SRINAGAR: Peoples Democratic Party president Mehbooba Mufti on Friday described the "struggle for the restoration of Article 370" and "resolution of Kashmir issue" as a long-drawn fight and pledged that she will not raise any flag till the flag of erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir is returned

In her first media interaction in over 14 months after the abrogation Article 370 in August last year and her subsequent detention, former Chief Minister lashed out at the BJP for desecrating the Constitution and "looting" the dignity of the people by revoking its special status.

"We had acceded to a liberal, democratic, secular India. Let me tell them we are not comfortable, we are incompatible with today's India where minorities and Dalits are not safe and where they tried to disrespect us by looting our dignity. They will have to think, if not today, then tomorrow, that this country will run on India's Constitution and not on the BIP's manifesto," she said.

PM Modi: Restoring Article 370 Will Be An Insult To **Families Of Soldiers**

SASARAM: In his first poll rally in Bihar, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday invoked the alleged reign of crime and loot during the 15-year rule of the RJD and also targeted the opposition for "daring" to seek votes in the state while seeking restoration of Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir.

Referring to the supreme sacrifice made by soldiers, including by those from Bihar, in Galwan Valley while fighting Chinese troops, he hit out at the opposition.

"They are saying they will restore Article 370 if they come to power. Look at their audacity, they are still daring to seek votes from the people of Bihar. Isn't this insult of the sentiments of Bihar which sends its sons and daughters to borders to protect the country?" he said.

He accused the opposition of siding with forces which are conspiring to weaken India by promising to restore Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir if it comes to power. Referring to the Galwan clash.

Modi said the sons of Bihar laid down their lives for the tricolour but did not let 'Mother' India's head bow. The soldiers of Bihar were also martyred in the Pulwama attack,

Pak To Remain In FATF 'Grey' List Till Feb 2021

NEW DELHI: Pakistan will remain in FATF's 'grey' list till February 2021 as it has failed to fulfil six key obligations of the global money laundering and terrorist financing watchdog that include failure to take action against two of India's most wanted militants Maulana Masood Azhar and Hafiz Saeed, officials said on Friday.

The virtual plenary of the Financial Action Task Force (FATF), held in the last three days, concluded that Pakistan will continue in its 'grey' list.

The decision has been taken after a thorough review of Pakistan's performance in fulfilling the global commitments and standards on the fight against money laundering and

"Pakistan remains in the increased monitoring list or the grey list," FATF president Marcus Plever said at a virtual press conference from Paris.

Pakistan failed to fulfil six of the 27 mandates so far as a result of which the country continues to be in the grey list of the FATF.

"Pakistan failed to fulfil six of the 27 mandates given to check terror funding," Pleyer said.

The FATF chief said Islamabad must impose sanction and prosecute those involved in terror financing. "Pakistan needs to do more on
