Mughal Road Reopens After 9 Days

POONCH: The Mughal road, connecting Shopian and Poonch districts, reopened after 9 days closure due to snowfall along the thoroughfare, officials said on

Tuesday. "Subject to fair weather and good road condition (only downward traffic) load carriers carrying fresh fruits/vegetables shall be allowed from Herpora (Shopian) from 1100 hrs to 1500 hours towards Poonch," a police officer told news agency GNS.

"No vehicle shall be allowed after cut off timing. Moreover, no passenger vehicle or pedestrian shall be allowed on Mughal Road," he added.

CASO Launched In Sopore

SRINAGAR: Government forces on Tuesday launched a cordon and search operation (CASO) in Sopore town of north Kashmir's Baramulla district.

According to reports, special operations group (SOG) of police, army's 22 RR and 179 CRPF on Tuesday evening cordoned off Model Town -B locality of Sopore and conducted house to house searches following inputs about the presence of militants in the area. Searches were going on in the area when last reports came in.

7 Officials Suspended In Budgam

BUDGAM: District Panchayat Election Officer (DPEO) Budgam, Shahbaz Ahmed Mirza on Tuesday placed seven officials under suspension for dereliction of Election duties till further orders.

The officials in question had failed to report on poll duties scheduled for Phase 2nd at Beerwah, Budgam,

Meanwhile, the said officials have been directed to remain attached in the office of Additional Deputy Commissioner Budgam till further orders.

SRINAGAR: A 49.5 percent turnout was recorded in the second phase of polling in District Development Council (DDC) elections in Jammu and Kashmir which passed off

peacefully on Tuesday. Jammu region witnessed 65.54 percent voting, while Kashmir valley recorded an average of 33.34 percent turnout, state election commissioner K K Sharma told reporters here.

Bandipora district recorded the highest turnout in Kashmir at 69.66 percent which was the third-highest

in the union territory. A turnout of 51.76 was recorded in the first phase on November 28--64.2 percent in the Jammu division and 40.65 percent in the Kashmir division.

Tarigami Challenges New J&K Land Laws **In Apex Court**

NEW DELHI: Veteran CPI-M leader Mohammed Yusuf Tarigami has state government on land were **approached the Supreme Court** aimed at protecting the large swathes challenging an October order of the Union Home Ministry which allows people from across the country to buy land in Jammu and Kashmir including that meant for agriculture purposes.

Moving a writ petition, he sought the apex court's intervention and a stay on the order till his petition is heard.

The petition moved under Article 32 (violation of fundamental rights) submitted that the October notification "is illegal" as it is issued in pursuance to the August 2019 reorganisation of Jammu and Kashmir which has been challenged by several people and that the top court is aware of the matter.

It said that home ministry has amended sections of the JK Land Revenue Act, 1996 which pertains to management of agricultural land and the JK Development Act, 1970 which deals with zonal development plans determining land use for buildings, roads housing recreation, industry, business, markets, schools, hospitals and public and private open spaces.

Pointing out the amendments in the Act, the petition said that while the fresh laws prohibits the sale of agricultural land to a non-agriculturist, but it "authorises the government or an officer appointed by it to grant permission to an agriculturist to alienate the land to a non-agriculturist by way of sale, gift, exchange or mortgage or for such agreement on such conditions as may be prescribed".

Tarigami pleaded that the change of land use can't be left at the "caprice of bureaucracy more so at the lower rung of district collectors" and said the checks and balances available in the repealed laws need reintroducing in them. The four-time MLA from Kulgam pleaded that these amendments will "seriously change the land use pattern and will destroy the food security of Jammu and Kashmir".

He said the laws of the erstwhile of farm land that provided life blood to the people of Jammu and Kashmir, from commercialisation.

"This crucial aspect has not been considered by the respondents (MHA) while issuing the notification," the petition said.



In an 111-page notification in Hindi and English, the home ministry made several changes to the land laws, including the most important amendment in the Jammu and Kashmir Development Act that deals with disposal of land with the Centre omitting the phrase "permanent resident of the state" from Section 17 of the law.

Before the repeal of Article 370 and Article 35-A in August last year, non-residents could not buy any immovable property in Jammu and Kashmir. The latest changes have paved the way for non-residents to buy land in the union territory.

Man Ends Life In Srinagar

SRINAGAR: A man on Tuesday allegedly ended his life by hanging himself to death in Shalimar area of this capital city.

The 50-year-old man identified as Bashir Ahmad son of Ghulam Mohammed of Banigam Shalimar, allegedly hanged himself to death at his home on Tuesday morning, news agency KDC reported. Meanwhile, Police have taken cognizance of the incident and have set investigations into motion.

House, Shops Gutted In Bandipora Blaze

BANDIPORA: A residential house besides at least two shops were completely gutted even as considerable damage dealt to two other shops in a blaze incident in Hajin area of Bandipora district on Tuesday.

According to eyewitnesses, the fire which broke out from a provision store and spread in no time resulting in damage to at least three other shops besides a residential house at Rekhi Hajin area in the district.

The raging fire was brought under control after hectic efforts made by Fire and Emergency department, however by then the fire had already razed a residential house and two shops belonging to Ghulam Mohuiddin Ganaie to ashes, they said.

Two other shops belonging to Bashir Ahmad Ganaie also suffered considerable damage in the incident, they added. When contacted a police official told GNS that the cause of the fire could not be immediately ascertained. "A case in this regard has been

taken up and further investigations are underway to enquire into the cause of mishap", the official said.

BSF Officer Killed In Pak Firing

JAMMU: A sub-inspector of the Border Security Force (BSF) was killed on Tuesday in a cross-border firing along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district of Jammu and Kashmir, officials said.

"The Pakistan army resorted to unprovoked ceasefire violation in Rajouri sector on the LoC again, in which BSF Sub-Inspector Paotinsat Guite, who was deployed at Forward Defence Location, was killed," a statement issued by the BSF said.
