Before the recent railway casualty, a Pulwama man was mowed down by a train in South Kashmir on July 2022, while in February this year, Zakir Khatana, 25, of Lolab was killed after hit by a train near Wanabal, Budgam.

Zakir was crossing railway track when hit by train. This was second such incident in 24 hours. Earlier, a man was crushed to death by a moving train at Budgam railway section. The data clearly suggests a clear

The One Vegetable Brain Experts Want You to Eat for Better Cognition as You Age

More and more people are in search of the best diet for brain health that will keep you sharp well into your golden years. The combination of an overall healthy diet and lifestyle will have a positive effect on your cognition, and knowing which foods to eat is a first step in the right direction.

Broccoli is on the list of cruciferous vegetables, which also includes nutrition powerhouses like cabbage, cauli-flower and Brussels sprouts. Including more of them in your diet is linked to a number of benefits, like lowering inflammation and protection against cancer, according to the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.

And now, emerging research suggests that compounds in broccoli and other crucifers may have impressive effects on keeping your brain healthy as you age

We asked William Li, MD, a physician, scientist, president and medical director of the Angiogenesis Foundation and author of Eat To Beat Disease: The New Science of How Your Body Can Heal Itself, for his thoughts on

eating broccoli to his patients and the possible effects on cognitive health.

Why Broccoli Is Good for the Brain 1. It Contains Sulforaphane

While sulforaphane is probably a new word, it soon may become as standard in your nutrition vocabulary as beta-carotene or flavonoids.

This is the compound in broccoli, and all cruciferous vegetables, that scientists are focusing on for its benefit in brain health, according to a March 2021 review in the International Journal of Molecular Sciences.

It's important to point out that the majority of the research on the link between sulforaphane and the brain has been done on animals or in test tubes. But experts say those studies have shown a decrease in inflammatory compounds linked to Alzheimer's Disease, which is significant info for older adults, according to the International Journal of Molecular Sciences review.

Small studies done on humans have shown sulforaphane may play a positive role in treating autism and schizophrenia, and potentially, other brain-related conditions, according to a May 2022 re-

"This bioactive compound stimulates the body's defense mechanisms leading to improved circulation, nerve cell development, gut health and immunity while lowering inflammation," Dr. Li says.

It's worth noting that the few sulforaphane studies done on humans have shown positive benefits using supplements or high-potency extracts, which may not be comparable to the amount of sulforaphane available in foods.

2. It's Rich in Vitamin K

Vitamin K is often taught as a necessary nutrient for blood clotting, but it does so much more than that, especially when it comes to your brain function.

Dr. Li touts the importance of vitamin K for the brain. "Vitamin K2 is a special form of vitamin K that can lower inflammation and has antioxidant properties, which can protect brain cells.'

In a study with 325 older adults, researchers found that those with higher levels of vitamin K in the brain were 17 to 20 percent less likely to depairment, per the April 2022 research in the Alzheimer's Association Translational Research and Clinical Interven-

3. It's High in Fiber

While we wait for more human studies to explore the link between specific compounds



improved cognitive function, one sure thing is that the benefits of fiber in broccoli are not disputed.

The connection between eating fiber and cognition might not be obvious, but there is evidence that what happens in the gut affects the brain.

The gut-brain connection explains the concept that the central nervous system and gut microbiome communicate bi-directionally. In other words, the state of each one affects the state of the other one, and what's going on in your gut may influence brain plasticity and cognitive function, according to an April 2015 review in Annals of Gastroenterology.

Broccoli also contains dietary fiber that promotes gut health by feeding the good bacteria in the microbiome," Dr. Li says. "Well-fed gut bacteria produce their own substances that have been shown to improve metabolism, lower inflammation and help ward off harmful visceral fat." And all of this affects your brain.

In a 19-year-long study, researchers found people who ate the most fiber (an average of 20 grams per day) had the lowest risk of dementia, and people who ate the least fiber (an average of only 8 grams per day) had the highest risk, per the results in the February 2022 issue of Nutritional Neuro-

How Much Broccoli Should You Eat?

There is no general recommendation for how much broccoli you should eat daily, but there is a recommendation for how many fruit and vegetable servings you should get in a day.

In a study that analyzed the diets of over 66,000 people, researchers found that eating five servings of fruits or vegetables per day provided the most health benefits, according to the March 2021 results in Circulation.

"I recommend eating broccoli to my patients because it is a nutritious vegetable with bioactive compounds including sulforaphane — that support their body's health defense systems, and so, aid and protect their brain function."

Work to get anywhere from 1/2 to 1 cup of broccoli a couple of times per week, and keep a wide variety of cruciferous vegetables in your diet for the

Does Flour Go Bad? Here's When You **Should Replace Your Baking Staples**

Whether you're an avid baker or someone who gets an occasional craving for homemade chocolate chip cookies, it's important to know how to keep those staple ingredients fresh so you can use them for as long as

Let's be honest, most people are guilty of buying a bag of flour or a canister of baking soda and using it over the course of several years without thinking twice. The truth is, using expired baking ingredients can greatly alter the taste and texture of your scratch-made sweets. Before you purge your pantry of these items, there are a few things to look out for to see if they need to be replaced, or can still be used to create a bevy of delicious baked goods.

Does Flour Go Bad?

Have you ever noticed that flour almost always comes in a giant paper bag? While flour is considered to be non-perishable, it will certainly go bad if left in that bag for too long. In fact, flour will only stay fresh for about three months if not stored properly. That's why you should transfer any store-bought flour to an air-tight container after you open it. By moving the flour to a designated food storage container, you can extend its shelf life for up to two years.

If you use alternative types of flour, like oat or almond flour, make sure they're also stored in a similar air-tight container, because they will spoil much faster than all-purpose white flour. If stored properly, almond flour has a shelf life of about one year.

Does Sugar Go Bad?

Unlike flour, granulated white sugar truly has an indefinite expiration date, especially when stored in a dry, dark place. This is the reason why foods like jelly and peanut butter can stay good for so long-because sugar acts as an effective preservative.

However, brown sugar is a bit different because it hardens when it's exposed to air. That's why you'll notice that brown sugar turns into a brick when left in its original packaging. To make the most of your brown sugar, store it in an air-tight container and use it within two years for optimal freshness and flavor. You can also store brown sugar in the freezer, but keep in mind that it will need to thaw for a few hours before use.

Confectioners' or powdered sugar can also last a lifetime if stored the same way. However, just like white and brown sugar, if confectioners' sugar is exposed to moisture or air, it won't taste as good. Your best bet is to transfer any type of sugar to an air-tight storage container and keep in the back of the pantry.

Under the initiative, the Government of India aims to reduce unnecessary intervention during childbirth, reduce the caesarean rate and balance the burden on doctors. A new Cadre of Nurse practitioners' midwives has been created to support the women throughout their

pregnancy, childbirth and postpartum stage. The midwives are going to be trained for 18 months as per the International Confederation of Midwives (ICM) standards at National Midwifery Training Institutes (NMTI).

The NPMs will run a full fledged ANC clinic, a midwifery led labour room and postpartum clinic in the high case load facilities. In the MLCU, they will manage normal, uncomplicated deliveries and collaborate with the obstetrician to manage complications.

Dr Qazi Haroon, State Programme Manager, NHM J&K and Incharge

Maternal Health presented an overview of the Midwifery initiative. The workshop was

inaugurated by Ayushi Sudan, Mission Director, NHM, J&K. She said that after this training of midwives as per ICM standards they would become an asset for the healthcare system. Receding Pandemic

In a clearest sign so far that the Covid-19 pandemic is on its way out, the Centre on Wednesday announced that face masks are no longer compulsory during air travel. The latest decision has been taken in line with the government's policy of a graded approach to COVID-19 management response. The airlines have been told that the in-flight announcements henceforth may only mention that passengers should preferably use mask in view of the threat posed by COVID-19. They have also been told that any specific reference to fine or penal action for not wearing the mask should be eschewed. Up until now, the use of masks or face covers while travelling on flights was mandatory.

The centre's fresh directive follows the receding threat from the pandemic. This is apparent from the new Covid numbers. India only logged 635 new coronavirus infections in the last 24 hours, while the active cases declined to 7,175, according to the latest data from the Union Health Ministry. Similarly fatalities have been reduced to just eleven. The active cases comprise now 0.02 per cent of the total infections and the national COVID-19 recovery rate has increased to 98.79 per cent. We seem to have come a long way when we realize that on January 25 this year India crossed the milestone of four crore infections.

Though India has recently witnessed the emergence of a new Omicron sub-variant XBB, which has led to some minor outbreaks here and there, the overall trend remains one of a steep decline in the cases. Though there is some cause for optimism here, things could still turn messy if the existing pandemic-related precautions are thrown to the winds. The Omicron wave early this year was gigantic in nature but its fallout was cushioned by the relatively moderate nature of the virus.

But the continuously mutating sub-variants of the Omicron virus could in time trigger yet another wave. So people have to continue to take care. It is too soon to abandon the masks or give up the use of sanitizers. The Standard Operating Procedure remain as relevant as it did when the pandemic broke out in early 2020. Meanwhile, we can celebrate our triumph on the Covid pandemic with the least number of Covid cases and fatalities to date. In Kashmir too, the drastic reduction in Covid cases is a cause for celebration. It is also a boon for tourism which has witnessed a bumper year so far with over one crore people visiting the union territory. We can't afford to let this momentum slow down.

India's Leadership at G20

t was inevitable that the G20 summit would be overshadowed by Russia's invasion of Ukraine, and that the divisions over this conflict would resonate in the meeting. In terms of the size of their economies and their stage of development, the G20 is a diverse group. Most countries want to see Russia and Ukraine resolve the conflict at the talks table, and are alarmed that those that lecture others on diplomatic resolution continue to pour significant money and national energies into this war. No country wants this war, but not everyone is on the same page over an outright condemnation of Russia. This is why, as Prime Minister Joko Widodo of Indonesia said, the discussion of the conflict was the "most contentious" at the summit. Russian President Vladimir Putin did not attend the summit, and sent Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov in his place, who lashed out at the assembly for politicising the war.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi — whose advice to President Putin in September that "this is not the era of war" is said to have played a role in hammering out the joint declaration — underlined the challenges India will face during its presidency: "Geopolitical tensions, economic slowdown, rising food and energy prices, and the long-term ill-effects of the pandemic". He rightly stressed that peace and development were essential for people to reap the fruit of economic development. Modi has promised that India's leadership of the G20 will be "inclusive, ambitious, decisive, and actionoriented", hinting that Delhi is planning to push a global campaign for a sustainable lifestyle, LiFE (Lifestyle for Environment). The theme of India's G-20 chairmanship, as announced earlier this month, is "One Earth, One Family, One Future". For India, this is an opportunity to make a concerted push for the global south. A debt crisis haunts many middle income economies. Climate change, and finding the money to make the "clean" transition, is another challenge This is an opportunity for India to make a mark as a global leader. Delhi must avoid the temptation to turn its presidency into a gimmicky year-long "festival of India" in the runup to the 2024 general elections.

Despite the fraught session, the summit had consequential bilateral interactions, including a first meeting between Prime Minister Modi and the new British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak. Sunak's green light to the reciprocal "young professionals scheme" under which the UK will give 3,000 visas to Indian graduates in the age group of 18-30 to live and work in the country for two years is likely to smoothen the path towards a quick finalisation of the Free Trade Agreement which hit a road bump last month. The meeting between US President Joe Biden and Chinese President Xi Jinping may not have helped them to find common ground, but the important takeaway from this, which India, as a Quad ally must note, is that the two sides are engaged.

he headline story in world football this summer concerned young French phenomenon Kylian Mbappe's decision to sign a three-year contract extension with Paris Saint-Germain (PSG) at the expense of pursuing his lifelong dream move to Spanish giants Real Madrid.

PSG, which is owned by the state-funded Qatar Sports Investments (QSI), made the 23-year-old Mbappe the highest-paid footballer in the world, and even reportedly gave him a \$125m signing bonus, a virtually unheard of fee for a team retaining its own player.

In a far less reported story, in late May the Argentine national football team cancelled a scheduled friendly match against Israel, responding to calls to pull out of the match by the Palestinian Al-Khader Football Club, whose 19-year-old player Mohammad Ali Ghoneim was shot dead by Israeli occupation forces in April.

Elsewhere in recent weeks, the Egyptian national football team found itself at the heart of a major regional crisis. Following its shocking 2-0 defeat to Ethiopia in the qualifiers for next year's Africa Cup of Nations, emotions ran high as fans and political officials could not help but draw connections between the team's performance on the pitch and Egypt's ongoing feud with Ethiopia over its construction of the Grand Ethiopian Renaissance Dam, which Egyptians consider an existential threat to the country's access to Nile waters.

In other news, Miguel Salgado, the 17-year-old son of former Real Madrid and Spain defender Michel Salgado, was recently called up to represent his country's under-20 team - that country being the United Arab Emirates, where the elder Salgado has worked since retiring from football a decade ago.

Together, these stories showcase the ubiquitous place that football has come to hold in the Middle East and, in turn, the region's impact on football globally. Football has long been the most popular sport in much of the Middle East, capturing the imagination of millions of people, channelling their aspirations, and uplifting legions of fans in the process.

Broader phenomena at work

More than a game, however, football has also emerged as a crucial marker of the levers of political and economic control, as well as an instrument in the hands of those who would challenge the reigning order.

Ever since Fifa shocked fans around the globe in 2010 by granting Qatar hosting rights for the 2022 World Cup, journalists, academics, activists, political leaders and lovers of the game the world over have clamoured to make sense of the decision and weigh the implications of a small Arab state serving as home to the most popular sporting event on the planet.

And while questions regarding labour rights, soft-power politics and the role of money in football have loomed over much of the conversation around the 2022 World Cup, others have seen how football offers a lens to identify broader phenomena at work in the region.

It is in that spirit that we approached our work on Football in the Middle East: State, Society, and the Beautiful Game, a new book in which 12 scholars offer insights into how football has become an arena of contest and dispute across a

How Football Became A Game-Changer For The Middle East

wide array of issues.

One of the first things that becomes apparent is that football's legacy in the Middle East long predates the point at which it began to play host to a World Cup, or leverage unparalleled oil wealth in the European transfer market.

Indeed, European colonial officials introduced football to the region over a century ago, as part of efforts to cultivate "properly obedient individuals" out of colonised subjects.

In turn, nationalist struggles led by local elites incorporated a strong belief in organised sports as a marker of cultural and civilisational advance, with the creation of the Egyptian football league a case in point.

As the early iterations of storied football clubs as Al-Ahly and Zamalek demonstrate, the establishment of a national league created a new terrain on which questions of national identity, social class, economic mobility and the distribution of political power would play out.

Success and failure on the pitch would reflect fierce competition among nascent sporting institutions over access to resources, promising players and the hearts of Egyptian fans across the country.

Tense relations

It was no surprise, then, that in the aftermath of Gamal Abdel Nasser's rise to power in a post-colonial Egypt, football yet again served as a site of political struggle, this time between Egyptian citizens and an emerging authoritarian regime that sought to control the lives of millions of passionate fans. As his popularity rose, Nasser was named honorary president of Al-Ahly, and proceeded to appoint a trusted military official to head the Egyptian Football Association.

Soon after, Nasser spearheaded the establishment of the Confederation of African Football in 1957, and inaugurated the Africa Cup of Nations at a time when Egypt was facing international isolation following its standoff with former colonial powers Britain and France. Egypt lifted the trophy in the first tournament, and to date has won more African cups (seven) than any other country.

In time, states would more frequently project their political agendas onto their national football teams. At the 1998 World Cup, a group stage match between Iran and the United States offered a stage upon which to play out years of hostility between the two nations, dating back to the 1979 Iranian revolution.

The build-up to the match, which Iran won 2-1 in dramatic fashion, featured intense media scrutiny and charged political sentiments expressed by fans on both sides, while the American and Iranian heads of state attempted to seize the moment to offer conciliatory gestures amid otherwise tense relations.

Incidentally, Iran and the US are set to meet in Qatar's Al Thumama Stadium in another group stage showdown later this year. In the wake of an escalating regional rivalry and stalled attempts to restart the Iran nuclear deal, the match is sure to take on far greater meaning than the result on the field.

Popular mobilisation Beyond attempts to

prop up authoritarian rulers or challenge rival states, passion for football has also been invoked in the course of popular mobilisation.

During the 2011 Arab uprisings, football fan groups such as Al-Ahlawy Ultras in Cairo played an important role in the mass protests confronting the regime of Hosni Mubarak, bringing a wealth of experience in confronting security forces and challenging state power.

More recently, the Hirak protest movement in Algeria, which sought to prevent ailing dictator Abdelaziz Bouteflika from running for a fifth consecutive presidential term, incorporated in their anti-regime street protests the popular cheers, chaabi folk songs and tifo visual displays usually reserved for match days.

So too has the Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions (BDS) movement, launched by Palestinian civil society, seized upon football's global appeal to call upon fans, clubs, national teams and their sponsors to observe the cultural boycott of Israel in response to its

continued occupation of Palestinian land and human rights abuses against Palestinians.

Building upon the sports boycott targeting apartheid South Africa, the BDS movement has succeeded in highlighting the plight of Palestinians in part through campaigns such as the successful cancellation of the Argentina-Israel match and the call for teams and fans to boycott Puma until it ends its sponsorship of teams based in illegal Israeli settlements.

As several scholars argue in Football in the Middle East, observing elements of football's role in society can offer a useful lens to examine deeper issues affecting populations, beyond players and fans.

Refugees who fled to neighbouring Lebanon following Israel's forcible expulsion of hundreds of thousands of indigenous Palestinians in 1948 continue to live as stateless residents, denied many basic rights and access to dozens of specified professions.

Lebanon's football league has institutionalised these discriminatory practices by placing quotas on the number of Palestinian players allowed at each club and even denying them the opportunity to play as goalkeepers.

Gender discrimination Similarly, football can

provide a means by which to both expose and challenge gender discrimination. In Turkey, for instance, the women's game has been subject to unequal treatment, resulting in female footballers experiencing high wage disparities, inadequate medical care, limited access to facilities and greater career insecurity compared with male players.

In Iran, the ban on female fans in stadiums has been challenged not only by Fifa and international human rights organisations, but by the spectators themselves, in a series of tense confrontations.

Moreover, the lead-up to the 2022 World Cup has helped shed light on a number of issues of significance to the Gulf region in particular. The Qatar national team players who will participate in the tournament later this year include full Qatari citizens, long-term residents born in the country and naturalised citizens who came from elsewhere.

Nevertheless, be it in media interviews, social media posts or celebrations on the pitch, the performance of national identity by squad members often challenges preconceived notions concerning identity and citizen-

ship in Gulf states.

On the question of migrant labour rights, preparations for the World Cup have exposed a global audience to the abuses inherent in the kafala system that governs labour relations in the Gulf.

As state authorities, global construction firms and recruitment agencies oversaw major projects, from stadiums and training facilities to hotels and a citywide metro system, an international pressure campaign urged Qatar to reform its labour practices.

The government announced a series of reforms in 2017, and the following year saw the International Labour Organization (ILO) open an office in Doha, where it has reported on changes to the conditions of migrant workers.

Rise of the Gulf states

The 2022 World Cup has come to symbolise the role that cash-rich states play by shifting the centre of gravity in world football. Indeed, the past two decades have witnessed significant transformations in the sport, with the increased globalisation and commodification of the game.

The 2008 purchase of Manchester City FC by an Emirati royal investment group, followed soon after by QSI's acquisition of PSG, ushered in a new era of Gulf states becoming major players in Europe's top leagues. Beyond the results on the field, these states have leveraged their prestigious holdings in the pursuit of soft power diplomacy and geopolitical interests.

In 2015, for instance, the Guardian reported that members of Man City's front office had lobbied the British government to launch an investigation into the Muslim Brotherhood as an extension of the Emirati government's regionwide crackdown against the movement. The recent acquisition of Newcastle United by the Saudi Public Investment Fund prompted allegations that the regime was engaged in sportswashing, particularly in light of its recent torrent of human rights abuses both at home and abroad.

Elsewhere, the war over football broadcasting rights took centre stage during the blockade of Qatar by a quartet of neighbouring countries that began in 2017. A pirate satellite signal based in Saudi Arabia called "beoutQ" operated for two years, undercutting the Qatari-run beIN Sports network, which holds broadcasting rights to the world's most watched football competitions.

Looking ahead, the future of football in the Middle East is likely to be even more intertwined with the broader political, cultural and socioeconomic developments in the region. As the beautiful game's reach expands ever further into society and becomes more deeply enmeshed within state and corporate interests, it is sure to raise new questions regarding consumerism and sustainability, national interests and labour rights, regime stability and political freedoms.

As the highs and lows of the game reverberate far beyond the field, it becomes clear to all that football is more than just a game.





Saurabh Bhagat Reviews SVEEP, Special Summary Revision Of Baramulla PC

SC To Hear Plea Of Navlakha, NIA Today In Elgar Parishad-Maoist Link Case

New Delhi: The Supreme Court agreed to list for hearing on Friday a fresh plea of activist Gautam Navlakha, who has not been put under house arrest despite the apex court's direction in the Elgar Parishad-Maoist link case.

A bench headed by Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud on Thursday took note of the submissions of senior lawyer Nitya Ramakrishnan, appearing for Navlakha, that the apex court's November 10 direction to shift him from Navi Mumbai's Taloja prison to house arrest owing to his deteriorating health has not been compiled with so far.

Solicitor General (SG) Tushar Mehta, appearing for the NIA, said the accused, instead of giving the address of his house, has given the address of the library-cum-office of the Communist Party and moreover, a separate plea would also be filed during the day.

"The Communist Party, in any case, is not a banned organisation," Ramakrishnan said.

The SG said the probe agency was also in the process of filing an application and both the pleas can be listed together.

The CJI suggested that the plea of Navlakha be listed on Friday and the probe agency can mention its application before the bench.

The law officer, referring to some facts of the case, said both the applications needed to be heard together on Friday. The submissions were allowed.

On November 15, the top court cleared the hurdle for the release of Navlakha from Navi Mumbai's Taloja prison by waiving the requirement of a solvency certificate for availing the benefit of house arrest.

Prior to this, the top court had on November 10 allowed the 70-year-old Navlakha to be placed under house arrest owing to his deteriorating health.

It had said that to avail the facility of house arrest, Navlakha will provide local surety of Rs 2 lakh by November 14.

While ordering that Navlakha be placed under house arrest, the bench comprising Justice K M Joseph and Justice Hrishikesh Roy had noted that the activist has been in custody since April 14, 2020, and prima facie there was no reason to reject his medical report.

It had said that Navlakha does not have any criminal background except this case and even the Government of India had appointed him as interlocutor to hold talks with Maoists.

Putting a number of conditions, it had also said Navlakha will not be allowed to use a computer and Internet during his house arrest.

"Petitioner will not use a computer, Internet or any other communication device while under house arrest. He will, however, be permitted to use a mobile phone without Internet, provided by police personnel on duty, once a day for 10 minutes in the presence of the police," the bench said.

The apex court had also said that Navlakha shall not be allowed to leave Mumbai and he will not attempt, in any manner, to influence witnesses during his house arrest.

Television and newspapers will be allowed, but these cannot be Internet-based, it had said.

It had allowed the Maharashtra Police to search and inspect the residence and said the accommodation would be under surveillance.

Navlakha would not be allowed to leave the house except for walks in the company of police personnel, it said. He would also be permitted to meet his lawyers as per Jail Manual rules and intimate police personnel in case of a medical emergency, the apex court had said.

The activist had appealed to the apex court against the April 26 order of the Bombay High Court dismissing his plea for house arrest over apprehensions of lack of adequate medical and other basic facilities in Taloja jail near Mumbai, where he is lodged.

The case relates to alleged inflammatory speeches made at the Elgar Parishad conclave held in Pune on December 31, 2017, which the police claim triggered violence the next day near the Koregaon-Bhima war memorial on the outskirts of the western Maharashtra city.

The notice further said that as per the directions of administrative department of Industries and Commerce on November 4, 2022, a final notice of 15 days is being served to all the (389) allottees from the date of issuance of this notice, who did not respond to earlier notices, to deposit the payment and complete formalities.

"Failing which it shall be presumed that they have nothing to say in their defence and the allotment order shall be deemed to have been cancelled or withdrawn ab-initio, if no convincing response is received during this period", Sethi said.

She further said that in accordance with procedural guidelines to the Jammu & Kashmir industrial land allotment policy, 30 days notice was served upon the unit holders, who failed to deposit the payment and complete the requisite formalities.

"Additionally a show cause notice of seven days and final notice of five days was also served through email. They again failed to deposit the due amount and complete the necessary formali-

"There are 4500 applications in queue for grant of allotment in setting up units in J&K. If they don't respond, there are others in the queue", Sethi

As per the notice SIDCO and SICOP issued land allotments or letter of intent (LOIs) in terms of Industrial Policy 2021-30 in compliance to the approval accorded by high level land allotment committee in its first meeting held on July 1, 2021 & December 30, 2021.

As per terms and conditions of allotment orders, the allottees were required to deposit the land premium, execute lease deed and complete other formalities within 60 days time frame from the date of issuance of said allotment order. However some unit holders have failed to deposit the due amount & complete the necessary formalities within the stipulated time period, Sethi said.

Jammu & Kashmir Land Allotment Policy, 2021-30 provides land allotment process and envisages that in case of non-execution of lease deed, including non-payment of payable premium, even after the expiry of notice period, the land allotment shall be cancelled by the concerned industrial development corporation immediately, she said.

As per the procedural guidelines, allotment policy provide that in case of failure on the part of allottees to make total payment towards premium within stipulated time from the date of allotment letter, violation of any condition of the lease deed, failure to come into production within stipulated time, among others, the concerned estates officer shall immediately take necessary action for determination of the lease deed and eviction of the allottees under the said act and rules made there under.
