Amid Suicides, Experts Warn Against 'Copycat Phenomena' In Kashmir

Beyond the bolstered bridge bids and shore up suicides in Kashmir, there's a looming danger of what Dr. Yasir Rather calls "copycat phenomena" that might end up doing more harm to the lockdown-distressed valley. "As news of suicide spreads like fire

and is sensationalised by media, we need to be also well aware of not activating copycat phenomena in someone else with mental health issues,' warns Dr.Yasir, noted psychiatrist

and professor at the Institute of Mental Health & Neurosciences (IMHANS), Government Medical College, Srinagar.
