**Civilian Injured In Cross-LoC Firing** 

Jammu: A middle-aged man on Saturday was injured when India and Pakistan troops traded gunfire along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district of Jammu and Kashmir. Mohammad Rafiq was hit by a bullet from across the border outside his house at Gohlad village in Mendhar sector, officials said. The officials said Rafig was evacuated to a local hospital and is undergoing treatment for an injury in his thigh. They said Pakistan resorted to unprovoked small arms firing in the sector, prompting retaliation by the Indian Army. The cross-border firing between the two sides lasted for sometime, the officials said.

#### Avalanche warning issued in J&K, Ladakh

Jammu: Authorities on Saturday issued a medium and a low danger avalanche warning for high altitude areas of various districts of the twin Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, an official said. The medium danger avalanche warning has been issued for Poonch, Rajouri, Reasi, Ramban, Doda, Kishtwar and Udhampur districts of Jammu region and Kupwara and Bandipora districts of north Kashmir besides Kargil district in Ladakh, Director of Disaster Management, Jammu and Kashmir, Aamir Ali said. #### **Minor Falls From Tractor**, Dies

Srinagar: A minor on Saturday was killed after he fell from a tractor in Qazigund area of South Kashmir's Anantnag district. Seven-year-old Muneeb Ahmad Ganie of Mandhole village received serious injuries when he fell down from a tractor, news agency KNO reported. The locals removed the injured minor to the Public Health Centre (PHC) Vessu where he was declared brought dead.

# India Declares COVID-19 'Notified **Disaster', Many Public Places Shut**

NEW DELHI: The Central government has decided to treat coronavirus as a "notified disaster" for the purpose of providing assistance under the State Disaster **Response Fund (SDRF) and has** announced an ex-gratia payment of Rs 4 lakhs to families of those who die of the infection.

The disaster management division of the Union Home Ministry has issued a letter to the Chief Secretaries of all the states.

The letter states, "The Central government, keeping in view the spread of COVID-19 virus in India and the declaration of COVID-19 as a pandemic by the World Health Organisation (WHO), by way of a special one-time dispensation, has decided to treat it as a notified disaster for the purpose of providing assistance under SDRF".

The home ministry said funds earmarked under the State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) can be utilised for procurement of essential equipment and measures taken to quarantine people.

Two persons -- a 76-year-old man from Karnataka and a 68-year-old woman in Delhi -have died from coronavirus, which has been declared a global pandemic by WHO and has >> PAGE 10

## Pak To Join Video Conference Of SAARC Nations

**NEW DELHI:** Pakistan on Saturday agreed to participate in the meeting of the SAARC nations through video conferencing to discuss measures to tackle the deadly coronavirus pandemic that has

killed over 5,000 people across the globe. According to reports, Pakistan agreed to Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's proposal to attend the meet aimed to discuss tackling of the pandemic. Pakistan's response to the proposal came late in the night with the country's Foreign Office Spokesperson Aisha Farooqui saying the threat of CO-VID-19 required coordinated efforts at global and regional levels.

"We have communicated that SAPM (Special Assistant to Pakistani Prime Minister) on Health (Zafar Mirza) will be available to participate in the video conference of SAARC member countries on the issue," she said

**Kashmir Highway Remains Closed For Third Consecutive Day**

Jammu-Srinagar National Highway remained closed for the third consecutive day on Saturday as multiple landslides overnight hampered the restoration work, officials said.

The highway, the only all-weather road linking Kashmir with the rest of the country, was closed for traffic on Thursday after heavy rains triggered landslides, leaving more than 3,000 Srinagar-bound vehicles stranded.

**JAMMU:** A TADA court in Jammu on Saturday said there was enough evidence to prosecute Jammu and Kashmir Liberation Front (JKLF) chairman Yasin Malik and six others over the killing of four Indian Air Force officers in Kashmir in 1990.

The court said that prima facia there was enough evidence to prosecute all of them, reports said.
