CRPF Man Shoots Self Dead In Sopore

SRINAGAR: A Centre Reserve Police Force (CRPF) trooper committed suicide by shooting self with his service rifle in Wadoora area of north Kashmir's Sopore on Wednesday morning.

Officials said that a trooper identified as Head Constable GD Rajan Kumar hailing from Chatiana Odisha shot himself dead while he was on duty at 92 BN CRPF Headquarter Wadoora. Soon after the incident, his

colleagues rushed to the spot and found him lying in a pool of blood, they said.

A police officer also confirmed the incident and said a case has been registered in this regard and further investigation have been taken up. The officer said it was not immediately known what forced the soldier to take the extreme step.

Electric Shock Kills Labourer In Hajin

SRINAGAR: A 25-year-old labourer died after receiving a high-voltage electric jolt here in Hajin area of Bandipora district on Wednesday afternoon.

Imtiyaz Ahmad Bhat of Wadipora Handwara received a high-voltage shock after coming in contact with a live-wire at Kousam Bagh Hakabara of Hajin, reported news agency GNS.

Bhat, as per reports, was immediately removed to nearby hospital for treatment. However, the doctors there declared him brought dead.

Meanwhile a police official has confirmed the incident and said that a case has been registered in this regard and further investigations taken up.



Couple, 10 Others Injured In Pulwama Blast

SRINAGAR: A couple and a nonlocal were among twelve civilians injured on Wednesday in a grenade blast in Kakpora area of south Kashmir's Pulwama district. Around 5:40

pm Wednesday, suspected militants lobbed a grenade towards the bunker of CRPF 41 battalion in Kakpora town of the district, officials said. However, the grenade, they said, missed the intended target and exploded on

the road leaving at least a dozen people injured, including a couple and a non-local All the injured were removed to

the nearby hospital for treatment. However, three of them identified as Habibullah Sheikh. Mohammad Shafi Dar and his wife Raja Begum, all residents of Kakpora were

referred to Srinagar's SMHS hospital for treatment. The other injured persons have been identified as Adil Ahmad of Samboora, Amir Ahmad of Uttar Pradesh, Mushtaq Ahmad of Anantnag, Bashir Ahmad Dar, Ghulam Nabi Sheikh. Abrar Dar, Bashir Ahmad, Muhammad

reports said the area was placed under cordon to nab the attackers. However, no arrests were made when the

"Investigation is in progress and officers continue to work to establish the full circumstances of this crime. Area has been cordoned and search in the area is going on," he added.

SRINAGAR: A sero survey conducted in Kashmir has found that two out of every five people in the valley have developed antibodies against the coronavirus.

The survey carried out in October found the highest prevalence of antibodies in Pulwama at 43.1 per cent and the lowest in Kulgam at 28.5 per cent.

"We conducted a sero survey in all 10 districts of Kashmir which has revealed that nearly 39 per cent of the 6,200 persons tested negative but had developed antibodies," said Dr Muhammad Salim Khan, head of community medicine at Government Medical College here.

He said the survey was carried out in October on the heels of an exercise in Srinagar which had thrown up almost identical results

While nearly 2,400 people were "Anantnag (35.2 per cent), randomly tested in Srinagar, 400 Baramulla (34.6 per cent), Shopian pandemic.

people each were tested in the rest (31.9 per cent) and Kulgam (28.5 of the nine districts as part of the per cent) recorded lower than average prevalence of antibodies among the surveyed population,"

he said. The first step survey was conducted in Srinagar in June. It showed the presence of antibodies in 3.8 per cent of the population.

"The trend has been encouraging but it does not mean that (SARS-2) COVID will be defeated at a certain level of the population developing the antibodies. The scientific community is also wary of using the term herd immunity in the absence of a vaccine," Khan cautioned.

The Kashmir valley has recorded 62,520 COVID-19 cases so far including 1,063 deaths. While 57,532 people have recovered, there are 3,925 active cases.

Srinagar is the worst affected district in Jammu and Kashmir with nearly 20,000 people infected and 399 deaths due to the

Young Techie's 'Mission Robotics' Is Ending Kashmir's Remote Reliance

s a campus routine, engineering students of Kashmir would rely on remote relief till recent past to complete their project work.

But such desperate degree completion bids-promoting a culture of foreign reliance—would often prove a bumpy ride for aspiring techies. When Tahir Showkat Bazaz became mindful of this despairing

dependence, he decided to make Robotics a feasible project for Kashmiri students.

A merit-holder who clinched



gold upon completing his engineering degree in 2015, this 28-year-old Kashmiri techie brought smiles to distressed students with his proactive self-starting endeavour.

"Engineering students of Kashmir would prefer to go outside for their project work due to lack of expertise and proper guidance in the valley," Tahir says, as we meet in his office chamber filled with projects and tech vibes.

"Those who couldn't afford to go outside ended up facing a tough time. But now, Kashmiri students have guidance available back home." That guidance has already created



a sweeping campus change, as since 2015, Tahir has successfully made more than 500 innovative and exciting projects with his students. He has also conducted several Robotics workshops in various schools. Some of his prominent projects

include Wireless Robotic Hand, Smart 'Tashnear', Tricopter, Medicine Box, Smart Pen, 3D Printer-based abrasive Jet, Bot, Miners Helmet, and AI based Home Automation System.

"Despite being a topper in my academic career," Tahir, who has won awards in Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India, says, "I always knew that I had to assist my tribe struggling to submit their cru-
