2 Militants Killed In **Kulgan Encounter: Police**

Srinagar: Two local militants of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) were killed in a firefight with government forces in South Kashmir's Kulgam district on Wednesday, police said.

Yasir Wani of Wangund Kulgam and Raees Manzoor of Chotipora, Shopian were killed in an encounter that erupted after a joint team of police and army's 9RR launched a cordon and search operation in Nowpora, Mir Bazaar area of the district, a police spokesperson said.

As per police records, he said, both the killed militants were categorized and part of groups involved in several crime cases including attacks on Police/SF and "civilian atrocities".

"Incriminating materials, arms & ammunition including 01 AK-47 rifle and 01 Pistol

were recovered from the site of encounter. All the recovered materials have been taken into case records for further investigation," he said.

"In this regard, a case under relevant sections of law has been registered and investigation has been initiated. People are requested to cooperate with Police till the area at encounter site is completely sanitized and cleared of all the explosive materials, if any," he added.

Giving more details of the operation, the spokesperson said that the search operation was launched on the basis of specific input about the presence of militants in the village.

He said during the search operation, as the joint search party approached towards the suspected spot, the hiding militants fired indiscriminately upon the joint search party More on P6




Kulgam Leading District In J&K With Quality Education: Report system-1,2 & 3.

Srinagar: The Department of School Education and Literacy (DoSE and L), Ministry of Education (MoE) on Monday the Performance released Grading Index for Districts (PGI-D) including Jammu & Kashmir for the 2018-19 and 2019-20 chapter.

PGI-D assesses the performance of the school education system at the district level by creating an index for comprehensive analysis. The latest PGI-D reports (2018-19 and 2019-20) provide insight into intra-State comparison of progress of School education.

Both the reports grade the districts into ten grades starting from Highest achievable Grade which is Daksh, meant for Districts scoring more than 90 percent of the total points in that category or overall. The lowest grade in



PGI-D is called Akanshi-3 which is for scores upto 10 percent of the total points.

As per the report, no district in J&K and rest of India has attained highest grade Daksh in both 2019-20 and 2018-19, implying that there is ample scope for the districts to further improve their performance in future years.

However, as per the report, districts in J&K have been arranged in three categories of Prachesta-which is the 5th category of PGI-D grading

The report further noted that under Prachesta 1, J&K has four districts with Kulgam (324 overall score) leading the race of imparting a better education than the rest of Kashmir. Other districts include Ganderbal (314 overall score), Srinagar (313 overall score) and Baramulla (303 overall score).

Besides this, the report added, J&K has 12 districts falling under Prachesta 2. This includes Bandipora(298), Ramban(290), Pulwama(284), Jammu(283), Badgam(280), Kupwara(281), Shopian(2280), Anantnag(277), Kishtwar(259), Kathua (252) and Doda(242).

"J&K has four districts in Prachesta 4 including Rajouri(222), Udhampur(218), Reasi(195) and Poonch (194)," the report noted.

54% People In India Turn To Social **Media For Factual Info: Study**

s many as 54 per cent of people in India turn to social media when looking for factual information, according to a global study by Oxford University Press (OUP). The researchled campaign 'The Matter of Fact' looked at the level of understanding of how truths are identified and sources validated.

Despite concerns around misinformation and false claims, social media users around the world continue to believe that the information they read and share on platforms like Twitter, Instagram, and Facebook is factually correct, with levels of trust highest in emerging economies, the study said.

The findings show that when looking for factual information, 37 per cent turn to social media, rising to 43 per cent of Mexicans and South Africans and 54 per cent of Indians. Britons were less likely to look for facts using social media, with only 16 per cent describing it as a preferred source, compared to nearly three in 10 (29 per cent) Americans.

Overall, most of us rely heavily on Google and other search engines for information, with two thirds (67 per cent) worldwide and 62 per cent in the UK finding facts this way. Threequarters of people are confident information they share from social media is accurate.

In India, as many as 87 per cent of people who share information from social media are confident in its truthfulness, slightly above the global average of three quarters, it said.

The study takes a broad look at how people across the world seek out information and judge its accuracy, drawing on a pool of evidence bolstered by survey data collected from 5,000 people across the UK, the US, South Africa, India, and Mexico.

It found that more than half (52 per cent) said that when it came to distin-

guishing fact from fiction, sites like Facebook, You-Tube, and Instagram play

an important role. At the same time, reliance on books and more traditional means of gathering accurate information has declined. For example, less than a third cited non-fiction books and encyclopeage-bracket turning to the platforms compared to just 12 per cent of over 55s, the study said.

The pandemic does appear to have had an impact on people's perceptions of truth, with around three in four people agreeing that they are now more cautious about the accuracy

channels, and so many answers available at the touch of a button, it's no surprise that our research presents a global picture of confu-

OUP India MD Sumanta Datta said with over 87 per cent of Indians placing their trust and confidence in information circulating



dias as sources when seeking facts.

There were geographical differences in the level of trust people put in social media, with almost 80 per cent of Indian and 60 per cent of Mexican respondents seeing these networks as an important tool for separating fact from fiction, but only 27 per cent taking this view in the UK and 42 per cent in the US, the study said.

People under the age of 55 were more inclined to believe in the accuracy of the material they shared on social media while 35 per cent of people aged 25 to 44 said they were 'very confident' they were sharing only truthful information on social media and only 13 per cent of over 55s felt the same, it found.

Younger people are also more likely to rely on social media as a source of factual information, with over 44 per cent of those in the 25 to 44

of the information they encounter - a figure that climbs to over 80 per cent in India, Mexico, and South Africa, the study said.

Notably, parents from India were much more likely than those elsewhere to use social media and WhatsApp when teaching their children, with around 30 per cent citing these

Speaking about the research, OUP CEO Nigel Portwood said: "With an ever-increasing number of sources to turn to for information, from books to academic texts to digital


on social media, there is a need to understand the potential impact of factual inaccuracies and misinformation.

"We hope to continue to provide and increase access to tools that allow individuals to be more confident to engage in debates and discussions in their pursuit of knowledge. In a country like India, with a large young population, it is imperative to build processes and policies that help raise a well-informed, intelligent, and perceptive future generation," he said.

Pilgrims' Progress

th the annual Amarnath yatra set to begin on June 30, the government is pulling out all stops to ensure a peaceful pilgrimage. The yatra is taking place after a two-year gap due to the Covid-19 pandemic which made it impossible to hold large gatherings. So, the government's effort is to make up for the suspension of the last two years by holding a successful pilgrimage this year. And to this end, the beefing up of security remains a top priority. And rightly so. Holding the yatra in a troubled region like Kashmir remains a major challenge for the administration. Security measures are thus unprecedented. All the peaks leading to the holy cave from Pahalgam and Baltal have been occupied by the security forces to facilitate the yatra. Security forces have set up temporary posts on these peaks. The government is also involving the political class as the Lieutenant General Manoj Sinha's invite to the heads of political parties in the union territory shows.

Over the years, the yatra has gained immense spiritual, economic and political significance. Underlining this, the Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, P K Pole recently said that the yatra is not mere a pilgrimage but a major economic push to J&K's economy. The government, he said, expects Rs 2000 to Rs 3000 crore revenue from 6 to 8 lakh pilgrims, who would visit tourist destinations as well. Each pilgrim, Divisional Commissioner said, stays in Kashmir for a week and spends at least Rs 35000. It is true, thousands of people have come to depend on yatra for their livelihood.

At the same time, the pilgrimage has a huge spiritual significance for Hindu community in J&K and across the country. Muslims in Kashmir Valley have always ensured that pilgrims are treated like their valued guests. The yatris have always been welcomed by the local people. Even during the times of unrest when the Valley was engulfed by the unprecedented protests, the yatra passed off peacefully. When stones and bullets flew around on the streets, the buses carrying pilgrims to the holy cave shrine operated unscathed. Amid the reigning chaos, the people have exhibited concern and empathy for their pilgrim guests and ensured they are spared of the mayhem on the streets. In 2008, when the yatra itself became a subject of controversy after transfer of the 100 acres of land to the Shri Amarnath Shrine Board, bringing hundreds of thousands people out on the streets, the pilgrimage itself went smoothly, even when sometimes the busloads of vatris ran into the agitated gatherings of angry youth. This year also, the yatra, as always, will receive the support of people of the Valley. Here's to a spiritually-enriching, peaceful yatra.

Plastic surgery iven that the country generates more than 25,000

iven that the country generates more than 25,000 tonnes of plastic waste every day — more than 40 per cent of it stays uncollected, often choking sewage networks — the need for measures to restrict the use of this non-degradable synthetic material cannot be overstated. The government has also done the right thing in enforcing the ban in phases. The current strictures apply to relatively low utility items. The real challenge will come when the prohibition is extended to polythene bags under 120 microns in December.

In the past five years, more than 20 states have put in place some form of regulation on plastic use. But by all accounts, their implementation has been patchy at best. The poorly-staffed and feebly-empowered state pollution control boards or cash-strapped municipalities tasked with enforcing the bans have generally not been up to the task. Environment Minister Bhupender Yadav has said that his ministry will set up control rooms to monitor the ban. A better way would be to raise awareness amongst people and take all stakeholders into confidence — the success of Sikkim and Himachal Pradesh, to an extent, testifies to this.

Some food vendors, takeaway restaurants and grocery outfits have begun using biodegradable cutlery and cloth or paper bags. The government claims that a large number of plastic units are making the switch to using packaging alternatives such as cotton, jute, paper and crop stubble waste. However, the alternatives sector does not produce at a scale that will enable businesses all over the country to make the environment-friendly transition. There are more than 22,000

plastic manufacturing units in the country.

It will be some time before enough numbers are brought under the alternative segment to make a tangible difference to the packaging sector's environmental footprint. Industry experts say that the prices of a lot of the current plastic substitutes burden the retailer and the consumer — a kg of fabric bags, for example, cost Rs 80 more compared to plastic bags. The government would, therefore, do well to hand-hold businesses, especially small outfits already strained by the economic fallout of the pandemic, during the transition period. In the long run, it must join hands with industry bodies to facilitate R&D in viable plastic substitutes.

New Global Development Partnerships

Within a week two strong messages have emanated from the two sparring world powers, aimed at controlling the world or realigning the current global order

S President Joe Biden on 26 June and the Chinese President Xi Jinping on 23 June have announced two new global initiatives at BRICS and G7 Summits, respectively.

China v/s US

Last week, in his address on 22nd June at the 25th St. Petersburg International Economic Forum and the next day, on 23 June at BRICS Summit in Beijing, the Chinese President Xi Jinping stressed the need to forge greater synergy amongst countries for greater international development and close the development gap, by pooling resources, platforms and networks of development partnerships.

Noting that the international community is keen to achieve more equitable, sustainable and secure development, Xi said it is important to seize opportunities, meet challenges head-on, and work on the implementation of the 'Global Development Initiative' (GDI) to build a shared future of peace and prosperity. The Chinese president proposed the GDI in his speech to the 76th Session of the UNGA in September last year. The plan charts a course for international development, based on China's goals and priorities.

Meanwhile, at the recent G7 Summit at Schloss Elmau in the Bavarian Alps, Germany, President Biden on 26 June relaunched his initiative to provide infrastructure funds to poor and developing countries only a year after a largely similar scheme was unveiled at the G7 conference in Cornwall last July under the label 'Build Back Better World'.

The fund was relaunched at the start of the G7 in Germany on Sunday as the 'Global Investment and Infrastructure Partnership'. The avowed aim of this initiative is to become an alternative to the Chinese belt and road initiative (BRI) that Beijing has used for more than a decade to expand its economic ties and influence with developing countries.

The partnership aims to generate \$600bn of private and public funds by 2027, with \$200bn over the next five years coming from the US.

Projects cited at the event include a secure sub-sea cable link-

ing Europe and south-east Asia, an industrial MRNA vaccine plant in Senegal, solar projects in Angola, a modular nuclear reactor plant in Romania and a port linking Christmas Island with the rest of the world.

Initiatives Galore

However, up until now, little has been heard of 'Build Back Better World' since last year, while in January the EU launched its own infrastructure fund for developing countries, called the 'Global Gateway', aiming to mobilise 300billion (\$53 billion) in investments between 2021 and 2027.

Initially, EU declared that this fund would work alongside 'Build Back Better World', and not be a rival. The UK, outside the EU, launched its own infrastructure project called the 'Clean Green Initiative'. There are reports that Japan is planning to raise \$65bn over the same period for regional connectivity, though this fund/project has not been christened, yet.

All these various funds, though

The Guardian quoted Jake Sullivan, the US national security adviser and an important member of the project, saying at an event hosted by the Centre for a New American Security last week that the US-initiated partnership will cover global infrastructure, physical health and digital infrastructure and will provide "an alternative to what the Chinese are offering". "We intend for this to be one of the hallmarks of the Biden administration foreign policy over the remainder of his tenure,"

On its part China has criticised the initiative as based on a "zero-sum game approach." The Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson, Wang Wenbin, said the relevant initiative from the US side ignores the desire of all countries for common development and win-win cooperation.

G-7: Next Steps

Also, on the heel of the G7 summit, the NATO summit, to be held in Madrid this week, will for the first time include the top leaders of four Asia-Pacific countries, Japan, South Korea, Australia and New Zealand, and also for the first time, the bloc will identity China in its new strategic concept, a key document on NATO's future security trial and military development will be adopted at the summit.

This underlines India's central role in the new thrust for the Indo-Pacific by the western nations led by the US and if India plays its cards well, it could translate into benefits for the country in both defence and economic & trade areas.

Zero Waste: 7 Rs to Heed

R Rule is inevitable as 5R's of waste management have become now obsolete in sustainable waste management efforts

Large scale Industrialization and an increase in living standards have led to the generation of impressive amounts of waste that, unfortunately, have made considerable environmental degradation through climate change, through their negative impact on fauna and flora and ultimately through their impact on our health. The most devastating effect comes from the generation of solid waste contaminating every ecosystem on the planet. The increasing use of plastics and their accumulation has further contributed to eco-pollution. A large percentage of plastic produced each year is used to make singleuse, disposable packaging items or products which is mostly permanently thrown out within a year. The effect of solid waste is even far more dangerous, acting as a large source of methane, a powerful greenhouse gas, contributing to global climate change. Along with it, if waste is not managed well, then it leads to flooding, air pollution and thereby various health problems such as respiratory ailments, diarrhea and dengue fever.

Despite the need and importance of zero waste in terms of preserving a clean and healthy environment for citizens, waste management has historically suffered from a poor image. Globally it has typically been viewed as dirty work in dirty and dangerous places carried out by people with little or no qualifications for little or no wages, sometimes just for subsistence on discarded materials. This is still a widely held view and sadly a daily reality for poverty stricken families in many under developed parts of the world and too much pronounced in our country. No doubt, by convention, solid waste management is a better choice. But, the idea of management also creates feelings of creating and using more solid waste, which is undesirable. Thus, the process of linear production-consumption-disposal system is now an outdated ideology and hence we should have one-way alternative i.e., "Zero waste management" or "Life with minimal waste".

Thus with change in mindset, times have changed and in many parts of the world, the modern waste industry have laid claims of being one of the most dynamic and fast changing business sectors. The 21st Century has seen a substantial number of initiatives that focus on improvements to the environment, with changes in how we manage our wastes forming a part of firm foundations that are being built to facilitate the sustainable development of society. However here still we have a greater requirement on the

waste sector to operate to higher standards of professionalism and to incorporate best practice and new technologies in all its activities. These changes should reflect society's desire to manage our resources better and to protect the environment, locally as well as globally. So waste management should be now viewed as resource management and a multi-disciplinary subject, incorporating: civil, electrical and mechanical engineering; physical, chemical, biological, environmental and materials sciences; politics; economics; urban and rural planning; media & communications; IT; advertising; marketing; design; technology; transportation; logistics and operational management; business studies; management; and even the creative arts. Resource or waste management has never had a higher public profile, because its complexity is not properly recognized by the society that

continues to under-value its importance to its quality of life. There has never been a better time to consider the importance of education to use to (reserve).

tion to waste (resource) management.
So, when we talk about waste, it literally means the solid wastes that are produced from residential, industrial and commercial sources with the exception of hazardous wastes. Among these, the output of garbage, litter, tailings, debris and other discarded materials of household materials are the large waste groups. The amount of waste produced in the world is growing exponentially, especially in developed countries, where the national gross domestic product (GDP) and waste generation per capita are at high ratio. Thus, there is a growing concern regarding the impacts of commodity production and associated waste materials.

Integrated waste management (IWM) is

thus the need of the hour and as such it has emerged as a holistic approach to managing waste by combining and applying a range of suitable techniques, technologies and management. There is no individual waste management method which is suitable for processing all wastes in a sustainable manner. With the rise in waste generation and processing costs along with a simultaneous dip in available land, the three or even five R's of waste management of past have become now obsolete in sustainable waste management efforts. It has been proposed that, instead of 3R or 5R, 7R rule must be incorporated indicating, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Recover, Rethinking, Renovation, and Regulation so as to arrive at Zero waste target.

Zero waste refers to waste management and planning approaches which emphasize waste prevention and using no extra

product that can generate potential waste. Zero waste focuses more on restructuring production and distribution systems to reduce waste rather than eliminating waste through recycling and reuse. Even if it is not possible to completely eliminate waste due to physical constraints still zero waste provides guiding principles for continually working towards eliminating wastes and there are many successful cases around the world which resulted from the implementation of the zero waste rule. Since the focus of zero waste is on eliminating waste at the outset, it requires heavy involvement primarily from industry and government. In fact, zero waste will not be possible without significant efforts from the industry. Meanwhile, the Government which has the ability to form policies should frame efficient policies and provide subsidies for better product manufacturing, design, sale and the ability to develop and adopt comprehensive waste management strategies that can reduce

New Zealand is one of the first countries to adopt a national goal of achieving zero waste who adopted the New Zealand Waste Strategy policy with the strategy the country was able to make considerable progress. A number of companies are now embracing the zero waste concept including Hewlett-Packard, Kimberly Clark, and The Body Shop. Cradle-to-cradle (C2C) strategies are at focus on designing industrial systems so that materials flow in closed loop cycles; meaning that waste is minimized, and waste products can be recycled and reused. In natural ecosystems, nutrients are cycled through an ecosystem because the waste generated by certain organisms is typically used or consumed by other organisms. This biological nutrient cycling can be mimicked for better waste recycling and reuse. Green engineering is another option of achieving sustainability through science and technology. It can reduce pollution at the source, and minimize the risks faced by humans and the environment when designing new products, materials, processes and systems. Many successful persons are working on promoting the zero waste system through awareness programmes to inspire the whole world on the beautiful concept of zero waste. So practically it is possible to make a world of zero waste, where no human being and no biotic life is prone to risk of harmful impacts of solid waste and plastics. It is the time which we can make for us as well as for our future generations to make a healthy, greener and sustainable planet to

5 Drawbacks To Following Your Passion

fter earning bachelor's degrees in engineering and sociology, I was determined to do what I love. I headed straight to graduate school to investigate the social problems that frightened and fascinated me.

For almost a decade, I told everyone I encountered – students, cousins, baristas at the coffee shop I frequented – that they should do the same. "Follow your passion," I counseled. "You can figure out the employment stuff later."

It wasn't until I began to research this widely accepted career advice that I understood how problematic – and rooted in privilege – it really was.

THE PASSION PRINCIPLE

As a sociologist who examines workforce culture and inequalities, I interviewed college students and professional workers to learn what it really meant to pursue their dreams, which I will refer to here as the passion principle. I was stunned by what I found out about this principle in the research for my book "The Trouble with Passion."

I examined surveys that show the American public has held the passion principle in high regard as a career decision-making priority since the 1980s. And its popularity is even stronger among those facing pandemic-related job instability.

My interviews revealed that proponents of the passion principle found it compelling because they believed that following one's passion can provide workers with both the motivation necessary to work hard and a place to find fulfillment.

Yet, what I found is that following one's passion does not necessarily lead to fulfillment, but is one of the most powerful cultural forces perpetuating overwork. I also found that promoting the pursuit of one's passion helps perpetuate social inequalities due to the fact that not everyone has the same economic resources to allow them to pursue

their passion with ease. What follows are five major pitfalls of the passion principle that I discovered through my research.

1. REINFORCES SOCIAL INEQUALITY

While the passion principle is broadly popular, not everyone has the necessary resources to turn their passion into a stable, good-paying job.

Passion-seekers from wealthy families are better able to wait until a job in their passion comes along without worrying about student loans in the meantime. They are also better situated to take unpaid internships to get their foot in the door while their parents pay their rent or let them live at home.

And they often have access to parents' social networks to help them find jobs. Surveys revealed that working-class and first-generation college graduates, regardless of their career field, are more likely than their wealthier peers to end up in low-paying unskilled jobs when they pursue their passion.

Colleges and universities, workplaces and career counselors who promote the "follow your passion" path for everyone, without leveling the playing field, help perpetuate socioeconomic inequalities among career aspirants.

Thus, those who promote the "follow your passion" path for everyone might be ignoring the fact that not everyone is equally able to find success while following that advice.

2. A THREAT TO WELL-BEINGMy research revealed that p

My research revealed that passion proponents see the pursuit of one's passion as a good way to decide on a career, not only because having work in one's passion might lead to a good job, but because it is believed to lead to a good life. To achieve this, passion-seekers invest much of their own sense of identity in their work.

Yet, the labor force is not structured around the goal of nurturing



our authentic sense of self. Indeed, studies of laid-off workers have illustrated that those who were passionate about their work felt as though they lost a part of their identity when they lost their jobs, along with

their source of income.

When we rely on our jobs to give us a sense of purpose, we place our identities at the mercy of the global economy.

3. PROMOTES EXPLOITATION

It's not just well-off passion-seekers who benefit from the passion principle. Employers of passionate workers do, too. I conducted an experiment to see how potential employers would respond to job applicants who expressed different reasons for being interested in a job.

Not only do potential employers prefer passionate applicants over applicants who wanted the job for other reasons, but employers knowingly exploited this passion: Potential employers showed greater interest in passionate applicants in part because employers believed the applicants would work hard at their jobs without expecting an increase in pay.

4. REINFORCES THE CULTURE OF OVERWORK

In conversations with college students and college-educated workers, I found that a substantial number were willing to sacrifice a good salary, job stability and leisure time to work in a job they love. Nearly half - or 46% - of college-educated workers I surveyed ranked interest or passion for the work as their first priority in a future job. This compared to only 21% who prioritized salary and 15% who prioritized work-family balance. Among those I interviewed, there were those who said they would willingly "eat ramen noodles every night" and "work 90 hours a week" if it meant they could follow their passion.

Although many professionals seek

work in their area of passion precisely because they want to avoid the drudgery of working long hours doing tasks they aren't personally committed to, passion-seeking ironically perpetuates the cultural expectations of overwork. Most passion-seekers I spoke to were willing to work long hours as long as it was work about which they were passionate.

5. DISMISSES LABOR MARKET INEQUALITY

I find that the passion principle isn't just a guide that its followers use to make decisions about their own lives. For many, it also serves as an explanation for workforce inequality. For example, compared to those who don't adhere to the passion principle, proponents were more likely to say women aren't represented well in engineering because they followed their passion elsewhere, rather than acknowledging the deep structural and cultural roots of this underrep-

resentation. In other words, passion principle proponents tend to explain away patterns of labor market inequality as the benign result of individual passion-seeking.

AVOIDING PITFALLS

To avoid these pitfalls, people may want to base their career decisions on more than whether those decisions represent their passion. What do you need from your work in addition to a paycheck? Predictable hours? Enjoyable colleagues? Benefits? A respectful boss?

For those who are already employed in jobs you are passionate about, I encourage you to diversify your portfolio of the ways in which you make meaning – to nurture hobbies, activities, community service and identities that exist wholly outside of work. How can you make time to invest in these other ways to find purpose and satisfaction?

Another factor to consider is whether you are being fairly compensated for the extra passion-fueled efforts you contribute to your job. If you work for a company, does your manager know that you spent weekends reading books on team leadership or mentoring the newest member of your team after hours? We contribute to our own exploitation if we do uncompensated work for our job out of our passion for it.

My research for "The Trouble with Passion" raises sobering questions about standard approaches to mentoring and career advising. Every year, millions of high school and college graduates gear up to enter the labor force full time, and millions more reevaluate their jobs. It is vital that the friends, parents, teachers and career coaches who counsel them begin to question if advising them to pursue their passion is something that could end up doing more harm than good.

Delhi Police Examining Financial Transactions Of Arrested Alt News Co-Founder Zubair

New Delhi: The Delhi Police on Wednesday wrote to multiple banks seeking information about bank account details and other financial transactions of fact-checking website Alt News co-founder Mohammed Zubair who is under police custody over an "objectionable" tweet, officials said.

Zubair was arrested on Monday for allegedly hurting religious sentiments after posting the tweet against a Hindu deity in 2018.

'We are currently focusing on the source of donation and other financial transactions made into the bank accounts associated with Alt News. We have evidence that in the last three months, transaction amounting to Rs 50 lakh was made into one of the accounts. We are further analysing the transactions made from multiple bank accounts," a senior police officer said.

He said Zubair will be taken to Bengaluru on Thursday in connection

"Our team will take Zubair to Bengaluru tomorrow to seize the devices, including the mobile phone and laptop, that might have been used to post the tweet in question, and also to collect other evidence linked to the case." the officer said.

Police had said that the objectionable tweet "led to a Twitter storm with hate speeches which was detrimental to communal harmony".

The officer also said that the mobile phone used by the journalist at present has been formatted and does not have information related to the case.

According to police, Zubair, when asked about the phone he used when he allegedly posted the tweet in question, said he had lost it.

Meanwhile, the anonymous Twitter handle, a complaint from which led to Zubair's arrest, does not exist on the microblogging website anymore, sources in the Delhi Police said.

A Delhi court had on Tuesday extended by four days the custodial in-

During the hearing, Zubair's counsel said that the photo which he had used in the tweet was from a 1983 film by Hrishikesh Mukherjee, Kissi Se Na Kehna, and that the film was not banned.

The court, however, rejected the submission, saying it was of no assistance to the accused at this stage.

The Delhi Police had also told the court that Zubair allegedly used controversial tweets to hurt religious feelings in an effort to get fame".

On June 20, a case against Zubair was registered under sections 153A (promoting enmity between different groups on grounds of religion, race, place of birth, language etc.) and 295A (deliberate and malicious act intended to outrage religious feelings) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC), the DCP said.

However, he was arrested in connection with one of his tweets posted in the year 2018 that had a questionable image with a purpose to deliberately insult the god of a particular religion, he said.

To ensure only bona fide pilgrims are present at the pilgrimage, the SASB has asked all intending pilgrims to carry Aadhaar cards or any other biometric verified document with

Apart from the deployment, drone surveillance and RFID chips are also a part of the three-tier security arrangements for pilgrims.

The peaks leading to the holy cave from both the routes -- Pahalgam and Baltal -- have been covered by the security forces, the officials said.

They said sanitisation of the routes has been carried out and round-theclock vigil is being maintained. The officials said the pilgrimage

would be monitored with the help of CCTVs and drones on both routes. Apart from security, other arrange-

ments have also been in an elaborate

At the Baltal base camp, a 70-bed fully-equipped DRDO hospital has

been set up for quality healthcare services to the pilgrims.

The hospital, funded by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, will have X-ray and ultrasound facilities, general and oxygenated wards, OPD,

ICU, pharmacy and a laboratory.
The health department of the Union Territory administration has also made special arrangements for providing healthcare facilities to the

They have stationed 109 basic life support ambulances and 26 advance life support critical care ambulances at 55 locations en route Baltal and Chandanwari routes from Qazigund for the pilgrims.

The officials said this year, special focus is on cleanliness and the board aims for a "Swachh Amarnath Yatra". Toilets have been provided all along

Talking to Kashmir Observer. Habibullah Reshi(GMO), Nodal Officer Yatra, Kashmir Division said that 250 buses have been deployed for daily operations and rest are kept as reserve. "We've deployed a total of 500 buses for the Amarnath Yatra pilgrims this year. Out of the 500, 250 are kept for daily travel and 250 have been kept as a reserve stock," Habibullah Reshi told Kashmir Observer.

The PGI-D is expected to help the state education departments to identify gaps at the district level and improve their performance in a decentralised manner. The indicator-wise PGI score shows the areas where a district needs to improve. The PGI-D will also reflect the relative performance of all the districts in a uniform scale which encourages them to perform better.

The structure comprises total weightage of 600 points across 83 indicators, which are grouped under six categories which includes outcomes, effective classroom transaction, infrastructure facilities and student's entitlements, school safety and child protection, digital learning and governance

These categories are further divided into 12 domains — Learning Outcomes

and Quality (LO), Access Outcomes Teacher Availability and Professional Development Outcomes (TAPDO), Learning Management (LM), Learning Enrichment Activities (LEA), Infrastructure, Facilities, Student Entitlements (IF and SE), School Safety and Child Protection (SS and CP), Digital Learning (DL), Funds convergence and utilization (FCV), Enhancing CRCs Performance (CRCP), Attendance Monitoring Systems (AMS) and School Leadership Development (SLD).

The PGI-D report has graded 725 districts in 2018-19 and 733 districts in 2019-20 across the States / UTs. In a press release, the Ministry has said that the "PGI-D 2020-21 is presently under compilation. PGI-D 2018-19 and 2019-20 provides insight into intra State comparison of progress of School education".

In the Digital Learning (DL) category along with scores in 2018-19 and 2019-20, 20 districts have shown over 20 percent improvement in score and 43 districts have shown improvement of over 10 percent in score during 2019-20 as compared to 2018-19 resulting in grade level progress.

In the Infrastructure, Facilities, Student Entitlements (IF & SE) along with scores during 2018-19 and 2019-20 category, overall 478 districts made improvement in score during 2019-20 as compared to 2018-19. Out of these 478, 37 districts made over 20 percent improvement in score and 115 districts made an improvement of over 10 percent implying Grade level improvement.

Under the Effective Classroom Transactions during 2018-19 and 2019-20 category, Overall 510 districts made improvement in scores in the category- Effective Classroom Transactions, of which 18 districts made more than 20 percent improvement in scores and 29 districts improved their score by over 10 percent resulting in grade level improvement in 2019-20 as compared to 2018-19.

New Genus Of Treeshrew From Middle Miocene Site Of Ramnagar In J&K Spotted

NEW DELHI: Scientists have spotted fossils of a small mammal resembling squirrels called treeshrew belonging to a new genus and species from Ramnagar in Jammu and Kashmir.

This treeshrew currently represents the oldest record of fossil tupaiids in the Siwaliks, extending their time range by 2.5–4.0 Million Years in the region and can help provide a more precise age estimate for this Ramnagar locality lying in the Udhampur District (UT-Jammu & Kashmir).

Siwalik sediments document the evolution of many mammalian groups from the middle Miocene through Pleistocene including treeshrews, hedgehogs, and other small mammals. Treeshrews, in particular, are very rare elements of the fossil record, with only a few species known throughout the entire Cenozoic era.

Scientists from the Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology (WIHG), an autonomous institute of Department of Science and Technology (DST) found fossils of the new genus and species of treeshrew (known as Sivatupaia ramnagarensis n. gen. n. sp) from the middle Miocene (extends from about 23.03 to 5.333 million years ago) site of Ramnagar in Jammu and Kashmir.

Dietary analyses suggest that the new tupaiid was probably adapted for a less mechanically the repository of Wadia Institute.

challenging or more fruit eating diet compared to other extant and fossil tupaiids. In addition, new hedgehog and rodent specimens have been described from this same fossil locality. The murine rodents are of particular importance, because different species and dental features are wellknown to be time sensitive, as has been documented throughout a continuous, time-controlled Siwalik sequence on the Potwar Plateau of Pakistan. Therefore, the identification of these time sensitive dental features and species in the current collection help to provide a more precise age estimate for this Ramnagar locality as between 12.7-11.6 Million Years.

This work was carried out by Dr. Ramesh Kumar Sehgal (leading author), Dr. Ningthoujam Premjit Singh (corresponding author) and Mr. Abhishek Pratap Singh from Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, Dehradun, India in association with researches from Panjab University Chandigarh (Dr. Rajeev Patnaik); Hunter College of the City University of New York, USA (Dr. Christopher C. Gilbert); University of Southern California, Los Angeles (Dr. Biren A. Patel); Arizona State University, USA (Dr. Christopher J. Campisano); American Museum of Natural History, USA (Dr. Keegan R.
