions as the court's wordings have given rise to problematic interpretations that could be adopted by the state in the longer run.

The grievance made in the petition was that the persons opposing the CAA and the NRC in the national capital had adopted a method of protest which resulted in the closure of public roads, affecting daily commute of passengers and causing grave inconvenience to the citizens residing in the nearby area. The petition argued that such encroachment by protestors into public spaces could not be permitted as it violated "public order".

The question before the courttherefore was on the point of "balancing of interests of the residents in the area and the passengers vis-à-vis the interest of the protestors to hold demonstrations". The court held that, "we have to make it unequivocally clear that public ways and public places cannot be occupied in such a manner and that too indefinitely". It further held that protests could be carried out only in "designated places". This wasreasoned as a "reasonable regulation" and not an "arbitrary exclusion".

The idea of restricting access to public spaces for protest by activists has been a colonial dream of the state. The petition before the court aimed at achieving the same. It was successful but, the larger question is, are we losing our legacy of a'protest democracy'? Not just in the context of the judgment in 'Amit Sahni' but as a larger political conspiracy in the recent past to close down streets, parks and playgrounds where citizens have found the comfort of a shared opinion in their fight against a common enemy.

At first look, the protest culture itse Standing in the heat, chanting, sloganeering, singing songs, dancing and demonstrating, looks like a futile exercise. The state is mighty afterall! Moreover, its actions are presumed to be constitutional in the eyes of law. Protests also look like a chaotic adventure by a group of anarchists whose main motive is to disrupt the system. They are irrational, disordered and a dysfunctional mob who have no respect for democracy. They are unruly and have an illusionary sense of being free thinkers, artists, libertarians, observ-

ers, intellectuals, academicians, etc. However, these notions about the nature of a protest and the motivation that drives the protesters are in line with the recent political attempt at stereotyping the activist. Majoritarian Politics has always been terrified by the ability of the people to command the streets. It's a colonial idea. The unmattering of the marginal voices and the delegitimization of a protest shows a larger political process that is at play. It starts with demonizing the idea of a protest and protesters by calling them

towards marginalizing and writing-off their voices in popular media. Many a time, slapping them with cases of sedition, criminality, violence, intimidation and imposing on them strict conditions for free movement. All this, even though the present governmentshows itself as followers of leaders like Gandhi, Bhagat Singh and Dr Ambedkar.

Protestors are now being termed as the "Loud Minority" - in line with the Richard Nixon rhetoric of the "Silent Majority" used during the 1969 Vietnam War. Daniel Q. Gillion in his book "The Loud Minority" goes on to characterize how activists are stereotyped as promoting the interests of only a small section of the community.

This mindset is, however, against the rich history of protest and dissent that civilizations across borders and philosophers like Gandhi, Thoreau, Martin Luther King Jr. and Chavez have propounded and celebrated. In his 'Letter from a Birmingham Jail', King Jr. quotes Socrates by saying, that it is "necessary to create a tension in the mind

unruly delinquents and generalizing the idea of a (of the people as well as the governments) so that individuals could rise from the bondage and half-truths to the unfettered realms of creative analysis and objective appraisal." He says that protests give rise to 'understanding and brotherhood'. He was inspired by Gandhi's civil disobedience and philosophy of non-violence. These philosophers and leaders believed and proved that 'norm shift' can only be brought by peaceful and direct action.

Simon Jenkins, a renowned British author, says, that, "streets are a sacred political space, the last resort and are liberty rampant. But they are consistently shown to be as licensed unreason". The status of public spaces in the history of political discourse, in every country across the globe, is symbolic and has a communicative value. Many a time, the ability to protest at a particular site is directly related to the communicative value of the protest. Judgments in foreign jurisdictions like 'Brown v. Tasmania' and 'Hague v. Committee for Industrial Organizations' go on to even legally recognize the special status of streets as public places and their significance in a protest.

The judgment in Amit Sahni grants arbitrary powers to the state and its authorities. They can now decide whether a protest site is a public place or not. It also grants them the power to allot 'designated spaces' for protest. Resultantly, these spaces will be far from the public eye. Use of established public spaces for assembly and communication between citizens on matters relating to important public questions will eventually wither awayand democratic freedom will be curtailed.

The judgment of the court, although cautiouslays down an alternative to physical protests in the form of online protests. However, dissent is more powerful when it is visible. Physical protests have a symbolic value and a visual impact. Streets are many a time, the only meaningful avenue for democratic expression.

Democracy must begin with ordinary people and must be centered around ordinary people. The present government's attempt to discredit social movements and protests as unorganized and led by incompetent organizations who are devoid of a clear message, is threatening. Protests on the streets allows for new political imaginations. It challenges the presence of elites in elections and pitches in for a Rule of Law and representative democracy. The question is, will protests ever be the same anymore?

t is a fact not so easily known, thus rarely acknowledged, that the British colonial project in India at one moment turned into an excavation of India's pasts. This excavation was aimed at exploring the arrival of various foreign people, cultures, religions and politics into the subcontinent. After all, the Indian peninsula had been the site of commercial, political and military incursions by the Portuguese, the Dutch and the Timurids since 1498. Surely, one reason for the excavation was that, as the latest foreigners to arrive in India, the British wanted a justification for their own arrival. The other reason is tied to the way in which the British saw themselves as heirs to the Romans.

Edward Gibbon published the first volume of his book The History of the Decline and Fall of the Roman Empire in 1776, the year Great Britain lost 13 of its colonies in America. All six volumes of the book came out by 1788 to tremendous acclaim and sales. A central theme in Gibbon's work was his quest for historical linkages between Pax Britannica – the period of British-dominated world order – and Pax Romana.

He provided the foundational stone for a theory that sought to legitimise British colonial enterprise as a successor to a great empire of the past that brought a long era of peace and prosperity for Europe in its wake. Even more influential, I would argue, is his exploration of the relationship between race and politics within the context of the Roman experience. This relationship was immediately employed in legitimising the British conquest of India.

### Series of scholar-warriors

The British formally began their imperial project in India in 1757 after the Battle of Plassey. In 1783, William Jones arrived as a sessions judge at Fort William in Calcutta. Over the next decade, he founded the new science of philology that combined linguistics with human migration patterns and mingling of races across the Indo-European region. He linked ancient languages and prehistoric migrations to the long history of foreign arrivals into India, a process that would culminate in the advent of the British presence in the subcontinent. He came up with a story that linked Greek, Latin and Sanskrit languages via a "common source" that "no longer existed". This "common source" was "conquerors from other

kingdoms in some very remote age".

By the early 19th century, a new generation of British officers became scholars of India's pasts. They imagined themselves as latter-day Alexander the Greats, amassing accounts of geographies, peoples and objects that connected India to the Greeks, and by extension to the Romans, of the past. Alexander Burnes, James Tod, Richard F Burton and Edward B Eastwick were most prominent among them.

They travelled between Kabul and Bombay and collected manuscripts, coins and copper utensils in order to establish how India came under Greek influence through Alexander the Great's conquest of the northwestern parts of the subcontinent. Their research focused on Greek and Roman trade with India, Alexander's conquest and the remnants of his armies that stayed back in the areas he had passed through.

They also looked into migrations from the Central Asian Steppe into the subcontinent and the relationship of all these developments to the evolution of languages, cities, religions and polities. The journals of the royal Asiatic societies of Bengal and Bombay published their findings on the presence of the Arya, the Indo-Parthians, the Indo-Bactrians and the "White Huns" in the Indian subcontinent – communities that had hints of a common Eurasian ancestry.

By the middle of the 19th century, a new generation of British historians took up the project of collating this raw data into historical treatises. HM Elliot and M Elphinstone were the forerunners in this generation. They were followed by Vincent Smith, Stanley Lane-Poole, Alexander Cunningham and RB Whitehead,

# Myth Of Muslims As 'Invaders'

among others. As the British colonial project expanded geographically – from Calcutta to Delhi, from Madras to Bombay and from Lahore to Peshawar – it delved deeper and deeper in time as far as excavation of India's pasts was concerned.

The roots of the Sanskrit language, the genealogy of the Aryan race, the origins of the subcontinent's "indigenous tribes" and the etymology of names of places show up regularly in the huge reams of colonial speeches, journal articles, travelogues, district reports, histories and commentaries of that era. Nestled in the middle of this project – and first highlighted in the middle of the 19th century – is the question of Muslim arrival in India.

Righting old wrongs
The East India Company defeated the Talpur Mirs in 1843 at Miani and conquered the princely state of Sindh. The conquest was cast as a corrective to the Muslim conquest of India – a move to emancipate the Hindus from the clutches of foreign Muslim rule going as far back as the early 8th century. Centred on the delta of the Indus River opening into the Arabian Sea, Sindh comprised a series of ports and large tracts of dry, desert-like terrain.

The state was a borderland for the East India Company at the beginning of the 19th century, though in contemporary maps it is surrounded by other parts of the subcontinent such as Gujarat, Rajasthan, Punjab and Balochistan. Indus, uncharted by the company till then, offered an upstream link from Bombay to Lahore, the capital of Ranjit Singh's Sikh kingdom. Through the deserts of Thar and Balochistan, Sindh linked India to the Durrani court in Kabul.

The company envisioned it as a necessary buffer between its long-established Bombay Presidency and Afghanistan (as well as French and Russian interests in Central Asia and Iran). More importantly, its scholar-warriors had already discovered that it was in Sindh that Muhammad bin Qasim had defeated the polity founded by the "White Huns" – remnants of the Indo-Bactrians – in 712 and pushed the Hindus of India into a millennium of domination by the Muslims. This discov-

ery was immediately put to political use.

Edward Law Ellenborough, governor-general of the East India Company at the time, dramatically brought back the "gates of Somnath" temple from Kabul to show to the Hindus that his company was there to counter Muslim tyranny. In his declaration of 1842 to "all Princes and Chiefs and People of India", he announced that the return of the spoiled remains of the temple to India avenged "the insult of 800 years...the gates of the temple of Somnath, so long the memorial of your humiliation, are become the proudest record of your national glory". Ellenborough's political strategy was to cast the company as a rectifier of the historical harm the Muslims had inflicted on Hindus. It mattered little that the "gates" had little to do with Somnath.

Charles Napier, a veteran military commander of imperial wars in Europe who was chosen by Ellenborough to conquer Sindh, was a deeply religious man. He had just arrived in India when he launched his campaign in Sindh.

He was convinced that the company had become beholden to commerce and had shied away from its divine mission. He saw the purported liberation of Sindh from its despotic Muslim rulers as his Christian duty. He called the Talpurs the "greatest ruffians" and "imbeciles" who possessed "zenanas filled with young girls torn from their friends" and treated the women in the harem "with revolting barbarity". The Talpurs, he said, were even prone to enjoying occasional "human sacrifice".

Napier's annexation of Sindh on February 17, 1843, was hailed by the British as a heroic event. Some of them likened it to the Battle of Plassey, the founding moment of British rule in India. "Since Clive's glorious victory at Plassey there has been nothing achieved by native or European troops in India at all to compare to it," wrote one. It was in his victory that stories about the advent of British rule in India – portrayed as the return of the long displaced and dominated Indo-European races – and those about the origins of Muslim rule in the Subcontinent, presented as domination by a foreign religious power, converged.

British quest for Muslim origins in India subsequently shaped the historical consciousness of native historians trained at University of Calcutta, Aligarh Muslim University, Maharaja Sayajirao University of Baroda and Osmania University. Shibli Nomani (1857-1914), Jadunath Sarkar (1870-1958), Syed Sulaiman Nadvi (1884-1953), RC Majumdar (1888-1980), Mohammad Habib (1895-1971) and BD Mirchandani (1906-1980) are some of the key historians who grappled with the question of Muslim arrival in the subcontinent as they endeavoured to find a nationalist response to colonial historiography.

Writing in journals such as Calcutta Review, Muslim Review, Islamic Culture and Indian Historical Review, many of them found their efforts to come up with an anti-colonial history clashing with colonial narratives about Muslim rule in India. They struggled to weave Muslim history into a nationalist narrative, given that Muslim rulers in the subcontinent had been shown by colonial historians to be despots of foreign origin who had demolished countless Hindu temples during their conquests and reigns.

Central to the argument about Muslims in India being religious invaders from outside was a particular text – Chachnama. It entered, in bits and pieces, into colonial historiography in the early 19th century. From Elliot to Elphinstone and Smith, the British historians writing on the history of Islam in India treated Chachnama as a book of conquest. Originally written in Farsi around 1220, it was a self-proclaimed translation of an 8th century Arabic history of Muhammad bin Qasim's campaign in Sindh. It describes events that preceded his conquest as well those that happened during his stay in this part of the world – a period stretching roughly over 60 years.

In the writings of Indian nationalist historians such as Sarkar and Majumdar, Chachnama and the figure of the outsider Muslim loomed large. Sarkar's lectures on Indian pasts – as well as his histories of Mughal India – took their cue from British historians and argued that India's conquest by "foreign immigrant"

Muslims differed fundamentally from all preceding invasions because of Islam's "fiercely monotheistic nature" – something that contrasted with polytheistic religious practices of pre-Islam India. Majumdar's treatment of the "Arab Conquest of Sind" presented the Muslims as conquerors by disposition who inevitably cast their covetous eyes on India after conquering Spain.

### Settlers, not conquerors

In contrast, a generation of Muslim scholars emphasised historical connections between Arabia and India that predate Muhammad bin Qasim's arrival. Nomani highlighted those connections in his biographies of the Prophet of Islam and other key figures of early Islam. Between 1882 and 1898, he produced a wide variety of historical essays on the early Muslim state in India, highlighting the earliest links between the two regions. Nadvi and Abdul Halim Sharrar wrote histories of Sindh in the early decades of the 20th century in the same vein. Habib, a Marxist historian, forcefully argued in his 1929 essay Arab Conquest of Sind that Muslims arrived in India not as conquerors but as settlers.

These Muslim historians, however, could not get past Chachnama's categorisation as a book of conquest. Even after 1947, historians working across South Asia and the United Kingdom have produced further investigations into the history of Muslim pasts in Sindh, treating this ancient text the way the colonial historians did. UM Daudpota, Nabi Bukhsh Khan Baloch, Mubarak Ali, HT Lambrick and Peter Hardy have all written numerous articles and books on Chachnama. They all agree that Sindh's military conquest by Muhammad bin Qasim heralded Muslim arrival in India.

Yet this origins narrative was based on the false categorisation of Chachnama. It reads unlike any other history of conquest written in Arabic or Farsi at the time. It incorporates much that is of little relevance to Muhammad bin Qasim's invasion and occupation of Sindh. It is less a history of the 8th century and more a political theory for the 13th century. Its claim to be a translation of an earlier Arabic text is, in fact, meant to evoke the memory of nearly 500 years of Muslim presence in Sindh as an era of cohabitation and accommodation.

It offers a history of both land and sea links between ports in Sindh and Gujarat – such as Daybul, Diu and Thane – and the Arabian ports of Aden, Muscat, Bahrain, Dammam and Siraf. It draws upon texts in Farsi, Pahlavi and Prakrit that explore thousands of years of connections between Oman and Yemen on the one hand and Sri Lanka and Zanzibar on the other. In Chachnama, these relationships span trade, marriages, settlement, languages and customs and they render it impossible to create and maintain a dichotomy between the Muslims and the Hindus as being merely rivals.

The book has been deliberately misappropriated and misread by British colonial historians since the early 1820s. They changed the "other" with the "outsider" in their work and a history of belonging became a history of exclusion.

We need to encourage the study of languages such as Sanskrit, Pahlavi, Farsi, Arabic, Sindhi and Gujarati in which these sources were written so that we do not end up misreading and misinterpreting them as we did in the case of Chachnama. These studies can enable our students to look at medieval pasts in all their complexity. We also need to equip our institutions to promote new methods of researching and writing history.

We need all this to stem the erasure of nuance and diversity in historical accounts, a practice that started with colonial historiography and continues in our postcolonial present. The last footnote in Bede's dissertation offers a strong rationale for working against this erasure.



# **India Bans Imported Goods** At Army Canteens, List **May Include Liquor: Report**



**NEW DELHI:** The government has ordered 4,000 army shops in the country to stop buying imported goods, according to a document reviewed by news agency Reuters, a move that could send an unwelcome signal to foreign liquor firms such as Diageo and Pernod Ricard.

Army canteens sell liquor, electronics and other goods at discounted prices to soldiers, ex-servicemen and their families. With annual sales of over \$2 billion, they make up one of the largest retail chains in India. The October 19 internal order from the defence ministry said that in future, "procurement of direct imported items shall not be undertaken".

The order said the issue had been discussed with the army, air force and navy in May and July, and was aimed at supporting Prime Minister Narendra Modi's campaign to promote domestic ucts at defence stores.

goods. A defence ministry spokesman declined to comment.

The order did not specify which products would be targeted. However, industry sources said they believed imported liquor could be on the list.

Imports make up around 6-7% of total sales value in the defence shops, according to an August research column of the government-funded Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses (IDSA). Chinese products such as diapers, vacuum cleaners, handbags and laptops, account for the bulk if it, it said.

Reuters reported in June that Pernod and Diageo had briefly stopped receiving orders for their imported brands from such government stores. Diageo did not respond to a request for comment, while a Pernod spokesman declined comment.

While imported liquor sales at defence stores generate only about \$17 million in annual sales, the order would send a negative signal, said an executive whose company sells prod-

# First-Of-Its-Kind Flash Flood **Warning System For South Asian Countries Launched**

**NEW DELHI:** The first-of-its-kind system for South Asian countries that will provide alerts for flash floods 6-24 hours in advance was launched at the India Mete-

orological Department (IMD) on Friday. The World Meteorological Department (WMO) has entrusted India with the responsibility of the Regional Centre of South Asia Flash Flood Guidance System for coordination, development and its implementation.

India also shares cyclone warning alerts with neighbouring countries.

The system will enable the member countries -- India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Nepal and Bhutan -- issue impact-based forecasting of floods which are very sudden and of short duration at watershed and also city level, IMD director general Mrutunjay Mohapatra said at the online launch.

Representatives of the member countries attended the event.

Flash floods are highly localised events of short duration with a very high peak and usually have less than six hours between the occurrence of the rainfall and peak flood. There is a general lack of flash



flood warning capabilities and capacities among countries across the world.

Recognising that flash floods have a particularly disastrous impact on lives and properties of the affected populations, the 15th WMO Congress had approved the implementation of a Flash Flood Guidance System (FFGS) project with global coverage.

The system has been developed by the WMO Commission for Hydrology, jointly with the WMO Commission for Basic Systems and in collaboration with the US National Weather Service, the US Hydrologic Research Centre (HRC).

The IMD has highly advanced capabilities with respect to computing pow-

er, numerical weather prediction, vast observational network (ground, air and space based), and an internationally acclaimed weather forecasting system.

It has tested the performance of the system during recent monsoon seasons in the pre-operational mode and the flash flood bulletins were issued to national hydrological and meteorological services in the region for its validation, said BP Yaday, a senior scientist at the IMD.

The system has in-depth science, dynamics and diagnostics to provide guidance for the possible occurrences of lash floods at local level, Yadav added.

"The guidance for flash floods in the form of Threats (6 hours in advance) and Risks (24 hours in advance) will be provided by Regional Centre to National Meteorological & Hydrological Services, National and State Disaster Management Authorities and all other stakeholders for taking necessary mitigation measures to reduce the loss of life and property in the South Asian region countries of India, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal and Sri Lanka," Mr Mohapatra said.

# **Mehbooba Mufti Disrespecting** National Flag; Art 370 Won't **Be Restored: Prasad**

Shankar Prasad on Saturday lashed out at former Jammu and Kashmir chief minister Mehbooba Mufti, saying her remarks were "downright denunciation" of the national flag's sanctity. The minister added that Article 370 will not be restored.

On Friday, addressing reporters for the first time since her release from a 14-month detention following the abrogation of Article 370 in August last year, Mufti had said she would only hold the national flag after the flag of Jammu and Kashmir was restored.

In an act seen as defiance, the flag of the erstwhile state was prominently placed on a table

nion Law Minister Ravi the saffron party at the "slightest of issues".

"This is hypocrisy and double

standard," Prasad said. During her presser, Mufti had accused the BJP of "looting" the dignity of the people of Jammu and Kashmir.

"We had acceded to a liberal, democratic, secular India. Let me tell them that we are not comfortable, we are incompatible with today's India where minorities and Dalits are not safe and where they tried to disrespect us by looting our dignity," she said.

The BJP had demanded Mufti's arrest for her "seditious" remarks. The party said "no power on earth" can either hoist



in front of the PDP president, along with that of her party, during the press conference.
