Pak Violated Truce In Poonch: Army

Jammu: Pakistani troops violated the ceasefire on Wednesday by firing and shelling on forward posts and villages in three sectors along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch district, a defence spokesperson said. The Indian Army gave a befitting reply and the cross-border shelling between the two sides was going on when the last reports were received, he added. The spokesperson said Pakistan initiated the unprovoked ceasefire violation by firing from small arms and shelling with mortars in Shahpur, Kirni and Qasba sectors around 6.50 pm. There was no report of any casualty on the Indian side, he added.

Electric Shock Kills Youth In Ganderbal

Srinagar: A youth died on Wednesday after suffering an electric shock in Lar area of central Kashmir's Ganderbal district. Sameer Ahmad Khan of Thune Kangan received an electric shock when he was repairing wire at the house of his brother-in-law in Benhama area of Lar in the district, officials said. The youth as per the official was an electrician by profession. He was rushed to the hospital, where doctors declared him brought dead.

Youth Stabbed To **Death In Pampore**

Srinagar: A youth was allegedly stabbed to death by his cousin brother amid altercation between two families over some property issue in Pampore area of Pulwama district on Wednesday. 22-year-old Aadil Ahmad Dar of Chandara Pampore was allegedly attacked with knife by his cousin brother Aiyaz Ahmad this evening, news agency GNS reported. Dar was critically injured in the incident and was shifted to local Sub District Hospital where he died. Meanwhile, a police officer said that the accused has been arrested while a case under relevant section of law has been registered in this regard.

Sopore Woman Dies Of **Burn Injuries**

Srinagar: A woman from north Kashmir's Sopore died of burn injuries at a hospital here on Wednesday, a day after she allegedly set herself ablaze. The woman had set herself abla; pouring kerosene oil over her body at her home in Naseerabad area of Sopore on Tuesday, news agency KNO reported. Her husband reportedly managed to douse the fire but not before both of them received severe burn injuries. NEW DELHI: A solution to the border row with China must be predicated on honouring all agreements and understandings without attempting to alter the status quo unilaterally. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has said, in a clear assertion of India's position on the issue.

Jaishankar called the situation in Ladakh the "most serious" after the 1962 conflict, adding the quantum of forces currently deployed by both sides at the Line of Actual Control(LAC) is also "unprecedented". At the same time, he noted that all border situations were resolved through diplomacy.

Kashmiri Youth Held In Delhi On Suspicion

SRINAGAR: Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel arrested a Kashmiri youth outside the Parliament House in the Indian capital when he was allegedly roaming in suspicious circumstances, reports said Wednesday.

The youth from Rathsuna area of Budgam was roaming around Vijay Chowk, when CRPF men apprehended him on the allegations that he has made a couple of rounds around the Parliament House, DNA reported.

The report said that two identity cards - one Aadhar card and a driving license - have been also been recovered from his possession

"Both the IDs have different names. While the driving license is in the name of one Firdaus, the name mentioned in the Aadhaar Card is Manzoor Ahmed Ahanger," the report claimed.

Quoting unidentified CRPF officials, the report says that the arrested youth has been changing his statements which aroused further suspicion about him.

"First, he said that he had come to Delhi in 2016. Then he said that he had come to the national capital during the coronavirus-induced lockdown. He told the CRPF officials that he has been staying in Delhi since then. The man, whose identity is not clear yet, said that he first stayed in Jamia locality, then near the Jama Masjid area in Nizamuddin," the report added.

Meanwhile, the family of the detained youth said that he had gone to Delhi before lockdown to retrieve money grabbed by a fraudster. "My son is innocent. • P-02

Whopping Loss In Lockdown: Global Tourism Going Kashmir Way?

n his latest policy briefing and video address, Antonio Guterres, the United Nation (UN) Chief, said that the world tourism sector lost USD 30 billion in exports in the first five months of the year and more than 120 million jobs are at risk.

"It (tourism) employs one in every 10 people on Earth and provides livelihoods to hundreds of millions more," he said. According to Guterres, it is a

According to the preliminary loss assessment report by Kashmir Chamber of Commerce and Industries, service sector including Tourism took the biggest cumulative hit

since last summer when Kashmir was plunged into lockdown.
