BSF Man Shoots Self Dead In Kupwara

SRINAGAR: A Border Security Force (BSF) personal on Wednesday shot himself dead in the frontier district of Kupwara.

Head Constable Bharinder Singh of BSF 118 Battallion allegedly committed suicide by shooting himself dead with his service rifle in Tangdar area of the north Kashmir district on Wednesday morning, news agency GNS reported. Singh, the report said ended his life while being on duty.

Quoting unnamed officials, the report said that the reason of Singh taking this extreme step was not immediately

Missing Minor Boy Found Dead

SRINAGAR: A 3-year-old boy on Wednesday was found dead in Chewdara village of Beerwah in central Kashmir's Budgam district, a day after he went

An official said that the minor boy had gone missing from his home in Chewdara village on Tuesday evening.

He said that the boy had gone missing when he was playing around his house and since then the family had been looking for his whereabouts. Today morning he was found dead in his native village, reported news agency

Meanwhile, a senior police official said that they are ascertaining the details and further investigation has been taken up to find the actual cause of the minor boy's death.

Teen Falls Off Moving Cab, Dies

Srinagar: A teenager on Wednesday died after falling off a moving cab in south Kashmir's Anantnag district.

18-year-old Riyaz Akhoon fell down from the rooftop of a running cab in Nowbugh area of the district on Wednesday evening, news agency KDC reported. The injured teen was removed to a nearby hospital for treatment. However, the doctors there declared him dead on arrival.

PANCHAYAT BY-ELECTIONS

65% Turnout In 2nd Phase Of **Panch By-Polls**

52% Polling For Sarpanch Vacancies

SRINAGAR: The second phase of byelections to vacant seats of Panch and Sarpanch in Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday witnessed 65.54 percent and 52.24 percent voter turnout respectively, State Election Commissioner (SEC) K K Sharma said on Wednesday.

The polling was held on Tuesday along with the second phase of the District Development Council polls but the figures were released on Wednesday.

Sharma said 65.54 per cent polling was recorded in the bypolls to the vacant panch seats and 52.24 per cent for the sarpanch seats.

The SEC said the second phase of the byelections to vacant panch seats was held in 343 constituencies -- 317 in Kashmir division and 26 in Jammu division.

Jammu division recorded 79.25 per cent turnout and Kashmir division recorded 63.92 per cent, he added. More On P2

BJP Tonga Rally in Geelani Bastion

SRINAGAR: For the first time in the past 30-years, Sopore area of north Kashmir's Baramulla district on Wednesday witnessed a Tonga rally organized by the BJP leaders who promised International Mandi for Sopore if people vote for their candidates in the ensuing District Development Council (DDC) elections.

Abdul Majeed, a Sarpanch from Mabugh area of Sopore, where the rally was held, said that it is for the first time in the past 30 years that a Tonga rally was held in favour of BJP in the area.

"This is a message of peace and in this rally dozens of Tonga wallas participated.

Dry Weather In Kashmir Till Dec 6: MeT

SRINAGAR: The famous ski-resort of Gulmarg was the only place in Kashmir which experienced a subzero night even as there was an improvement in the minimum temperature across the Valley, officials said on Tuesday.

The weather is expected to remain dry till December 6 in Kashmir, they

Gulmarg, in north Kashmir's Baramulla district, was the only place in the valley where the mercury stayed below the freezing point at a low of minus 1.0 degrees Celsius, the officials said.

They said the mercury in Srinagar, which had recorded the minimum temperature of minus 1.3 degrees Celsius on Monday, settled at a low of 1.0 degree Celsius on Tuesday.

Pahalgam tourist resort in south Kashmir's Anantnag district recorded a low of 0.2 degree Celsius.

The officials said the mercury settled at the minimum of 1.4 degrees Celsius in Qazigund, 1.0 degrees Celsius in Kupwara and 1.2 degrees Celsius in Kokernag.

The MeT office has forecast mainly dry weather in Jammu and Kashmir till December 6, after which there is a possibility of a spell of rain and snow between December 7-8.

COVID-19 Vaccine Is Here But Do We All Need To Be Vaccinated?

Here's What We Know

SRINAGAR: The United Kingdom, today, became the first country in the world to approve the COVID-19 vaccine developed by Pfizer Inc-BioNTech SE. The vaccine will be available for mass use from next week onwards, as per reports.

Although India will have to wait a little longer as it is yet to get approvals for vaccines. It will be either Oxford-AstraZeneca which is tested by the Serum Institute of India (SII) or the Russian vaccine Sputnik-V tested in India by Dr. Reddy's Lab.

The vaccine has been the only hope for the past many months as the coronavirus turns a year old. Currently, there are many vaccine candidates in the race including Pfizer-BioNTech, Moderna, Oxford-AstraZeneca, Russia, and China. But, does everyone need to get vaccinated once the COVID-19 vaccine is available for mass use? Pfizer scientist says no.

Who all need COVID-19 Vaccine?

Pfizer ex-scientist Dr. Michael Yeadon distinctly said that there is absolutely no need for a vaccine to end the COVID-19 pandemic. He said that we should vaccinate people who are not at risk of contracting the said disease. "You do not vaccinate people who aren't at risk from the disease. You also don't

set about planning to vaccinate millions of fit and healthy people with a vaccine that hasn't been extensively tested on human subjects," Yeadon wrote for Lockdown Sceptics.

In fact, the Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan on Tuesday said that the Indian government has never spoken about vaccinating the entire country. "If we're able to vaccinate a critical mass of people & break virus transmission, then we may not have to vaccinate the entire population," ICMR DG Dr. Balram Bhargava added.
