## PDA Report On Lessees In Pahalgam Discloses Terrible State Of Affairs: HC

Asks Government To Take Immediate Action On 'Serious Issue'

SRINAGAR: A report providing list of lessees in Pahalgam by PDA "discloses a terrible state of affairs", Jammu and Kashmir High Court has said even as it directed authorities to take immediate actions against those holding the land sans lease.

As the hearing of Public Interest Litigation started, a bench of Chief Justice Gita Mittal and Justice Puneet Gupta was informed that a compliance report has been filed by the Chief Executive Officer, Pahalgam Development Authority (PDA) Mushtaq Ahmad Simnani.

"The list of persons/ lessees is en-

closed. It discloses a terrible state of affairs," the court said.

As per the report, 75 parties are in occupation of 75 plots comprising of 79 kanals 8 marls 7 Sirsai and 4 sft out of which 63 kanals 18 marlas 1 Sirsai and 5 sft has been leased out by the Government.

15 kanals and 10 marlas and 6 Sirsai are encroached upon by different persons, it said.

The PDA said that it has no record of any grant of any lease. The CEO also stated that a series of public notices through the print media were issued for the production of lease documents by the lessees but to "It ►PAGE 02

## PM Modi Inaugurates Atal Tunnel

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday inaugurated the strategically important all-weather Atal Tunnel in Rohtang.

Atal Tunnel, built by the Border Roads Organisation, is the longest highway tunnel in the world and reduces the distance between Manali and Leh by 46 km. It also reduces the travel time by four to five hours.

Speaking on the occasion, Modi said Atal Bihari Vajpayee laid the foundation of the approach road for this tunnel, but after his government left, the project was all but forgotten.

"Our govt increased the pace of construction from 300 meters per year to 1,400 meters per year and completed the project in 2020," Modi said.

## 'Shadow Of Nuclear Catastrophe'

UNITED NATIONS: UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres warned Friday that the world is living "in the shadow of nuclear catastrophe," fuelled by growing distrust and tensions between the nuclear powers.

The UN chief told a high-level meeting to commemorate the recent International Day for Total Elimination of Nuclear Weapons that progress on ridding the world of nuclear weapons "has stalled and is at risk of backsliding."

And he said strains between countries that possess nuclear weapons "have increased nuclear risks."

As examples, Guterres has expressed deep concern at the escalating disputes between the Trump administration and China. Relations between the U.S. and Russia are at a low point.

Nuclear-armed India and Pakistan are feuding over Kashmir, and India just had a border skirmish with China. And North Korea boasts about its nuclear weapons.

Without naming any countries, Guterres said programs to modernize nuclear arsenals "threaten a qualitative nuclear arms race," not to increase the number of weapons but to make them "faster, stealthier and more accurate."

Guterres also pointed to the only treaty constraining the size of the world's largest nuclear arsenals -- the New Strategic Arms Reduction Treaty between the United States and ►PAGE 02

## Delhi Police Arrests 4 Kashmiri Youth Over 'Terror' Plot

NEW DELHI: The Special Cell of Delhi Police on Saturday arrested a group of four Kashmiri youth for allegedly planning militant strikes in the national capital.

In a statement, the police claimed the accused were nabbed from central Delhi's ITO area and were carrying four sophisticated pistols and over 120 rounds of ammunition.

The accused have been identified as Altaf Ahmad Dar (25), a resident of Pulwama, and Mushtaq Ahmad Gani (27), Ishfaq Majeed Koka (28) and Aqib Safi (22), all residents of Shopian, the statement said.

"Ishfaq is the elder brother of slain militant Burhan Koka, ex-chief of Ansar Ghajwat Ul Hind, an off-shoot of Al Qaeda in Jammu and Kashmir," police said.

They said Burhan Koka was

killed in an encounter in Shopian's Melhora area on April 29 this year along with two other associates.

After his death, his elder brother Ishfaq Majeed Koka was approached by the cadres of Ansar Ghajwat Ul Hind to work for the outfit, police stated.

"On Friday, police received information that a group of radicalised Kashmiri youth had collected a huge cache of arms and ammunition and will come to ITO and Daryaganj.

"Thereafter, a trap was laid near ITO and the accused were apprehended," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Special Cell) Pramod Singh Kushwah said.

Preliminary interrogation revealed that Ishfaq was allegedly indoctrinated by present chief of Ansar Ghajwat Ul Hind to work for the cause of Jihad. ►PAGE 02

According to the official sources, eleven more people fell victim to the deadly infection in Jammu division, while the virus claimed nine more lives in Kashmir Valley.

# 3 Killed, 4 Injured In Lightning Strikes In Jharkhand; Rainfall Recorded In Eastern States

**NEW DELHI:** Three people were killed and four injured in lightning strikes in Jharkhand on Saturday as rain and thunder-showers were witnessed in eastern parts of the country.

Meanwhile, Delhi's air quality was recorded in the "moderate" category, and it is likely to turn "poor" in two days due to lowering temperatures and slow wind speed.

Delhi's 24-hour average air quality index was recorded at 189 on Saturday. It was 180 on Friday.

An AQI between 0 and 50 is considered 'good', 51 and 100 'satisfactory', 101 and 200 'moderate', 201 and 300 'poor', 301

and 400 'very poor', and 401 and 500 'severe'.

"As predicted, the PM2.5 contribution (in pollution) is increasing, which is a characteristic of winters. The air quality is likely to deteriorate to the lower end of poor quality on Monday," the System of Air Quality and Weather Forecasting and Research (SAFAR) said.

PM2.5 is tiny particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in diameter. It can enter deep into the lungs and even into the bloodstream.

It said an increase in farm fires was observed on Friday around Punjab, Haryana and neighbouring border regions and it is likely to

impact Delhi in the coming days.

Also, there is a marked dip in minimum temperatures recorded in Delhi. On Saturday, it settled at 20.3 degrees Celsius, which was a notch below normal.

The minimum temperature is likely to drop to 19 degrees Celsius by Wednesday.

Low temperatures and stagnant winds help in accumulation of pollutants near the ground, affecting air quality.

In Jharkhand's Palamu district, three people were killed and four injured in lightning strikes, officials said.

Ramdhuni Mehta, 37, was working in the farm in Shamudih village in Hussainabad when he

was killed in a lightning strike, they said.

In Bhikhi village in Chhatarpur block, a group of boys was playing at a ground when lightning struck. Two of them died on the spot, while four were injured, officials said.

Those killed have been identified as Kanchan Kumar (18) and Sonu (16), they said.

The injured are being treated at the Chhatarpur Hospital and their conditions are stated to be critical, they added.

According to Indian Meteorological Department, rain and thundershowers were observed at many places over Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura and

On July 18, the Army claimed that three militants were killed in Amshipura village in the higher reaches of south Kashmir's Shopian district.

The Army initiated an inquiry after social media reports indicated that the three men were from Rajouri district in Jammu and had gone missing in Amshipura. The families of the trio, who worked as labourers in Shopian, had also filed a police complaint.

The probe was completed in a record four-week time and on September 18, the force said it has found "prima facie evidence" that its troops "exceeded" powers under the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA) during the encounter. Disciplinary proceedings were then initiated.

The police also launched its investigation and collected the DNA samples of the families which matched with the slain persons.

According to the officials, the bodies reached their Dharsakri and Tarkassi villages around 6.45 pm via Mughal road, an alternate road linking Shopian district of south Kashmir with the twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch in Jammu region.

While Mohammed Ibrar (21) and Imtiaz Ahmad (26) were buried at their ancestral graveyard at Dharsakri, the burial of Ibrar Ahmad (18) was performed at his nearby Tarkassi village, the officials said adding a large number of locals participated in the funeral prayers.

Senior police officers led by a deputy inspector general (DIG) and SSP were present during the funeral of the trio which concluded peacefully, officials said.

Earlier, they said the families of the three men were called from Rajouri district and taken to the spot where the trio was buried in north Kashmir and the bodies were handed over to them.

On September 30, inspector general of police (IGP), Kashmir, Vijay Kumar said since the DNA samples matched with the family, the three bodies will be exhumed and handed over to families after due process of law.

Meanwhile, Jammu and Kashmir Apni Party (JKAP) vice president Choudhary Zulfikar Ali hailed the decision to handover of the bodies to the family members and demanded exemplary punishment for the guilty.

"The exhumation of three bodies and a fair investigation will restore the confidence of the people in the government and its justice system," said Ali, a former minister.

"Delivering justice will also work as deterrence for the elements in the forces so that they do not repeat such incidents," he said adding the kin of the three youth should be duly compensated and be given a government job.

monitored by the court. The petition has been filed in respect of the killing of Ibrar Ahmad (18), Mohammad Ibrar (21) and Imtiaz Ahmad (26 years), by Dr. Sandeep Mawa, a Medical Doctor, who is functioning as a Chairman of the Jammu & Kashmir Reconciliation Front.

As the plea came up for the hearing before a division bench of Chief Justice Gita Mittal and Justice Puneet Gupta, Assistant Solicitor General of India T. M. Shamsi submitted that the petition by a private citizen would not be maintainable inasmuch as the parents of the deceased have already filed a plea at Jammu Wing. He said the plea was listed on August 28 and thereafter on September 28.

Following the submissions Advocate Salih Pirzada, Mawa's counsel, sought a short adjournment to ascertain and verify the nature of the proceedings in the petition.

"Let him verify the same and address the Court on the next date," the court said and posted the plea on October 23.

The PIL besides the investigation by the SIT also seeks courts direction to preserve the graves of the victims from any tampering pending investigation of the case and compensation of Rs. One crore each to the family of the victims.

He also seeks direction to the government to constitute a High Powered Committee to analyze the aspect of "criminalizing Custodial Killings and Fake Encounters" by way of a special legislation.

A direction has been also sought to the government to constitute the State Human Rights Commission and Human Rights Courts in terms of Section 21 and 31 respectively in the territory of J&K. (GNS)

Russia -- which is set to expire next year.

"It is imperative" that the two countries extend it without delay for the maximum five years, he said, warning that without a treaty there is an "alarming possibility of a return to unconstrained strategic competition."

The secretary-general said the nuclear non-proliferation treaty or NPT, which marks its 50th anniversary this year, remains the cornerstone of nuclear disarmament and efforts to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons.

The five-year review of its implementation was postponed because of the COVID-19 pandemic until next year and Guterres urged its 191 parties to use the extra time to strengthen the treaty, including making "tangible progress towards the elimination of nuclear weapons."

Guterres said he also looks forward to the entry into force of the first-ever treaty to ban nuclear weapons, which was adopted in July 2017 by 122 countries. Once it has 50 ratifications, the treaty will enter force in 90 days, and with Malaysia's ratification on Sept. 30 it now has 46.

At Friday's high-level meeting, 103 of the 193 UN member nations were scheduled to speak for two minutes each. But many spoke longer so only 79 delivered addresses, and the UN said it would post the rest.

Of the major nuclear powers, Russia and China were on the speakers list but didn't get to speak. The United States Britain and France skipped the meeting. So did North Korea and Israel, which is widely reported to have a nuclear arsenal but has never admitted it publicly. India and Pakistan were scheduled to speak, but only India got to deliver remarks.

Many speakers recalled that the meeting took place 75 years after the United States dropped nuclear bombs on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, which killed 210,000 people and sped the end of World War II.

Iran's Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif, whose country is

still part of a 2015 agreement with Russia, China, Britain, France and Germany aimed at preventing the Islamic Republic from obtaining nuclear weapon, said the meeting "provides a unique opportunity to mobilize the world to liberate humanity from the nuclear nightmare."

In brief prerecorded remarks, Zarif accused the United States of "developing new nuclear weapons and recklessly lowering the threshold of their deployment."

He said the US has also caused "immense damage to the NPT by unlawfully withdrawing from the 2015 nuclear deal with Iran and the 1987 intermediate-range Nuclear Forces Treaty with Russia on missile.

Zarif also lashed out at US support for Israel, "the sole possessor of nuclear arsenal in our region."

He demanded that the international community "compel Israel -- which has aggression in its very DNA -- to promptly accede to the NPT and destroy its nuclear arsenal" and submit to "the most intrusive inspection regime."

The Iranian minister also called on the General Assembly "to declare as a binding norm of international law that a nuclear war cannot be won -- and must never be fought," and to develop a concrete program for "time-bound nuclear disarmament."

"Just imagine if the billions wasted on instruments of global annihilation were allocated to help fund the fight against COVID-19," Zarif said.

India's Foreign Minister Harsh Vardhan Shringla reiterated the country's longstanding commitment to nuclear disarmament through a step-by-step process, and said all states possessing nuclear weapons need to hold a "meaningful dialogue" to build trust and confidence.

Swedish Foreign Minister Ann Linde said in spite of the "catastrophic humanitarian consequences" of the atomic bombings, "the nuclear threat is as present as ever and multilateralism is under severe pressure."

"Polarization and a lack of trust" are "a dangerous mix, one which we cannot afford to ignore," she said.

Linde called on the U.S. and Russia to promptly extend New START and welcomed recent discussions "on a broader, follow-on agreement, which could also include China."

Sweden has launched the Stockholm Initiative on Nuclear Disarmament with 15 non-nuclear nations aimed at building "political support for a result-oriented disarmament agenda within the NPT framework," she said, urging other countries to join the effort.

Indonesia's Foreign Minister Retno Marsudi said "no significant progress" has been made by nuclear weapon states in reducing their arsenals, and their current modernisation efforts have resulted in "the ever-enlarging trust deficit among countries."

She called for enforcement of the NPT, strengthening disarmament, the early entry into force of the nuclear test ban treaty, and for all nuclear weapon states to become parties to nuclear weapons free zones.

"Maintaining nuclear weapons, is clearly, a zero-sum situation, while total abolishment of such weapons, will ensure that humanity prevails," Marsudi said.

He said taking cognizance, police filed a case FIR No. 82/2020 under relevant section of law and started further investigation in this matter. The police spokesperson cautioned people not to pay any heed to such provocative and derogative posts and importantly not to further share such unlawful posts as that may earn legal consequences.

He said the case has also sent a resounding message across the circles of such elements, "propagandists and criminals" that whatsoever they may be, and whatever their level and degree of their evil planning, they cannot escape from the clutches of law enforcing agencies.

"In the past week, 185 prisoners across the Jammu region, including 56 in district Jail Amphalla and four in Kot Bhalwal Jail (Jammu district), 51 in district jail Kathua, 50 in district jail Rajouri and 24 in district jail Bhandarwah have tested positive for COVID-19. All necessary measures have been taken for their treatment," Singh told PTI here.

He said the surge in COVID-19 cases prompted a review of the situation and a need was felt to set up temporary jails near the jail com-

plexes to isolate the asymptomatic positive prisoners for their better care.

"A notification has been issued to transform Pahari hostel at Bantalab (Jammu) as a temporary jail and it will be operationalised on Monday to cater the positive but asymptomatic cases which were detected in Amphalla and Kot Bhalwal jails. The guards have already taken up the positions there," the DG prisons, who visited the facility on Saturday morning to take stock of the arrangements, said.

He said similar facilities are being set up in Rajouri and Kathua districts where more than 50 COVID-19 cases each have come to the fore.

"This is a work in progress. Our concern is the safety of the prisoners and the staff, and are following the guidelines and SOPs issued by the government from time to time religiously," Singh said.

He said a prisoner with co-morbidities lodged in Amphalla jail was shifted to Government Medical College (GMC) hospital early this week after he tested positive for coronavirus.

"Our first priority is to ensure better medical care to those suffering from the virus and the upcoming facilities are the secondary response to ensure better care and overall safety of the prisoners," he said.

The DG prisons said things have to be kept ready as Kot Bhalwal and Amphalla jails have good numbers of jail inmates.

"In other districts, we have to identify facilities adjoining the jail premises. The warden staff of the jails is being deployed for the security of the temporary jail," he said, adding that a similar facility was provided in Srinagar and Anantnag district which together had reported 191 COVID-19 cases about a month back and successfully treated.

He said all the new admissions in the jails are accepted only after their negative COVID test and then they are also quarantined for 14 days before being lodged in the barracks.

"Anyone found with fever is subjected to testing and accordingly in case his test report is positive, all his contacts, including jail staff is being screened and tested," the DG prisons said adding that no visitor is allowed inside the prison to meet the inmates since the outbreak of the pandemic while the court hearing for trial and remand is being done via online mode.

The inmates are being provided with masks, hand sanitizers and their barracks are also being fumigated regularly, the DG prisons said.

Amphalla District Jail Superintendent Mirza Saleem Ahmad Beig said all the prisoners lodged in the jail have been tested for COVID-19 and further precautionary measures have been taken to meet the challenge.

"The testing in the prison was completed and we have 14 more positive cases on Saturday, taking the total number of positive prisoners to 80, including four female prisoners," he said.

"It was on the initiative of the DG prisons, we undertook the exercise of testing and to our surprise, 56 of the inmates and three jail staff deployed outside the barracks were found positive for COVID-19 by Friday," he said.

All of them are asymptomatic barring one who was suffering from other ailments and was subsequently shifted to a hospital, Beig added.

According to the official spokesperson, the LG said that the government intends to route funds under various schemes to be utilized in consultation with panchayats to ensure that villages of J&K lead in quality of living, education, health, employment, and with respect to

business growth indicators in the entire nation.

"The Lt Governor said that a massive economic package has already been sanctioned for relief & revival of the business sector in J&K. The ill effects of COVID are being mitigated gradually and sincere efforts are being put to revitalize the incomplete projects to finish them at the earliest," he said.

## J&K team for Tibet to find truth of ‘Shahtoosh threat’

Srinagar: Chief Minister Farooq Abdullah today said the centre would be approached to seek China's permission for facilitating the visit of a team to Tibet to find if continuing shahtoosh trade threatens antelope.

Speaking at a function held in observance of the mil-lennium's first wildlife week here this afternoon, the chief minister said the team will comprise wildlife officials and representatives of shahtoosh traders whose trip would be sponsored by the government. “If the team feels threat to antelope as genuine, the shahtoosh traders will have nothing to do with it”, he said, adding that with this the controversy over the issue would end once for all.

The chief minister said that as a result of measures taken to preserve wildlife, their population is on increase in the state. He stressed for creating awareness among the people especially students about the need for protecting wildlife and said that two zoos would be set up at Manda in Jammu and Dachigam in Srinagar for people to see nature's fauna. He asked for preparing comprehensive plans for conservation of various sanctuaries like Hokarsar, Hygam and Mirgund.

Abdullah called for evolving a mechanism and adopting an integrated programme for making use of dead wood as fuel by those living near forest while stringent measures would be taken for preserving the green trees. Steps have to be taken for bridging the gap between energy-need and energy source. This has become imperative in view of growing pressure of forest resource since other sources of energy like electricity and LPG have become costlier and scarce. He made a fervent appeal to the people for making judicious use of electricity, generation of which is affected during winter due to lesser water flow.

# Turkey In The Caucasus Conflict

Israel's main enemies have always been Syria, Iran and Hezbollah and not Turkey. It serves Turkey for the Palestinians to suffer. Why? Because set-back for Palestinians only vindicates Erdogan's neo-Ottoman narrative.

Recent developments in the geo-political scene across the world have been, perhaps, the most pivotal since the end of cold war in late 80s. It is easy to fall into binaries and take sides, mostly based on emotions; the world however is much more complex and multilayered. I'll try to de-clutter the hubris and present a view which is closer to the realities of our world.

The Caucasus flare up raging between Azerbaijan and Armenia is the latest that could possibly escalate into war and have wider consequences, amidst wide range of developments in other parts of the world. Be it the US-China trade war or Pakistan brokering peace in Afghanistan.

While the Caucasus neighbors have been fighting over the years, in past, Moscow would ultimately force the two post-Soviet nations to come to the negotiating table. This time the situation is slightly different because of the active role Turkey is playing in supporting Azerbaijan.

Erdogan announced unconditional support to Azerbaijan with which it claims to share ethnic and cultural ties. Ankara's support has altered the balance in a region where Moscow had regional hegemony. This just goes to prove that there are no true allies where interests conflict; for Turkey and Russia seemed to be allies in keeping the west's role limited in Syria, Libya and other places. It is unlikely that Russia on its part will try to engage with Turkey, which probably means Russia will rely on diplomacy than aggressive military response. Kremlin, in fact, has given a statement that downplayed suggestions of going into a fight.

Turkey's response is interesting but not surprising for anyone who is following Erdogan's neo-Ottoman narrative, which is that Arab nationalists should feel guilty/shame for having betrayed the Ottoman Empire in WWI.

Turkey is trying to emerge out as a power-house broker in the region. Owing to its strategic geography, straddled between Europe and Asia Minor, Erdogan's ideas stem out clearly to benefit its own end.

Last month, after the historic deal between UAE and Israel, Turkey threatened to sever ties with UAE. Erdogan claims to be standing up for Palestine, but in reality this is just an expression of war within the Sunni bloc — with Turkey and Qatar in one corner, and the Saudi and Emiratis in another corner. Turkey's dodgy role in Palestine crisis must not be overlooked. By allying with the 'jihad' forces to overthrow government in Syria, Turkey was on the side of Israel, you like it or not.



Israel's main enemies have always been Syria, Iran and Hezbollah and not Turkey, which in fact sold jet fuel to Israel during the 2014 Gaza war. It serves Turkey for the Palestinians to suffer. Why? Because set-back for Palestinians only vindicates Erdogan's neo-Ottoman narrative. It follows therefore that before Palestine is liberated, every other former Ottoman territory must be reconquered by Erdogan — the new wannabe Sultan.

For Syria, Iran and Hezbollah, liberating Palestine is a geopolitical priority. This is because Palestine has always primarily been a Syrian/Levantine struggle, while as for Turkey/Qatar, Palestine is more of a blunt offering for the neo-Ottoman Ikhwan agenda.

Traditionally, in the Muslim circles, the heart of

Islam looks to Mecca and brain to Istanbul. Turkey is geo-politically important to all energy producers of the world. Since Turkey has the potential as a transit country to increase the geographic diversification of energy resources to the West, while at the same time easy access to Caspian Basis, Caucasus regions and Asia; it will be interesting to see the trajectory Ankara takes in coming years, with implications for the wider Muslim world.

would be an anachronism if the members of the Rajya Sabha enjoyed less freedom. But that would be the inevitable result of Mr Hidayatullah's ruling. A matter of national concern arises. The government is accused of abusing an emergency provision in the constitution (Article 356). But the house is forbidden to discuss it because

the legality of the executive's action is in issue before the high courts. Let alone the legal aspects, even those concerning its propriety or political soundness may not be discussed at all.

Referring to the sub judice rule the speaker of the House of Commons remarked on July 29, 1976, that he intended to exercise his discretion in favour of freer debate in every case where he properly could.

India's constitution imposes limits on parliament, state legislatures and the courts in regard to discussion of each other's conduct. Articles 211 and 212 read: "No discussion shall take place in the legislature of a state with respect to the conduct of any judge of the supreme court or of a high court in the discharge of his duties. The validity of any proceedings in the legislature of a state shall not be called in question on the ground of any alleged irregularity of procedure."

What if a judge uses intemperate language or takes manifestly partisan cases? Is parliament limited to the impractical and cumbersome process of his impeachment?

The classic case is that of Jalianwala Bagh so well brought out by a jurist: "When it is relevant to the issue under adjudication, a judge may comment on the activities or omissions of government departments or the police, provided that it is done in a dignified manner. Judges, however, do not comment on the wisdom of the policy of the government or on matters which are not relevant to the case before them. Naturally, judges are cautious in their comments on controversial matters...."

In 1924, justice McCardie heard a libel action brought by Sir Michael O'Dwyer, Lieutenant governor of Punjab, regarding atrocities committed by his administration. These included orders by Gen Reginald Dwyer to open fire at a mob during disturbances in India. McCardie said: "...I express my view that General Dyer in the grave and exceptional circumstances, acted rightly, and... was wrongly punished...." It surely called for censure by parliament.

The solution lies in mutual respect and restraint.

# ‘Kashmir Belongs More to Central Asia’

Kashmir Observer Archives: 16th of October, 2011

Professor Gregory Gleason who teaches political science at the University of New Mexico in the U.S. believes that Kashmir belongs more to Central Asia than to South Asia, owing to its glorious ties with the region in terms of culture, traditions, religion, etc. Professor Gleason who visited Kashmir as part of the International Conference on Central Asia, describes the efforts made by India and Pakistan on Kashmir as insufficient as he discusses the pros and cons of Kashmir being the venue of an International Conference on Central Asia with Kashmir Observer correspondent M Farooq Shah.

Excerpts of the Interview:

**You've been one of the special invitees to the International Conference on Central Asia. What does this conference mean to you?**

The Conference is an important turning point, I believe, for the studies on Central Asia, in the United States but also in other countries around the world, particularly the European Countries and the countries of Central Asia. Previously, we thought of Central Asia primarily as the countries of the former Soviet Union. Increasingly after the collapse of the Soviet Union, we began to think more broadly about Central Asia. And then, of course, after the events of September 11, American involvement in the coalition for operation “Enduring Freedom” in Afghanistan, we began to realise that there are cultural, linguistic and close potential trade relations among all the countries of the region. So most of the scholars have now begun to think of Central Asia in terms of an historical and broader definition.

**Why wasn't this conference, which has been described as of ‘Unprecedented significance’, held somewhere else, Delhi for instance?**

Well, I think the important aspect of the venue in Kashmir is that Kashmir is very clearly a Central Asian region. It is a region that has close associations with other cultures in Central Asia, in particular Uzbek culture, culture of Tajikistan, culture in Turkmenistan. The idea of holding the conference in Kashmir is the idea of bringing to the attention of scholars and policy makers and journalists and hopefully eventually the general public that there are close connections in the region.

**Could you say a little more on that when you say Kashmir is very clearly a Central Asian region?**

To be honest with you, when I arrived in Kashmir, I immediately recognised the kind of kindred relationship with the Central Asian Countries. There are cultural features and characteristics in Kashmir that remind me very much of Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and other countries we've traditionally regarded as the central Asian countries. I have to say that is not the same feeling that one feels when one arrives for instance in Delhi.



**Could you outline the significance of holding a conference of this scale in Kashmir a little more explicitly?**

I think one of the important aspects of holding the Conference in Kashmir is that many of the scholars in the outside world who've worked on issues of economics, politics, government, international relations, history and cultural studies in the region have not themselves focussed on the regions around Jammu and Kashmir. Therefore, this is an important re-orientation of the work in the interests of many scholars around the world. I think it is important because it highlights the connectedness of Kashmir with other countries of the region. It's not enough, I would say because very little is known about Kashmir and its relationship with other countries in the neighbouring Central Asia. It is the first major effort to bring to attention of the International scholarly community and the professional organisations in the outside world such as the Central Eurasian Studies Society based in Harvard University that Kashmir belongs more to Central Asia.

**Kashmir, you know is a landlocked territory where a conflict is raging and with an uncertain political future. How are ordinary Kashmiris going to benefit from this conference?**

I think scholarship is always to the benefit of ordinary citizens in all the regions of the world. Scholarship in the long run will have an influence but scholarship is not politics and policy making itself. It does not have the direct impact.

It rather is a way of accumulating knowledge and understanding that can lend the policy makers more wisdom to do decisions about policies. Its immediate effect is, I think, to be understood in terms of the long-term affect of increasing human understanding of that region.

**As far the human understanding you're talking about, Kashmiris are unable to move freely between its own divided parts. How do you view that?**

That's certainly a human tragedy. But it is not a unique situation, there're similar situations in many regions of the world. These kinds of issues certainly have to be resolved in a way that is equitable for all the interested and involved parties.

**India and Pakistan have embarked on certain measures with regard to the connectedness of the divided parts of Jammu and Kashmir. Do you think that suffices the requirement given the level of sentiment involved among the peoples of the divided parts?**

I don't think that those particular steps themselves suffice the requirement but I do think the confidence building measures are an important sequence that would be necessary for any kind of unification of the divided groups of people. In this particular case, it seems to me that what we can hope for is a more extensive set of measures taken to improve relationships between the countries to reduce the amount of tension that has been created by disagreements in the past.

**How does Kashmir figure in what you've described as**

**‘The idea of Greater Central Asia’?**

Kashmir is a natural corridor between India and other parts of the Asia, Europe and other parts of the Eurasian landmass. I think it can play a very important role in the idea of Greater Central Asia. Most important aspect of that idea is it is not just a concept or a geographical description rather it is an idea of the importance of maintaining close ties between people who've kindred interests and more pragmatically people who've economic mutual interests in trade and greater economic development.

**You've said that there's a greater need for inter-state co-operation without changing of borders or reorganising institutions. What exactly do you mean by that?**

We live in a globalized world today. It is a powerful force today and is primarily driven by technology not by the intentions of the people in Berlin or Moscow or Washington. In this globalized world however, the unsettling aspect is of changes in the existing border situations. That however, does not mean that there can't be mobility of capital, movement of people, or movement of ideas across those borders. I'm very much in favour of the idea of trans-border or cross border communication between the countries.

**As an expert, do you think there's a need for a third party mediation on Kashmir?**

To be honest with you, I'm still at the point of gathering information on the subject. It is not clear to me how a third party mediation on Kashmir would differ from present circumstances but what I can promise with you is to reflect on the question, think about the question and gather more information to get an idea what would be the international theory given the interests of the various actors involved.

**But both India and Pakistan have failed to resolve their differences on Kashmir for well over five decades now. Do you, as a political science teacher not think that it is the right time for the international community to tell them that enough is enough?**

I certainly think that this is the right time for India and Pakistan to think seriously about their differences on Kashmir and hammer out an equitable solution acceptable to the all actors involved in the region. The International community certainly has a role to play but the responsibility ultimately lies with the actors directly involved in the conflict.

**As an expert from outside, how do you visualise Kashmir 10 years from now?**

I see a prosperous Kashmir 10 years from now where human rights are protected; where people are free to speak their minds; where people are tolerant; where businesses are protected through legal a regulatory system that allows for open businesses but not frequented by monopolies or economic dominations.

# My Tryst with Mental Health

I never thought that my experiences carried any weight because so many have it worse, when it comes to mental health. Fortunately, now I have realised that validating your trauma and pain is just another step towards healing — and quite an important one.

My mother tells me how it makes her happy when I take care of myself, comb my hair and dress up. It is because she has seen me doing none of this for years. Depression takes away from you the basic will to even do the mundane.

Even when we never quite talked about it, but both of us knew that I wasn't just being lazy (which many people still jokingly call me at times), but there was something else consuming me all those months. And even when she and my father tried attributing it to quite a lot of things going wrong here and there, she was the only one who saw in my eyes a demon no parent ever wishes to see their child fighting.

I've gotten better — Alhamdulillah, in ways I never imagined. I am in a happy space for the most part. But I still have those days, when getting up in the morning is the hardest task and probably the only conscious decision I make for the day.

Since I am in hostel for most time of the year, I have the liberty to switch off without being answerable to anyone. But now that I am at home for over 6 months now, I have seen how my mother gets worried when she finds me all sunken and reluctant to do basic things.

I wish to explain to her that it is just a day or two, and I will be fine; a feeling that I explain with the colloquial, *hojata hai na kabhi kabhi* (it happens sometimes, right?). But we have never sit down to have discussions of this sort.

I have never sort medical help, which I truly wish I'd. So, to even call it clinical depression won't be totally right. But I know that it wasn't just a transient mood swing or a looming personal or professional pressure. It is way more than that and it has stayed with me; often changing forms, with varying triggers and strange discourses.

But I have learnt to deal with it better; taming-the-storm, they call it!

A lot of things and a lot of people, most of all my friends, have helped me through this and still are a big reason that keeps me going. What worked for me, and what I've understood works for everyone is having a safe place to go where we can open up, scream, weep, cry or disappear without the fear of being judged and where we never have to explain ourselves.

Indubitably, I have survived holding on to the kindness and empathy people showed me.



I got better through practice, mostly, by the realisation of how I was or am not the only person feeling this way, and then by the acceptance of the fact that even if I was the only person, it was still alright to feel this way.

I derived my sense of identity and existence from God (others definitely would have different sources), and gradually started focusing on thoughts that would all align in one direction with the core never changing. As the core of my thoughts, both positive and negative, became stagnant; I felt my life stabilising and it gradually became easier to control my mind and all the overwhelming responses therein.

I started to respond more and react less, and often-times broke down my responses later to make sense of

where I could do better and how.

I have days when I lose direction again; when even hope looks dark. But on those days now, I remind myself that I will find my way back — till then, I rest.

I have always been someone who has asked people to come forward with their stories. But today I decided to be the first person to start this. I never thought that my experiences carried any weight because so many have it worse, when it comes to mental health. Fortunately, now I have realised that validating your trauma and pain is just another step towards healing — and quite an important one.

# Face Masks Do Not Cause Overexposure To Carbon Dioxide, Study Says

**HOUSTON:** Face masks are unlikely to cause over-exposure to carbon dioxide, even in patients with lung disease, according to a new study which contradicts statements linking mask-wearing to poisoning by the exhaled gas.

As several governments across the world have made it mandatory to wear face masks during the COVID-19 pandemic, the researchers, including those from the University of Miami in the US, noted that some people were discouraging its use, claiming it may be a health risk.

The study, published in the Annals of the American Thoracic Society, assessed problems associated with changes in oxygen and carbon dioxide levels in healthy individuals, as well as those with chronic obstructive pulmonary

disease (COPD) before and while using surgical masks.

According to the scientists, people with COPD, "must work harder to breathe, which can lead to shortness of breath and/or feeling tired."

"We show that the effects are minimal at most even in people with very severe lung impairment," said study co-author Michael Campos from the University of Miami.

As for the feeling of breathlessness that some healthy people may experience, Campos said, dyspnea - or the feeling of shortness of breath - felt by some while wearing masks is not synonymous of alterations in gas exchange.

"It likely occurs from restriction of air flow with the mask in particular when higher ventilation is needed (on exertion)," he explained.

"If you're walking briskly up an incline, for example, you may experience feelings of breathlessness. An overly tight mask may also increase the feeling of breathlessness," the scientists noted in a statement.

They said the solution is to slow down or remove the mask if one is at a safe distance from other people.

Campos stressed the importance of wearing a face mask to prevent COVID-19 infection.

If a surgical mask is not available, the researchers said

a cloth mask with at least two layers is recommended by the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

They said patients with lung disease, in particular, should avoid getting infected and should wear a face mask, which, along with hand-washing and social distancing can reduce the risk of COVID-19 infection.

"We acknowledge that our observations may be limited by sample size, however our population offers a clear signal on the nil effect of surgical masks on

relevant physiological changes in gas exchange under routine circumstances (prolonged rest, brief walking)," the scientists wrote in the study.

They believe it is important to inform the public that the discomfort associated with mask use should not lead to unsubstantiated safety concerns as this may attenuate the application of a practice proven to improve public health.

"The public should not believe that masks kill," Mr Campos added.

## Study Reveals Writing By Hand Makes Kids Smarter

Results from several studies have shown that both children and adults learn more and remember better when writing by hand.

Now another study confirms the same: choosing to handwrite over keyboard use yields the best learning and memory.

Professor Audrey van der Meer at NTNU believes that national guidelines should be put into place to ensure that children receive at least a minimum of handwriting training.

Van der Meer and her colleagues have investigated this several times, first in 2017 and now in 2020.

In 2017, she examined the brain activity of 20 students. She has now published a study in which she examined brain activity in twelve young adults and twelve children.

This is the first time that children have participated in such a study.

Both studies were conducted using an EEG to track and record brain wave activity. The participants wore a hood with over 250 electrodes attached.

## India's COVID-19 Death Toll Breaches 1-Lakh Mark



**NEW DELHI:** India's COVID-19 death toll crossed one lakh on Friday night, while the caseload climbed to over 64 lakh and recoveries surged to 54,15,197, according to data from states and union territories.

Union Health Ministry data updated on Friday 8 am showed a single-day spike of 81,484 infections, taking the country's COVID-19 tally of cases to 63,94,068, while the death toll climbed to 99,773, with the virus claiming 1,095 lives in a span of 24 hours.

However, by night, a PTI tally showed India's COVID-19 caseload at 64,64,012, death toll at 1,00,768 and recoveries at 54,15,197. The tally has been compiled as per information provided by the

states and union territories.

India is in the number one position in terms of the number of recovered coronavirus cases followed by Brazil and the US, according to the Johns Hopkins University, which has been compiling COVID-19 data from all over the world.

India is the second worst hit nation in terms of COVID-19 cases after the US, while it is in the third spot in terms of fatalities globally after the US and Brazil, according to JHU data.

The Union Health Ministry on Sunday said a total of 53,52,078 people have recuperated from coronavirus infection taking the national recovery rate to 83.70 per cent, while the COVID-19 case fatality rate was recorded at 1.56 per cent.

There are 9,42,217 active cases of coronavirus infection in the country which comprises 14.74 per cent of the total caseload, the data stated.

## Polls In Offing, Demand For Kurta-Pyjamas Up In Bihar

**W**ith Bihar going to the polls in October-end, the political fervour has started gradually spreading from the cities to towns and villages across the state. The poll prospects of different parties are being debated from city cross-roads to the village chaupals.

Another offshoot of the election season is that party activist eager to be recognised as 'politicians' are busy shopping for the quintessential 'political dress' -- pyjamas, kurtas and jackets.

From the capital Patna to towns in the hinterland, political activists and leaders are thronging Khadi and tailoring shops to buy khadi kurtas and pyjamas. The more fashion savvy among them are also choosing the right colours matching their personality.

Bharatiya Janata Party workers are buying kurtas reflecting the sartorial style of Prime Minister Narendra Modi while the choice of Congress leaders and activists remains the pyjama and kurta in the style of former Congress President Rahul Gandhi.

Khadi shops near Veerchand Patel Path in Patna have engaged more tailors. Shopkeepers and tailors are leaving no stone unturned to satisfy the customers, after suffering from the coronavirus recession. There is a rush of customers as soon as these shops open with stitching work going on till late night.

An ordinary tailor on an average makes seven or eight pairs of kurta-pyjamas daily.

Maqsood Alam, who has been working as a tailor for



almost 10 years, said the number of people wanting kurta-pyjamas has increased manifold since the announcement of the Bihar elections.

Many leaders want to have a pair of kurta-pyjamas stitched every two or three hours. We are also not disappointing them. Simple kurta-pyjamas are being stitched for Rs 400-Rs 500," Alam added.

Many shopkeepers are being kept busy round the clock. This election has proved to be a boon for tailors.

Mohammad Khalid, who runs a tailoring shop near the High Court in Patna said, "This election has proved to be a boon for us. During the corona pandemic, we were in a state of penury. Now customers are coming from outside the city as well."

Not to be left behind, women political activists are buying cotton saris. In this election, women have opted for cotton, Kota check and string saris as their first choice.

Cloth sellers say there are many varieties of Khadi available in the market. People, however, prefer Charkha, Matka, handloom, Akbarpuri and muslim Khadi. Nowadays, people choose coloured Khadi over the traditional white.

## Relief For MSMEs: Centre Waives Off Compound Interest On Loans During Pandemic

**NEW DELHI:** In a relief to individual borrowers and medium and small industries, the Centre has agreed in the Supreme Court to waive compound interest (interest on interest) charged on loans of up to Rs 2 crores for a six-month moratorium period announced due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

It said the government will seek due authorisation from parliament for making appropriate grants in this regard and the endeavour shall be over and above the support of Rs 3.7 lakh crore to MSMEs, Rs 70,000 crore for home loans etc. already extended through the Garib Kalyan and Aatma Nirbhar packages announced by government earlier .

In an affidavit filed by Union finance ministry on behalf of the Union of India, it said that the relief to all borrowers in respect of compounding of interest during the period of moratorium would be admissible to the categories specified irrespective



eight categories by the government including MSME (Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises), education, housing, consumer durable, credit card dues, auto, personal, and consumption.

It further said that any individual/entity whose loan amount is more than Rs 2 crore will not be eligible for waiver of the compounding of interest.

## Hathras Gangrape: SIT Probe Over; Officials, Cong Leaders Make A Beeline For Town

**HATHRAS/NEW DELHI:** The SIT set up by the Uttar Pradesh government has completed its probe into the death of a 19-year-old Dalit woman who was assaulted and allegedly gangraped, officials said on Saturday as barricades outside her village in Hathras were lifted and the media was allowed in.

All roads it seemed led to Hathras with Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath sending senior officials, including

Additional Chief Secretary (home) Awanish Awasthi and Director General of Police HC Awasthi, to the village to meet her family.

Congress leaders Rahul Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, who were detained amid high drama on Thursday, also headed towards Hathras in another effort to meet the family.

There was heavy police deployment on the Delhi-Uttar Pradesh border with barricades on Delhi-

Noida Direct (DND) flyway and scores of policemen deployed. The border is not sealed but checks have been intensified at the Delhi-Noida border, according to a local police officer.

As the Congress delegation from Delhi prepared to make its way to Hathras, about 180 km away, its Uttar Pradesh unit president Ajay Kumar Lallu and more than 500 workers were put under house arrest, the party alleged.

## 75% Consumers Feel Children Are Being Misled In Many Ads

**NEW DELHI:** Seventy-five per cent consumers feel children are being misled in many advertisements for apps, gaming and other online services, according to a survey by Local Circles.



Eighty-seven per cent consumers say they have difficulty in reading, viewing and hearing disclaimers while 86 per cent have come across child inappropriate ads in the last one year.

In August, the Ministry of Consumer Affairs issued a draft for 'Central Consumer Protection Authority (Prevention of Misleading Advertisements and Necessary Due Diligence for Endorsement of Advertisements) Guidelines, 2020 aimed at preventing unfair trade practices and protecting consumers' interest.

According to the survey on these guidelines, 87 per cent consumers find disclaimers in advertisements difficult to read, view and hear. The draft guidelines clearly state that a disclaimer should not attempt to correct a misleading claim made in an advertisement and should be clearly visible to the consumer. Non-legible disclaimers will also be considered as misleading ads.

Around 86 per cent consumers have come across child inappropriate ads on television, digital sites or newsprint in the last 1 year. Consumer reported how on video sites child inappropriate ads are presented between children videos and how sites should only show ads based on the video content being watched.

75 per cent consumers have come across ads

of apps, games and online products/services that were designed to mislead children into spending.

On this front, the draft says that the ad should not take advantage of children's inexperience, credulity or sense of loyalty, or exaggerate the features of a good or service in a way that could lead to children having unrealistic expectations of such good or service, and include a direct promotion to children to purchase a good or service or to persuade their parents to purchase a good or service for them.

Many consumers highlighted that most of the regulations require a transaction to be done for a brand to held accountable and action taken by the authorities and that prevents actions from being taken in many cases of misleading advertisements. Instead, anyone who has seen a misleading ad and is reporting the same must be considered a prospective buyer and the draft advertising code should consider all such complaints and action them.

During the Covid-induced lockdown months, a series of advertisements were flagged by the consumers as misleading including products like mattresses, sanitisers, fabrics, readymade garments, juices, breads and even ice creams as immunity building for Covid-19 or fighting the Covid-19 virus. — IANS

## Revenue Officials Seize Smuggled Gold Worth 17.5 Crore From Truck In Bengal, 4 Arrested



**KOLKATA:** In one of the largest gold recoveries in recent times, the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) seized 33.5 kg of the yellow metal from a truck in Siliguri, a DRI release said.

The gold is valued at 17.5 crore, it said.

The agency officials acting on a tip off intercepted the truck on Friday morning. The truck was on way from the Indo-Myanmar border in Manipur to Sri Ganganagar in Rajasthan, the release said.

The four occupants of the truck during interrogation said that they were coming from Guwahati and denied carrying any contraband items with them.

On being grilled further they confessed that they were carrying 202 pieces of smuggled gold which were hidden in their luggage, it said.

They confessed that the gold pieces were smuggled from Myanmar through the border in Manipur and were being carried to Sri Ganganagar for delivery. The four have been arrested under the Customs Act, the DRI said.

In the current fiscal, the agency has seized around 98 kg of smuggled gold valued at 52 crore in West Bengal and Sikkim.

## Sushant Singh Rajput's Death 'A Case Of Hanging And Death By Suicide': AIIMS Medical Board

**NEW DELHI:** The AIIMS' medical board has ruled out murder in the death of actor Sushant Singh Rajput, terming it "a case of hanging and death by suicide," the premier institute's forensic chief Dr Sudhir Gupta said on Saturday.



In its conclusive medico-legal opinion to the CBI, the six-member team dismissed the claims of "poisoning and strangling", with Dr Gupta saying the panel did not find any trace of poison and drugs in the viscera.

"It is a case of hanging and death by suicide. We have submitted our conclusive report to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI)," Dr Gupta, who is also the chairman of the forensic medical board, said.

There was no injury on the body other than that of hanging. Also, there was no mark of struggle and scuffle. The ligature mark on the neck was consistent with hanging, he said.


The doctors' panel did not find any trace of poison and drugs in the viscera. Dr Gupta told PTI, but refused to di-

vulge any further details stating the case is subjudice.

Rajput, 34, who made his silver screen debut in the critically acclaimed 'Kai Po Che' seven years ago, was found dead in his apartment in suburban Bandra in Mumbai on June 14. The CBI had taken over the probe from Bihar Police into the alleged abetment to suicide case filed by the actor's father K K Singh in Patna against Rajput's girlfriend Rhea Chakraborty and her family.

Earlier this week, the central probe agency had said that it has not reached any conclusion in Rajput's death case and that all aspects were under investigation. PTI


