Militants Attack CRPF Post In Pulwama

Srinagar: Unknown militants on Thursday opened fire upon CRPF troopers in south Kashmir's Pulwama district. Militants appeared in Belav village of the district and fired dozens of rounds towards the picket of CRPF 183 Battalion, news agency KNT reported today. The troopers, report said returned the fire as the militants managed to flee from the spot. The brief shootout. sources told KNT triggered panic in the village. Soon after the incident, government forces cordoned off the area and launched a cordon and search operation, the report said.

2 Cops Killed In Reasi Accident
