LG Announces Rs 28,400 Cr Industrial Scheme For J&K

Says Scheme To Provide Employment To 4.5 Lakh People

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir administration on Thursday announced a new industrial developmental scheme (IDS) with a total outlay of Rs 28,400 crore to encourage new investment and to take industrial development to the block level.

"In a major decision of far-reaching consequence, Government of India has approved a new Industrial Developmental Scheme for Jammu and Kashmir," Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha announced at a press conference here.


"The scheme will go a long way in ushering an era of socio-economic development of the region and for catering to the aspirations of people," he said.

Sinha said that this scheme is from the period of date of notification up to the year 2037 with a total outlay of Rs 28,400 crore.

He said that it is for the first time any industrial incentive scheme is taking development to the block level and added that it will promote far-flung areas of Jammu and Kashmir.

"The scheme will encourage new investment, substantial expansion and also nurture the existing industries in the Union territory. It will also provide employment to 4.5 lakh people besides leading to equitable, balanced and sustainable socio-economic development of the region," the LG said.

He said that manufacturing and service sector units in the union territory will benefit and noted that the scheme visualises a larger role of Jammu and Kashmir in the Indian economy.



LAWAYPORA 'ENCOUNTER'

Will Give Answer At Appropriate Time: LG Says 'Good News' On High Speed Internet Restoration Soon

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Thursday said he will give an "appropriate answer" after looking into the facts in connection with December's Lawaypora 'encounter' in Srinagar in which three alleged militants were killed by government forces.

He said that he is looking into the facts that have come to him. "All facts are coming to us. I am personally looking into the issue. At appropriate time, we will give you an appropriate answer," Sinha said in response to a question at a press conference.

A journalist had asked him whether the government will order a probe into the

Lawaypora 'encounter' and return the bodies to the families in a bid to do justice. The families are demanding the return of bodies and probe into the encounter.

Government forces had claimed to have killed three local militants in the encounter. Their families, however, said the youths killed in the encounter were civilians.

J&K Civil Services Cadre Merged With AGMUT

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir cadre of IPS, IAS and Indian Forest Service (IFoS) was merged with the AGMUT cadre on Thursday and its officers will now be posted by the central government.

According to a notification signed by President Ram Nath Kovind and issued by the Ministry of Law and Justice, the members of IAS, IPS and Indian Forest Service for the existing cadre of Jammu and Kashmir will now become part of AGMUT (Arunachal, Goa, Mizoram and Union Territories) cadre.

Now, the officers of the erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir cadre can be posted to Arunachal Pradesh, Goa, Mizoram and any union territory. Necessary modifications may be made in the corresponding cadre allocation rules by the central government.

The notification said the officers borne or allocated to AGMUT cadre shall function in accordance with the rules framed by the central government.

The move comes over a year after the Centre abrogated Jammu and Kashmir's special status under Article 370 of the Constitution and bifurcated the state into union territories in August 2019.

Centre Asks States, UTs To Get Ready For Vaccine Supply

NEW DELHI: The Union health ministry has informed states and union territories that they are likely to receive the first supply of COVID-19 vaccine shortly and asked them to remain prepared to accept these consignments.

In a communique, the ministry said vaccine will be supplied to the identified consignee points of 19 states and union territories -- Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar,

Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Gujarat, Haryana, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Telangana, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal -- by the supplier.

Army Defuses Mortar Shell In Uri

Govt Bans Poultry Import Into J&K

SRINAGAR: Amid the looming threat of bird flu as reported in the neighbouring states, the Jammu and Kashmir government on Thursday imposed a ban on import of poultry items into the Union Territory.

In an order issued on Thursday, Navin K Choudhary, Principal Secretary to the government announced a complete ban on import of poultry and unprocessed poultry meet for any purpose into J&K with immediate effect, till January 14.

"In the wake of spread of bird flu in neighbouring states of J&K as a measure of abundant precaution and in view of declaration of whole J&K as "Controlled Area" for bird flu disease. Government of UT J&K imposes complete ban on import of live birds including poultry and unprocessed poultry meet for any purpose into the union territory of J&K with immediate effect," the order reads.

It further adds that the decision on the import ban will be reviewed based on the evolving situation.

The order on banning poultry imports comes a day after government said on Wednesday that no cases of bird flu or avian influenza has been detected in the union territory and urged people not to panic or stop using poultry products, even as it issued an advisory to poultry owners and dealers for the prevention of the spread of the disease. ● More On P6

Caved-In Roofs Expose Chinks In Kashmir's Architectural Armour

As 'blizzard' thawed and snow-laden rooftops caved in to shock of Kashmir, octogenarian carpenter Abdul Khaliq Zaz stood vindicated.

"Wousta' (Master) Khaliq had been predicting this 'pack of cards' moment for Kashmir's new-age architecture for many years now.

"Our idea of living has drastically changed," said the old-timer sitting in his downtown home Srinagar. "Unlike our forefathers, our idea of construction has now become very cosmetic. But in an unpredictable place like Kashmir, such concept doesn't work. It just took a few days of snowfall to bust the make-believe facade of our homes."

On January 6, roofs of many houses

caved-in, sending shockwaves across the valley. Viral visuals of snowbound and buried houses panicked many people, who drove out, with spades and shovels, on a desperate snow-clearance drive. "Last year, the untimely snowfall damaged our trees," Khaliq continued. "And this year, this heavy snowfall exposed the delicate reality of our houses. These uncertain weather patterns were always there. That's how winter used to be in Kashmir. But akin to unexpected floods which caught government of the day pants down in 2014, this year's vintage snowfall exposed our misplaced priorities. It's clear that Kashmiris are investing more in show than in safety. And in a place like Kashmir, this can prove very dangerous." ● More On P6
