'Sinking Ship' Situation Installing Quick-Heal In Kashmir Houseboats

Anticipating yet another harsh winter that signaled its early-arrival with the untimely snowfall this autumn, the houseboat community of Kashmir has gone for the advance-coring process.

Last year, many houseboats sank in the frosty waters of Dal Lake and river Jhelum due to decayed boat bases.

"Winter now makes me restless," said Farooq Ahmad, a houseboat owner.

"We helplessly saw our houseboats sinking last year due to the want of repairing. That sinking ship

But to keep up with its heritage and beautification, these floating houses need to go under numerous maintenance

As autumn is now gradually paving way to winter in Kashmir, houseboat proprietors are counting on the coring process to stay afloat in the chilly and challenging season.

Coring aka Sangkar is completed by exceptional craftsmen called Kouthur. Special grassmade of dried reed is imported from Assam and utilized in this process.

Brushed into a rope-like design, the grass is placed in the base and side-gaps of the houseboat with some uncommon tools to stop the spillage. The damaged base parts are replaced by expensive wood called deodar.

"This healing cycle requires more than 10 days," said

Mushtaq Mir, a houseboat owner. "This interaction is done after each two to three years."

The houseboats normally have a life-expectancy of around 50 to 100 years. But due to the harsh winters in the valley, proprietors are now resorting to the prompt defense cover.

"Coring should end before December when a heavy snowfall is usually expected in Kashmir," said Mehraj Ahmad, another houseboat owner.

"We begin this compulsory interaction to save our house-boats from drowning in awful climate conditions."

FM Hints Centre Considering Statehood To J&K

Thiruvananthapuram: Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday hinted at the possibility of the Centre considering restoring state status to Jammu and Kashmir.

She dropped the hint while talking about the distribution of funds to the states by the Centre as per the recommendations of the 14th Finance Commission.

Delivering a lecture on Centre-State relations here, Sitharaman said Prime Minister Narendra Modi without any hesitation had accepted the recommendation of 14th Finance Commission in 2014-15 that 42 per cent of all taxes— an increase from 32 per cent till then—should be given to the states.

"That Finance Commission said now you raise it to 42 per cent...which means that Centre will have a lesser amount in its hand. Prime Minister Modi, without a second thought about it, fully accepted the Finance Commission and that is why today states get 42 per cent of the amount—now reduced by 41 per cent because Jammu and Kashmir is no longer a state.

"It will soon become may be sometime...," Sitharaman said in her lecture on "Cooperative Federalism: The Path Towards Atma Nirbhar Bharat" organised here by Bharatiya Vichara Kendram in memory of Sangh idealogue P Parameshwaran.

In August 2019, the central government abrogated Article 370 of the Constitution, which accorded special status to Jammu and Kashmir, and More on P10

Two-Day Rain, Snow Spell In J&K From Today

2-3Ft Snow Expected Over Higher Reaches: MeT Dept

Srinagar: The weather department on Saturday forecast widespread rain and snowfall in Jammu and Kashmir for the next 2 days, leading to a significant drop in mercury.

On November 6 and 7, a meteorological department official said, moderate rain and snow (over higher reaches) was very likely to occur at most places of J&K. "Plains of Kashmir, mainly South, likely to receive (2-3) inches of snowfall during 6-7th," he said, adding, "Heavy Snowfall (2-3feet) is very likely over higher reaches."

Regarding probable impacts, he said, snowfall and

low temperature may lead to temporary disruption of surface transportation, mainly over Zojila, Jammu-Srinagar Highway, Sinthantop, Mughal road etc. during November 6-7. He said that snowfall may damage orchards.

The MeT department also issued an advisory, urging people to confirm the status of the roads prior to embarking journey to avoid inconveniences.

Farmers have been advised to harvest agriculture and horticulture produces which are vulnerable to snowfall and low temperature.

Meanwhile, he said, Srinagar recorded a low of 5.6°C against 5.0°C on the previous I More on P10

CAG Fumes Over Delayed Decision, Heavy Losses

Says delay in decision over construction of Srinagar-Leh transmission line causes generation loss of 1602.64 MUs

Srinagar: The Comptroller and Auditor General of India has slammed the authorities over delay in taking decision for construction of Srinagar-Leh transmission line, saying it not only led to huge cost escalation but also caused a generation loss of 1,602.64 MUs and an extra expenditure of Rs 700.25 crore due to billing of deemed generation to Power Development Department.

In its report, the CAG has revealed that delay in taking decision over construction of the transmission line caused huge financial losses.

"Due to delay in taking decision for construction of the line, not only huge cost escalation



had occurred but there was also a generation loss of 1,602.64 MUs and an extra expenditure of Rs 700. 25 crore due to billing of deemed generation to Power Development Department," reads the CAG's compliance audit of activities selected Central Public Sector Enterprises.

In 2003, the Government of India announced a special package for J&K comprising a 375 km transmission system project from Srinagar to Leh via Kargil with four substations at Drass, Kargil, Leh and Khaltsi at an estimated cost of Rs 377.52 crore. | More on P10

Study: Enzyme Engineering Made Easy Using Al

n a new study, researchers from Osaka University have imparted an analogous level of adaptability to enzymes, a goal that has remained elusive for over 30 years. The findings of the study were recently published in ACS Synthetic Biology.

Enzymes perform impressive functions, enabled by the unique arrangement of their constituent amino acids, but usually only within a specific cellular environment. When you change the cellular environment, the enzyme rarely functions well--if at all. Thus, a long-standing research goal has been to retain or even improve upon the function of enzymes in different environments; for example, conditions that are favourable for biofuel production. Traditionally, such work has involved extensive experimental trial-and-error that might have little assurance of achieving an optimal result.

Artificial intelligence (a computer-based tool) can minimize this trial-and-error but still relies on experimentally obtained crystal structures of enzymes--which can be unavailable or not especially useful. Thus, "the pertinent amino acids one should mutate in the enzyme might be only best-guesses," says Teppei Niide, co-senior author. "To solve this problem, we devised a methodology of ranking amino acids that depends only on the widely

available amino acid sequence of analogous enzymes from other living species." The researchers focused on the amino acids involved in the specificity of the malic enzyme to the molecule that the enzyme transforms (i.e., the substrate) and to the substance that helps the transformation proceed (i.e., the cofactor). By identifying the amino acid sequences that did not change over the course of evolution, the researchers identified the amino acid mutations that are adaptations to different cellular conditions in other species.

"By using artificial intelligence, we identified unexpected amino acid residues in a malic enzyme that correspond to the enzyme's use of different redox cofactors," says Hiroshi Shimizu, co-senior author. "This helped us understand the substrate specificity mechanism of the enzyme and will facilitate optimal engineering of the enzyme in laboratories." This work succeeded in using artificial intelligence to dramatically accelerate and improve the success of substantially reconfiguring an enzyme's specific mode of action, without fundamentally altering the enzyme's function.

Future advances in enzyme engineering will greatly benefit fields such as pharmaceutical and biofuel production that require carefully tuning the versatility of enzymes to different biochemical environments--even in the absence of corresponding enzymes' crystal structures.

Taj Mahal Vanishes Under Magic Spell

GRA- The elegant 16th century embodiment of love, Taj Ma¬hal, today had an altogether different date when noted magic wizard, P.C Sorcar junior, made it

Sorcar, master of the Indrajaal magic snow, performed the feat at 1450 hours for over two minutes from a distance of about 400 me¬tres behind Taj at a pot called Eachpura across the river Yamuna.

The mysterious entertainment, as Sorcar described it later, left hundreds of onlookers including policemen, administra¬tion officials and mediapersons absolutely stunned. The magic made the Mughal architectural marvel disappear in the thin air leaving a blank space at the site.

The magician was assisted by his daughter, Maneka, who made the historic monument reappear after two minutes. No it was not mass hypnotism, a jubilant Sorcar told PTI, adding on the contrary, it was a case of Application of 'Adrishya' (disap-pearance) Rasa' of the science of magic.

I just kept the Taj away from your eyes, it was a perfect illu¬sion, the 53-year-old magician, whose late father had several in¬credible feats to his credit, said. This was the junior Sorcar's first major performance since 1992 when he had made a running train disappear at Khana junction near Bardhaman in West Bengal.

Sorcar is also credited with having made Kolkata's famousvicto¬ria memorial vanish in 1990 and an aircraft at Hamamata in Japan.

I don't possess any supernatural powers. I perform with the blessings of God and goodwishes of the people, the magician,, who had challenged a famous godman of the south in the eight—ies, said. A beaming Sorcar, who says magic was in his blood since eight generations, maintained that there was nothing su—pernatural in his feat.

This is all science, the science of controlling the mind and the will–power to create a psychic balance with the environment, he added.

'Jana Gana Mana' And 'Vande **Mataram' Stand On Same** Level: Centre To Delhi Hc

esponding to a plea for equal status to 'Vande Mataram' with 'Jana Gana Mana', the Centre has told the Delhi High Court that both stand on the same level and every citizen of the country should show equal respect to both.

"...National song occupies a unique and special place in the emotions and psyche of the people of India," the Ministry of Home Affairs submitted.

The MHA, in its reply, also pointed out that on January 24, 1950, the President of the Constituent Assembly of India adopted the 'Jana Gana Mana' as the National Anthem of India.

The 'Orders relating to the National Anthem of India' were issued regarding the manner and the circumstances in which the National Anthem has to be played or sung.

In 1971, the action of preventing the singing of the National Anthem or causing disturbances to any assembly engaged in such singing was made a punishable offence by the enactment of the Prevention of Insults to National Honour Act, 1971.

The Centre's response came on a Public Interest Litigation (PIL)

moved by BJP leader and lawyer Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay seeking parity of treatment between the National Anthem and National Song and also to frame guidelines for the National Song 'Vande Mataram' giving it the same honour and status at par with the National Anthem of India.

However, the Centre, clarified that similar penal provisions have not been made by the Government in the case

of the National Song 'Vande Mataram' and no instructions have been issued laying down the circumstances in which it may be sung or played. The Centre also referred to the Supreme Court order in

Upadhyay's similar earlier plea. In its judgment dated January 17, 2017, the apex court observed that Article 51A (a) of the Constitution of India does not refer to 'National Song'. It only refers to National Flag

and National Anthem. "5IA. Fundamental duties - It shall be the duty of every citizen of India-(a) to abide by the Constitution and respect its ideals and institutions, the National Flag, and National Anthem. Therefore, we do not intend to enter into any debate as far as the National Song is concerned," the earlier SC order read.

Deadlock persists over filing of FIR over attack on Imran Khan

ISLAMABAD: A deadlock persists over filing an FIR in connection with an assassination attempt on Imran Khan after the former prime minister refused to withdraw the name of a senior Pakistan Army officer from the complaint, which also carries the names of the Prime Minister and the Interior Minister.

Khan, 70, suffered a bullet injury in the right leg when two gunmen fired a volley of bullets at him and others mounting on a container-mounted truck in the Wazirabad area of Punjab province, where he was leading a protest march against the Shehbaz Sharif government.

Khan, the chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) party, alleged that Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah and Major General Faisal Naseer were part of a sinister plot to assassinate him in the same way former Punjab governor Salman Taseer was killed in 2011 by a religious extremist.

He also said that an FIR was not being registered as some people were afraid of (some names).

Punjab Chief Minister Chaudhry Pervez Elahi is caught between 'the devil and the deep blue sea' as Khan, who essentially calls the shots for the ruling coalition in Punjab, continues to insist on naming the Army officer in the FIR, the Dawn newspaper reported.

The matter was also taken up



by the Punjab Cabinet during its meeting on Friday, which was attended by police chief Faisal Shahkar as well as other senior government officials and the provincial law minister.

An official privy to the development told the newspaper that the meeting discussed the serious issues pertaining to all the legal aspects of the registration of a case.

He said the meeting also discussed that a further delay in the registration of a case could spoil all efforts to secure evidence and punish the suspects involved in the armed attack on Khan's container truck in Wazirabad.

Sharing the political dimensions of the issue, the source said Elahi was against the 'logic' of naming the senior army officer in the case.

Elahi and PTI leaders held many meetings on the issue where the former attempted to convince them to drop the name of the Army officer, the source added.

"The matter of filing an appli-

cation with the police was under discussion between the PTI (ruling coalition partner) and the Punjab government," he said.

He said the police chief conveyed to the government that the FIR had been the first authentic document about the commission of the cognisable offence to start investigations.

Unfortunately, the investigation process in this respect has come to a grinding halt, despite the detention of three suspects, including the alleged shooter who was caught on the spot, and two more suspects who provided the weapon.

At the Cabinet meeting, the police chief told other participants that the police had not received any application to register the FIR of an assassination attempt on former prime minister Khan.

Regarding the formation of a Joint Investigation Team (JIT), the Punjab police were of the opinion it would be premature to form a JIT before even lodging the case.

Iran Admits To Sending Drones To Russia 'Months Before The Ukraine War'

ran has acknowledged for the first time that it supplied Russia with drones, insisting the transfer came before the war in Ukraine that has seen the Iranian-made drones target Kiev.

The comments by Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amirabdollahian on Saturday come after months of confused messaging from Iran about the weapons shipment. "We gave a limited number of

drones to Russia months before the Ukraine war," Amirabdollahian told reporters after a meeting in Tehran.

Previously, Iranian officials had denied arming Russia in its war on Ukraine.

Just earlier this week, Iran's Ambassador to the UN Amir Saeid Iravani called the allegations "totally unfounded" and reiterated Iran's position of neutrality in the war.

Position of 'neutrality'

The US and its Western allies on the Security Council have called on Secretary-General Antonio Guterres to investigate if Russia has used Iranian drones to attack civilians in Ukraine.

Even so, Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard has vaguely boasted of providing drones to



the world's top powers.

Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei has extolled the efficacy of the drones and mocked Western hand-wringing over their danger.

During state-backed demonstrations to mark the 1979 US Embassy takeover on Friday, crowds waved placards of the triangle-shaped drones as a point of national pride.

As he acknowledged the shipment, Amirabdollahian claimed on Saturday that Iran was oblivious to the use of its drones in Ukraine. He said Iran remained committed to stopping the conflict.

"Îf (Ukraine) has any documents in their possession that Russia used Iranian drones in Ukraine, they should provide them to us," he said. "If it is proven to us that Russia used Iranian drones in the war against Ukraine, we will not be indifferent to this issue."

There Can Be No Curbs On Woman's Right To Reproductive **Choice: Kerala Hc**

KOCHI: There can be no restriction on a woman's right to exercise her reproductive choice to either procreate or to abstain from procreating, Kerala High Court has said while allowing a 23-year-old student to medically terminate her 26-week

pregnancy.
Justice V G Arun, in an order on November 2, said the medical board has opined that the woman was having acute stress reaction and continuation of the pregnancy may risk her life.

The woman, an MBA student, had conceived from a consensual relationship with her classmate. According to her plea, she became aware of her pregnancy only after an ultrasound scan was conducted on the advice of the doctor whom she had visited complaining of irregular menstrual periods and other physical discomfort.

"There can be no rest a woman's right to exercise her reproductive choice to either procreate or to abstain from procreating," Justice Arun said in his order.

Referring to previous Supreme Court judgements, the Kerala High Court said a woman's right to make reproductive choice

comes under the dimension of her personal liberty, under Article 21 of the Constitution.

"A careful scrutiny of the opinion shows that the petitioner is having acute stress reaction and continuation of the pregnancy may cause an exacerbation of her medical distress which may entail risk to the petitioner's life, the court noted.

The High Court permitted the woman to get her pregnancy terminated at the government medical college hospital or any other hospital having facilities mandated by the Medical Termination of Pregnancy Act.

The woman had told the court that she had been suffering from polycystic ovarian disease, a condition characterised by irregular menstrual periods and hence, she had no clue of her pregnancy till the scan report was received on October 25.

Adding to her woes, the classmate, with whom she was in a relationship, had left the country for higher studies and she moved the High Court seeking permission to medically terminate the pregnancy as continuing with the pregnancy would aggravate her stress and mental agony and would impact her education and ability for a livelihood.

This State Will Begin MBBS In Hindi From 2023, 2nd State To Do So In Weeks

of the videos it is clear that all the accused have fraudulently, blatantly and slavishly with an intention of making wrongful gains have unauthorizedly and illegally used the sound recording owned and held by the Complainant." The Congress' Bharat Jodo Yatra began from Kanyakumari in Tamil Nadu on September 7 and is expected to reach Jammu on January 30, 2023. The march has so far covered five southern states, namely Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. It will traverse through different states in this course.

Disabled SAC

he State Accountability Commission is reported to have stopped functioning, amazingly for the most unlikely reason, that it doesn't have enough space on the dais to enable all its members the chairperson and two newly appointed members - to conduct the hearing as required under its Act. The chairperson, Justice (retd) R P Sethi, is believed to have sent a letter to the chief minister, Ghulam Nabi Azad, to empower the Commission to decide on the nature of cases which can be heard by the Commission's double bench and full bench by amending the Accountability Commission Act. Quoting sources, reports said he urged Azad "to ensure that the functioning of the Commission doesn't suffer in the absence of the chairperson or any of the two members." In case the government agrees to amend the Act, the Commission can also hold the sitting in Jammu and Srinagar simultaneously. As of now, the Commission has to function for three days at Srinagar and other three days at Jammu. For the first time since its establishment, the Commission on Monday adjourned all the cases listed for the day to May 15. The decision was taken in the case titled Tahir Enterprises v/s Mushtaq Ahmad Dar. An order passed in the case said, "In the absence of chambers and supporting staff for the new members of the Commission and in absence of adequate space on the dais for all the members. it is not practical to hold the joint sitting of the Commission as required under sub section (2) of section 13 of J&K Accountability Commission Act." As per the Act, the sittings of the Commission are required to be held jointly by its chairperson and the other two members who were sworn in only a couple of days earlier. Responding to the extraordinary situation, the state's law secretary has said that the government would provide the Commission adequate space. Indicating a further deepening of the crisis, the chairperson is reported to have informed the government that he would not be available till the section 13 of the Act were amended so that cases could be attended bench-wise as the SAC sans adequate staff and office accommodation made it difficult for the members to hear cases simul-

taneously in joint sittings. On the face of it, all these developments seem to be bizarre in that the Commission head has to knock at the door of the chief minister for a trivial matter like provision of enough accommodation to make the highprofile body functional. It goes without saying that the Commission is a constitutional body with a mandate to hear cases even against the chief minister. It is travesty of circumstances that an institution created to root out corruption, although in its infancy yet, has to suffer from a handicap like it does at the moment. The government which had taken up construction of a building on the MA Road to house the Commission is believed to have developed cold feet subsequently for unknown reasons. As if the pin-pricks were not enough, the chief minister had recently given an offence to the Commission chairperson by making a less circumspect observation in response to an issued raised by a member in the state legislature. Earlier, one of his ministers, who had been implicated in a corruption case, had approached the governor seeking a stay on the proceedings against him. The developments leave one with an unmistakable impression that the government, particularly its head, the chief minister, Ghulam Nabi Azad, is not serious enough about the crusade he has launched against the menace of corruption. On the one hand he spares no occasion to go on reiterating his government's determination to stamp out the canker from both the administration as well as politics, but on the other, a sustained effort is being made to erode the Accountability Commission's position and to render it disabled. It may well require a magic wand to reconcile to the two mutually opposed situations. Needless to recall that in the very first instance the state government did not seem to be earnest in its decision to set up the Accountability Commission. After all it took no less than about three years to find a chairperson for it. In between, Jammu and Kashmir earned the dubious distinction of being the second most corrupt state, next only to Bihar. Interestingly, when, at long last, a retired Supreme Court judge was found to head the august body, the chief minister and several of his ministers went eloquent to praise his integrity and judicial acumen. Unless he relishes the drift, the chief minister is expected to come clean on the growing chasm between the SAC and his government.

ammu and Kashmir in general, and Kashmir valley in particular is known across the globe for its picturesque beauty, pleasant weather, rich biodiversity, unparalleled hospitality and uncluttered social setup. But, of late, the erstwhile border state of the Indian republic is grabbing headlines for diabolical reasons. From drastic climate changes to our cultural dilution, the quondam state of India is confronting swingeing social issues which have not only assumed dangerous proportions but have lacerated our social health. Consequently, our fragile social fabric is torn and stained.

Since marriage is the most important institution of human societies, fiddling with it and setting new standards for it, have blemished our great cultural ethos and legacy. The social health of the valley is not all well. Many evils which were considered alien to us, have now creeped into our social system.

It is shocking to learn that no metropolitan city, no industrially advanced state or union territory of India but Jammu and Kashmir tops the list of unmarried youth in the entire country. According to reports, the number of both male and female never-married youth has considerably gone past 29% during the last decade. According to the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation's 'Youth in India 2022' study, Jammu and Kashmir has a higher percentage of 99.1 percent of young people (aged up to 29 years) who are not married compared to the national average. According to the most recent study, it is the highest percentage reported by any state or union territory in India.

The above figures are alarming, appalling and a matter of concern for us all. Something is terribly wrong with our social setup. Contrary to our ancestors and forefathers, we have probably set difficult benchmarks and standards for our marriages and married lives. Extravaganza and lavish spending has deepened the crisis. In contrast to our beautiful old traditions and teachings, we have infused materialism into the veins and arteries of our youth. We often see everything through the prism of materialism.

For instance, we prioritise earning men for nuptials. That's the minimum eligibility and is justified to some extent. However, in Kashmir, this has assumed more stringent forms. Only a man in the government services is considered worthy of being an eligible suitor. Why is this the case? Honour and dignity are not restricted to Sarkari jobs. A labourer toiling hard to earn his livelihood through legitimate means, is far better than a government employee who evades his assigned work or goes for illegitimate ways to earn extra bucks. We haven't stopped here.

Infact, women without government jobs are not considered for marital matches now. I pity this mindset!

This perception has been a stumbling block in our social renaissance. Now, if the earning men are made a benchmark, it should not be synonymous to government services and luxurious lifestyle only. Hefty and heavy amounts as wages should not be the yardstick to measure one's earnings. Ways and means must be fair though the amount is meagre and scanty.

Happy and prosperous married life is not subject to swanky ways of life. Here, I am reminded of an anecdote of Ali and Fatima's (RA) marriage. When Fatima Binti Mohammad (SAW) was about to leave for her in-laws home, prophet Muhammad (SAW) went to bid farewell to His most beloved daughter. Prophet Muhammad (SAW) witnessed melancholic symbols on her daughter's face, and said, "O the light of my eyes! Are you dejected and sad because Ali is very poor? Wallah! There is no parallel of Ali (RA) in the entire Arab. Fatima (RA) bowed her head down, and didn't open her mouth. And it is pertinent to mention here that Ali (RA) had

When marriages are made difficult, cohabitation and fornication prevail like dirt. Incidence of rape attempts and molestation bids have awfully increased. Immodesty and indecency among youth has terribly shot up . Thousands of girls have crossed the marriageable ages. Young people have fallen prey to substance abuse. Infertility among married couples is rapidly increasing. Thousands are seen circumambulating clinics and diagnostic labs. Yet, we consider ourselves prosperous, wise and advanced. Our materialistic perspective regarding marriages must change, otherwise we may end up worse than savages and beasts.

Now, the onus is on us all. We must educate our masses about the ill effects of the menace. We should take concrete steps to nip the evil in the bud. Our clerics and scholars should edify people to make our social fabric immaculately clean. Youth, particularly educated ones must set glaring examples of courage to curb the peril of late marriages.

n an icy November morning in Srinagar's Government College of Education, Dr. Seema Naz's spirits are high as she marshals her staff and students with an effortless executive expertise

The institution-insights have been a hallmark of her progressive career. As a symbol of woman empowerment, the educationist has been heralding a campus change as head of Kashmir's top institute.

"Things related to education have improved a lot in Kashmir," Dr. Naz, Principal Govt College of Education, tells me in a freewheeling chat. "We now have around 142 colleges and 12 universities. Students should avail the opportunities and they are doing very well."

Back in the day, the woman-in-command continues as she keeps a hawkish gaze on the campus affairs, there was no Psychology course at Kashmir University. "But today there's a total revamp in our education system and technology has also been integrated," she asserts. "Apart from new universities and colleges, a number of new programmes have also come up. The infrastructure in our colleges and universities has improved."



But how did you become part of this campus change?

Well, it began with my formative education from Presentation Convent School. At that point, it was the best school for girl education.

After completing my schooling, I did my graduation from Women's College M.A Road. I was very much interested in studying Psychology but back then Kashmir University did not have a Psychology Department. I had secured very good marks in my graduation and sought admission in Bombay University. I did specialization in Clinical Psychology there. After that I got married and had to leave Bombay and came back to Kashmir.

After that I got selected through Public Service Commission and was first appointed as Assistant Professor Psychology at Women's College Baramulla and was later posted at Nawa Kadal College.

Following that, I taught at B.Ed College for 23 years. During my service there, I completed my B.Ed and M.Ed through distance mode and did my Ph.d in Education from the Kashmir University.

In 2018, I was placed as Principal B.Ed College, where teacher education has been part of my personality.

Well, at that time, girl education was

already in progress in Kashmir. We studied at the best of the colleges. What I have been observing from the last many years is that the number of girls in the class outnumbers boys. Their regularity, punctuality and their motivational level is way better. If girls secure education, our whole society will get educated.

I think girls are very hard working and are progressing in every field. With reference to education, girls are very focused on education and jobs.

Being a woman myself, I tell girls to come to our college and try to provide them with the best of opportunities. I try my level best to secure the future of our students by helping them in the best possible way.

Now that you're at the helm of affairs, what changes have you brought to evolve



education in Kashmir?

Well, we have initiated a lot of changes in the college. You must be knowing about National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The policy has come after 34 years and it has transformed education.

In the past, digital initiatives were not there. But during the Covid-19 pandemic, our classes were held online and we integrated them in our education system.

There has been a total shift in pedagogy. The old teaching methods did not work and will not work anymore.





Female Bones Change Permanently After Giving Birth, Shows Study

id you know female bones permanently change after giving birth to a child. A team of anthropologists recently discovered that reproduction permanently changes the bones of females in ways that were previously unknown.

The findings of the study were published in the journal PLOS ONE.

'Our findings provide additional evidence of the profound impact that reproduction has on the female organism, further demonstrating that the skeleton is not a static organ, but a dynamic one that changes with life events." explains Paola Cerrito, who led the research as a doctoral student in NYU's Department of Anthropology and College of Dentistry.

Specifically, the researchers found that calcium, magnesium, and phosphorus concentrations are lower in females who have experienced reproduction. These changes are linked to giving birth itself and to lactation.

However, they caution that while other clinical studies show calcium and phosphorus are necessary for optimal bone strength, the new findings do not address overall health implications for either primates or humans. Rather, they say the work illuminates the dynamic nature of our bones.

'A bone is not a static and dead portion of the skeleton," notes NYU anthropologist Shara Bailey, one of the study's authors. "It continuously adjusts and responds to physiological processes."The other authors

of the study, which appears in the journal PLOS ONE, are Timothy Bromage, a professor in NYU College of Dentistry, Bin Hu, an adjunct professor at NYU College of Dentistry, Justin Goldstein, a doctoral candidate at Texas State University, and Rachel Kalisher, a doctoral candidate at Brown University.

It's been long-established that menopause can have an effect on females' bones. Less clear is how preceding life-cycle events, such as reproduction, can influence skeletal composition. To address this, the researchers studied the primary lamellar bone--the main type of bone in a mature skeleton. This aspect of the skeleton is an ideal part of the body to examine because it changes over time and leaves biological markers of these changes, allowing scientists to monitor alterations during the life span.

In the researchers examined

the growth rate of lamellar bone in the femora, or thigh bones, of both female and male primates who had lived at the Sabana Seca Field Station in Puerto Rico and died of natural causes. Veterinarians at the field station had monitored and recorded information on these primates' health and reproductive history, allowing the researchers to match bone-composition changes to life events with notable precision.

Cerrito and her colleagues used electron microscopy and energydispersive X-ray analysis--commonly deployed methods to gauge the chemical composition of tissue samples--to calculate changes in concentrations of calcium, phosphorus, oxygen, magnesium, and sodium in the primates' bones.

Their results showed different concentrations of some of these elements in females who gave birth compared males as well as females who did not give birth. Specifically, in females who gave birth, calcium and phosphorus were lower in bone formed during reproductive events. Moreover, there was a significant decline in magnesium concentration during these primates' breastfeeding of infants. "Our research shows that even before the cessation of fertility the skeleton responds dynamically to changes in reproductive status," says Cerrito, now a research fellow at ETH Zurich.

"Moreover, these findings reaffirm the significant impact giving birth has on a female organism--quite simply, evidence of reproduction is 'written in the bones' for life."

If You Put On A Smiling Face You Can Trick Your Mind Into Happiness

ust like the famous lyrics suggest, if you put on a happy face you will feel a little brighter, according to a new study published in Nature Human Behaviour.

A new study has found that by posing our facial muscles in a smile we can feel happier.

Led by Stanford University, and conducted with the Florida State University and the University of South Australia, and working with a team of international collaborators, the study assessed whether people's subjective experiences of emotion could be influenced by their facial expressions.

Collecting data from 3878 participants across 19 countries, the study found a noticeable increase in happiness from people who mimicked smiling photographs or pulled their mouth toward their ears.

UniSA researcher, Dr Fernando Marmolejo-Ramos says it's a timely finding as the world heads toward a fourth year of the COVID-19 pandemic.

'There's no doubt that the world's been struggling amid the current pandemic. While individuals naturally respond differently to adverse situations. it's encouraging to think that we can sway our emotions by simply putting on a happy face,"

Dr Marmolejo-Ramos says. "The concept of being able to influence our emotions by simply moving our facial muscles has long been debated by researchers, but until now, no test or theory has been globally agreed upon.

"In this study, we assembled a team of sceptics and a team of believers (called the 'Many Smiles Collaboration') to test a mutually agreed methodology, and what we found was reliable evidence that the physical formation of a smile can produce

feelings of happiness. The study tested three well-

known techniques:

1) mimicking facial expressions of actors seen in photos; 2) moving the corners of their mouths to their cheeks using only their facial muscles; and

3) using the 'pen-in-mouth' technique which moves the facial muscles in a simulated smile shape.

'Two out of three of these conditions generated noticeable increases in happiness, providing a compelling argument that human emotions are linked to muscle movements," Dr Marmolejo-Ramos says.

"But as the pen-in-mouth technique didn't achieve the same mood changes (possibly because the simulated mouth shape wasn't as representative of a smile as we thought) we can't say with absolute certainty that one always causes the other.

'Still, the evidence is strong, and knowing that we can somewhat 'fake it 'til we make it', is definitely a reassuring proposal.

Borrower Can't Claim Extension Of Time Under OTS As Matter Of Right: SC

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court has said a borrower cannot claim further extension of time as a matter of right for making payment under the one-time settlement (OTS) scheme.

The apex court said the borrower has to establish any right in its favour to claim the extension as a matter of right.

A bench of Justices M R Shah and Krishna Murari quashed the Punjab and Haryana High Court judgement delivered in March, which had granted further six weeks to a borrower, a company, to make the payment of balance amount with interest to the State Bank of India according to the sanctioned letter of OTS.

The top court observed that rescheduling the payment under the OTS scheme and granting extension of time would tantamount to "rewriting the contract", which is not permissible while exercising the powers under Article 226 of the Constitution.

The modification of the contract can be done only by mutual consent under section 62 of the Indian Contract Act, it said.

Article 226 of the Constitution deals with the power of high courts to issue certain writs.

"The borrower as a matter of right cannot claim that though it has not made the payment as per the sanctioned OTS scheme, still it be granted further extension as a matter of right. There cannot be any negative discrimination claimed," the bench said.

The top court delivered its verdict on an appeal filed by the SBI against the high court judgement. It noted that the bank had

The apex court noted that the bank sent OTS offer to the borrower, who accepted it.

It said under the sanctioned OTS, the borrower was required to deposit 25 per cent of the amount by December 21, 2017, and the balance amount with interest was to be deposited within six months from the date of the letter.

The borrower requested extension of eight to nine months for repayment of balance amount of Rs 2.52 crore, which the bank declined and directed it to make the payment by May

The borrower then approached the high court seeking eight to nine months to pay the outstanding amount beyond May 21, 2018.

It said the question which arises for consideration of the top court is whether in the facts and circumstances of the case, the high court was justified in extending the period to make the payment of balance amount under the sanctioned OTS scheme while exercising powers under Article 226.

The bench said in the sanctioned letter dated November 21, 2017, it was specifically provided that the entire payment was to be made by May 21, 2018.

"It is an admitted position that the borrower did not make the payment due and payable under the sanctioned OTS scheme on or before the date mentioned in the sanctioned letter," it said.

While allowing the appeal, the bench said the judgement passed by the high court granting further time to the borrower to make balance payment under the OTS scheme in exercise of powers under Article 226, was unsustainable and the same deserves to be quashed and set aside and is accordingly quashed and set aside.

THIRUVANANTHAPURAM: Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Saturday said indiscriminate borrowing and spending by certain States on non-merit goods and expenditure is a matter of concern, and fiscal strength is a critical component for 'Atma Nirbhar Bharat'.

The temptation to borrow beyond capacity would create inter-generational burden and affect fiscal soundness of the country, she said.

"The tendency to get into such not-so-viable, non-merit expenditure is very high in some States," she said.

As per the Constitution, the Centre can discuss with and raise questions to the States on borrowing but many of them see it as an interference in their space of authority, she said.

Sitharaman was delivering the P Parameshwarji Memorial Lecture on "Cooperative Federalism: The Path Towards Atma Nirbhar Bharat" organised here by Bharatiya Vichara Kendram in memory of Sangh ideologue



P Parameshwaran. Lamenting that a wrong political narrative is being made to spoil the Centre-State relations, she said federal relationship should be governed by three Cs -- cooperation, collectiveness, and co-

The economy in the globalised world must address the vulnerabilities it faces and the Centre and the States would have to work together in that regard, she said.

Despite hurdles and challenges, the country surged ahead in areas of development and even reached the fifth position in the global economy index overtaking the United Kingdom, the Minister added.

Govt Resumes Sugar Exports; Allows 6 Mn Tons On Quota **Basis Till May 31**

NEW DELHI: The government on Saturday allowed export of 6 million tonnes of sugar on quota basis till May 31, according to a food ministry notification.

As per the notification, the ministry has allocated a uniform export quota of 18.23 per cent of the three years average production of the sweetener in operational sugar seasons.

Sugar mills can export themswap with domestic sale quota of any other mills, it said.

Sugar season runs from October to September.

'In order to prevent uncontrolled export of sugar or with a view to ensure sufficient availability of sugar for domestic consumption at a reasonable price, government has decided to allow export of sugar upto a reasonable limit with effect from November 1 till May 31, 2023." it said.

According to official sources, the first tranche of quota has been allowed only till May-end. Further allocation of quota for export will be decided based on the domestic sugar production.

The sugar production in the new 2022-23 season commenced in Maharashtra and Karnataka from October onwards, whereas in Uttar Pradesh and rest of the cane growing states, it will kick off in a week's

In October month alone, mills had manufactured 4.05 lakh tonnes of sugar, which was lower by 14.73 per cent from the year-ago period, according to cooperative body National selves or through exporters or Federation of Cooperative Sugar

69% Indian Households Struggle With Financial Insecurity: Survey **Press Trust Of India**

NEW DELHI: Despite robust growth in financial inclusion and the burgeoning financial services industry, almost 69 per cent of Indian households struggle with financial insecurity and vulnerability, according to a personal finance survey conducted by Money9.

India's Personal Finance Pulse maps Indian households' income, savings, investment and spending, said a statement issued by Money9, promoted by TV9 Network.

Providing insights into how India earns, spends and saves, the survey has also unveiled the country's first-ever state ranking of citizen financial security -- the Money9 Financial Security Index.

"The survey finds that the average income of an Indian family of 4.2 persons is Rs 23,000 per month. Over 46 per cent of Indian families have an income of less than Rs 15,000 per month i.e.belong to the aspiring or lowest-income cohort." it said. "Only 3 per cent of Indian households have a luxury standard of living and most of them belong to higher income cohorts (High-

Middle and Rich).' Also, the survey found that 70 per cent of Indian households do some financial savings in the form of bank deposits, insurance, post office savings, and gold. The highest penetration is for bank and post office savings, followed by life insurance and gold.

The survey found that 22 per

cent of Indian households invested in stocks, mutual funds, ULIP and physical assets. However, investment in property/land is high (18



Over 64 per cent of savings are parked in bank accounts, while only 19 per cent households have

"The incidence of saving is less prevalent among the aspiring class. Also, two-fifths of the Indian households in the same class are unable to do any financial savings. There is a clear need to address this segment by the policy makers/market per cent), followed by mutual funds (6 per cent), stock market (3 per cent), and Unit Linked Insurance Plans or ULIPs (3 per cent).

Only 11 per cent of Indian households have active loans with banks or NBFCs. Among all retail loans, the consumption of personal loans is highest, followed by home loans.

India Faces Global Shocks With Better Balance Sheets; Medium-Term Growth Outlook Good: CEA

NEW DELHI: India is encountering global shocks with a position of strength backed by far better household, corporate and financial sector balance sheets and its medium term growth outlook is good, said Chief Economic Adviser V Anantha Nageswaran.

"Overall, all things considered, including the risk of oil price, I do believe that the external situation will be manageable, of course with some anxious moments to come," he said while speaking at an event organised by National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) here.

He further said that given all the short-term unknowns, it was better to focus on medium-term prospects and what lies ahead of the country in the next six years until 2030.

The medium-term growth outlook is actually constructive very simply because we have paid our growth dues last decade and that was because we had to undergo balance sheet repair in the financial and non-financial sector. We are encountering global shocks fortunately with a far better household, corporate and financial sector balance sheet," he added.

On the high debt-to-GDP ratio, Nageswaran said, it is sustainable as India's macroeconomic fundamentals are

Even in the ongoing global turmoil India's borrowing cost is lower than countries which have better ratings than India, he said.

"India's bond yield has not really spiked up. It is doing better than countries that have better credit ratings than India. That tells us a little bit about the overall macroeconomic stability that is there under the current circumstances,"

He also said that the country's current account deficit could range between 3-3.5 per cent during the current financial year depending on evolving external

With regard to the medium term outlook for growth, he said, it would be closer to 6.5-7 per cent rather than closer to 6 per cent taking a baseline scenario of oil under USD 100 a barrel.

This growth would be largely driven by the capital formation and robust public digital infrastructure leading to formalisation of the economy, he added.

India's first voter dies in HP after voting for 34th time, PM, Kharge and others mourn death

Shimla: Three days after casting his vote for the 34th time, India's first voter Shyam Saran Negi died on Saturday at his home in Kalpa in Himachal Pradesh. He was 106.

Negi, who was the Election Commission's brand ambassador, voted for the Himachal Pradesh assembly polls through postal ballot on November 2, the poll panel said. It was the last vote for the man who was 31 when India gained its Independence and witnessed the passage of democracy through the decades.

As news came in of the death of the indefatigable voter, who emblemized the conscientious Indian citizen and performed his electoral duties almost till his dying day, scores of people gathered at his home in Kalpa in Kinnaur district to bid him farewell. Police personnel also paid their respects to Negi.

His death was condoled by leaders across the spectrum, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge as well as Rahul Gandhi.

"I learnt about the death of Shyam Saran Negi when I was leaving from New Delhi in the morning. The 106-year-old had voted more than 30 times in his life, Modi said at a rally in Sundarnagar in Mandi district.

"Just a few days ago, Negi had cast his vote through postal ballot for the Himachal Pradesh polls. Even before his demise, he discharged his duty." Negi's outlook towards democracy will inspire the country's youth, the prime miister added.

"With a heavy heart, I bow my head to pay homage and express my deepest condolences to his kin," the prime minis-

Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur took to Twitter to condole the death. "I am pained to learn about the passing away of India's first voter Shyam Saran Negi. Adhering to his duty, he cast his vote for the 34th time on November 2 though postal

ballot. This thought will always make me emotional.

While Himachal Pradesh Chief Electoral Officer Maneesh Garg said Negi was the brand ambassador for the Election Commission, a spokesperson from the poll panel described him as a "man with exceptional faith in democracy".

"He inspired millions to vote. even before his demise, he voted for Himachal Pradesh Assembly Elections 2022 through postal ballot on November 2, 2022," the Election Commission said on Twitter.

The BJP and Congress, too, condoled Negi's death.

"The BJP expresses deep sadness and condolences on the demise of independent India's first voter Shyam Saran Negi. May God grant peace to the departed soul," the party said on its Twitter handle.

Congress leader Gandhi wrote, "The demise of India's first voter Shyam Saran Negi is a sad news. He has seen the country take its first breath in a free sky and held on to the strings of democracy till his last breath. Negi will always remind us of our obligation towards the nation.

Congress president Kharge said he was pained to hear the news.

"The best example of his unwavering devotion towards democracy is that he cast his vote for the 34th time on November 2. My condolences to the departed soul," Kharge said in a tweet in Hindi.

Priyanka Gandhi Vadra said Negi gave a unique example of his duty towards democracy by voting in every election.

The Election Commission had announced the elections on October 14. The single phase election will take place on November 12 and the votes will be counted on December 8.

The poll panel said voters above 80 years, persons with disabilities and Covid patients would be allowed to vote through postal ballot. However, the secrecy of their votes would be ensured and the facility of voting would be made at the comfort of their homes

A win would ensure South Africa finish in the top two of Group 2 and advance to next week's semis, but defeat would see them miss the knockout rounds for a third T20 World Cup in succession while opening the door for Pakistan and

India, who lead the group with six points, one ahead of the Proteas, will be strong favourites to fend off Zimbabwe in the evening match at the Melbourne Cricket Ground



"We need to be as clinical as possible," all-rounder Ravichandran Ashwin told reporters on Saturday. "We know no team is a brush-

PSG defender Presnel Kimpembe also has a minor Achilles tendon issue and is being rested for Lorient. He hopes to line up in central defense for defending champion France at the World Cup.



'I-League Winner To Be **Promoted To ISL Next Season'**

NEW DELHI: The All India Football Federation (AIFF) on Saturday said that the winner of the I-League, which begins on November 12, will play in the Indian Super League (ISL) next season, without paying any fee as per the roadmap finalised three years ago.

But the participation of I-League winners of 2022-23 season -- as well as 2023-24 -- in the ISL will be subject to fulfilling the club licensing criteria.

We can confirm that the I-League winner of this season will be promoted to the ISL (2023-24 season) subject to fulfilling the Premier one licensing criteria and sporting merit," AIFF secretary general Shaji

Prabhakaran told PTI. "They (I-League winners) will not give any (participation) fee. Since all the clubs playing in the ISL will have to fulfil Premier one licensing criteria, they (I-League winners) also will have to fulfil the criteria.'

According to the roadmap approved in 2019 with the involvement of Asian Football Confederation (AFC) and agreed upon by the stakeholders, the I-League champion team of this season (2022-23), as well as that of next year (2023-24), will get direct slot in the next season of the top-tier ISL.

The promotion and relegation system was to kick in the ISL from 2024-25 season onwards.

The I-League, which begins on November 12 at Manjeri with defending champions Gokulam Kerala hosting last year's runners-up Mohammedan Sporting, will be telecast live on two channels -- Eurosport and DD Sports -- and will be livestreamed on the Discovery Plus OTT platform.

Black Hole Closest To Earth Found. It Is 10 Times Bigger Than The Sun

Washington: The nearest known black hole to Earth has been found by astronomers utilising the International Gemini Observatory, run by the NOIRLab of the NSF.

It has been confirmed that a dormant stellar-mass black hole exists in the Milky Way for the first time. With only 1600 light-years between it and Earth, it is a fascinating subject for research to improve our knowledge of the development of binary systems.

The most extreme things in the universe are black holes. All huge galaxies presumably have supermassive versions of these unfathomably dense objects at their centres.

There are an estimated 100 million stellar-mass black holes in the Milky Way alone, which are significantly more prevalent and weigh five to one hundred times as much as the Sun. In contrast to dormant black holes, which do not flash strongly in X-rays as they consume matter from a nearby star companion, only a small number have been confirmed thus far, and nearly

all of these are "active."

The closest black hole to Earth has been named Gaia BH1 by astronomers using the Gemini North telescope on the island of Hawaii, one of the twin telescopes of the International Gemini Observatory, which is run by NSF's NOIRLab.

It is three times closer to Earth than the previous record-holder, an X-ray pair in the constellation of the Monoceros. This dormant black hole is around 10 times as big as the Sun and is situated about 1600 light-years away in the constellation Ophiuchus. Exquisite studies of the motion of the black hole's partner, a star similar to the Sun that orbits the black hole at around the same distance as the Earth orbits the Sun, allowed for the new finding.

"Take the Solar System, put a black hole where the Sun is, and the Sun where the Earth is, and you get this system," explained Kareem El-Badry, an astrophysicist at the Center for Astrophysics | Harvard & Smithsonian and the Max Planck Institute for Astronomy, and the lead author of the paper describing this discovery.

'No Choice', Says Musk As He Justifies Massive Layoffs At Twitter

mid massive layoffs at Twitter across the world, including in India, and the subsequent backlash, the microblogging site's new owner Elon Musk on Saturday justified the move, saying there was "no choice" when the company was losing millions of dollars daily.

The company posted a net loss of USD 270 million in the second quarter ended June 30, 2022 compared to a profit of USD 66 million in the same period a year ago.

"Regarding Twitter's reduction in force, unfortunately there is no choice when the company is losing over \$4M/day," Musk tweeted.

"Everyone exited was offered 3 months of severance, which is 50% more than legally required," he added.

Hundreds of employees were handed the pink slips at Twitter on Friday as Musk, 51, started overhauling the social media platform which he bought for a whopping USD 44 billion late last month.

In a letter to employees obtained by multiple media outlets on Friday, the company said employees would find out by 9 am Pacific Standard Time if they had been laid off. The email did not say how many people would lose their jobs.

Twitter has also fired the majority of its over 200 employees in India. Sources said the layoffs are across engineering, sales and marketing, and communications teams. However, there is no clarity vet

on the severance package to be paid to employees laid off in India. The entire marketing and com-



munications department in India has been sacked, the sources said. Musk has blamed activists for

Musk has blamed activists for a significant drop in the company's revenues.

"Twitter has had a massive drop in revenue, due to activist groups pressuring advertisers, even though nothing has changed with content moderation and we did everything we could to appease the activists. Extremely messed up! They're trying to destroy free speech in America," Musk tweeted on Friday.

Twitter's roughly 7,500 employees have been expecting layoffs since Musk took the helm of the company. After he completed the acquisition of Twitter, Musk ousted CEO Parag Agrawal, legal executive Vijaya Gadde, Chief Financial Officer Ned Segal and General Counsel Sean Edgett.

He also removed the company's board of directors and installed himself as the sole board member.

Musk has also announced Twitter will charge USD 8 (around Rs 660) per month from verified (blue tick) accounts -- triggering intense debate on the social media platform
