RKFC's complaint included a statement of driver Riyaz Ahmed who had ferried the referees from a local hotel. The driver alleged that the referees had a "conversation to teach RKFC a lesson" in Monday's match. Former minister and senior politician Usman Majid, who witnessed the match, expressed his disappointment with the refereeing.
