5 More COVID-19 **Deaths In Ladakh**

Leh: Five more patients died of coronavirus in Ladakh, taking the death toll due to the disease in the union territory to 14, officials said on Monday. Kargil district recorded four new deaths, while one CO-VID-19 patient breathed his last in Leh, the officials said. So far, Kargil has reported eight deaths due to the disease and Leh six. Exactly three days later on August 13, 2019, the Home Ministry again tweeted out a clarification calling the protests "miscreants mingled with people returning home after prayers at a local mosque. They resorted to unprovoked stone-pelting against law enforcement forces to cause widespread unrest".

Republic TV's Editor-in-Chief Arnab Goswami on his prime time debate dismissed the western media's Kashmir coverage as fake news. The aggressive anchor known for his tirade of abuse went on to accuse the BBC of spreading false propaganda. "Don't run away from me now, BBC! The figures you have peddled about, what was the proof gathered from?"
