### Indian Soldier Killed In Cross LoC Firing **Observer News Service**

SRINAGAR: An army man was killed in cross-border firing along the Line of Control (LoC) in Sunderbani Sector of Rajouri district in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said Friday.

Pakistan troops on Thursday night opened fire upon Indian posts along the LoC in Sunderbani sector of the border district, they said. Indian troops guarding the border mounted a befitting retaliation to the unprovoked firing by Pakistan troops. In the cross-LoC firing, a solider

identified as Havaldar Mathiazhagan P was critically injured. A resident of Sreerangai Kadu

village in Tamil Nadu, the injured soldier was removed to the nearby army hospital for treatment, where he succumbed to his injuries.

Fear has heightened among villagers along the LoC in Rajouri, Poonch and Kupwara since three civilians were killed in April this year in shelling by Pakistan. There were a total of 646 incidents of ceasefire violation along the International Border (IB) as well as the LoC between January 1 and February 23 this year, Minister of State for Defence Shripad Naik said in March. • P-02

# **5 Doctors, 7 Pregnant Women Among 182 Fresh Positive Cases**

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Friday recorded another big jump in Covid-19 cases, as 182 more people, including five doctors and seven pregnant women tested positive for virus, taking the number of infected persons in the Union Territory to 3324. While 108 cases were reported

from the Valley, 74 others came positive from Jammu province. In Valley, Shopian district

topped the new cases tally as 42 people tested Covid-19 positive from the south Kashmir district. Srinagar reported 22 fresh cases, while Kupwara had 13, Budgam 9, Baramulla 7, Anantnag 6, Bandipora 4, Kulgam and Pulwama districts 2 each and Ganderbal reported on a new single case of coronavirus.

Similarly, Udhampur in Jammu province reported 26 new cases, Ĵammu district 12, Ramban and Kathua 11 each, Doda 5, Samba 4, Rajouri and Poonch 2 each while Reasi reported a single case today. At the Chest Diseases hospital here, 64 reports came **PAGE 02**

## Shah Faesal, Madni Placed **Under 'House Arrest'**

SRINAGAR: IAS officer-turned-politician Shah Faesal and two PDP members, including the maternal uncle of former chief minister Mehbooba Mufti, who were released from detention under the PSA earlier this week have been "informally" told not to move out of their houses, in-

formed sources said. The three were shifted to their official residences on Wednesday after they were released following revocation of the controversial Public Safety Act (PSA) against them by the home department of

the union territory. However, they were conveyed informally that they should not step out of their homes and a police guard has also been posted outside, the sources said. When contacted, Sartaj Madani,



uncle of Mehbooba Mufti, told PTI over phone that he was not sure whether he had been kept under house arrest but added that he was not allowed to go to his native village in Bijbehara of South Kashmir. "I was told that I can go without

assigning any reason," he said.
