# 3 more bodies recovered from avalanche site in Kulan

SRINAGAR: After retrieving dead bodies of a son father duo, caught under an avalanche, which hit Kulan area of Ganderbal district on Monday, rescue workers recovered three more bodies from the avalanche site on Tuesday. With the recovery of three more bodies, the death toll so far in the incident has reached to five.

Several other people were injured in the incident, while six persons were rescued alive from under the snow, which are all undergoing treatment presently.

According to CNS the bodies of those recovered on Tuesday, include the body of Ishtiyak Tikri, another son of the person Sadiq Tikri R/O was recovered on Monday, along with the dead body of his son Showkat Tikri.

GANDERBAL : District Administration Ganderbal informed that five people have died after coming under an avalanche at Gund Kullan in district Ganderbal on Monday.

Giving the details, DDC Ganderbal, Hashmat Ali Khan said soon after receiving the information about the incident, a search and rescue operation began in the area, following which the operation team rescued the four persons and retrieved the two dead bodies.

He said the rescue operations was carried jointly by District Administration and Police throughout the night amid heavy snowfall. He said the rescue operations were halted for some time due to heavy snowfall and later on three more bodies were recovered. After completing legal medico formalities, the DDC, who supervised the rescue operations during the whole night, said bodies were handed over to families.

# No snow clearance in Sonawari this season

SRINAGAR: A group of locals told CNS, while appealing Anti Corruption Bureau (ACB) to investigate the matter and take action against the corrupt officers of the department. They requested ACB to seize all the records of Sumbal R&B office and check the accounts for the alleged embezzlement of lacs of rupees by raising the fake the bills. According to CNS no snow

clearing operation has so far been conducted in many areas of Sumbal Sonawari,

which include Hajin, Markandal, Bahrabad, Shilwat, Gund Jahangir, where roads were covered with snow till late Tuesday afternoon, while no snow clearance operation was conducted, due to which people of these areas are cut off from other parts of the valley. Local people further alleged that since November 2019, in

no situation of snowfall in this season snow was cleared by the department from various roads of the area, but the local

Assistant Executive Engineer (AEE), while raising fake bills has fraudulently looted the public money.

Carrying on their allegations against the concerned AEE the locals further said that if at all snow was removed from some selected roads, instead of using relevant machines, tractors and ICs were used for the purpose, resulting in heavy damage to the macadam surface of the roads.

"Even here the thickness of

snow removed from the roads was fudged and an estimate, quite varying to the factual thickness of the snow was prepared and huge amounts were withdrawn". they added.They requested ACB to have a look on the estimates of snow clearance by the department to find the facts for themselves. I Don't Want To Fill Jails: Farooq

# 'My orders to the police; wherever you find a militant, kill him'

SRINAGAR : The chief minister, Dr Faroog Abdul-lah, today said that his gov-ernment would give mili-tants no quarter and hinted 'extraordinary security measures' to be undertaken in the state very soon. Speaking today at a gather¬ing at the residence of former minister and National Confer-ence MLA, Muhammad Dilawar Mir, whose brother was gunned down by unidentified gunmen at Rohama in Rafiabad yesterday, he said, "I don't want to fill jails. My orders to the police are; wherever you find a militant, dispatch him.

According to Dr. Abdullah, militants were killing innocent people and therefore deserved to be paid in the same coin.

Referring to a meeting he had had with prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, he said that he had told him that militants had not stopped killing innocents despite the prime minister's talk of peace. "Make one final push and fin-ish the matter off, I told the prime minis-ter.'

He said that he had presented his formula long ago: Kashmir is an integral part of India; Pakistan should be given the territory under its control and the LoC converted into an international border; the Rawalpindi road should be opened: Kashmiris should be given internal autonomy -and the Kashmir issue will dissolve automatically.

"India will never give up Kashmir even if all Kashmiris per-ish." Desisting from his customary tirade against the Hurriyat, he said the APHC leader's visit to Paki-stan would not alter the LoC. "I want to see how the Pakista-nis react." Later, talking to NAFA, Dr. Abdullah said that he would be talking to the PM and the HM soon, and extraordinary secu-rity measures would be put in place after that. "We will not al-low our campaign against mili-tants to be slackened," he said.
