

In view of weather forecast issued by Metrological Department with possibility of heavy rains and snowfall from 22nd October (evening) to 24th of October 2021, Fruit Growers of Kashmir valley are requested to follow below detailed ad-

- Speedup harvesting of fruit crop and its proper storage 2. Ensure proper maintenance and cleaning of drainage
- Channels, so that water logging shall not take place in the orchards. 3. Don't remove the stakes from the fruit trees
- 4. Ensure proper support and staking of fruit trees and limbs damaged previous untimely snowfall.
- 5. Prefer pruning of their orchards in view of weather alert.
- 6. In case of snow fall visit your orchards and shake fruit trees and their limbs so that snow does not accumulate on fruit trees.
- Those orchards where 50% of leaves of fruit trees have turned yellow spray with 4 to 5 kg of Urea per 100 liters of water for speedy leaf fall.

"We are launching Collabs, a new way to co-author Feed posts and Reels. Invite an account to be a collaborator. Both names will appear on header, share to both sets of followers, live on both profile grids, share views, likes and comments," the company said in a tweet.

Instagram said that collaborating is a huge part of how people connect on the social media platform. "With 'Collab', you can invite a collaborator to your Feed Post and Reels and so they can share the content with their followers," the company noted.

Meanwhile, Facebook is testing a feature that would allow users on its platform to cross-post their posts, including photos or videos, over to their Instagram.

RSS Asks Farooq To Move JK Trifurcation Plan

SHIMLA- RSS leader incharge Kashmir affairs, Indresh, today asked Jammu and Kashmir chief minister Farooq Abdullah to bring a resolution in the assembly for trifurcation of the state saying there was both logic and merit in such a move.

It is neither a regional nor a communal demand but expression of people's aspirations. There was both logic and merit in growing demand for trifurcation of the state into Jammu and Kashmir states and Ladakh union territory, he told reporters here. He said the autonomy resolution passed by Jammu and Kashmir assembly had no relevance after its rejection by the government.

Indresh asked the union government to destroy the militants train-ing camps run by Pakistan's ISI. He said India should garner support against Pakistan on the issue of militancy and running of training camps for militants. ONS adds from Jammu: It may be recalled the RSS had formally launched its campaign for the state's trifurcation coming out in the open, for the first time, in support of the division of the only Muslim majority state. Advocating 'reorganisation of the state by what it perceives as isolation of the Muslim majority valley from rest of the state, the organisation visualises the move as a step towards early solution of the Kashmir problem. According to reports, the RSS has planned 'mass action programme' and even floated an umbrella organisation the Jammu and Kashmir Nationalist Front (JKNF) -and is 'subtly' promoting groups to organise mass agitations to get the state divided into Hindu Jammu, Muslim valley and Budhist Ladakh. The Front held its first dharna in Jammu on Gandhi Jayanti recently.

In fact, according to the report, the RSS plan would not stop at the mere 'trifurcation' of the state. It favours further division of the Muslim dominated valley by carving out a separate home-land for the migrant Kashmiri Pandits. The movement envisages mobilisation of public opinion in the Muslims majority districts of Poonch, Rajouri and Doda, besides the Gujjar community against what it describes as Kashmiri hegemony.

Israel, Iran Holding Separate Large Scale Aerial Drills

JERUSALEM: As tensions continue to rise between Iran and Israel, both countries are holding largescale aerial exercises.

Israel and seven nations -Germany, Italy, Britain, France, India, Greece and the US - are participating in Blue Flag 2021, the largest and most advanced aerial exercise ever held in the Jewish state.

This year's drills will focus on the integration of fourth- and fifth-generation aircraft, including the F-35 Adir, in complex operational scenarios, the Israeli military said

The exercise will focus on "broadening and enhancing the first time that a British fighter squadron has been deployed to Israel since the establishment of the state as well as the first time that India has sent a Mirage fighter squadron to Israel and that France has deployed a Rafael squadron to the Jewish state.

Israel Air Force commander Maj.-Gen. Amikam Norkin, who took part in a symbolic flyover over Jerusalem alongside his German counterpart Lt.-Gen. Ingo Gerhartz last week, said that the threats posed to Israel continue to increase and that the drill is a "stepping stone" toward cooperation with other countries in the region.

Flights Cancelled, Schools Closed As China Ramps Up Testing To Fight Covid Spike

Beijing: Authorities in China cancelled hundreds of flights, closed schools and ramped up mass testing on Thursday to try and stamp out a new Covid-19 outbreak

relentless zero-Covid approach with strict border closures and targeted lockdowns, even as other countries tentatively try to ease restrictions.

Domestic outbreaks have largely been eliminated, but as China logged a fifth straight day of new cases -- mostly in northern and northwestern areas -- authorities beefed up coronavirus

The latest outbreak was linked to an elderly couple who were in a group of several tourists. They started in Shanghai before flying to Xi'an, Gansu province and Inner Mongolia.

Dozens of cases have since

been linked to their travel, with close contacts in at least five provinces and regions, including the capital Beijing.

In response, local governments have rolled out mass testing and closed scenic spots and tourist sites, schools and entertainment venues in affected areas, and also imposed targeted lockdowns of housing compounds.

Some regions including Lanzhou -- a city of some four million people in northwestern China - have told residents not to leave

unless necessary. Those who nee

present a negative Covid-19 test. Airports in the affected regions have cancelled hundreds of flights, according to data from

aviation tracker VariFlight. Around 60 percent of flights to the two main airports in Xi'an and Lanzhou have been cancelled

In a notice published Monday, Erenhot in Inner Mongolia said travel in and out of the city was banned and residents should not

leave their housing compounds.

And on Wednesday, stateowned tabloid Global Times cautioned that the new virus cases in Inner Mongolia were likely to affect coal imports from Mongolia because of supply chain disruptions.

For Afghan Hazaras, Where To **Pray Can Be Life And Death Choice**

Kabul: Each time Hussain Rahimi leaves his Kabul home for the mosque to pray, he recites the Kalima - a short verse that is the central tenet of Islam - because he is not sure he will come home alive.

"I am afraid. My family is afraid when we go to the mosque," said 23-year-old Rahimi, an ethnic Hazara - a predominantly Shi'ite community that has been at the receiving end of some of the most violent attacks in Afghanistan's bloody history.

The last two Fridays have seen suicide bombings at mosques - both attacks claimed by Islamic State (ISIS) and both targeting the minority Shi'ite sect. More than 100 people were killed in total.

In the wake of the violence, some Hazaras are not going to the mosque at all.

Hazaras have long been discriminated against in Afghanistan from a mix of factors, of which religion is just one.

But while thousands died under the last Taliban government from 1996-2001, it was the appearance of Islamic State in Afghanistan from around the start of 2015 that made them and the wider Shi'ite community a systematic target.

Many hundreds were killed in suicide attacks on mosques and community centres by hardline Sunni militants who do not see them as true Muslims, bringing a form of the sectarian violence that devastated countries like Iraq to Afghanistan.

No up-to-date census data exists, but estimates put the size of the overall Shi'ite community at between 10-20 percent of the population, including Persianspeaking Tajiks and Pashtuns as well as Hazaras

In addition, Hazaras have often also been victim of the ethnic and economic rivalries endemic to Afghan politics.

Rahimi lost his sister, a 12th grade student, in a bombing of a Kabul school in May which killed mostly young girls. Although the Taliban have

promised that all of Afghanistan's ethnic groups will be protected. the killing has gone on since they

seized power in August. "When we are out of our homes, our family calls and asks where we are ... they tell us to return home quickly, the situation is bad," says Rahimi, a computer science student at Kabul University, clutching a picture of his sister.

He is still working up the courage to go to the mosque for Friday prayers - the most important congregation for Muslims across the world.

GARDEN OF THE MARTYRS With more than 400 Shi'ite

mosques in Kabul alone, total security is impossible and no one knows where the next attack will come.

"Our community feels that on future Fridays, maybe Herat will explode, maybe Kabul will explode, maybe some other," said Mohammad Baqer Sayed, a university professor who has worked for the rehabilitation of victims of previous attacks.

The Persian-speaking Hazara, thought to trace their descent back to the armies of the 13th century Mongol conqueror Genghis Khan, are considered the third largest ethnic group in Afghanistan behind the Pashtuns

Pak Minister, ISI Chief In Kabul "To Deepen Cooperation" With Taliban

Islamabad: Pakistan's Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi travelled to Kabul on Thursday along with spy agency ISI chief Lt Gen Faiz Hameed to hold talks with Afghanistan's interim government led by the Taliban.

During the day-long visit, the Pakistani delegation will hold talks with Afghanistan's Acting Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi and call on leadership of the interim government in Kabul and other Afghan leaders, according to Foreign Office.

Mr Muttaqi welcomed the Pakistani delegation at the Kabul International Airport.

"The talks between the two sides will cover the entire spectrum of bilateral relations and focus on ways and means to deepen cooperation in diverse areas," the Foreign Office said.



The Foreign Minister will also share Pakistan's perspective on issues of regional peace and stability, it said.

As a close fraternal neighbour, Pakistan has always stood by Afghanistan, keeping the border crossing points open for trade and pedestrian crossing under COVID protocols, it said.

Facilitative visa regime for Afghan nationals and border crossing procedures for

trade and cargo have been instituted, while in recent months Pakistan has also provided humanitarian aid and assistance in the form of food stuffs and medicines.

The Foreign Minister's visit reflects Pakistan's consistent policy of supporting the brotherly Afghan people, deepening bilateral trade and economic relations, and facilitating closer people-to-people contacts, according to FO.

Vaccine Inequity Will Drag Covid Pandemic To 2022: WHO

he Covid-19 pandemic will drag on until 2022, longer than it needs to, because several poor countries have not received vaccines against the deadly infectious disease, the World Health Organization (WHO) has said.

In Africa, less than 5 per cent have been vaccinated, compared to 40 per cent on most other continents.

According to Bruce Aylward, senior leader at the WHO, this means the Covid crisis could "easily drag on deep into 2022", the BBC reported.

Aylward appealed to wealthy countries to give up their places in the queue for vaccines in order that pharmaceutical companies can prioritise the lowest-income countries instead.

He said that wealthy countries needed to "stocktake" where they were with their donation commitments made at summits such as

The vast majority of Covid vaccines have been given in highincome or upper middle-income countries. Africa accounts for just 2.6 per cent of doses administered globally.

The group of charities, which includes Oxfam and UNAIDS, also criticised Canada and the UK for procuring vaccines for their own populations via COVAX, the UNbacked global programme to distribute vaccines fairly, the report said.

COVAX was initiated so that all countries would be able to acquire vaccines from its pool, including wealthy ones, but most G7 countries decided to hold back once they started making their own one-to-one deals with pharmaceutical companies.

Canada and the UK were technically entitled to get vaccines via this route having paid into the



the G7 meeting in St. Ives earlier this year.

"I can tell you we're not on track. We really need to speed it up or you know what? This pandemic is going to go on for a year longer than it needs to," he said.

Just one in seven of the doses promised by pharmaceutical companies and wealthy countries are actually reaching their destinations in poorer countries, suggest new figures from The People's Vaccine -- an alliance of charities, the Covax mechanism, but it was still 'morally indefensible" given that they had both obtained millions of doses through their own bilateral agreements, Oxfam's Global Health Adviser, Rohit Malpani, was quoted as saying.


"They should not have been acquiring these doses from Covax," he said. "It's nothing better than double-dipping and means that poorer countries which are already at the back of the queue, will end up waiting longer."

Facebook Will Now Pay French Newspapers For Content On Users' Feed

Paris: Facebook said Thursday it had reached an agreement with some French newspapers to pay for news content shared by its users, months after Google announced plans to renumerate them for articles

Facebook said the licensing agreement with the APIG alliance of will be able to continue uploading and sharing news stories freely amongst their communities, whilst also

ensuring that the copyright of our publishing partners is protected." News outlets struggling with dwindling print subscriptions have long



In January, Google said it had reached a draft agreement with APIG to pay publishers for a selection of content shown in its searches.

The deal was seen as a victory for France's battle to protect the publishing rights of the press and news agencies. France was the first country in the EU to enact a 2019 EU directive

on these so-called neighbouring rights, but Google initially refused to comply, saying media groups already benefit by receiving millions of visits to their websites. Facebook said that, beside paying for French content, it would

also launch a French news service, Facebook News, in January to "give people a dedicated space to access content from trusted and reputable news sources.'

Australian Police Offer \$1 Million Reward For Missing 4-Year-Old Girl

ydney: Australian authorities on Thursday offered Aus\$1 million (US\$750.000) for information leading to the discovery of a missing fouryear-old girl feared abducted from a remote campsite last weekend.

Cleo Smith disappeared from her family's tent in Western Australia during the early hours of Saturday, sparking an extensive air, sea, and ground search.

But after six days of fruitlessly combing in the area surrounding the Blowholes campsite -- a coastal tourist spot about 1,000 kilometres (620 miles) north of Perth -- police said they were "urgently seeking" public assistance.

"Someone in our community knows what happened to Cleo. Someone has the knowledge that can help," Western Australia police deputy commissioner Col



Cleo Smith disappeared from her family's tent in Western Australia during the early hours of Saturday, sparking an extensive air, sea, and ground search.

"Now there's a million reasons why you need to come forward." Superintendent Detective Rod Wilde said the investigation

now "leads us to believe that she was taken from the tent". "We are hopeful that we will find Cleo alive. But we hold great fears for her safety," he told a

Donald Trump, banned on Twitter and FB, to launch his own social network

en months since being banned by so-cial medial companies following the January 6 Capitol Hill riots, former US president Donald Trump has now decided to launch his own social networking platform called "TRUTH Social."

The platform will be owned by Trump Media & Technology Group (TMTG), which also intends to launch a subscription video on demand service that will feature "non-woke" entertainment programming, the group said in

"I am excited to send out my first TRUTH on TRUTH Social very soon. TMTG was founded with a mission to give a voice to all," Trump said in a statement on Wednesday.

Trump said that Truth Social would "stand up to the tyranny of Big Tech". The platform will be available through an app on the Apple Store as a beta version for trial by "invited guests" in November and the company expects a full rollout in the first quarter of 2022.

"We live in a world where the Taliban has a huge presence on Twitter, yet your favourite American President has been silenced. This is



unacceptable," he continued

The Trump Media & Technology Group will merge with blank check company Digital Acquisition Corp to make TMTG a publiclylisted company, the statement said.

"The transaction values Trump Media & Technology Group at an initial enterprise value of \$875 Million, with a potential additional earnout of \$825 Million in additional shares (at the valuation they are granted) for a cumulative valuation of up to \$1.7 Billion depending on the performance of the stock price postbusiness combination," it stated. Trump was banned from the many social

media platforms— Twitter, Facebook and YouTube— after his supporters stormed the Capitol earlier this year—over concerns that he might further incite the mob with his continued presence on social media.

YouTube said its ban would be lifted after the "risk of violence" decreases, Facebook said Trump could come back to the platform at the soonest in 2023 and Twitter said its ban would be permanent.

Since then, Trump has been trying to reclaim his space on social networking sites.

In May he launched a blog called "From the Desk of Donald J. Trump," which was touted as a major new outlet.

But Trump, who was also banned from Instagram, and Snapchat, cancelled the blog just a month later.

He has been communicating through a constant stream of press releases with tweetlike statements to the media and supporters.

Time To Change The Tack

he exodus of Biharis following the killings of non-locals, two Kashmiri Pandits and one Sikh woman has created a sense of de javu in Kashmir. For some, it has transported us back to the early nineties when Kashmiri Pandits fled the Valley following killings of the members of the community by the militants. But for others, the prevailing dire situation is still retrievable. The truth is, no matter, how you look at it, the situation is very tricky and it could go either way. The killings, which include those of the Muslim civilians too, have certainly pushed the situation to the brink. And God forbid if the situation isn't reigned in quickly, we could be in for very difficult times ahead. So the government needs to take pro-active steps to pre-empt further killings. And the majority community, on their part, needs to assure the minorities, despite the fact that they are as helpless as the minorities in the existing state of affairs in the former state.

The responsibility, thus, squarely rests with both the central and the UT governments. It is time for them to nuance their approach to Jammu and Kashmir. An exclusively security-driven policy was expected to bring the militancy under control and also reign in the youthful protesters, leading to a realization that the resistance was futile. This, in turn, was expected to force people to settle for accommodation with New Delhi.

But as the last three years of BJP rule have proven, the policy has done little to bring peace to Kashmir. Instead, the situation has only gotten worse. The alienation is unprecedented. Far from ending the militancy, the last three years seem to have revived it. What is more, the security estimate puts the number of militants at around 200, the same it has been over the last five years.

True three years is not a long time for a policy to bear fruit. But if we go by the current situation, the existing policy has only ended up deepening the alienation in Kashmir. Hence the need to change the tack. If any policy has made a redeeming difference in Kashmir, it was a policy of reconciliation and engagement pursued by New Delhi from 2002 onwards to 2007. Ironically, the policy was begun by Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, a BJP leader, and taken forward by Prime Minister Manmohan Singh through his first term. The policy had greatly reduced militancy in the Valley and helped build momentum towards the redressal of the problems and issues in Kashmir. If anything is urgently needed to address today's Kashmir situation, it is to return to the same processes and policies.

ndia has done remarkably well to get to one billion Covid vaccine doses in less than 10 months, having roughly covered 75 per cent of the eligible adult population (above 18 years) with the first dose and 25 per cent with the second. It was not too long ago in the summer months that the pandemic was raging and vaccines were in short supply – with a total monthly output of less than 70 million doses, mainly Serum Institute's Covishield. The average number of vaccinations per day slipped from three million in April to about 1.5 million in May. Barely a quarter of the population had received its first dose. Now, over five million daily vaccinations have become the norm, as monthly production has increased to about 200 million doses (with Covishield accounting for 80 per cent and Covaxin most of the rest), something that seemed very distant in those bleak summer months.

It is no mean feat that health workers have managed to vaccinate populations in remote areas, braving hostile terrain and weather. Workers have encountered recalcitrant populations and talked them out of vaccine hesitancy – now no more or less than in the developed world'. The indigenously developed COWIN app, despite its teething problems, has proved its worth in managing the complex logistics and providing instant doses, it should be possible to rapidly raise the number of fully vaccinated. As vaccine supplies improve further by December, India should push forward on its responsibility and commitment to supply to COVAX and help improve vaccination rates in Africa, apart from expanding its neighbourhood Vaccine Maitri diplomacy. After all, no one is safe until everyone is safe.

Meanwhile, the government should move carefully on vaccinating the child population. The successful vaccination roll-out should not blind us to the fact that our public health infrastructure was shown up for its inadequacies. Governments, Centre and State, need to invest more in health facilities. As India celebrates its one-billionth dose today, we should not forget to praise our vaccine companies who rose to the occasion developing indigenous vaccines and producing large quantities 'at risk' even before approvals were given. But for them, it is doubtful if India could have managed to cover three-quarters of its large eligible population with at least one dose in just 10 months.



Mindful Fridays How To Help Someone With Non-Suicide Self-Injury?

he International Society for the Study of Self-Injury defines Non-Suicidal Self-Injury as the deliberate, self-inflicted damage of body tissue without suicidal intent and for purposes not socially or culturally sanctioned. Self-harm is a symptom, not a diagnosis, of mental illness. Some people may do self-harm as a result of a mental illness such depression, anxiety, an eating disorder, or psychosis, however, self-harm isn't always indicative of a mental illness, but rather of a lack of healthy coping methods to deal with emotions.

What to do if I have reason to believe that someone is self-injuring?

If you feel someone you care about is purposefully injuring themselves, you should talk to them about it. Recognize and address your own concerns about their selfharming behavior before approaching the person. If you're unable to communicate with the person who is self-injuring, attempt to find someone else who can.

Identify a private space for the discussion about such behavior. Express your concern that the person may be harming himself or herself. Inquire about selfinjury in a way that demonstrates to the person that you have some knowledge about self-injury so that they feel less judgmental, e.g., Say, "When people are in a lot of emotional distress, they sometimes harm themselves on purpose,". Is that how you got your injury?"

Self-injury is a very personal issue that is difficult to talk about. Demanding that someone talk about something they don't want to talk about isn't a good idea. A strong emotional response such as anger, fear, revulsion, or irritation should be avoided while having a conversation with such person. If the person is having psychiatric treatment, find out if their treating professional is aware of the injuries.

What do I do if I find someone causing self-employed by self injuring?

If you have got engaged with someone who is committing intentional selfharm, intervene in a helpful and nonjudgmental manner. When you learn that someone self-injures, it's natural to feel disturbed, helpless, and even angry Try to remain cool and avoid expressing shock or anger. Tell the person you care about them and ask if there is anything you can do to help them feel better. Inquire if medical assistance is required.

How do I approach someone who is deliberately Self-injuring?

WHEN SPEAKING WITH THE PERSON,

use 'I' statements rather than 'you' statements (e.g., "I feel worried/ angry/frustrated when you..." rather than "You make me feel worried/ angry/frustrated..."). Inquire about the person's self-injury, but don't press them to talk about it. Recognize the person's experience as they describe it to reflect what they're saying

Keep in mind that 'stopping self-injury' should not be the centre of the discussion. Instead, consider what can be done to make the person's life easier or their environment less stressful. Recognize that self-injury cannot be stopped instantly, and that people will require time to recover and figure out healthy coping mechanisms.

Be helpful and non-judgmental in your behavior. Recognize that self-injury makes a person's life less stressful and understand their motivations for doing so. Be supportive without condoning the behaviour. Be conscious of what your body language says about your attitudes towards self injury.

When speaking with the self injuring individual, use a cal voice. Avoid expressing frustration or a desire to punish the person for harming themselves. Allow the person time to comprehend what has been discussed by being available silently. Be prepared for strong emotions to be expressed by the self harming person.

What am I supposed to say?

Demonstrate concern and listen actively When speaking with the person, use 'I' statements rather than 'you' statements (e.g., "I feel worried/angry/frustrated when you..." rather than "You make me feel worried/angry/frustrated..."). Inquire about the person's self-injury, but don't press them to talk about it. Recognize the person's experience as they describe it to reflect what they're saying.

Provide assistance and reassurance Demonstrate empathy for the person's

feelings. Validate their emotions by telling them that their emotions are appropriate and valid. Tell them they are not alone and that

you are there to help them. Collaborate with the person to identify solutions (i.e., find out what they want to ensue and discuss any potential actions with them).

Reassure the individual that there are available sources of assistance and support. Inform the person that you wish to assist them and outline the methods in which you are willing to assist them. Don't pledge to keep the person's self-

injury a secret from them. Speak to them first, if you need to tell someone about a person's self-injury in order to keep them safe. Avoid gossiping or discussing it with others without their permission.

Don'ts when dealing with someone who is self-injuring themselves:

Do not:

- · Downplay the person's feelings or
- · Make statements that dismiss the person's suffering (for example, "but you've got a great life" or "things aren't that awful").
- · try to address the person's issues for
- Make physical contact with (e.g., hug or hold hands with) the person without their permission.
- Refer to the person as a 'selfmutilator, 'self-injurer,' or a
- · Accuse the individual of doing self-injury to seek attention.
- · Make the person feel guilty about the impact their self-harm is having on others.
- Make goals or pacts, such as "If you pledge not to damage yourself between now and next week, you're doing incredibly well," unless the person specifically requests you for
- · Provide the individual with drugs, prescription medicines, or alcoholic beverages.

What should I do if the person is not willing to talk about it?

Respect the individual's right to remain silent about their self-injury. If the person does not want to speak right away, tell them you will listen to them when they are ready. Inquire about what might help the person feel safe enough to talk about their feelings. Unless the injury is severe, do not press upon the matter. If the person still refuses to speak, seek assistance from a health professional on what to do.

How can I assist someone with Non-Suicidal Self Injury?

Seeking professional assistance

Self-injury is frequently a symptom of a treatable mental health disorder. Encourage the individual to seek professional assistance. Allow them to retain as much control over the decision of obtaining assistance as possible. Rather than telling the person what to do, suggest and

> help. Assist the individual in developing a plan of action for getting assistance. Discuss how you can assist them in seeking therapy and who they can talk to, such as a mental health service or a mental health professional such as a clini-

explore choices for getting

cal psychologist/ psychiatrist. Praise the individual on any steps he or she takes toward seekprofessional

help. Follow up with the person to see if they've found professional help that's right for them.

You should seek mental health assistance on their behalf if:

- · If the individual requests you to
- The harm is severe or getting worse, such as cuts getting deeper or bones broken
- The self-injurious behaviour is interfering with everyday living
- · The person has caused damage to their eyes.
- · The individual has caused injuries to their genitals.
- The individual has voiced a desire

It's important to remember that not everyone who self-injures wants to

change their ways. Although you can offer assistance but you are not responsible for their conduct or behaviour and have no influence over what they do.

If the individual is a teenager, a more guided approach may be required. Assist the adolescent in developing a plan of action for obtaining help and offer to accompany them to an appointment.

When is it important to seek urgent medical intervention?

Don't over-react; seek medical assistance from medical emergency services only if the harm is severe. Any gaping cut necessitates medical treatment, as it may require sutures. Any burn with a diameter of two centimetres or more, as well as any burn on the hands, feet, or face, necessitates medical treatment. Call an ambulance if the person has hurt themselves by taking an overdose of medication or swallowing poison, as the risk of death or serious harm is significant. Deliberate overdose is usually intended to kill, although it can also be a form of self-injury. Irrespective of one's

intentions behind such acts, emergency

medical help must be sought.

Since self-injury is an indication that the person has difficulty in handling their distress, encourage them to look for different ways to cope with their distress. Help the person employ coping mechanisms that do not need selfinjury, and assist them in developing a plan for what to do when they feel like self-injuring. Recommend some coping skills and talk with the person about what would be beneficial to them.

Encourage them to utilise any good coping approach that helps them overcome the desire to self-injure. When the individual is distressed and has the temptation to self-injure, encourage them to communicate their feelings with others, such as a close friend or family member. Help the person consider strategies to alleviate their distress, such as taking a hot bath, listening to loud music, or doing something nice for oneself. Provide the individual with information materials (such as a website or leaflet) regarding alternatives to self-injury.

Team India: Responding To Adversity With Achievement

ndia completed vaccination of 100 crore doses on 21st October 2021, in just about 9 months since starting vaccination. This has been a tremendous journey in dealing with Covid-19, especially when we recall how things stood in early 2020. In early 2020, when Covid-19 was rampaging across the world, it was clear to us that this pandemic will have to be eventually fought with the help of vaccines. We started preparing early. We constituted expert groups and started preparing a roadmap right from April 2020.

Till today, only a handful of countries have developed their own vaccines. More than 180 countries are dependent on an extremely limited pool of producers and dozens of nations are still waiting for the supply of vaccines, even as India has crossed 100 crore doses! Imagine the situation if India did not have its own vaccine. How would have India secured enough vaccines for such a large population and how many years would that have taken? It is here that credit should be given to Indian scientists and entrepreneurs for rising to the occasion. It is due to their talent and hard-work that India is truly Aatmanirbhar when it comes to vaccines. Our vaccine manufacturers, by scaling up to meet the demands of such a large population, have shown that they are second to none.

In a nation where governments used to be known as a roadblock impeding forward movement, our government has instead been an accelerator and enabler of progress. The government partnered with the vaccine makers right from day one and gave them support in the form of institutional assistance, scientific research, funding, as well as accelerated regulatory processes. All ministries of the government came together to facilitate the vaccine makers and remove any bottlenecks as a result of our 'whole of Government' approach.

This entails the deployment of thousands of trips taken by flights and trains. During this entire journey, the temperature has to be maintained in a particular range which is centrally monitored. For this, over 1 lakh cold-chain equipments were utilized. States were given advance notice of the delivery schedule of the vaccines so that they could plan their drives better and vaccines reached them on the pre-decided days. This has been an unprecedented effort in the history of independent India. All these efforts were complemented

by a robust tech platform in CoWIN. It ensured that the vaccine drive was equitable, scalable, trackable, and transparent. This ensured that there was no scope for favouritism or jumping the queue. It also ensured that a poor worker could take first dose in his village and the second dose of the same vaccine in the city where he works, after the required time interval. In addition to a real-time dashboard to boost transparency, the QR-coded certificates ensured verifiability. There are hardly any examples of such efforts not only in India but also the world.

In my Independence Day Address in 2015, I had said that our country is moving ahead because of 'Team India' and this 'Team India' is a big team of our 130 crore people. People's participation is the biggest strength of democracy. If we run the country through the participation of 130 crore Indians, our country will be moving ahead 130 crore steps every moment. Our vaccination drive has yet again showed the power of this 'Team India'. India's success in its vaccination drive has also demonstrated to the whole world that 'democracy can deliver'.

This AI tech may spot unseen signs of heart failure

S researchers have developed an electrocardiogram-reading algorithm that can detect subtle signs of heart failure.

Heart failure, or congestive heart failure, occurs when the heart pumps less blood than the body normally needs. For years, doctors have relied heavily on an imaging technique called an echocardiogram to assess whether a patient may be experiencing heart failure.

While helpful, echocardiograms can be labour-intensive procedures that are only offered at select hospitals.

In the study, the researchers at Mount Sinai described the development of an artificial intelligence (AI)-based computer algorithm that not only assessed the strength of the left ventricle but also the right ventricle, which takes deoxygenated



blood streaming in from the body and pumps it to the lungs.

The algorithm was 94 per cent accurate at predicting which patients had a healthy ejection fraction and 87 per cent accurate at predicting those who had an ejection fraction that was below 40 per cent.

The algorithm also learned to detect right valve weaknesses from

the electrocardiograms with 84 per cent accuracy at predicting which patients had weak right valves.

"We showed that deep-learning algorithms can recognise blood pumping problems on both sides of the heart from ECG waveform data," said Benjamin S. Glicksberg, Assistant Professor of Genetics and Genomic Science at Mount Sinai

For the study, published in the 'Journal of the American College of Cardiology: Cardiovascular Imaging', the team programmed a computer to read patient electrocardiograms along with data extracted from written reports summarising the results of corresponding echocardiograms taken from the same

In this situation, the written reports acted as a standard set of data for the computer to compare with the electrocardiogram data and learn how to spot weaker hearts.

"Our results suggest that this algorithm could be a useful tool for helping clinical practitioners combat heart failure suffered by a variety of patients," added Glicksberg. "We are in the process of carefully designing prospective trials to test out its effectiveness in a more realworld setting."

Online abuse: Banning anonymous social media accounts is not the answer

In the wake of the tragic death of the Member of Parliament for Southend West. David Amess, fellow MPs have been talking about how to best protect both politicians and the public from abuse and harm.

This has included a strong focus on enacting laws designed to halt online abuse, even though police have not linked Amess's killing to this issue directly.

There have been suggestions that such abuse can be attributed, at least in part, to online anonymity that is, the fact many social media users set up their accounts using aliases, and without images that reveal who they are, in order to conceal their identity.

Speaking on Sky News, Home Secretary Priti Patel indicated there was a need to address anonymous accounts. Asked if she would consider legislation to remove the right to anonymity on social media, Patel responded: I want us to look at everything. And there is work taking place already

I spend too much time actually with communities who have been under attack basically, who have had all sorts of postings put online, and it's a struggle to get those postings taken down. We want to make some big changes on that.

[...] But we can't carry on

like this.

The idea has since gained traction, with other MPs calling for a ban on anonymous social media accounts as a way to mitigate online abuse.

Yet while it's clear there is a need to address how we engage with and on social media, removing anonymity isn't going to solve the problems of online abuse. In fact, removing the right to anonymity online could cause harm to many users, especially those from marginalised groups.

Anonymity as a form of

While there are many examples of people using anonymous social media accounts to abuse others online, it's equally clear that anonymity can be a lifeline to many users and communities. Posting anonymously can allow people to protect themselves - to openly discuss and deal with complex

topics safely. It can allow people to speak out about abuse, and seek information.

For example, social media users in LGBTQIA+ communities have spoken about the importance of online anonymity as a way to negotiate discussions of sexuality safely, where disclosing their name might put them at significant risk of abuse and harm online and offline

Some said anonymity allowed them to access valuable information online as they navigated their own identities.

In my own research for my 2020 book about social media design and identity, my participants talked about the many ways in which they felt anonymity helped them to develop a sense of community.

India Hopes China Will Work With It To Bring 'Satisfactory Resolution' To Current Issues: FS

NEW DELHI: Asserting that peace and tranquillity in the border areas is a "sine qua non" for India and China to work together, Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla on Thursday said New Delhi hopes that Beijing will work with it to bring a satisfactory resolution to the current issues, keeping in view each other's sensitivities and interests.

In his remarks at a seminar on "Leveraging China's Economy", Shringla also said the developments along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in Eastern Ladakh have "seriously disturbed" the peace and tranquillity in border areas, and this has obviously had an impact on the broader relationship too.

The foreign secretary also referred to External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar's remarks that the ability of India and China to work together will determine the Asian century.

"For this to materialise, peace and tranquillity in the border areas is a sine qua non. He (Jaishankar) has also clearly articulated that development of our ties can only be based on mutuality -- mutual respect, mutual sensitivity and mutual interests should guide this process," Shringla said.

"We hope that the Chinese



side will work with us to bring a satisfactory resolution to the current issues so as to make progress on our bilateral relations keeping in view each other's sensitivities, aspirations and interests," the foreign secretary said.

The border standoff between the Indian and Chinese militaries erupted on May 5 last year following a violent clash in the Pangong lake areas and both sides gradually enhanced their deployment by rushing in tens of thousands of soldiers as well as heavy weaponry.

As a result of a series of military and diplomatic talks, the

two sides completed the disengagement process in the Gogra area in August and in the north and south banks of the Pangong lake in February.

Each side currently has around 50,000 to 60.000 troops along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) in the sensitive sector, according to sources.

In his remarks, Shringla also talked about the issues of concerns in the Sino-India trade relationship such as the widening trade deficit and increase in trade barriers.

"China is our largest neighbour. With its GDP reaching USD economy is the second-largest in the world. Under the shadow of ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, China is the only major economy to have registered positive growth in 2020," he said.

Being the largest contributor to world trade and our largest trading partner, it is imperative for us to have a better understanding of China's economy, Shringla said

He noted that India's relations generally followed a positive trajectory since 1988 when the two country's re-established contacts at the highest level.

"We were engaged in developing a broad-based bilateral relationship. The advancement of ties in this period was clearly predicated on ensuring that peace and tranquillity were not disturbed. The areas of cooperation were not limited to bilateral but also had regional and global dimensions." he said.

It was also recognised that relations between India and China were in the interest of not only our two countries but also in the interest of peace, stability and security in the region and world at large, Shringla said at the seminar organised by the Centre for Contemporary China Studies.

Noting that last year, the total trade volume between the two countries was around USD first nine months of this year, the bilateral trade touched USD 90 billion, an increase of 49 per cent over last year.

"At this rate, we are likely to attain the highest ever bilateral trade between two countries,'

The trade, however, remains unbalanced with a large trade balance in favour of China, Shringla said.

"Our trade deficit concerns are two-fold the first is the actual size of the deficit. The trade deficit for the nine months period stood at USD 47 billion. This is the largest trade deficit we have with any country. Second, is the fact that the imbalance has continuously been widening," the foreign secretary said.

There are a number of market access impediments including a whole host of non-tariff barriers, for most of our agricultural products and the sectors we are competitive in, such as pharmaceutical, IT/ITES, etc., he said.

"We have highlighted that widening deficit and increase in trade barriers are issues of concern. These have been regularly flagged at the highest level, most recently at the 2nd Informal Summit between our Prime Minister (Narendra Modi) and the Chinese President in Chennai in 2019," Shringla said.

Notably, the crackdown on the two-wheelers has also coincided with the three-day scheduled visit of Home Minister, Amit Shah to the Valley, starting on October 23. In the same issue, huge deployment on the roads, increased frisking of passersby, surprise stopping and checking of vehicles was seen.

But apparently, the crackdown on bikes in the valley has dismayed a huge number of civilians that have termed this overnight crackdown by Police as 'absurd'.

"I'd all the necessary documents on me but I was still stopped by the cops and asked to park my bikes inside the Police station." Manpreet Singh, a non-local carpenter told Kashmir Observer.

"I've nothing to do with the recent killings nor am I interested in any violence, then why am I being made to pay for someone else's crime? I've come all the way from Punjab to earn a living for my people but the police here are creating hurdles for us to live a normal life by coming up with this nonsense crackdown

here in Kashmir," he added. It is pertinent to mention here that police's crackdown came into action on Monday when they started confiscating hundreds of bikes at various locations in the Srinagar city and since then, the crackdown has been going on for

three consecutive days. "I was stopped in the middle of the road and without even checking my documents; I was forced to park my scooty inside the Police station premises.'

Shah Ibtisam, who has been waiting outside the Ram Munshi Bagh PS since noon, told Kashmir Observer. "What is my fault? I've all the necessary documents but without even checking them, the police declared us 'Criminal'. Is this what law permits them to do? This is gross

He further added, "There are more than a hundred people waiting outside the Police station but none from the police is willing to resolve our queries but rather they're trying to increase our problems by not allowing us to even explain ourselves."

The ongoing crackdown has not only created a sense of panic and anger among bikers but has also hampered the normal functioning of small scale businesses in the city. Talking to Kashmir Observer, an owner of a

delivery service said that Police's "absurd" action against bikers has cost many people their daily wages.

"Since Tuesday, dozens of my delivery agents have called and complained that the police are confiscating their bikes without any specific reasons." Qazi Amaan said

"These bikes are how these guys earn a living and feed their families. The police should understand that by confiscating their bikes, they re not only augmenting our iosses but also creating financial issues for these delivery agents. He further added that if none of these bikers

had any role in the recent targeted killings then why are they being made to suffer. "If this police crackdown continues, these delivery agents will have to guit their jobs and look for something else that doesn't require a bike." 'I was stopped by cops and immediately

without even looking at my papers, they seized my bike without providing any reason," said Kashmir Observer staffer, Irfan Dar "When I asked them to provide any specific

reason behind this, they replied this is an order and asked me to come with them to Maisuma Police Station.'

According to the eyewitnesses, the crackdown on bikes, continued for the third day in the jurisdiction of several police stations in the city including Kral Khud, Maisuma, Foreshore Road, Nishat, Barzulla, Rajbagh, Mehjoor Nagar, Rambagh, TRC and Sonwar.\

The exchange of gunfire continued for several minutes before the guns fell silent.

"It looks like the militants had managed to escape from the cordoned area using the dense dark as cover," a Police official told Kashmir

The Roshni Act was brought in by the Farooq Abdullah government with the aim of granting proprietary rights to occupants of state land in lieu of charges. The money thus generated was to be used for setting up hydroelectric power plants in the erstwhile state.

However, the scheme was disbanded after the Jammu and Kashmir High Court declared

it illegal and directed the CBI to investigate the beneficiaries of the scheme.

In November last year, the Jammu and Kashmir administration named former chief ministers Farooq Abdullah and Omar Abdullah in a list of scheme beneficiaries and alleged a residential house in Jammu was built on illegally-possessed land.

Indian Delegation Meets Taliban Team In Moscow

of the Pakistan-Afghanistan-Iran division of the Ministry of External Affairs, which was here to attend the Moscow Format meeting at the invitation of Russia, held talks with the Taliban leaders on the sidelines of the conference. Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Muiahid said in a brief statement. There was no official word from Indian government on the meeting.

India had its first formal contact with the Taliban in Doha on August 31. However, the meeting on Wednesday was the first formal contact between the two sides after an interim Cabinet was announced by the Taliban last month.

The Indian side expressed readiness to provide extensive humanitarian assistance to Afghanistan, Mujahid was quoted as saying by Afghanistan's

India has in the past provided assistance both for infrastructure as well as for humanitarian purposes to Afghanistan.

The two sides also emphasised the need to take into account each other's concerns and improve diplomatic and economic relations, Mujahid said.

The Moscow format was established in 2017, based on a six-party consultation mechanism of the special envoys of Russia, Afghanistan, India, Iran, China and Pakistan to address Afghan issues. Several rounds of talks have been held in Moscow since 2017.

This was the first Mo mat dialogue since the Afghanistan by the Tali The Taliban seize

Afghanistan on August 15, two weeks before the US was set to complete its troop withdrawal after a costly two-decade war.

During the Moscow Format meeting, Hanafi called on the international community to recognise Afghanistan's interim government, which is dominated by the Taliban's established leaders, including those who are on the UN blacklist.

"Afghanistan's isolation is not in anyone's interests. And this has been proven in the past," he was quoted as saying by the Afghan news agency Khaama Press.
