The Facebook Files

5 Things Revealed By Leaked Documents

Facebook has been struggling to attract younger users for more than a decade, and some senior employees are alarmed over the company's inability to keep teens engaged. When asked by analysts about growth prospects, Facebook executives frequently paint a rosier picture than the one depicted by internal research, a whistleblower alleges.

Those are just some of the findings outlined in a cache of disclosures made to the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission by Frances Haugen, a former Facebook product manager, and provided to Congress in redacted form by her legal counsel. A consortium of 17 U.S. news organizations, including Bloomberg, has obtained the redacted versions received by Congress.



The documents provide rare, vivid insight into ways Facebook, under the guidance of Chief Executive Officer Mark Zuckerberg, created a Silicon Valley social media behemoth that - while frequently posting lavish sales and profit gains - has also faltered in its mission to give users the tools they need to build community and bring the world closer together.

In its own defense, Facebook points to new products and services it is developing to attract younger users; it notes that hate speech represents well under 1% of overall content on its platform and is declining; it says that it uses research, hypothetical tests and other methods to analyze how it recommends content and improve on efforts to curb the spread of harmful content. Facebook also contends that it has made adequate disclosures concerning growth and that the documents Haugen shared with the SEC represent a "curated selection" that

"can in no way be used to draw fair conclusions about us."

Even so, the company's missteps are beginning to take a toll. The documents chronicle worsening morale among some staff and disagreements over the best way to combat bad content; Facebook's shares have lost more than 10% since the Wall Street Journal began publishing stories based on the whistleblower's documents; and lawmakers, already weighing legislation that would rein in Facebook's power, are calling for even more stringent oversight.

Other insights gleaned from the documents, researchers and people familiar with Facebook, including current and former employees:

- Facebook executives have long known that the platform's hate-speech problem was bigger and more entrenched than the company discloses. While Facebook prioritizes rooting out violence and hateful content in English-speaking Western nations, it neglects developing regions that are more vulnerable to real-world harm from negativity on social media.

- A Facebook team tasked with stemming the flow of harmful posts was hamstrung by a lack of staffing, limits placed on its product development and the platform's engagement-focused algorithm that often ends up promoting content that can be false and divisive.

- Facebook staff who study misinformation have concluded that the social network's core products contribute to the spread of harmful material, and the company's own efforts to quell misinformation are sometimes undermined by political considerations.

- In 2019, Facebook set up a test account in India to determine how its tools affect people in its most important market; within three weeks, the fictional user's account devolved into a maelstrom of fake news and incendiary images.

- Facebook's own staff, including internal researchers, faulted the company for failing to thwart the proliferation of groups that fomented violence on Jan. 6.

Amid Standoff With India, China Passes Law Supporting Building Of Border Towns

New Delhi: Asserting that sovereignty and territorial integrity of China are "sacred and inviolable", the country's national legislature has adopted a new law on the protection and exploitation of the land border areas, which could have a bearing on Beijing's border dispute with India.

Members of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress (NPC) approved the law at the closing meeting of a legislative session on Saturday, state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

The law will become operational from January 1 next year.

The state shall take measures to safeguard territorial integrity and land boundaries and guard against and combat any act that undermines territorial sovereignty and land boundaries, the report said.

The law also stipulates that the state shall take measures to strengthen border defence, support economic and social development as well as opening up in border areas, improve public services and infrastructure in such areas, encourage and support people's life and work there, and promote coordina-

tion between border defence and social and economic development in border areas, it said.

Following the principles of equality, mutual trust and friendly consultation, the state shall handle land border-related affairs with neighbouring countries through negotiations to properly resolve disputes and long-standing border issues, it said.

India and Bhutan are the two countries with which China is yet to finalise the border agreements, while Beijing resolved the boundary disputes with 12 other neighbours.

A significant aspect of the new law includes state support for the construction of border towns, improving their functioning and strengthening supporting capacity for the construction.

By the end of 2020, Tibet had built more than 600 well-off, high-standard border villages. The roads connecting border villages are also quite accessible. At least 130 border roads have been newly built or reconstructed with a total length of 3,080km.

The new law calls for the establishment of trade areas and border economic cooperation zones at the borders. It also calls for improving the ecological environment along the border besides epidemic control and maintaining flood and fire control.

Muslim Unity Qur'anic Order, Israeli Normalization Great Sin: Khamenei

Tehran: Arab nations that normalised ties with Israel last year have "sinned" and should reverse such moves, Iran's Supreme Leader Sayed Ali Khamenei said on Sunday.

The unity of Muslims is a "definite duty and a Qur'anic order", Ayatollah said adding some regional governments' decision to normalise ties with Israel is a "great sin and mistake".

The United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Sudan, and Morocco agreed to normalise ties with Israel in 2020, as Washington under the administration of then-US President Donald Trump made Arab-Israeli rapprochement a foreign policy priority.

Egypt and Jordan were until last year the only two Arab countries to normalise relations with Israel.

"These governments must return from this path which is against the Islamic unity and make amends," Iran leader told a gathering of Muslim scholars at a Unity Conference in Tehran.

The annual Unity Week conference held on the birth anniversary of Prophet Muhammad (Pbuh) celebrated separately on 12th and 17th Rabiul Awwal of Hijra calendar by Sunni and Shia Muslims brings together scholars, intellectuals and clergy from both sects from around the world to Tehran annually. Iranian leader told the gathering that they have a duty to explain and promote the "comprehensiveness of Islam in all matters of life".

Ayatollah Khamenei said

the reason for his repeated emphasis on the issue of unity is the big schism which exists among religions, with the enemies striving seriously to widen it.



"You see that the issue of being a Sunni or a Shia has entered the American political literature for several years, while they are against the quintessence of Islam and hostile to it," he said.

"The recent unfortunate and distressing explosions at mosques targeting Muslim worshippers in Afghanistan are among such incidents that were carried out by Daesh," the Leader said.

"Who is Daesh? Daesh is the same outfit that the Americans - the same Democratic group of the United States - explicitly said 'we created', even though they are not saying it anymore and deny it."

Ayatollah Khamenei said one of the ways to prevent such incidents is for the current Afghan officials to attend Shia centers and mosques and encourage Sunni Muslims to participate in inter-religious congregations.

Sudan Military Dissolves Transitional Government In Apparent Coup

Khartoum: Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, a military officer who headed the Sovereign Council, announced a state of emergency across the country.

Soldiers arrested most of the members of Sudan's cabinet on Monday and a military officer dissolved the transitional government, while opponents of the takeover took to the streets where gunfire and injuries were reported.

Abdel Fattah al-Burhan, a military officer who headed the Sovereign Council, a power-sharing ruling body, announced a state of emergency across the country and dissolved the council and the transitional government.

Prime Minister Abdalla Hamdok was detained and moved to an undisclosed location after refusing to issue a statement in support of the coup, said the information ministry, still apparently under the

control of Hamdok's supporters.

The ministry said tens of thousands of people opposed to the coup had taken to the streets and had faced gunfire near the military's headquarters in the capital Khartoum.

At least 12 people were injured in clashes, a doctors' committee said on its Facebook page, without providing further details.

The director of Hamdok's office, Adam Hereika, told Reuters that the military had mounted its takeover despite "positive movements" towards an agreement between Hamdok and military leaders, following meetings with a visiting US special envoy, Jeffrey Feltman.

A Reuters journalist in Khartoum saw joint forces from the military and from the powerful, paramilitary Rapid Support Forces stationed in the streets of Khartoum.

UN agency warns as Afghanistan verges on collapse

United Nations: Millions of Afghans, including children, could die of starvation unless urgent action is taken to pull Afghanistan back from the brink of collapse, a senior United Nations official warned, calling for frozen funds to be freed for humanitarian efforts.

World Food Program (WFP) Executive Director David Beasley told Reuters that 22.8 million people - more than half of Afghanistan's 39 million population - were facing acute food insecurity and "marching to starvation" compared to 14 million just two months ago.

"Children are going to die. People are going to starve. Things are going to get a lot worse," he said in Dubai.

"I don't know how you don't have millions of people, and es-



pecially children, dying at the rate we are going with the lack of funding and the collapsing of the economy."

Afghanistan was plunged into crisis in August after Taliban fighters drove out a Western-backed government, prompting donors to hold back billions of dollars in assistance for the aid-dependent economy.

The food crisis, exacerbated by climate change, was dire in

Afghanistan even before the takeover by the Taliban, whose new administration has been blocked from accessing assets held overseas as nations grapple with how to deal with the hard-line Islamists.

"What we are predicting is coming true much faster than we anticipated. Kabul fell faster than anybody anticipated and the economy is falling faster than that," Beasley said.

He said dollars earmarked for development assistance should be repurposed for humanitarian aid, which some nations have already done, or frozen funds be channelled through the agency.

"You've got to unfreeze these funds so people can survive."

The UN food agency needs up to \$220 million a month to partially feed the nearly 23 million vulnerable people as winter nears.

Drought-Stricken California Doused By Major Storm

California: A powerful storm barreled toward Southern California after flooding highways, toppling trees and causing mud flows in areas burned bare by recent fires across the northern part of the state.

Drenching showers and strong winds accompanied the weekend's arrival of an atmospheric river—a long and wide plume of moisture pulled in from the Pacific Ocean. The National Weather Service's Sacramento office warned of "potentially historic rain."

Flooding was reported across the San Francisco Bay Area, closing streets in Berkeley, inundating Oakland's Bay Bridge toll plaza and overflowing rivers in Napa and Sonoma counties. Power poles were downed and tens of thousands of people in the North Bay were without electricity.

By Sunday morning, Mount Tamalpais just north of San Francisco had recorded a half foot (15 centimetres) of rainfall during the previous 12 hours, the weather service said.

"Some of our higher elevation locations could see 6, 7, 8 inches of rain before we're all said and done," weather service meteorologist Sean Miller said.

About 150 miles (241 kilometres) to the north, the California Highway Patrol closed a stretch of State Route 70 in Butte and Plumas counties because of multiple landslides within the massive Dixie Fire burn scar.

"We have already had several collisions this morning for vehicles hydroplaning, numerous trees falling, and several roadways that are experiencing flooding," the highway patrol's office in Oroville tweeted on Sunday. "If you can stay home and off the roads today, please do. If you are out on the roads, please use extreme caution."

Ex-Saudi Official, In Tiff With Crown Prince, Seeks Biden's Help To Free His Kids

Washington: A former top Saudi intelligence official who is living in exile accused Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman on Sunday of targeting him and made an unprecedented public plea to the Biden administration to help obtain the release of his children jailed in Saudi Arabia.

Saad al-Jabri was a long-time aide to another Saudi royal, Prince Mohammed bin Nayef, whom bin Salman, or MbS, ousted as heir to the throne in a 2017 palace coup. MbS is now de facto ruler of Saudi Arabia, the world's top oil exporter and a key U.S. ally.

In August 2019, Jabri, who currently lives in Canada, filed a 107-page lawsuit in a U.S. court alleging the crown prince "dispatched a 'hit squad' to kill him in October 2018, but Canadian au-

thorities foiled the attempt.

Last year, a Saudi court jailed two of Saad al-Jabri's adult children for money laundering and conspiracy to escape the kingdom unlawfully, charges they deny.

In his first interview since

leaving the kingdom, Jabri said MbS has "no empathy," adding that the 36-year old leader is a threat to the people of Saudi Arabia, Americans and the rest of the world.

"I have to speak out. I am appealing to the American people

and to the American administration to help me to release those children and to restore their life," a visibly emotional Jabri told CBS television's "60 Minutes" show.

The Saudi embassy in Washington did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

The crown prince's lawyers have rejected Jabri's allegations and said MbS has legal immunity in the United States as a foreign head of state.

Last year, MbS's lawyer Michael Kellogg dismissed the claims, describing them as "steeped in drama." Jabri's allegations come more than three years after Jamal Khashoggi, a Saudi-born U.S. resident who wrote opinion columns for the Washington Post critical of MbS, was killed and dismembered by a team of operatives linked to the prince in the kingdom's consulate in Istanbul.

Now, Self-Driving Suitcase-Sized Robots Deliver Parcels In Russian Capital

Moscow: Self-driving robots have started delivering parcels in certain Moscow neighbourhoods after tech giant Yandex teamed up with the state-run Russian Post service, the companies said on Monday.

Yandex, which operates a raft of services from online search to ride-hailing, already uses robots for food delivery in Russia and on some U.S. college campuses in a partnership with GrubHub, but a tie-up with the federal post service could widen their reach.

In a joint statement, Yandex and Russian Post said 36 rectangular, suitcase-sized robots would initially deliver from 27 post offices in several districts of the Russian capital as part of a



pilot project, with parcel recipients able to select robot delivery using an app.

Users can track the six-wheeled, black and white robots as they trundle across town and can access their parcel using a unique verification code.

"Every part of the logistics chain can be automated, and

technologies are changing processes at every stage: from the first to the last mile," said Stanislav Chernin, head of innovation at Russian Post.

Russian Post has over 38,000 branches across the world's largest country and handles more than 108 million parcels each year.

Day 15: Heavy Gunfire Rattles Poonch Forest

JAMMU: Heavy firing was reported from a forest area as a massive search operation to track down hiding militants in Jammu and Kashmir's twin border districts of Poonch and Rajouri entered the 15th day on Monday, officials said.

It was not immediately clear whether the firing in Bhatti Durrian forest was the result of a fresh contact with the militants, believed to be hiding in caves deep inside the forest, the officials said.

Nine Army personnel including two JCO's and an arrested militant, a resident of Rawlakot in Pakistani side of Kashmir, have been killed and three security men injured since the commencement of the operation on October 11.

While five Army personnel were killed on the first day of the operation in Surankote forest of Poonch, four other soldiers lost their lives in Bhatti



Durrian area of Mendhar on October 14.

The militant, who was shifted from Kot Bhalwal Central Jail Jammu to Mendhar on police remand for questioning in connection with the ongoing operation was killed when the security forces accompanying him to identify a hideout came under fire from hiding militants on Sunday.

Besides Surankote and Mendhar, the search operation also

continued in nearby Thanamandi forest in Rajouri district.

The officials said Army helicopters made several sorties over the besieged forest area, while drones are also being used to keep a tight surveillance to ensure that the militants are not able to flee.

Kashmiris In Punjab Colleges Pay Price For Pakistan's Cricket Win

SRINAGAR: Shortly after Pakistan thrashed India in the T20 World Cup on Sunday night, at least seven Kashmiri students were beaten up by their classmates, from other states, at two educational institutes in Punjab.

The students alleged that more than two dozen students from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar attacked them after breaking into their hostel rooms at two institutes -- Bhai Gurdas Institute of Engineering and

Technology in Punjab's Sangrur district and the Rayat Bahart University in Kharar.

"We thought they would kill us. They beat us blue and black," a student at Bhai Gurdas Institute, Kamil Rashid Sheikh told Kashmir Observer over the phone. "They were angry because of India's defeat and they went out their anger on us."

Videos of the "attack" uploaded on the internet by students at the Rayat Bahart institute showed ransacked hostel rooms of Kashmiri students. Mohammad Aaqib, also an

engineering student at the Bhai Gurdas Institute told Kashmir Observer that after the scuffle, the police and college administration reached the spot and tried to pacify the situation. "But we are still fearing for our lives, the attack was horrific," he said.

A senior police official alleged to Indian Express that over 90 Kashmiri students who are staying in the hostel had cheered when Pakistan won. "They also raised azadi slogans," he alleged.

NEW DELHI: A Delhi court Monday awarded 12-year-jail terms to two Hizbul-Mujahideen (HM) militants and 10-year-terms to two other members of the outfit for conspiring to commit "terror activities" and arranging funds for those acts. Special Judge Parveen Singh awarded 12-year jail terms to Mohd. Shafi Shah and Muzaffar Ahmad Dar and 10-year-jail terms to Talib Lali and Mushtaq Ahmad Lone. All the four accused had pleaded guilty to all the

charges levelled against them on September 27, and following that, were convicted on October 4. While Shah and Lali were residents of Bandipora district in Jammu and Kashmir, Dar and Lone hailed from Budgam and Anantnag districts respectively.

The case was lodged by the NIA with allegations that HM had been regularly receiving funds originating from neighbouring countries for carrying out militant activities in India and that in the garb of an organization Jammu Kashmir Affecteds Relief Trust (JKART), the HM was actively involved in furthering the militant activities.

All the four were convicted for the offences under sections 17 (punishment for raising funds for the

Home Minister's Visit

The home minister Amit Shah has been on a three-day visit to J&K from October 23, his first since the revocation of Article 370 in August 2019. The home minister's visit came in the wake of the recent civilian killings and the ongoing Poonch encounter which has so far led to the killing of nine security personnel. He along with Lt. Gov Manoj Sinha reviewed the security situation with the security brass in Srinagar.

Though the visit has not had a major political component, Shah on Monday made it clear that the government would rather talk to the people of Kashmir than Pakistan as advocated by the National Conference chief Dr Farooq Abdullah. If anything, this shows that the union government is not keen on talks with Pakistan with whom it was allegedly involved in a back-channel engagement early this year, culminating in February in re-affirmation of the 2003 LoC ceasefire.

Earlier in his visit, the home minister interacted with the representatives of 4,500 youth clubs in J&K that work at panchayat level. During the meeting he made it clear that the terrorism and stone-pelting had disappeared in Kashmir and those who wanted to disrupt peace here would be dealt with an iron hand. Talking about the development of J&K in the last two years, Shah painted a positive picture saying that J&K has received Rs 12,000 crore investment in the past six months compared to a total of Rs 15,000 crore in the past seven years.

As for the all-important subject of statehood, the home minister said it will be followed by the fresh delimitation of Assembly seats in J&K and the subsequent elections. A delimitation commission has already been in place for the last over a year and it may soon complete its mandate. The enhancement of the Assembly seats, Shah said, will be followed by holding of the elections within the union territory framework.

It is not clear whether this statehood that would hopefully come after delimitation and the election would be full or a truncated one where the real power would vest with the governor. Such an arrangement, according to mainstream J&K politicians, would hardly be enough to make a redeeming difference to the existing state of affairs, as fundamentally there won't be much that would change on the ground. There is thus a demand, both in the Valley and Jammu, that the centre must be more considerate and sensitive towards the demands of the people of J&K and start the process of outreach with the restoration of statehood itself. As things stand, this seems unlikely to happen. But we can only hope that this happens as the statehood alone will give people of J&K a sense of empowerment.

Cricket's Plan B

At the peak of the Gulf Boom in the '70s and '80s, the UAE was an oasis for millions of migrant labourers from the subcontinent. Now, the desert nation with neither a cricketing heritage nor a thriving fascination for the game, is home to its cricketing powerhouses. Whenever a crisis, natural or man-made, comes, they simply shift base to the welcoming "Gulf".

It has been Pakistan's home for 12 years, since the Lahore terror strikes on Sri Lanka's team bus in 2009; it could resume being their home, now that there is a new frisson of fear in travelling to Pakistan. It has housed the PSL, and the IPL too, in 2014 due to the general polls and in 2020 and 2021 because of the pandemic. From Saturday, it will host the T20 World Cup, embellishing its reputation as cricket's trusted Plan B.

Nearly half of those living in the Gulf states are of Pakistani, Indian or Bangladeshi origin, so the audience is there. So are the pitches, stadiums and facilities, most notably at Dubai's billion-dollar Sports City complex and Abu Dhabi's state-of-the-art cricket centre. The climate is favourable, with play possible for seven months of the year. The concrete theatres of sport might not wield the raw romance of the Sharjah Cups of the last century, but in today's cricketing world, they are indispensable. The UAE might not be a cricketing superpower, but the country is an important cricketing destination.

The T20 World Cup will be Virat Kohli's swan-song as T20 captain. Besides, India's quest for a title, since winning the inaugural edition, has been fraught with frustration. It will launch its campaign against Pakistan, who will seek to harness its experience playing in the Emirates. Then there is the West Indies, defending champion and T20 master, a ragged Australia, still hunting for its maiden title, an understated New Zealand, World Test champion, fearless England, the World 50-over champion, and South Africa under its first black captain. The stage is set, in cricket's home away from home.

Glasgow Climate Change Summit

A Confluence For Change?

The Glasgow Summit Will Prove Whether The Global Leaders Are Ready To Put The Entire Mankind To Peril Or Whether They'll Work Out A Roadmap To Counter Climate Change Effectively And Wisely

report by the US intelligence agency's assessment of climate change has come out and as per the report, India and Pakistan are among the 11 highly vulnerable countries in terms of their ability to prepare for as well as respond to the environmental and social impact of climate change

A UN-sponsored marathon conference to tackle the global climate crisis is due at the British city of Glasgow, the coming Sunday (31 October) and will continue till 12 November. World leaders will meet in the so-called last-ditch effort to keep global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius this century, besides considering plans on how to stop burning fossil fuels, stabilise global temperatures and share money to adapt to increasingly extreme weather.

Global leaders had signed up the Paris Agreement in 2015 - with a supposedly non-binding target to keep warming well below 2 C above pre-industrial temperatures, and ideally 1.5 C - yet most of the participating countries continue to burn fossil fuels and chop down trees at rates incompatible with that goal.

With the effects of climate change visible in both rich and poor countries alike, the leaders are meeting for what analysts expect to be the most meaningful conference since that pledge. Climate change has shot up the political agenda amid deadly weather extremes and mass public protest, and leaders of several polluting countries have pledged to decarbonise their economies by the middle of the century.

Summit's Agenda

The world leaders got to choose how fast their country will cut emissions under the Paris Agreement, besides agreeing to update their action plans for doing so every five years. But in reality, just weeks before the summit, big emitters like China, India and Saudi Arabia are yet to submit new plans.

Reportedly, the UK, which is co-hosting the summit with Italy has pressured countries to submit new plans and is pushing for concrete deals that would help reach those targets. Prime Minister Boris Johnson has called on world leaders to deliver bold commitments on "coal, cars, cash and trees."

The UK is pushing for a treaty that would "consign coal to history" and has proposed a deadline of 2040 to stop selling combustion engine cars. It also wants to put more money into stopping deforestation.

According to the United Nations Climate Change Framework Con-

vention (UNFCCC), COP26 will work towards four goals: Secure global net-zero by mid-century and keep 1.5 degrees within reach, adapt to protect communities and natural habitats, mobilise assured finance to help developing and under-developed countries to attain emission cuts, and work together to deliver to frame a list of detailed rules that will help fulfil the Paris Agreement.

On the really big question of keeping the 1.5C temperature threshold within reach, the likelihood is that a significant gap will remain even after Glasgow. Under the terms of the Paris Agreement, those countries that have used fossil fuels the most over the past two centuries - the US and from Europe - accept they will make the bigger cuts in the short term. The larger developing nations that are now the biggest source of CO2 - chiefly China - accept they will make the bigger cuts in the longer term.

The environmentalist and experts say that we can very easily understand the colossal and disastrous results of the climate change, if we can observe the following four weather changes, which have been caused by the increasing global temperature due to the emission of CO2 and other poisonous gases like methane into the atmosphere: Hotter and longer heat waves, more persistent droughts, more fuel for wildfires, and more extreme rainfall events are the resultant climate change vagaries.

Meanwhile, an interesting report by the US intelligence agency's assessment of climate change has come out and as per the report, India and Pakistan are among the 11 highly vulnerable countries in terms of their ability to prepare for as well as respond to the environmental and social impact of climate change. The first-ever US National Intelligence Estimate (NIE) on the issue of climate change has been published, and it adds that India along with China will be crucial in determining the trajectory at which there is a rise in global temperatures. On the other hand, the report has downplayed the role that the Western world has played in the problem of climate change. Further, the report has warned that the possibility of geopolitical tensions and the risk to US national security are present due to global warming in the run up to 2040.

Expectations from the Summit

In another development before the summit, India has said that it will raise the topic of compensation to developing nations for the losses caused by climate disasters. The Indian environment ministry said that India stands with other low-income and developing nations on the matter and the compensation clause will be negotiated at the upcoming climate summit.

India has reiterated that the countries responsible for climate change should finance what they have committed to and make technology available at an affordable cost. It is also confirmed that Prime Minister Narendra Modi will put forward the Indian stand at the summit.

Meanwhile, reports say that Jennifer Morgan, the executive director of Greenpeace International has warned against efforts by countries and corporations at the forthcoming talks in Glasgow to "green wash" their ongoing pollution of the planet.

By doing so, governments would "give that kind of hope and confidence to their people that they got this and that they're willing to do things that their corporate interests don't want them to do," she added.

Morgan pointed to leaked documents showing how countries such as Australia, Brazil and Saudi Arabia are apparently trying to water down an upcoming UN science panel report on global warming as evidence of the way in which some governments' public support for climate action is undermined by their efforts behind closed doors.

Documents obtained by Greenpeace indicate how those countries wanted the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change to remove references to the need to shut down coal-fired power stations, reduce meat consumption and focus on actual emissions cuts rather than ways to capture carbon already released into the atmosphere.

Various outcomes of the Glasgow Summit in view of the non-adherence to the goals of the Paris Agreement are being predicted. Yet, barring a complete collapse in the talks, there are likely to be a range of tangible outcomes. It's expected that more countries will announce they are moving away from using coal for energy, and more nations may probably sign up to curb methane emissions.

There is only a moral pressure to improve your offer, and a degree of embarrassment if a country doesn't step up to the mark. Glasgow will reveal whether this approach actually works.

As Bangladesh's Prime Minister Sheikh Hasena has put it succinctly and wisely in a recent speech, tackling climate requires a great deal of fortitude, imagination, hope and leadership. If western leaders listen, engage and act decisively on what science demands of them, there is still time to make COP26 the success it desperately needs to be.

25 scientists from Jammu and Kashmir in top 2 percent in their respective fields. Congratulating the enlisted scientists, KU Vice-Chancellor Prof Talat Ahmad urged faculty members to publish in reputed journals and submit more proposals for research grants. "This feat, while it is a moment of pride for us, is also a validation to our institution's unrelenting commitment to academic excellence," Prof Talat said. Dean Research Prof Irshad Ahmad Nawchoo also congratulated the scientists and said their research output helps the university in its ranking. Reopen Schools For Primary, Middle Classes Parents Plea To LG

SRINAGAR: Parents have urged the LG administration to reopen schools for primary and middle classes in Jammu and Kashmir as life has been back to normal and almost every sector is functioning normally. Parents, while talking to news agency, expressed their concern about the closure of primary and middle schools. They said that the administration should devise a mechanism to reopen schools for these classes as the future of their children is at stake. Even though after a gap of 18 months, the government recently allowed reopening of higher educational institutions and schools for classes 10 and 12 with Covid-19 guidelines in place, however, schools for primary and middle classes continue to remain closed. The parents said that they will sensitise their children about Covid-19 SOPs, but the government must devise some mechanism so that schools are reopened for these classes.

"No doubt the pandemic is highly infectious but administration cannot wait for cases to go to zero level and the reopening schools cannot wait for a longer period now as it is affecting the education and wellbeing of the future generation," they said. They said that they worried about the future of their children as it has been for about two years that the kids in the valley haven't attended offline classes. "Attending hour long classes and preparing for exams through online modes have affected the eyesight of many children. Many states in the country recently have reopened the primary schools with proper guidelines to be followed. The children who are the future of our society have every right to go to school and to learn which is crucial for their overall development, safety and well being," the aggrieved parents said. They expressed their concern over the matter and urged the administration in J&K to devise a proper mechanism for reopening of the primary schools as well. (KNS)

Hizb Expels Defiant Commander

ISLAMABAD- Paced with continued dissensions within its ranks, Hizb-ul-Mujahideen has expelled one of its commander's Masood Sarfaraz, media report said here today. The Hizb-ul-Mujahideen spokesman Saleem Hashmi was quoted by the Frontier Post as saying that Sarfaraz was ousted by the Command Council as he was not abiding by the group's rules. He was posing as a rebel and was not cooperating with the leadership of the group, Hashmi stated while announcing his expulsion from the Hizb. His ouster came after he resented the taking over of control and command of Hizb-ul-Mujahideen by Pakistan based Jamaat-e-Islami. The conflict began when Amir of the Jamaat-e-Islami in Pakistan-controlled-Kashmir, Abdul Rasheed Turabi, tried to replace Masood Sarfaraz, the commander of Hizbul Mujahideen, Pir Panjal range, the Friday Times weekly had said in its earlier edition. The weekly quoted sources in the PCK's Jamaat-e-Islami as saying that number of complaints ranging from arbitrary use of funds to mismanagement in the training camps against Sarfaraz prompted Turabi to replace him. Sarfaraz, the weekly said, is a nephew of former president of Pakistan-controlled Kashmir Sardar Sikander Hayat, who had helped the Hizb commander in carving out a separate niche for himself (Kashmir Observer, October 26, 2000)

Heat waves, extreme droughts in 2020 had worst impact on health: Lancet

In 2020, adults over 65 were hit by 3.1 billion more days of heat wave exposure than in the 1986-2005 baseline average and the senior citizens from China, India, the US, Japan, and Indonesia were the most affected, a latest report from the Lancet said on Thursday.

Climate change is driving an increase in the frequency, intensity and duration of drought events, threatening water security, sanitation, and food productivity, with 19 per cent of the global land surface in 2020 affected by extreme drought in any given month, the 2021 Report of the Lancet Countdown on Health and Climate Change: Code Red for a Healthy Future, said.

Increasing the risk of wildfires and exposure to pollutants, this extreme drought over 19 per cent global land surface is worrying as this value had not exceeded 13 per cent between 1950 and 1990, it said, adding: "The five years with the most areas affected by extreme drought have all occurred since 2015. The Horn of Africa, a region impacted by recurrent extreme droughts and food insecurity, was one of the most affected areas in 2020." The report also talks about the potential for outbreaks of dengue, chikungunya and Zika increasing most rapidly in countries with a very high human development index, including European countries. Suitability for malaria infections is increasing in cooler highland areas of countries with a low human development index.

"Coasts around northern Europe and the US are becoming more conducive to bacteria, which produces gastroenteritis, severe

wound infections and sepsis. In resource limited countries, the same dynamic is putting decades of progress towards controlling or eliminating these diseases at risk," it said.

The report outlined the growing risks to health and climate and exposed inequities in the global response to climate change in general. "It is the countries lowest on the human development index



and often least responsible for rising greenhouse gas emissions that are lagging behind in climate change adaptation and mitigation efforts and in realising the associated health benefits of accelerated decarbonisation." Observing that the world continues to subsidise fossil fuels, the report said, in 2018, 65 out of the 84 countries analysed by the Lancet Countdown researchers had net-negative carbon price equivalent to an overall subsidising fossil fuel.

The report pointed out how climate change and its drivers are creating ideal conditions for infectious disease transmission, potentially undoing decades of progress

to control diseases such as dengue, fever, chikungunya, Zika, malaria and cholera and said, only 45 of the 91 countries (49 per cent) in 2021 reported having carried out a climate change and health vulnerability and adaptation assessment.

Only eight out of those 45 countries reported that their assessment of the effects of climate change on their citizens' health had influenced the allocation of human and financial resources. As many as 69 per cent of the countries said insufficient financing was a barrier to implementing these plans, the report said.

"The 2021 report shows that populations of 134 countries have experienced an increase in exposure to wildfires. Millions of farmers and construction workers could have lost income because on some days it is just too hot for them to work. Drought is more widespread than ever before. The Lancet Countdown report has 40 indicators and far too many of them are flashing red," said Executive Director of the Lancet Countdown, Professor Anthony Costello.

The Lancet Countdown report represents the consensus of leading researchers from 38 academic institutions and UN agencies.

The report exhorted politicians to show "leadership moving beyond rhetoric" by taking action at the UN climate change conference (COP26) which will take place from October 31 in Glasgow, Scotland.

"Carbon emissions must be rapidly reduced to improve health and to provide a more equitable, sustainable future," it asserted.

Jindal said, "This facility shall provide immense benefits to local businesses and society in a meaningful way and provide

employment opportunities to the local youth."

Jammu Body Seeks Amendment In Land Law For Outside Investors

JAMMU: A Jammu-based body of industrialists has sought an amendment to a land revenue law for transfer of non-agricultural private land to prospective investors from outside Jammu and Kashmir to set up their units in the union territory.

The Federation of Industries (FOI), Jammu, raised the demand in a memorandum, which was submitted by its delegation to Union Home Minister Amit Shah here, its co-chairman Lalit Mahajan said in a statement on Monday.

"We requested the home minister for the necessary amendment in the Land Revenue Act, 1962, on priority basis for the transfer of non-agricultural private land for industrial purpose on free hold basis, enabling the prospective unit holders to purchase the non-agriculture land for setting up their units in a time-bound manner," Mahajan, who along with FOI chairman Ratan Dogra met Shah, said.

Shah is on a visit to Jammu and Kashmir and Monday was the third day of his tour of the Union territory.

Thanking the Narendra Modi-led government for granting fiscal incentives for the industrial sector in Jammu and Kashmir, the delegation termed it

as the beginning of a new era of development and industrialisation.

"We are hopeful that industrialisation will achieve a new height in the coming days in J&K to provide employment opportunities to the local youths as well as overall growth in the economy as we are expecting huge investment in the industrial sector of J&K on the basis of Rs 28,400 crore Central Industrial Package," the statement said.

Mahajan, however, said prospective investors from outside Jammu and Kashmir, who are in the process of setting up of big industrial units, could face issues due to non-availability of developed industrial land and in respect to non-agriculture private land, which is not transferable to outside investors according to the present land revenue law.

The other issues related to the industrial sector highlighted in the memorandum include compulsory purchase by central government and Jammu and Kashmir government departments from Local Small Scale Industry (LSSI) units, establishment of mother industry in Jammu and Kashmir and reimbursement of road freight for dispatch of industrial goods to domestic market as well as for export from J&K.

POONCH: Member Parliament and President of National Conference, Dr. Farooq Abdullah on Monday said that there is no normalcy in Jammu and Kashmir even after abrogation of Article 370, 35-A and all claims of normalcy made by BJP are "hollow".

Farooq was addressing a public rally at Poonch in which a large number of NC workers and leaders took part, KNO reported.

"We all need to save NC from such faces who use party platform for their personal gains and later ditch us. Unfortunately, it is not written on people's face when they would backstab. Some joined NC to gain benefit and later left," he said. "Now those leaving are in fact helping us to clean the party. We are least bothered for those who leave."

Referring to abrogation of Article 370 and 35-A and recent militancy acts in Kashmir, Farooq said that BJP is claiming

of normalcy in Kashmir but all such claims are hollow and devoid of facts from ground.

"There is rise in militancy in Jammu and Kashmir and this will remain unless Hindus, Muslims and Sikhs of J&K do not get what they have been promised," he said, adding that "It seems ending militancy is impossible now."

He also said that special status of Jammu and Kashmir was not a temporary provision in constitution of India as is claimed by BJP and rather it is permanent. "The then Maharaja Hari Singh wanted J&K to be an independent State but Pakistan did a mistake by sending invaders and the Maharaja had no choice other than to accede to India to get army help. The accession was still conditional and the issue of Kashmir was taken to UN where it is still pending. The then UN body promised that it would send a special rapporteur for holding plebiscite in both parts of Kashmir which didn't take place till date."

The trolls on social media linked his ordinary performance on Sunday night to his religion which did not go down well with fellow netizens. The other Indian players were also trolled online after

the crushing loss on Sunday. VVS Laxman also urged fans to support the pacer and added that he can't be defined by one performance. Commentator Harsha Bhogle also gave his thoughts and said those trolling Shami should stop watching cricket. Former India spinner Harbhajan and current leg-spinner Yuzvendra Chahal, who was controversially not included in the World Cup squad, also came to Shami's support. "We love you @MdShami11," wrote Harbhajan on Twitter. Chahal added: "We are so proud of you @MdShami11 bhैया." Former India pacer R P Singh tweeted: "@MdShami11 is an Indian cricketer and we are proud of him. To target him after the loss against Pak is pathetic."

Don't Go Overboard: Pakistan Captains After Win Over India

KARACHI: Former Pakistan captain Misbah-ul-Haq and current skipper Babar Azam were among the ones who cautioned the players of not going "overboard" with their celebrations following the historic win over India as it was only the first match of the team's T20 World Cup campaign.

Misbah, who was forced to resign as head coach of the national team one month before the World T20 Cup, said the players must remain focussed on winning the mega-event after beating India for the first time in a World Cup.

Speaking on the A Sports Channel with Waqar who also resigned as bowling coach before the tournament, Misbah said: "I just hope we don't go overboard with the celebrations and forget we have more matches to play and win in the World Cup." Misbah said that the team had displayed perfect discipline and executed its plans to perfection to beat India by 10 wickets.

Waqar also noted that it was a tendency in Pakistan cricket that celebrations tended to go overboard. "This is only the first match and we are still to play against other tough opposition. If we beat India today it does not mean we should take it for granted we can also beat New Zealand, Afghanistan for that we will have to continue the hard work."

Interestingly Pakistan captain, Babar Azam made the same impassioned plea to his players in a video released by the PCB soon after the match against India. "Lets celebrate, let us go back to the hotel and enjoy this moment with our families but don't forget this match is now over and we must get back on track to preparing for the other matches of the tournament, Babar said to his players."

Babar said that after beating India there would be more expectations from the team now and to live up to them the players will have to work harder. "I want every player to

celebrate this moment tonight but then go back to realising what his role is in the team and what is expected of him in the remaining matches."

"We have not just come here to win against India, we have come here to win the World Cup, always remember that," Babar said.

Pakistan team's interim head coach, Saqlain Mushtaq also reminded the players that now teams will come stronger at Pakistan after the win over India.

"We must all do soul searching and think what we did right today to win the match in such a fashion and to also think and keep working on the weak areas where we still need to continue to do work to remove them. It is about honest self assessment," he said.

Saqlain also said that the players must not get carried away with the celebrations after the win over India as cricket was a cruel sport and every match was a new one.

Former Test pacer Aaqib Javed said that Shaheen Shah Afridi's burst of two wickets with the new ball and Hasan Ali's one wicket put India on the back foot and they never recovered after that. "I liked the way the bowlers displayed so much discipline and game awareness today. Haris Rauf used the slower balls to great advantage," he said.

Pakistan's former wicket-keeper-batsman and captain Rashid Latif lauded the thorough professional attitude and performance from the players.

"Everything went according to plan today starting with the toss. I don't think any other team which loses its head coach and bowling coach just before a World Cup can perform like this. This can only be done by Pakistan which produces remarkable cricket when least expected," Latif said.

Pakistan's former Test pacer Umar Gul said he had no doubt that India would make a strong comeback in their remaining matches. "They are a very strong side and they will be smarting after this defeat. Expect them to come back strongly."

issued twelve hours after Shahid's killing, the police claimed that he was an "associate of terrorists" who had snatched a paramilitary trooper's weapon; yet, the police also claimed that he was killed in "cross firing".

The incident occurred outside a CRPF camp in Babopora area of Zainapora in Shopian district on Sunday morning at about 10:30 am. The police also claimed that one member of the paramilitary also received injuries but didn't specify who or the extent of injuries.

A resident of Nowpora Arwani hamlet of Kulgam district, Shahid, as per the relatives, was the sole bread earner in the family. Shahid's father Aijaz Ahmad Rather said that his son was a 12th class student but due to poverty he wasn't able to submit his examination fee.

"Due to poverty, he was working as a laborer. Around a week before he went to Reshiepura, Zainapora to earn livelihood by plucking apples and had to return home on Saturday but due to heavy rain, he wasn't able to come and decided to return home on Sunday instead," Aijaz Ahmad said.

On Sunday morning, a local person was called by the concerned police station and enquired about Shahid, who later informed us about his killing," he said.

"Soon we saw his picture on social media and identified him," Rather said, adding that they rushed to the concerned police post who were cordial and told them to wait up to 4 pm. "We received his body at around 7: 30 pm and was laid to rest in a local graveyard," he said.

Unlike several recent instances of killings of militants, their associates, or civilians in government forces firing, the Rather family was given custody of Shahid's body and allowed to perform his last rites.

"My son was never arrested and if any person will say he was involved in any wrong activity, then we don't demand anything, but if he wasn't wrong in any way then why he was killed," Rather said, adding "He was a very caring son but his killing has snatched everything from us."

"I have been operated three and have a fracture in hand and foot, how can I take care of four minors and my wife," he said, urging the Sinha administration to help bring facts to light.

"We don't have any source of income and have just a single room to live in and now since yesterday's incident we are living in neighbours house as we don't have space where we can keep guests who are coming for condolences," Rather said.

The killing of Shahid, on a day the Union Home Minister was visiting Jammu and Kashmir for the first since August 2019 was widely condemned by regional parties including the National Conference, People's Democratic Party, and the People's Conference. They sought a time bound probe into the matter as has been the case during such killings in their tenures in power.

The police official said that FIR No.130/2021 under section 307,392,353,511-IPC,7/27 I.A. Act stands registered in Police Station Zainapora and investigation has been taken up.

Students To Carry

Chief Secretary (Chairperson, State Executive Committee. The seating arrangement should be made in such a manner that every second desk is left vacant to maintain physical distancing, the order stipulating the guidelines reads

Vaccinating the teachers, staff and officials involved in conducting the examination with the cooperation of the district administration shall be made mandatory, it reads.

"There should be a thermal scanner, pulse oximeter, first aid boxes and hand sanitisers at the venue of the examination."

All the students appearing for examination must mandatorily be wearing masks and arrangement to this effect needs to be ensured by the concerned institution, the guidelines mandate.

"Separate facility should be provided to the students showing any symptoms like cough, common cold and flu."

It shall be the responsibility of Board authorities and Head of the schools to ensure that the Covid protocols are strictly adhered to, it added.

As regards the education institutions and other permitted activities, the government has retained previous guidelines.

Among others, the Deputy Commissioners shall continue to focus on the positivity rates of the Medical-Blocks under their jurisdictions. "Intensified measures related to Covid management and restriction of activities shall be undertaken in these Blocks. There shall be renewed focus on Panchayat level mapping of cases and effective micro-containment zones shall be constituted wherever unusual spike of cases is noticed."

Effectiveness of micro containment zones shall be decided on the basis of number of cases reported from such zones, the order reads. "The DCs shall keep active track of the positivity rates in blocks and consider implementing stricter control measures in closed clustered spaces like Public/ Private Offices, Community halls, Malls, Bazaars etc., in case weekly positivity rate goes beyond 4 percent in these Blocks."

The three - "T" protocol of testing, tracking and treating, besides vaccination, needs to be strengthened in all Blocks, it reads further. "The proportion of RT-PCR tests in the total mix should be scaled up on best effort basis."

All Districts of J&K shall intensify efforts to ensure timely administering of the Second Dose of the Covid-19 vaccination in accordance with the due date for the same, it added.

that over 500 students from Kashmir living in rented accommodation near the college were asked to vacate by local residents.

"A few students burst the fire crackers after Pakistan beat India," he admitted. "This enraged the people living in the society and they told us to vacate." The police, he added, was helping Kashmiri students shift to other locations.

Nasir Khuehami, spokesperson of the Jammu and Kashmir Student Association told Kashmir Observer that the organisation had raised the issue with the concerned authorities who promised a prompt action against the attackers.

He said students were mercilessly thrashed, punched on their faces. "They were beaten to pulp by other state Students who barged in their rooms, thrashed them & went on rampage, vandalised the rooms of students, damaged the belongings & beat up a few others" he said.

Prior to Sunday's historic match, Khuehami wrote in Kashmir Observer appealing to students to stay calm and control their emotions during the match - forewarning the violence against young students in Indian colleges.

This is not the first time Kashmiris have been attacked in colleges across India. The mob violence against Kashmiris has escalated in recent years owing to the growing impunity to such acts.

Condemning the "unwarranted and unjustified" attack on students, Khuehami urged Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi for action against the accused and to provide security to the Kashmiri students studying and working in Punjab state.

Punjab has long been considered a "safe state" by Kashmiris. Sunday night's assault on the students, many told Kashmir Observer, were led by students from other states.

This association has taken up the matter with Jammu and Kashmir Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, after which a senior police official from J&K reportedly spoke to the Punjab Director General of Police.

BSF Man Spying

to the neighbouring country over WhatsApp, the ATS said on Monday.

The arrested BSF man, identified as Mohammad Sajjad, is a native of Sarola village in the Rajouri district of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, who was deployed in the 74 BSF Battalion at Bhuj in July 2021, the ATS said in a release. Sajjad was arrested at the BSF headquarters in Bhuj.

Sajjad had joined the BSF as a constable in 2012. He was getting money for providing the information which was getting deposited in the accounts of his brother Wajid and colleague Iqbal Rashid, the ATS added.

Sajjad had got his passport issued from the Regional Passport Office at Jammu. On the same passport he travelled to Pakistan for 46 days between December 1, 2011, and January 16, 2012, the ATS said, adding he had boarded Samjhauta Express from Attari railway station to visit Pakistan.

According to the ATS, Sajjad used two phones.

On one of his phones, he had last activated a SIM card on January 14-15, 2021. When the CDR (Call Data Record) of that number was examined, it was found that the SIM card, belonging to one Satyagopal Ghosh from Tripura, was first activated on November 7, 2020, and he (Sajjad) received two calls on that number.

The number remained active till November 9 before being deactivated till December 25, 2020. It was reactivated on December 26, 2020, the ATS said.

"On January 15, 2021, when the number was activated, an SMS was received at 12:38:51 hours. An SMS was received on the same number at around 12:38 pm, which seemed to be an OTP for WhatsApp. The number was deactivated thereafter," it said.

The accused received the OTP on this number and sent the same to Pakistan where he got the WhatsApp activated which he used to send secret information, the ATS said. WhatsApp was still active and used by some person in Pakistan who was in touch with Sajjad, said the ATS.

ATS officials said Sajjad had misled the BSF by providing the wrong birth date. As per his Aadhaar card, he was born on January 1, 1992, but his passport details showed his date of birth as January 30, 1985.

"Two mobile phones along with their SIM cards, two additional SIM cards were seized from Sajjad's possession. Further investigation is underway," the ATS said.

projects and laid the foundation stone of some. Before beginning his 38-minute-long speech at a function here, the home minister got the bullet proof glass shield for the speaker removed.

Later, he told the audience that he likes to have a "mann ki baat" (talk straight from his heart) with the people.

"I was cursed and criticised bitterly and today, I wish to talk to you with an open heart without security and without any bullet proof glass. And, here I am in front of you," Shah said while speaking at a heavily guarded Sher-e-Kashmir International Convention Centre.

"Friends, today I saw the newspapers where Farooq (Abdullah) Saheb has suggested to me that the government should engage in talks with Pakistan. Well, he is a seasoned politician, who has been the chief minister here, and this is his suggestion, but I would like to tell Farooq Saheb that if talks are to be held, I would like to hold it with brothers and sisters of the Kashmir Valley and the youth of the Kashmir Valley," the home minister said.

On the abrogation of Article 370, he said repeating it had only one "pakeeza" (pious) intention that is to put Kashmir, Jammu and newly created Union Territory of Ladakh on the path of development.

"You will see the fruits of our efforts by 2024," Shah, who wore a traditional Kashmiri pheran, said.

The minister also said, "The next time they (local politicians) mislead you about land being snatched after repeal of Article 370, tell them how much land has been taken away in your village or area. No land has been snatched in the two years since August 2019."

The article, which granted special status to the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir, was abrogated in August 2019 and the state was bifurcated into union territories of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh.

Shah inaugurated a 500-bed hospital at Bemina, completed at a cost of Rs 115 crore, laid the foundation stone for the Handwara Medical College, a Rs 46-crore steel girder bridge over the Ferozepur Nallah in Baramulla district and road projects worth Rs 4,000 crore, among others.

The home minister said that those who advocate talks with Islamabad and separatists should be asked what has Pakistan done in Pakistan-controlled Kashmir (PcK).

"Compare the development between this side and PcK. Do they have electricity, roads, healthcare and toilets for women. There is nothing (on the other side). You (Kashmiris) have the same rights as any other Indian does," he said.

Without naming Congress, National Conference and Peoples Democratic Party, he said while only three medical colleges were set up by the "three families which have ruled Jammu and Kashmir", Prime Minister Narendra Modi has ensured seven new medical colleges and these are coming up.

"Earlier, 500 youths could become doctors ... now 2,000 youths can become doctors from these new medical colleges. Nobody will need to go to Pakistan to study medicine," he said.

Shah said schemes and plans of the Modi government will ensure that J&K is the most developed province of the country.

He sought the cooperation of the people to realise this dream.

"It is only the youth of J&K who can work towards achieving this goal," he said, adding "we want that the youth of Kashmir pick books and not stones, pick tools to brighten their future and not arms."

Asserting that the government is aiming to wipe out terrorism and put an end to civilian killings in J&K, Shah said nobody will be allowed to disrupt peace and development in the Union Territory, which has a special place in Prime Minister Modi's heart.

Defending the curbs on internet services and imposition of curfew in the aftermath of abrogation of Article 370, he said that "some people would have misled the masses. Who would have been killed? The Kashmiri youth. We know how heavy the coffin of a young son is for an old man".

He said 40,000 people have been killed in Kashmir in violence and it should stop now.

"This many people do not die even in wars. We have to come back and take Kashmir to new heights of development," he said.

The minister said Rs 12,000 crore worth of investment has already come to the Union Territory and the government aims at a total of Rs 51,000 crore by the end of 2022 to provide five lakh jobs to the local youth.

Shah said "three families" are answerable to the people for their failure to develop J&K over the past seven decades.

"The new phase of development under the leadership of Modi has started in J&K but attempts are being made by inimical elements to create hurdles. I have come here to assure you that nobody will be able to create a hurdle and disrupt peace and development," he said.

He said a new phase of development has started and this cannot be stopped.

Shah said five lakh jobs are being created in Jammu and Kashmir, while 20,000 people have been provided government jobs in the past two years.

"The three families used to say who will come and invest in J&K... in just six months after announcing a new industrial policy, we have got an investment of Rs 7,000 crore in Jammu and Rs 6,000 crore in Kashmir and are looking forward to an investment of Rs 50,000 crore by 2022-end," he said.

Shah accused the "three families" of ruining the tourism industry of the erstwhile state of J&K. However, he said, "from March 2020 to March 2021, 1.34 lakh tourists came to the valley" and claimed it to be highest since independence.

The army commanders are also expected to deliberate on various reform measures recommended by separate internal committees, the people cited above said.

They said the discussions on the situation in eastern Ladakh and ways to further bolster India's military preparedness in the region are likely to dominate the conference in the next three days.

"The commanders will review overall military preparedness in eastern Ladakh as well as in other sectors of the IAC," said one of the people cited above.

The eastern Ladakh border standoff between the Indian and Chinese militaries erupted on May 5 last year following a violent clash in the Pangong lake areas and both sides gradually enhanced their deployment by rushing in tens of thousands of soldiers as well as heavy weaponry.

The tension escalated following a deadly clash in Galwan Valley on June 15 last year.

As a result of a series of military and diplomatic talks, the two sides completed the disengagement process in the Gogra area in August and in the north and south banks of the Pangong lake in February.

The last round of military talks on October 10 ended in a stalemate following which both sides blamed each other for the impasse.

In a strong statement after the 13th round of talks, the Indian Army said the "constructive suggestions" made by it at the negotiations were neither agreeable to the Chinese side nor could Beijing provide any "forward-looking" proposals.

Each side currently has around 50,000 to 60,000 troops along the LAC in the sensitive sector.

Spends Night At CRPF

three-day visit to Jammu and Kashmir, stayed for the night at the CRPF Campus in Lethpora in Pulwama where a suicide car bomb attack by militants in February 2019 had left 40 paramilitary personnel dead.

"I want to spend one night with you people and understand your problems," Shah said addressing the security personnel at the CRPF campus, adding it was his "most important" engagement during his visit to the Union territory.

Shah said that the law and order situation has improved a lot in Jammu and Kashmir, adding that he was hopeful "we will be able to realise a peaceful Jammu and Kashmir as envisaged by Prime Minister Modi during our lifetime".

Stone-pelting incidents are only seen when we try to look for them. There was a time when stone pelting was common in Kashmir. Such incidents have decreased to a huge extent. But, I want to say that there is no need to be satisfied, Shah said.

Narendra Modi government has a zero-tolerance policy towards terrorism. We cannot bear it. It is against humanity. It should be our priority to save the people of Kashmir from the persons who are linked to this heinous crime against humanity, he said.

The Home Minister expressed his gratitude to the CRPF and other security forces for ensuring that there was no bloodshed after Article 370 was revoked in August 2019.

"There are many changes that are happening on the development front, in infrastructure, industrial and education sectors because the Army and CRPF are ensuring that all sinister designs are defeated," Shah said.

He said when Articles 370 and 35A were revoked, there were many apprehensions that "there would be a huge reaction".

"It was possible as well, that perhaps there could have been bloodshed, but today I have come here to tell you and tell you freely that because of your alertness not a single shot was fired. It is a huge thing for us.

The alertness with which 28,000 jawans and also J-K policemen worked after a major decision was taken in national and J-K's interest, no blood was shed and a new era of development was started in Kashmir," he said.

Its effect is visible in the fact that the Pulwama which was known across the country and the world over for the attack on CRPF will now have a medical college to be built at the cost of Rs 2000 crore, he said.

Shah said during 2004-14, an average of 208 civilians and 105 security personnel were killed every year, but in the 2014-21 period, it has come down to 60 personnel and 30 civilians per year.

Priyanka Promises Free Medical Treatment Up To Rs 10 Lakh In UP If Voted To Power

Making another poll promise ahead of the Uttar Pradesh Assembly polls, Congress leader Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Monday said free medical treatment of up to Rs 10 lakh would be provided to people of the state if her party is voted to power.

The Congress leader had flagged off her party's 'Pratigya Yatras' from Uttar Pradesh's Barabanki district on Saturday with seven promises, including loan waiver for farmers and jobs to 20 lakh people if voted to power.

"Everyone saw the dilapidated condition of the health system of UP due to government neglect during the corona period and now during the spread of fever. For ensuring good and cheap treatment, with the consent of the manifesto committee, the UP Congress has decided that if voted to power, our government will provide up to Rs 10 lakh for treatment of any disease," Gandhi said in a tweet in Hindi.



Among the other promises made by the party are purchase of wheat and paddy at Rs 2,500 per quintal and Rs 400 per quintal for sugarcane.

The party has also promised jobs to 20 lakh people, halving the electricity bill of all and a sum of Rs 25,000 to families who faced financial crunch amid the Covid crisis.

Besides the party has decided to give 40 per cent tickets to women in elections and smartphones to Class 12 pass girls and e-scooters to graduate girls if voted to power.

Rickshaw Puller In Uttar Pradesh Gets I-T Notice For Rs 3 Crore



A rickshaw puller has approached the police in Mathura district after he was served a notice by the Income Tax (IT) department, asking him to pay over Rs 3 crore.

Pratap Singh, a resident of Amar Colony in Mathura, submitted a complaint at the Highway police station, claiming fraud, after he received the notice from the IT department.

Station House Office (SHO) Anuj Kumar said no case was registered on the basis of Singh's complaint, but the police will look into the matter.

Singh also uploaded a video clip on social media in which he narrated the sequence of events.

According to him, he applied for a PAN card at the Jan Suvidha Kendra in Bakalpur in March this year after his bank asked

him to submit the same. Subsequently, he got a coloured photocopy of the PAN card from one Sanjai Singh of Bakalpur.

Since he is illiterate, he could not differentiate between an original PAN card and a coloured photocopy of the same, the rickshaw puller said in the video clip.

He had to run from pillar to post for about three months to get his PAN card.

Singh said he got a call from IT officials on October 19 and was served a notice, asking him to pay Rs 3,47,54,896.

He said the officials told him that someone had impersonated him and obtained a GST number on his name for running a business and the turnover of the trader for 2018-19 was Rs 43,44,36,201.

43% Teachers Unhappy, 9% Totally Dissatisfied With Online Teaching: Survey

Around 43 per cent of teachers said they were not satisfied with online teaching during the pandemic while nine per cent of them expressed complete dissatisfaction with the mode of education, according to a survey.

A total of 220 school teachers participated while 20 people, including eight teachers, were interviewed for an online survey published in the Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights' (DCPCR) first journal—Children First: Journal on Children's Lives.

A majority of teachers (43 per cent) expressed that they were not satisfied with teaching online and nine per cent of the participants were not at all happy with it, the survey said.

The key issues that the teachers identified as the teaching went online due to the pandemic were absenteeism (14 per cent), children with special needs not being considered (21 per cent), low attention span of students (28 per cent), emotional issues expressed by the students (19 per cent), and no assessment or assignment completion by the students (10 per cent).



The participating teachers and students also stated that online emotional support and group engagements by the counsellors and social workers helped children to be more expressive and participatory in online education.

The teachers stressed that the involvement of parents became necessary in school education because only they have regular access to children and can directly engage with them during this period.

The students who participated in the study expressed that they missed many school activities, including meeting friends, interacting with people, celebrations, and friendships.

Some of the participants also expressed that they are overloaded with academic exercises, according to the survey.

Teachers also shared their challenges of keeping up with online teaching schedules and fulfilling their responsibilities at home.

The survey concluded that for a successful transition to the online mode, some things are necessary—accessibility and affordability of digital platforms, need-based curriculum and pedagogy, and sufficient capacity building of the learning community.

"The pandemic shifting of those necessities still poses a major challenge to online learning," it said.

NEET-PG counselling not to commence till Supreme Court decides on OBC, EWS quota: Centre

The Centre assured the Supreme Court on Monday that the counselling process of NEET-PG will not commence till the top court decides the challenge to 27 per cent reservation for OBC and 10 per cent for EWS category in PG All India Quota seats (MBBS/BDS and MD/MS/MDS) from the current academic session.

A bench of Justices DY Chandrachud and BV Nagarathna recorded the assurance given by Additional Solicitor General (ASG) KM Nataraj, appearing for the Centre, and observed that students would be in serious problem if the counselling process went ahead as scheduled.

The assurance by Nataraj was given after senior advocate Arvind Dattar, appearing for some NEET candidates, mentioned that as per the schedule announced by the Director General of Health Services, the counselling process for the NEET-PG is to commence from



October 25. He said that by the time the court decided the pending batch

of petitions, challenging the July 29 notification, introducing the reservation from a academic year, the entire process of admission would be over and serious prejudice would be caused to the students.

Nataraj said the communication which the counsel for petitioner is referring to was sent only to the medical colleges for verification of seats and one more notification had been issued on Monday.

"The counselling process will not begin till the court decides the pending batch of petitions," the ASG submitted. The bench said that it is taking the word on record. **PTI**

Plea Against Ramdev By Doctors' Association Can't Be Thrown Out: Delhi HC

The Delhi High Court, on Monday, said prima facie, a suit filed by several doctors' associations against yoga guru Ramdev for allegedly spreading misinformation against allopathy amid the COVID-19 pandemic deserves consideration and cannot be "thrown out" at the first stage.

Justice C Hari Shankar said at the present stage, it only needs "to see if allegations in the plaint make out a case to be entertained".

"The allegations may be right or maybe wrong. He may say he did not say any such thing... It needs to be looked into," said the judge.

"Prime facie, it appears that the present suit can't be thrown out at the threshold without granting leave to institute the suit," said the court which had earlier sought Ramdev's stand on the institution of the proceeding.

The court listed the matter on October 27 to enable the counsel for Ramdev to make his submissions. Three resident doctors' association of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences at Rishikesh, Patna and Bhubaneswar as well as association of resident doctors, Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education & Research, Chandigarh; Union of Resident Doctors of Punjab (URDP); Resident Doctors' Association, Lala Lajpat Rai Memorial Medical College, Meerut, and Telangana Junior Doctors' Association, Hyderabad had moved the high court earlier this year.

They alleged that Ramdev was misleading and misrepresenting to the public at large that allopathy was responsible for the deaths of several people infected by COVID-19, and insinuating that allopathic doctors were causing the deaths of the patients.

Senior counsel Akhil Sibal, representing the associations, said that amid a pandemic, Ramdev made unsubstantiated claims on Coronil being a cure for COVID-19, contrary to the licence



granted to the drug for merely being an "Immuno booster".

The senior counsel claimed that Ramdev's statements were not "bonafide opinions" but were made for marketing and commercial use.

"This is a person with no degree. He is dispensing medical opinion in a regulated field, endangering life amid a pandemic. People are gullible. He is a repeat offender. He claimed Yoga can cure AIDS and cancer. You can't just say things and dupe people. The commercial speech comes with some responsibility," he said.

In their plea filed through advocate Harshavardhan Kotla, the associations had submitted that the yoga guru, who is a highly influential person, was sowing doubts in the minds of the general public concerning the safety and efficacy of not only allopathic treatments but also COVID-19 vaccines.

The plea alleged that the misinformation campaign was nothing but an advertisement and marketing strategy to further the sales of the product sold by Ramdev, including Coronil which claims to be an alternative treatment for COVID-19.

The other defendants in the plea include Acharya Balkrishna and Patanjali Ayurveda.

The court had, on June 3, issued summons to Ramdev on a plea by the Delhi Medical Association in connection with his alleged statements against allopathic medicines and claims regarding Patanjali's Coronil kit.

The court had refused to restrain Ramdev at that stage saying the allopathic profession was not so fragile. It had, however, orally asked Ramdev's counsel to tell him not to make any provocative statements.
