J&K's Digital Education Needs A Boost, Says UDISE Report

100 PERCENT GOVERNMENT-AIDED SCHOOLS and 62.5 percent private-unaided schools provide internet facilities, but only 22.3 percent government schools had the facility, which is even worse than the national average (24.2 per cent)

efforts espite afoot to digitize civic affairs and governance structure in Jammu Kashmir, the region's 'slow progress" in the digital education—gaining momentum in the mainland-has prompted a new report to suggest some boost measures.

As per the latest Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE) report, only 32.6 per cent of schools in J&K had functional computer facilities in the academic year of 2021-22. The UDISE data has also shown stark difference in availability of computer and internet facilities in government as compared to private schools in J&K.

This disparity has prob-ably affected the kind of digital education options available to government schools during the pandemic.

Only 21.9 per cent of government schools had a functional computer facility which has largely dragged down the JK's average. At the same time, the

government-aided schools have registered 100 percent

functional computer facilities, while the private-unaided schools have shown 77.1 per cent progress in J&K. When compared with the national average of government-aided (67.5 per cent) and private schools (71.9 per cent), J&K did much better. The region has even sur-

passed several states including Assam, Bihar, Madhya Pradesh More on P6

Poonch: A top army commander Tuesday said that the total number of militants active in Jammu and Kashmir hovers around 300 and that includes 82 foreigners and 53 locals while all efforts, he said, were on to foil their attempts to target the security forces.

Addressing a press conference in Poonch on the occasion of Poonch Link Up Day, General Commanding-in-Chief Officer Northern Command Lieutenant General Upendera Dwivedi said that figures available with the army suggest that there are 300 militants active in J&K including the Rajouri-Poonch area.

"There are 82 foreign militants and 53 local militants active in J&K. Worrisome is that there are almost 170 unidentified militants listed with the army who are tasked to conduct criminal he said. The army activities."

Gamers Seek Fame, Riches in World's Next Esports Hub India

ext to a primary school and a shabby playground in In-dia's financial capital Mumbai stands a plush four-story building that's home to the world's newest breed of athlete.

More than 20 young "streamers" in residence spend their day playing video games, training hard for televised esports tournaments that draw in millions of viewers. Equipped with bunkbeds, cubicles and a kitchen with a full-time chef, the gaming house is one of many popping up around the country -- testament to the explosive growth of an industry that's attracting investment from around the world.

"We eat, sleep and play under the same roof," said Animesh Agarwal, founder of Mumbai-based content creator and gaming talent management company S8UL. "When we play big ticket tournaments, it's all about the mental play. We need to bring teams together to build trust."

While still in its infancy compared to the US, China and Japan, investors are betting on huge growth in Indian esports -- powered by one of the world's youngest populations and cheap mobile data. Tournaments are attracting huge prime-time television audiences, while thousands pack into arenas to watch teams play shooter games on their mobile phones, with the action beamed onto giant screens.

Dubai-based esports firm Galaxy Racer is joining up with one of Asia's largest music festivals Sunburn to host a three-day tournament from Nov. 18 in the city of Hyderabad, where players of the first-person hero shooter game

Valorant will compete for a prize pool of \$100,000. "India's growing middle class will

have more disposable income, which they will spend on entertainment of their choice," said Akshat Rathee, managing director of Nodwin Gaming, which organized the three-week Battlegrounds Mobile India Masters Series tournament earlier this year. These eyeballs are going to be worth a lot of money."

The industry was jolted in July when India's government demanded the Battlegrounds game be removed from app stores. But investors and gamers seem unfazed by the disruption and the potential for more regulatory action, figuring the order was aimed at a Chinese-backed firm and there are plenty of other blockbuster titles to fill the void.

"Our revenues have only gone up after the game was taken away," said Rohit Jagasia, the founder of Revenant Esports, whose teams play a range of titles and announced a sponsorship deal from sportswear brand Puma in October.

The industry, excluding real money gaming, is expected to grow to \$4 billion by the fiscal year ending March 2027, from \$1.1 billion in 2022, according to gaming focused venture capital fund Lumikai. India was the largest consumer of mobile games in the world this fiscal year, topping China and the US with 15 billion downloads, it said.

Investor interest remains strong, even after the government action against Battlegrounds, said Lumikai's founding general partner Salone Sehgal. "Investors care about the longterm picture, and that is still intact," she said



Mobile Global Esports Inc., a U.S.based firm that runs India's biggest university esports competition with more than 400 teams, raised \$6.75 million in an initial public offering on the Nasdaq exchange in July. "It's very clear that all components for a successful capitalistic venture with extreme upside exists here," said Richard Whelan, founder of MOGO.

Unlike other gaming markets where play is console- or PC-based, Indian users access live-streams mainly via their mobile devices. Thanks to cheap data from wireless carriers such as Reliance Jio Infocomm Ltd., India

is among the highest mobile data users in the world. The nation will have 1 billion smartphone users by 2026, from 750 million last year, according to Deloitte.

The rollout of 5G in India will give gaming a further boost, according to Sean Hyunil Sohn, the chief executive officer of Krafton India whose South Korean parent created hit video game PUBG: Battlegrounds, and the Indian version Battlegrounds Mobile.

"When 5G is established, we will have much more resources to deploy more games into the Indian market,' said Sohn.

me," said Ahmad, whose player name is Mamba. "I used to play games till 4 am during my engineering days -- now I am supporting my family with it."

Saloni Pawar, 23, is one of a growing number of women gamers, though doesn't play for S8UL or reside in its training house. She was the first woman to represent India internationally, and helped her team come second in a tournament in Thailand in 2019.

"My parents have told me to do more 'girly' things and not sit at home playing games," said Pawar, who has almost 61,000 YouTube subscribers and has collaborated with brands such as LG and Asus. "But once money started flowing in, they turned supportive."

The industry does face some difficulties, not least the fact that esports are not officially recognized as a sport -- making it more difficult for players to gain visas to take part in international tournaments. There needs to be a clear distinction between esports that require skill, and other online "games of chance" such as rummy or poker, according to Lokesh Suji, director of Esports Federation of India.

The government action against Battlegrounds Mobile has also fueled uncertainty for developers, according to Rishi Alwani, communications manager and writer at SuperGaming. "The concern is not whether this a permanent ban or not, it's about the lack of clarity," he said.

There's been no official government comment on the decision to remove the battle royale shooter game from app stores, though industry participants suspect concerns over data privacy. India's technology ministry didn't respond to emailed requests for comment.

Srinagar's Namda Man Gives New Twist To Dying Craft

Kashmir's Srinagar: lone Nuno felting artisan is blending traditional art with Australian technology to give a modern look to Namda.

Namda, a rug made of wool was introduced in Kashmir during the reign of Mughal Emperor Akbar and used as flooring during winters in Kashmir. But over the years, the demand for Namda declined with a few craftspersons left now.

Among them, Farooq Ahmad Khan of Khanqah-e-Sokhta in Safa Kadal's Srinagar, an old hand, has incorporated the technique to come up with new designs of Namda so that it can introduce life to the dying art. Khan said that he learnt the craft grandparents and his parents.

"Majority of artisans have already left the craft due to low market demand. It took me years together to learn Nuno felting, which is a fabric felting technique used to press loose fibres, usually sheep's wool, into soft fabrics such as silk. This technique has an Australian origin," said Khan, who is

From KO Archives Bomb Attack In Anantnag; 1 Killed, 45 Injured

rinagar- One person was killed and 45 others, including four women injured in a blast near Anantnag headquarters of Superintendent of Police this morning, reports said. The condition of ten more persons is stated to be serious. The blast occurred at 10-30 a.m., when large number of

civilians had gathered outside SP's office to seek a meeting with him. SP was in his office chamber when the explosion rocked outside his office, reports reaching here said.

The explosion left over 40 people injured. Eleven critical persons were shifted to hospital first, where one of them was declared brought dead. He was identified as Mohammad Yusuf. Son of Abdul Aziz Rather of Larkipora, Anantnag.

While others are out of danger, reports said, ten people have suffered serious wounds. Doctors are trying their best to stem their hemorrhages Four Special Police Officers are among also among the injured, besides two home guard personnel.

Following the explosion, security forces opened fire in all the directions, injuring a civilian. He was also removed to hospital, where his condition is stated to be serious. The security personnel fired from their bunkers, sparking panic in the entire town.

There were contradictory reports as to what caused the explosion outside the SP's Office in Anantnag. While police said it was a bomb explosion, witnesses said, an explosive device was tossed towards the SP's Office which exploded with a bang.

Security forces and SOG personnel later sealed the area and started searching the area. Residents were huddled in one of the grounds and masked informers scanned through them to find out the suspected militants. Police blamed the militants for the explosion. However, no

militant group has owned the same so far.

This is the second explosion in three days in Anantnag. Earlier on Thursday a cop was killed and 12 others including the daughter and son of the former union junior home minister, Maqbool Dar were injured in a landmine explosion.

Militants, meanwhile, hurled grenades and followed it by firing with AK rifles on an ITBP camp in Baghwanpora, Verinag in Anantnag district overnight, reports said. The fire was returned and the ensuing fire-fight lasted for several hours, causing panic among the residents living in the area (KÁSHMIR OBSERVEŘ, 23 NOVEMBER, 1998)

No time for Indo-Pak talks

n an interesting comment, National Conference president Dr Farooq Abdullah on Monday called on the union government to use its presidency of G20 to engage Pakistan to address the Kashmir issue. He also urged the government to help the world end the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war. Abdullah, who has been the former J&K Chief Minister, said he was tired of the media dubbing anyone making a case for India-Pakistan dialogue as "anti-national."

He is right. In recent years, advocating talks between the two neighbours has become a taboo subject in the political discourse of the country. And there are reasons for it. The union government under prime minister Narendra Modi has taken Kashmir off the table in any future discussions with Pakistan. This was also made clear by home minister Amit Shah during his visit to Kashmir in October. Addressing a well-attended rally in Baramulla, the home minister refused to engage with Pakistan, saying instead he would prefer to talk with Gujjars and Paharis and also with the youth of Kashmir. This has made the chances of any re-engagement between the two neighbours in the near future look very bleak.

The removal of Article 370 in August 2019 and the subsequent measures have fundamentally altered the ground situation in J&K in most of its aspects. It has also changed the complexion of the Kashmir issue as it existed before. The home minister's rally in Baramulla was a testament to this reality.

But it is also true that the union government did engage with the neighbouring country informally for months after the withdrawal of Article 370. The back-channel talks were reported to have begun in November 2020 and by February 2021, the two countries reinstated the otherwise defunct 2003 ceasefire along the Line of Control. The truce was marked by a brief spell of bonhomie. Both the then Pakistan prime minister Imran Khan and the Army chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa called for dialogue and resolving Kashmir in a peaceful manner. But there was no further progress on the back-channel making it difficult for the two neighbours to move to the front-channel.

And now, with the two countries due to hold their national elections in the next two years - Pakistan in 2023 and India in 2024 - the chances of an engagement have further ebbed. The ongoing turmoil in Pakistan has further complicated the matters. Now, if at all, any meaningful talks can only happen after the new governments are formed in the two countries which would happen only after 2024. So Abdullah's call for the resumption of India-Pakistan engagement is unlikely to find any traction in the current situation.

ongoing election campaign in Gujarat is the focus of media attention in the country and rightly so. More so, with the AAP entering the fray. Its leader Arvind Kejriwal has been in the state to try and replicate his party's triumph in Punjab. The key question is whether he can pull it off. In Gujarat, he is up against the toughest odds. Gujarat is not Punjab. It is in this state that the phenomenon of prime minister Narendra Modi began in 2001, when he was first made the chief minister of the state. Rest as the cliche goes is the history.

The BJP has already been in power in Gujarat for 27 years, making it too entrenched in the state to be easily dislodged. What is more, it hardly faces any antiincumbency issues. Under Modi, the BJP in Gujarat has become much more than a political party: it has become a part of the Gujarati identity. Gujaratis are perceived to be proud of the fact that one of their own is the prime minister of the country and another is the home minister. So, the BJP is not necessarily judged on the basis of its performance in the government but as the party of Modi, the prime minister of the country. This puts the Gujarat BJP beyond any political challenge on the traditional lines. The opposition can't draw attention to its governance shortcomings, as the party most likely won't be evaluated on that criterion. The parties can't even rail against Hindutva at a time when the ideology has become the reigning ideological creed of the country. Also, in Gujarat, the opposition have to contend with the fact that the BJP is the party of Modi, a

n son of the soil.

The advantages like these make the BJP unassailable. That said, Kejriwal has proved he is not a pushover. In Gujarat, he is attempting to fill the void left by the Congress party's decline as a viable political alternative. He is also trying to beat the BJP at its Hindutva game by plying a Hindutva lite version of the ideology. And in this pursuit, the AAP leader has even shocked the BJP by demanding that images of Hindu deities Lakshmi and Ganesh be printed on currency notes for the economy to do well. He has now also sought a uniform civil code - one of the BJP's core electoral planks - and sought its nationwide implementation. Once during his campaign, he emerged from the Somnath temple with a tripund on his forehead and rudraksha around his wrists. Earlier, he has also chanted the Hanuman Chalisa and flagged off pilgrim trains to the temple town of there are not even distant signs that it will end there. Competition is getting tougher with Congress also in the process of rejuvenating itself by hitting the road. Congress leader Rahul Gandhi is currently undertaking a padayatra to reconnect Congress with the people. The public response has so far been good. And the participation of people has grown with every passing day. It remains to be seen whether this public outreach could translate into any electoral gains for the party in Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh.

Keiriwal has shown political skills to get his party up and running out of nowhere. He could very well do so in Gujarat by peddling the Hindutva card. But it is also true that PM Modi's charisma is still fresh and more so in his home state where his remarkable journey began. So, it would be next to impossible to dislodge him in Gujarat. With every passing year, his political appeal and constituency have grown stronger and wider while that of Congress has correspondingly shrunk. But there are still two years to go before the general elections are held, and much can change during this time. Two years is a long time in politics. The outcome of the polls in Gujarat and Himachal could very well set the stage for 2024. More so, the one in Gujarat.

The a recent interview with Twinkle Khanna, filmmaker Karan Johar revealed that he wanted to "become Tabassum" when he grew up. His revelation that the late chat show host, who died this week at 78, was the inspiration for his show Koffee with Karan, is not surprising. To Indians of a certain vintage, the line of descent from Tabassum's popular Doordarshan chat show, Phool Khile Hain Gulshan Gulshan, to Johar's show couldn't be clearer. At a time when mystique was an essential part of the celebrity toolkit, Tabassum nudged her famous guests to let their guard down. Others, like Johar or Simi Garewal, have only followed the path she laid down.

It helped that Tabassum — born Kiranbala — was a Bollywood insider almost from the start. She began acting before she turned three, debuting in the 1947 film Nargis as Baby Tabassum. She took on more mature roles as she grew up, but her biggest success came as an interviewer, where she used her considerable charm to coax revelations out of her celebrity interviewees. With a flower tucked in her hair and her sari drawn over both shoulders, she soon came to be as recognisable a figure as some of the stars on her show.

Celebrity chat shows have been a mainstay of television since the 1990s. One might argue that Tabassum's gentle interviewing style won't work today. But as much as Tabassum relied on her native charm, she also deployed craft in her interviews. To watch her, for example, draw out a young, painfully shy Nazia Hassan, then still in school, to talk about her aspirations and even sing "Aap jaisa koi", is to get a masterclass in the art of the interview. Tabassum knew how to probe without prying, with conversations that remain, to this day, a pleasure to watch.

Single Use Plastic Not Fully Recycled

ccording to a recent study, only 8% of plastic waste makes it to recycling facilities and is properly processed. Recycling is not the solution to plastic pollution. Everyone in the country needs to end plastic pollution by becoming more aware of where plastic waste goes, fighting wasteful, single-use plastic practices encouraged by industry and bad politics alike, and reducing plastic consumption in general. The popularity of single-use of plastics harms both human society and global ecosystems. Businesses have few restrictions on the amount of plastic waste they can produce and few financial incentives to change their practices.90% of companies production of single-use plastic in the country do not get recycled. The burden of limiting plastic pollution should not fall on the everyday consumer. It's not the individual's fault. While the reasoning behind plastic recycling is sound, it's not the be-all and end-all of the environment; The

vast majority of plastic that ends up in the country's recycling facilities is not properly recycled.Only 5% of plastics produced in the country are properly recycled.That's just 0.25 million tons out of 5 million tons of plastic waste. Plastic waste takes more than 450 years to fully degrade, releasing myriad microplastics into the environment that can carry chemical contaminants and cause severe cellular damage if ingested. Plastics production has exploded in recent years: 50% of all plastics produced were made in the last two decades. With so little being properly recycled, the amount going to landfill has also increased dramatically. If country's plastic consumption continues as usual, plastic waste will triple by 2050, according to the study. Half of that goes straight to landfill, it's a future we can't afford to live in.

Has Kashmir's Fight Against Disability Become Personal?

For his community welfare works and crisis-management, Haneef has become a "messiah" for the differently-abled people of Kashmir.

ohammed Haneef is a textbook activist whose community campaign is touching many lives. This Pattan resident has become a new hope for the specially-abled people of Kashmir.

Haneef lost his vision in 2007 due to a reason he does not wish to mention. Since then, the resilient man never looked back and strived to turn his disability into strength.

He worked as an electrician before joining Voluntary Medicare Society (VMS), an organisation working for the welfare of the disabled people of Kashmir. Even after joining VMS, Haneef contin-

Even after joining VMS, Haneef continued to repair electrical fittings and appliances in the office, setting up an example for the rest of the staff members.

When the pandemic lockdown held everyone captive inside their home, Haneef visited disabled people with an ambulance and driver. His critical visits helped his brethren to face the trying times that human race had witnessed in decades. Kashmir. As a familiar figure now, he gets distress calls and addresses them curtly. And to sustain his Samaritan cause, the society is now throwing its weight behind him.

This silent activism worked wonders during the pandemic that freaked out the already fractured life and exposed faultlines in Kashmir. The restrictions imposed by the authorities to prevent the spread of COVID-19 had cast a spell of uncertainties around. While an ordinary person was struggling for some normalcy, it was the people with disabilities who were grappling with isolation and helplessness. Among them were the specially-abled children.

Though the speed of the internet was very slow in Kashmir back then, students were somehow trying to cope up with their studies. But it was the children with visual and mental disabilities who were facing the brunt of the lockdown. "For such students," said Bashir Lone of VMS, "only offline class was possible." During those virulent times, the VMS was arranging Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) kits for the educators who went to the homes of various special children for teaching. "Since attending the online classes was tough for those specially-abled children," Lone said, "we had started home visits at various locations. Something, I believe, was better than nothing." The education centres for special children were not able to provide classes to all the students back then. The restrictions had forced those children to stay at home. The special educators of various organizations working for the cause of physically and mentally disabled children conducted online classes from time to time but the slow speed of internet marred the dedicated efforts put in by these teachers. "The visually-impaired people needed timely medication and education and we provided door-to-door services to them," Lone said. "But we were not sure how much these PPE kits would protect our educators but still we needed to pull it off in those special circumstances. According to Lone, behavioural changes were seen in the mentally-unstable students who were away from schools for quite a while. Prolonged home stay had caused psychological disorders and bedsores to many disabled people. "Children had become more aggressive," he said. "And if they didn't get to talk to teachers for any longer, it might've gotten worse." At that point in time, Lone said, parents' cooperation saved their day and efforts. "They were very encouraging and wanted their kids to learn." One such parent was Muzaffar Ahmed, the father of Khabib Muzaffar.

While these individual efforts are tackling the disability distress every now and then, the larger community response is still missing. The bodies working for the welfare of the persons with disabilities often rally for the synergic support to save the ship from sinking.

Amid the absence of the collective response, Kashmir's disability predicament is deepening. Apart from the visually and mentally disabled children, even people with physical disabilities are being marginalized.

Irfan Rasool Lone became wheel-chair ridden after getting injured in a car accident in 2008. He did not move out of home for four years. He started rehabilitation at VMS, and now he plays basket-

"Disability leads to depression and the pandemic lockdown deteriorated the already distressed mental state of disabled people of Kashmir," Haneef said. "As someone wearing disabled shoes, I tried to motivate those people through counseling and consoling conversations."

Apart from his comforting visits, he spent 25 per cent of his salary on the needy. Recently, Haneef said, he helped a visually-challenged poor person to get a cornea transplant. The total cost of the operation was around Rs. 2.50 lakh. Out of which, Haneef got the assistance of Rs. 1.50 lakh from the VMS. He paid Rs. 50,000 from his own pocket.

> "I'm just playing a small part in lighting peoples' lives," he said. "It's not a big deal. That's how a human being has to be—helpful and considerate."

> With the same human quality, Haneef lately came to the rescue of a handicapped couple. He boosted their morale as well as helped them monetarily. "Sometimes these people just need an act of kindness, like a consoling talk," he said. "I'm happy I could comfort the couple."

Muzaffar's 12-year-old son was coming under severe depression because of being locked at home. The three-month therapy he got at the special school helped a lot, but things had deteriorated again during pandemic.

Back then, many educators faced street and security hassles despite the mandatory movement passes. "We had to re-

quest the office of the deputy commissioner to issue movement passes," Lone said, "but those passes had a validity of only 2-3 days."

However, in order to educate the specially-abled children, ambulances were being used to ferry the special educators from one place to another. "It helped our collective cause of educating speciallyabled children during those challenging times," Lone smiled.

Apart from education, the survival of the specially-abled community of Kashmir is equally crucial. This is where the likes of Lone are working quite unassumingly and effectively. The Samaritan is working for the better wage-structure for the persons with disability.

"People with disability get a meager amount of Rs 1000 as a pension," Lone said. "This amount is not enough to end their miseries. They struggle to make ends meet."

Working for the welfare of people with disabilities for many years now, Humanity Welfare Organisation Helpline (HWOH) is a leading crisis-manager in the region where the rights of the differently-abled are being brushed aside. But the body didn't buckle under the pressure of pandemic and attended the crisis head on.

"We send audio material on WhatsApp to the children with visual impairment and our special educator went to the homes of mentally challenged children twice a week," Javed Tak, founder HWOH, a south Kashmir-based welfare body.

"But a majority of students were unable to get an education, since they live at far off locations. But still, the visually-challenged students are somehow managing to study using the available technology, while the mentally-unstable children are facing many hassles."

Many children were becoming attention-deficit during pandemic, Tak said, as majority of them had no smartphones at their homes. "And the stigmas attached to COVID-19 were preventing their neighbours to give them their phones," he said. ball for disabled at the national level.

He often returns home in a very distressed state. "Be it bus stations or terminals," he said, "there are hardly any ramps at stands. The washrooms are also not accessible for physically disabled persons."

The same anguish is being voiced by Irfan Mir, a visually-challenged cricketer. Despite representing JK at National Level, he feels an apparent apathy for his tribe. "In every community, there are persons with disability," Mir said. "Ours isn't an exception. We are very much part of this society and our disability isn't our fault. We fated fate deserves some empathetic treatment and not a cold shoulder."

But till the community mobilization happens, Haneef wants to play his individual role with an unfaltering spirit.

He lately helped a handicapped couple from Hajin sonawari village. The poverty had forced the couple to live with their children under a tin shed.

"During summers, the tin shed gets very hot, and it is impossible to stay under that during the daytime," he said.

The welfare worker reported the old couple's case to VMS, and along with the organization, he helped them to build a small house. "Some of us might be attending the local cases only," Haneef said, "but small steps eventually become a giant leap."

Haneef was partially visually-impaired since birth but lost his sight completely in 2007.

The loss of vision did not become a hindrance in overcoming his weaknesses, rather he chose to show the world light through his eyes.

"During the previous lockdowns," Haneef says, "I teach my tribe to use available technology."

He also motivates visually-challenged people to not to stop learning and writing using Braille script. The Samaritan wants to open a training institute to teach electrical work to visually challenged people, but the paucity of funds forced him to withdraw hands.

"For this kind of investment, one needs a huge investment," Haneef said. "I neither have land nor types of equipment to start this. My sole objective is to help disabled people to shed their disabilities."

J&K's Digital Education

in terms of functional computer facilities in government-aided and private schools.

In the case of internet facilities at schools, only 29.7 per cent of schools in J&K provide it.

100 per cent government-aided schools and 62.5 per cent privateunaided schools provide internet facilities, but only 22.3 per cent government schools had the facility, which is even worse than the national average (24.2 per cent), the data revealed.

Pertinently, the data has come at a time when the government is investing in the model of education through digital mode that holds promise of being accessible to everyone, affordable, and can overcome the shortage of quality education.

Further, only 22 per cent of schools in J&K have functional desktops/PCs.

Even though 53 per cent of private schools have functional desktops/ PCs, only 14.5 per cent of government schools have such facilities in J&K.

In comparison, 100 per cent government-aided schools have functional desktops.

Moreover, the data reveals that only 12.6 per cent of schools in I&K have functional projectors.

"21.2 per cent of private schools have such facilities while only 10.6 per cent of government schools have such facilities," it notes.

J&K even lags behind in terms of schools with functional Smart Classrooms used for teaching with digital boards/ smart boards/ virtual classrooms/ smart TV availability.

Only 15.4 per cent of private schools and 6.4 per cent of government schools offer smart classrooms with digital boards, smart TVs, etc.

In comparison with the national average of 14.9 per cent, J&K has only 8.1 per cent of smart classrooms.

The data further noted that only 7.2 per cent of JK schools have functional mobile phones used for teaching purposes, which is quite lower than the national average of 17.7 per cent.

Out of this, only 3.6 per cent of government schools and 22.5 per cent of private-unaided schools use this facility.

He had also threatened Advocates for appearing before courts during the Hartal call given by illegal bar association," the Investigation has revealed.

About security situation post article 370 abrogation, the GoC-in-C said that the security scenario has witnessed a big change post August 5, 2019. He said peace and development has gained speed and civil administration is occupying the space.

In a statement, the SIA said that it had on 22th August this year presented a charge sheet against four accused namely Inayat Sikender Padder son of Mohammad Sikender Padder resident of Bathipora Kulgam, Mohammad Hussain Dar alias Kifayat son of Abdul Hamid Dar resident of Gandwani D H Pora Kulgam, Sabzar Ahmad Bhat son of Bashir Ahmad Bhat resident of Okay Kulgam and Shahid Bhaie of Jhelum City Punjab Pakistan before the Designated Competent Court of NIA at Srinagar in Case FIR No 05/2022 of P/S CI-SIA Kashmir Srinagar.

The statement further stated that on Monday, the Court framed the charges against three accused persons under sections 13, 17, 39 and 40 of ULAP Act including one entity based in Pakistan against whom proceedings under section 299 of Cr. PC were initiated. However, charges against one accused namely Sabzar Ahmad were framed u/s 13 ULAP Act only by the Hon'ble Court.

Case FIR No. 05/2022 under relevant sections of law was lodged at Police Station CIK (SIA) Kashmir following some credible inputs about the above named valley based accused persons in connivance with a Pakistani militant Shahid Bhaie of JeM trying to carry out militan acts with a purpose of causing disturbance to the peace and tranquillity in the UT of J&K with an ulterior motive of challenging the sovereignty and integrity of Union of India, they said. Investigation was set into motion for the logical conclusion of the case for judicial determination. "We have largely succeeded in facing this challenge and this year so far, over 100 modules of hybrid militants were busted across J&K," the DGP said.

The brief details of these complaints and action taken by ACB were submitted to court by ACB in its status report.

It was also conveyed by ACB that when the reports in rest of the complaints forwarded to District Vigilance Officer for enquiry were awaited from DVO/Director Rural Development Kashmir. and other reports were being examined for taking further course of action, a fresh credible information was received by the ACB on 30-05-2022 from a primer intelligence agency against KAS officer, again with serious and multiple allegations of abuse of official position, indulging in corruption/bribery, allegations of misappropriation of Govt funds in the garb of execution of developmental works, causing loss to state exchequer and accumulation of disproportionate assets.

There are allegations of malpractices against woman KAS officer, BDO Pattan and her activities have caused considerable loss to the exchequer. The said officer remained posted as Block Development Officer, Block Singhpora from 15 Mar, 2015 to 15 Oct, 2021 during her tenure she is alleged to have misappropriated government funds in the name of executing developmental works in her area of jurisdiction and this way earned huge sums of money. While being posted in the Block, she came in contact with one Mohammad Shafi Rather son of Mohammad Sultan, a resident of Wanigam Payeen, Pattan who is working as a salesman in CAPD Department.

He is considered to be very close to the officer and his services were utilized by her in sale and purchase of land in the area. This way huge profits were made by the officer.

In its status report ACB submitted that there are Allegations of the huge Benami property in form of investments in plots, real estate and other business by the lady officer and her power. While inherent power of the High Court has a wide ambit and plenitude, it has to be exercised to secure ends of justice or to prevent an abuse of the process of any court."

The court further observed that "The instant petition, when looked from all angles, requires and demands full dress trial and examination of facts by this Court as if it is in appeal and acting as an appellate court and to draw its own conclusion vis-à-vis impugned FIR, complaint and proceedings emanating therefrom."

"This is not the aim and objective of provisions of Section 482 Cr. P.C. more particularly when petition on hand does not unveil any ground much less cogent or material one, to indicate that the inherent powers are to be exercised to prevent abuse of process of law and to secure ends of justice."

"In that view of matter, impugned FIR does not call for any interference qua petitioner and as a consequence of which, petition on hand is liable to be dismissed.'

And finally the Court observed that; "For the reasons discussed above, the instant petition is without any merit and is, accordingly, dismissed with connected CM(s). Interim direction, if any, shall stand vacated.'

The judgement was pronounced by Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul and the case on behalf of Anti-Corruption Bureau was pleaded by senior Ld AAG Asifa Padroo.

With the High Court final judgement, Anti-corruption Bureau is free to conduct investigations into all 07 number of complaints received against woman KAS officer Sheeba Inayat including allegations of disproportionate assets/Benami assets with her conduit Mohd Shafi Rather and will accordingly take appropriate legal action as envisaged under law.

Anti corruption Bureau JK has already shared a detailed report before General Administration Department Govt of JK wherein it has been conveyed that there are many corruption related complaints against the woman KAS officer and in order to obstruct the probe into these allegations she filed a false and concocted case against the officers of Anti Corruption Bureau. With Disbanded Women's **Commission, Women Victims** Have Nowhere To Go

SRINAGAR: At a time when crimes against women have been showing an upward trend, the victims are unable to approach anywhere for the redressal of their grievances.

In Jammu and Kashmir there is no such platform for women at present.

After the abrogation of the special status of Jammu and Kashmir in 2019, the BJP-led Delhi government disbanded the Commission for Protection of Women and Child Rights along with six other Commissions.

In the opinion of a senior journalist: "There's nobody to listen to the J&K women, particularly women employees, whose rights are being brazenly violated & who are brought to the verge of suicide by government officers as there is no trace, no address of Women and Child Rights Commissions after the creation of Union Territory in October 2019."

"We can't go anywhere for the redressal of our complaints. There is no platform for us. Everything has stagnated in Kashmir after

2019," a social activist said. The J&K State Commission for Protection of Women and Child Rights was created in April 1999 to investigate and examine matters relating to safeguards provided for women under the Indian Constitution and other laws. Kashmir Valley has witnessed a surge in domestic violence cases over the years. The victims are unable to lodge complaints and get justice. The victims have nowhere to go to seek justice in the absence of any commission in Jammu and Kashmir.

Pertinently, Senior Supreme Court lawyer Vasundhara Pathak Masoodi, was the last chairperson of the J&K State Commission for Protection of Women and Child Rights before it ceased to exist. This Commission used to receive complaints from victims of domestic violence and sexual harassment. [KNT]

Admin Directs Crackdown On Illegal Brick Kilns Of Budgam

Calls them threat to environ, public health; seeks action from SDMs

SRINAGAR: The District Magistrate, Budgam on Tuesday directed all the Sub-Divisional Magistrates to act against the illegal establishment, construction and operation of brick kilns in their respective jurisdictions.

An order according to Kashmir News Observer reads that the Jammu and Kashmir Brick Kiln (Regulation), Act. 2010 and the Jammu and Kash-mir Brick Kiln (Regulation) (Amendment), Act, 2016, envisage a proper procedure for establishing and operating the brick kilns.

The complaints are being received every now and then regarding the illegal establishment and operation of brick kilns in the jurisdiction of district Budgam. It added that these illegal brick kilns are a threat to the environment, health and



flora and fauna of the area.

"Now, therefore, in view of the above, all Sub-Divisional Magistrates of District Budram. Assistant Commissioner (Revenue). Budgam and all Tehsildars of District Budgam are hereby authorized to take necessary action as per the norms in vogue including the aforementioned Acts against the il-

legal establishment/construction/operation of brick kilns in their respective jurisdictions. Further, it is impressed upon all stake-holders to strictly abide by the provisions of the Jammu and Kashmir Brick Kiln (Rerulation), Act. 2010. Any violation thereof shall be dealt with strictly under law," the order reads.

JAMMU: Additional Chief Secretary (ACS), Agriculture Department, Atal Dulloo, chaired a meeting held to review status of Lumpy Skin Disease in the Union Territory besides assessing mitigation measures being implemented to contain the malady at the civil secretariat.

It was apprised in the meeting that more than 96 percent eligible cattle has been vaccinated against the LSD and the vaccination data is also being updated online. Besides, more than 72 thousand cattle, around 2.3 percent of total population, have been affected in J&K. Encouragingly, the recovery rate of 90 percent and average fatality rate of around 4 percent (for Jammu and Kashmir divisions collectively) has been reported by the

experts, it was highlighted.

ACS underlined the need to

lower the mortality rate in the

Kashmir division, along with regular uploading of respective data from all districts. He pressed for strict surveillance and also enquired about the availability of methylene blue, which is also an effective drug against the disease.

Experts from SKUAST advised that the farmers should continue giving recommended treatment to the infected animals for at least 10 days, post recovery, to prevent death caused due to thromboembolism, i.e. blood clotting.

Technical Officer, Dr Arif, assured that the department is maintaining surveillance of all animals being imported into I&K and that sufficient stock of vaccines is available.

The meeting was attended by Secretary Agriculture, Director, Animal Husbandry Jammu/ Kashmir, Chief Animal Husbandry Officers and other senior officers from all districts.

World Cup Stunner: Saudi Arabia Beats Messi's Argentina 2-1

LUSAIL: Lionel Messi stood with his hands on his hips near the center circle, looking stonefaced as Saudi Arabia's jubilant players ran in all directions around him after pulling off one of the biggest World Cup upsets ever against Argentina. The South American champions and one of the tournament favourites slumped to a 2-1 loss Tuesday against the second lowest-ranked team at the World Cup in a deflating start to Messi's quest to

win the one major title that has eluded him. Asked how he felt after a painful start to his record fifth World Cup for Argentina, Messi said: "The truth? Dead. It's a

very hard blow because we did not expect to start in this way." Saudi Arabia's comeback joins the list of other major World Cup upsets: Cameroon's 1-0 win over an Argentina team led by Diego Maradona in the opening game of the 1990

World Cup; Senegal's 1-0 victory over defending champion France 1-0 in the 2002 tournament opener; or the United States beating England by the same score in 1950. The match that started

with Messi giving Argentina the lead, calmly converting a penalty in the 10th minute for his 92nd international goal.

However, goals by Saleh Alshehri and Salem Aldawsari in a five-minute span early in the second half gave the Sau-dis a landmark result in the first World Cup staged in the Middle East. Their previous biggest win was 1-0 over Belgium at the 1994 World Cup, secured by a storied individu-al goal by Saeed Al-Owairan.

"We are facing two finals now," said Argentina striker Lautaro Martinez, looking ahead of remaining group matches against Mexico and Poland. "We screwed it up in the second half."

The unlikely victory by a team made up entirely of Sau-

di-based players was sealed by a somersault by Aldawsari, who brought down a high ball just inside the penalty area, spun his way past Nahuel Molina with the help of a ricochet, dribbled past Leandro Paredes and drove a powerful shot to the far corner in the 53rd.

A stunned Messi watched as Saudi Arabia's green-clad fans, who had come over the Qatari border in their thousands, celebrated in disbelief in the stands. Saudi Arabia's substitutes swarmed onto the field to congratulate Aldawsari, who sank to his knees after his post-goal acrobatics.

Saudi goalkeeper Mohammed Alowais made two diving saves during 14 minutes of stoppage time to preserve a win that shakes up the group. "This group always stood out for its evenness, its strength, and it is time to be more united than ever," Messi said. "We have to go back to our training base and try to win the next game.
