3.6 Magnitude **Quake Jolts Ladakh**

Srinagar: An earthquake measuring 3.6 on the Richter scale hit the mountainous Ladakh Union Territory on Tuesday. "The medium intensity earthquake occurred at 11:25 am in Ladakh region,' A MeT official said, adding "The coordinates of the earthquake were latitude 32.6 degrees north and longitude 78.9 degrees east," The depth of the quake, the official said was 16 kilometers. The official said that there were no reports of any damage due to the moderate intensity quake.

3 Gamblers Arrested In Ganderbal

Srinagar: Police on Tuesday claimed to have arrested three gamblers in a raid in central Kashmir's Ganderbal district. A police spokesperson said that on a credible input, a police party raided a gambling site in Khalmulla area and arrested three gamblers besides recovering stake amount of Rs 24000/- and mobile phones from them. Police identified the trio as Mohammad Idress Khan of Karan Nagar, Mohammad Amin Naqash of Buchpora and Shabir Ahmad Sheikh of Upper Soura. "Case FIR No. 12/2020 under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Ganderbal," the police spokesperson added.

CB Files Case Against JKPCC Officials

LOC FLARE UP

Indo, Pak Troops Trade **Fire For Third Straight Day**

JAMMU: India and Pakistan troops exchanged heavy gunfire for the third consecutive day Tuesday along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir, a day after a civilian was killed and four others injured in the crossborder skirmishes.

According to reports, India and Pakistan troops traded heavy gunfire along the LoC in Poonch and Gurez sector of the Valley since early morning.

The Pakistan army resorted to unprovoked firing and shelling along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district, a defence spokesman said.

The latest ceasefire violation comes a day after a 60-year-old man was killed and four people were injured in Pakistani shelling along the LoC in Tangdhar sector of Kupwara district.

Ex-PDP MLA, **Trade Leader** Released

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir administration on Tuesday released a former PDP legislator and a trade leader from preventive detention, officials said.

With the release of the two leaders, the number of people now under detention at the MLA hostel is 15. The hostel has been temporarily converted into a subsidiary jail.

Former PDP MLA from Wachi in south Kashmir Aijaz Ahmad Mir and trade leader Shakeel Ahmed Qalandar, who is former president of the Federation Chamber of Industries Kashmir, were released two days after the administration had released four politicians from preventive custody at the MLA hostel on Sunday.

The released politicians on Sunday comprised three from the National Conference and one from the PDP. These leaders were part of preventive detention carried out on mainstream politicians, activists and trade leaders after August 5 last year when the Centre withdrew the special status of the erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir state and bifurcated it into union territories -- Ladakh and Jammu and Kashmir.
