CASO Carried Out In Pulwama

Srinagar: Government forces on Tuesday carried out a cordon and search operation in several villages of south Kashmir's Pulwama district. A joint team of Army, CRPF and police laid a siege around Murran, Miatregam, Drubgam and Rajpora villages in Pulwama district this morning and launched a search operation, a local newsgathering agency CNS reported. During the daylong operation, forces paraded the people of these villages and checked their identity cards, the report said. Forces also conducted house to house searches: however there was no information about any arrests from these villages.

School Boy Drowns In Dal Lake

Srinagar: A school boy died of drowning in the interiors of Dal Lake when he was on way to his school on Tuesday morning. The tragic incident occurred this morning when 8-year-old Faizan Hussain slipped from the veranda of his dilapidated house in Kand Mohalla locality and fell into the Dal Lake, a local newsgathering agency KNT reported today. The report said that the efforts of the locals to save the boy from drowning did not yield any results. His body was fished out from the Lake after half an hour. Meanwhile, Police visited the spot and registered a case in this regard.

JK Cong Dissolves Baramulla Unit

Jammu: The Jammu and Kashmir Congress on Tuesday dissolved its Baramulla district unit, a party spokesman said. Kashmir A 'Big **Problem' Between India And Pak: Trump**

NEW DELHI: US President Donald Trump on Tuesday described the Kashmir issue as a big problem" and a "thorn" for a long time, and offered to mediate in de-escalating tensions between India and Pakistan.

However, he clarified that he is not offering to mediate on the Kashmir issue.

At a packed press conference, the US president also said ways to deal with terrorism figured prominently in his talks with Prime Minister Narendra Modi who, Trump stressed, is determined to check the menace.

"We talked a lot about Pakistan. I have a very good relationship with Prime Minister Khan. We talked about it today at length with Prime Minister Modi. Kashmir obviously is a big problem between India and Pakistan; they are going to work out their problem. They have been doing it for a long time," Trump said.

He further added: "We just hope, and I just said I'll do what-

ever I have to do, if I can do that because my relationship with both gentlemen is so good. But there has been difficulty in Pakistan. We are seeing what we can do about it. Anything I can do to mediate, anything I can do to help I would do."

Later, asked about India's rejection of his earlier offer to mediate on Kashmir, the US president said he is not offering to mediate on the issue.

"Kashmir has been a thorn in a lot of people's sides for a long time. There are two sides to every story," said Trump.

When asked about the controversial Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA) that has triggered a wave of violent protests across the India, Trump said that he won't comment on it.

"I'll leave that up to India and hopefully they will do the right thing," he said

Earlier, he spoke a little more about religious freedom and his discussions with PM Modi. "We did talk about religious freedom. The PM said he wants people to have religious freedom. They have worked really hard >> PAGE 10
