PMDP Sponsored Small Hydro Projects In J&K Hit Roadblock

Only Rs 1.94 Crore **Utilized Against** Financial Outlay Of Rs 2000 Crore

SRINAGAR: The ambitious project of setting up of small hydro projects in Jammu and Kashmir under the Prime Minister's Development Package (PMDP) has come to a grinding halt.

Official documents reveal that only Rs 1.94 crore has been utilized for setting up the small hydro projects in the Union Territory till date against the financial outlay of Rs 2000 crore

for it under the package. So far, the documents reveal, the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy has sanctioned Rs 27. 71 crore for the project and only Rs 3.86 crore has been released out of it, the documents reveal.

According to the documents, out of 23 projects proposed to be set-up under the package, only three have awarded or are under process of award. Of 23 small hydroelectric projects proposed to be set-up under the package, seven are in range of 2-10 megawatts and 16 of 10-25 MWs.

'13K Litres Medical Oxygen Generation Capacity In Srinagar Hospitals'

SRINAGAR: The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz Asad Saturday chaired a meeting to take stock of the availability of Medical Oxygen in City hospitals and subsequent allocation of the same among all hospitals functioning in Srinagar.

Additional Deputy Commissioner, Srinagar, SSP Srinagar, SSP Traffic Srinagar City, Medical Superintendents of SMHS, Lal Ded, Chest Disease, Bone & Joint, JLNM, SKIMS, G.B Pant, SKIMS JVC hospitals and Kashmir Nursing Home were present in the meeting besides CMO Srinagar, Nodal Officer Covid Control Room and representatives of various Medical Oxygen Plants operating in Srinagar.

The DC urged all Medical Superintendents to work in a coordinated manner to fulfil requirements relating to oxygen and other Covid-19 issues.

He also stressed the need to increase he availability of oxygen cylinders as well as upgrade the logistics facilities for generation and transportation of oxygen supplies.

The DC stressed upon the officers to fill the gaps if any and forecast the Oxygen demand to tackle untoward situations, if any. He urged the authorities of Po-

lice and Traffic to ensure hassle free movement of Oxygen supplies and no oxygen carrying vehicle meant for any hospital or health institution is stopped or gets stranded.

He also told the owners of oxygen plants operating in Srinagar to ensure smooth and prompt supply of oxygen to City hospitals to meet increasing oxygen requirements.

While reviewing hospital wise availability of oxygen supply, the DC was informed that at present City hospitals are having capacity of generating about 13000 litres per minute of oxygen supply for patients. While at industry level about 3000 oxygen cylinders are being produced at different oxygen plants at Rangreth, Khonmoh and Sanat Nagar industrial Estates for hospital supplies.

Sirens Wail Across Israel As Palestinians Hit Back After Violent Attacks

ocket warning sirens have for several times been activated in numerous locations across the Israelioccupied territories over the past 24 hours amid an assertive Palestinian response to recent attacks on Jerusalem al-Quds and the besieged Gaza Strip.

Israeli media said on Saturday that Palestinian resistance movements had fired 36 rockets from the Gaza Strip toward the occupied territories overnight, activating warning sirens in various settlements in the early morning hours.

Israeli authorities claimed that most of the rockets had struck "open areas" and six of the projectiles had been intercepted by the Iron Dome missile defense system.

The rocket salvos came after Israeli bombings of the Gaza Strip and violent attacks on worshipers in the occupied Old City of Jerusalem al-Quds, in which more than 100 Palestinians have been injured.

The unity shown by the Palestinian factions and the ferocity of confrontation in the Old City as well as the response of the resistance movements in the besieged Gaza to fresh Israeli aggression is unprecedented.

It comes in the wake of normalization deals signed by several Arab regimes with Israel, which the Palestinians have described as a stab in their back.

The uptick in tensions also comes as Palestinian territories gear up to mark Quds Day which falls on the last Friday of the fasting month of Ramadan, along with pro-Palestine advocates around the world.

French Isolation Study Ends After 40 Days In Cave Hideout



ne coronavirus pandemic has engulfed us from all sides and the unprecedented situation it has created in India is a grave concern that should worry us. The numbers are rising, dead bodies are piling, and mourning is what you hear the most these days. It is like a war zone with burning and burial of corpses surroundings us from all sides

The virus originated in China in December 2019 and travelled via people to countries and forced the entire world to review the facilities that could hinder its growth and development, and that in particular was related to the healthcare facilities. Right from December 2019, it was clear that the virus will have grave consequences in the developing world, and in particular where the health facilities are inadequate and people are poor. India was red-flagged very early, but the steps taken by the government were not sufficient to stop the pandemic from turning into a living hell. Now, India has emerged as the main virus spreading centre, which was envisaged much earlier by the experts but largely overlooked by the administration and people in general

So, what are the choices with us now? Should we wait for the dead bodies to pile in front of us or should we learn lessons and start fighting back?

We have no time left to watch or complain about the lack of facilities, poor role of administration and so on. These things ought to be done later and through a proper legal and formal route. Now, is the time for all of us to unite and fight the virus. That ought to be our priority. Here are a few immediate steps that I suggest could help prevent the catastrophe from spilling out of control.

It is time to demonstrate how religious institutions help humanity in the crisis. Mosques need to play a proactive role and be ready to transform into community centers for the assistance of covid-19 patients. These can be turned into covid-19 facilities if need be. Similarly, auditoriums and stadiums are perfect places to transform into a COVID-19 facility. It can hold a large number of patients in one place. Community-level arrangements should also be made for availability of oxygen and responsibilities like the burial of the dead bodies so that the sanctity of the deceased is maintained. Public and private gatherings must be stopped immediately. Hospital visits must be avoided if possible. Mask wearing, social distancing, ventilation and all hand hygiene must be followed strictly. Help each other in this crisis: some may



need monetary help as well.

Kashmir is also at a critical juncture where things can turn ugly anytime, and it may be too late to turn, and we may find ourselves in the position similar to other states presently. Therefore, we ought to stop everything and help the healthcare professionals by following Covid-19 appropri ate behaviour. And if such behaviour is delayed further, it will only worsen the situation on the ground and will definitely plunge the region into a major coronavirus infection crisis where people and our vital healthcare staff will be infected on a large scale, which is what seems to be the case currently in most of India. Therefore, it is important that the concerned administration should look into this immediately and make quick arrangements regarding the shortage of

medical supplies, human resources, and hospitals.

People have a special responsibility by helping healthcare workers to deal with the present crisis and in a concerned manner. They are fighting on multiple fronts and not just the virus but also the lack of facilities, shortage of staff, poor condition of hospitals. We should work together to avert the current crisis and we hopefully will.

Looking the Other Way

From Gautam Gambhir to Amitabh Bachchan: No word of succor from India's celebs as COVID-19 tragedy unfolds

t's sometimes in our genes - we Indians like leaders, cricketers and movie stars who fool us again and again.

Witness the current COVID-19 catastrophe as India becomes the only country in the world with the highest number of CO-VID-19 infections - 316000 cases in a day. You would reckon that all members of Parliament would be providing succour and tangible help to their constituents as the primitive health care systems capsizes to a historical low.

Indian Twitter has provided more help than the Indian authorities in the COVID-19 catastrophe. Let that sink in and then let me give you some examples of "stars" who have turned tail at the crisis fearing infection and those who simply prefer to rake in big bucks while doing commentary for Indian Premier

Take Gautam Gambhir, Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) member of parliament from East Delhi. He is safely swaddled up in a bio bubble while his constituents run from pillar to post. Fadnavis of course is the once and future CM of Maharashtra as he conducts "Operation Lotus" in the worst medical crisis that has hit his state to topple the Uddhav Thackeray led government.

Bollywood missing in action

Take the case of Sunny Deol ex-Bollywood hero and the BJP's member of parliament from Gurdaspur. Not even a cheep or a tweet has been heard from him during the farmers agitation against the Modi government's three farm Acts and now when people are dying with the total collapse of the health system.

Actor Dharmendra, Sunny's father, resigned from Bikaner constituency after fail-

ing to either visit his constituency or the parliament. Dharmendra while campaigning for his son had made dramatic speeches that he would not forgive Sunny Deol if he let Gurdaspur down. As residents of Gurdaspur desperately seek help, both father and son have long since vanished

Hema Malini, who tweets at @dreamgirlhema and who is the second wife of Dharmendra, represents Mathura as a BJP MP. Malini has not been heard of since the outbreak of COVID-19 either in the parliament or in her constituency as Mathura collapses.

Clearly voting for this extended family has not been good for the voters yet star candidates keep getting voted to office and then run away from their responsibilities.

Sachin Tendulkar, who was nominated to the Rajya Sabha, barely had an attendance record of two percent, forget raising any issues.

Yet he dutifully tweets in support of the Modi government from the pulpit. Gambhir, with his lack of concern, is only following in the footsteps of Tendulkar.

Hollywood actors seem to possess a social conscience and a spine unlike our lot. They take serious advocacy stands. Bachchan first lent his famous baritone and credibility to then Gujarat CM Narendra Modi and is now the brand ambassador of a host of marquee public campaigns of the BJP government like the Swach Bharat Abhiyan.

Forget standing with the common man as COVID-19 cuts a swathe, resulting in historic death toll, actors and celebrities who have a social media following in millions are not even bothering to amplify desperate voices seeking hospital beds, drugs and oxygen for their loved ones.

Not one single cricketer or actor has even bothered to retweet a request. We see beautiful curated pictures of them going to the Maldives for a holiday and then pictures of the obligatory six pack and the fit bikini look but, that's it.

Sonu Sood is a rare actor with a social conscience who been helping people in distress but, actors like Ahshay Kumar and Ajay Devgn, who always stand by the BJP government, are mum on the COVID-19 catastrophe. The bubble they live in is impervious to the tragedy unfolding in India.

Obituary: Maulana Wahiduddin Khan


A Life Devoted To Fostering Trust & Goodwill

N 2009, a publication by the Georgetown University, USA titled "The 500 Most Influential Muslims of 2009" described Maulana Wahiduddin Khan "Islam's Spiritual Ambassador to the world." His approach, the book points out, is "popular among Indians, both Muslim and non-Muslim.

Internationally recognised for his contributions to world peace, Maulana Wahiduddin Khan was conferred with, among others, the Demiurgus Peace International Award, the Padma Bhushan, the Rajiv Gandhi National Sadbhavna Award and the National Citizen's Award in

Born in Azamgarh (UP) in 1925, Maulana left this mortal world on May..2021 in New Delhi where he lived most part of his illustrious life. Maulana was educated in a traditional seminary but from his early years, he showed a voracious appetite for modern knowledge, spending entire days in the library. As a result he became well versed in both classical Islamic learning and modern disciplines. His extensive research led him to conclude that the need of the hour was to present Islamic teachings in the style and language of the post-scientific era.





EDUCATION AND INTELLECTUAL CHALLENGES

had graduated, he was deeply shocked to realize that, although his education had been completed, he was not able to respond to statements and questions put to him by those who had received scientific education. Realising that, without studying English and modern science, his education would be incomplete, the young Khan immersed himself in learning English and then went on to study innumerable books on science and contemporary thought.

WHY SCIENCE DOES NOT DISPROVE GOD THE SCIENTIFIC BASIS OF RELIGION

Upon completion of his research, in 1955, Maulana Wahiduddin Khan published his first book, Naye Ahd Ke Darwaze Par, or 'On the Threshold of a New Era'. The book is a unique contribution to Islamic literature in that it logically examines the basis of atheism and provides a scientific basis to religious beliefs such as the existence of God and the life Hereafter. 
ISLAMIC CENTRE AND AL-RISALA MISSION

To give full expression to these positive ideas, he established the Islamic Centre at New Delhi in 1970. Subsequently, the organ of the Centre, Al-Risala - the monthly magazine - was launched in Urdu in 1976. This journal, consisting entirely of his own articles, quickly acquired a wide circulation throughout the Urdu-speaking world, and has done much to enlighten people about the peaceful ideas of Islam, to awaken in Muslims a new awareness of their responsibilities in the present age, to rekindle in Muslims the inner spirit of Islam and to promote positive thinking and action. The first issues of the English and Hindi versions of Al-Risala were launched respectively in 1984 and 1990. The English version continues to be published under the title Spirit of Islam.

FOSTERING TRUST AND GOODWILL



QURAN IN CONTEMPORARY ENGLISH

Realising the need for a clear translation of the Quran, he translated the Quran into Urdu. This was subsequently translated into English. According to Maulana, there are more than a dozen translations of the Quran in English. However, the clarity that is there in the Arabic Quran is lacking in all of the translations. His English translations now widely popular as simple and easy-to-read. Maulana has also written a commentary on the Quran which is titled in Urdu Tazkirul Quran. The English version of the commentary is available as Quran Commentary. The focus is on extracting the spiritual meaning of the verses of the Quran, seeking nearness to God and applying Quranic guidance to daily life experiences.

POPULAR BOOKS

Maulana Wahiduddin Khan has authored over 200 books on Islam, prophetic wisdom, spirituality and peaceful co-existence in a multi-ethnic society, the most




recent being The Prophet of Peace: The Teachings of Prophet Muhammad, Jihad, Peace and Inter-Community Relations in Islam, The Age of Peace. These books analyse the basis of violence perpetrated in the name of Islam, deconstruct the political interpretation of Islam and provide a pragmatic ideology of peace based on the Islamic scripture and the life of the Prophet. Many of his proposals have been utilised to de-escalate controversial disputes between communities in India and reinforce trust and goodwill among people from different religious backgrounds. Another genre that Khan is famous for is applied spirituality. His books such as Leading a Spiritual Life provide wisdom to those who seek to lead their life beyond materialism and choose to manage their life's affairs instead of succumbing to tension and depression. Many of his articles on applying spirituality to resolve problems of our life are regularly published in the Speaking Tree column of The Times of India. These insights have great acceptability among people across diverse religious affiliations.

RELIGION AND FREEDOM OF THOUGHT

Some of the essential features of the modern age are democratic governance, secularism, pluralistic societies, freedom of conscience and scientific learning. Maulana realised that the traditional literature on Islam which was compiled in the medieval times needs to take into account modern changes. Some of the questions he answered in his writings are: Is Islam compatible with democracy and secularism? Can Muslims live peacefully alongside people of other faiths? Is it necessary to reestablish an Islamic state as the ultimate goal of Islam? Does the Quran sanction violence against non-Muslims because they are non-believers? Should those who speak against the Prophet be punished due to blasphemy? If a person leaves Islam for another faith, will he be liable to death?

A central theme found in Maulana's writings is that Islam gives complete freedom to individuals. In Islam there is no concept of coercion, either at the individual level or state level. Faith is a matter of one's conscious intellectual discovery and not compulsive following imposed by any external authority.

People with high omega-3 index less likely to die prematurely

id you ever imagine that consuming fish oil or Omega-3 capsules can save you from premature death? A new research paper examining the relationship between the omega-3 Index and the risk for death from any and all causes shows that those people with higher omega-3 EPA and DHA blood levels (i.e. Omega-3 Index) lived longer than those with lower levels.

In other words, those people who died with relatively low omega-3 levels died prematurely, i.e., all else being equal, they might have lived longer had their levels been higher.

Numerous studies have investigated the link between omega-3s and diseases affecting the heart, brain, eves and joints, but few studies have examined their possible effects on lifespan.

In Japan, omega-3 intakes and blood levels are higher than in most other countries in the world AND they happen to live longer than most. Coincidence? Possibly, or maybe a high Omega-3 Index is part of the explanation.

Studies reporting estimated dietary fish or omega-3 intake have reported benefits on risk for death from all causes, but "diet record" studies carry little weight because of the imprecision in getting at true EPA and DHA intakes. Studies using biomarkers - i.e., blood levels - of omega-3 are much more believable because the "exposure" variable is objective.

The new study published in Nature Communications is from the FORCE - Fatty Acids & Outcomes Research - Consortium. FORCE is comprised of researchers around the world that have gathered data on blood fatty acid levels in large groups of study subjects (or cohorts) and has followed those individuals over many years to determine what diseases they develop.

These data are then pooled to get a clearer picture of these relationships than a single cohort can provide. The current study focused on omega-3 levels and the risk for death during the follow-up period, and it is the largest study yet

Specifically, this report is a prospective analysis of pooled data from 17 separate cohorts from around the world, including 42,466 people followed for 16 years on average during which time 15,720 people died. When FORCE researchers examined the risk for death from any cause, the people who had the highest EPA+DHA levels (i.e., at the 90th percentile) had a statistically significant, 13 per cent lower risk for death than people with EPA+DHA levels in the 10th percentile.

When they looked at three major causes of death - cardiovascular disease, cancer and all other causes combined - they found statistically significant risk reductions (again comparing the 90th vs 10th percentile) of 15 per cent, 11 per cent, and 13 per cent, respectively

The range between the 10th and 90th percentile for EPA+DHA was (in terms of red blood cell membrane omega-3 levels, i.e., the Omega-3 Index) about 3.5 per cent to 7.6 per cent. From other research, an optimal Omega-3 Index is 8 per cent or higher.

In the new paper, the authors noted that these findings suggest that omega-3 fatty acids



may beneficially affect overall health and thus slow the ageing process and that they are not just good for heart disease.

"Since all of these analyses were statistically adjusted for multiple personal and medical factors (i.e., age, sex, weight, smoking, diabetes, blood pressure, etc., plus blood omega-6 fatty acid levels), we believe that these are the strongest data published to date supporting the view that over the long-term, having higher blood omega-3 levels can help maintain better overall

health," said Dr Bill Harris, Founder of the Fatty Acid Research Institute (FARI), and lead author on this paper

Dr Harris co-developed the Omega-3 Index 17 years ago as an objective measure of the body's omega-3 status. Measuring omega-3s in red blood cell membranes offers an accurate picture of one's overall omega-3 intake during the last four to six months. To date, the Omega-3 Index has been featured in more than 200 research studies.

Researchers find how climate change is driving some to skip having kids

new study drove by the University of Arizona found that overconsumption, overpopulation and uncertainty about the future are among the top concerns of those who say climate change is affecting their reproductive decision-making.

When deciding whether to have children, there are many factors to consider: finances, support systems, personal values. For a growing number of people, climate change is also being added to the list of considerations, says a University of Arizona researcher.

Sabrina Helm, an associate professor in the Norton School of Family and Consumer Sciences in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, is the lead author of a new peer-reviewed study that looks at how climate change is affecting people's decisions about whether to have children.

"For many people, the question of whether to have children or not is one of the biggest they will face in their lives," Helm said. "If you are worried about what the future will look like because of climate change, obviously it will impact how you view this very important decision in your life."

Helm and her collaborators wanted to better understand the specific climate change-related reasons people have for not wanting to have children. They started by analyzing online comments posted in response to news articles written about the growing trend of people forgoing having children due to a change concerns.

They then sought out adults ages 18 to 35 who said climate change plays

The researchers' findings, published in the journal Population and Environment, identify three major themes that emerged in both the online comments

1) Overconsumption: This was the most common concern expressed by interviewees, Helm said. Almost all participants said they worried about how children would contribute to climate change through an increased carbon footprint and overuse of resources that could become more scarce in the future, such as food and water.

2) Overpopulation: Overpopulation was the prevailing concern among online commenters, and it often came up in interviews as well, Helm said. Some participants said they felt having more than two children would be problematic and even selfish, as they would be "over-replacing" themselves and their partner. Some said they saw adoption as a more responsible choice. "Adoption was seen as the low-carbon alternative." Helm said.

3) An uncertain future: Interviewees and online commenters also frequently expressed a sense of doom about the future if climate change continues unchecked. Many said they would feel guilty or as if they were doing something morally or ethically wrong if they brought a child into a world with such

better and brighter future. Others expressed hope that future generations could contribute to environmental improvement by increasing climate change awareness and action.

"There was a hope that future generations will get the job done and makes things better," Helm said. "But that puts a lot of burden on small children."

Understanding how climate change affects reproductive decision-making is part of a larger effort by Helm and other researchers to understand how climate change is impacting individuals mentally and emotionally overall. Helm noted that climate change anxiety is on the rise, especially in younger people.

"Many people now are severely affected in terms of mental health with regard to climate change concerns," she said. "Then you add this very important decision about having kids, which very few take lightly, and this is an important topic from a public health perspective. It all ties into this bigger topic of how climate change affects people beyond the immediate effect of weather phenomena.

Helm said many study participants expressed anger and frustration that their concerns aren't taken seriously by family members and friends, who might dismissively tell them they will change their minds about having kids when they're older or meet the right person.

"It's still a bit taboo to even talk about this -- about how worried they are - in an environment where there are still people who deny climate change," Helm said "I think what's been lacking is the opportunity to talk about it and hear other people's voices. Maybe this research will help," he added.

Ind Ra Revises Down India's FY22 GDP Growth Forecast To 10.1%

ndia Ratings and Research on Friday revised down India's FY22 real GDP growth forecast to 10.1 per cent, from earlier projection of 10.4 per cent, citing the second wave of COVID-19 infections and slower pace of vaccination.

At a time when large parts the country are experiencing tremendous pressure on medical infrastructure, the agency said it expects the second wave to start subsiding by mid-May.

Earlier this month, the Reserve Bank maintained its 10.5 per cent GDP growth estimate, but Governor Shaktikanta Das has flagged the rising cases as the biggest impediment to recovery.

NEW DELHI: Billionaire Mukesh Ambani's Reliance Industries Ltd has bought Britain's iconic country club and luxury golf resort, Stoke Park, for 57 million pounds

(about Rs 592 crore). The acquisition adds to Reliance's current stake in Oberoi hotels and hotel/managed residences in Mumbai that it's developing. Over the past four years, Reliance has announced USD 3.3 billion in acquisitions with 14 per cent in retail, 80 per cent in technology, media, and telecom (TMT) sector, and 6 per cent in energy.

The UK-based firm, which owns a hotel and golf course in Bucking-



hamshire, UK, will add to Reliance's consumer and hospitality assets, the firm said in a filing late on Thursday.

"Reliance Industrial Investments and Holdings Ltd (RIIHL), a whollyowned subsidiary of Reliance Industries Limited, has on April 22, 2021, acquired the entire issued share capital of Stoke Park Limited, a company incorporated in the United Kingdom, for 57 million pounds," it said.

Stoke Park Limited owns and

manages sporting and leisure facilities in Stoke Poges, Buckinghamshire, UK. The facilities include a hotel, conference facilities, sports facilities and one of the highest rated golf courses in Europe.

"RIIHL will look to enhance the sports and leisure facilities at this heritage site, while fully complying with the planning guidelines and local regulations," Reliance said.

This acquisition will add to the consumer and hospitality footprint of the oil-to-telecom conglomerate. The group already has investments in EIH Ltd (Oberoi Hotels) and is developing state-of-the-art convention centre, hotel and managed residences in BKC Mumbai.

Govt Asks Twitter, Other Social Media Platforms To Remove Misleading Posts Around COVID

NEW DELHI: The government has asked social media platforms, including Twitter and Facebook, to remove content and posts that were spreading misinformation and public panic around the pandemic, according to sources.

Twitter said it has notified the impacted account holders of its action taken in response to a legal request from the Indian government but did not give details of the affected accounts.

Sources said these flagged posts carried misleading information about COVID-19 pandemic, and were designed to incite public panic.

The development comes at a time when India is registering

a record number of coronavirus infections daily. The number of COVID-19 cases touched a new daily high of 3.46 lakh cases and 2,624 fatalities on Saturday.

When contacted, a Twitter spokesperson said when it receives a valid legal request, it reviews it under both Twitter Rules and local law.

the content violates Twitter's Rules, the content will be removed from the service. If it is determined to be illegal in a particular jurisdiction, but not in violation of the Twitter Rules, we may withhold access to the content in India only.

"The legal requests that we receive are detailed in the biannual Twitter Transparency Report, and requests to withhold

content are published on Lumen, the spokesperson said.

Reports citing Lumen database (an independent research project studying cease and desist letters concerning online content) suggested that more than 50 posts - including those by a member of Parliament, MLA and filmmakers - were removed by Twitter on government request.

Meanwhile, Twitter said ahead of withholding the content, it has notified the account holders so that they're aware that the action has been taken in response to a legal request from the Government of India.

The microblogging platform emphasised that it is committed to the principles of openness and transparency, and that it

tackles misinformation based on the highest potential for harm.

It noted that it is tackling COVID-19 misinformation using a combination of product, technology, and human review.

Facebook and Instagram did not respond to queries.

According to sources, a number of posts and content were flagged by the government to Twitter, Facebook, Instagram and other websites on Friday.

These posts carried misinformation around COVID. were designed to incite public panic and create a feeling of ill-will towards health personnel, they added.

Details of the account holders and number of such posts flagged could not be immediately ascertained.

Bharat Biotech Prices Covaxin At Rs 600 For States, Rs 1,200 For Pvt Hospitals

NEW DELHI: Bharat Biotech has fixed the price of its COVID-19 vaccine, Covaxin, at Rs 600 per dose for state governments and at Rs 1,200 per dose for private hospitals, the vaccine maker announced on Saturday.

In a statement, Bharat Biotech Chairman and Managing Director Krishna M Ella said the company is supplying the vaccine to the Central Government at Rs 150 per dosage.

"We would like to state that more than 50 per cent of our capacities have been reserved for Central Government supplies," Ella said.

Recovering cost is essential in the journey of innovation towards

other vaccines such as intranasal Covid-19, Chikungunya, Zika, Cholera and others, he added.

The company has tagged the vaccine between USD 15-20 for export markets.

Earlier this week, Serum Institute of India (SII) had announced a price of Rs 400 per dose for "Covishield" for state governments and Rs 600 per dose for private hospitals.

The company also said for the next two months, it will address the issue of limited capacity by scaling up vaccine production.

"Going ahead, 50 per cent of our capacities will be served to the Government of India's vaccination programme, and the remaining 50 per cent of the governments and private hospitals," Serum Institute of India had said in a statement.

American vaccines in the private market cost more than Rs 1,500 per dose, while Russian and Chinese vaccines cost greater than Rs 750 per dose, it

had noted. Covishield comprises over 90 per cent of the 12.76 crore COVID-19 vaccines administered across the country so far, according to government data

on Wednesday. Of the 127,605,870 COVID-19 vaccination jabs administered till now, 11,60,65,107 are of Covishield, while 1,15,40,763 are Covaxin, according to the government's CO-WIN portal.

Curfew Imposed

to 6 am was imposed in the urban areas of eight districts, which was extended to the municipal and urban local body limits of all the 20 districts in the Union Territory on April 20.

Besides extending the night curfew on April 20, the administration had ordered the closure of 50 per cent shops on alternate basis in municipal and urban areas and capped the passenger capacity in public transport at 50 per cent.

While the shopkeepers followed the order with some reservations, the transporters in the Jammu region went on an indefinite strike on April 21, demanding a 50-per cent hike in the passenger fare to save them from operational

The Jammu Chamber of Commerce and Industry (JCCI) appealed to the Union Territory administration to review its decision pertaining to the opening of 50 per cent shops on alternate days, claiming that the schedule formulated by the administration is causing much inconvenience to both the trading community as well as the people at large.

Demanding a review of the order, the trade body suggested that the shops and other establishments should be allowed to work daily from 10 am to 6 pm with a two-day weekend lockdown on Saturdays and Sundays.

In view of the marriage season having commenced, the JCCI said people, especially those who have weddings in their families, are highly perturbed over this schedule, which needs an immediate review.

Expressing similar views, the Federation of Traders' Associations said there are some markets in Jammu that deal in single-stuff products and keeping the entire market closed on particular days causes great inconvenience to people.

Meanwhile, the Nehru Market and Kanak Mandi wholesale markets in Jammu city re-

mained voluntarily closed on Saturday. Ware House Nehru Market Traders' Association president Deepak Gupta said the decision to observe a weekend lockdown was taken in view of the ongoing COVID-19 crisis.

However, he said the association does not support the administration's decision of opening 50 per cent shops on alternate days as the move is not in favour of the general public and the traders.

Sachin Tendulkar Recovers From COVID-19, To Donate Plasma

MUMBAI: Former India captain Sachin Tendulkar on Saturday said he has recovered from COVID-19 and will donate plasma when he is eligible.

Tendulkar, celebrating his 48th birthday on Saturday, tested positive for the virus on March 27 and had to be briefly hospitalised here as a precautionary measure.

"I would like to give a message, which the doctors have told me to give. Last year, I had inaugurated a plasma donation centre and their message, if plasma is given at the right time, patients can recover faster," Tendulkar said in a video posted on his twitter handle.

"I personally, when permissible, will donate it and I have spoken to the doctors," he added.

Tendulkar had been in home isolation after he was discharged from hospital on April 8.

A donor should not have any symptoms of the infection for at least 14 days prior to plasma donation. The legendary right-handed bats-

man appealed to people who have

recovered from COVID-19 to donate their plasma, to help the others.

"And you all, who have recovered from COVID-19, consult your doctor and when permissible, please donate blood, it can reduce

a lot of problems. "We know what problems our family members, friends have, till we are unwell," added the iconic player.

Usually, the donated plasma from COVID recovered patients is used for treatment of the patients who are positive for the virus.

Tendulkar also thanked the doctors for keeping him in a positive frame of mind during his treatment.

"...thank you so very much for your birthday wishes. It's truly made my day. Last month has been a tough month for me. I was tested positive and had to be isolated for 21 days.

"Your prayers and good wishes, my family's prayers and good wishes, friends, last but not the least, all the doctors and the staff with them, they kept me in a positive frame of mind and helped me recover. A big thank you to all of you," he said.

Despite playing as a left-winger, Ganguly had a penchant for scoring goals and showed his talent in his second match of the Calcutta League for Mohun Bagan when his free-kick downed Rajasthan Club.

With him in the team, Mohun Bagan won every major trophy --Calcutta League, IFA Shield, Durand Cup, Rovers Cup. His career highlights also include a brilliant hattrick in the Rovers Cup.

He was also successful for Bengal in Santosh Trophy, participating from 1967 to 1969 and 1971, winning the title in 1969 and 1971.

In 1969, Ganguly was brilliant

in the Santosh semi-final against a strong Andhra Pradesh team, scoring four times over two legs. After retirement he was involved

Thousands Of Indians Return To UAE Before Midnight Flight Suspension

nousands of Indians returned to the UAE this weekend before flights to the Emirates are suspended from midnight on Saturday.

People who travelled to meet relatives, on business or vacation have snapped up tickets, often paying more than Dh4,000 (\$1,088) – six times the usual cost of a one-way fare.

UAE authorities have said the decision covers all incoming flights from India for 10 days on national and overseas airlines.

This follows a worsening Covid-19 situation in India.

Some categories are exempt, including UAE citizens and diplomats, who are permitted to return as long as they adhere to quarantine and testing rules.

Godly Babukutty, an agent at Epic Travel in Dubai, said his team had handled more than 300 passengers who booked to return on Saturday on flights with airlines including Air India Express, Spice-Jet and IndiGo from southern India.

"All airlines have put on extra flights because the requests have shot up," he said.

We Will Hang Anyone Blocking Oxygen Supply: Delhi High Court

The Delhi High Court on Saturday asked the Centre about the preparedness to deal with the expected Covid-19 second wave peak in mid-May, terming the massive rise in cases as a 'Tsunami', and warned it will "hang" any person who tries to obstruct oxygen supplies to hospitals here. Talking tough, a bench of Justices Vipin Sanghi and Rekha Palli, said this during a special hearing on a holiday on the issue of mounting oxygen crisis in various hospitals in Delhi.

The court said the viral disease has a low mortality and those who have a low immunity will eventually die but the problem comes when people who could be saved are also dying. "The mortality rate needs to be reduced."

Referring to a study by a team of scientists from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Kanpur, the court noted its assessment that the peak of this COVID wave will come in mid-May.

"We are calling it a wave, it is actually a Tsunami," the court said, and asked the Centre about the preparedness in terms of infrastructure, hospitals, medical staff, medicines, vaccines and oxygen as on date for the peak.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, said there might be a rapid rise in the number of cases in May and June and the country needs to be ready for the worst.

He said the Prime Minister and others are working on it and have decided to import oxygen and are also exploring the remotest possibility of generating oxygen from wherever it is possible

The court was hearing submissions by the counsel for Maharaja Agrasen Hospital, Jaipur Golden Hospital, Batra Hospital and Saroj Super Speciality Hospital here over shortage of oxygen for treating seriously-ill Covid patients.

'We will hang that man. We will not spare anyone," the court said while telling the Delhi government to give one instance of any official at the central, state or local administration obstructing the pickup of oxygen supplies.

The court told the Delhi government to inform the Centre also about such officials of the local administration so that it could take action against them.

It also asked the Centre when the 480 metric tonne (MT) of oxygen per day allocated for Delhi would see the light of the day.

"You (Centre) had assured us (on April 21) that 480 MT per day will reach Delhi. Tell us when will it come? The 480 MT per day is still to see the light of the day."

The query came after the Delhi government said it was getting only 380 MT oxygen per day over the past few days and it received only around 300 MT on Friday.

During the hearing, the court also questioned the Delhi government officers as to what endeavour they have made to secure tankers to get the supply of oxygen allocated to it by the Centre.

Why India Is Facing An Oxygen Crisis As Covid-19 Cases Mount

y air, by train and by road. Blarge quantities of medical oxygen to hospitals in its capital New Delhi and other areas hit hard by a record surge of Covid-19. Are hospitals running out of oxygen?

The main problem is that medical oxygen is not reaching hospital beds in time. This delay is a product of where production units are located, a stretched distribution network, and what critics have said is bad planning. Several hospitals in Delhi,

which has no significant oxygen production capacity, made frantic public calls this week seeking emergency supplies. With Covid-19 cases also

swamping its neighbouring states like Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, oxygen facilities there are overstretched attempting to meet local demand. To fulfil Delhi's current needs,

additional medical oxygen now has to be trucked in from industrial zones in eastern India.

ting delayed?

The facilities from where Delhi will now receive oxygen are spread across seven states, some more than 1,000 km (625 miles)away, according to a court document.

Given the hazardous nature of the substance, all liquid oxygen must be transported in a limited number of specialised tankers, requiring advance planning to ensure deliveries are made on time, a gas industry source told Reuters.

In recent days, as a scramble for oxygen among states worsened, local officials in some regions disrupted movement of tankers in a bid to keep supplies for themselves.

In part due to such blockades,

Delhi only received about 177 tonnes of oxygen on Wednesday against its allocation of 378 tonnes, an official said.

But the industry source said that Delhi had also dragged its feet on planning ahead, without factoring in the time it takes to move oxygen cross-country by "This problem wouldn't have

happened if they had acted 2-3 weeks ago," the source said. Delhi's government did not respond to questions about the planning. Does India have enough oxygen? India has a daily production

capacity of at least 7,100 tonnes of oxygen, including for industrial use, which appears to be enough to meet current demand.

This week, the government allocated 6,822 tonnes of liquid oxygen per day to 20 of the country's worst-affected states, compared to their combined demand of 6,785 tonnes, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's office said on Thursday.

India's total medical oxygen demand was just 3,842 tonnes as of April 12, as the surge in cases really took hold.

tivated the Indian railways to move multiple tankers from refilling plants to where it is most needed. Working with industrial gas

major Linde India and others, the government is also using the Air Force's cargo planes to fly empty tankers to production hubs. filled oxygen tankers will then move back by road.

The armed forces are importing 23 mobile oxygen generation plants from Germany.

Several other industries are offering oxygen to hospitals, while salt-to-software conglomerate Tata Group is importing 24 specialised containers to transport liquid oxygen.

The government has issued orders to convert argon and nitrogen tankers into oxygen ones.

But as some experts predict a trebling of daily infections in a few weeks, India will have to dramatically ramp up both oxygen production and distribution

Supreme Court Should Have Acted Sooner, Sena On **Kumbh, Rallies Amid Covid**

MUMBAI: The Shiv Sena on Saturday said the COVID-19 situation in the county wouldn't have worsened had the Supreme Court taken timely cognisance of election rallies in West Bengal and the Kumbh Mela in Haridwar.

The party's remarks come after the court's order asking the Centre for a national plan on oxygen supply and vaccination amid the pandemic.

"It is good that the court has stepped in. However, had there been a timely intervention about election rallies and road shows of the Prime Minister, home minister and other leaders in West Bengal and the religious congregation in Haridwar, people wouldn't have been left to die in agony," the Sena said in an editorial in its mouthpiece "Saamana"

Citing the death of 25 COVID-19 patients in a hospital in Delhi due to oxygen shortage, the party asked who should be held responsible for the situation, if not the Centre.

"This is the situation in the national capital. Who is responsible for this situation if not the central government?" it said, highlighting that a leading British daily had described the scenario as "India's descent to Covid hell".

Had the Centre focused on tackling the second COVID-19 wave instead of the Assembly polls in West Bengal, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Assam and Puducherry, the situation would not have deteriorated, it added.

The Uddhav Thackeray-led party also condoled the loss of lives in hospital tragedies in Bhandara, Mumbai, Virar and Nashik.

"Modi and his colleagues wanted to turn India into a heaven. Today, we see only crematoriums and burial grounds. There are mass funeral pyres and hospitals themselves are on fire along with the patients. Is this a hell?" it stated.

Meanwhile, speaking to reporters, Sena leader and Saamana's executive editor Sanjay Raut blamed the country's top leadership for the health crisis.

"Our leadership is not willing to go beyond winning elections and politics. They feel this is the ultimate success. Had the focus been on tackling the pandemic, we wouldn't be in such a situation," the Rajya Sabha member said.



COVID-19: Umrah Pilgrimage **Rituals Taking 80 Minutes To** Complete On Average

CAIRO: The duration of performing the Umrah or minor pilgrimage is estimated at 80 minutes on average, according to a Saudi state religious agency.

The Umrah, which can be undertaken round the year in the Grand Mosque, comprises two key rituals: Tawaf or the circumambulation of the Holy Kaaba: and Sa'i, which is walking seven times back and forth between the hills of Safa and Marwa.

The General Presidency for Affairs of the Two Holy Mosques explained in a report that the average duration of Tawaf reaches 27 minutes, while that of Sa'i takes up to 47 minutes. Moving from the Tawaf site to that of Sa'i takes six more minutes.

The holy month of Ramadan is usually a peak Umrah season.

Saudi authorities have increased the capacity of the Grand Mosque to reach 50,000 Umrah pilgrims and 100,000 worshippers per day in current Ramadan.

The number of tracks designated for encircling the Holy Kaaba has also increased by 11 tracks to reach 25 to ensure safe distancing among pilgrims and help them perform the ritual comfortably.

In October, Saudi Arabia set into motion a plan for gradual resumption of the Umrah after suspension of around seven months amid stringent precautions against COVID-19.

The first phase of the plan, which began on October 4, allowed 6,000 Umrah pilgrims from inside the kingdom per day into the mosque.

The second went into effect on October 18, allowing about 40,000 worshippers and 10,000 pilgrims a day into the site. As many as 20,000 Umrah pilgrims and 60,000 worshipers per day were allowed into the mosque according to the third phase that started in November.

Earlier this month, Saudi authorities announced that only 'immunised" people against CO-VID-19 will be allowed to perform the Umrah and visit the Prophet's Mosque starting from Ramadan 1.

The Ministry of Haj and Umrah has defined the eligible "immunised" worshippers as those who have received two doses of vaccination against COVID-19; those receiving a single dose of inoculation at least 14 days in advance; and those who have recovered from the virus infection.

Man Arrested For Killing Wife By Pouring Boiling Water On Her

CAIRO: Saudi prosecutors are interrogating a man accused of savagely beating his wife and pouring boiling water on her, resulting in her death, local newspapers reported.

The suspect, an African resident in the Saudi region of Mecca, was exposed after a government hospital notified police that a woman, holding an African nationality, had been brought to the hospital with serious burns and signs of physical abuse.

Investigations showed that the woman had been severely abused by her husband in their house in the governorate of Al Taif. Her family transferred Thursday to the hospital where she died a day later. Mecca police arrested the suspect who is being questioned before referral to court.
