Covid Cases Spike For 3rd Day In Row

173 New Infections, One Death Reported In 24 Hrs

SRINAGAR: The spike in the Covid-19 cases continued for the third consecutive day on Friday as Jammu & Kashmir reported 173 new novel coronavirus infections while there was one death due to the virus in the last 24 hours. 23 of the fresh cases were reported from Jammu Division and 150 from Kashmir Valley, taking the overall case tally to 326653. There was one death, from Jammu division, reported due to the pathogen during the time, they said. So far 4412—2167 in

Jammu and 2245 in Kashmir have succumbed to the virus as per official data.

Providing the district-wise details, the officials said that Srinagar reported 80 cases, Baramulla 12, Budgam 21, Pulwama 7, Kupwara 9, Anantnag 6, Bandipora 2, Ganderbal 8, Kulgam 5, Shopian 0, Jammu 2, Udhampur 0, Rajouri 4, Doda 10, Kathua 0, Samba 0, Kishtwar 0, Poonch 3, Ramban 2 and Reasi 2.

IT 'Surveys' Newsclick, Newslandry In Tax Case

NEW DELHI: The Income Tax Department, on Friday, conducted separate "survey operations" on the premises of online news portals Newsclick and Newslandry in New Delhi, officials said.

The operations are being conducted to verify certain tax payment details and remittances made by the organisations, they said.

Some documents have been found and these are being studied, the officials said.

In a survey operation, which is carried out under provisions of section 133A of the Income Tax Act, 1961, tax officials cover only the business premises of an assessee and those linked to it and not their residential [More On P10](#)

NEW DELHI: A special National Investigation Agency (NIA) court in New Delhi on Friday sentenced seven-year rigorous imprisonment to a Pakistani national for being part of Laskar-e-Taiba (LeT), the agency said.

Identified as Mohammad Amir, along with three others had illegally infiltrated into Indian territory from Pakistan along with weapons, ammunition, and other war-like stores with an intention to carry out a terrorist attack at different locations in India in the directions of their handlers based in Pakistan, NIA said in a statement.

From 9/11's Ashes, A New World Took Shape. It Did Not Last.

In the ghastly rubble of ground zero's fallen towers 20 years ago, Hour Zero arrived, a chance to start anew.

World affairs reordered abruptly on that morning of blue skies, black ash, fire and death.

In Iran, chants of "death to America" quickly gave way to candlelight vigils to mourn the American dead. Vladimir Putin weighed in with substantive help as the U.S. prepared to go to war in Russia's region of influence.

Libya's Moammar Gadhafi, a murderous dictator with a poetic streak, spoke of the "human duty" to be with Americans after "these horrifying and awesome events, which are bound to awaken human conscience."

From the first terrible moments, America's longstanding allies were joined by longtime enemies in that singularly galvanizing instant. No nation with global standing was

cheering the stateless terrorists vowing to conquer capitalism and democracy. How rare is that?

Too rare to last, it turned out. Civilizations have their allegories for rebirth in times of devastation. A global favorite is that of the phoenix, a magical and magnificent bird, rising from ashes. In the hellscapes of Germany at the end of World War II, it was the concept of Hour Zero, or Stunde Null, that offered the opportunity to start anew.

For the U.S., the zero hour of Sept. 11, 2001, meant a chance to reshape its place in the post-Cold War world from a high perch of influence and goodwill as it entered the new millennium. This was only a decade after the collapse of the Soviet Union left America with both the moral authority and the financial and military muscle to be unquestionably the lone superpower.

Those advantages were soon squandered. Instead of a new order, 9/11 fueled 20 years of war abroad. In the U.S., it gave rise to the angry,



aggrieved, self-proclaimed patriot, and heightened surveillance and suspicion in the name of common defense.

It opened an era of deference to the armed forces as lawmakers pulled back on oversight and let presidents give primacy to the military over law enforcement in the fight against

terrorism. And it sparked anti-immigrant sentiment, primarily directed at Muslim countries, that lingers today.

A war of necessity — in the eyes of most of the world — in Afghanistan was followed two years later by a war of choice as the U.S. invaded Iraq on false claims that Saddam Hussein was hiding weapons of mass destruction.

President George W. Bush labeled Iran, Iraq and North Korea an "axis of evil."

Thus opened the deep, deadly mineshaft of "forever wars." There were convulsions throughout the Middle East, and U.S. foreign policy — for half a century a force for ballast — instead gave way to a head-snapping change in approaches in foreign policy from Bush to Obama to Trump. With that came waning trust in America's leadership and reliability.

Other parts of the world were not immune. Far-right populist movements coursed through Europe. Britain voted to break away from the European Union. And China steadily ascended in the global pecking order.

President Joe Biden is trying to restore trust in the belief of a steady hand from the U.S. but there is no easy path. He is ending war, but what comes next?

In Afghanistan in August, the Taliban seized control with menacing swiftness as the Afghan government and security forces that the United States and its allies had spent two

decades trying to build collapsed. No steady hand was evident from the U.S. in the harried, disorganized evacuation of Afghans desperately trying to flee the country in the first weeks of the Taliban's re-established rule.

Allies whose troops had fought and died in the U.S.-led war in Afghanistan expressed dismay at Biden's management of the U.S. withdrawal, under a deal President Donald Trump had struck with the Taliban.

THE 'HOMELAND'

In the United States, the Sept. 11 attacks set loose a torrent of rage. In shock from the assault, a swath of American society embraced the us vs. them binary outlook articulated by Bush — "Either you are with us, or you are with the terrorists" — and has never let go of it.

You could hear it in the country songs and talk radio, and during presidential campaigns, offering the balm of a bloodlust cry for revenge. "We'll put a boot in [More On P10](#)

Blocked Drain Inundates City Locality With Filthy Water

SRINAGAR: Due to blockade of drainage system at Ziyarat Madin sahib in Hawal Srinagar, stench and garbage spilling all over the road and into the premises of houses have created health problems for residents while the concerned department is doing nothing to give a respite to the people.

Residents said that it has become difficult for them to spend time even inside the houses as "The foul smell emanating from the drain has made our lives hell. Even children are not able to concentrate on their studies".

According to the locals, the presence of high-tension lines over the drain possesses another threat to their lives in the area. The wires according to them are attached with the iron electric poles which often lead to electric shocks.

"The choked drain and high-tension wire can cause a major tragedy in the area," the residents said.

The locals said that filth and dirty water are all over on the link road and in the premises of the houses. "This is because of the faulty drainage system that the area has. The water from the drain has spilled all over the road and it has now become impossible to even walk on it," said locals.

"The drain has become a den for dogs and rats. Often dead dogs and birds are spotted in the drain. It becomes difficult to

breath near the drain," said Umar Ahmad, a shopkeeper near Ziyarat Madin sahib.

"We have many times requested the concerned authorities to undertake cleaning of the drains, however no action has been taken so far," he added.

The state government had taken hundreds of drainage schemes in Kashmir over the years. Most of them could not be completed due to "lack of funds and coordination" between various departments.

"The Roads and Buildings department has been constructing roads in various areas without ensuring drainage system. The restoration of drainage system and road macadamization should have been done simultaneously," one of the local said.

However, the officials of SMC and City Drainage said that this drain does not come under their domain.

The UEED Superintendent Engineer said that this is not our project; it is a part of NBCC's sewerage line whose sewerage filtration plant is inactive at Noorbagh

"NBCC team has been directed to inspect the spot so that further action can be taken to repair the drain.

Project engineer NBCC Suhail Ahmad said that this drain is already blocked however the industrial units in the area are using this drain illegally.

Locals have requested concerned officials to look into the matter at an earliest site, so that locals may not suffer any more.

BEIJING- In a major shift in its policy, China today advocated tripartite talks with the

Participation of Pakistan, India and Kashmiri representatives to hammer out a lasting solution to the 53-year old Kashmir dispute. It hoped that India also involve the

International community as well to peacefully resolve the Kashmir issue.

Of late, China had been suggesting bilateral talks between India and Pakistan to solve the issue. This virtually lent an endorsement of India's insistence on bilateral approach

"The Pakistani side has already said that they are willing to talk about any issue. May be the Indian side could also include the Pakistani side in the talks," Chinese Assistant Foreign Minister Wang Yi said while commenting on the recent talks between India and the Hizbul Mujahideen which excluded Pakistan.

Expounding China's stand, Wang noted that the Kashmir issue has long stalemated. "I think the only way out is the peaceful settlement with the help from the international community," he said, indicating a possible change in Beijing stand.

India has firmly ruled out third party involvement in the resolution of the issue.

China's official media has come out with a series of articles recently, saying that the Kashmir issue involves three parties: India, the Kashmiri people and Pakistan!

"What is more important right now is that the two sides should find a way to really work it out. As a neighbor to India and Pakistan, China will only make positive efforts to help you and not to the contrary," Wang said.

"As neighbor to both India and Pakistan, China's position is very clear: we wish the two sides could 'sit down and talk so that this issue could be worked out through peaceful means," Wang said.

"China does not wish to be the mediator between the two countries nor I think does India wish to have any third party to get involved as a mediator," he said.

"But we do wish to see that you two sides could sit down and have talks. I believe the peaceful settlement of this issue will not only reduce tension there which will do, good not only to the two countries but also to the development of South Asia," he said.

Commenting on China's stand on terrorism, Wang said that as a principle, the Chinese side stands firmly against any form of international terrorism.

'Woman Can't Be A Minister...
They Should Give Birth: Taliban

Days after the Taliban announced its all-male cabinet of the new Afghanistan government, the radical-Islamist group on Friday said that women can't be made ministers and they should rather give birth.

When asked on women not being included in the new government, Taliban spokesperson Sayed Zekrullah Hashimi said, "A woman can't be a minister. It is like you put something on her neck that she can't carry." "It is not necessary for women to be in the cabinet - they should give birth. Women protesters can't represent all women in Afghanistan," Hashimi added.

However, Hashimi also said that the organisation 'doesn't consider women as half.' "What kind of half? The half itself is misdefined here. The half means

here that you keep them in the cabinet and nothing more. And if you violate her rights, not an issue," he said.

At least 14 members of the Taliban's interim government are on the UN Security Council's terrorism blacklist, including acting Prime Minister Mullah Hasan and his both deputies. Specially designated global terrorist Sirajuddin Haqqani, who carries a reward of USD 10 million US bounty on his head, is the acting interior minister.

The 33-member interim Cabinet includes four of the five leaders known as the "Taliban Five" who were once held at the Guantanamo Bay prison. The Afghan Cabinet members are expected to take oath on September 11, the day marking the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks.

However, the Taliban leaders said it is not final.

Iraq Doubles Iranian Pilgrim
Numbers For Arba'een

Iraqi authorities have decided to double the number of visas issued for Iranian nationals heading to the holy city of Karbala to commemorate Arba'een, the 40th day after the martyrdom anniversary of Imam Hussein (AS), the third Shia Imam.

The media bureau of the Iraqi prime minister's office said in a statement that Mustafa al-Kadhimi had ordered officials to increase the quota for pilgrims from 40,000 to 80,000, including 60,000 for Iran.

Iraq had initially permitted entry to 30,000 Iranian pilgrims provided that they travel by air.

"By God's help and through commitment to health protocols, the numbers of confirmed coronavirus cases will decline and Iraq will once again receive guests from all over the world," it added.

For the second year in a row, Iranian pilgrims have been barred from traveling by road to neighboring Iraq for the annual Arba'een pilgrimage.

Officials in southwestern Khuzestan province have announced that no Iranian pilgrims would be allowed through Chazabeh and Shalamchah border crossings into Iraq this year.

Likewise, local authorities in Iran's western Ilam province have closed the busy Mehran border crossing point.

Last year, Iraq banned foreign pilgrims traveling to the country for Arba'een in light of the coronavirus pandemic.

Every year on Arba'een, millions of people from around the world flock to Karbala. Large groups of mourners travel on foot toward the holy city to take part in the largest annual Islamic gathering on earth. The ceremony falls on September 27 this year.

Imam Hussein (AS) and his 72 companions were martyred in the Battle of Karbala in southern Iraq in 680 AD after fighting courageously for justice against the much larger army of the Umayyad caliph, Yazid I.

Iraqi PM Kadhimi to visit Iran on Sunday

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Kadhimi will visit Tehran over the weekend to discuss a range of issues, including bilateral relations and regional developments, with senior Iranian officials, Iraqi media outlets reported Thursday.

Kadhimi, heading a high-level government delegation, is expected to arrive in the Iranian capital on Sunday, they said.

It would be Kadhimi's first visit to Tehran since Ebrahim Raeisi was sworn in as Iran's new president.

On August 5, Raeisi told his Iraqi counterpart Barham Salih that Iran wanted a powerful and strong Iraq and was determined to further improve relations with Baghdad.

Divided, Bruised US Marks
9/11'S 20Th Anniversary

WASHINGTON: Americans mark the 20th anniversary of 9/11 on Saturday with troops finally gone from Afghanistan, but national discord -- and for President Joe Biden, political peril -- are overshadowing any sense of closure.

A whole generation has grown up since the morning of September 11, 2001.

In the interim, Al-Qaeda founder Osama bin Laden has been hunted down and killed. A towering new sky scraper has risen over Manhattan, replacing the Twin Towers. And less than two weeks ago, the last US soldiers flew from Kabul airport, ending the so-called "forever war."

Yet 9/11 never fully went away.

The Taliban who once sheltered bin Laden are back ruling Afghanistan. The mighty US military has been humiliated. In Guantanamo Bay, accused 9/11 mastermind Khalid Sheikh Mohammed and four other men continue to await trial, nine years after charges were filed.

Even the full story of how the attack came to happen remains secret. Only last week did Biden order the release of classified documents from the FBI investigation over the next six months.

Monica Iken-Murphy, who lost her 37-year-old husband Michael Iken in the World Trade Center, says this will be a "heightened" anniversary for many Americans.

But for her, as for many other survivors, the pain has never wavered.

"I feel like it just happened," she told AFP.

- 'Honor and memorialize' - Same as every year, simple, heart-wrenching ceremonies will unfold at each of the three places where Al-Qaeda hijackers crashed packed airliners, striking the cultural, financial and political hearts of the United States.

Ground Zero in New York was where the majority of the approximately 3,000 fatalities, including people from all over the world, were killed in the initial explosions, jumped to their deaths, or simply vanished in the inferno of the collapsing towers.

At the Pentagon, an airliner tore a fiery hole in the side of the superpower's military nerve center.

And in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, the third wave of hijackers crashed into a field after passengers fought back, sending United 93 down before reaching its intended target -- likely the US Capitol building

in Washington, a short flight further on.

Biden and First Lady Jill Biden will stop at each of these places on Saturday to "honor and memorialize the lives lost," the White House said.

- Afghanistan haunts anniversary -

Biden planned for this to be a pivotal day in his nearly eight-month-old presidency.

Taking over from Donald Trump in January, with the country still reeling from a Trump mob's assault on Congress, he promised Americans unity; exiting Afghanistan against the background of the 9/11 anniversary was going to be a big part of that.

Where Trump had promised the Taliban a deadline of May 1 for US troops to leave, Biden changed the pullout date to September 11 itself.

Even if he backtracked to a less politically sensitive cut-off of August 31, he clearly meant to own both the withdrawal and the anniversary.

However, instead of presiding over a moment of unity, Biden will traverse a country angry about the chaotic Kabul evacuation and stung by the broader realization of failure and defeat. AFP

Imported Frozen Food May Play Role
In Emergence Of Covid-19: Research



Imported frozen food may play a role in the emergence of SARS-CoV-2 in China, said a recent research conducted by British and Chinese scientists and published in US magazine Science.

The researchers reviewed the SARS-associated coronavirus and discussed possible animal origin of the novel coronavirus, reaching the conclusion that "animal-to-human transmission associated with infected live animals is the most likely cause of the Covid-19 pandemic," according to the study report titled "The

animal origin of SARS-CoV-2."

"However, the massive scale of cold-chain supply ... suggests that frozen susceptible-animal carcasses, either for human or animal consumption, should not be discounted as playing a role in the emergence of SARS-CoV-2," read the report published in late August.

The report noted that the outbreak of the African swine fever virus, which had led to a severe shortage of pork products in China in 2019, increased wildlife-animal contacts, since

China imported other meat such as poultry, beef and fish products from international markets in response to the short-fall, the Xinhua news agency reported.

"The resulting increased trade of susceptible farmed animals and wildlife could have brought humans into more frequent contact with meat products and animals infected with zoonotic pathogens, including SARS-CoVs," it said, pointing to reports of Chinese patients who had contact with imported frozen foods, and of SARS-CoV-2 "apparently identified from frozen food, packaging, and storage surfaces."

The scientists also called for international anti-virus cooperation, saying "humanity must work together beyond country borders to amplify surveillance for coronavirus at the human-animal interface to minimize the threat of both established and evolving variants evading vaccines and to stop future spillover events." IANS

Palestinians Hold 'Day Of Rage'
Solidarity Protests For Escapees

Beita, Occupied West Bank - Palestinians across the occupied West Bank and East Jerusalem are gathering for a day of rage on Friday in support of the six Palestinian prisoners, who escaped from an Israeli prison, heeding the call of Hamas and other Palestinian resistance groups.

They are also protesting against the punitive measures that the Israeli jail authorities have imposed on imprisoned members of the Islamic Jihad, another group active in the Gaza Strip, in the wake of a brazen escape from one of the country's most secure prisons.

Several relatives of the escaped prisoners have been arrested, including three people on Friday morning, as part of an Israeli manhunt to capture them. The six men tunneled out of the high-security Gilboa jail on Monday, triggering celebration and solidarity protests in the Palestinian territories.

Israeli forces were on their second-highest level of alert on Friday, below declaring a state of emergency, prepared for protests in the occupied Palestinian territories and possible riots within Israeli jails.

More than 100 Palestinian protesters moved towards the valley below the illegal Israeli settlement of Evyatar which is constructed on agricultural land expropriated from the villagers. On the hill above, groups of Israeli soldiers monitored youths who burned tyres and threw stones.

Periodically, drones flew over the young men, dropping tear gas on them, while others buzzed close above taking pictures.

Later on Friday, the Red Crescent reported more than 30 injuries in Beita and Beit Dajan near Nablus. An ambulance was

also hit by Israeli soldiers.

"It is our duty as Palestinians and activists to support the escaped prisoners," Abu Rahme told Al Jazeera. "It is very good news that they escaped and we all support them."

Muhammad Khabeisa, who has lost agricultural land to the settlement of Evyatar, told Al Jazeera his whole village backed the escaped prisoners.

"The prisoners in Palestinian jails are longing for freedom. They want to live their lives. They are not ordinary criminals, but patriots fighting for freedom," he said.

He added: "The Israelis have put Palestinians in prison with the occupation of their land. When the Palestinians take up arms, the world calls us terrorists and when we lay down our arms and resist peacefully, the Israelis kill us."

"And even when we don't protest peacefully, they take our land. What can we do?" Khabeisa said.

The Israeli high-handed measures, which various rights groups say amounts to collective punishment, have already led to the burning of cells and riots within the prisons in the last few days.

At least 100 people were wounded on Wednesday evening after the Israeli forces fired live ammunition and used tear gas at solidarity rallies in several cities in the West Bank.

Frustrated at their ability to track down the escaped prisoners and fearing more such attempts, the Israel Prison Services (IPS) broke up groups of Islamic Jihad prisoners and forcibly removed them from their cells, transferring them to other prisons.

Angry prisoners responded by setting fire to prison cells in several Israeli jails which prompted the IPS to send in the notorious Masada prison unit, known for its brutality, to quell the riots and shift individual prisoners to other jails.

Bahrain: Gulf Air Announces
Direct Flights To Tel Aviv
From Sept 30

Starting September 30, the Bahrain's flagship carrier plans to operate two flights a week to Tel Aviv.

As the national carrier of the Kingdom of Bahrain, we take great pride in supporting our leadership and Kingdom in their role of preserving peace and prosperity in the region. We hope this is merely the beginning of developing further opportunities," remarked Captain Waleed Al Alawi, Gulf Air's Acting CEO.

The announcement of the destination follows several agreements signed last year between Bahrain and Israel, including civil aviation.

Afghans Fear For Jobs And Money After Taliban Takeover

As a nurse at one of Kabul's main hospitals, Latifa Alizada was the breadwinner for her family, providing for her three young boys and unemployed husband.

Now -- since the Taliban rolled into Afghanistan's capital -- she too is jobless, and worried about the future.

The 27-year-old left her role at Jamhuriat Hospital because the Taliban said salaries would not be paid, and imposed rules that would force her to wear a face veil and be segregated from male colleagues.

"I have left my job because there is no salary. There is no salary at all," she said, holding the hands of two of her boys who chewed on sweetcorn cobs.

"If I go there, they say 'do not work with this style of dress. Do not work with men. Work with women'. This is impossible," she told AFP at a street market in Ka-

bul. "For us, there is no difference between men and women, because we are medical workers."

Afghans like Alizada worry about what lies ahead under the Taliban.

Food prices have gone up at markets, the cost of fuel has risen and there are fewer opportunities to make money.

The UN this week warned prices for essential goods were soaring in Afghanistan, adding: "There are fears of food shortages, higher inflation, and a slump in the currency all resulting in an intensification of the humanitarian emergency across the country."

Many government services are no longer functioning, while the international community -- which has long propped up the aid-dependent economy -- hesitates over funding Afghanistan.

Cash in short supply



In some sectors that are operating, the Taliban have offered wildly different salaries.

A former customs official, who did not want to be named for security reasons, told AFP he had worked at the Spin Boldak border crossing with Pakistan for more than seven years.

Under the previous government, he earned about \$240 per month, but the Taliban said they would

pay him just \$110.

"It is up to you if you want to continue your job, or quit," the Taliban told him, he said.

The official said he resigned after weighing up his salary against the cost of the long commute to work.

The sight of big crowds queueing to get into banks to access cash is now commonplace across Afghanistan. The country's central bank only

has access to a fraction of its usual financing, cut off from the international banking system and access to the country's foreign currency reserves.

It means cash is in short supply and the Taliban are enforcing a withdrawal limit of \$200 per person each week.

In the capital on Wednesday, about 150 men jostled in the midday sun outside a branch of Kabul Bank, where government employees under the last administration held accounts.

An armed security guard clutched an electric cable to use as a whip in case the crowd grew too boisterous as they queued for one of the two automated teller machines (ATMs).

Abdullah told AFP he travelled overnight from the northeastern province of Takhar, which borders Tajikistan, to get to the branch at the crack of dawn -- and he was still at the back of the queue at noon. AFP

UAE Lifts Travel Ban On Jabbed
Residents From India, Pak

The United Arab Emirates said on Friday residents who had been fully vaccinated with a shot approved by the World Health Organization could return as of Sunday from a list of previously suspended countries including Bangladesh.

Dubai, one of the UAE's seven emirates, is due to open the Expo 2020 world fair on Oct. 1 after a year-long delay due to the pandemic. The regional business and tourism hub is relying on the fair to give its economy a boost.

Organisers had previously said they expect remaining UAE flight restrictions imposed to curb coronavirus infections to be lifted in time for Expo 2020.



Countries from which residents can now fly into the UAE are: India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Namibia, Zambia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Uganda, Sierra Leone, Liberia, South Africa, Nigeria and Afghanistan.

Approval must be sought from the UAE government to return, and various PCR tests must be taken, the UAE's National Emergency Crisis and Disaster Management Authority said on Twitter.

During his visit to IICT, Advisor interacted with the Junior/Senior Craft instructors of Handicrafts and Handloom Department who are undergoing Skill Up-gradation and Capacity Building Training at the Institute.

Advisor also interacted with another group of Handloom weavers who are undergoing Skill Up-gradation Training organized by Silk Technical Services Centre (STSC), Central Silk Board, Jammu in association with IICT to upgrade their skill and give them necessary inputs on designing and other related subjects.

Speaking on the occasion, Advisor said that the skill development is important for exposing the artisans to the newer techniques and adopting latest designs to cater to the new market trends. He said that weavers should be made aware of the blending technique of pashmina and silk.

Advisor was informed that the introduction of Jacquard and Dobby techniques will be beneficial for the weavers and will be helpful to modify the designs for better returns and customer satisfaction.

While reviewing the progress of Testing, Certification and Labelling of Hand-knotted Carpets under Geographical Indication of Goods Act, the Advisor was informed that orders for testing equipments and other related items have already been placed by the Institute and Development of Cloud Based QR Code Management System is also in progress.

It is pertinent to mention here that IICT shall be introducing QR Code mechanism, first of its kind in the Country, for the purpose of Testing and Certification of Hand-knotted Carpets produced in Kashmir under Geographical Indication of Goods Act 1999.

This QR Code along with 'GI' logo shall be printed on a unique destructible label. By virtue of this QR Code mechanism, the customer would be able to check and verify requisite details of carpet with the help of Smart Phone before purchasing the same just to confirm its genuineness/authenticity along with other related parameters of carpets.

A brief Power Point Presentation on the overall working of QR Code mechanism and its features was also made by the Institute.

Advisor said that the QR code will go a long way in checking the machine made and fake goods that are being sold in the name of Kashmir craft. He said that customer satisfaction should be the motive of the department and



every effort should be made so that only genuine craft is sold.

He further added that Kashmir enjoys a prominent position on the world map of exports. However, over the past few years, machine made and fake goods are being sold in the name Kashmir handicrafts which are detrimental to the future of the craft sector. He said that the introduction of QR code will facilitate the artisans and weavers to avail testing, certification, and labelling facility for authentication of pashmina products.

To ensure long term survival of the Kashmir craft sector, Advisor said that QR code will go a long term in this direction and will restore its exclusivity, elegance and traditional splendour for which it is known internationally.

The Advisor also directed the officers to promote and publicise this technique so that the message reaches to every potential customer and they will adopt this technique while purchasing.

During his visit to Pashmina Testing Laboratory, Advisor was briefed about its overall working which was recently transferred to Handicrafts and Handloom Department (Kashmir), Advisor was given demonstration on functioning of different equipments of the centre.

He took a first hand account of the process of testing of the fibre up to the end product. He directed the officers to follow the entire process meticulously so that only genuine craft reaches to the customer.

It is important to mention here that Pashmina Laboratory is first of its kind in the country, which is conducting testing of GI certified Pashmina Shawls. The Advisor was apprised that Up-gradation of Pashmina Laboratory has been initiated by way of procurement of OFDA, SEM and other sophisticated equipments necessary for catering to the huge demand of testing and certification of Pashmina Shawls under GI Act.

During his interaction with Directors and other officers, the Advisor was intimated that Minimum Support Price for GI certified Pashmina Shawls and Hand-knotted Carpets has been fixed by the Committee constituted by the Government for the purpose and the same has recently been notified for strict implementation in letter and spirit.

Dr Samoon Holds Meeting

SRINAGAR: Principal Secretary, Skill Development Department, Dr Asgar Hassan Samoon, on Friday convened a meeting regarding implementation of COVID Customized Crash Course in Jammu and Kashmir.

Pertinently, this innovative training programme has been initiated by Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE) for Corona warriors to meet the deficit of skilled healthcare professionals and augment existing healthcare system across India.

In this regard, Jammu and Kashmir has been allocated 2500 targets under PMKVY 3.0 Centrally Sponsored State Managed Component. However, the training of COVID warriors has already been started in the UT under Centrally Sponsored Cen-

tre Managed Component.

During the meeting, State Engagement Officer of National Skill Development Corporation (implementing agency of MSDE), made a PowerPoint presentation on COVID Crash Course guidelines.

It was decided in the meeting that the National Health Mission will be the TP for the programme, targets will be allocated to medical colleges, paramedical colleges, CHCs and PHCs. Candidates will be given classroom training for 21 days which will be followed by 90 days on-the-job training in hospitals. Candidates will be provided stipend during On-the-job training (OJT) and will be designated as Covid Warriors.

Candidates moving to other districts, other than their home district will be given boarding and lodging payouts.

Faith in Modernity

Vernacular Islam in the War on Terror

The demands to prove that God exists and Islam is true are not particularly challenging, as long as the one who demands has a coherent definition of proof. But just because we can rationally explain Islam as true, it does not mean that we can then easily persuade people to change their convictions. Perhaps radical scepticism, like atheism, has always been a persistent phenomenon across generations. However, there is something specific about the way contemporary modern Muslims have started to adopt this sceptical stance towards Islam, with many losing their religion entirely. That specific context is linked to the development of the global War on Terror and the rise of the vernacular Islam discourse.

The discourse gained traction in the decades following 9/11. In Southeast Asia, particularly the region of Indonesia-Malaysia-Singapore, the immediate policy adopted by Muslim communities was to distance themselves from 'those bad Muslim terrorists'. This policy suggested Southeast Asian Muslims embrace a more culturally-informed and presumably more nationalistic Muslim identity, with a very noticeable anti-'Arabisation' stance. Vernacular Islam offers a discourse that suits this political agenda since in this paradigm, Islam does not need to be confirmed outside of Muslims' living realities. Statements such as: "If Islam is inherently violent, then we would all already dead since there are seven billion Muslims in the world" are examples of this; Muslims need not explain or propagate Islam, they can prove their humanity by living as 'normal' people. Yet, these rhetorical one-liners are now gradually becoming a permanent argument

To clarify, this article does not problematise all knowledge producers who pursue scholarships along the path of vernacular Islam. The political use of vernacular Islam might be diverse and take different forms to suit the needs of different Muslim societies. However, as Muslims, we should be clear on the way it can fundamentally affect, if not drastically alter, our belief system.

The Patriarchy in Property Rights Culture

PATRIARCHY, like any other forms of injustice feeds itself on the detritus of disinformation: by twisting the truths and realities. Unjust societies have a default embedded paraphernalia in place to reproduce themselves in new forms. Such societies incubate the culture of silence over telling issues to the point that they become non-existent or non-issues. One such issue which by the dent of our collective disservice has metamorphosed into a non-issue in Kashmir is the question of women's property rights or the rights of inheritance. Women, over the ages have either been conditioned not to seek her share in property or the subject of women's property rights has been stigmatised into non-existence.

Womenfolk, today are challenging stereotypes and reclaiming their agency in realms which hitherto were monopolised by men. However, even in the present times, women seem to be inheriting genetic docility when it comes to the question of property rights. Inheritance rights of women guaranteed by Islam long usurped by the patriarchal ghost don't even exist in name; nor is any data available on the subject which makes the case even worse.

While our society keeps strict and detailed manuals of expectations that women must fulfil without fail; educating them about their property rights in particular and other array of rights is apparently designed subversive. In fact, women are conditioned or (precisely) indoctrinated to forgo her property rights in the name of some constructed sense of feminine generosity and benevolence. While women breaking the silence over the injustice is bound to offend the patriarchal sensibilities, this topic remains nearly untouched in routine conversations, Friday khutbas, public debates, media and every other platform which could prove to be icebreakers in this regard.

Islamic legislation in this respect is not only comprehensive but based on justice. It provides

for the rights of inheritance for both men and women in a way that maintains social equilibrium. The force with which these rights were at first pronounced in Surah Nisa of Quran was subversive to the existing system of inheritance which was managed by men and favourable to men alone. As the verse goes, "men shall have a share in what parents and kinsfolk leave behind,

and women shall have a share in what parents and kinsfolk leave behind, whether the property be small or large- a determinate share" (Qur'an, 4 : 7). Further in verse 32 of the same chapter, economic rights of both men and women have been ascertained as, "men shall have a benefit of what they earn and women shall have a benefit of what they earn".

The aforementioned verses are followed by many other allied verses which lay down the legal framework for inheritance. Surprisingly, in more cases than one, female heirs receive a larger share of property than their counterparts. It is a subject which escapes our notice partly because of tainted social-construction of the subject and partly owing to our fragmented and irresponsible understanding of religion. Islamic legislations aim at ascertaining the overall wellbeing of its adherents which by default includes economic well-being but the entire structure of rights has been foreshadowed by androcentric propensities of the society.

Islam came as a liberatory force for women and toppled male-controlled economic system of that period in favour of women. The whole concept of women's rights of inheritance was alien to the society of 7th century which adhered strictly to the system of male primogeniture.

Being a Muslim majority society, we seem to have deeply cultivated an unjust system against the equitable spirit of our religion. Unfortunately, lavishing our life-time earnings in ostentatious marriages still finds more meaning with us than upholding the rights of an already marginalised section of our society. We have reversed the sacred law quite conveniently and established a system of injustice where women are devoid of cultural and economic capital guaranteed to them by their Maker.

Palestine: An Open-Air Museum Of Colonialism

Palestine has been turned, brutally, into a permanent museum of colonialism whose doors should have closed long ago.

On a recent visit to Palestine (I belong to a category of Jordanian Palestinians who can visit Palestine using an Israeli-issued ID card), a Palestinian friend of mine in Ramallah invited me to drive with him to Bethlehem. Thirty minutes into the trip, we stopped at an Israeli checkpoint, pulling into a huge queue of cars. The place was engulfed by an apathetic silence, perhaps indicative of how normal the situation was for those experiencing it. I, however, felt increasingly impatient, and I asked my friend if it would take too long before we were allowed to move. My friend responded, rather sarcastically, "This is Palestine. You can never predict when to move or to stop. People have lost any sense of what a meeting time means. You arrive when you arrive."

Welcome to Palestine – an open-air museum of colonialism.

For most people nowadays, colonialism is part of a bygone era. The majority of the world's population has no first-hand experience of it, and many cannot imagine what it means to live under total foreign control. Today we have museums of colonialism, where people can go to learn about how this form of rule affected natives' freedoms to live, to move, to speak, to work, and even to die peacefully. We live (supposedly) in a postcolonial world, and museums of colonialism serve to transport visitors back to a cruel era, granting them a glimpse of the damage this type of governance wrought on native communities.

What if, however, there were an actual place in our world today where colonialism and post-colonialism co-existed? Herein lies the sad, almost incomprehensible Palestinian contribution to the museum industry. If museums of colonialism reimagine the past in a modern setting, Palestine is both past and present – a colonial and postcolonial reality. In Palestine, there is no need to create a museum of colonialism: the whole country functions as such.

At any museum, you can expect to be able to explore different sections on different themes. The same holds true in Palestine – it has various sections, each displaying a different layer of colonialism. There is the West Bank, where you can see illegal Israeli settlements, expropriated land, a separation wall, and a



physically controlled population. Then there is Gaza, where open-air museum meets open-air prison, as two million Palestinians have been living under an Israeli blockade for more than 15 years. And if you are more into surveying a surreal case of colonialism, then head to Israel proper and find out how Palestinians who stayed in historic Palestine after the foundation of Israel live. There, you will learn about stolen houses, demolished villages, second-class citizens, and institutionalised racism.

Open-air museums seek to give visitors a direct experience of what it was like to live in the past. When I tell foreign friends that settler-only roads surround my tiny village, Burin, located a few kilometres southwest of Nablus in the West Bank, they respond with a disbelieving gasp. For many, it is inconceivable to imagine colonial-era conditions in our time, and yet they have been the status quo in Palestine for decades. People who would like to learn about colonialism need look no further than Palestine. It is colonialism incarnate.

Recognising 21st century Palestine as an open-air museum of colonialism casts the longstanding Palestinian-Israeli conflict in a different light. During the latest war in Gaza, some supporters of Israel legitimised its use of force by noting that any sovereign state would have reacted similarly to defend itself had it been under rocket fire from another state. Hamas launched rockets into Israeli territory, so this logic goes, and so Israel has a right to fight back.

This repeated argument ignores one crucial reality of the situation: Gaza is not a state. The West Bank

is not a state either. In fact, there is no Palestinian state. The conflict between Israelis and Palestinians is not one between two sovereign states. Rather, it is a conflict between a colonised people and their coloniser.

Framing Palestine as a colonial question is essential to understanding the peculiarity of the Palestinian condition. For many people around the world, Palestine is an enigma. How is it that for so long Palestinians have been stuck in a situation that is seemingly so unchangeable, fixed, intractable? Statelessness, uprooting, refugeehood, and resistance have practically become permanent descriptors of Palestinians. The conflict between Palestinians and Israelis has evolved into a cornerstone of our modern soundscape – something always happens there, except what happens never brings about any serious change to the status quo.

If Palestine is often viewed as a persistent dilemma whose resolution is long overdue, it is because Palestine is more of an anomaly than an enigma. Palestinians have not enjoyed the kind of history that most people in the colonial era have. In most cases, the story of former colonies followed a linear path: colonialism, anti-colonial struggle, and then independence – a new nation-state. This pattern was so forceful and the defeat of colonialism so successful that the last few decades have witnessed the emergence of a powerful new field of intellectual inquiry aptly named "postcolonial studies". Ironically, one of the grand masters of this field was Palestinian – the late Edward Said.

Not so for Palestinians. Unlike other would-be nations in the Mid-

dle East, such as Jordan, Iraq, and Syria, Palestine did not witness an end to a British or French Mandate that would lead to the formation of an independent nation-state. Rather, the termination of the British Mandate of Palestine in 1948 led to what Palestinians view as another form of colonialism.

The Zionist movement, which would form Israel and result in the destruction of Palestinian society and the ethnic cleansing of Palestine (a series of events known in Palestinian historiography as the Nakba, or Catastrophe), has successfully managed to halt the linear progression of Palestinians' path to self-determination. Both before and after 1948, Palestinians have been struggling to resist first, British and then, Zionist colonialism; realise their dream of a free, independent state; and cast off their own specific, multilayered experiences of imperialism.

Put bluntly, Palestinians have yet to enter the postcolonial world order. As individuals, they live in the 21st century, but as a stateless nation, they are still captive to the pre-1948 colonial moment. This is the anomaly of Palestinian time: as Columbia University professor Joseph Massad characterises it, Palestine can be understood as a "post-colonial colony", a region where two periods, two world views, two eras, fiercely collide. This is why it functions as an open-air museum of colonialism – it is at once past and present, with the exploitative policies and practices of colonialism on perpetual display.

It is dangerous to view Palestine as solely a human rights issue – it is drastically more. Palestinians are a living demonstration of what colonialism looks like. They simultaneously belong and do not belong to the postcolonial order. For them, 1948 is not just a memory – it is an ongoing reality, a moment in time that has been stretched to define who they are, and who they are not. Palestine has been turned, brutally, into a permanent museum of colonialism whose doors should have closed long ago.

Social Media: Youth and Narcissism

Is the use of social media associated with superficial relationships and loneliness, or with an increase in self-esteem and social skills? As smartphones became more affordable, we are seeing a dramatic shift in how young people access and use media technologies and content. Smartphones have virtually permeated all strata of global society in the last decade

Never before have had young people so many chances to perfect their public image. They can, for example, edit their digital profiles and selfies indefinitely before posting them to the Internet or sending them to friends. Do they become more self-aware as a result of this ability, or do they become narcissists? In recent years, a plethora of social media platforms have emerged in rapid succession. Even a behemoth like Facebook must do everything possible to avoid losing its young users to other emerging apps. These developments raise a slew of concerns. Is the use of social media associated with superficial relationships and loneliness, or with an increase in self-esteem and social skills? As smartphones became more affordable, we are seeing a dramatic shift in how young people access and use media technologies and content. Smartphones have virtually permeated all strata of global society in the last decade.

While previous generations of teenagers developed dexterity in self-presentation and self-disclosure primarily through offline means, the smartphone generation prefers to use social media to aid in the development of these skills. In fact, one in every three adolescents prefers to communicate via social media rather than face-to-face. What could explain why adolescents prefer to communicate via social media, even about private matters? In short, this preference is due to the affordances of social media, which provide adolescents with an enhanced sense of control—or, more accurately, the illusion of control. The affordances give them the impression that they have control over who they interact with, how and when they interact with them, and whether or not they reveal their identity. This sense of control, in turn, makes them feel more secure and self-assured on social media than they do in real life. And this sense of control is especially important during adolescence, because adolescents on their way to autonomy can be uncertain about a variety of things.

Every now and then, we hear about user data or personal information being misused. Most teens, like adults, are well aware that social media threatens their privacy, but they continue to post pictures on social media. This contradictory behavior is referred to as the 'Privacy Paradox.' The privacy paradox focuses too much on informational privacy when another type of privacy may better explain teens' (and adults') online behavior. That is referred to as psychological privacy—our ability to control when, what, with whom, and how we share information about ourselves. Social media, to a much greater extent than offline communication, allows users to control when, what, and how they express themselves, as well as to whom. Every teen has a tendency to become more and more autonomous for deciding their life's decisions on their own, the affordances of social media may reduce teens' informational privacy, but they also provide them with enhanced psychological control over their communication and allow them to demonstrate their



autonomy—which helps to explain social media's enormous appeal for teens. Access to information can also increase a teen's sense of control. Never before have had the adolescents access to such a wealth of information about the formation of identity, intimacy, and sexuality. They can research their idols, make online friends, and find support in self-help groups. Furthermore, because (most) social media platforms are scalable, teens can select the audience with whom they communicate.

Every day, teens spend a significant amount of time on social media, and accordingly numerous studies have been conducted to investigate the impact of social media on teens and adults. Apart from a vast number of harmful effects, researchers have identified narcissism as one of the most prevalent effects found in the majority of young people. Narcissism is characterized by a high level of public self-awareness. Narcissists are overly concerned with how others perceive them, and they will go to great lengths to be regarded favorably. Narcissism is a personality trait that everyone possesses to some extent. At its most severe, it is a psychiatric disorder that affects most of the population. Narcissists exhibit a wide range of symptoms. They have a distorted self-image and exaggerated self-confidence. They are arrogant, overestimate their abilities and feats, and expect to be admired for them. Sigmund Freud coined the term "narcissism." It is based on the Greek myth of Narcissus, a handsome youth who fell in love with his reflection in a pool of water and eventually starved to death because he couldn't stop looking at his image. According to alarming publications such as The Narcissism Epidemic by Jean Twenge and Keith Campbell, youth today are more narcissistic than previous genera-

tions. Some psychologists argue that, on a small scale, narcissism is beneficial to self-development. Indeed, research on adults suggests that narcissism is associated with a variety of positive traits, including self-esteem, assertiveness, and extraversion. The healthy levels of self-esteem, assertiveness, and extraversion are regarded as positive traits, whereas narcissism is not. A small amount of narcissism is likely to be adaptive, functional, and beneficial to social well-being. Excessive amounts, on the other hand, lean toward pathology and are harmful.

In contrast to the negative effects of social media, no one denies the benefits of it, especially in the information age of the twenty-first century. Everyone needs to remain updated with current events because no one wants to fall behind in this information age, but the question is where to press the breaks. The continuous release of dopamine and other hormones in the brain by entertaining content on social media gives people short-term pleasure, and in order to keep it releasing, we need to feed our brains continuously, which is exactly how the young generation has adopted the overuse of social media in their lives. In general, the negative effects of social media use on social-emotional development appear to vary according to how the younger generation use social media. If teens use social media to maintain existing contacts, as the majority of them do, the overall effects appear to be positive. However, if they primarily use social media to communicate with strangers, or if they create unusual profiles that elicit negative responses, the consequences are negative.

How 9/11 changed cinema

One of the most common responses to the events of September 11 2001, both among witnesses on the scene and more distant commentators, was that the destruction of the World Trade Center was like something only seen in the movies. This famously prompted veteran director Robert Altman to declare that 9/11 was an instance of life imitating art: "The movies set the pattern, and these people have copied the movies."

If the terrorist attacks had appeared like a movie, then the immediate response of Hollywood was that films released in the aftermath of the event should not be too much like 9/11. Representations of the World Trade Center became taboo. The original teaser trailer for Spider-Man (2001) showing the Twin Towers was withdrawn, while the climactic final scene of Men in Black II (2002) had to be reshot. For various other releases, the Twin Towers were erased in post-production.

Later on, the towers would be digitally restored for the 2006 US docudrama disaster film, World Trade Center, directed by Oliver Stone. The film reconstructs events from the point of view of policemen getting caught in the North Tower when the South Tower collapses. Like Paul Greengrass's United 93, released the same year, Stone's film celebrates resilience in the face of terrorism while giving viewers access to events previously unseen.

Other cinematic forms offered more oblique evocations of the terrorist attacks. Steven Spielberg's 2005 adaptation of War of the Worlds transplants H.G. Wells's late-Victorian story to post-9/11 New Jersey and Boston. The tagline of the film, "they're already here", echoes fears of sleeper cells, suggesting that the enemy is already in the US – undetectable and waiting to be activated. After the alien tripods have emerged from below the ground to wreak havoc on innocent bystanders, the protagonist's daughter asks her ash-covered father: "Is it the terrorists?"

Imagery reminiscent of 9/11 also abounds in The Dark Knight (2008), the second instalment of Christopher Nolan's celebrated Batman trilogy. Casting Joker as a terrorist, the film sheds an ambivalent light on Batman's pursuit of counter-terrorist justice.

The Dark Knight played a crucial part in the boom of superhero films that continues to dominate mainstream cinema. It's perhaps no coincidence that this ongoing boom roughly coincides with

the so-called "war on terror", and particularly the ill-fated invasion of Iraq.

Moral ambiguity

In a time of increasingly complex geopolitical entanglements and moral failings, these films articulate a yearning for unsullied heroism, effective leadership and appropriate responses to crises.

The invasions of Afghanistan in 2001 and Iraq in 2003 initially found widespread support in the US. In October 2001, a poll found that 88% of those in the US backed a military response to the terrorist attacks. Yet as the wars continued, support declined significantly. The realist dramas of Kathryn Bigelow, in both The Hurt Locker (2008) and Zero Dark

Thirty (2012), reflect the moral ambiguity of the US position in the Middle East.

Films like Eye in the Sky (2015), meanwhile, capture the impersonal nature of long-range drone warfare. On TV, the hugely popular series Homeland (2011-2020) tracks the entanglements of Americans and Iraqis in the sphere of counter-terrorism and radicalisation.

Many of these narratives centre on the figure of the white Western woman, perhaps as a way to "soften" the US image abroad. This movement away from blockbuster thrillers to more personal dramas is in line with Obama's stated shift towards a form of "humane warfare", a move some have called "the humanisation of interminable conflict".

The terrorist and the hero

The figure of the terrorist has also evolved in post-9/11 cinema. In the 1980s and 1990s, terrorists that were coded as Muslim or Arabic in films like True Lies existed alongside the Germanic villains of Die Hard or the IRA man found in films like The Devil's Own and The Crying Game. Yet after 9/11, terrorism is mainly equated with jihadism in Hollywood films, where terrorists are often denied any deep characterisation and contrasted with US heroes.

Clint Eastwood's American Sniper (2014) is a prime example of this. Telling the story of Chris Kyle, one of the most lethal snipers in US military history, the

film split critics, with the left-wing press describing it as Republican propaganda, while the right-leaning National Review praising the movie for capturing "the true nature of the enemy" – the Iraqis that the central character calls "savages".

But filmmakers from around the world have also sought to capture the ongoing ramifications of the event and the subsequent "war on terror". Indian-American director Mira Nair's film The Reluctant Fundamentalist (2012), based on Mohsin Hamid's Booker-nominated novel of the same title, takes on the racial and ethnic stereotyping found in films like American Sniper. Riz Ahmed plays Changez, a young Pakistani in the US who goes from ruthless corporate climber to disillusioned and excluded immigrant throughout the film.

Freedom and victory?

The attack on the World Trade Center is one of the most significant events of the 21st century. So much so that it is used as a generational marker, distinguishing millennials from Generation Z in terms of whether or not one remembers the event directly.

Perhaps it's appropriate, then, that even the Marvel Cinematic Universe, with its predominantly youthful viewership, has allegorically hinted at the failures of the "war on terror". Its most recent television spin-off, Loki (2021), appears to question the validity of some of the language that surrounded 9/11 and what started out as "Operation Enduring Freedom". On the afternoon of 9/11, George W. Bush stated that "freedom itself was attacked this morning" – Loki challenges the very notion of liberation, saying "the first and most oppressive lie ever uttered was the song of freedom".

And now as the world witnesses the takeover of Afghanistan by the Taliban within days of the US and British troop withdrawal, it remains to be seen how Hollywood will treat not only 9/11, but its ongoing ramifications – which even the Hollywood dream machine may struggle to spin into a spectacle of freedom and victory.

‘Govt Committed To Support Small, Marginal Farmers’

JAMMU- As part of the ongoing public outreach initiatives of the Centre Government, Union Minister for Agriculture, Narendra Singh Tomar and Union Ministers of State for Agriculture, Shobha Karandlaje and Kailash Choudhary today visited Jammu and took stock of agriculture and horticulture related activities in the region.

Advisor to Lieutenant Governor, Farooq Khan and Principal Secretary, Agriculture & Horticulture, Navin K Choudhary also accompanied the team.

During an event organised at village Maralian, in RS Pura sub-division, the Union Agriculture Minister expressed delight and said, “farmers of J&K are showing extraordinary enthusiasm for availing benefits of the government’s schemes”.

‘Around 85 percent of farmers of India have land holding of less than 2 hectares, the minister said, and it is by strengthening these farmers that the nation can truly prosper’. He stressed that in order to double the farmer’s income, they need to shift from traditional methods and opt for modernisation and diversification of crops. He also laid impetus on maintaining quality to match global standards.

The Minister informed that the Prime Minister is working towards giving boost to agriculture and allied sectors, so as to ensure greater exports of exceptional quality. He lauded the Government for implementing “200 out of 201” recommendations of the Swaminathan Committee and highlighted that ‘the most significant recommendation to be accepted has been to ensure that farmers get at least 50 percent profit over their investment’. Some crops are even earning them profit of about 100 percent, he added.

Detailing the PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana, the Minister informed that the Centre Gov-

ernment has already disbursed Rs 1,58,000 crore to more than 11 crore farmers through the scheme. More than 17 hundred farmers of J&K have also received an amount of Rs 6 thousand per year under the scheme, told the minister.

Acknowledging the efforts of Lieutenant Governor, the Principal Secretary said that through his intervention, marginal farmers and orchardists with land holding of 1 kanal are now being provided government support. Earlier the minimum requirement was capped at 4 kanal.

Navin K Choudhary informed the Minister that with high density plantation technique, around one thousand plants can be planted in one hectare land. The number is significant as earlier only four hundred plants were being planted in the same land. ‘Thus, with high density plantation, orchardists could easily double their income’, he said.

The Principal Secretary informed that the UT administration has been successful in increasing horticulture cover in Jammu division from 50 thousand to 10 lakh plants this year. Greater targets have been set for subsequent years, he assured. ‘The department is proactively promoting plantation of less water-intensive crops like lemon-grass and aloe vera in kandi areas of the region. Land amounting to 1500 hectares has come under the two kinds of plantations so far’, added the Principal Secretary.

An exhibition of agriculture implements and horticulture products of districts like Poonch, Rajouri, Doda, Kathua and others was also organized at the venue.

The visiting ministers also inaugurated one high density plantation at Maralian by planting mango saplings at the site.

Those present at the event included DDC Chairman, Bharat Bhushan, Director Horticulture Ram Sewak and other senior officers of the department.

Govt Enhances Scope Of MTA Scheme For Agri Exports

NEW DELHI- The government on Friday enhanced the scope of Transport and Marketing Assistance (TMA) scheme for specified agriculture products by including dairy products under its purview and increasing the rates of assistance.

The scheme has been extended till March 31, 2022, according to an official statement.

Enhanced assistance under the revised scheme is expected to help Indian exporters of agricultural products to meet rising freight and logistics costs, the statement said.

In 2019, the government announced the scheme for providing financial assistance for transport and marketing of agricultural products to boost exports of such commodities to certain countries in Europe and North America.

Under the TMA plan, it reimburses a certain portion of freight charges and provides assistance for marketing of agricultural produce.

“Now the Department of Commerce has notified revised TMA for specified agriculture products scheme for exports effected on or after April 1, 2021 up to March 31, 2022. The existing scheme will remain in operation for exports effected up to March 31, 2021,” the statement said.

Dairy products, which were not covered under the earlier scheme, will now be eligible for assistance, it said adding that rates of assistance have been increased, by 50 per cent for exports by sea and 100 per cent through air.

The scheme was introduced to provide assistance for the international component of freight, to mitigate disadvantage of higher freight costs faced by the Indian exporters of agriculture products.

It was initially applicable for exports effected during March 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020. It was later extended up to March 31, 2021.

The Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) will shortly notify the procedure for availing assistance under the revised scheme.

Tomar Stresses Need For Holistic Development Of Agriculture Sector In J&K

JAMMU- Narendra Singh Tomar, Union Minister for Agriculture and Farmers’ Welfare today visited Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology of Jammu and lays foundation stone of Gene Bank and Cold Storage facility at Mega Seed.

He was accompanied by Shri Kailash Choudhary and Sushri Shobha Karandlaje, Union Ministers of State for Agriculture and Farmers’ Welfare, Farooq Khan, Advisor to LG, J&K Union Territory and Navin Kumar Choudhary, Principal Secretary, Agriculture and Farmers’ Welfare, Govt. of Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory.

The Ministers also visited Integrated farming system, newly developed laboratory of School of Biotechnology besides flagging off Beej Vahan to mark the launch of Rabi campaign at Mega Seed unit of SKUAST-Jammu. The minister inspected exhibition stalls laid by farmers’, agri-start-ups and KVKs of University.

The Union Minister in his address on the occasion said that he is feeling happy by visiting SKUAST-Jammu and has seen

a transformation in agriculture sector of J&K Union territory. He appreciated the efforts and activities of Vice Chancellor, SKUAST-Jammu and SKUAST-Kashmir for bringing development and sea change research and extension in both the Universities benefiting the farmers of Jammu and Kashmir. He said that out of 201 recommendations of M. S. Swaminathan Committee constituted in 2003, two hundred recommendations were implemented by present government.

The Union Minister informed the gathering that Rs 158000 crore rupees have been transferred in the bank accounts of 11 Lakh farmers of India under PM Kisan Samman Nidhi Yojana whereas Rs 1723 crores have been transferred to the farmers of UT of J&K. The government is following the procedure for fixation of Minimum Support Price of Agricultural Produce as recommended by Swaminathan committee which is fifty percent more of the cost of cultivation. However, the MSP announced recently for Rabi crops is almost 100 percent more than the cost of cultivation. The present Budget of Agriculture has also in-

creased to Rs 123000 cr which was Rs 23000 cr in 2014.

Union Minister appreciated the efforts of Central Government for formation of 10000 FPOs to strengthen the 85% of Marginal and small farmers of India. He said Kisan Credit Card scheme was launched by the Vajpayee Govt has saved the farmers from the clutches of Money lenders. Union Minister also informed that the document related to role of agricultural education in National Education Policy 2020 will be released shortly by the ICAR.

Meanwhile, prestigious multi crore ICAR/ World Bank sponsored Institutional Development Plan (IDP) project was also launched during the function at Baba Jitto Auditorium of SKUAST-Jammu.

Navin K Choudhary, Principal Secretary, Agriculture and Farmers’ Welfare, Govt. of Jammu and Kashmir Union territory also spoke on the occasion and raised the issues and demands pertaining to infrastructure development, establishment of Agriculture Technology Information centre, centre for organic agriculture, development of farms of university and sanctioning of more AICRPs.

Earlier, the Union Minister and team inspected exhibitions and stalls demonstrated by the KVKs of university, farmers, start-ups, etc. During the programme, progressive farmers of UT of J&K were felicitated for their contribution in agriculture and allied enterprises. Kulbhushan Khajuria and Tejinder Singh, progressive farmers also spoke on the occasion.

Over 50Pc Agri Families In Debt With Average Loan Of Rs 74,121 In 2019: Survey

NEW DELHI- Over 50 per cent of agricultural households in the country were in debt with average outstanding loan per household at Rs 74,121 in 2019, says a survey conducted by National Statistical Office (NSO).

The survey further points out that only 69.6 per cent of the outstanding loans were taken from institutional sources like banks, cooperative societies and government agencies, while 20.5 per cent of loans were from professional money lenders.

Of the total loan, only 57.5 per cent was taken for agricultural purposes, it added.

“Percentage of indebted agricultural households: 50.2 per cent; and average amount of outstanding loan per agricultural household: Rs. 74,121,” it said.

NSO carried out the survey on land and livestock holdings of households and situation assessment of agricultural households in rural areas of the country during January-December 2019.

The survey further said the average monthly income per agricultural household during agricultural year 2018-19 was at Rs 10,218. Of this, the average income per household from wages was Rs 4,063, crop production Rs 3,798, animal husbandry Rs 1,582, non-farm business Rs 641 and leasing of land Rs 134.

According to the survey, the number of agricultural households in the country was estimated at 9.3 crore with OBCs accounting for 45.8 per cent, SC 15.9 per cent, ST 14.2 per cent and others 24.1 per cent.

The survey estimates non-agricultural households living in rural areas at 7.93 crore. It also revealed that as much as 83.5 per cent of rural households had less than 1 hectare of land, while only 0.2 per cent possessed land in excess of 10 hectare.

Meanwhile in another report, NSO stated that the incidence of indebtedness was about 35 per



cent in rural India (40.3 per cent cultivator households, 28.2 per cent non-cultivator households) compared to 22.4 per cent in urban India (27.5 per cent self-employed households, 20.6 per cent other households) as of June 30, 2018.

NSO conducted the latest survey -- All India Debt & Investment Survey-- during the period January-December, 2019 as a part of 77th round of National Sample Survey (NSS).

Prior to this, the survey was carried out in NSS 26th round (1971-72), 37th round (1981-82), 48th round (1992), 59th round (2003) and 70th round (2013).

The report also found that in rural India, 17.8 per cent households were indebted to institutional credit agencies only (21.2 per cent cultivator households, 13.5 per cent non-cultivator households) against 14.5 per cent households in Urban India (18 per cent self-employed households, 13.3 per cent other households).

About 10.2 per cent of the households were indebted to non-institutional credit agencies only in rural India compared to 4.9 per cent households in urban India, it added.

About 7 per cent of the households were indebted to both institutional credit agencies and non-institutional credit agencies in rural India against 3 per cent households in urban India.

‘Ford's Decision To Stop Manufacturing In No Way Reflects On Biz Environment In India’

NEW DELHI- A day after US auto major Ford made the surprise announcement of stopping vehicle manufacturing in India, a senior government source on Friday said the decision in no way reflects on the business environment in the country and is rather linked to operational issues.

The source, a senior functionary in the government who wished not to be identified, reasoned the shutdown decision to competition from Japanese and Korean carmakers.

Ford Motor Co on Thursday announced it will shut its two manufacturing plants in India and sell only imported vehicles in the country, as part of a restructuring exercise.

Ford, which invested about USD 2.5 billion at its Chennai



(Tamil Nadu) and Sanand (Gujarat) plants, will stop selling vehicles such as the EcoSport, Figo and Aspire, which are produced from these plants.

“India’s automotive growth story is alive and growing both in domestic and export markets. Ford’s exit is related to possible operational reasons and does not in any way reflect the story of the Indian automobile sector or business environment in India,” the source said.

Explaining further, he said the COVID-19 pandemic may have impacted sales volumes.

“More than USD 35 billion investments have come in India during the last six years. The automotive sector continues to attract billions of dollars in investment,” the source added.

Ford India has an installed manufacturing capacity of 6,10,000 engines and 4,40,000

vehicles a year. It also exported its models such as Figo, Aspire, and EcoSport to over 70 markets around the world.

Ford is the second American auto major after General Motors to shut plants in India.

In 2017, General Motors had said it will stop selling vehicles in India as there was no turnaround in its fortunes here even after struggling for over two decades to make a mark.

Total sales of passenger vehicles stood at 11.42 lakh during April-August this fiscal as compared to 10.91 lakh in the same period of 2019-20.

Commenting on the August 2021 sales data, SIAM Director General Rajesh Menon said, “Looking at the cumulative sales from April to August 2021, the passenger vehicle segment is still below the level of 2016-17.”

City's Ever Busy Habba-Kadal Bridge Turns Into New Parking Place

SRINAGAR: As the parking space in the city seems to shrink with each passing day, the ever busy Habba kadal Bridge in the heart of the city has been turned into the new parking space and hub of anti-social activities.

This old bridge in Habba Kadal is an epitome of history in itself, which connects old city areas of Chinkaral Mohalla, Fateh-Kadal and Babademb areas to civil lines areas.

The inhabitants echoed the views. "Shopkeepers and visitors use the bridge for parking. This brings traffic in the area to standstill," the aggrieved locals said.

"We had expected that the bridge would help us to ease our grievances, but the initiative has worsened the situation," they said.

Mohammad Maqbool, President Mohalla committee said "These Habba Kadal bridges that connect civil lines areas to the Downtown areas of the Srinagar were meant for local

traffic but the same have either been occupied by the vendors or converted into parking area creating more chaos in the area".

Meanwhile, Deputy Superintendent of Police (DSP) Traffic Srinagar City, Musadiq Basu, when contacted, said that they have time to time taken action against the illegal parking on the bridge during daytime. However, the locals have always restrained against our action during night hours".

Similarly, the residents also complained about "hooliganism" and anti-social activities hanging on the bridge all day.

"Boys from other localities come and gather here at a particular spot and smoke, consume all kinds of drugs, without even caring about the people here," said a resident, wishing anonymity.

"The bridge, according to the locals, has become a bastion of such immoral activities. These boys resort to stone throwing in a nearby bunker in the late hours when someone from the

area taunts them," said another anonymous resident.

"These goons resort to abuse in front of local residents. Female folk feels uneasiness in their presence. They fight with one another in full public glare. Their actions embarrass us, particularly our daughters and mothers who are unable to cross the bridge", Maqbool added.

"One could smell narcotics particularly Charas in the air. Billows of smoke and smell had affected our life," said a paramedic living in the area.

Many of the locals said they had planned to migrate from the area just because of "bridge menace.

When contacted, Station House Officer Police Station kral khud said that action will be initiated against those indulging in illegal activities in the park. "I request locals to inform us whenever they feel such activities are going in area," he said adding that addressing the grievances of general public is first priority of police.(CNS)

Newsclick has argued in its defence in the court that there is no question of siphoning off of funds, as alleged by probe agencies, as the same had been utilised for paying salaries to employees and that there was no loss to the exchequer in the process.

The ED had claimed that it is also probing Newsclick and its promoters for alleged transfer of certain funds to activist Gautam Navlakha, accused in the Elgar Parishad case of Maharashtra.

It has also questioned Navlakha, lodged in a Maharashtra jail, in connection with the case.

Purkayastha had earlier said in a statement that a smear campaign has been launched against the portal, and "selective leaks" from the ED, whose probe is already under challenge before court, reflect the "inherent weakness" in the investigation and the course that it will take in the courts.

From 9/11's Ashes

your ass, it's the American way," Toby Keith promised America's enemies in one of the most popular of those songs in 2002.

Americans stuck flags in yards and on the back of trucks. Factionalism hardened inside America, in school board fights, on Facebook posts, and in national politics, so that opposing views were treated as propaganda from mortal enemies. The concept of enemy also evolved, from not simply the terrorist but also to the immigrant, or the conflation of the terrorist as immigrant trying to cross the border.

The patriot under threat became a personal and political identity in the United States. Fifteen years later, Trump harnessed it to help him win the presidency.

THE OTHERING

In the week after the attacks, Bush demanded of Americans that they know "Islam is peace" and that the attacks were a perversion of that religion. He told the country that American Muslims are us, not them, even as mosques came under surveillance and Arabs coming to the U.S. to take their kids to Disneyland or go to school risked being detained for questioning.

For Trump, in contrast, everything was always about them, the outsiders.

In the birther lie Trump promoted before his presidency, Barack Obama was an outsider. In Trump's campaigns and administration, Muslims and immigrants were outsiders. The "China virus" was a foreign interloper, too.

Overseas, deadly attacks by Islamic extremists, like the 2004 bombing of Madrid trains that killed nearly 200 people and the 2005 attack on London's transportation system that killed more than 50, hardened attitudes in Europe as well.

By 2015, as the Islamic State group captured wide areas of Iraq and pushed deep into Syria, the number of refugees increased dramatically, with more than 1 million migrants, primarily from Syria, Afghanistan and Iraq, entering Europe that year alone.

The year was bracketed by attacks in France on the Charlie Hebdo magazine staff in January after it published cartoons of the Prophet Muhammad, and on the Bataclan theater and other Paris locations in November, reinforcing the angst then gripping the continent.

Already growing in support, far-right parties were able to capitalize on the fears to establish themselves as part of the European mainstream. They remain represented in

many European parliaments, even as the flow of immigrants has slowed dramatically and most concerns have proved unfounded.

THE UNRAVELING

Dozens of countries joined or endorsed the NATO coalition fighting in Afghanistan. Russia acquiesced to NATO troops in Central Asia for the first time and provided logistical support. Never before had NATO invoked Article 5 of its charter that an attack against one member was an attack against all.

But in 2003, the U.S. and Britain were practically alone in prosecuting the Iraq war. This time, millions worldwide marched in protest in the run-up to the invasion. World opinion of the United States turned sharply negative.

In June 2003, after the invasion had swiftly ousted Saddam and dismantled the Iraqi army and security forces, a Pew Research poll found a widening rift between Americans and Western Europeans and reported that "the bottom has fallen out of support for America in most of the Muslim world." Most South Koreans, half of Brazilians and plenty more people outside the Islamic world agreed.

And this was when the war was going well, before the world saw cruel images from Abu Ghraib prison, learned all that it knows now about CIA black ops sites, waterboarding, years of Guantanamo Bay detention without charges or trials — and before the rise of the brutal Islamic State.

By 2007, when the U.S. set up the Africa Command to counter terrorism and the rising influence of China and Russia on the continent, African countries did not want to host it. It operates from Stuttgart, Germany.

THE SUCCESSES

Over the two decades, a succession of U.S. presidents scored important achievements in shoring up security, and so far U.S. territory has remained safe from more international terrorism anywhere on the scale of 9/11.

Globally, U.S.-led forces weakened al-Qaida, which has failed to launch a major attack on the West since 2005. The Iraq invasion rid that country and region of a murderous dictator in Saddam.

Yet strategically, eliminating him did just what Arab leaders warned Bush it would do: It strengthened Saddam's main rival, Iran, threatening U.S. objectives and partners.

Deadly chaos soon followed in Iraq. The Bush administration, in its nation-building haste, failed to plan for keeping order, leaving Islamist extremists and rival militias to fight for dominance in the security vacuum.

The overthrow of Saddam served both to inspire and limit public support for Arab Spring uprisings a few years later. For if the U.S. showed people in the Middle East that strongmen can be toppled, the insurgency demonstrated that what comes next may not be a season of renewal.

Authoritarian regimes in the Middle East pointed to the post-Saddam era as an argument for their own survival.

The U.S.-led wars in Afghanistan and Iraq killed more than 7,000 American military men and women, more than 1,000 from the allied forces, many tens of thousands of members of Afghan and Iraqi security forces, and many hundreds of thousands of civilians, according to Brown University's Costs of War project. Costs, including tending the wars' unusually high number of disabled vets, are expected to top \$6 trillion.

For the U.S., the presidencies since Bush's wars have been marked by an effort — not always consistent, not always successful — to pull back the military from the conflicts of the Middle East and Central Asia.

The perception of a U.S. retreat has allowed Russia and China to gain influence in the regions, and left U.S. allies struggling to

understand Washington's place in the world. The notion that 9/11 would create an enduring unity of interest to combat terrorism collided with rising nationalism and a U.S. president, Trump, who spoke disdainfully of the NATO allies that in 2001 had rallied to America's cause.

Even before Trump, Obama surprised allies and enemies alike when he stepped back abruptly from the U.S. role of world cop. Obama geared up for, then called off, a strike on Syrian President Bashar Assad for using chemical weapons against his people.

"Terrible things happen across the globe, and it is beyond our means to right every wrong," Obama said on Sept. 11, 2013.

THE NEWISH ORDER

The legacies of 9/11 ripple both in obvious and unusual ways.

Most directly, millions of people in the U.S. and Europe go about their public business under the constant gaze of security cameras while other surveillance tools scoop up private communications. The government layered post-9/11 bureaucracies on to law enforcement to support the expansive security apparatus.

Militarization is more evident now, from large cities to small towns that now own military vehicles and weapons that seem well out of proportion to any terrorist threat. Government offices have become fortifications and airports a security maze.

But as profound an event as 9/11 was, its immediate effect on how the world has been ordered was temporary and largely undone by domestic political forces, a global economic downturn and now a lethal pandemic.

The awakening of human conscience predicted by Gadhafi didn't last. Gadhafi didn't last.

Osama bin Laden has been dead for a decade. Saddam was hanged in 2006. The forever wars — the Afghanistan one being the longest in U.S. history — now are over or ending. The days of Russia tactically enabling the U.S., and China not standing in the way, petered out. Only the phoenix lasts.

Another source said the problem of not being able to find a DRS technology provider and operator had arisen as the PCB sold the media rights of the New Zealand series very late.

The rights were sold very late and that is why this problem has arisen. The result is the series will be without DRS technology on television.

The source said there was so much international cricket being played around the world at this time that equipment technology provision will have to be arranged well in advance.

Fifth Test Cancelled After India "Unable To Field Team" Against England

MANCHESTER: The fifth Test between India and England was cancelled on Friday amid a chaotic turn of events during which the host board's statement on the visitors changed from "unable to field a team and will instead forfeit the match" to "regrettably unable to field a team".

The development came after the touring side was left on tenterhooks following physio Yogesh Parmar's positive COVID-19 test that led to concerns that the infection could spread during the match, which was eventually cancelled a couple of hours before toss.

The initial statement issued by the England and Wales Cricket Board categorically mentioned the word "forfeit" but that was later omitted from a revised media release. Both statements are in possession of PTI.

"Due to fears of a further increase in the number of COVID cases inside the camp, India are regrettably unable to field a team," read the revised ECB statement.

It is learnt that, led by skipper Virat Kohli, who voiced his apprehension strongly, the players,

negative on Thursday, there have been continuous back-channel talks between the two boards.

"The BCCI and ECB held several rounds of discussion to find a way to play the Test Match, however, the outbreak of Covid-19 in the Indian team contingent forced the decision of calling off the Old Trafford Test Match," Shah said.

Also, deferring the game by a day or two would have caused logistical issues as the Indian and English players were supposed to fly together to the UAE in a charter flight.

"There is no guarantee that post Ravi Shastri's book release function which the team attended, there won't be more cases. So players were wary and more so about being in isolation for 10 days," a source said.

Messi Overtakes Pele To Become South America's Top Goal Scorer

BUENOS AIRES: Argentine star Lionel Messi became the top international goal scorer in South American history on Thursday, overtaking Brazil's Pelé. The 34-year-old netted all the goals at Argentina's 3-0 win against Bolivia in World Cup qualifying, and now has 79 for the national team.

Messi scored his goals in 153 caps for Argentina, while Pelé netted his 77 in 92 official matches for Brazil.

Both goals at the Monumental Stadium in Buenos Aires, in front of about 20,000 fans, were pieces of art by the six-time Ballon d'Or winner.

The first came in the 14th minute, with Messi moving the ball between a Bolivian defender's legs and shooting from outside the box to the right of goalkeeper Carlos Lampe.

The second came in the 64th minute after he and striker Lautaro Martinez dazzled the Bolivian defense with a quick exchange of four passes. Messi still had time to dribble past one defender before scoring.

Messi completed his hat-trick



in the 88th minute from close range after getting a rebound from Lampe.

Messi didn't speak about the record after the match, but celebrated by lifting the Copa America trophy in front of home fans, who were allowed to attend after a 20-month pause caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

"I waited a lot of time for this, I sought this, I dreamed about this," he said. "It is a single moment because of the way it happened, after so much wait."

"There was no better way to

celebrate than being here," he added. "My mom, my brothers are here in the tribunes... They suffered a lot and today they are here celebrating. I am very happy."

Messi had a troubled relationship with the national team, with a series of hurtful defeats in World Cups and Copa Americas, until he led the team to the continental title against Brazil in July. It was his first major title with Argentina, a team that was in a 28-year title drought. Three-time World Cup winner Pelé is currently in hospital due to surgery for a tumour on his colon.

FIFA Unveils Biennial World Cup Plan, UEFA Threatens Boycott

SWITZERLAND: FIFA detailed its plan for reshaping international soccer around playing the men's World Cup every two years despite European opposition that could lead to a boycott.

Joined by retired greats, FIFA unveiled the proposal Thursday but the pushback from Europe was immediate as UEFA president Aleksander Ceferin confirmed it could launch a boycott by its teams which have dominated soccer's marquee event since Brazil won in 2002.

"We can decide not to play in it," Ceferin said in an interview with British daily The Times.

About 80 former internationals including World Cup winners went to Qatar for two days of FIFA-hosted talks and emerged with consensus for playing the tournament twice as often.

"We all agreed with the new proposal of the calendar," said Brazil great Ronaldo, who went to four World Cups and won

twice. He described FIFA's proposal as "just amazing."

Still, European soccer leader Ceferin said "as far as I know, the South Americans are on the same page" with resisting FIFA's plan.

"So good luck with a World Cup like that," Ceferin told The Times in the latest UEFA vs. FIFA fight since 2016 when he and Gianni Infantino were elected to the respective presidencies.

Infantino and his allies have since 2018 floated the idea of a biennial World Cup which European soccer has viewed as a commercial and competitive threat to its club and national team events.

Arsene Wenger has led the project since FIFA hired the former Arsenal coach last year to be its director of global development.

Details floated in recent media interviews and briefings were finally presented Thursday from Qatar in an overall plan to shape the schedule of international games from 2024. The

FIFA-managed calendar mandates when clubs must release players to national teams.

More top-level tournaments and fewer qualifying games are the priority with a biennial men's World Cup the key takeaway.

Wenger said his priorities were less travel for players and less disruption for their clubs plus giving young talent worldwide "a chance to shine" by also playing more meaningful games.

The current system — that typically sees players based in Europe taking long-haul flights home throughout the season in short breaks for national-team games — could be replaced by a single block of fewer qualifying games in October.

International tournaments would occupy June each year, with players proposed to get a mandatory 25-day vacation in July before rejoining their clubs.

Wenger said the balance of players having 20% of their games for national teams and 80% for clubs would stay, though

"in a more efficient way."

"I think it is an outdated (status quo)," he said. "It is not linked with the evolution of the modern game. We will not increase the number of games, we might even reduce it."

Retired greats like Germany's Jürgen Klinsmann, Roberto Carlos of Brazil, Didier Drogba of Ivory Coast and Denmark's Peter Schmeichel were enlisted to discuss changing the four-year World Cup cycle in place since the first edition in 1930.

"I don't think anyone disagreed on the frequency" of biennial World Cups, said Schmeichel, who played at just the 1998 World Cup. "It was a really, really long wait for an ambitious player like me to have the next possibility."

The global group of players' unions, FIFPRO, has not yet commented on FIFA's plans.

FIFA's process has angered many in European soccer who claim they were cut out of the consultation so far.

Mutation Entry Does Not Create Any Right In Favour Of Individual Title Or Interest: SC

Mutation entry does not confer any property right, title or interest in favour of an individual and is only for the fiscal purpose, the Supreme Court has said.

Mutation of a property is the transfer or change of title entry in revenue records of the local municipal corporation.

A bench comprising Justices M R Shah and Aniruddha Bose said it cannot be disputed that the right on the basis of the will can be claimed only after the death of the executant of the will.

As per the settled proposition of law, mutation entry does not confer any right, title or interest in favour of the person and the mutation entry in the revenue record is only for the fiscal purpose, the bench said.

The apex court said that if there is any dispute with respect to the title and more particularly when the mutation entry is sought to be made on the basis of the will, the party who is claiming title/right has to approach the appropriate court.

It said that the applicant's

rights can only be crystallised by approaching the court and only thereafter on the basis of the decision before the civil court necessary mutation entry can be made.

Referring to its earlier decisions, the top court said that mutation of property in revenue records neither creates nor extinguishes title to the property nor has it any presumptive value on title.

Such entries are relevant only for the purpose of collecting land revenue, it said.

Entries in the revenue records or jamabandi have only fiscal purpose, i.e., payment of land revenue, and no ownership is conferred on the basis of such entries.

It is further observed that so far as the title of the property is concerned, it can only be decided by a competent civil court, the bench said.

The order came while upholding an order of Madhya Pradesh High Court which set aside the order passed by the Additional Commissioner, Rewa Division, Rewa, directing to mutate the name of a person in the revenue records, which was sought to be mutated on the basis of the will.

Owaisi Booked In UP For 'Vitiating' Communal Harmony, Violating Covid Norms

Lucknow: Uttar Pradesh Police have booked AIMIM chief Asaduddin Owaisi for allegedly vitiating communal harmony, violating Covid norms and making "indecent" remarks against Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, police said on Friday.

The FIR against the All India Majlis-e-Ittehad-ul-Muslimeen (AIMIM) chief was registered on Thursday night at Barabanki city police station after his party's rally.

IPC sections 153A (promoting enmity on ground of religion, race etc), 188 (disregarding order of a public servant), 269 (negligent act likely to spread disease dangerous to life), 270 (malignant act likely to spread infection of disease) and the Epidemic Act had been slapped against him, Superintendent of Police, Barabanki, Yamuna Prasad, said.

He said the Hyderabad MP violated Covid guidelines - on mask and social distancing - by arranging huge crowds at the party rally

at Katra Chandana on Thursday.

"In his speech, the AIMIM chief made statements for vitiating communal harmony and said the 100-year-old Ram Sanahi Chat mosque was razed by the administration and its debris was also removed. This is contrary to the fact," the SP said.

"By this statement, Owaisi tried to vitiate communal harmony and incite feelings of a particular community. He also made indecent and baseless remarks against the PM and the Uttar Pradesh chief minister," he said.

Owaisi was on a three-day trip to Uttar Pradesh, where his party plans to contest 100 seats in the upcoming Assembly polls.

In a scathing attack on PM Modi, Owaisi had on Thursday alleged that there had been efforts to turn the country into a "Hindu rashtra" since he came to power seven years back.

Referring to the law against instant triple talaq, the Hyderabad MP also mentioned the "plight" of Hindu women, while directing a personal barb at Modi. PTI

Afghan Situation 'Fragile, 'Of Direct Concern To Us: India At UN

UNITED NATIONS: Terming the situation in Afghanistan as "very fragile", India has said it is important that the Taliban adheres to its commitment to not allow the use of the Afghan soil for terrorism, including from terror groups designated under Security Council resolution 1267 that lists Pakistan-based outfits Lashkar-e-Taiba and Jaish-e-Mohammed.

India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador TS Tirumurti said at the UN Security Council Debate on Afghanistan Thursday that as Afghanistan's neighbour, India was privileged to preside over the adoption of a substantial and forward-looking product of the Council during its presidency of the 15-nation UN body last month.

The resolution on Afghanistan "took into account some of our collective concerns, in particular on terrorism, where it has noted the commitment of the Taliban not to allow the use of the Afghan soil for terrorism, including from terrorists and terrorist groups

designated under Resolution 1267.

The Security Council resolution has "underlined that Afghan territory should not be used to threaten or attack any country or to shelter or train terrorists, or to plan or to finance terrorist acts. As witnessed from the deplorable terrorist attack at Kabul Airport last month, terrorism continues to pose a serious threat to Afghanistan. It is therefore important that commitments made in this regard are respected and adhered to," Mr Tirumurti said.

Lashkar-e-Taiba and Jaish-e-Mohammed as well as the Haqqani Network are proscribed terror entities under UNSC resolution 1267 (1999) concerning ISIL (Da'esh), Al-Qaeda, and associated individuals, groups, undertakings and entities. JeM founder Masood Azhar and LeT leader Hafiz Saeed are also listed as global terrorists under the 1267 Sanctions regime.

Resolution 2593 also took note of the Taliban statement that Afghans will be able to travel abroad in an unhindered manner. "We hope that these commitments

will be adhered to, including regarding the safe, secure, and orderly departure from Afghanistan of Afghans and all foreign nationals," Mr Tirumurti said.

India also called on the international community to rise above any partisan interests and stand together with the people of Afghanistan in their desire for peace, stability and security in the country.

"The situation in Afghanistan continues to be very fragile. As its immediate neighbour and a friend to its people, the current situation is of direct concern to us," Mr Tirumurti said.

He said uncertainties about the future of the Afghan people, as well as about sustaining and building on the gains achieved over the last two decades.

"In this context, we reiterate the need for the voices of Afghan women to be heard, aspirations of Afghan children to be realised and the rights of minorities to be protected. We call on humanitarian assistance to be provided urgently and underline the need to provide unhindered access to the UN and other agencies in this regard," he said.

Magistrate Can't Extend Probe Time In Anti-Terror Law Cases: Supreme Court

NEW DELHI: A magistrate would not be the competent authority for extension of time to complete investigation in cases under the Unlawful Activities (Prevention) Act, the Supreme Court has said.

A bench headed by Justice U U Lalit said the only competent authority to consider such request would be the Special Courts set up under National Investigation Agency Act.

"So far as all offences under the UAPA are concerned, the Magistrate's jurisdiction to extend time under the first proviso in Section 43-D (2)(b) is nonexistent.

"Consequently, in so far as "Extension of time to complete investigation" is concerned, the Magistrate would not be competent to consider the request and the only competent authority to consider such request would be 'the Court' as specified in the proviso in Section 43-D (2)(b) of the UAPA," the bench also comprising Justices S Ravindra Bhat and Bela M Trivedi said.

The order, passed on September 7, came on an appeal filed by Sadique and others challenging the judgment passed by the High Court of Madhya Pradesh.

They were arrested in connection with crime lodged with STF/ATS Police Station, District Bhopal for offences punishable



under Arms Act and various provisions of UAPA.

While dealing with an application moved on behalf of the Investigating Machinery under Section 43-D(2)(b) of the UAPA, the extension was granted by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bhopal.

On completion of 90 days of their actual custody, applications on behalf of appellants were moved seeking bail on the ground that no charge-sheet was filed by the Investigating Agency within 90 days, which was rejected by Court of CJM, Bhopal.

When the matter reached the high court, it said that since the CJM, Bhopal had passed an appropriate order, the period available for the Investigating Machinery to complete the investigation stood extended to 180 days and the accused were not entitled to bail.

The lawyer appearing for the accused referred to previous decisions of the top court and said the extension granted in the instant case by CJM, Bhopal was beyond jurisdiction.

AIADMK Wants 'Non Factual' Scenes On MGR, Jayalalithaa Deleted

CHENNAI: The opposition party All India Anna Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (AIADMK) in Tamil Nadu today objected to certain references about party stalwarts -- the late Mr MG Ramachandran and Ms J Jayalalithaa -- in the latter's multi-lingual biopic 'Thalaivi', and wanted the scenes deleted.

Senior AIADMK leader and former minister, Mr D Jayakumar, who watched the film directed by Al Vijay at a cinema theatre, said such references were not factual and insisted that barring them the movie was a well-made one with a lot of effort put in and that it will receive good response both from party supporters as well as the general public.

For instance, one scene showed Ramachandran, fondly addressed as MGR, as seeking a minister post in the first Dravida Munnetra Kazhagam (DMK) government and being denied by the late M Karunanidhi, Mr Jayakumar said, and asserted the yesteryear matinee idol-turned-politician was never after such posts.

Ramachandran was then part of the DMK which, under its

founder, the late CN Annadurai, unseated the Congress in the 1967 elections to become the first regional party to head the state in independent India. Later, Mr Ramachandran parted ways with it when Mr Karunanidhi helmed the party and launched his AIADMK in 1972. The DMK chief succeeded Annadurai as Chief Minister following his death in 1969.

Mr Jayakumar said while pictures of Ramachandran undergoing treatment carried in party posters after he was shot at, allegedly by the late actor MR Radha, played a vital role in DMK's victory, Annadurai subsequently wanted to make Ramachandran a minister, which he refused but was later made deputy chief of Small Savings, a newly created post.

Mr Jayakumar said that the film portrayed as if Ramachandran had sought a minister's post after Annadurai's death, when Mr Karunanidhi took over the mantle and said, "This is not true."

In fact, it was Ramachandran who proposed Karunanidhi's candidature for the Chief Minister's post after Annadurai's death, he said.

Voice Command, Wireless Syncing: Ray-Ban, Facebook Debut Smart Shades

SAN FRANCISCO: Facebook and iconic eyewear brand Ray-Ban on Thursday launched their new smart glasses, the latest effort in a tricky, niche market but which the social media giant sees as a step toward its future.

The "Ray-Ban Stories" shades can take pictures and video upon the wearer's voice commands, and the frames can connect wirelessly to Facebook's platform through an app.

"We took our Wayfarer (frames), born in 1952, and we re-invented the design squeezing in some cool technology," said Fabio Borsoi, global research and design

director at the EssilorLuxottica group, Ray-Ban's maker.

Facebook is wading into a market that has already seen 2013's Google Glass, which sparked a privacy backlash over built-in cameras and prompted the tech titan to pivot its focus for the device away from the general public.

Messaging app SnapChat has also released its camera-equipped Spectacles, but they are pricey and have struggled to catch on broadly with tech lovers.

Notably, the Ray-Ban Stories glasses will not have augmented reality features -- technology that can mesh online computing with visual cues such as mapping or face recognition.

Instead, the shades are an early step toward efforts to create futuristic eyewear that adds to real-world views with data or graphics from the internet, Facebook chief executive Mark Zuckerberg has said previously.

The company had said in July it was combining specialists from across its hardware, gaming and virtual reality units to build an immersive digital world known as the "metaverse."

Priced starting at \$299, the Ray-Ban Stories will roll out in Australia, Britain, Canada, Ireland, Italy and the United States.

Cameras are built into the front of the frames, while the arms are designed to act as directional
