The doctors who have been terminated include Dr Mudasir Bashir of Batamaloo Srinagar, Dr Muzaffar Mohidin Hakeem of Palhalan Pattan, Dr Shazia Kausar of Rajbagh Srinagar, Dr Ubaid Ali of Chanapora Srinagar, Dr Nowsheen Mir of Hyderpora Srinagar and Dr Imran Khan of Kursoo Rajbagh.

As per order a copy of which lies with the Kashmir Observer, these doctors neither replied to final notice nor reported back for duties except Dr. Ubaid Ali who after completion of course had signed compulsory bond with the Karnataka Government to work there till January 2023, **More on P10**

Govt Orders To Hold Salaries Of Striking KP Employees

Jammu: The Jammu and Kashmir administration has issued orders to stop the salaries of Kashmiri Pandit employees protesting in Kashmir valley for months demanding their relocation to a safer place amid targeted killings of minorities by the militants.

The labour department of Kashmir and additional deputy commissioner, Anantnag, had on Wednesday issued orders to stop the salaries of Kashmiri migrant employees on strike in the valley In his order, Deputy Labour Commissioner (DLC) Kashmir Ahmad Hussain Bhat directed all assistant labour commissioners across districts in the Kashmir valley to stop the salaries of these employees for September. Bhat sought the leave accounts of all the employees of the department and said: "Further, salary for the month of September 2022 should not be drawn in respect of those PM package employees, who have remained absent during the month of September." A similar order has been issued by the ADC Anantnag.

Irate over the orders, striking employees intensified their agitation, which entered 133rd day on Thursday, calling the order a harassment and arm-twisting move to break their agitation.

Amid slogans of 'Bharat Mata Ki Jai', 'We Want Justice', and 'We Want Relocation', hundreds of employees held protests under the banner **More on P10**

Low self-esteem among reasons for body revealing social media posts, says study

ow self esteem are among the reasons why people use body-revealing social media posts, according to a noted psychologist. There is substantial concern about body image misconstructions and their complex psychological influence during the process of content consumption and creation, said Dr Manoj Kumar Sharma, a professor in National Institute of Mental Health And Neuro Sciences (NIMHANS) here.

Sharma, a professor of the department of clinical psychology, service for healthy use of technology at NIMHANS Centre for Well Being, is the corresponding author of a study titled Making the body public: Implications of the new standards of body, which has been published recently in the 'International Journal of Social Psychiatry'. People with low selfesteem due to poor academics and other reasons use such body-revealing social media posts, Dr Sharma, who also heads SHUT (Service for Healthy use of Technology) clinic at NIMHANS, and sexual appeal is the told PTI on Sunday.

One of such social influencers, who used to take selfies and post on the social media used to get depressed whenever she did not get 'approvals' (read likes and com-

pornographic material are perplexing. Millions of viewers eagerly repeat the amateur videos, often carefully done and edited, according to the study.

Watching such videos can exacerbate pre-existing psychological problems such as addiction, social problems, and negative well-being.

When a social media influencer poses for the camera, there is a blatant copy of prominent celebrities through similar costumes, make-up, and mannerisms besides video editing tricks, it said. The content creators tend to acquire a 'famous self' status by enacting a fantasied gesture before the camera. Hence, every social media influencer has elevated themselves

Google Rolls Out Tool To Let People Remove Personal Info Directly In Search

Google has started to roll out a new privacy feature that will allow people to directly make a request to remove Search results that contain their personal information.

Google's "Results about you" tool, announced during its annual developer conference earlier this year, is now rolling out to some users, reports 9to5Google. With this new tool, if you find vour personal information like home address, email address, phone number or any other information on Google Search, flow menu that appears in the top-right corner of each result. The existing 'About this Result' panel opens with a new "Remove result" option appearing at the bottom of your screen, the report mentioned. SMC Fails To **Recruit Drivers For** Garbage-Lifting Vehicles

rinagar: Over 200 garbage lifting smallsize trucks called 'Hooper' are lying untouched for the past six months in the Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) owned yard near Aloochi Bagh area of uptown Srinagar

These trucks had been procured by SMC to lift the solid waste material from the interiors of Srinagar city, but due to the non-availability of drivers, these vehicles have not been used for the required services and are lying where they were parked six months ago.

Insiders at SMC said that authorities are pressurizing the Ward Officers to identify those 'Sweepers' who can drive these vehicles so that they can be used to lift garbage from different wards of Srinagar city.

Sources added that not a single 'Sweeper' has shown a willingness to drive these smallsize trucks so for.

"We are being scolded by top officials in every meeting. I had even identified some 'Sweepers' for the job but they don't possess driving licenses. How can a Ward Officer get driving licenses for these 'Sweepers' when they don't have one and even are not skilled drivers," one of the Ward Officers said on condition of anonymity.

Insiders added that SMC is reluctant to go for a fresh recruitment drive due to insufficient budget. SMC is keen to avail the services of existing employees and for that matter, it is directing ward officers to identify the 'Sweepers' who possess driving licenses and are skilled drivers.

'Majority of the 'Sweepers' deployed in different wards are amateur drivers without any driving license. Still, if any Sweeper knows the driving and possesses the driving license he is reluctant to take up the new job Top officers are shrugging their shoulders and pressurizing ward officers," said an SMC employee Efforts to contact Commissioner SMC, Athar Aamir Khan didn't materialize as he didn't pick up the phone. Waqf Plans Cancer Hospital At Eidgah, Srinagar

Amit Shah likely to lay foundation stone on October 2

Srinagar: The Waqf Board has identified the land for the much-needed cancer hospital in Kashmir at Eidgah area of Srinagar with Chairperson Darkshan Andrabi stating that the foundation stone of the hospital is likely to be laid by Union Home Minister Amit Shah on October 2.

Andrabi said that the cancer hospital was set to come up near Hazrat Sultanul Arifeen (RA) shrine, but the Department of Archaeology didn't allow the construction of a building there

However, she said that a huge chunk of Waqf land, which is near about 650 kanals in Eidgah is available. Cops Accused Of Harbouring Militants

RINAGAR- In an unprecedented operation, army carried out a cordon and search operation at a police station in the central Kashmir district of Budgam yesterday. Administration and police authorities have taken a strong exception to the incident which left the police and central reserve police force (CRPF) personnel shell shocked and gripped in fear

Quoting police, agency reports said troops of 34 Rashtriya Rifles (RR) led by Col T Shashidharan laid siege to the police station at Beerwah at about 6 p.m. yesterday and called out all the policemen and the CRPF personnel from its 197 battalion deployed in a portion there. Six persons lodged in the police lock up at the moment were also brought out.

Accusing the police of harbouring militants in the police station, the army officer told the officials a suspect had entered the premises shortly before. That was why the operation was started, he said. The surprised policemen produced one Ghulam Rasool before him saying he had come to report the theft at his home earlier

Denying that he was the person who had entered the premises earlier, the army officer allegedly threatened the policemen of torching the police station along with the personnel in the event of any untoward incident there. The entire premises including the police station and the family quarters were thor-

oughly searched. The operation lasted one and a half hours. On learning about the incident, the deputy commissioner Budgam, accompanied by the superintendent of police, visited the police station this morning, primarily to mollify the visibly agitated police officials. They assured them of investigation into

the matter and 'appropriate action' against those responsible. Reports said the RR action has generated fear not only among the police and security forces, but among the local people as well. Residents told API the RR personnel had allegedly made their life miserable. Viewed in light of their action against the police and CRPF, they said, one could easily guess what could be the extent of the harassment they caused to the common people.

It may be recalled the RR camp located next to the police station was stormed by the Lashkar-e-Taiba and Jami'at-ul-Mujahideen groups in a pre-dawn sneak attack on 12th of this month killing about a dozen army jawans and injuring several others before getting killed themselves. An API report had put the toll in the incident at 21. The deputy commissioner, Rohit Kansal, said this evening the army had searched some private buildings adjacent to the police station, including a building "being used by the police for various purposes". The police matter had been taken up with the army authorities at the corps headquarters here and they were enquiring into it.

When contacted, the deputy inspector general of police, Srinagar-Budgam range, K Rajender, confirming the incident, told Observer News Service the matter had been taken up with the army authorities at the corps headquarters here and they were enquiring into it.

Protest Death Toll Rises In Iran As Officials Accuse Western Nations Of Meddling

Drotests in Iran have claimed the lives of at least 10 people, as citizens take to the streets for five days to demand answers for the death of 22-year old Mahsa Amini.

The Kurdish woman died in police custody in the hours following her arrest for the alleged improper wearing of the hijab, a mandatory item of clothing for women in the Islamic Republic. Four security officers were

killed overnight on 21 September in different cities; furthermore, at least six civilians have lost their lives during the five days of mobilizations, which began after Amini's funeral. Authorities have denied that

the security forces killed any protesters, suggesting instead they may have been shot by "armed dissidents."

side dozens of other women.

Amini is later seen talking to a female officer before collapsing onto the floor. The footage further shows her being carried away on a stretcher into a waiting ambulance.

On Wednesday, the Director General of Forensic Medicine in Tehran, Mahdi Forosh, confirmed that there were no traces of physical violence or wounds on Amini's head and face, and said "misleading information" had been spread about her.

Speaking with the state-run Tasnim News Agency, Amini's father said his family wants "the perpetrators [to be] questioned in public as to why they did this and to be punished for their actions."

Amjad Amini also denounced those "who seek to exploit the issue of Mahsa's death," saying the family has nothing to do with these groups.

Supreme Court Reserves Verdict On Pleas Against High Court Order Over Hijab Ban

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Thursday reserved its verdict on a batch of petitions challenging the Karnataka High Court judgement refusing to lift the ban on hijab in educational institutions of the state. On March 15, the high court had dismissed petitions filed by a section of Muslim students from

the Government Pre-University Girls College in Udupi seeking



permission to wear hijab inside the classroom, saying it is not a part of the essential religious practice in Islamic faith.

The state government had, by its order of February 5, 2022, banned wearing clothes that disturb equality, integrity, and public order in schools and colleges.

Several pleas have been filed in the top court challenging the high court verdict.

A bench of Justices Hemant Gupta and Sudhanshu Dhulia reserved its verdict in the matter.

According to the Ministry of Information official in the National Salvation Government (NSG) Tawfiq al-Hamiri, these new weapons including surface-to-surface, surface-to-air missiles, and air defense systems – will safeguard the war-torn country from airstrikes by the Saudi-led coalition.

The Yemeni navy also revealed its new arsenal, including the 'Red Sea' high-speed missile, which works with two thermal and radar systems, as well as several advanced warships that have high maneuverability and can perform offensive and defensive missions against fixed or moving targets.

Pakistan's Imran Khan Apologises To Woman Judge Over His Remarks

Islamabad: Pakistan's former prime minister Imran Khan on Thursday apologised before a top court here for his controversial remarks against a female judge and promised that he will not repeat it in the future.

"I am sorry if I have crossed a red line," Khan told a larger bench of the Islamabad High court headed by Chief Justice Athar Minallah and comprising Justices Mohsin Akhtar Kayani, Miangul Hassan Aurangzeb, Tariq Mehmood Jahangiri and Babar Sattar.

The bench was expected to formally indict Khan in contempt proceedings against him for passing controversial remarks against Additional District and Sessions Judge Zeba Chaudhry during a rally here last month.

Khan, who appeared before the court amid tight security, went on to assure the court that "I will not do something like this in the future." The court deferred



contempt proceedings against Khan after he expressed his willingness to apologise to Chaudhry for his controversial remarks.

As the hearing began, the former prime minister and chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party sought permission to put his statement on the record, saying he was barred from speaking at the last hearing.

"I am ready to apologise to the female judge," he told the court. "The court thinks that I have crossed a line. My intention was not to threaten the female judge. If the court says so, I am ready to personally go to the judge and apologise," the 69-year-old crick-

eter-turned-politician said. As he made the plea, Chief Justice Minallah asked if he was ready to visit the female judge to offer an apology then it was enough. "It is your personal decision as to visit the judge in person...If you have realised the mistake and are ready to apologise for

it...that is enough," he remarked. Following Khan's response, the court said that it was "satisfied with the apology rendered by the respondent." Chief Justice Minal-

lah also asked the former premier to submit an "affidavit detailing what you have said" and adjourned the hearing till October 3. During the rally here on August 20, Khan threatened to file cases against top police officials, election commission and political opponents over the treatment meted out to his aide Shahbaz Gill, who was arrested on charges of sedition.

Congress's Gourav Vallabh Slams Shashi Tharoor, Supports Ashok Gehlot As Party Chief

New Delhi: Congress leader Gourav Vallabh today hit out at Shashi Tharoor over his probable AICC president poll bid, saying his "only major contribution" to the party was to send letters to Sonia Gandhi when she was hospitalised.

In a first indicator of leaders taking sides in the upcoming contest for the top post, Mr Vallabh also voiced support for another likely contender, Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot, who seems to have the backing of the current leadership.

"The choice is very simple and clear," said Mr Vallabh on Twitter.

Mr Vallabh is also a party spokesperson but he asserted his comments were as a Congress worker and not spokesperson.

"Like crores of workers, my first wish is that Rahul Gandhi ji should provide his leadership to the Congress and the country. But if Rahul Gandhi ji remains



steadfast on his decision (of not taking up the Congress chief post) and one has to choose between the two names that are appearing in public discussion, then there is no comparison between the two," Mr Vallabh said.

On one hand, there is Ashok Gehlot who has the experience of being a Union minister, three times chief minister, five times MP, five times MLA, and who has defeated PM Modi- Amit Shah in a direct contest and who has had 45 years of "spotless" political life, Mr Vallabh said.

"On the other hand there

is Shashi Tharoor sahib who has only one major contribution to the party in the last 8 years -- sent letters to Congress President Sonia Gandhi ji when she was hospitalized, this act caused pain to crores of party workers like me. The choice is

very simple and clear," he said. Mr Vallabh's remarks were in reference to the letter sent by a group of 23 leaders, including Mr Tharoor, to Sonia Gandhi in 2020 seeking large scale reforms in the party. The race for the Congress president's post hotted up on Wednesday with Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot giving a clear indication that he could enter the poll fray and Shashi Tharoor meeting the party's poll panel chief to enquire about the nomination formalities.

After over two decades, the Congress is set to see a contest for the post of party chief. Ashok Gehlot and Shashi Tharoor are being seen as the likely contenders.

Robbers Uproot ATM in Rajasthan, Steal ₹12 Lakh

Jaipur: Some unidentified persons fled away with an automated teller machine (ATM) having over 12 lakh cash after uprooting it in Rajasthan's Sawai Madhopur, police said on Thursday.

The incident happened on Wednesday night at State Bank of India's ATM in Sarsaunp village, Station House Officer (SHO) Tinu Sogarwal said. The persons fled from the spot with the ATM machine having 12.10 lakh cash, the SHO said.

On the bank management's complaint, a case has been registered at Chauth ka Barwara police station, Sogarwal said.

Kashmir as G20 meetings venue

ammu and Kashmir is reportedly among the possible destinations for the upcoming G-20 meetings, which will set the stage for the group's summit next year in New Delhi. Other possible places are Siliguri, Rann of Kutch and Goa. India will assume the G-20 presidency from December 1, 2022, to November next year. During this period, it will host 215 G-20 meetings over 55 locations, four of which will be focused on promoting the tourism sector. The one that will be held in Jammu and Kashmir is focused on the tourism sector. But the planned meetings in the union territory have drawn a lot of attention. This is despite the fact that Kashmir will no longer be the site of the G20 summit meeting. The administration in Jammu and Kashmir has already started making preparations for the meetings.

Earlier, when New Delhi indicated that the G20 summit itself might be held in Kashmir, there were protests from Pakistan and its ally China. India, in a snub to Beijing, subsequently planned a part of the event in Ladakh too, with Ladakh administration even issuing an order to this effect.

Interestingly, the west has not reacted to India's selection of Kashmir and Ladakh as G20 venues which could be read as a tacit acceptance of India's choice. If that be so, it would be seen as a big diplomatic victory for India. The west reconciling to Kashmir as a G20 venue would mean that it no longer considers the region as an issue.

In June, Jammu and Kashmir administration constituted a five-member committee headed by the Principal Secretary, Housing and Urban Development Department, to coordinate the G-20 meetings that are to be held in the union territory. Harsh Vardhan Shringla, Chief Coordinator of the G-20 Secretariat in the Ministry of External Affairs has already written to chief secretaries of all the states and Union Territories that India's presidency of the G-20 provides a unique opportunity to place "our narrative in the global agenda and to showcase India's development and cultural diversity."

That said, in the recent past, India has sought to portray Kashmir as a Davos-like venue for global events. In December 2020, Union minister Nitin Gadkari said that the union government was planning a hill station, more enchanting than the world-famous Davos in Switzerland, in the picturesque landscape between the 18-km stretch of Zojila tunnel in Ladakh and Z-Morh tunnel in Jammu and Kashmir.

Similarly, the ski-resort of Gulmarg was also called Davos of East. In 2015, the then Chief Minister Mufti Mohammad Sayeed said the government intended to promote Gulmarg in Kashmir as the Davos of India, where the country's top business and policymakers could hold their annual summits to frame new policies and strategies. With possible G20 meetings, such a prospect seems one step closer.

Geopolitics First?

World powers are paralysing the UN and pulverising the planet

he United Nations General Assembly has opened its 77th session amid urgent global challenges, including environmental disasters, economic instability, basic food and fuel shortages, cultural wars and populist nationalism, and intra- and inter-national conflicts. But as the world powers clash and collide over Ukraine (and Taiwan), their geopolitics is undermining the UN agenda and stalling the multilateral cooperation needed to remedy the many planetary crises.

Well over a hundred world leaders have arrived in New York, with two notable absentees – the Russian and Chinese leaders – and two notable attendees – the US and British leaders, who are expected to speak firmly and fervently against the Russian war in Ukraine and in support of the virtually present Ukrainian leader.

All eyes will be on Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, who has been granted special permission to speak to the world's parliament through a video link, just as he did to various national parliaments this year. His army's successful counter-offensive against the Russian aggression in recent weeks will amplify his words as they echo across the UN chamber.

In his speech to the UN last year, Zelenskyy urged world leaders to "wake up" and face the daunting challenges his and other countries are facing, but the world marched into an even bigger, deadlier conflict, eyes wide open. What's to become of this war will have huge ramifications not only for Ukraine, but the world over. And it may fall upon the Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan and French President Emmanuel Macron, who have closely engaged both sides since the Russian invasion, to put forward a proposal on how to end it. Their speeches at the UN may signal the viability of a solution. Many world leaders would like to see the conflict resolved quickly so that the UN may refocus its attention on other urgent issues, including Yemen, Libya, Afghanistan, Syria, Mali and Palestine. The Russian war in Ukraine has already dominated the agenda of the UN Security Council (UNSC) and left no space for other urgent issues that require international attention. While the UNSC has made some progress on the diplomatic or humanitarian fronts in Libya, Yemen and Mali, it has failed miserably in Ukraine, as the world powers continue to use its platform to score points against each other.

As the world powers clash and collide over Ukraine (and Taiwan), their geopolitics is undermining the UN agenda and stalling the multilateral cooperation needed to remedy the many planetary crises by raw power politics, where everything is weaponised" in a fierce battle of narratives. However, to be clear, both Eastern and Western powers are to blame for those geopolitical tensions. Sadly, Western powers have not lived up to their lofty values and the Eastern powers have failed to take their international responsibilities seriously, with both sides hypocritically citing international law and norms only when convenient.

UN Secretary-General António Guterres is also right to say that "the choices we make – or fail to make – today could result in further breakdown and a future of perpetual crises, or a breakthrough to a better, more sustainable, peaceful future for our people and planet." That will depend on the United Nations being united.

Hyperbole aside, we are better off as a human civilisation than we have ever been in terms of quality of life, health, wealth, and life expectancy, as well as education, science, discovery, industry, technology and so on. And we are more capable than ever before of taking on global challenges if the will is there to do so.

But we have utterly failed to take care of the more vulnerable and less fortunate. A million more people have died of COVID-19 unnecessarily so far this year, well after vaccines were developed. And more than 800 million have gone hungry, or 150 million more people than before the pandemic.

Life In The Aftermath

here is some debate about whether the disaster is the initial 'big bang' or the years that follow," the recovery expert Prof Lucy Easthope writes in her recent book When the Dust Settles. "Life after disaster is perpetual, chronic, with a pain that ebbs and flows like tides," with initial events followed by a "new, long, chronic loss". Extreme events rip lives apart. The terrifying force of nature unleashed makes headlines and fills broadcasts with compelling, appalling images: torrents of water, vast lakes where fields once stood. But it is the aftermath which determines the true physical, economic, social and psychological cost.

This weekend, the World Health Organization warned of a "second disaster" as waterborne diseases and other illnesses spread by the disruption soar. The displaced, now living in makeshift camps, face rising levels of dengue fever, malaria and diarrhoea. Beyond that immediate threat lie the challenges of housing and feeding people. In all, 33 million people in Pakistan – equivalent to half the population of the UK – have been affected. Experts say it will take months for the waters to fully drain from Sindh, the hardest-hit province. Agricultural land has been devastated, and huge quantities of livestock lost. Roads and railway lines have been washed away.

Physical and psychological recovery requires more than simply providing building materials and rice, however. Meeting the real needs of the population is impossible unless their knowledge and wishes are sought, welcomed and incorporated. Even well-intentioned reconstruction efforts often go awry: in Banda Aceh, following the Boxing Day tsunami of 2004, universities and factories were built but never used, while women were given sewing machines to start businesses, but not taught to use them. Prof Easthope also notes the importance of preserving communities, so that survivors can support each other and maintain their sense of identity when so much else has been lost.

Visiting Sindh earlier this month, the UN secretary general, António Guterres, said he had never seen such "climate carnage" - and also warned that we can expect many more such disasters. A study by an international team of climate scientists has found that the intense rainfall was made worse by global heating. This year alone, the country had already experienced a gruelling heatwave, wildfires and drought. Climate catastrophes will be disproportionately experienced by developing countries, which have made a minimal contribution to global heating. As Mr Guterres pointed out, that makes massive financial support for Pakistan a matter of justice, not generosity. So far, other governments have pledged only a tiny proportion of the estimated \$30bn needed for recovery in a country already in dire economic straits. They must do better in funding reconstruction - as they must in tackling their carbon emissions, and funding vulnerable countries to prepare for future disasters <u>Guardian</u> Expect more of the same this week, as dozens of world leaders in love with the sound of their own voices turn the "high-level debate" into low-level diatribe, boast of their achievements, or blame others for their failures. Their speeches will contain lofty language and alarmist expressions about the planet's future, but will only pay lip service to remedies, responsibilities and commitments.

And so, Ukraine will continue to harden and deepen the divide between the United States and Europe in the West and Russia and China in the East. With the four comprising some 60 percent of the world economy, and all the veto powers at the UNSC, expect their conflict and collision to sap the energies of the United Nations and paralyse the multilateralism that could help the world to tackle global disasters. They also happen to be the biggest polluters in the world.

The EU foreign policy chief Josep Borrell is correct to say that the Russian war in Ukraine has shown that we live in a world "shaped

Want to Cure Your Perfectionism? Try Self-compassion

"If I'm not perfect, I'm a failure." If I don't aim for perfection, I won't get

anything done or be successful. "I shouldn't commit errors,"

"I ought to be able to foresee issues before they arise."

All of the above negative thoughts are the result of perfectionism, and unpleasant feelings like these can cause anxiety, depression, addictions of various types and kinds, as well as sense of helplessness out of a fear of failing.

WHY IS PERFECTIONISM SUCH A BAD THING?

We know for the fact that there is no such thing as perfect in this imperfect world. Pursuing perfection is like chasing the mirage and hence it may become self-destructive. An unattainable and unrealistic ideal of how we should appear or behave is created in our minds by perfectionism.

As a result, we establish an impossible, continually shifting bar that we are chasing but never able to attain. We judge ourselves as undeserving of that "ideal body," "perfect home," "perfect career," or even "perfect love" because we feel incapable of obtaining it. Thus, even if we do succeed in achieving our goal that we had once set for ourselves, we come to the conclusion that it was unsatisfactory and establish a higher standard. Sometimes, we persuade ourselves that our loved ones will perceive us negatively in one way or the other. We are, in a sense, always on a hamster wheel because we let destructive thoughts of perfection wreck havoc in our lives. We are never able to get to a point of genuine contentment and acceptance because pursuing perfection is a draining, addictive effort.

Even while we might be able to accept and comprehend the faults of others, we are frequently our own harshest critics, unable to accept the same faults in ourselves or mistakes of our own. Perfectionism is a manifestation of shame or the sense of not being good enough. Fortunately, the mental agony that perfectionism causes can be reduced or even completely eliminated by engaging in self-compassion practices.



WHAT IS SELF-COMPASSION?

Being self-compassionate means learning to control your inner dialogue and shifting it from "You'll never be good enough" to "I am enough." It is the process of looking after oneself and speaking to oneself with care and kindness.

WHAT DOES SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH SAY ABOUT SELF-COMPASSION AS A TOOL TO DEAL WITH PERFECTIONISM?

In order to comprehend the effects that self-compassion has on perfectionism and depression, researchers in Australia published a paper in February 2018 based on their study of more than 1,000 children and adults. According to the study's findings, persons who were compassionate toward themselves were able to lower their perfectionism levels, which can result in depression and other undesirable side effects.

Another study showed that high selfcompassion levels reduce the likelihood of depressive symptoms in those with high levels of maladaptive perfectionism. Given that perfectionists are more likely to experience depression, the findings of the study imply that therapies that teach patients to practice self-compassion may enhance treatment outcomes for depression.

HOW DOES SELF-COMPASSION HELP IN HANDLING PERFECTIONISM?

Perfectionism may prevent us from attempting new things because we may be afraid of failing and falling down and hence it may lead to procrastination due to anxiety of not being able to live up to high-standards. When something isn't "perfect," it could also make us feel bad about ourselves. On the other hand, in such vulnerable times, selfcompassion gives us the room we need to grow, break, recover, and rise back again

- It enables us to learn lessons from our past mistakes rather than looking
 - at those mistakes as something we

should be ashamed of.

- Instead of limiting ourselves to what we are confident we can do well or not attempting at all, it enables us to freely explore the possibilities the world has to offer, no matter how vast or tiny.
- Instead of comparing ourselves with others or aiming for impossible standards, it enables us to accept and value everything that makes us who we are.
- Self-compassion enables us to be both attentive and understanding of our flaws, faults, and failures while being non-judgmental of the suffering these things cause us to go through.
- Self-compassion encourages us to discover acceptance and understanding within rather than seeking validation and approval from outside sources (such as grades, compliments, and Instagram, Facebook etc. likes and followers).
- ► It permits us to be human.

HOW TO CULTIVATE SELF-COMPASSION?

Next time you struggle with thoughts of perfection, practice self-compassion by performing the following actions:

- Maintain your physical health by eating healthy and working out.
- Practice being mindful and simply observe your perfectionism-based thoughts, labeling them as such as soon as you have such thoughts and respond to such thoughts with warmth and tenderness.
- Try journaling the negative events while having a caring attitude and being kind in your description of such unpleasant experiences.
- Decide on a few things you want to excel at. Instead of having a single benchmark for all areas, be flexible in your approach and don't expect to perform at your peak all the time. Make your goals attainable and consider your achievement instead of continuously evaluating yourself and criticizing yourself for falling short of them.
- Keep in mind that you are not alone. There are others who experience perfectionism as well. It's natural to want to please other people and to strive for perfection in an effort to spare oneself the hurt of blame, criticism, and shame.
- Be gentle to yourself. Put your hand over your heart. Allow the warmth and understanding to permeate your body with each beat. Remind yourself that you are completely acceptable with all your imperfections. You are adequate just the way you are.
- Consider what you would say to a friend in a similar circumstance. Can you speak to yourself with the same kindness and support?

You can escape the terrible cage that perfectionism has imprisoned you in by engaging in self-compassion practices.

Sign Language — Connecting Beyond Barriers

On International Day of Sign Languages

anguage is the ability to acquire and use complex systems of communication. It is thought to have originated when early humans started gradually changing their early communication systems. The structures of language have evolved to serve specific communicative and social functions. Language is not the creation of one person or of one period but it is an institution, on which hundreds of generations and countless individuals have worked on. Language is thought to have originated 10,000 BC. Language is a vital part of human connection. Although all species have their ways of communicating, humans are the only ones that have mastered cognitive language communication. Language allows us to share our ideas, thoughts, and feelings with others. It has the power to build societies, but also tear them down. Language is any formal system of gestures, signs, sounds, and symbols used or conceived as a means of communicating thought. There are over six thousand language schemes currently in use around the world. The language spoken by the greatest number of people on the planet is Mandarin; other widely spoken languages are English, Spanish, and Arabic.

Language is what makes us human. It is how people communicate. By learning a language, it means you have mastered a complex system of words, structure, and grammar to effectively communicate with others. Language helps us express our feelings and thoughts – this is unique to our species because it is a way to express unique ideas and customs within different cultures and societies. Our language is the most important part of our being. It's important to learn other languages besides our own because it helps us to learn about other peoples and cultures but the most important one that we can learn is our own mother tongue as this is one of the most basic parts of our identity. The act of communicating with our hands has always preceded formal language. When

we're babies and children, we point and grab to communicate what we want. We'll shake our heads and turn away to signal when we don't want something. In other words, we all use a version of sign language to communicate before we know how to speak.

Hearing loss is the most common sensory deficit in humans today. As per WHO estimates in India, there are approximately 63 million people, who are suffering from Significant Auditory Impairment; this places the estimated prevalence at 6.3% in Indian population. As per NSSO survey, currently there are 300 persons per one lakh population who are suffering from severe to profound hearing loss and of these, a large percentage is children between the ages of 0 to 14 years. With such a large number of hearing impaired voung Indians, it amounts to a severe loss of productivity, both physical and economic. An even larger percentage of our population suffers from milder degrees of hearing loss and unilateral (one sided) hearing loss. Everything from mild hearing loss to complete deafness occurs, and the communication skills needed will depend on the person and the severity of their condition. For mild hearing loss, it may simply be a case of ensuring that you enunciate clearly and slow down your speech slightly to achieve clarity and understanding. With more severe deafness, lip reading and sign language are primary communication tools.

For someone who maintains the condition of deafness and can't hear sound, the use of auditory language to exchange information is a no-way. A large number of the population is disconnected from the mainstream hearing-dominated society and lie at the risk of being marginalised, because people who are limited to using only speech can't communicate with them. A lack of accessibility to support the conversation between both communities also adds to the problem. Because of this, a huge challenge in the form of a communication gap between D/deaf, hard of hearing, and hearing people arises.

To bridge this gap, a non-verbal language known as sign language exists. Every language, whether verbal or non-verbal, has its own elements and functions and differs from each other in how they are used. Even though sign language is another means of communication and also has every basic feature of language, it is still different from spoken language in many ways.

Sign language is defined as a wav to communicate using hand gestures and symbols for words or letters of the alphabet, often used by those who are hard-of-hearing. An example of sign language is the means of communicating used by Helen Keller Sign language, any means of communication through bodily movements, especially of the hands and arms, used when spoken communication is impossible or not desirable. The Practice is probably older than speech. Sign language may be as coarsely expressed as mere grimaces, shrugs, or pointings; or it may employ a delicately nuanced combination of coded manual signals reinforced by facial expression and perhaps augmented by words spelled out in a manual alphabet. Wherever vocal communication is impossible, as between speakers of mutually unintelligible languages or when one or more would-be communicators is deaf, sign language can be used to bridge the gap. Sign language is manual communication commonly used by people who are

deaf. Sign language is not universal; people who are deaf from different countries speak different sign languages. The gestures or symbols in sign language are organized in a linguistic way. Each individual gesture is called a sign.

The question of who invented sign language has sparked much debate and has a vague answer. One of the earliest written references to a sign language is from the fifth century BC, in Plato's Cratylus, where Socrates says: "If we hadn't a voice or a tongue, and wanted to express things to one another, wouldn't we try to make signs by moving our hands, head, and the rest of our body, just as dumb people do at present. The first person credited with the creation of a formal sign language for the hearing impaired was Pedro Ponce de León, a 16thcentury Spanish Benedictine monk. His idea to use sign language was not a completely new idea. In the 1800s, Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet developed American Sign Language (ASL). Inspired by a desire to help his neighbour's deaf daughter, Gallaudet went to Europe to meet with Laurent Clerc, a deaf instructor of sign language. Together they founded the first American school for the deaf and established a sign language unique to the USA.

It was inspired by the French Sign Language, signs from Martha's Vineyard and might have been inspired by the signing system of the Great Plains Native Americans. American Sign Language (ASL) is a complete, natural language that has the same linguistic properties as spoken languages, with grammar that differs from English.

ASL is expressed by movements of the hands and face. It is the primary language of many North Americans who are deaf and hard of hearing and is used by some hearing people as well. Indian Sign Language (ISL) is used in the deaf community all over India. But ISL is not used in deaf schools to teach deaf children. Teacher training programs do not orient teachers towards teaching methods that use ISL. There is no teaching material that incorporates sign language. It was Sibaji Panda, a deaf teacher, who created and introduced the first-ever formal training course in ISL at the Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Speech and Hearing Disabilities (AYJNISHD), in 2001

Some advanced equipment enables a person to remotely control the other person's video camera, in order to zoom in and out or to point the camera better to understand the signing.

It is a unique opportunity to support and protect the linguistic identity and cultural diversity of all deaf people and other sign language users. Deaf communities, governments and civil society organisations maintain their collective efforts - hand in hand - in fostering, promoting and recognising national sign languages as part of their countries' vibrant and diverse linguistic landscapes

Consumption Of Tea May Lower The Risk Of Getting Type 2 Diabetes: Study

oderate use of black, green, or oolong tea is associated with a lower risk of acquiring type 2 diabetes, according to a systematic review and meta-analysis of 19 cohort studies involving more than 1 million adults from eight different countries. The research indicates that having at least four cups of tea per day is linked to a 17% lower risk of type 2 diabetes (T2D) over an average of ten years, according to findings presented at this year's European Association for the Study of Diabetes (EASD) Annual Meeting in Stockholm, Sweden (19-23 September).

According to main author Xiaying Li of Wuhan University of Science and Technology in China, "our results are intriguing because they imply that people can do something as easy as drinking four cups of tea a day to potentially lower their chance of acquiring type 2 diabetes.

Because of the numerous antioxidant, anti-inflammatory, and anticarcinogenic components that tea contains, it has long been known that drinking tea frequently may be healthy, but the link between tea consumption and the risk of T2D has been less obvious. Cohort studies and meta-analyses that have been published so far have presented conflicting results.

To clarify the connection between tea drinking and future T2DM risk, researchers carried out a cohort study and a dose-response meta-analysis. First, they looked at 5,199 participants (2583 men and 2616 women; average age, 42) from the China Health and Nutrition Survey (CHNS), who were enrolled in 1997 and followed up within 2009



and had no prior history of T2D. The CHNS is a multicenter prospective study that examines inhabitants from nine provinces' socioeconomic conditions as well as their physical and mental health.

Participants initially completed a food and drink frequency questionnaire and supplied details on lifestyle choices such regular exercise, smoking, and alcohol use. 2,379 (46%) participants reported drinking tea overall, and 522 (10%) persons had T2D by the conclusion of the trial. Researchers discovered that tea drinkers and non-drinkers had comparable risks of getting type 2 diabetes (T2D) after correcting for vari-

ables such as age, sex, and physical inactivity that are known to be associated with higher risk of T2D. And when patients who got diabetes during the first three years of follow-up were omitted or the results were broken down by age and sex, they did not significantly alter the findings.

The researchers then conducted a systematic evaluation of all cohort studies examining the relationship between tea consumption and the risk of T2D in adults (aged 18 or older) up until September 2021. The dose-response meta-analysis comprised 19 cohort studies totalling 1,076,311 participants from eight different nations.

They investigated the potential effects of various tea consumption patterns (less than one cup per day, one to three cups per day, and four or more cups per day), gender (male and female), and research region (Europe and America, or Asia), on the risk of T2D.

Overall, the meta-analysis discovered a linear relationship between tea consumption and T2D risk, with each daily cup of tea lowering risk by about 1%. Adults who drank 1-3 cups of tea per day had a 4% lower risk of T2D than those who didn't, while those who drank at least 4 cups per day had a 17% lower risk

The relationships were shown regardless of the type of tea people drank, whether they identified as male or female, or where they resided, indicating that the quantity of tea taken may be more important than any other factor in explaining the associations. Our results imply that drinking tea is beneficial in lowering the risk of type 2 diabetes, but only at large levels (at least 4 cups a day), adds Li. However, more research is needed to pinpoint the precise dosage and processes underlying these observations.

She continues, "It is plausible that specific tea constituents, like polyphenols, may lower blood glucose levels, but it may need a significant quantity of these bioactive substances to be effective. It may also be the reason why, despite looking at higher tea intake, we did not discover a link between type 2 diabetes and tea drinking in our cohort analysis.

The same plant that is used to produce green and black teas is also used to manufacture oolong tea, a traditional Chinese beverage. The processing method makes a difference; oolong tea is partially oxidised whereas black tea is permitted to fully oxidise. Green tea is not allowed to oxidise substantially. Despite the significant results, the authors point out that as the research was observational, it cannot conclusively show that tea consumption decreased the incidence of T2D but rather provides evidence that it probably does

The researchers also highlight a number of cautions, such as the fact that they relied on estimates of the amounts of tea consumed that were made subjectively, and that they cannot completely rule out the possibility that residual confounding from other lifestyle and physiological factors may have impacted the findings.

by Alfred Lawrence of the chemistry faculty at the Isabella Thoburn College of the University of Lucknow to assess the health risk among the women and children specifically due to indoor air pollution.

The findings of the research presented recently at an international conference at the University College of Stockholm, Sweden, found headache as the most common symptom as reported by 60 per cent women, while in children it was stuffy nose as reported by 62 per cent.

The participants included 560 women from three microenvironments.

While 434 (77. 5 per cent) women were from planned residential areas, 107 (19.1 per cent) were from the industrial belt of the city, whereas 19 (3.4 per cent) were from the commercial belt of the city.

The study was done using a real-time portable air sampler that was placed in the living area to study the variation pattern and was placed at least two metre away from doors and walls of the room

It found the concentration of PM 2.5 pollutants indoor to be almost six times higher than the WHO standards.

Research scholar Samridhi Dwivedi said the study also found 51.1 per cent of women consciously unaware of household air pollution. The study found that the deposition of particles in women was the highest in the head region (61.1 per cent) followed by pulmonary (21.1 per cent) and tracheobronchial region (17.3 per cent).

Among 408 children, who were part of the study, 62 per cent complained of a stuffy nose, followed by dry/sore throat reported by 30.6 per cent children.

The study found that in most of the cases, these symptoms were more prevalent during October and November, followed by February and April.

The study found that poor indoor quality is also keeping children at increased risk of attention deficit hyperactivity.

SC Gives 6-Month Jail **Term To Former Fortis** Promoters

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Thursday awarded six months jail term to former promoters of Fortis Healthcare Ltd, Malvinder Singh, and Shivinder Singh, in a case related to the sale of shares of Fortis to Malaysia-based IHH Healthcare.

A bench headed by Chief Justice Uday Umesh Lalit awarded six months jail term to the former promoters of Fortis Healthcare who were earlier held guilty of contempt.

The top court also ordered a forensic audit of the share sale in Fortis Healthcare Ltd.

"Everything goes back to the executing court," the CJI said. The former promoters of Fortis Healthcare Ltd were facing the court battle after a Japanese firm, Daiichi Sankyo, had challenged the Fortis-IHH share deal to recover the ₹3.600 crore arbitration award that it had won before a Singapore tribunal against the Singh brothers.

The IHH-Fortis deal is stuck due to the legal fight between Daiichi Sankyo and the former promoters of Fortis Healthcare.

In 2018, when some Indian lenders sold the pledged shares of Fortis Healthcare to the Malaysia-based firm, Daiichi Sankyo went to court alleging that the former promoters of Fortis had assured them that their shares in the Indian hospital chain will cover the arbitral award amount.

Internet Calling Apps May Soon Need Telecom Licence

NEW DELHI: Apps like Whatsapp, Zoom, Skype and Google Duo which provide calling and messaging services may soon require licences to operate in the country, according to the draft telecommunication bill 2022.

The draft bill has included OTT Apps as part of the telecommunication service. "For provision of Telecommunication Services and Telecommunication Networks, an entity shall have to obtain a license," the draft bill released on Wednesday evening said. The government in the bill has proposed a provision to waive fees and penalty of telecom and internet service providers. The ministry has also proposed a provision for the refund of fees in case a telecom or internet provider surrenders his license.

"Seeking your views on the draft Indian Telecom Bill 2022," Telecom Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said in a post on a social media platform in which he also shared the link of the draft bill. The last date for public comment on the draft is October 20. According to the draft, the central government may, "waive in part or full any fee, including entry fees, license fees, registrations fees or any other fees or charges, interest, additional charges or penalty" for any licence holder or registered entity under the telecom rules.

ABG Shipyard: ED Attaches Rs 2,747 Cr Worth Assets

NEW DELHI: The ED on Thursday said it has attached dockyards, agricultural lands, commercial properties and bank deposits worth more than Rs 2,747 crore as part of an alleged bank loan fraud linked money laundering investigation against ABG Shipyard Ltd, its group companies and linked entities.

The seized properties include shipyards located at Surat and Dahej in Gujarat, agricultural lands and plots, various commercial and residential premises in Gujarat and Maharashtra and bank accounts owned by ABG Shipyard Ltd., its group companies and other related entities, the federal agency said in a statement.

The total value of the provisionally attached assets, under the Prevention of Money Laundering (Act), is Rs 2,747.69 crore.

The Enforcement Directorate action comes a day after the CBI arrested the founder of the company Rishi Kamlesh Agarwal.

Probe found that the ABG Shipyard Ltd. and its Chairman & Managing Director Agarwal availed various credit facilities/ loans from consortium of Banks led by the ICICI Bank, Mumbai on pretext of meeting its capital requirements and other business expenses, the ED said.

India Defends Its Decision To Ban Rice, Wheat Exports

NEW DELHI: India has defended its decision to ban export of wheat and rice at a WTO meeting even as some member countries have flagged concerns over the country's stand. an official said.

At a meeting last week in Geneva, Senegal, the US and the European Union raised questions over this decision, stating it could have adverse implications on global markets.

In May, India restricted export of wheat to enhance domestic availability. This month, it also banned export of broken rice and imposed a 20 per cent export duty on non-Basmati rice except for parboiled rice to boost domestic supplies amid a fall in area under paddy crop in the current kharif season.

Defending its decision, India clarified that the ban on export of broken rice, which is used in poultry feed, follows a rise in the grain's exports in recent months which put pressure on the domestic market.

In the case of wheat, food security concerns necessitated export curbs.

India has also stated that the measures are temporary in nature and under continuous monitoring, the official said.

Spicejet Hikes Salary Of **Section Of Pilots**

NEW DELHI: SpiceJet has hiked salary of its captains and senior first officers by around 20 per cent from October as it gets the first tranche of funds under the government's credit guarantee scheme, according to an internal communication.

The loss-making Ajay Singh-promoted carrier is also expected to deposit TDS of all employees in next two to three weeks, as per the communication sent to the airline pilots on Wednesday.

The communication to the airline pilots came on the day it sent 80 of its cockpit crew on Leave Without Pay for three months and aviation regulator DGCA announced that it has extended the 50 per cent restrictions on its flights till October 29.

On September 2, airline sources had told PTI that the carrier was likely to receive around Rs 225-crore under the government's credit guarantee scheme ECLGS.

SpiceJet has received the approval for a loan under the central government's ECLGS scheme. The first tranche of the payment has already been received, SpiceJet Chief of Flight Operations, Gurcharan Arora stated in the communication.

He, however, did not mention the quantum of funds received in the first installment.

Rainfall recorded below 15 mm is considered light, between 15 and 64.5 mm is moderate, between 64.5 mm and 115.5 mm heavy, between 115.6 and 204.4 very heavy. Anything above 204.4 mm is considered extremely heavy rainfall.

The fresh spells of rains just before the withdrawal of monsoon from the National Capital Region will help cover the large deficit (46 per cent till September 22 morning) to some extent. It would also keep the air clean and the temperature in check.

The city recorded a minimum temperature of 23.8 degrees Celsius and a maximum temperature of 28 degrees Celsius, seven notches below normal.

The 24-hour average air quality index settled at 66 (satisfactory category) at 4

when the monsoon season historically sets in. The IMD on Tuesday said the

southwest monsoon had withdrawn from parts of southwest Rajasthan and adjoining Kutch, three days after the normal date of September 17.

Usually, it takes around a week after its withdrawal from west Rajasthan for the monsoon to retreat from Delhi.

The withdrawal of southwest monsoon is declared if there has been no rainfall in the region for five days along with the development of anti-cyclonic circulation and water vapour imagery indicates dry weather conditions over the region.

Woman Lawyer Sexually Harassed On Mumbai Train, Accuses Police Of Insensitive Behaviour Press Trust of India

Mumbai: A 25-year-old woman lawyer on Thursday accused the railway police of treating her with insensitivity and apathy after a man sexually harassed her in the ladies' compartment of a Mumbai local train.

The police force needs to be sensitized about how to behave with the victims of such incidents and be held accountable for their duties, the woman said in a long Twitter thread which went viral.

The incident took place on Wednesday morning when the woman was traveling to her workplace from Cotton Green to Jogeshwari on the harbour branch of Central Railway. According to police, a man, around 40 years old and ap-parently mentally unstable, boarded the ladies' first class compartment in which she was traveling alone at Andheri.

As the train approached Jogeshwari station, he sexually harassed her before jumping out and fleeing. "Upon reaching the Andheri Railway Police station, I was visibly distressed and crying. As I spoke to the police in-charge and told them I was molested and I'd be comfortable speaking about it to a female cop, the first question he asked me was "Molestation kya hota hai" (what is molestation)," the woman wrote in a tweet.

As she identified the perpetrator in the CCTV footage, one of the women police personnel kept telling her that being a lawver. she should have hit the man. the woman said. She was made to narrate the incident threefour times and her statement

EWS Row: Reservation Has Social, Financial Connotations, Meant For Oppressed, Says SC

New Delhi: Observing that poverty is not a "permanent thing", the Supreme Court said on Thursday the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) among upper castes could be promoted through various affirmative actions at the "threshold level" like giving them scholar-ships instead of 10 per cent quotas in government jobs and educational institutions.

It said the term reservation has different connotations such as social and financial empowerment and is meant for the classes that have been oppressed for centuries.

A five judge constitution bench headed by Chief Justice Uday Umesh Lalit said reservation has been given to those stigmatised

for centuries due to their caste and vocations and the EWS among forward classes could have been given facilities like scholarship and free education without the government getting into the "reservation issue".

When it is about other reservations, it is attached to lineage. That backwardness is not something which is temporary. Rather, it goes down to centuries and generations. But economic backwardness can be temporary, said the bench.

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the Centre, defended the 103rd constitutional amendment, saying the 10 per cent quota for the EWS of general category has been provided without disturbing the 50

per cent reservation available to SCs, STs and OBCs, and the parliamentary wisdom, leading to a constitutional amendment cannot be set aside without establishing that it violated the basic structure of the Constitution.

The other side is not denying the fact that people, who are struggling or who are poverty stricken in that unreserved class, needed some support. There is no doubt about that.

"What is being submitted is that you can try to elevate that class by giving them sufficient opportunities at the thresh-old level, say at the 10+2 level... Give them a scholarship. Give them the freeship so that they get the opportunity to learn, to educate themselves or to elevate

India Among Top Ten Countries With Highest Type 2 Diabetes **Prevalence: Lancet Study**

n estimated 8.4 million people were living with Type 1 Diabetes across the globe in 2021, and India was among the top ten countries with highest prevalence of the disease, according to a modelling study published in The Lancet Diabetes & Endocrinology journal.

This number is predicted to increase to 13.5-17.4 million people living with Type 1 Diabetes (T1D) by 2040, the researchers said.

"Given that prevalence of people with T1D is projected to increase in all countries to up to 17.5 million cases in 2040, our results provide a warning for substantial negative implications for societies and healthcare systems," said Professor Graham Ogle, one of the authors of the study, from the University of Sydney, Australia.

"There is an opportunity to save millions of lives in the coming decades by raising the standard of care for T1D and increasing awareness of the signs and symptoms of T1D to enable a 100 per cent rate of diagnosis in all countries," Ogle said.

Researchers modelled data on childhood, adolescent and adult T1D prevalence in 97 countries, along with incidence over time data from 65 countries.

They also analysed mortality data from 37 countries to predict T1D incidence, prevalence, and mortality in 2021 for 201 countries, with projections of future prevalence through 2040.

The estimates were tested for accuracy against real world prevalence data from 15 countries.

In 2021, the model estimated that 8.4 million individuals worldwide were living with T1D. Of these individuals, 18 per cent were under 20 years old, 64 per cent were between 20-59 years, and 19 per cent were over 60 years.

"These findings have important implications for diagnosis, models of care, and peer support programmes," said Professor Dianna Magliano, one of the authors of the study, from Monash Uni-LOW versity. Australia.

"Such programmes, in countries where they exist, are almost exclusively designed, and delivered for children and youth with T1D," Magliano said.

The ten countries with the highest estimated T1D prevalence US, India, Brazil, China, Germany, UK, Russia, Canada, Saudi Arabia, and Spain account for 5.08 million (60 per cent) of global cases of T1D, the resaerchers said.

Model estimates also suggest that 21 per cent of individuals with T1D live in low income countries (LICs) and lower and middle income countries (LMICs), they said. Model estimates place global deaths due to T1D at 175,000 in 2021, the researchers said.

Of these, 35,000 or 20 per cent were attributed to non-diagnosis, of which 14,500 were in sub-Saharan Africa and 8,700 were in South Asia, they said.

The researchers estimate that an extra 3.1 million people would have been alive in 2021 if they hadn't died prematurely due to suboptimal care of T1D, and a further 700,000 people would still be alive if they hadn't died prematurely due to non-diagnosis.

"Our findings indicate that the overall footprint of T1D is much larger than previous estimates have indicated, when missing prevalence due to excess mortality is accounted for," said Professor Kim Donaghue, one of the authors of the study, from the University of Sydney, Australia.

"This is particularly true in lowand middle-income countries for example in sub-Saharan Africa which accounts for 357,000 cases of T1D or 4 per cent of global prevalence but 23 per cent (40,000) of the lives lost each year highlighting the urgent need to increase awareness of the signs and symptoms of T1D in LMICs," Donaghue said.

The projected T1D prevalence in 2040 given by the model was is 13.5-17.5 million people, with largest relative increases predicted to occur in LICs and LMICs, the researchers said. Conservative **BLOOD SUGAR**

estimates place the relative increase in the number of people living with T1D by 2040 compared to 2020 at 66

per cent, they added.

Guterres Warns Against Continued Global Warming, 1.5-Degrees Limit 'On Life Support'

'N Secretary-General Antonio Guterres warned that global warming continues and the most ambi-tious goal of the 2015 Paris accord -- to limit Earth's warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels -- is "on life support".

"The 1.5-degrees limit is on life support, and it is fading fast," the top UN official told reporters late Wednesday after he concluded two meetings with many heads of state and government to talk about the climate emergency and the triple global crisis of food, energy and finance.

"You have all seen the appalling images from Pakistan. This is happening at just 1.2 degrees of global warming... We are headed for over 3 degrees," Xinhua news agency quoted the UN chief as saying. Guterres said that he told the assembled leaders that "we need their action, their leader-

ship, now". First, more ambition on mitigation to keep 1.5 alive. Emissions must decline by 45 per cent before 2030. Current commitments will see them rise by 14 per cent.'
