SRINAGAR: Two local militants were killed in an overnight gunfight with government forces in Awantipora area of South Kashmir's Pulwama district, police said Tuesday.

5:30 Around pm Wednesday, police, army's 42 RR and the personnel of CRPF launched a cordon and search operation in Rajpora village of Awantipora after receiving specific input about the presence of militants, a police spokesperson said.

During the search op-eration, he said, as the joint search party approached towards the suspected spot, the hiding militants fired indiscriminately upon the joint search party leading to an encounter.

In the ensuing encounter, the spokesperson said two local militants of

Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) were killed and their bodies were retrieved from the site of encounter.

He identified them as Shahid Ahmad Rather of Tral linked with JeM and Umar Yousuf of Tukro, Shopian linked with LeT.

As per police records, the spokesperson said both the killed militants were categorized and part of groups involved in several cases including attacks on Police and security forces and "civilian atrocities".

Besides other "terror crimes", Rather, he said, was involved in killing of a woman Shakeela of Aripal and a government employee Javaid Ahmad of Lurgam Tral.

China's Population Is About To Shrink For The First Time Since The Great Famine

The world's biggest nation is about to shrink. China accounts for more than one sixth of the world's population.

Yet after four extraordinary decades in which China's population has swelled from 660 million to 1.4 billion, its population is on track to turn down this year, for the first time since the great famine of 1959-1961.

According to the latest figures from China's National Bureau of Statistics, China's population grew from 1.41212 billion to just 1.41260 billion in 2021 a record low increase of just 480,000, a mere fraction of the annual growth of eight million or so common a decade ago.

While a reluctance to have children in the face of strict anti-CO-VID measures might have contributed to the slowdown in births, it has been coming for years. China's total fertility rate (births per woman) was 2.6 in the late 1980s well above the 2.1 needed to replace deaths.

Ît has been between 1.6 and 1.7 since 1994, and slipped to 1.3 in 2020 and just 1.15 in 2021.

By way of comparison, in Australia and the United States the total fertility rate is 1.6 births per woman. In ageing Japan it is 1.3. This has happened despite China abandoning its one-child policy in 2016 and introducing a three-child policy, backed by tax and other incentives, last year.

Theories differ about why Chinese women remain reluctant to have children in the face of state incentives. One involves having become used to small families, another

involves the rising cost of living, another involves increasing marriage age, which delay births and the dampens the desire to have children.

In addition, China has fewer women of child-bearing age than might be expected.

Limited to having only one child since 1980, many couples opted for a boy, lifting the sex at birth ratio from 106 boys for every 100 girls (the ratio in most of the rest of the world) to 120, and in some provinces to 130.

pected the population to peak in 2029, at 1.44 billion. The 2019 United Nations Population Prospects report expected the

peak later still, in 2031-32, at 1.46 billion. The Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences team predicts an annual

average decline of 1.1% after 2021. pushing China's population down to 587 million in 2100, less than half of what it is today.

The reasonable assumptions behind that prediction are that China's total fertility rate slips from 1.15 to 1.1 between now and 2030, and remains there until 2100.

The rapid decline will have a profound impact on China's economy. China's working-age population peaked in 2014 and is projected to shrink to less than one third of that peak by 2100.

China's elderly population (aged 65 and above) is expected to continue to climb for most of that time, passing China's working-age population near 2080. Older, and much less young

This means that while there are currently 100 working-age people available to support every 20 elderly people, by 2100, 100 working-age Chinese will have to support as many as 120 elderly Chinese.

The annual average decline of 1.73% in China's working-age population sets the scene for much lower economic growth, unless productivity advances rapidly. Higher labour costs, driven by the rapidly shrinking labour force, are set to push low-margin, labourintensive manufacturing out of China to labour-abundant countries such as Vietnam, Bangladesh and India.

Already manufacturing labour costs in China are twice as high as in Vietnam.

More caring, less manufacturing At the same time, China will be required to direct more of its productive resources to provision of health, medical and aged-care services to meet the demands of an increasingly elderly population. Modelling by the Centre of Policy Studies at Victoria University suggests that without changes to China's pension system, its pen-

sion payments will grow five-fold from 4% of GDP in 2020 to 20% of GDP in 2100. For resource-exporting nations

such as Australia, these changes are likely to require a reorientation of exports towards manufacturers outside China.

For importers of goods including the United States, the source of goods is set to gradually shift towards new and emerging centres of manufacturing.

Despite forecasts that this will be the Chinese century, these population projections suggest influence might move elsewhere including to neighbouring India, whose population is expected to overtake China within this coming decade



Owing to privacy concerns, Google will give users an option in settings to opt out of the personalised speech recognition if they don't want their voice to be stored. The virtual assistant software application can now also warn users when they need to change their password, and can even help them change it.

The company had said the new experience would roll out gradually, but it is only about now that more than a handful of users have started to get it on their devices

Srinagar: A school-based cross sectional survey on Prevalence of cigarette smoking among adolescent boys in Srinagar has found that 23 percent of school going adolescents are smokers in the capital city of Jammu and Kashmir.

The first such survey conducted by the Department of Community Medicine Government Medical College Srinagar was published in the first issue of Journal of Integrative Medicine and Public Health (JIMPH) and was made available today.

As per the survey, the school based cross sectional study was conducted from June 2015 to March 2017 in 20 high schools selected randomly from public and private sectors.

"Male students from grade 9-12, in the age limit of 13-19 were included in the study. Data were collected by self-administered questionnaire that is adapted from global youth tobacco survey questionnaire. Bivariate and multivari-

Cyber Police Arrests Notorious Fraudster From New Delhi

Srinagar: Cyber Police Kashmir, on Tuesday said it arrested a Srinagar based notorious con-man involved in dozens of online cheating and fraud cases.

"A team of Cyber Police Kashmir apprehended Haroon Fayaz Bazaz son of Fayaz Ahmad Bazaz resident of Alamgari Bazaar, Srinagar from New Delhi".

"The accused has duped dozens of people on the pretext of selling online clothes and cheap airline tickets, and he was mainly operating from Delhi and Goa", Police in a statement said.

Cyber Police Kashmir received a complaint from Ishfaq Ahmad son of Gh. Mohd Bhat resident of Bandipora on 25-09-2021.

"While using social media site Facebook, he saw a post uploaded by one Facebook user having a Facebook page 'Craft Core Exports' dealing with winter clothes collection". He contacted the said Facebook user on his given mobile number, who introduced himself as wholesale dealer of clothes, presently running a shop in the name of Haroon Bazaz & Co, located at 8/21 Jangpur Extension, South Delhi. The complainant ordered some clothes and electronic items online from him, for which he transferred a staggering amount of Rs 3, 61,000 into the accused's bank account. After that, the said Facebook user



switched off his phone. Later on, the complainant came to know that the said Facebook user is a notorious fraudster who is impersonating himself as a businessman on social media platforms for the purpose of defrauding innocent people of their hard earned money.

On the receipt of this information, case FIR no 25/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered and investigation taken up.

During investigation, this Police Station came to know that this online fraudster has not only duped the complainant but dozens of other people in Kashmir valley on the pretext of cheap airline ticket fraud.

"The Modus Operandi of the accused was to create fake Social Media profiles to impersonate authentic travel agencies and then post advertisements for cheap air tickets with the best offer"

'People, in an urgency to trayel by Air, search low price travel tickets on social media sites and upon click-baiting to the accused's site, they would get trapped in this fraud"

Cyber Police said gullible customers shared personal details and made online payments to the fraudster's bank account. After paying money online, the said fraudster would not provide tickets to customers and when customers called him, his mobile number would be switched off siphoning off the money of gullible citizens.

Almost a dozen complaints of such nature were received from different persons.

Another case FIR no. 27/2022 under relevant sections was registered by Police Station Cyber.



UN's Afghan report

United Nations report has said that a change in the name of the Al-Qaeda in the Indian Subcontinent (AQIS) magazine "suggests a refocusing" of the terror group from Afghanistan to Kashmir. The 13th report of the Analytical Support and Sanctions Monitoring Team discusses the Taliban and other associated individuals and entities constituting a threat to the peace, stability and security of Afghanistan was released on Saturday. The AQIS, the report said, has 180 to 400 fighters and they are from Bangladesh, India, Myanmar and Pakistan and are located in Ghazni, Helmand, Kandahar, Nimruz, Paktika and Zabul Provinces. But the global jihadi group AQIS is said to have for now been forced to adopt a less aggressive posture due to financial constraints. But the report warns that as with Al-Qaeda core, new circumstances in Afghanistan may allow the group to reorganise itself. The 2020 name change of the AQIS magazine from 'Nawa-i Afghan Jihad' to 'Nawa-e-Gazwah-e-Hind' suggests a shift away from Afghanistan to Kashmir. Similarly, Jaish-e-Mohammed and Lashkar-e-Taiba, the report says, are said to maintain their training camps in some provinces of Afghanistan and some of them are directly under the Taliban control.

In fact, the fears of militants turning their attention towards Kashmir grew in the wake of the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan in August 2021. This despite the fact that the Taliban spokesman Zabihullah Mujahid had last year assured that the group won't allow Afghan soil to be used against any other country. But such reassurances have far from satisfied the security agencies in India. There have also been noises to the effect among the militant groups that the waning militancy in Kashmir be revived. Al Qaeda in its statement following the Taliban victory had called for "liberation" of Kashmir.

There is no telling as yet how the shift in the regional situation would impact Kashmir. Over the last two and a half years, Kashmir has witnessed a relative decline not only in militancy but also in the influx of Pakistani militants. Pakistan, under what is believed to be pressure from the FATF has cracked down on the leaders of Kashmir centric militant groups like Lashkar and Jaishe-Mohammad Lashkar leaders like Hafiz Saeed and Za ki-ur-Rahman Lakhvi have been jailed. Similarly Jaish chief Masood Azhar and Hizbul Mujahideen supremo Syed Salahuddin have largely become conspicuous by their absence from the scene, more so, the former. Would things change now? The opinion among security experts remains split over the possibility of this happening. But if this happens, it would confront security agencies in Kashmir with a renewed Kashmir challenge. As of now, everything is in the realm of speculation. The common refrain in Kashmir among the experts in the country is to wait and watch. However, recent spurt in violence across the Valley doesn't bode well for the near future.

THACA – Food shortages are beginning to cast a shadow over the world. One longterm factor is the warming of our planet, which has slowly destroyed agricultural land. But the proximate cause of greatest concern is the war in Ukraine and Russian President Vladimir Putin's Black Sea blockade, which is preventing Ukrainian grain and fertilizers from leaving the port of Odessa.

This is an extremely urgent problem, and policymakers are rightly scrambling to solve it. But there is also a generic problem, beyond the immediate emergency, that needs to be understood if we are to overcome the current food crisis. It arises from our failure to keep pace with the march of economic globalization by implementing global policy and conventions

Since late 2019, the world has been in relentless crisis mode as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, supply-chain disruptions, and now Putin's war of aggression against Ukraine. This train of crises has naturally left all concerned citizens rushing to put out one fire after another. But, if we spend all our resources fighting fires, we will probably fail to produce innovative flame-resistant institutions. In this spirit, I want to step back from our immediate concerns, grave as they are, to address their underlying causes. Some of these causes are

individuals. When global policy coordination is poor, the natural reaction to news of some shortage is to hoard supplies. We know this from studies such as Amartva Sen's classic work on the 1943 Bengal Famine, and we see it happening now

While Ukraine has halted its wheat exports because it had no option, other countries have chosen to stop or curtail shipments. India, for example, announced a virtual ban on wheat exports on May 14. And it is not alone; 26 countries have limited their wheat exports to ensure that they have sufficient supplies for their own citizens. All this is causing global wheat prices to rise precipitously. India's announcement alone triggered a 6% price increase

A similar phenomenon occurs at the household level. Once fear of shortages sets in, people stock up on more food than they immediately need in order to guard against a full-blown crisis. Yet, these small actions by millions of people, along with local and national government policies, can end up causing just that.

This is not unique to food. We have seen the same thing happen with vaccines: Countries acquire far more doses than they need in order to guard against the possibility of a future shortage. Such

had confidence that this system worked, and that in itself would help avert a crisis.

If this sounds like wishful thinking, consider what happened in India, a country with a history of food shortages and hoarding. Longstanding efforts to establish a national public food distribution system resulted in a major improvement in 1992 and culminated in the 2013 National Food Security Act. With a sophisticated system of minimal food guarantees in place for three decades, the psychology of hoarding at the household level has diminished, which in turn has diminished the need to hoard.

Fireproof

s metaphors go, a fireproof book is a bit on the nose. But then, in an age of censorship, consigning ideas to the flame (both literally and metaphorically) and scoring political points at the expense of artists, perhaps the sacrifice of subtlety was much needed. Nobel Laureate Margaret Atwood announced the release of an "unburnable" edition of arguably her most famous novel, The Handmaid's Tale (1985), over a YouTube video on May 23.

The Handmaid's Tale, set in a right-wing dystopia where women are used as breeding machines, paints a picture of a world where people do not have rights to their own bodies and sexuality. It has become topical once more with the challenge to women's right to choice in the US. Unfortunately and unsurprisingly, the book has been burnt, banned from school libraries in the US and beyond and protested against at various points. According to the publisher, Penguin Random House, the fireproof book is "designed to protect this vital story and stand as a powerful symbol against censorship"

There is a particular irony in the burning of books, the censorship of thought and the fear of slogans. Ideas, as the anarchist V remarked (in V for Vendetta), are bulletproof. Yet, they are not invincible. Their kryptonite is a counterargument, a well-thought-out riposte, an act of engaged criticism. But those that most vehemently oppose certain people and books usually do not engage with either. Burning a book does nothing — it is a wanton act of destruction. Reading a book expands your horizons, even if it says something that is deeply offensive to your sensibilities. A fireproof book, then, is an act of advanced semiotics, a message to those who believe that violence and censorship are acceptable ways to oppose those you disagree with. Another irony: This metaphor is likely to be one more idea book burners refuse to engage with.

clearly visible, starting with the Russian blockade around Ukraine. Until 2021, Ukraine exported roughly 17 million tons of wheat annually, or 8.5% of the world's total. But it is not immediately clear why this should lead to such a big increase in wheat prices, and to the dangers of global food shortages and famine that we are seeing today. After all, most countries have some buffer stocks and should be able to absorb this shock.

The answer lies in the behavioral response of national and local governments and even of hoarding explains some of the glaring global inequities in access to COVID-19 vaccines.

If such responses were inevitable, we would have to treat them like the law of gravity, which is not something we can do anything about. But there is much we can do through collective action to overcome shortages that the market cannot fix. A system of global buffers or an international agreement that countries with a surplus must help others during times of scarcity would go a long way toward solving much of the problem. Just like the introduction of deposit insurance put an end to bank runs, most people would stop hoarding once they

to establish minimal global conventions and agreements to prevent it from trampling the most vulnerable.

NITI Aayog is taking steps in this direction in collaboration with the country's Institute of Economic Development and the Public Health Organization of India. In fact, Indian food has traditionally been a trend of namkeen, chips, bhujia, etc., but in recent years, in the name of snacks, there has been an increase in the popularity of such foods which are injurious to health. It should be a matter of our concern that according to the National Family Health Survey, the number of women suffering from obesity in the country has gone up to 24 percent, while the figure for men is 22.9%. In such a situation, the need of the hour should be said that the government should take steps in this direction. Undoubtedly, obesity is the root of all diseases and the Indian medical system feels the pressure due

to the diseases caused by it.

Actually, due to change in urban lifestyle and eating habits, the problem of obesity has become worrying. Talks continued about this problem, but no serious initiative was seen in this direction. Due to the market gimmicks, the use of junk food and packaged food items increased in the country. In this, the producers searched the market but did not care about the health of the common man. The irony was also that there was mention of factors that increase obesity, but serious efforts were not seen to stop them. The steps taken to stop them were only symbolic. The market is full of such foods which are tempting in taste, but are heavy on health. They have a long-term harmful effect on health, due to which obesity increases and under its guise serious diseases ranging from diabetes to heart disease start growing. Which over time takes a frightening form due to neglect. Undoubtedly, the need

of the hour is to strictly regulate the factors causing obesity. People should know that what they are consuming affects their health. In fact, due to the change in eating habits, the problem of obesity in developed countries has started spreading rapidly in India too. In India, such a problem assumes a formidable form because people are not conscious in time. We have failed to create awareness among the general public about obesity. We do not care when the factors that increase obesity have become a part of our daily life. Also which foods are really fattening. When the body becomes a home of deadly diseases due to such carelessness, the person does not even realize it. But while taxing such food items, keep in mind that the lives of common and poor people are not affected. Smartphone and a finger click are all you need to create a virtual domino effect. After all, a click has no legs to stand on. A single click leads to another. And thereby our fingers are conditioned to share without care. And soon it becomes our second nature.

As per the American Journal of Sociology, a rumour is a tall-tale of explanations of events circulating from person to person and pertaining to an object, event, or issue in public concern.

One must remember that rumours are lies and a lie is no match for the truth. Irrespective of the quantum of rumour, the extent of its spread and the ubiquity of its existence, a lie can never attain the status of truth. Beyond doubt is the supremacy of truth over falsehood, heresy and tell-tales. In the words of Martin Ugwu, "A rumour thrives in the palace of uncertainty but dies in the corridors of truth."

Be it religious, be it ethical; be it scientific, be it humanistic; be it empirical, be it observational- from every single point of view, the act of sharing unconfirmed and unauthentic information is ugly and devastating. It is damaging and destroying. It is devouring and endangering. It is putting calm at risk and order in jeopardy. It deserves contempt and condemnation to say the least.

To add to the existing woes of epidemics, we have the scare of infodemics. Besides the danger of a pathogen, we have the derringer of misinformation. While some do it purposely, to some, it is recreation. While some do it out of intention; to some, it is like invention.

Isolating and sifting rumours from facts can be painful and daunting, but it is necessary. The English humorist, Terry Pratchett wrote in Feet of Clay, "Rumour is information distilled so finely that it can filter through anything. It does not need doors and windows, sometimes it does not need people. It can exist free and wild, running from ear to ear without ever touching lips."

The luring and tempting entice of rumour-mongering and easy access to doing it has resulted in its



widespread and prevalence. William Shakespeare in Henry IV part 2 wrote:

"Rumour is a pipe Blown by surmises, jealousies, conjectures And of so easy and so plain a stop

That the blunt monster with uncounted heads, The still-discordant wavering

multitude, Can play upon it." Rumours cannot and must not be justified. Call it "improvised news" or "stories of perceived importance that lack substantial evidence", a

rumour is not less harmful than a tumour that has the potential of enlargement and growth, the possibility of being carcinogenic and the danger of wreaking havoc and rampage. Rumours travel and have speeds that thrill but kill. In his novel, "the Chalk Man", the British author, C. J. Tudor wrote, "Rumors are like germs. They spread and multiply almost in a breath and before you know it, everyone is contaminated."

History is witness to a plethora of concocted, fabricated, madeup, misquoted and spun tidings that culminated into substantial losses or beyond-repair ramifications. And our recent local history bears witness to several mistakes we have already committed. The rumour of the death of children by polio vaccine in 2016 and other numerous under-researched published articles in newspapers are just the tip of the iceberg. It shows the ugly and deteriorating face of our society. The Indonesian writer, the author of Master of Stupidity, Tobago Beta writes in Betelgeuse Incident, "If humour and rumour are needed more than faith and truth, then it tells me something about the kind of world we live today."

The potential danger of a rumour may be hard to gauge. It may not look ugly and dreadful at the start. But it can debase a person or give rise to myths besides making one believe a widespread falsehood or reject an unpopular truth. In the words of Wiss Auguste, "There's nothing more poisonous to a community than rumours and gossip. They taint the good character of those who effortlessly stand out. They provide mediocre individuals with a means to become relevant. They set in like gangrene and eat away at the sense of decency that differentiates humans from animals."

The importance of being circumspect and meticulous vis-à-vis passing on to others the information we receive is hard to overestimate. It is the responsibility of one and all to inspect, investigate and scrutinize what one hears and shares. It is advisable to remember the words of Ziad Abdelnour, "Rumors are carried by haters, spread by fools, and accepted by idiots."

USERS' PRIVACY Apple expressed security and privacy concerns about allowing apps

could trigger a wave of creative, cheaper apps with more privacy options for users. Every budding developer dreams of creating an app that goes viral and makes lots of money overnight. The Angry Birds game became a worldwide phenomenon within weeks when it launched in 2009 and made US\$10 million (£8 million) in its first year.

But, overall, the numbers make it clear that mobile apps don't guarantee wealth. A 2021 study showed just 0.5% of consumer apps succeed commercially. Developers have to jostle for attention among the almost 3 million apps and games on Google Play and 4.5 million apps and games on the Apple store.

On Apple's iPhone and iPad platforms, the App Store is the only way to distribute apps. Until recently, Apple and Google's stores charged a 30% commission fee. But both halved it for most independent app devel-



opers and small businesses after lawsuits such as in 2020 when video games company Epic Games claimed Apple has an illegal monopoly of the market.

Epic Games lost but Apple was subject to App stores changes that are on hold. Both Epic Games and Apple are appealing. Epic Games has filed a similar case against Google, which is set to go to trial in 2023. App stores set the rules on privacy, security and even what types of apps can be made.

Third-party stores could set different rules which might be more re-

laxed and allow developers to keep more of the money from apps they sell.

YOU HAVE BEEN SHERLOCKED

Independent developers say they are sometimes being "Sherlocked" by Google and Apple. They develop an app, and not long afterwards the platforms embeds the app's features in the operating system itself, killing the developer's product.

FlickType was developed as a third-party keyboard for iPhones and Apple Watches in 2019. Shortly afterwards Apple apparently told the developer that key-

boards for the Apple Watch were not allowed, they announced the feature themselves.

It can take between three and nine months to develop one app and can cost between US\$40,000 and US\$300,000 to build a minimum viable product. Some apps take much longer than this to develop.

In 2021 a group of UK-based developers filed a £1.5 billion collective action suit against Apple over its store fees. The case will be heard in the UK.

The Eur o p e a n C o m m i s s i o n told Apple it had abused its position and distorted competition in the music streaming industry and its restrictions on app developers prevent them telling users about cheaper alternative apps.

For instance, when Apple builds a music app, rivals such as Spotify argue this is unfair. They have to pay 15% or 30% of their revenues to Apple, their rival, which o p - erates the store

platform. Until recently, Apple prevented Spotify from telling users about cheaper options (like by subscribing via the service's website).

A report from the UK's Competition and Markets Authority highlighted concerns that the tech giants are creating barriers to innovation and competition. Their full market study is due to report

back in June 2022. The UK government has pledged to introduce new laws "when parliamen-

The EU's Digital Markets Act could be in force by Spring 2023. The legislation is designed to open up mobile platforms by allowing users to install apps from alternative stores, and ensure app store providers don't favour their own products or services over third-party developers' offerings.

In February 2022 a US senate panel approved a bill that aims to rein in app stores.

It is possible to install apps from other niche stores on Android hardware – such as the F-Droid store for open source apps. But the Play Store is available on almost every Android phone by default, meaning the apps available on it can reach a much larger number of users.

Both Apple and Google's app review processes (which looks at developers' apps before making them available) have been heavily criticised for their lack of transparency, consistency, and general inequality. Independent developers

have no real leverage against international billion-dollar companies.

Google has been criticised for failing to provide meaningful clarification when it remove apps from its store. from other stores on its devices.

App store review processes can try to ensure that apps follow their privacy policies. Most users don't read these however, and apps can already access and share a lot more data than users realise.

Third-party app stores are likely to create a trade-off between user freedom and user safety. Some users may prefer Apple and Google's approach to privacy. Others may prefer a more open experience, where they can install apps from smaller independent developers, who can develop their apps without having to jump through the large app stores' hoops.

The fact is that it's possible to give users this choice - evidence from lawsuits shows that Apple originally planned to support running apps



from outside its app store. The Digital Markets Act might force Apple to reconsider.

The DMA won't deliver results for users and developers unless it is properly implemented. The European Commission itself looks set to become a dedicated regulator for the first time. This will take time though, and the commission will need to grow a team large enough to provide meaningful oversight and enforcement.

around 10:30 am Tuesday, when unidentified militants opened fire from close range at 36-year-old Rajni Bala near the Government High School Gopalpora, where she was posted, a police spokesperson said.

Bala, who received multiple gunshot injuries in the attack, was removed to the district hospital, Kulgam by her colleagues for treatment. However, before the doctors could operate upon her, she succumbed to her injuries.

According to officials, Bala was putting up at Chawalgam village of the district. She is the second non-Muslim government employee to be killed this month.

Earlier on May 12, Rahul Bhat, a clerk at the Tehsil office Chadoora was shot dead by militants.

Last Wednesday, Kashmiri TV actor Amreen Bhat was killed by militants in the same area (Chadoora), while her 10-year-old nephew was injured in the attack.

According to the reports, soon after the attack on Bala, police and army launched a cordon and search operation in the area to nab the attackers. The joint team also questioned villagers about the identity of the assailants.

"Police have registered a case under relevant sections of law and initiated investigation. Officers continue to work to establish the full circumstances of the terror crime and terrorists involved in this gruesome terror crime will be soon identified and neutralized. The whole area has been cordoned off with the help of reinforcement and search in the area is going on," police spokesperson said.

Bala's killing also evoked strong condemnation from political parties and set off protests as well by the Kashmiri Pandit employees recruited under the PM's special package.

"Very sad. This is yet another targeted killing in a long list of recent attacks directed at unarmed civilians. Words of condemnation & condolence ring hollow as do the assurances of the government that they will not rest till situation normalises. May the deceased rest in peace," National Conference vice-president Omar Abdullah tweeter

Militants on Tuesday shot dead Kashmiri Pandit teacher Rajni Bala (36) in the Kulgam district, police said.

Bala sustained injuries when militants fired at her in the Gopalpora area of Kulgam where she was posted as a teacher. She was rushed to a nearby hospital, where doctors declared her dead on arrival, officials had said.

"We will definitely take necessary steps against terrorism. Our battle against terrorism will continue and we are confident that we will be successful," said the external affairs minister.

Before attending the event, Jaishankar, who was on a two-day visit to Vadodara city beginning Monday, visited Police Bhavan and interacted with women police personnel of "She Team"- a special cell to address complaints and distress calls by women.

"Visited Vadodara city Police Bhavan and met the highly motivated She Team. A great example of gender sensitive and socially caring policing" Jaishankar tweeted.

DAK Seeks Ban On Tobacco To Prevent Cancer

SRINAGAR: On world No tobacco day, Doctors Association Kashmir (DAK) on Tuesday has sought complete ban on tobacco products in Kashmir.

"That would prevent people from cancer," said DAK President Dr Nisar ul Hassan.

Dr Hassan said Jammu and Kashmir (JK) has witnessed 39,041 cases of cancer in the last 3 years with lung cancer being most prevalent due to high rates of smoking. International researches have shown that smoking is linked to about 90 percent of lung cancer cases.

After lung cancer, foodpipe, stomach and colon are the other types of cancer that have been found to have high prevalence and smoking is a big factor. "Not only does smoking cause

cancer, but it also increases the risk of dying from heart attack and stroke, the two leading causes of death and disability in the valley," he said.

to unprecedented levels in Kashmir," he added.

The DAK President said JK is emerging as the smoking capital of North India as JK's cigarette consumption is almost double the nationwide prevalence.

According to Global Tobacco Survey (2016-17) 20.8 percent of JK people smoke, against the national average of 10.7 percent. "One reason that is aiding this huge prevalence is because tobacco use, especially cigarette smoking is socially acceptable in Kashmir," he said.

"Another reason for increased rates of smoking is the alarming levels of stress among people in Kashmir," said Dr Nisar.

When people experience stress, they tend to manage the unpleasant feeling by resorting to the use of substances such as tobacco.

"The prime reason for increased use of tobacco in Kashmir is its availability," he said adding cigarettes and other tobacco products are freely available in

"Smoking is a gateway for Kashmir and can be purchased by drug abuse which has reached anyone, whatever the age.


