Fresh Traffic Allowed On Kashmir Highway

Srinagar: The authorities on Tuesday allowed fresh traffic on the Srinagar-Jammu highway after clearing the votal road link, connecting Valley with rest of the country, of stranded vehicles. Traffic today plied from Srinagar to Jammu today after all the vehicles starnded on the strategic 270-km highway were cleared by the officials, a police official said today. The highway was closed for traffic on Saturday after heavy rain triggered shooting stones on the Ramban-Banihal stretch.

Nursing Student Found Dead In Soura

Srinagar: A Nursing student on Tuesday was found dead at her rented house in Srinagar outskirts. The female student (name withheld) was found dead at her rented accommodation in Soura locality of the city outskirts this morning, news agency KNT reported. The slain was a student of a private college here. She was a native of South Kashmir's Dooru. Meanwhile, a police official said that prima facie, it seems a natural death, however, they have registered a case for investigation.

CRPF Trooper Injured In Pulwama Grenade Attack



SRINAGAR: A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) trooper was injured on Tuesday after militants lobbed a grenade on police station Kakpora in south Kashmir's Pulwama district.

Sonu Kumar of CRPF 41 batallion sustained splinter injuries when militants lobbed a grenade inside the police station Kakpora this evening, a police offiical told news agency GNS.

The injured trooper was shifted to hospital for treatment, the official said. Soon after the blast, the cops manning the main gate fired several shots in air triggering panic in the area. The state forces also launched search operation in the area to nab the attackers, the report said.

Threat Of Coronavirus Pandemic 'Has Become Very Real', Says WHO

GENEVA: The coronavirus is closer to causing a pandemic butoutbreaks in countries can still be controlled through a combination of containment and mitigation measures, the World Health Organisation (WHO) said on Monday.

"Now that the virus has a foothold in so manycountries, the threat of a pandemic has become very real," Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus, WHO director-general, told a news conference. "But it would be the first pandemic that could be controlled.

The bottom line is we are not at the mercy of the virus."Four countries account for 93% of the nearly 110,000 cases worldwide, Tedros said.

'We are encouraged that Italy is taking aggressive measures to contain its epidemic and we hope that those measures prove effective in the coming days," he

ACB To Get **Economic** Offences Wing

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory administration on Tuesday ordered the establishment of an independent Economic Offences Wing (Eow) in the Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB)

According to the order issued by GAD, the wing will have headquarters at Jammu and 56 posts will be created which shall form part of the Wing.

The EOW shall have one post of Superintendent of Police ,one Senior Prosecuting Officer, three Deputy Superintendents, three Prosecuting Officers, 10 posts of Inspector and Sub-Inspector each . The Wing also shall have five posts of Junior Scale Stenographer, 20 posts of Constable and three posts of Orderly The method of recruitment for filling up of these posts shall be notified separately, the order said.
