MILAN: Cristiano Ronaldo's injury-time penalty grabbed Juventus a 1-1 draw at AC Milan in their Italian Cup semi-final, first leg as his incredible scoring run continued. The 35-year-old has now scored 12 goals in his last eight games in all competitions in the 61st minute, though, as Castillejo's clipped after the Portuguese ultimately got the better of old rival Zlatan Ibrahimovic despite being largely anonymous for much of the match. Milan paid for Theo Hernandez's 71st-minute red card on Thursday as they failed to close out a game they had dominated for long periods and led through Ante Rebic.
