Police Raids Multiple Locations in 3 Districts

Srinagar: Jammu and Kashmir police on Thursday carried out searches at seven locations in three districts of the Vallev in connection with an online threat to journalists.

Reports quoting police said that the raids were conducted in Srinagar, Budgam and Pulwama districts subsequent to the leads received from searches done a few days ago in the same case.

Reports said the searches were conducted at the residences of Asif Maqbool Dar, resident of HIG Colony Bemina, Ishfaq Ahmad Reshi (journalist), a resident of Poshkar Khag in Budgam, Saqib Hussain Mughloo (journalist) a resident at Lal-Bazar Srinagar, Haji Hayat Ahmad Bhat owner of daily Kashmir Reader at Pampore and his office in Srinagar, Showkat Ahmad Mota at Botshah Mohalla, Lal-Bazar Srinagar and Advocate Adnan Bashir in Nowgam Srinagar.

'Pain Relievers May Worsen Arthritis Inflammation'

aking certain anti-inflammatorv pain relievers for osteoarthritis may worsen inflammation in the knee joint over time, according to a study. Osteoarthritis is the most common form of arthritis, affecting more than 500 million people worldwide. It occurs most frequently in the hands, hips and knees. In people with osteoarthritis, the carti-

lage that cushions the joint gradually wears away. Arthritis is often accompanied by inflammation, or swelling, of the joint, which can be painful.

Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) are commonly prescribed for os-teoarthritis pain and inflammation. How-ever, little is known of the long-term effects of these drugs on disease progression.

"To date, no curative therapy has been approved to cure or reduce the progression of knee osteoarthritis, said the study's lead author, Johanna Luitjens, postdoctoral scholar at the University of California, San Francisco, US.

"NSAIDs are frequently used to treat pain, but it is still an open discussion of how NSAID use influences outcomes for osteoarthritis patients. In particular, the impact of NSAIDs on synovitis. or the inflammation of the membrane lining the joint,



has never been analysed using MRI-based structural biomarkers," Luitjens said.

In the study, being presented next week at the annual meeting of the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA), the researchers analysed the association between NSAID use and synovitis in patients with osteoarthritis of the knee and to assess how treatment with NSAIDs affects joint structure over time.

"Synovitis mediates development and

progression of osteoarthritis and may be a therapeutic target," Luitjens said.

"Therefore, the goal of our study was to analyse whether NSAID treatment influences the development or progression of synovitis and to investigate whether cartilage imaging biomarkers, which reflect changes in osteoarthritis, are impacted by NSAID treatment," the scientist said.



erate to severe osteoarthritis and sustained NSAID treatment for at least one year between baseline and four-year follow-up were included in the study and compared with a group of 793 control participants who were not treated with NSAIDs.

All participants underwent MRI of the knee initially and after four years. Images were scored for biomarkers of inflammation.

Cartilage thickness, composition and other MRI measurements served as noninvasive biomarkers for evaluating arthritis progression. The results showed no longterm benefit of NSAID use.

Elsewhere in the state, two military officials and two militants died in a fierce gunbattle.

The mine explosion occurred on a mountainous road in the Sirigufwara region, 40 miles southeast of Srinagar, when members of the Special Task Force were patrolling in the region. Two improvised Explosive Devices were detonated in quick succession by suspected militants with the help of remote control when the SOG vehicle followed by the CRPF party was passing through the area.

Five SOG personnel died on the spot, as the first IED went off wrecking their vehicle. Another was critically wounded who died on way to hospital. Moments after another land mine went off near Mahand village damaging the CRPF vehicle and injuring five. The impact of the first blast was felt in the three KM radius area, reports quoting villagers and police officials said.

The deceased SOG personnel were identified as Sub Inspector Naresh Kumar, Head Constable Hakim Din, Constable Roshan Lal, Roop Lal, Ali Mohammad, and Mohamad Jamal.

Reports said soon after the blasts security forces arrived on the scene and laid cordon of the whole area. Massive searches were on when the reports last came in late in the evening, a CNS news agency report said.

Today's blast was the third in the series within a week in Anantnag district. A personal security officer of Union minister of State for Home, Maqbool Dar, was killed and ten others including some of his close relatives were injured on November 19, in a land mine explosion at Bregpora-Shangus in the district.

This was followed by a bomb explosion outside the office of the district police chief on November 21 killing a civilian and injuring 42 others

The Tourism Rebound

ourism across the world has returned to 65 percent of the pre-pandemic level in 2022, in a sign that the world economy is slowly recovering from the depredations wrought by the Covid-19 contagion. An estimated 700 million tourists travelled internationally between January and September, more than double the number recorded for the same period in 2021, according to the new data revealed by UNWTO. Travel, the tourism body said, was boosted by strong pent-up demand, improved confidence levels and the lifting of restrictions in an increasing number of destinations. Europe has led the rebound of international tourism with the region welcoming 477 million international arrivals in January-September 2022 which is 68 percent of the world total. India along with the countries such as Germany, Belgium, Italy, the United States, Qatar, and Saudi Arabia reported strong tourism inflow in the first six to nine months of 2022.

According to the recent India Travel Market Report by Phocuswright, the Indian travel market will continue its impressive growth to reach USD 32 billion in gross bookings by 2023. The recouping of the travel industry, the report said, is fuelled by exclusive deals and packages by industry players. With innovative amenities and multiple authentic experiences, they are attracting a portion of the market. Travel market growth in 2023 will be driven by international destinations and reducing foreign travel uncertainties, despite domestic travel dominating in 2022.

Jammu and Kashmir has witnessed a tourism boom this year. And incidentally, 43 percent of the tourists are pilgrims to two Hindu shrines — Vaishno Devi in Jammu and Amarnath in Kashmir. Around 3.65 lakh pilgrims visited the Amarnath shrine this year and 65 lakh visited Vaishno Devi. The union territory has received the highest-ever tourist footfall of 1.6 crore this year, and the administration expects the number to cross two crore by the end of this year.

With winter approaching, the tourist inflow is only going to further increase. The Valley's upper reaches have already received snowfall. Affarwat in Gulmarg and Pir Panjal range of mountains have been draped in white blanket of snow for some time now. Snowfall in the Valley has been traditionally a great attraction for the people in mainland India, since snow is a novelty for them.

Tourism, one of the mainstays of the Kashmir economy, is one of the sectors that has been hit the hardest over the two years following the abrogation of Article 370 with successive Covid -19 lockdowns also crushing the sector. As a result, a large section of people was largely without employment. Their savings had been depleted. This included also the people associated with tourism. Here's hoping that things improve from hereon. The waning pandemic and the return of normalcy has created conditions for unhindered tourism in the Valley. The future looks bright if things stay the same way.

ne of the most difficult tasks that many of us encounter is coping with the death of a close friend or family member. Losing a partner, sibling, or parent can cause us to grieve very deeply. Even though we recognize that loss is a part of life, we can still be overcome by shock and confusion, which can result in protracted feelings of intense sadness or depression. When a loved one passes away, the pain usually lessens in intensity with time, but grieving is a necessary process to help you get past these emotions.


Why is it difficult for us to help someone to grieve loss of their loved ones?

Most of us are socialized to assist others by resolving their issues, yet grief cannot be fixed. As a result, some people will either try to steer clear of the subject or try to soothe others by sharing their own experiences. Sadly, those responses are frequently ineffective. It can be challenging to know what to say or do when someone you care about is grieving following a loss. The person who is bereaved experience a wide range of powerful and agonizing emotions, such as depression, anger, guilt, and extreme sadness. As a result of the severe sorrow and challenging emotions, many times they also feel alone and alienated in their grieving.

Be aware of what to say and do to console a person in grief:

Even though many of us worry about what to say to someone who is grieving, listening to them is actually more crucial. When the name of the deceased person is spoken, many well-intentioned people choose to either avoid discussing the death or shift the subject. Or, realizing there is nothing they can do to help, they try to completely avoid the grieving individual. But those who have lost a loved one must feel that their sorrow is understood, that it isn't too painful to discuss, and that their loss won't be forgotten. They could want to cry on your shoulder one day, while they might prefer to vent, sit in silence, or reminisce on another. Being present and attentive to them can be a tremendous source of solace and healing.

While you shouldn't try to coerce someone into talking about their feelings, it's crucial to let your grieving friend or loved one know that you're willing to listen if they want to. When the name of the deceased is mentioned, discuss them openly and don't veer off topic. Additionally, when it appears appropriate, politely inquire as opposed to prying in order to open the griev-



out. Make

things simpler for them by offering concrete suggestions rather than stating, "Let me know if there's anything I can do," as a grieving person might not have the strength or desire to call you when they need anything. You could say, "This afternoon, I'm going to the market. What is there that I can bring you?

Try, if you can, to be constant in your offers of help. The grieving person won't have to make the extra effort of asking repeatedly since they'll know that you'll be there for however long it takes and can look forward to your consideration.

Deliver continuous support:

Long after the funeral is over and friends and relatives have ceased calling on the family, your loved one will still be grieving. Each person's grieving process is different in length, but it frequently takes far longer than most people anticipate. Your grieving friend or relative may want your assistance for months or perhaps years. Keep in touch with the mourning individual by dropping by, talking over phone or texting them sometimes.

For your grieving friend or relative, some occasions and days of the year will be especially difficult. Holidays, significant life events, birthdays, and anniversaries frequently bring up old pain. On these occasions, show compassion. Make sure the bereaved individual knows you're there for them no matter what.

Have the markets turned around?

In fact, this has been the paradox across most non-financial sectors where turnover recovered due to pentup demand, but profits came down due to higher input costs. Clearly, the profit logic of today does not work in evaluating value tomorrow, as the stock market has brushed these results aside as being only transient. The long-term story remains intact.

The other consequence of the Fed tempering its commentary is that the bond yields have come off highs, even in the USA and European markets. It may be recalled that the earlier Fed action and tone had driven the yield past the 7.6% mark. It was moderated when there was news of the Indian bonds being included in global indices. The deferment of this inclusion drove the rates up to the 7.4-7.5% range, and now the trajectory seems to be downwards toward the 7.2% mark.

Therefore, while there is a lot of talk and speculation on RBI action, which can provide forward guidance for the market, it has been observed that the Fed's action has an equivalent impact on domestic markets. And this can be felt even before RBI takes a call. In fact, the RBI rate hikes have not quite brought about a similar reaction in the bond market, though liquidity considerations have impacted the lower maturity yields. But the benchmark 10-year bond has been more or less resilient to RBI action. Similarly, RBI's actions in the forex market were not able to do what the Fed announcement did, as it does appear that our fundamentals may not be that strong to warrant an appreciation. However, the global spillover effect has been impactful. The power of globalisation has hence been more evident in the three markets like never before. The global slowdown or the action taken by Jerome Powell leaves an indelible mark for sure and cannot be brushed aside. It is not surprising that in the last monetary policy meeting, the RBI governor highlighted the importance of the announcements of the central banks of advanced economies. Financial Express

What are the various ways of helping someone grieve such losses?

You could be worried about interfering, saying the wrong thing, or aggravating your loved one's emotional issues during this trying time, or perhaps you feel helpless to improve the situation. It makes sense that way. But don't let your discomfort stop you from offering support to a grieving person. Your loved one needs your help right now more than ever. You don't have to know all the answers, be able to offer guidance, or say and act in all the proper ways. Being there is the most crucial thing you can do for someone who is grieving. Your love one will be able to deal with the pain and gradually start to recover with your encouragement and tender presence.

Here are some ideas for how you might assist someone who has experienced a loss:

Try to understand the process of grief:

You'll be better able to support a grieving friend or relative if you have a better understanding of grief and how it is resolved. Grief does not necessarily unfold through logical, sequential stages. It can be an unpredictable emotional roller coaster with highs, lows, and disappointments. Try not to dictate to your loved one how they "should" be feeling or acting during their grieving process. Understand that extreme emotions and behaviors can accompany grief. Guilt, anger, despair, and terror are frequently experienced emotions during such times. A person in grief may shout to the sky, think endlessly about the deceased, strike out at family members, or cry unceasingly. Your close relative or friend needs affirmation that their feelings are normal. Your close relative or friend needs reassurance that their feelings are normal. Don't criticize them or take their expressions of grief personally.

Grieving has no prescribed length of time. Many people need 18 to 24 months to heal following a loss; however different people's periods of grieving may be longer or shorter. Don't make your loved one feel like they've been in grieving for too long or put pressure on them to move on. The healing process may even be slowed by this.

Or, realizing there is nothing they can do to help, they try to completely avoid the grieving individual. But those who have lost a loved one must feel that their sorrow is understood, that it isn't too painful to discuss, and that their loss won't be forgotten

ing person's mind and heart. Your loved one will know that you are willing to listen if you just ask them, "Do you feel like talking?"

Don't presume you understand how the bereaved person is feeling at any given time because the emotions of grief might change quickly. If you believe it would be helpful, share your own experience if you've had a loss comparable to this one. But keep in mind that grieving is a very personal experience. Do not assert that you "know" how the person is feeling or contrast your loss with theirs because no two people experience grief in precisely the same way. Once more, emphasize listening and ask your loved one to share their feelings with you.

Let the grieving person know it's alright to cry, become angry, or lose it in front of you. Do not attempt to convince them that they should or should not feel a certain way. The bereaved must feel free to express their emotions, no matter how unreasonable, without fear of judgment, dispute, or criticism because grieving is a very emotional experience.

If the grieving individual doesn't feel like talking, don't push it. They frequently find comfort in merely being in your presence. If you're at a loss for words, just make eye contact, squeeze their hand, or give them a comforting hug.

Find out what the grieving person needs from you. Offer to assist with a particular duty, such as making funeral arrangements, or simply be there to hang out with or offer support.

Offer assistance that is practical:

Asking for assistance can be challenging for many grieving people. They can feel bad for getting so much attention, worry that they will be a burden to others, or just be too miserable to reach

Watch out for depressive symptoms:

An individual who is grieving frequently experiences feelings of depression, confusion, social isolation, or as if they are going crazy. However, if the bereaved person's symptoms don't gradually start to go away—or if they worsen over time this may indicate that natural grief and sorrow has turned into a more serious issue, like clinical depression.

If you notice any of the following warning indicators during the initial grieving period—especially if it's been more than two months since the death—encourage the bereaved individual to seek professional help from a mental health professional such as a clinical psychologist and/or psychiatrist.

- Functioning poorly in daily life.
- Attention on the death is excessive.
- Hatred, indignation, or guilt that is excessive.
- Disregarding personal hygiene
- Drug or alcohol misuse.
- A lack of enjoyment of life
- Hallucinations.
- Withdrawing from other people.
- Persistent hopelessness
- Talking about death or suicide.
- How can psychologists help in such cases?


Psychologists are trained to assist individuals in managing the fear, guilt, or anxiety that can be connected to the loss of a loved one. Consult a psychologist or other qualified mental health professional if you need assistance managing your sorrow or adjusting to a loss. Psychologists can assist individuals in increasing their resilience and creating coping mechanisms for their grief and sadness. To help people better their lives, practicing psychologists employ a number of evidence based psychotherapies.

Behind Reels, KASHMIR'S WINTER IS HARSH And We're Responsible



Harsh Winters, Lazy Approach

n the first of this month, Kashmir Observer ran an editorial concerning the grim record of the authorities regarding providing sufficient electricity during the winter months. It hoped that this time authorities would "surprise" people with timely readiness to tackle the "challenges". However, these always have turned out to be false hopes.

It is an appalling situation that there are always fingers raised at the authorities regarding the preparedness in Kashmir. And every time, the pleas, requests, and anger fall to dumb ears. The authorities' attitude has always been to see things through, not to prepare and find

a lasting solution. Unfortunately, that is not only confined to providing sufficient electricity but clearing off snow from roads, ensuring sufficient LPG and food supplies, and so on. As soon as the winter is over, authorities take a sigh of relief and then seem to go into a deep slumber only to wake up when the win-This escapism certainly has not helped in any way.

The ideas discussed above invoke multiple questions simultaneously. Why, in the first place, are winters harsh? Also, is it because they inherently are harsh, or is it because we have been conditioned to think like that? More

importantly, is it because we have yet to systemise the preparedness and logistics that would make winter feel as easy as any other season?

Kashmir is prone to witness snowfall from early November to the first half of March. Winter's core spans from the 20th of December to the 30th of January. It is called Chillai Kalan and is extremely chilly during this time. Temperature dips down to as extreme as -8 degrees Celsius in the capital Srinagar during these days. Keeping in mind the topography of Kashmir, other places tend to be colder than Srinagar. Heavy snowfall sometimes cuts off the valley from the rest of the world. Therefore, it makes it challenging to see through the winter months. There are always apprehensions about the disruption in the normal functioning of institutions and the perturbation of everyday life. This causes concern among the people regarding essential supplies that cannot enter the valley. It shows how much things can get uglier if Kashmir valley remains isolated for around a week if an unexpected snowfall happens. For many years now, climate change has been a concern which has exponentially increased the chances of witnessing surprising trends. Is Kashmir ready to face that challenge?

Winters are not exclusive to Kashmir. More than half of the world's population witnesses snowfall. Our very own Ladakh is an example where winter is

harsher due to its distinct geography with prolonged freezing temperatures for geographical and demographic reasons. Similarly, winters are probably more brutal compared to Kashmir in North America, Europe, and North Asian territories. However, Kashmiris tend to believe that winter is written only in their fate. We only prepare individually to face winter. Our only job seems to start collecting charcoal, Kangris, and other things. It is absolutely fine to do that. But that is all we think of. We have been conditioned to think like that. Even in the third decade of the twenty-first century, we do not have substantial collective efforts on the ground to tackle the challenges we face during winter. As the editorial mentioned at the beginning suggests, we do not have enough electricity to keep our spaces warm and our homes out of the darkness. It is ironic because most of the electricity produced in Kashmir lights up most of the North Indian states instead.

The concerned power corridors should be serious about bringing a change. It would not only make things less challenging but would make our time more productive. For almost four months, we sit and do nothing productive, and we only wait to see winter pass away. As mentioned before, winters with snowfalls are almost everywhere in the world, but they are far ahead of us. It is because they do not waste time to see winters pass but instead make winters easy and suitable to work.

Any argument that there is no money to bring such change is just living in a fool's paradise. We have enough money to get a tangible change along the same lines. We have young human resources who want to work instead of staying inside homes. We will accept any change on the ground, however little that may be. Let us start by making resources available to help continue economic activities in winter. Electricity is one. Technically, it will push other sectors to help boost the local economy and will not bring unemployment down that skyrockets during winter months.

Therefore, it is evident that there is not a tinge of doubt about winters putting up a challenge, but to perceive it as inherently harsh may not be fair. However, human callousness is the primary factor that worsens things. Kashmiris accept when nature feels slow and when life seems to slow down. How are we, in this day and age, using mediaeval answers to a challenging winter in a fast-paced world? Adapting to preparedness will also better our behaviours, and our psyches will accept the change if and when resources and logistics are available. Our overtly sedentary lifestyle needs to go. We are hard-working people; only the intent is missing at the top.

However, there is a section of people who apparently enjoy winters. Their day starts with capturing the winter landscapes and night passes by uploading reels of the same on Instagram.

No Invitation Extended To Islamic **Preacher Zakir Naik To Attend** World Cup, Qatar Tells India

New Delhi: India on Thursday said it has raised the issue of Islamic preacher Zakir Naik being a fugitive of law with authorities in Qatar, amid reports of his presence in the emirate during the ongoing FIFA World Cup.

External Ministry of Affairs (MEA) Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said India will make every effort to make Naik face the law and continue with its efforts for his extradition.

Bagchi said the issue was not raised by Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar during his visit to Qatar to attend the inaugural ceremony of the FIFA World Cup, indicating that it was brought up through diplomatic channels

He also made it clear that

authorities in Qatar had conveyed to their Indian counterparts that no invitation was extended to Naik, who is wanted in India since 2016 for allegedly laundering money and inciting extremism through hate speeches. Naik has taken refuge in

Malaysia "Qatar did mention to us that no invitation was extended to Zakir Naik to attend the FIFA World Cup," Bagchi told reporters here.

He said Naik is an accused in India and has been declared as an absconder. "We will continue with our

efforts to get him back separately," he said. Bagchi said India has raised the issue of Naik's extradition with the Malaysian authorities and would continue to take every step to make him face the law here.

Former top spy Lieutenant General Asim Munir appointed Pakistan Army chief

Islamabad: Pakistan's former spy master and senior-most Lt General Asim Munir was named as the new Army Chief by Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif on Thursday, ending speculation over the most powerful position in the coup-prone nation, where the military wields considerable power in matters of security and foreign policy.

Lt Gen Munir has served as chief of two most powerful intelligence agencies-the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) and the Military Intelligence (MI) -- but his stint as the spy chief at the ISI was the shortest ever as he was replaced by Lt Gen Faiz Hamid within eight months on the insistence of then-Prime Minister Imran Khan in 2019.

He would replace Gen Qamar Javed Bajwa, who retires on November 29 after two consecutive three-year terms. Gen Bajwa, 61, was appointed as the

army chief in 2016 for a threeyear term. He was given a threeyear extension by the Khan government in 2019.

role will need to be changed." Lt Gen Munir is the seniormost general. Although he was promoted to the rank of twostar general in September 2018,

he took charge two months later. As a result, his four-year tenure as Lt Gen will end on November 27. But with his appointment as COAS, he would get a three-year extension in the service.

He was commissioned into the Frontier Force Regiment and has been a close aide of the incumbent COAS ever since he commanded troops in the Force Command Northern Areas as a brigadier under Gen Bajwa, who was then the Commander X Corps.

Munir was later appointed chief of Military Intelligence in early 2017, and in October next year was made the ISI chief. He was then posted as Gujranwala Corps commander, a position he held for two years, before being moved to the GHQ as Quartermaster General.

Lt-Gen Mirza, who hails from the Sindh Regiment, has had an impressive career in the army, particularly in senior leadership positions during the past seven years. He came to prominence as director-general military operations (DGMO) during the last two years of Gen Raheel Sharif, the COAS from 2013-16. In that role, he was part of Gen Sharif's core team at GHQ, which supervised the military operation against the Tehreek-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and other militants in North Waziristan.

Further, he was closely in-volved in the Quadrilateral Coordination Group (QCG) that brokered intra-Afghan talks involving Pakistan, China, Afghanistan and the United States. Besides, he was also a member of the Sartaj Azizled committee on reforms for Gilgit-Baltistan.

After his promotion to the three-star rank, he was appointed chief of general staff, effectively making him the second-most powerful person in the army after the COAS. In that role, he was closely engaged in crucial decision-making related to national security and foreign

affairs. He also joined former foreign minister Shah Mehmood Qureshi in strategic talks with Chinese Foreign Minister Wang Yi in 2021.

He also dismissed social media

In October 2021, he was posted as Corps Commander Rawalpindi to enable him to acquire operational experience and become eligible to be considered for the top posts.

Meanwhile, Defence Minister Khawaja Asif told the media after the appointments that the "advice" had been forwarded to President Arif Alvi, adding that all matters had been settled according to the law and the

Constitution. He called on citizens to refrain from viewing it through a "po-litical lens," Dawn newspaper reported.

He hoped that the President would not make the appoint-"controversial" ments and would endorse the advice of the premier.

reiterated that the President should endorse the premier's advice so that a "controversy may not arise".

"This will also help our country and the economy to get on track. Currently, everything is at a standstill." There has been extraordinary interest in the appointment of Bajwa's successor as many believe ousted prime minister Khan's long march is linked to the change of command in the Army.

He has asked his supporters to gather in Rawalpindi on November 26, two days before Gen Bajwa hands over the baton to the new Army chief.

The high drama around the key appointment has not gone unnoticed around the world as the army chief of a nuclear army, which is also one of the biggest, of the sixth biggest strategically placed country, when it is also facing political turmoil and economic meltdown, is by no means an ordinary affair.

"The investigation in the instant case is going on vigorously and is in an advanced stage. General public is requested to cooperate with Police and bring any information relevant to this case in the notice of Srinagar Police," police said.

Earlier last week, Srinagar police raided 12 locations across the Kashmir in FIR No 82/2022 which was registered at Police Station Sherghari against "terror handlers, active terrorists, and terrorist associates of proscribed terror outfit Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and its offshoot The Resistance Front (TRF) for online publication and dissemination of direct threat letters to journalists and reporters based in Kashmir."

Pulwama Admin Delays Compensations To Sheep Farmers

SRINAGAR: The administration of Pulwama district has failed to release the compensation to sheep farmers and breeders, who had lost their livestock in the highland pastures during the rare snowfall in June this year.

Despite six months having passed since the snowfall, which had continued for several days in June and resulted in death of nearly 7000 sheep in highland pastures across Kashmir valley, the many sheep farmers and breeders said they are yet to receive the compensation.

While some sheep farmers and breeders have been provided compensation nearly three months ago, many said they are yet to receive any compensation from Pulwama administration.

An official of District Sheep Husbandry Office passed the buck to Pulwama Deputy Commissioner's office and said the compensation file has been pending there for the last nearly two months. "We have verified the details and sent the file to the (Pulwama) DC office but there is no word back from there," an official of the Pulwama District Sheep Husbandry said.

The sheep farmers and breeders in Pulwama district, who had lost their livestock in high-

land pastures like Nagaberi and Marsar, said the undue and unwarranted delay in the release of compensation is badly hurting their preparation for the winter. "It has been six months since we lost many sheep in snowfall and yet there is no compensation," a sheep breeder from Kakapora tehsil of Pulwama said. "We urgently need the compensation to prepare for the winter. We have already suffered huge losses this year and this delay

will cause more losses," the breeder said. "It is unfair that the compensation that is verified by the Sheep Husbandry department is being withheld by Pulwama administration without any valid reason," the sheep breeder said. The rare snowfall had occurred in higher mountainous reaches and highland pastures across Kashmir valley between 19 and 22 June. A month later, on July 20, the Jammu and Kashmir administration headed by Lt Gov Manoj Sinha had declared the June snowfall as a "state specific natural disaster" under SDRF norms. Subsequently, the Jammu and

Kashmir administration had ordered all deputy commissioners to provide compensation to the affected individuals and families.

Dr Mehta impressed upon

the officers that the drug menace is a grave issue spoiling the precious lives of our youth falling its victims. He asked them that the problem deserves a wholesome approach from each appendage of the government. He maintained that the government is sympathetic towards victims and very harsh towards the peddlers.

The Chief Secretary directed all the Deputy Commissioners to popularize the helpline number 14416 among public so that they are able to report about this menace. He asked the police to have close coordination with the Rural Development and Social Welfare Departments to have insights and leads about those running this illegal trade. He made out that the PRI's had done a commendable job during the recently concluded 'Nasha Mukht Abhiyan' carried out in the UT.

Dr Mehta asked the Police administration to monitor the surroundings around educational institutions for movement of drug peddlers in their vicinity. He also advised for having close eye on the pharmacists. He asked them to create ample awareness among masses to identify the victims and peddlers so that the former is given treatment and latter convicted under the law. He asked them to intensify their campaign and do not take rest until this menace is eradicated from the UT. The Chief Secretary also took

note of the holding of district level NCORD meetings. He urged on all the DCs to convene such meetings regularly in their territorial jurisdictions without any fail and upload the minutes simultaneously on the national NCORD portal. He assured the Police administration that the augmentation of FSL is in process and the time taken for requisite analysis of contraband material would get shortened considerably. He asked them to destroy the seized material publicly so that people feel confident of reporting such activities coming to their knowledge or observation.

World antimicrobial awareness week

DAK Calls for Rational Use of Antibiotics

SRINAGAR: On world antimicrobial awareness week, Doctors Association Kashmir (DAK) on Thursday called for rational use of antibiotics.

'Irrational use of antibiotics is responsible for unprecedented levels of antibiotic resistance in Kashmir valley," said DAK President Dr Nisar ul Hassan in a statement.

Dr Hassan said more than two third of antibiotics are either given unnecessarily or used improperly. "Antibiotics are prescribed for viral infections against which they have no effect. You go to a doctor with cold or flu; you will walk away with a prescription for antibiotics."

"Every time you have fever. you are given an antibiotic. Every fever is not because of infection and does not require an antibiotic," he said adding "antibiotics find their way in prescriptions for viral diarrheas, sore throats, ear and sinus discharges The DAK President said mis-

use of antibiotics has assumed serious proportions due to widespread over the counter sale of antibiotics. "Chemist shops give antibiotics for everything from malaise, fatigue, body aches to headache," he said.

Dr Nisar said inappropriate use of antibiotics has turned hospitals into breeding grounds for deadly bacteria that are resistant to all antibiotics. "More than 80% of the bacteria are resistant even to last resort antibiotics."

"Patients are dying of simple infections as no antibiotic works. We are kind of back to the era of not having antibiotics," he said.

"With no antibiotics, cancer chemotherapy, organ trans-plantation and simple surgery will become impossible and we are facing a future where cough or cut can kill once again," he cautioned.

General Secretary DAK Dr Arshad Ali said there is an urgent need for an explicit, comprehensive and continuously updated antibiotic policy and we should closely audit the use of antibiotics in hospitals so that these medicines can be administered judiciously.

"Every year world antibiotic awareness week is observed from November 18-24 to raise awareness about antibiotic resistance and to encourage best practices among both public and clinicians to prevent the emergence and spread of drugresistant infections," he said

Under first phase of implementation of this initiative, 578 facilities have been covered and more will be further extended to other facilities in a phased manner.

It is pertinent to mention that JK e-sahaj (Electronic System for Automation of Hospital Administration J&K) was formally launched on 4th November 2022 as part of Jashn-e-Sehat, by the Lieutenant Governor for different types of facilities i.e. Tertiary care, District Hospitals, Community Health Centres, Primary Health Centres and some New Type PHCs. JK E -Sahaj has been integrated with Rapid Assessment System (RAS), 104 Centralised Health Helpline for outbound calling and RCH portal of Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

In the category of Associated Hospitals of Government Medical Colleges, the first rank has been clinched by Psychiatric

Disease Hospital, Jammu followed by Chest Disease Hospital, Jammu, Chest Disease Hospital, Srinagar, GMC Kathua and Govt. Dental College, Jammu. In the category of District Hospitals, DH Bandipora secured first rank followed by Government Hospital Gandhi

Nagar, Jammu, DH Kulgam, DH JLNM, Srinagar and MCCH Anantnag In the category of Community Health Centres (CHCs), first

rank has been clinched by CHC Seer, followed by CHC Kreeri, CHC(AH) Ghagwal, CHC Zachaldara and CHC Ramgarh.

In the category of Primary Health Centres (PHCs) and UP-HCS, first rank has been secured by PHC Upper Hathal, Rajouri followed by PHC Kanachak, Jammu PHC D K Pora, Anantnag, PHC Bijhama, Baramulla.

The ranking has been done on the basis of registration, conversion of EMR (Electronic Medical Record) and Patient feedback uploaded on the portal of JK e Sahaj for the month of October 2022, on a real time basis. The detailed list of facilities has been shared on NHM website.

Tunnels Across Major Passes In Ladakh In Offing; To Cost Rs 5,000 Cr

LEH: The Ladakh administration is planning to build tunnels at cost of Rs 5.000 crores across major passes in the union territory to improve internal connectivity, and has hired consultants for the mega task, a senior official said on Thursday.

Situated at an average altitude of over 11,000 feet, Ladakh, which literally means 'land of high passes' is a place like no other. The passes offer breath-taking views and gateway to beautiful valleys nestled in the Himalayas. The Ladakh's famous Khar-

dung-La pass is also known as the highest motorable road in the world, and the tourists need to pass through it while going to Nubra Valley.

"The government of Ladakh is contemplating to build tunnels across major passes to improve internal connectivity in the union territory," Commissioner-Secretary, Ladakh Public Works Department (PWD) Aieet Kumar Sahu told PTI. He said that the consultants

have been hired to prepare detailed project reports (DPRs) of tunnels across Khardung La, Fotu La, Namika La, and Key-La passes.

An all-weather tunnel enhances connectivity between valleys for facilitating the movement of the military, civilians, and tourists in the region, he said.

The tunnel on Key-La pass will be alternative path to dangerous Changla pass, which will make travel to world famous Pangong lake easy and shorten it by oneand-half-hours, the Commissioner-Secretary said.

The survey and feasibility study is being conducted by Rail India Technical and Economic Services (RITES), which has been assigned to prepare DPRs of the tunnels, he said.

"The construction of these tunnels will lead to faster, safer, and smoother movement of internal traffic resulting in the all-around economic development of Ladakh". Sahu said.

The proposed 5.5 kilometre long Kĥardung-La tunnel, will

also help increase the safety of travellers due to bypassing of areas prone to landslide and avalanche, Sahu said.

Besides, it would also protect the Khardung glacier, which is a major source of water for Leh town, from receding due to the increase in heat emitted by automotive vehicular movement, the official said.

The consultant agency for the project shared that the proposed bypass tunnels at the Fotu La and Namika La passes will reduce the travel distance from Kargil to Leh by around an hour besides providing safety in traffic movement due to the accumulation of snow and icing on road during winters, he said.

'The expected increase of traffic in winter after the opening of the Zojila tunnel also necessitates the construction of these tunnels as it serves as a strategic route for logistic supply to Ladakh. These tunnels are expected to boost local business activities, employment opportunities, and tourism in the region", Sahu said.
