### **Army Officer Shoots Self Dead**

SRINAGAR: An Army officer allegedly shot himself dead at a forward post in Tangdhar sector along the Line of Control in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said on Monday.

The deceased has been identified as Major Fayazullah Khan, a company commander of 6 Jammu and Kashmir Rifles, they said.

The officials said the reason behind the officer taking such an extreme step was not immediately known. (PTI)

SRINAGAR: The three youth killed in a gunfight in Lawaypora last month were involved in militancy; Inspector General of Police-Kashmir Vijay Kumar said on Monday and added that police will soon convince their parents of it with concrete evidence.

"Their involvement has been -- almost 60 per cent -- proved. We are getting the data and we will convince their parents, he said. He said the police were not

sharing the information as yet deliberately as the issue was very sensitive.

"According to the meta data we have collected so far, all the three associates who were killed in the encounter were involved in militancy. They were providing logistic support (to militants). We want to take a few more days so that we collect all the
