**CRPF Man Dies
Of Haemorrhage**

SRINAGAR: A Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) man, who had suffered brain haemorrhage in south Kashmir's Shopian district, died at SK Institute of medical sciences here on Wednesday, reports said. 55-year-old Ramsukh Meena of CRPF 14 battalion died at the Neurology ward of the SKIMS here on Wednesday, local news agency KNO reported. A resident of Rajasthan, Meena was posted at Deputy Commissioner (DC) Shopian's office and died. ● More On P10

**CASO Conducted
In Tral**

SRINAGAR: Government forces on Wednesday launched a cordon and search operation (CASO) in Tral town of south Kashmir's Pulwama district. Special operations group (SOG) of police, army's 42 Rashtriya Rifles and the personnel of CRPF 180 Battalion laid a siege around Shaldraman village of Tral and conducted door-to-door searches after receiving inputs about the movement of militants, news agency KNT reported while quoting police sources. In Kashmir, Doctors Taking First Shot To Allay Vaccine Fears

Amid growing paranoia and panic, Mohammad Shafi, a 30-year-old dentist in Govt Dental College, Shireen Bagh Srinagar signed up as the 20th health beneficiary in SMHS hospital for taking the Covid shot. But before being jabbed, he asked a few questions in



hesitation, "Since I'm diabetic, is this vaccine safe for me? I also have hypertension, can I really take the vaccine?" After getting assurance from the doctors, he took the vaccine and joined other participants — kept under observation for an hour to monitor any Adverse Effects Following Immunization (AEFI). Every vaccine made for any disease has its side-effects,

Dr Saleem Khan, Head of the Department Community Medicine, Government Medical College (GMC) Srinagar, told Kashmir Observer. "And it's very common," Dr Khan said. "It's actually the stimulation of the human body towards a drug like fever, chills, headaches etc, but it's not something to be afraid of." Dr. Shafi wasn't alone to

take the vaccine shot. His colleague, 29-year-old dentist, Owais Gowher, was following him as the 21st participant. "I feel a slight pain on my shoulder, nothing else," said Dr Owais. "We don't know how many more mutated variants are coming — it's better to take the cure beforehand," he said and smiled. But amid public skepticism, only a ● More On P10

NEW DELHI: The Union Cabinet on Wednesday approved an investment proposal of Rs 5,281.94 crore for the 850 MW Ratile hydro power project on river Chenab in Kishtwar district of Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, an official statement said.



The project will be constructed by a joint venture company (JVC) to be incorporated between National Hydroelectric

Biden Becomes 46th US President

WASHINGTON: Joseph Robinette Biden Jr. became the 46th U.S. president on Wednesday, completing the most daunting power transfer in recent American history.

Inaugurated in a fortified Washington under the shadow of the coronavirus pandemic, the 78-year-old Democrat took the oath of office at the U.S. Capitol in front of a sparse bipartisan crowd. He enters the White House exactly two weeks after a mob inflamed by his predecessor, Donald Trump, stormed the Capitol, disrupting the transition to Biden's administration and leaving five people dead.

Wet Spell From Saturday To Break Cold Wave In Kashmir

SRINAGAR: As Kashmir continues to reel under intense cold wave, the weather department on Wednesday predicted another wet spell from Friday night in Jammu and Kashmir which might lead to temporary disruption of surface and air traffic.

According to a meteorological official, most of the places in Jammu and Kashmir are likely to receive widespread snowfall between January 22-January 24 under the influence of a fresh

western disturbance of moderate intensity which is most likely to affect J&K and Kargil district of Ladakh during the night of January 22.

"The main activity will be on January 23-24. This will cause widespread moderate snowfall in hilly areas of Jammu, plains of Kashmir, rain in plains of Jammu and light snowfall at scattered places of Ladakh especially in Kargil district," the official said, adding that the wet spell may lead to temporary disruption of surface and aircraft traffic. ● More On P10

4 Soldiers Injured In Pak Firing On LoC

JAMMU: Four soldiers of the Army sustained injuries as Pakistani troops opened fire targeting forward areas along the Line of Control (LoC) in Jammu and Kashmir's Akhnoor sector, official sources said on Wednesday.

The ceasefire violation from across the LoC in the Keri Battal area took place on the intervening night of Tuesday and Wednesday, they said. Four soldiers suffered splinter injuries and were

shifted to the military hospital in Udhampur for treatment, the sources added.

Jammu and Kashmir recorded 5,100 instances of ceasefire violations by Pakistan along the Line of Control (LoC) in 2020, the highest in the past 18 years with an average of 14 cases daily, according to official sources.

In these ceasefire violations, 36 people, including 24 security personnel, were killed and over 130 injured, as per data.

In her blog Life Beyond Usual, Sengar writes about the "warm hospitality" and the mesmerizing beauty of the valley.


