Jammu: Security forces have aunched a long-range patrolling and area domination operation in border areas of Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district to keep a vigil on anti-national elements ahead of the Republic Day, officials said on Tuesday.

Several bids to smuggle weapons and infiltrate militants into the Indian side of the border have been foiled by the security forces in Samba in the past.

"We are undertaking longrange patrolling and area domination operation of the area which is close to the border (in Samba district) in a bid to foil any design of the anti-national elements," a senior police officer leading the operation said.

"Anti-national elements who try to disturb peace will not be allowed to succeed", he said.

Inmate Dies In Kupwara Jail, 2nd Death In Six Months

SRINAGAR: A 33-year-old accused from Sopore, who was lodged along with his brother, at district jail Kupwara died around midnight, officials said on Tuesday.

They said the accused Khurshid Ahmad Wani of Saidpora Sopore, who was lodged in the jail since October 5, 2021 in a case (FIR no 52/2021 under section 363 498 and 109 IPC of police station Kralgund, fell severely ill and was taken to sub District hospital Kupwara where doctors declared him brought dead.

Sources said that Khursheed was not keep well for quite some time and around midnight, his

brother who is also lodged in the jail in connection with same case, raised an alarm following which health officials of the hospital reached and found him dead. The jail authorities shifted him

to hospital where doctors declared him dead on arrival. This is the second death in the jail in the last six months as an accused from Brath Kalan Sopore had died there on June 14 last year.

Meanwhile, Superintendent of Kupwara Jail, Shahbaz Hussain in a letter issued to the chairman District Legal Services Authority, Kupwara has stated that the undertrial prisoner was suffering from several ailments and was sent to More on P10



'Parent's Genes Can Influence A **Child's Educational Success'**

According to new research by the University College London, a child's educational success depends on the genes of his parents that have been inherited as well as not been inherited.

The study has been published in 'The American Journal of Human

Funded by the Nuffield Foundation, the study confirmed that genes a person inherits directly are most likely to contribute to their achievements in education. But parent genes that aren't directly inherited, yet have still shaped parents' own education levels and subsequently influenced the lifestyle and family environment they provide for their children, are also important and can affect how well a person does at school and beyond.

Children resemble their parents because of nature (the genes they inherit) and nurture (the environment they grow up in). But nature and nurture effects are intertwined.



Mothers and fathers each pass on half of their genes to their children, and although the other half of their genes are not passed on, they continue to influence the parents' traits and ultimately influence the traits in their children. For example, parents with a higher genetic propensity for learning may have a greater interest

in activities such as reading that, in turn, nurture learning in their offspring.

This concept -- when parents' genes influence outcomes for their offspring by shaping the environment that they provide for them -- is called genetic nurture. It describes how parents' genes indirectly their children's characteristics.

For the current paper, researchers reviewed and analysed 12 studies in several countries and used a method called polygenic scoring to study the influence of millions of genetic variants on educational attainment in nearly 40,000 parent and child pairs. The researchers found that genetic nurture had about half as much impact on education success as genetic

Genetic nurture effects captured by polygenic scores in the studies explained at least 1.28 per cent of the variance in educational outcomes, while direct genetic effects explained at least 2.89 per cent of the variance in educational outcomes. The researchers said that the find-

ings are underestimated given that polygenic scores only capture a fraction of heritability in educational outcomes; the actual genetic effects could be multiple times higher, but direct genetic effects would probably still be roughly double those of

Study Examines How Fake News Headlines Trigger Emotions them one of eight fake news

A new study looked into how people's emotions are sparked by false political headlines -- and how their reactions determine whether they share those stories with others.

The research has been published in the 'Journal of Management Information Systems'.

"Emotions do really seem to matter in terms of the spread of fake news," said Christy Galletta Horner (A&S '05, EDUC '13G, '15G), now an assistant professor at Bowling Green State University and the study's lead author.

"Emotions get ignored a lot in research, and I think in this case that could be a mistake," she added.

Concerned by the increasing presence of misleading news stories in the past few years, Galletta Horner jumped on the chance to study the trend when approached by then-graduate student Abhijeet Shirsat about his thesis on the topic.

During the 2020 election season, the team presented 879 participants with on-

headlines that covered topics from political scandals to candidate health concerns and implicated either Joe Biden or Donald Trump. The survey asked whether they would share the headline or share opposing information, as well as how it made them feel.

Participants, the team found, fell roughly into three groups. The first was the most likely to say they would share the fake news headlines. "That's a group that's just

high on all emotions, this

set of people we called

'hot,'" said Dennis Galletta, co-author, professor of business administration at Pitt's Joseph M. Katz Graduate School of Business and father of Galletta Horner. "So we can't just say anger drives it all, or happiness drives it all. It really depends," he added.

Another, which the team

called "upset" users, had a mostly negative response to seeing the headlines. The majority, though, fit into what the researchers called the "cold" group, which didn't have much of a reaction at all and were less likely to share anything. line surveys and showed Participants' political affiliations affected how they responded, too: Unsurprisingly, they were more likely to share negative headlines about an opposing party. But the researchers also found differences specific to political parties. "Independents seem to be

the most sceptical of all, and Republicans believed the fake headlines more, even if they were about Trump," said Galletta. The researchers noted, however, that participants

weren't necessarily representative of the political makeup of the U.S. "It was surprising to see how many people just don't

care," added Galletta. He sees this "cold" group as

having the potential to be mobilized by appealing to their emotions. "I think that the major-

ity would be people who, if they had their emotions raised, would suppress the fake news" by posting information to counter it. he said. "Availability was found upto the mark. All the Oxygen Ports were used simultaneously and there was no drop in Oxygen pressure," statement reads.

Some medical experts emphasised on utilization of services of final year

Besides, a Referral Control Room be also established for effective and prompt monitoring of patient referral is managed.

'Covid Booster Dose Mandatory For Healthcare Workers'

Srinagar: Doctors Association Kashmir (DAK) on Tuesday has sought mandatory Covid booster shots for healthcare workers.

'Vaccine mandate will ensure that all people in the healthcare workforce are boosted," said DAK President and Influenza expert Dr Nisar ul Hassan in a statement issued to the agency—Kashmir News Observer (KNO).

The DAK President said we are seeing many doctors, nurses and paramedical staff getting infected and even fully vaccinated are not spared. "They are at the forefront in the fight against Covid-19 pandemic. We need to keep them safe. They need that extra layer of protection," he said.

Dr Hassan said boost-

ers will protect medical staff from getting infected and prevent disruption of healthcare delivery services. 'There is a moral imperative

for staff to get booster shots to ensure that the hospital environment is safe for patients," he said, adding that patients entrust healthcare workers with their lives and clinicians should not be the ones to make them sick.

"The science is clear now that while two doses of Covid-19 vaccine protects you from severe disease, immunity begins to wane after a period of 6 months," said Dr Nisar, adding that it has been almost 12 months since healthcare workers were vaccinated. That makes boosters shots critically important for them.



Amid Tensions With China, Taiwan Starts Rescue Operation For Missing F-16 Fighter

TAIPEI: Taiwan's air force said it had launched a rescue operation to locate one of its most advanced F-16s after the fighter jet vanished from radar screens on Tuesday.

The jet disappeared around half an hour after taking off for a routine training flight from a base in the southern city of Chiayi, the air force said in a statement.

Taiwan's national rescue centre growing pressure from China. reported that people saw the F-16V "crashing into the sea," adding that two choppers and one coastguard vessel had been dispatched to find the jet.

President Tsai Ing-wen has ordered an all-out rescue effort and asked for clarity around the cause of the incident, her office said.

Taipei commissioned its first squadron of US-made F-16V fighters in November in an effort to upgrade its ageing fleet as tensions with China continue to heighten. Beijing claims the self-ruled island as part of its territory and has vowed to take it one day, by force if necessary.

Omicron Vaccine To Be Ready In March

Pfizer Chief Executive Officer Albert Bourla Told CNBC That Pfizer Is Already Manufacturing Doses Due To Keen Interest From Governments.

NEW YORK: Pfizer expects a Covid-19 vaccine targeting the Omicron variant to be ready in March, the company's head said Monday.

Pfizer Chief Executive Officer Albert Bourla told CNBC that Pfizer is already manufacturing doses due to keen interest from governments, as authorities contend with huge Covid-19 infection counts, including large numbers of "breakthrough" Omicron cases in vaccinated populations.

"This vaccine will be ready in March," Bourla told the network. "I don't know if we will need it. I don't know if and how it will be used."

Bourla said the existing regime of two vaccine shots and a booster has provided "reasonable" protection against serious health effects from Omicron.

US Man Recovering After 'Breakthrough' Pig Heart Transplant



man with terminal heart disease is responding well three days after Abeing given a genetically modified pig heart in a first-of-its-kind surgery, his doctors reported on Monday.

The surgery, performed by a team at the University of Maryland Medicine in the United States, is among the first to demonstrate the feasibility of a pig-tohuman heart transplant, a field made

possible by new gene editing tools. If proven successful, scientists hope pig organs could help alleviate shortages of donor organs.

"This was a breakthrough surgery and brings us one step closer to solving the organ shortage crisis. There are simply not enough donor human hearts available to meet the long list of potential recipients," Dr Bartley Griffith, who surgically transplanted the pig heart into the patient, said in a statement.

"We are proceeding cautiously, but we are also optimistic that this first-in-theworld surgery will provide an important new option for patients in the future," Griffith added. For David Bennett, a 57-year-old from Maryland, the heart transplant was his last option.

"It was either die or do this transplant. want to live. I know it's a shot in the dark, but it's my last choice," Bennett said a day before his surgery, according to a statement released by the university.

Multi-Millionaire Killer Robert **Durst Dies In Prison**

LOS ANGELES: Real estate heir and convicted murderer Robert Durst, who was jailed for life for the killing of his best friend, died Monday in a California prison, his lawyer said.

Multi-millionaire Durst was the subject of an explosive HBO documentary entitled "The Jinx," which ultimately led to his conviction over one of the three gruesome deaths for which he was believed to be responsible.

Attorney Chip Lewis said the 78-yearold died of "natural causes associated with the litany of medical issues we had repeatedly reported to the court over the last couple of years."

Durst was convicted last year of the December 2000 shooting of Susan Berman in her Beverly Hills home.

Crime writer Berman, the daughter of



a Las Vegas mobster, had taken on the role of Durst's spokeswoman after he became a suspect in the disappearance of his wife, Kathleen, 18 years earlier.

Prosecutors said he had murdered Berman to prevent her from incriminating him in a renewed police investigation into the disappearance of Kathleen Durst.

Durst's wife, a medical student, was just 29 when she vanished as the couple's marriage was disintegrating.

He told investigators in New York state she had boarded a train to Manhattan bound for the couple's apartment there one of a number of homes they shared -- but had never arrived.

72-Year-Old US Man Arrested For Threatening To Kidnap, Kill Trump

NEW YORK: The US Secret Service arrested a 72-year-old man in New York on Monday after he allegedly phoned them threatening to kill ex-president Donald Trump, a criminal indictment showed.

Prosecutors in Brooklyn say Thomas Welnicki "knowingly and willfully threatened to kill, kidnap, and inflict bodily harm upon" the former US president. It alleges that Melnick told US Capitol Po-

lice during an interview in July 2020 that if Trump "loses the 2020 election and refused to step down" he would "acquire weapons and take him down." Trump is referred to as "Individual-1" in the indictment.

Third Wave Is Here

n just a matter of a few days, India is right in the midst of a third wave. On Monday, the caseload of the fresh Covid infections spiked to 1,80,000, according to the data published by the Union ministry of health and family welfare. The number of active cases is now over 700,000-mark. Even in Jammu and Kashmir, the fresh cases have surged to 706, taking active cases to 4024 in the UT. The upward trend in the cases is likely to continue for some time. Thankfully so far, India is yet to witness the chaos of the second wave that wrought havoc and led to the death of thousands of people. On a positive note, as of now, only 5 to ten percent of the infected people need hospitalizations

The number of cases of Omicron, the highly transmissible mutant variant, is also growing. The caseload now stands at 4,033, with Maharashtra recording the maximum number of 1,126 infections. The number is likely to increase further given the highly contagious nature of the new variant.

But there is also hope now that eventually the daily caseload will progressively reduce like last year. Manindra Agrawal, Professor of Mathematics and Computer Science at IIT Kanpur, has predicted third wave peaking in Mumbai and Delhi in mid-January, projecting four to eight lakh cases a day in India. But the consequent improvement in the situation would mean little if there is no corresponding expansion in the vaccination, especially the booster dose to frontline workers and the elderly.

Government also needs to invest in a world class healthcare infrastructure to increase the capacity of the hospitals and the medical personnel to deal with the pandemic. Unlike last year, there is no scope to implement a nationwide lockdown, although some regions have imposed weekend curbs on movement and the night curfews. Delhi has ordered bars and restaurants to shut. Tamil Nadu Govt has extended lockdown restrictions till January 31.

But considering the terrible state of the economy, the state governments across India can hardly afford to impose fresh lockdown. The trick is to upgrade healthcare, expedite vaccination include booster doses, enforce strict adherence to SOPs in public and running an advertisement blitz to create more awareness about the contagion.

In fact, India has already begun administering the 'precaution dose' of the Covid vaccine to frontline workers and senior citizens with comorbidities. Eligible beneficiaries can walk-in to their nearby vaccination centre and get the third dose. Prime Minister Narendra Modi has also urges eligible beneficiaries to get Covid-19 'precautionary dose. "As we all know, vaccination remains among the most effective means to fight Covid-19," PM Modi tweeted and the people need to heed him.

Insecure State

ounter-insurgency operations are usually understood to target weapon wielding militants, their organisations and their leaders. As reported in this newspaper, in Kashmir, where the sweeping changes of 2019 have failed to end the militancy, COIN operations appear to have changed tack to fold in an increasingly wider swathe of the population. They now cover funders and financiers, and "overground workers", a term that was recently used at an Army-organised seminar at Srinagar's Badami Bagh garrison, as a description that fit young and old, man or woman, scholars, doctors, teachers, businessmen, lawyers, and anyone else "from gunners to runners". Now it is not just the police, the army and the paramilitaries but a plethora of other organisations such as the Enforcement Directorate, and others included in the Terror Monitoring Group such as the two Central Boards dealing with direct and indirect taxes and customs. On the face of it, a case can be made that instead of focusing on the numbers of "kills" of militants, which may end up pushing more young people to take up arms and declare war against the Indian state, focusing on breaking their networks, whether financial, logistical or ideological, is a more intelligent way of dealing with an insurgency. Far too many recent encounters have led to the killings of barely adult teenagers with no training and armed with nothing more than a pistol. Instead, if a crackdown on those who give them money and shelter, and other types of support can lead to arrests and save lives, this new approach may even win community support.


However, the danger in the ever-widening definition of overground workers is that it can end up profiling or labelling an entire population as such, and lead back to the same undesirable result — alienation and a simmering militancy. After thousands of arrests under draconian laws such as the Unlawful Activities and Prevention of Terrorism Act and the Public Security Act over the last three years, the government is no closer to making friends with the people in Kashmir. Add the new rules of conduct for government employees, and several dismissals under constitutional provisions that require no reason to be given, a muzzled press, the barring of dissent to the extent that even the police force says its actions must not be questioned, this feels more like the hatchet arm of a security state bent on othering the people of the Valley.

This heavily securitised approach to bringing back "normalcy" and zero community outreach, the continuing absence of a political process with restrictions on the movement and activities of the former state's political leadership even as the rest of the country is forever in election mode has only served to emphasise the difference.

Livestock Entrepreneurship In Kashmir - Long Way To Go

Ensure Rigorous Training To Budding Cattle And Sheep Farmers

ome years back, while discussing the potential of sheep and cattle farming in Jammu & Kashmir during a workshop, local entrepreneurs expressed dismay over lack of practical training. They complained that the Government was not providing them enough field training that would make them professional cattle or sheep farmers

In the summer of 2014, I visited a huge sheep farm in the Tangmarg area. I saw almost 300 sheep with a huge farm built on 10 kanals of land. After a year, I came to know that the farm has been closed down. I have seen many cattle farms, sheep farms or even poultry farms shut down by budding entrepreneurs. On one hand, the Go

keeps advising educated youth to look into business opportunities in sheep and cattle farming but the authorities fail to ensure practical training or proper hand-holding for these budding farmers. The sheep and animal husbandry departments ask youth to set up farms through various centrally sponsored schemes and a lot of awareness is created as well but very few people are aware about the challenges sheep or cattle farmers face especially when there is outbreak of some disease. Last summer, there was an outbreak of Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) in sheep which otherwise is attributed to cattle, buffaloes and goats. I was in Pir Panjal meadows that time and I know how desperate the sheep farmers were who had traveled all the way through dense forests of Yusmarg to see their sheep. Some were seen vaccinating the sheep themselves as sheep husbandry department vets were not available in spite of the fact that they have annual summer camps in these areas for 3 to 4 months. Similarly, the cattle farmers also face a lot of problems especially when the cows are unwell. Lack of fodder availability is also a big challenge for them.

Practical Training?

We lack Practical Training Centers (PTCs) in Jammu & Kashmir where budding entrepreneurs especially the livestock entrepreneurs would get trained for a few months. Neither the Government nor any Non Governmental Organisation (NGO) or any other private entity has set up such centers in J&K. In these PTCs, the livestock entrepreneurs would be given a practical exposure where they would live in an atmosphere to undertake training in the cattle

women start their sheep and cattle farms by availing different subsidy schemes of the Government through J&K Entrepreneurship Development Institute (JKEDI). I am sure the JKEDI would be taking the trainees to visit dairy farms, sheep farms, and other similar places for which our young men and women are getting trained but without staying in these farms and living in such an atmosphere, I believe such visits won't help to create dedicated and professional dairy

module has been built in such a way that all the focus and thrust during entrepreneurship training is given on theory. or sheep farming for at least two to

three months. It is impossible to create potential entrepreneurs by only making them go through lectures in class rooms or auditoriums. The budding educated MBA graduates or other qualified young men and women might get fascinated by watching videos of Jersey cows or Australian Merino sheep during the training workshops but once they start the livestock units, it is an arduous task. They have to face lots of challenges. This leads to closure of the units they establish.

As discussed above, the sheep are not much affected by FMD across other states in India but in Kashmir this is not an uncommon disease in sheep. This summer, even professional sheep farmers faced huge challenges.One can understand what kind of ordeal the young entrepreneurs would have gone through especially at a time when they had sent their sheep to pasturelands.

JKEDI

Many educated young men and

They have to live around sheep and cattle farms for months and then only we can expect some good results.

The Entrepreneurship Development Institutes (EDI) and other training centers imparting skill development training in agriculture, horticulture, dairy, sheep, trout farming, floriculture etc must have their own farms where these kinds of activities would be undertaken. In addition, EDI and similar institutions must help the entrepreneurs with market linkages

The JKEDI lays special emphasis on dairy farming but they don't own a dairy farm. The Government spends a huge amount of money on entrepreneurship development. Lot of

money was spent on construction of EDI buildings in Srinagar outskirts near Pampore. I wish the Govt had set up a small practical training center under EDI for sheep and cattle farming at least that could have been established somewhere in Pulwama or Budgam.

National Livestock Mission

The Govt of India launched the National Livestock Mission (NLM). This scheme proposes to bring sharp focus on entrepreneurship development and breed improvement in rural poultry, cattle, sheep, and goat farming including feed and fodder development. National Live-stock Mission (NLM) was launched in the financial year 2014-15 which seeks to ensure quantitative and qualitative improvement in livestock production systems and capacity building of all stakeholders. The scheme is being implemented as a sub scheme of white revolution. The department of Sheep husbandry or even animal husbandry have various schemes that are funded under National Livestock Mission. Govt provides support to farmers and entrepreneurs to start sheep or cattle rearing farms. Unfortunately in these cases also no practical training is available.

Conclusion

It must be mandatory for all the beneficiaries of Govt schemes to undergo practical training sessions in sheep and cattle farming especially at designated farms. In summers the budding entrepreneurs should be sent to pasturelands to learn the art of sheep farming and the department of sheep husbandry who are already available in these places must provide necessary assistance to them. With regard to cattle farming the young boys and girls who avail funds from Govt must be attached with some Govt or private dairy farm for at least two months so that they get fully familiar with the cattle farming and challenges cattle farmers face. Unless the budding cattle farmers don't milk the cows themselves or clean the cow-dung or are not able to vaccinate their cows or calves themselves ,they can't become promising cattle farmers. Similarly the emerging sheep farmers have to be associated with shepherds and live with them for at least two months in pasturelands. Once they do this practical course then only they will become professional sheep farmers.

What Makes Bangladesh India's Largest Export Destination?

n Fiscal Year 2022, Bangladesh is expected to be India's fourthlargest export destination jumping from the fifth place it is currently holding. This is definitely a landmark for the Indo-Bangladesh relations which began on 6 December 1971 with India's recognition of Bangladesh as an independent state. It is a time-honored decision to analyze the factors that have made Bangladesh to be in the list of top five export destinations of India and how both countries can generate more benefits from this economic engagement.

According to the available data till October, during the first seven months of fiscal year 2022, exports from India to Bangladesh increased 81 percent over the same time period in the previous year to USD7.7 billion. This makes Bangladesh the fourth largest export destination of India after the USA, UAE and China respectively. Sri Lanka and Cambodia may also follow Bangladesh's footsteps to make their market more attractive to Indian investors.

If this export trend remains constant, then Bangladesh is most likely to achieve the rank as India's fourth largest export market from the fifth position it is holding from last year. Analysts and experts were surprised, in fiscal year 2020, when Bangladesh directly jumped to the fifth position from the ninth position in India's export profile.

What makes Bangladesh such an attractive export destination for India?

This has become possible because of Bangladesh's economic boom which has ultimately contributed substantially to India's export growth to Bangladesh. Bangladesh has demonstrated extreme economic success and growth in the past decades especially among the South Asian countries. The RMG sector, which is responsible for almost 80 percent of the total export earnings, worked as a main engine of economic growth and development. According to the Global Knowledge Partnership on Migration and Development (KNOMAD),

types of trade facilities, such as tariff reduction, to create a level playing field for Bangladesh. The countries may undertake a bilateral comprehensive economic partnership agreement (CEPA) to address the aforementioned issue and to have greater bilateral engagement. Not to forget, without addressing issues of tariff and non-tariff barriers, the countries cannot expect to sustain the growth in their economic ties for a long time

Bangladesh has become eighth largest remittance earner in 2020. In 2020, the remittance Bangladesh earned from its expatriates accounted for 6.6% of GDP. This remittance inflow ensures stable household income, increased consumption level and improved living standard of the people. Economists also predict that Bangladesh may even surpass India

in terms of per capita income in the coming year. Sri Lanka and Cambodia may learn from Bangladeh's macroeconomic policies to manage their economy for further growth.

In the Fiscal Year 2020-21, the Per Capita Income (PPI) in Bangladesh was \$2,554 and the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) of Bangladesh has increased to \$409 billion. If we analyze the GDP and

PPI of Bangladesh over the last 10 years, we will see a growing trend which ultimately indicates that the purchasing power of the people of Bangladesh has increased over this timeframe. When PPI increases, demand for goods and services increases which makes Bangladesh an attractive market not only for internal companies but also for the foreign companies.

How India penetrated into Bangladesh's market?

There are a number of factors that helped Indian companies to successfully penetrate into Bangladesh's market. The shared civilizational bonds, common history and cultural and social affinity bought Bangladesh and India closer. People of these countries have similar taste in foods and other day-to-day necessities which made Indian companies read the psychology of Bangladeshi consumers. On the other hand, Indian media is widely broadcast in Bangladesh which also created huge demand for Indian goods in Bangladesh through successful marketing promotion and advertising. Besides, Indian companies grabbed the Bangladesh market perfectly with quality products and affordable prices. Noteworthy to mention here, the major goods exported to Bangladesh from India, during April-October 2021, are cereal, cotton, electricity, vehicle parts, and mechanical appliances.

In Fiscal Year 2019-20, the bilateral trade between India and Bangladesh crossed \$10 billion where India's exports to Bangladesh were \$8.2 billion and Bangladesh's exports to India \$1.26 billion. This data shows that there is a huge trade deficit for Bangladesh which should be addressed immediately by both countries especially by India. Otherwise, these economic ties will be questioned by the critics dubbing it as "trade imbalance". Besides, India, as a South Asian Giant, should provide different types of trade facilities, such as tariff reduction, to create a level playing field for Bangladesh. The countries may undertake a bilateral comprehensive economic partnership agreement (CEPA) to address the aforementioned issue and to have greater bilateral engagement. Not to forget, without addressing issues of tariff and non-tariff barriers, the countries cannot expect to sustain the growth in their economic ties for a long time.

World Economy In 2022

Il 2022 be the year where the world economy recovers from the pandemic? That's the big question on everyone's lips as the festive break comes to an end. One complicating factor is that most of the latest major forecasts were published in the weeks before the omicron variant swept the world. At that time, the mood was that recovery was indeed around the corner, with the IMF projecting 4.9% growth in 2022 and the OECD projecting 4.5%. These numbers are lower than the circa 5% to 6% global growth expected to have been achieved in 2021, but that represents the inevitable rebound from reopening after the pandemic lows of 2020.

So what difference will omicron make to the state of the economy? We already know that it had an effect in the run-up to Christmas, with for example UK hospitality taking a hit as people stayed away from restaurants. For the coming months, the combination of raised restrictions, cautious consumers and people taking time off sick is likely to take its toll.

Yet the fact that the new variant seems milder than originally feared is likely to mean that restrictions are lifted more quickly and that the economic effect is more moderate than it might have been. Israel and Australia, for example, are already loosening restrictions despite high case numbers. At the same time, however, until the west tackles very low vaccination rates in some parts of the world, don't be surprised if another new variant brings further damage to both public health and the world economy.

As things stand, the UK thinktank the Centre for Economics and Business Research (CEBR) published a more recent 2022 forecast just before Christmas. It predicted that global growth would reach 4% this year, and that the total world economy would hit a new all-time high of US\$100 trillion (£74 trillion).

The inflation question

One other big unknown is inflation. In 2021 we saw a sudden and sharp surge in inflation resulting from the restoration of global economic activity and bottlenecks in the global supply chain. There has been much debate about whether this inflation will prove temporary, and central banks have been coming under pressure to ensure it doesn't spiral.

AS FOR INDIA, WHOSE ECONOMY HAS SEEN double dips during the pandemic, it is showing a strong positive

trend with 8.5% expected growth in the year ahead. I therefore suspect that emerging Asia will shoulder global growth in 2022, and the world's economic centre of gravity will continue to shift eastwards at an accelerated pace

So far, the European Central Bank, Federal Reserve and Bank of Japan have all abstained from raising interest rates from their very low levels. The Bank of England, on the other hand, followed the IMF's advice and raised rates from 0.1% to 0.25% in December. This is too little to curb inflation or do any good besides increase the cost of borrowing for firms and to raise mortgage payments for households. That said, the markets are betting that more UK rate rises will follow, and that the Fed will also start raising rates in the spring.

Yet the more important question regarding inflation is what happens to quantitative easing (QE). This is the policy of increasing the money supply that has seen the major central banks buying some US\$25 trillion in government bonds and other financial assets in recent years, including about US\$9 trillion on the back of COVID.

Both the Fed and ECB are still operating QE and adding assets to their balance sheets every month. The Fed is currently tapering the rate of these purchases with a view to stopping them in March, having recently announced that it would bring forward the end date from June. The ECB has also said it will scale back QE, but is committed to continuing for the time being.

Of course, the real question is what these central banks do in practice. How To Remain Youthful And Resilient Despite Stress

bit of stress can be good for your mental and ∟physical wellbeing, but too much can lead to anxiety, depression and other health problems. It can also make you age faster. So learning to become more stress-resilient is important if you're not in a hurry to grow old fast.

Studies have shown that people who aren't good at managing their stress can increase their risk of dying prematurely by 43 percent. The increase in deaths might in part be due to the effect stress has on DNA. DNA, which is found

in nearly every cell (except red blood cells), contains genes that code for the building blocks (proteins) that comprise your body. DNA consists of two strands woven together in the famous "double helix". Your cells are constantly making copies of themselves, and when a cell divides, the two strands unravel and an identical copy is made of each-well, most of the time.

Sometimes mistakes happen during the replication process, especially at the end of DNA strands. These mistakes can cause mutations in the copied DNA, leading to the cell becoming cancerous. Luckily, cells have protective caps called telomeres at the ends of the DNA strand that are designed to ensure these mistakes don't happen.

Telomere caps are like sequences of beads



(telomeric repeats). Each time the cell divides, the next generation loses one bead of telomeric repeats. Unfortunately, each cell has a fixed number of these repeats, meaning that it can only replicate a certain number of times before the protective telomere caps are eroded.

This number of cell divisions is called the Hayflick limit. Once a cell reaches the Hayflick limit (up to 60 cell divisions, for most cells), it selfdestructs (safely). This is the essence of ageing.

Some cells in the body, especially the immune cells that fight infection, possess molecules called telomerase. Telomerase can add the beads back (telomeric repeats) in immune cells (and some others, such as cancerous cells), meaning that ageing can be reversed in these cells. Telomerase can add the beads back, meaning that ageing can be reversed in the cells in question.

makes as immune cells have to replicate many times to fight viruses and bacteria.

Without telomerase, they would reach their Hayflick limit and disappear, leaving organisms with no protection. Unfortunately, however, even telomerase stops working properly when people reach their 80s and lose their immune cells to ageing. It's not all beyond

your control Smoking, excess alco-

hol consumption, being overweight and stress are all associated with telomere loss. Telomerase does not work as efficiently when a person suffers from excessive stress, and this causes premature ageing.

Adopting a healthy lifestyle, such as eating a plant-based diet, can stop and even reverse the process. And physical activity, especially intense exercise, can also increase telomerase activity. So leading a healthy life can decrease the speed of ageing as can

eustress from becoming distress and enhance stress resilience.

Other techniques include doing things that enhance your positive emotions, such as reading a book, listening to music, or playing a computer game. Experiencing positive emotions broadens your mind, allowing you to perceive and draw from your psychological, intellectual and social resources, especially when experiencing adversity.

Resilience is the ability to bounce back after adversity and become resistant to daily stressors. Besides problem-solving, social support and effective use of coping strategies, mindfulness can also help vou become more resistant to daily stressors.

We can't yet be sure that these psychological strategies affect telomeres and by extension the ageing process. However, telomere length and telomerase activity in your cells do seem to negatively affected by stress and positively affected by stress management. So if you have lifestyle changes you can make to help you develop stress resilience, you might want to adopt them. They might not make you live as long as an Arctic shark, but they could add some precious years onto your life.

Case fatality rate

The extent of compliance to COVID Appropriate Behaviour

3. Whereas, it was observed that there is a need for additional measures besides continuing with the existing COVID containment measures in all Districts in view of the uneven trend observed in daily Covid cases as well

4. Govt To Get 35.8% Stake In Debt-Ridden Vodafone Idea In Lieu Of **Dues Liability**

NEW DELHI: Debt-ridden Vodafone Idea (VIL) has decided to opt for converting about Rs 16,000 crore interest dues liability payable to the government into equity which will amount to around 35.8 per cent stake in the company, as per a regulatory filing of the telecom

If the plan goes through, the government will become the biggest shareholder in the company which is reeling under a debt burden of about Rs 1.95 lakh crore.

"...the board of directors, at its meeting held on 10th January 2022, has approved the conversion of the full amount of such interest related to spectrum auction instalments and AGR dues into equity. The Net Present Value (NPV) of this interest is expected to be about Rs 16,000 crore as per the company's best estimates, subject to confirmation by the DoT," Vodafone Idea said in a regulatory filing.

The government has given telecom operators an option of paying interest for the 4 years of deferment on the deferred spectrum instalments and AGR dues by way of conversion into equity of the NPV of such interest amount.

SC To Hear Plea Today On Alleged Hate Speeches Made In Haridwar, Delhi

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on Wednesday a petition seeking a direction to ensure investigation and action against those who allegedly made hate speeches during two events held recently in Haridwar and the national capital.

The plea is scheduled to come up for hearing before a bench comprising Chief Justice N V Ramana and justices Surya Kant and Hima Kohli.

The petition, filed by journalist Qurban Ali and former Patna High Court judge and senior advocate Anjana Prakash, has sought a direction for an "independent, credible and impartial investigation" by an SIT into the incidents of hate speeches against the Muslim community.
On Monday, a bench head-

ed by the CJI had taken note of the submissions of senior advocate Kapil Sibal that no action has been taken against those who made the hate speeches despite registration of FIR by Uttarakhand Police.

"I have moved this PIL in respect of what happened in Dharam Sansad in Haridwar on December 17 and 19 (last year). We are living in difficult times where slogan in country has changed from 'Satyamev Jayate' to 'Shastramev Jayate',"



The FIR has been filed but no arrests have been made, the senior lawyer had said, adding that no action would be possible without the intervention of this court.

The bench had said that it would take up the matter for hearing.

The plea, which specifically referred to the "hate speeches" delivered between the "17th & 19th of December 2021 at Haridwar and Delhi", has also sought compliance of apex court's guidelines to deal with such speeches.

One event was organised in Haridwar by Yati Narsinghanand and the other in Delhi by 'Hindu Yuva Vahini' allegedly "calling for genocide of members" of a community, it said.

The Uttarakhand Police filed the FIR on December 23 under various provisions of the Indian Penal Code against some persons including Sant Dharamdas Maharaj, Sadhvi Annapoorna alias Pooja Shakun Pandey, Yati Narsinghanand and Sagar Sindhu Maharaj.

A similar complaint was filed with the Delhi Police for the second event organised in the national capital.

The plea said that no effective steps have been taken by Uttarakhand and Delhi police.

Till date no FIR has been lodged by the Delhi Police despite calls for ethnic cleansing at the event organised here, it said.

Besides this petition, another plea has also been filed in the apex court by the Jamiat Ulama-i-Hind to ban anti-Muslim speeches and programmes like the 'Dharma Sansad'.

The petition has demanded stern legal action against those who allegedly threat-ened to massacre Muslims and said it was not just a matter of religion but of the Constitution, law, unity and integrity of the country.

Nagaland Firing: Govt Asked To Make SIT **Probe Report Public**

Kohima: Naga civil society organisations on Tuesday demanded that the Nagaland government make public the findings of the Special Investigation Team (SIT) set up by it to probe into the killing of 14 civilians by security forces in Mon district last month.

Following the killing of 14 civilians by army para-commandos in Oting area in a botched up operation and its aftermath, the state government set up the SIT and asked it to submit its report within 30 days that ended on January 5.

A section of the Nagaland media on Tuesday reported that the SIT has submitted a preliminary report to the government.

Police sources said that enquiry of the personnel of 21 para-commandos stationed at Jorhat in Assam was done only on December 30 while investigations into some other issues are also in progress.

These are the reasons the final report is yet to be submitted, the sources said.

Global Naga Forum (GNF), an organisation that works for the rights of the Naga people, said the state government is yet to make the preliminary report public.

GNF Convenor Ozukum said the findings of the SIT should be made public for all to understand the reality.

Naga Students' Federation, an influential body of Naga students and youths in Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur and Nagaland, also said the report should be in public domain. A Dimapur-based organisa-

tion of the Konyak tribe also raised the same demand. Thirteen of the 14 people killed by army personnel on December 4 and 5 belonged to the Konyak tribe, one of the ma-

jor tribes of Nagaland. They were killed in three consecutive episodes of firing by security forces, the first of which has been claimed to be a case of

mistaken identity. Union Home Minister Amit Shah had told the Lok Sabha that the army had received information on the movement of insurgents in Mon and '21 Para Commando' unit had laid an ambush. A vehicle was signalled to stop but it tried to speed away. Suspecting the presence of insurgents in the vehicle, the security personnel opened fire, leading to the death of six of its eight occupants, Shah said.

Regretting the death of the civilians, he had said security forces fired in self-defence.

Eight others, including an army man, were killed in subsequent clashes between the force and villagers.

Seeking Money For Construction Of House Is 'Dowry Demand': SC

NEW DELHI: Seeking money for construction of a house is a 'dowry demand' which attracts offence under Section 304B of the Indian Penal Code, the Supreme Court said on Tuesday while restoring conviction and sentence of a man and his father in a dowry death case.

A bench headed by Chief Justice N V Ramana said Section 304-B was inserted in the IPC to combat the social evil of dowry demand that has reached alarming proportions.

It cannot be argued that in case of an ambiguity in the language used in the provision, the same ought to be construed strictly as that would amount to defeating the very object of the provision, it said.

"In the light of the provision (Dowry Act) that defines the word 'dowry' and takes in its ambit any kind of property or valuable security, in our opinion, the High Court fell into an error by holding that the demand of money for construction of a house cannot be treated as a dowry demand," the bench, also



comprising Justices A S Bopanna and Hima Kohli, said.

The apex court said interpretation of a provision of law that will defeat the very intention of the legislature must be shunned in favour of an interpretation that will promote the object sought to be achieved through the legislation meant to uproot a social evil like dowry demand.

"In this context the word 'Dowry' ought to be ascribed an expansive meaning so as to encompass any demand made on a woman, whether in respect of a property or a valuable security

of any nature.

"When dealing with cases under Section 304-B IPC, a provision legislated to act as a deterrent in the society and curb the heinous crime of dowry demands, the shift in the approach of the courts ought to be from strict to liberal, from constricted to dilated," the bench said.

It said that any rigid meaning would tend to bring to naught, the real object of the provision.

"Therefore, a push in the right direction is required to accomplish the task of eradicating this evil which has become deeply entrenched in our society," it said. The top court was hearing an

appeal filed by Madhya Pradesh government against the High Court judement which set aside conviction and sentence against husband. father-in-law of a woman, who committed suicide at her matrimonial home, under Sections 304-B (dowry death) and 306 (abetment to suicide) of the Indian Penal Code.

The apex court said that taking into account the evidence brought on record by the prosecution, it has no hesitation in holding that the analysis of the trial Court was correct and the respondents deserved to be convicted under Sections 304-B and 498-A IPC.

"Accordingly, the judgment of conviction and sentence passed by the trial Court in respect of both the respondents under Section 304-B and Section 498-A IPC, is restored. However, the sentence imposed on them by the trial Court of RI for life is reduced to RI for seven years, which is the minimum sentence prescribed for an offence under Section 304-B IPC," the bench

Stressing that the police personnel should be sensitized about adhering to Covid Appropriate Behaviour (CAB), the IGP, as per the spokesperson directed the officers to ensure that the police personnel who are the frontline workers be provided with Covid-19 booster dose in view of surge in Covid cases & the existing infrastructure including isolation wards etc be got activated to meet any eventuality.

Kumar, he said, also directed the officers to intensify the war against drug peddlers and root out the menace of drugs from the society saying that this menace is spoiling the career of youth.

"He also directed them to personally supervise the probe into the narcotics cases to improve the conviction rate. Besides, he also directed the officers to build up strong police-public relationship at all police levels and conduct regular interactive meetings with general public as such meetings will strengthen the police-public in-

terface," he said. Expressing concern over the incidents of theft of copper wire along the railway track meant for electrical trains, the IGP, as per the police spokesperson directed the concerned district SSsP in whose jurisdiction the railway track passes to take all possible measures to prevent such thefts as also to identify the culprits involved in the crime.

"The officers were also directed by the IGP Kashmir to ensure timely help to those who require any assistance in view of inclement weather conditions and the special help-lines so established shall remain functional 24x7 with dedicated manpower," the police spokesperson added.

New Zealand Beats Bangladesh By An Innings To Tie Series



CHRISTCHURCH: A courageous century by wicketkeeper Liton Das made Bangladesh a hard nut to crack but New Zealand finally broke through on Tuesday to win the second cricket Test by an innings and 117 runs to tie the two-match series.

Das batted almost one-handed for much of his innings after being struck on the glove. He weathered a barrage of short-pitched bowling from New Zealand to post his second Test century from only 106 balls.

Bangladesh rallied around his resilient example to force a match which many thought would be over quickly on Tuesday into the final session of the third day before the last wicket fell 20 minutes from scheduled

Das finally was out for 102 and the end came swiftly afterwards with Bangladesh losing its last wickets in dimming light at Hagley Oval. When the ninth wicket fell the crowd began baying for the veteran batsman Ross Taylor who will retire from Test cricket after his 112th Test to be given a chance to bowl.

captain Tom Latham bowed to the crowd's demand and Taylor's third ball of gentle off breaks brought a false shot from Ebadot Hossain who skied the ball to Latham. That brought the curtain down on Taylor's 15-year Test career in the most unusual fashion and to the reverberating cheers of the crowd.
