Senior BJP Leader Manoj Sinha Is New LG Of J&K

SRINAGAR: Manoj Sinha, former union minister and senior BJP leader from Uttar Pradesh, was on Thursday appointed as the new Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir. He is the first political leader to take charge as the LG of the union territory.

The 61-year-old, who is known for his massive connect with the people of rural areas, comes in place of former IAS officer Girish Chandra Murmu who hurriedly tendered his resignation on Wednesday night.

Sinha arrived here in a state plane and was likely to be administered the oath of office and secrecy on Friday by Jammu and Kashmir Chief Justice Gita Mittal at the Raj Bhavan, located on the foothills of the Zaberwan range.

He was received by Advisors to the previous LG including Farooq Khan, Chief Secretary BVR Subrahmanyam and top brass of the police and civil administration. A guard of honour was accorded to him at the airport.

Later he held an informal meeting with the four advisors. the Chief Secretary and senior police officials.

BJP Sarpanch Shot Dead In Qazigund

SRINAGAR- Suspected militants on Thursday shot dead a BIP Sarpanch at Vessu village in Qazigund block of south Kashmir's Kulgam district.

Official sources said the militants fired upon the Sarpanch identified as Sajad Ahmad Khanday near his residence at Vessu around 9:30 am , leaving him critically injured before fleeing.

Khanday was immediately rushed to a GMC Anantnag where he was declared brought dead, they said. This is the second attack of its kind in less than 48 hours as a BJP Panch Arif Ahmad was critically wounded after militants fired upon him at Akhran Oazigund on the evening of August 4. • P-02

...BANK FRAUD CASE ED Raids NC Leader's Son Hilal Rather
