## 2 Militants Killed In Overnight Encounter: Police

SRINAGAR: Police claimed on Thursday to have killed two local militants of Jaish-e-Muhammad (JeM) in an overnight gunfight in Bijbehara area of south Kashmir's Anantnag district.

JeM militants Adil Ahmad Bhat and Zahid Ahmad Rather were killed on Thursday morning by the joint team of police, army's 3 RR and CRPF in Kandipora village of Bijbehara in the exchange of gunfire that ensued when

the former rejected repeated surrender offers and fired upon the state forces to break the cordon, a police spokesperson said.

As per police records, he said, both the killed militants were involved in several crime cases including attacks on security forces and "civilian atrocities".

## Civil Secretariat To Go Paperless

JAMMU: The Administrative Council in Jammu and Kashmir has approved the adoption of e-office system in all departments of the Civil Secretariat, an official spokesman said on Thursday.

The time-bound roll out of e-office in government departments at an estimated cost of Rs 67.62 crore will be a step towards the introduction of paperless office, besides, saving on the cost of shifting official records twice a year between both the secretariats at Jammu and Srinagar, he said.

The shift to e-office will bring a considerable improvement in the pace of disposal of official business and establish accountability through monitorable statistics of file movement, thereby improving public service delivery, the spokesman said.

The project entails setting up of wired LAN for Civil Secretariat, Jammu and Srinagar for providing high speed and uninterrupted connectivity, setting up ● More On P10

## Rohingya Refugees: Plea In SC Seeks Release Of Members Detained In Jammu

NEW DELHI: A plea has been filed in the Supreme Court seeking immediate release of detained Rohingya refugees in Jammu and restrain the Centre from implementing any order deporting them.

An intervention application has been filed in the pending matter before the top court, which also sought direction to Ministry of Home Affairs to expeditiously grant refugee identification cards through the Foreigners Regional Registration Office (FRRO) for the Rohingyas in the informal camps.

The application filed by Mohammad Salimullah, a Rohingya refugee through advocate Prashant Bhusan, said that it is filed in the public interest in order to secure and protect the right against deportation of the refugees in India.

The plea said that it is filed to protect rights guaranteed under Article 14 and Article 21, read with Article 51(c) of the Constitution, against the deportation of Rohingya refugees who have taken refuge in India after escaping widespread violence and discrimination against their community in their home country Myanmar.

"Release the detained Rohingya refugees immediately and direct the Union Territory government and the Ministry of Home Affairs to expeditiously grant Refugee identification cards through the FRRO for the Rohingyas in the informal camps," it said. It sought ● More On P10

## SOPORE 'CUSTODIAL DEATH'

## HC Seeks Govt's Response On Family's Plea

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir high court has issued notice to the government on a plea by family from Sopore area of north Kashmir's Baramulla district, seeking copy of a magisterial enquiry report and filing of FIR into the alleged "custodial death" of their kin in September last year.

A bench of Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey has sought the response by May 12 after hearing advocate Shafaqat Nazir for the family which alleges that their kin, Irfan Ahmad Dar of Sidiq Colony Sopore, was killed in alleged police custody on the night of September 16 last year as against the official version that the 23-year-old's body was found near a quarry at Tujjar-Sharief

after he "escaped taking advantage of the darkness."

In the petition filed by Irfan's mother—Haja Begum, and his siblings—Tahira Akther (sister) and Javid Akbar Dar (brother)—the family has sought copy of the magisterial enquiry report conducted on the directions by District Magistrate Baramulla, as per petition.

The family has also sought directions to the police to register FIR with regard to "killing of Irfan in Police custody" as well as "adequate compensation the kin of the deceased." The court has issued notice to government through Commissioner cum Secretary General Administration Department, Principal Secretary Home Department, Director General Of Police, ● More On P10

In his celebrated anthology, The Veiled Suite: The Collected Poem, Agha Shahid Ali details his grandmother's "bleeding heart"—which ensured the educational empowerment of the masses in the valley.

Shahid's poem, Prayer Rug in her memory, became a token introduction of "the lady with a lamp"—Begum Zaffar Ali.

Beyond the poem, however, there's a staggering profile of the grand old lady of Kashmir—whose educational service made her legend. "Firmly determined, my

mother-in-law, Begum Zaffar Ali, was a self-made lady, who spent her life relentlessly advocating for women education and empowerment in the

valley," recalls Dr. Shaheena Agha, at her Rajbagh residence.

In the sweeping accolades being showered on the lockdown-hit girls whose recent grades once again made them the shining stars of Kashmir's dented academia, Begum Zaffar Ali found a glorious mention for inspiring generations of girls in the valley.

"My mother-in-law was one of the first Kashmiri girls whose grit made her a beacon of educational excellence," Shaheena continues.

"An untiring activist, Begum Zaffar helped Kashmiri women in one way or another. I take inspiration from her."

In her 60s, Shaheena first met Begum Zaffar as a 26-year-old woman, when she married the celebrated educationist's eldest son, Agha Nasir Ali, in 1986.

"It was an evening of mutual admiration and love," she talks about the first interaction with her ● More On P10
