Limited Resources Delaying Srinagar Master Plan: Chief Town Planner

Six years after the Srinagar Master Plan draft was completed, the Chief Town Planner of Kashmir who prepared the blueprint terms limited resources as the main impediment in the implementation.

The Master Plan for Srinagar City was completed in 2016 and it took almost three years to notify it in 2019.

"It was to be implemented by the development authority and the municipal corporation after I completed the final draft," said Iftikhar Hakim, Chief Town Planner, Kashmir. "But I lost track after my transfer." With 35 years of experience in the preparation of urban planning and policy frame-

work at micro, macro and re-gional levels, Iftikhar said that in developed countries, it's seen how much of the master plan has been implemented.

"But there's no such mechanism in Kashmir," said the town planner who has supervised colony developments, road planning and other schemes.

"We've to keep in mind that in developing countries, the resources are limited. The



implementation of Master So, that issue is still prevalent." In a freewheeling interview Plans needs a lot of investment.

with *Kashmir Observer*, the town planner talks about the urban scenario and the vision document lost in translation.

What has happened to the Srinagar Master Plan?

As a vision document of the city, I prepared the Srinagar Master Plan in 2016. It took almost three years to notify it in 2019. But I lost the track after my transfer.

But as someone who has framed all the master plans since 2008, I can say it involves expansion of the city and proper functioning of civic affairs.

It's designed after a period of twenty years and reviewed after every five years. However, the dearth of resourc-

es has delayed its implementation. So many Departments, like Roads &Buildings (R&B), Public Health Engineering (PHE), Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC), Srinagar Development Authority (SDA), etc are involved in its implementation.

Decks Cleared For Assembly Polls In J&K

EC Concludes Electoral Roll Revision, 7.72 Lakh New Voters, 613 Polling Stations Added

Jammu: Paving way for the conduct of first-ever assembly polls in the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir, the Election Commission Friday concluded first special summary revision (SSR) exercise in the Union Territory by adding 613 new polling stations and nearly 8 lakh new voters, taking the total number of eligible voters in J&K to 7586899.

According to an official spokesperson, this was for the first time in the history of J&K that more than 11 lakh names were included in a single SSR period.

"Overall net addition of 772872 electors i.e. more than 10% of the draft electors is a milestone as the best figure till date even in Election year SSRs was less than 2 lakh," he said.

The spokesperson said that in the revised electoral rolls, gender ratio has shown a remarkable

Srinagar: Cold conditions prevailed in Jammu and Kashmir as Srinagar, the summer capital of J&K, recorded the sea-son's coldest night on Friday.

A MeT department official here said that Srinagar recorded a low of minus 1.4°C against minus 0.8°C on the previous night. The temperature was 1.5°C below normal during this time of the year for the capital city so far, he said.

Qazigund recorded a low of minus 2.2°C against minus 2.0°C on the previous night, while in Pahalgam, the mercury settled at minus 3.6°C against minus 4.4°C on the previous night and it was 1.2°C below normal for the south Kashmir resort, he said.

Kokernag recorded a low of minus 0.5°C against minus 1.0°C on the previous night and it was 1.1°C below normal for the place, he said.

Gulmarg recorded a low of 0.0°C against minus 2.4°C on the previous night, the official said. It was 2.1°C above normal for the world famous skiing resort in north Kashmir's Baramulla district, the official said.

In Kupwara town, the mercury settled at minus 2.4°C, the same as on the previous night, the official said. It was 1.9°C below normal for the north

The announcement of winter break in schools came on a day when Srinagar city, recorded the season's coldest night at minus 1.4 degree Celsius.

According to an order issued by the Principal Secretary, School Education Department, Alok Kumar all schools up to class 5th shall observe winter vacation from December 1while the middle classes (6th to 8th standard) will cease academic activities on December 12.

Antioxidant Flavonols Intake Linked To Slower Mental Decline: Study

eople who eat or drink more foods with antioxidant flavonols, found in several fruits, vegetables, tea and wine, may have a slower rate of memory decline, according to a study.

Flavonols are a type of fla-vonoid, a group of phytochemi-cals found in plant pigments known for its beneficial effects on health.

"It's exciting that our study shows making specific diet choices may lead to a slower rate of cognitive decline," said study author Thomas M. Holland of Rush University Medical Centre in Chicago, US.

After adjusting for other factors that could affect the rate of memory decline, such as age, sex and smoking, researchers found that the cognitive score of people who had the highest intake of flavonols declined at a rate of 0.4 units per decade more slowly than people whose had the lowest intake. Holland noted this is probably due to the inherent antioxidant and anti-inflammatory properties of flavonols.

The findings have been published in the journal American Academy of Neurology

"Something as simple as eating more fruits and vegetables and drinking more tea is an easy way for people to take an active role in maintaining their brain health," said Holland



The study also broke the flavonol class down into the four constituents: kaempferol, quercetin, myricetin and isorhamnetin. The top food contributors for each category were: kale, beans, tea, spinach and broccoli for kaempferol; tomatoes, kale, apples and tea for quercetin; tea, wine, kale, oranges and tomatoes for myricetin; and pears,

for isorhamnetin. The researchers found that people who had the highest intake of kaempferol had a 0.4 units

per decade slower rate of cognitive decline compared to those in the lowest group. Those with the highest intake of quercetin had a 0.2 units per decade slower rate of cognitive decline compared to those in the lowest group. People with the highest in-

take of myricetin had a 0.3 units per decade slower rate of cognitive decline compared to those in the lowest group. Dietary isorhamnetin was not tied to global cognition, the study said.

The study involved 961 people with an average age of 81 without dementia. They filled out a questionnaire each year on how often they ate certain foods. They also completed annual cognitive and memory tests including recalling lists of words, remembering numbers and putting them in the correct order, the study said.

They were also asked about other factors, such as their level of education, how much time they spent doing physical activities and how much time they spent doing mentally engaging activities such as reading and

playing games. They were followed for an average of seven years, the study said.

To determine rates of cognitive decline, researchers used an overall global cognition score summarizing 19 cognitive tests. The average score ranged from 0.5 for people with no thinking problems to 0.2 for people with mild cognitive impairment to -0.5 for people with Alzheimer's disease, the study said.

The people were divided into five equal groups based on the amount of flavonols they had in their diet.

While the average amount of flavonol intake in US adults is about 16 to 20 milligrams (mg) per day, the study population had an average dietary intake of total flavonols of approximately 10 mg per day. The lowest group had an intake of about 5 mg per day and the highest group consumed an average of 15 mg per day; which is equivalent to about one cup of dark leafy greens, the study said.

Holland noted that the study shows an association between higher amounts of dietary flavonols and slower cognitive decline but does not prove that flavonols directly cause a slower rate of cognitive decline.

Other limitations of the study are that the food frequency questionnaire, although valid, was self-reported, so people may not accurately remember what they eat.

Guns Fail To Fall Silent

RINAGAR: Hours after the Ramadhan ceasefire an¬nounced by the Prime Minister, Atal Bihari Vapayee, came into effect, reports of escalated violence have come in from various areas shattering the prospects of unilat-eral truce. Eighteen people, including six security person¬nel, were killed and 23 others were injured in separate in¬cidents across the state since early morning today.

In a major incident, four security personnel were killed and 14 others were injured when a powerful explo-sion ripped apart the vehicle they were travelling in at Nowpora-Dooru, 74 km from here on Srinagar-Verinag road in the south Kashmir district of Anantnag this afternoon, official sources said. Condition of most of the wounded sol¬diers were reported to be crtitical. The incident took place around 2 p.m.

Officials said militants detonated the improvised explo-sive device (I E D) immediately after the army vehicle car¬rying jawans of 36 Rashtriya Rifles (RR) passed over it. The explosion was possibly triggered by using a remote control device. The vehicle was blown up killing four jawans and injur-ing 14 others. All the wounded soldiers were rushed to the base hospital here.

Soon after the incident, the security forces laid scige to the entire area after which fear gripped the people. But no searches had been carried out till the reports last came in.

No Jet up in Begaar, frisking Hizb-ul-Mujahideen has claimed responsibility for the inci-

dent and said they would intensify the attacks during the month of Ramadhan. Hizb spokesman, Salim Hashmi, telephoned reporters in Srinagar to claim the responsibility for the blast.

"The unilateral ceasefire announced by the Indian government is not a serious effort, but an attempt to ward off interna-tional pressure on it to resolve the Kashmir issue,"he alleged.

A NAFA report said a foreign militant identified as Tan ¬zeel-ur-Rahman alias Abu Zareen, belonging to Lashkar-e-Taiba was killed in an encounter with the troops of 28 RR at Atri Naribal in Rafiabdd area of Bammulla district today.

Rajinder Singh reports from Jammu: Barely an hour after the ceasefire came into force, nine people, including two security personnel and five militants, were killed in a gun battle at Dhana-Sawjian village in the border district of Poonch. Eight civilians were also injured in the encounter.

Pak Army Chief's Record - And Why It's So **Relevant To India**

KARACHI: Pakistan named Lieutenant-General Asim Munir as the head of the country's nuclear-armed military, the most powerful institution in a nation seldom far from its next crisis.

The appointment could have a crucial bearing on the future of Pakistan's fragile democracy, and whether relations with India are allowed to improve. The Army's Role In Pakistan

During the 75 years since independence and formation of Pakistan out of the Partition of India, the army has seized power three times and directly ruled the Islamic republic for more than three decades, fighting three wars with India along the way.

Even when a civilian government holds power, Pakistan's generals retain a dominant influence over security matters and foreign affairs.

WHO IS ASIM MUNIR

Munir will replace General Qamar Javed Bajwa, who retires later this month after a six-year term. Munir served in Pakistan-

occupied Kashmir and also in Saudi Arabia, a major financial supporter of Pakistan.

He later headed Pakistan's two most influential intelligence agencies - Military Intelligence (MI) in 2017 and then the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) in 2018. He was removed as ISI chief after just eight months on the request of then-Prime Minister Imran Khan. No reason was given for his removal.

Munir is currently serving as the army's quartermaster general, in charge of supplies.

WHY IT MATTERS GLOBALLY

Pakistan's army chief will play a key role in managing risks of conflict with nuclear-armed rival India on its eastern border, while dealing with potential instability and friction with Afghanistan on its western frontier.

Many world capitals, including Washington and Beijing, have direct ties with Pakistan's military, given the country's strategic location in a volatile



neighbourhood, and a coastline close to major shipping lanes serving the oil-rich Gulf.

Foreign governments have periodically questioned the safety of a nuclear arsenal, which includes long-range missiles, in a country so frequently needing IMF bailouts and where anti-Western and anti-India terrorist groups have proliferated. And internal security has

been a near constant problem due to insurgencies in ethnic Pashtun and Baloch regions. Despite all the risks, Pakistan

and its military have dismissed foreigners' concerns over the command and control, and security of its nuclear weapons.

WHY IS THIS APPOINTMENT **IMPORTANT DOMESTICALLY?**

The military has long been accused of manipulating the democratic process to maintain its dominance. Nineteen of Pakistan's 30 prime ministers were elected, but not one of them completed their five year terms. Having recently admitted to its past meddling in politics, the army has said it would no longer interfere. Whether the new chief stands by that commitment could be key to Pakistan's democratic evolution.

Pakistan is in the midst of another bout of political uncertainty as Khan has led countrywide protests in an attempt to force Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif into early elections.

The incoming army chief could potentially play a key role in lowering the political temperature as Pakistan attempts to survive an economic crisis and recover from historic floods.

GENEVA: India on Thursday abstained from voting on a United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) resolution to set up a fact-finding mission to investigate the alleged Human Rights violation committed on protesters in Iran that started on

September 16. Taking to Twitter, United Nations Human Right Council said, "At its 35th special session, the @UN Human Rights Council decided to create a new fact-finding mission to investigate "alleged #HumanRightsViolations in the Islamic Republic of #Iran related to the protests that began on 16 September 2022.' This resolution came amid the

protests that started on September 16 after 22-year-old Mahsa Amini, who was taken into custody by Iran's morality police for wearing an 'inappropriate' headscarf, later died, drawing allegations of custodial violence. Apart from India, Malaysia, Indonesia, UAE, and Khakhastan had also abstained from

the resolution. Meanwhile, Pakistan and China rejected the resolution. However, the resolution in



This follows calls from UN human rights chief Volker Turk for an independent investigation, UN News reported.

In the meeting, the UN High Commissioner highlighted how the security forces, "notably the Islamic Revolutionary Guard

used live ammunition, birdshot, and other metal pellets, teargas and batons" against the protest movement as it has spread to a reported 150 cities and 140 universities in all provinces of Iran. Before calling for an independent probe into all alleged rights violations, the High Commissioner noted that his Office had received "multiple communica-

tions" from Iran about the episode, "including domestic investigations". These efforts "have failed to meet international standards of impartiality, independence, and transparency", UN news quoted Turk as saying.

Responding to the High Commissioner's comments, Iran's representative, Khadijeh Karimi, Deputy of the Vice President for Women and Family Affairs, insisted that "necessary measures" had been taken to seek justice by the Government, after Amini's death. These included the formation of an independent, parliamentary investigation commission as well as a forensic medical team.

"However, before the formal announcement of the probe analysis, the biased and hasty reaction of a number of Western authorities and their interventions in internal affairs of Iran turned the peaceful assemblies into riots and violence," she maintained.

Since Amini's death following her arrest by Iran's so-called Morality Police on September 13 for not wearing her hijab properly, more than 300 people have been killed in protests, including at least 40 children, according to the latest UN human rights office information.



2 Dead As Heavy Rains Hit Saudi Arabia, Block Road To Mecca

RIYADH: At least two people died on Thursday as heavy rains hit western Saudi Arabia, including the coastal city of Jeddah, delaying flights and forcing schools to close, officials said.

"Two deaths have be ed so far, and we call on everyone not to go out unless necessary," the Mecca regional government said on its Twitter page. The Mecca region includes Jeddah, the kingdom's secondlargest city of roughly four million people, and Mecca city, the holiest city in Islam where millions perform the hajj and umrah pilgrimages each year.

In Jeddah, images posted to social media showed standing water snarling traffic and partially submerging some vehicles.

The city's King Abdulaziz International Airport said that "due to weather conditions, the

AHMEDABAD: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said anti-social elements earlier indulged in violence in Gujarat as the Congress supported them, but after the perpetrators were "taught a lesson" in 2002, they stopped such activities and the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) established "permanent peace" in the state.

Parts of Gujarat had witnessed large-scale violence in 2002 following the train-burning incident at Godhra railway station in February that year.

Addressing a rally in Mahudha town of Kheda district in support of BJP candidates ahead of the next month's Assembly elections, Shah alleged, "During the Congress rule in Gujarat (before 1995), communal riots were rampant. The Congress used to incite people of different communities

Congress had strengthened its vote bank and did injustice to a large section of the society."

Shah claimed that Gujarat witnessed riots in 2002 because perpetrators became habitual of indulging in violence due to the prolonged support they received from the Congress.

"But after they were taught a lesson in 2002, these elements left that path (of violence). They refrained from indulging in violence from 2002 till 2022. BJP has established permanent peace in Gujarat by taking strict action against those who used to indulge in communal violence," the Union minister said. Thanking Prime Minister Narendra Modi for abrogating Article 370 from Jammu and Kashmir, Shah alleged that the Congress was against it because of its "vote bank"

India's response to the 26/11 attack could have been much better, he said, adding that he was making this statement "as I am from the force".

Before 2014, if any terror attack took place, India would condemn it and then repeat the condemnation in stronger terms after another incident, and then say "we very very strongly condemn it" when still another attack took place, the retired COAS said.

After 2014 (when Narendra Modi government came to power) an attack is condemned with a stern warning that a repeat will not be forgotten and "we will storm into your house and hit you.'

"This is the change," he said.

Many great world leaders have come to Kashmir and been swayed by its taste. Bakshi Ghulam Mohammad and Nikita Khrushchev fed each other Ghustab, during the latter's state visit to India in 1955; thus ushering a new era of friendship between the USSR and India. Visiting EU parliamentarians were ensorcelled by Wazwan (along with Shikara ride) while Kashmir was held incommunicado back in October 2019.

An attempt was made by Ghulam Mohammad Sadiq, with a socialist touch of the 70s, to phase out Wazwan for being a "vestige of aristocrats of Kashmir". He wanted to buy all the utensils from the cooks to put them in a museum. Sadiq's attempt failed, as did Vivek Agnihotri's who attempted to saffronise it by having Kashmiris, one of the highest mutton consumers in the subcontinent per capita, eat "Veg Wazwan".

Not only did Wazwan impress the Soviet leader but it has also been a tool of diplomacy for many Kashmiri leaders.

It's widely believed that Wazwan saved the government of Ghulam Mohammed Shah who, in 1985 was facing threats of isolation from his Congress allies. Before his opponents could do anything, he flew to Delhi with a bunch of local Wazas from Kashmir to entertain Rajiv Gandhi. Rajiv was swooned; thus power was influenced, tensions were eased and relations were built. Shah was saved.

The modern lavish evolution that Wazwan has seen, however, doesn't seem warranted. No sane Kashmiri would even try to rationalise such unnecessary extravagance and alien trends. Such decadence necessarily seems to be associated with the "modern" culture; and it hasn't left Wazwan unsullied. Ghulam Mohammad Sadiq would've been nodding his head all along.

But is Wazwan really a "vestige of aristocrats"? There are no aristocrats any-



where in the world anymore, let alone in Kashmir. So who are the so-called 'aristocrats' of today? It's the Upper class 'elites' of Kashmir, who have, with novel alien innovations and additions made the dish unaffordable for common people. Let them eat haakh batte!

Substantial social pressure exists in Kashmir. The standard of profligacy, a standard unheard of before, has been set. More than 50,000 girls, a number so colossal in itself, have crossed sociallyperceived 'marriageable' age in Kashmir and find themselves single due to reasons beyond their control. According to a Srinagar based non-profit organisation, Tehreek e Fala-Ul-Muslimeen, it is because of "unnecessary fashion and trend" - a phrase implying pompous ostentatious — is the reason that women are finding it difficult to get married in Kashmir. One of the most important reasons of these late marriages, they said, was "the competition set by a group of people wherein the underprivileged families try to compete with their neighbours belonging from the well-to-do families

Additionally, this traditional cui-

For instance, while efforts are being made at the global level to rid our lives of plastic, Kashmiri Wazwan is wholeheartedly embracing its persistent and unneeded use. Mineral water is getting served in plastic bottles in our Wazwan; curd, which used to come traditionally in earthenware, nowadays comes with plastic along with beverages, another novel intervention.

From all these—undue squander, foreign waste as well as the political flattering—Wazwan needs preservation.

Aladdin's Djin, Lamp and History

In popular depictions like Disney's Aladdin, genies are trapped in lamps with possession of the lamp granting the owner dominion over the genie and its powers via wishes. But the relationship between jinn and vessels is an ancient one of mystery, folklore, and magic.

The idea of containing spirits is relatively widespread throughout the ancient near east.

We have material evidence of bowls from Babylonian Jewish incantation bowls and other similar healing and apotropaic talismanic objects (see Gross & Manekin-Bamberger's Babylonian Jewish Society: The Evidence of Incantation Bowls and Shaked's work).

Similar practices are found in the Islamic world where vessels, bowls, and jars would come to be linked to the jinn, a hidden race of fiery supernatural beings.

Pre-Islamic reference to the jinn, particularly in poetry, often align the jinn to animals. Something which later encyclopedic works like that of al Qazwini would continue.

But we also see a connection to caves, holes, and cracks. Not unlike cats, jinn seem to like to nestle themselves into crevasses. As such humans are warned not to pour hot water into a hole as it may anger or harm a jinn.

Damiri even tells a story of how a man accidentally killed a jinn by tossing the seed of a date into a hole.

Additionally because the jinn are shapeshifters they are able to squeeze their way into any crack or opening. This allows them to slip into homes easily, but could be their undoing.



In one popular tale, a jinn had fallen in love with a woman and so took to the guise of her husband to enter their home. When the real husband came back he found the jinn doppelganger in his own house.

Causing a scene brought the neighbors who were all confounded by the appearance of two of the same man. They were all taken before the local magistrate and wise man who knew just how to handle the matter. He proposes a contest: whoever can squeeze inside the small jar in his hand would be the true husband.

The jinn gave a triumphant shout and quickly changing his form, leaped into the jar only for the magistrate to close the lid, trapping him.

These stories alternatively reveal the jinn as immensely powerful with the ability to ride desert storms to wipe out whole towns but at the same time easily killed by tossing a seed in a hole. They are described as infinitely cunning, yet simple enough to fall for ruses that trap them. (Human propaganda most likely).

Yet the combination of the jinn as shapeshifters and dwellers in cracks and holes along with the older tradition of magic bowls are perhaps an origin for jinn vessels in the form of bowls, jars, and rings and in the case of Aladdin the lamp.

Various legends of King Solomon further this connection. The Qur'an speaks of Solomon's dominion over the jinn who serve him as soldiers and builders (Q 27:17).

Rebellious jinn are punished by trapping them in vessels others are put in service of building great monuments. The tales are found in pre-Islamic poetry like that of al-Dhuby n and further confirmed in the Qur'an. (See Stetkevych)

practices and magic. By the medieval era we encounter a body of literature of how to tame and exorcise jinn. Mages and the wise give instructions for the prescription of talismanic objects which include techniques like the creation of jinn vessels.

Constructed as jars they are inscribed with a seal to contain the mighty jinn. Other objects include magic rings with semi-precious stones like carnelians within which reside jinn servants and familiars.

The jinn ring in particularly is drawn from the legend of the Solomonic seal which contains the sacred Name of God and was given to Solomon from God by the angel Gabriel.

We are also given instructions for the construction of magic bowls. Some of which are inscribed with various Qur'anic verses and used in healing practices usually by drinking water out of them. Finally, we find the relationship between vessels and jinn in popular folk practices as well. Muslims are often advised to avoid leaving jars and bottles open lest a jinn slip in.

Damiri even attributes the advice to Umar, the companion of Muhammad, who advises that jinn feed on anything left in open containers. Muslims are also told not to pour hot water down the sink, a call back to the older stories of pouring hot water into holes.

Further advice warns not to leave open containers of water around as they attract the jinn. Yet that can sometimes be desirable. For example for those who are disturbed by jinn at night, a bowl of water next to the bed can be a solution for the jinn will be drawn to the bowl then trapped in it.

The water can then safely be disposed away from the home. It is not uncommon for bowls of water to be used as a folk healing practice against nightmares and dreams.

And of course some of this makes it way into the Arabian Nights where stories abound of jinn trapped vessels and cast into the sea, or in the case of the story of Aladdin can be found trapped inside a lamp.

But what is often forgotten is there are two jinn in Aladdin! The jinn of the lamp and the jinn of the ring. Both descend from a much older history of jinn and vessels.

Mard Ko Dard Nahi Hota?

Unattainable body standards are not only targeted at female consumers of media, but also at men. In an attempt to secure the ideal physique, eating disorders are on the rise. The November issue of Esquire Singapore brought attention to the rise of 'superhero culture,' one that celebrates a specific kind of masculine body, and puts pressure on men to perform that ideal.

A study carried out at the Melbourne School of Psychological Sciences suggested that continued exposure to extremely muscular male portrayals was detrimental to self-worth in men. This negative effect on self esteem can then lead to anxiety, loneliness and problems in relationships with family or spouses. Not only can such stressors manifest as physical ailments, they can also have a negative effect on those around us.

One media portrayal that acts as a case study is Vasan Bala's 2018 project Mard Ko Dard Nahi Hota. It garnered positive reviews internationally for its play with gendered tropes yet it still falls back on the idea of the superhero. It reads as an example of two steps forward, one step backward. Even as it drives away from misogyny, any loss is dealt with through violence and revenge. This is mediated through the muscular body, trained into a buff superhero spectacle. Surya's character embodies personal revenge and muscularization to the effect of being read as the hero of a vigilante film.

But first... the refreshing choices in the film

We have all heard of the trope 'men don't feel pain.' Mard ko Dard Nahi Hota takes this saying literally to then spin it on its head. The main character Surya is born with a rare disorder that makes him resistant to any and all pain. This seemingly unique condition subjects him to bullying at school, the other kids curious to see what it's like to not feel any pain at all. Supri, a classmate of Surya, defends him when such situations arise. Surya tells his grandfather, "Supri mereko protect karti hai, puri dunya se." The film tries to make the female the protector to flip the trope



of the knight in shining armor.

As an adult, Supri is stuck in an abusive relationship to help her family's medical costs. She is soon guided by her mother into an escape plan. She doesn't continue to suffer resolutely. An idol is not created out of victimhood. The mother is able to secure herself treatment while the daughter escapes her abusive partner.

Often wheelchairs or crutches are cast as invitations for ableism, that is discrimination against disabled people, through expressions of pity. But in the final action scene in the film, Karate Man passes his crutches to Surya as he's broken his leg. The mobility aid is claimed as the need arises in the middle of a fist fight. The spectacle of a fight, the center stage of muscular masculinity shows crutches simply as mobility aids, the hero is not emasculated if he uses them, instead they help him fight. This is an instance of positive disability representation in a Hindi film, hopefully a baton that is carried forward by other filmmakers as well.

A Vigilante Film?

A closer look at the film reveals a certain return to the tradition of films that dominated 70s and 80s Bollywood – that of the vigilante film.

Karen Gabriel, Professor of English and Director of Centre for Study of Gender at St Stephen's College names vigilante masculinity as violent and redemptive according. She states that this masculinity emerges inside a matrix of loss and violence, prioritizing revenge over legal resolution.

Surya loses his mother to a chain snatching incident soon after his birth. We watch him bring up the death of his mother over and over again in the film, especially in relation to the fact that his father and grandfather let the 'chain choor' go. To not let the proverbial thief run away in his own life becomes the be all and end all for Surya.

The emotional excess from his mother's passing is turned into a muscular masculinity channeled in Karate. And any violence acts are always underscored by a redeeming personal history. The narrative is such that he can beat up the nurses looking for Karate Man and injure them in the process, because he must find the teacher who will help him in the journey to become the hero.

Hence Surya's personal loss fuses with his public acts in deciding to become a figure that never loses to the chain chor. Anguish and resulting masculine violence takes our attention away from other afflictions generated by it, says Gabriel. This is observed in the relationship between Surya and his father, who re-

one step backward. Even as it drives away from misogyny, any loss is dealt with through violence and revenge. This is mediated through the muscular body, trained into a buff superhero spectacle. peatedly says he wanted a normal child. Shaking Surya as a toddler, he asks, "tuje kuch mehsoos kyu nahi hota?" The tensions in their relationship are not properly explored because the revenge arc takes the spotlight.

Karen Gabriel's theorization of the vigilante figure says women and villains are treated as props, they simply testify to the narrative of the hero. But in this film, they are well fleshed out, there is the creation of a vigilante figure that shares the center stage with them.

Even as the film shows a disabled hero in the form of Karate Man, it circles back to Surya's hyper-muscularity and superheroism. His physical appearance is complete with six pack abs, and tree-trunk like arms. This film helps us visualize the amount of work needed in divesting from superhero culture and its un-attainable representations. It is not enough to stage sidelined masculine figures as sidekicks to the superhero. Body diversity is a call for all forms of media if we are to move away from damaging and absurd body standards.

Why Covid Infection In Some Causes Fatal Inflammation, **Study Finds**

cientists have uncovered a new mechanism that could help explain why some Covid infected people develop a potentially fatal systemic inflammation, according to a study.

Researchers at the University of Sao Paulo (USP) in Brazil have found that severe COV-ID-19 is associated with an imbalance in an important immune system signalling pathway.

The researchers detected "dysregulation", or a dysfunctional regulation, of the immune system mediated by adenosine triphosphate (ATP), one of the main sources of energy for cellular processes. Severe COVID-19 patients had higher levels

of ATP in their blood and lower levels of adenosine, which should increase when ATP is metabolised for energy production, the study said.

'The immune system comprises several signalling pathways that provide alerts in response to invasion by a pathogen, for example. One involves ATP, which triggers the release of inflammatory substances in defense cells to attack the invader," said study author Maria Notomi Sato

of severe COVID-19 patients," Sato said.

ATP is constantly produced by cells and is broken down in the extracellular environment by enzymes called ectonucleotidases. "ATP turns into a danger signal when it exits cells in large amounts. When does that happen? When an exacerbated inflammatory

response is activated, when cells are badly injured or when some other severe damage occurs," said Anna Julia Pietrobon, co-study author of the article. "In response, ATP triggers an inflamma-

tory process that involves other cells in a chain reaction," said Pietrobon.

For the study, the researchers measured ATP and adenosine levels in blood samples collected in 2020-21 from 88 severe COVID-19 patients. None of them had been vaccinated.

We found cell-surface ectonucleotidases that cleave ATP to be less expressed in cells from both mild and severe COVID-19 patients, but particularly the latter. In fact, we concluded that the higher the ATP level, the more se-vere the disease," Pietrobon said.

The researchers also investigated possible alterations in immune system cells.

"We found that some immune cell cially B lymphocytes, expressed less CD39 and CD73, enzymes that break down ATP.

"We conducted an in vivo experiment in which we gave ATP to cells from both COVID-19 patient and healthy controls. The B cells from patients produced less adenosine than those from the healthy controls, possibly because they expressed less CD39 and CD73," she said.

The researchers do not yet know if the alteration in ATP metabolisation causes or is caused by the exacerbated inflammatory response to SARS-CoV-2. They plan to investigate this in future projects, the study said.

The link between severe COVID-19 and inflammasome activation is exacerbated and fails to shut down after the infection clears.

The inflammasome is a protein complex inside defence cells. When this cellular mechanism is activated, pro-inflammatory molecules, known as cytokines, are produced to warn the immune system that more defence cells need to be sent to the infection site.

According to the researchers who conducted the study on ATP metabolisation, the buildup of ATP in conjunction with low levels of adenosine in severe patients may contribute to exacerbation of the cytokine-mediated inflammatory response.

'Samsung' One Of The Most Commonly Used Passwords In 2021: Study

amsung, or rather "Samsung" with a lowercase S, is one of the most commonly used passwords in at least 30 countries, a recent study by password management solution company Nordpass has showed.

According to SamMobile, using the name of your smartphone/TV/home appliance brand, for example, Samsung, as a password is not the worst offender, but it has grown in popularity in recent years.

While the "samsung" password ranked 198th in popularity in 2019, it rose to 189th in 2020 and 78th in 2021, breaking the top-100 mark last year.

The most popular pass-word is "password," which was reportedly chosen by nearly 5 million users, while other commonly used passwords include "123456," "123456789," and guest", according to the report.

In the case of "samsung," it turns out that it is not the only brand-based password used by a large number of online users.

According to a recent report, a simple and predictable password can be decrypted in less than one second, whereas combining lowercase and uppercase letters with numbers can also produce variable results.

A seven-digit password containing all of those elements can be decrypted in about seven seconds, while an eight-digit password takes about seven minutes, said the report.

The research firm discovered that the majority of commonly used passwords can be decrypted in less than one second because they are short and consist only of numbers or letters with no uppercase characters, the report added.

Self-Cleaning Coating Developed By IIT For Easy Maintenance Of Solar Panels

esearchers at the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Jodhpur have developed a coating technology for self-cleaning of solar panel surfaces.

According to officials, these coatings are transparent, scalable, durable and superhydrophobic. It reduces dust accumulation on solar panels and

According to the team, the coating method is an efficient and easy process to use in existing photovoltaic power generation with simple spray and wipe techniques. Self-cleaning using superhydrophobic coatings does not require much water for cleaning purposes. Thus, it can be used in water-scarce areas with low maintenance costs.

"The immune system also has control mechanisms to avoid excessive inflammation, but when this error in ATP metabolisation occurs, it results in a huge imbalance and systemic dysfunctions in the immune response," said Sato.

The increase in unmetabolised ATP, according to the study, produces a pro-inflammatory state and triggers a potentially fatal systemic inflammation known as a cytokine storm.

The study pointed to an imbalance in the signalling system and a dysfunction in the regulation of these components, as one more factor at the systemic level that attacks the organs

"Lymphocyte levels generally tend to be low in COVID-19 patients, but in our study, not only the levels of B cells in blood from severe patients were low, but these cells also expressed lower amounts of both enzymes, contributing to less ATP metabolisation and hence less production of adenosine, the antiinflammatory component that would try to regulate this response," Pietrobon said.

Given this finding, the researchers decided to isolate the B cells present in the blood samples and provide them with ATP.

insufficient ATP breakdown occurs because of decompensation in this pathway, which functions as a form of anti-inflammatory regulation.

"However, when this error in the ATPadenosine metabolism occurs, the ATP build-up acts as a signal to other inflammation pathways in the immune system, culminating in inflammasome activation, for example," Sato said.

In these cases, in which immune system regulation is dysfunctional, the excessive inflammatory response is directly linked to multiple organ failure and frequently to death.

IRDAI Relaxes Entry Norms For Insurance Biz, Reduces **Solvency Margin**

NEW DELHI: Insurance regulator IRDAI on Friday approved a host of reforms, including easing the entry norms and reducing solvency margin that will unlock Rs 3,500 crore-worth capital for the insurers.

The latest decisions are aimed at increasing the insurance penetration in the country and enabling 'Insurance for All by 2047'.

The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) at its board meeting has also approved a proposal to permit Private Equity (PE) funds to invest directly in insurance companies.

Besides, the watchdog has allowed subsidiary companies to be promoters of insurance companies.

According to a statement issued by IRDAI, a single entity making investment of up to 25 per cent of the paid up capital and 50 per cent for all investors collectively will be treated as 'investor' in insurance companies. Investments over and above that will only be treated as 'promoter'. Earlier, the threshold was 10

per cent for individual investors and 25 per cent for all investors collectively.

IRDAI said that a new provision has been introduced to allow the promoters to dilute their stake up to 26 per cent, subject to condition that the insurer has satisfactory solvency record for preceding 5 years and is a listed entity.

the process of setting up an insurance company in India," IRDAI said.

In order to enable the policyholders to have wider choice and access to insurance, the maximum number of tie-ups for Corporate Agents (CAs) and Insurance Marketing Firms (IMFs) has been increased.

"Now, a CA can tie-up with 9 insurers (earlier 3 insurers) and an IMF can tie up with 6 insurers (earlier 2 insurers) in each line of business of life, general and health for distribution of their insurance products," IRDAI said. With an objective to allow general insurers to efficiently utilise their capital, the solvency factors related to crop insurance has been reduced to 0.50 from 0.70 which will release the capital requirements for insurers by around Rs 1,460 crore.

In case of life insurers, the factors for calculation of solvency for Unit Linked Business (without guarantees) has been reduced to 0.60 per cent from 0.80 per cent and for PMJJBY to 0.05 per cent from 0.10 per cent. This will provide a relaxation in capital requirements by around Rs 2,000 crore, IRDAI said.

PMJJBY is the Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana.

States Demand More Funds In **Pre-Budget Meeting With FM**

NEW DELHI: State finance ministers in their pre-budget consultation have stepped up their demand for more funds, greater say in implementing centrally-sponsored schemes and an increase in payments for royalty on minerals.

These issues were raised by the states at a meeting called by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman to elicit their views on the 2023-24 Budget to be presented on February 1.

Tamil Nadu Finance Minister P Thiaga Rajan said that states, cutting across party lines, said that centrally sponsored schemes are constraining states' fiscal autonomy since in some schemes states end up contributing large amount which is more than the Centre's contribution.

"All states, irrespective of political party, expressed common theme states fiscal autonomy is greatly constrained by the extent of centrally sponsored scheme, by the extent of changing ratios of funding of such schemes," Thiaga Rajan told reporters.

States demanded that they should be given greater flexibility in implementing CSS.

CSS are implemented through a joint contribution of the Union Government and State Government. Bihar Finance Minister Vijay Kumar Choudhary said centrally sponsored schemes should be limited as the burden on states for such schemes is increasing. PTI

India, UAE Central Banks Discuss Rupee, Dirham Trade

NEW DELHI: The central banks of India and UAE are discussing a concept paper on promoting bilateral trade in rupee and dirham with a view to reduce transaction cost, a top official said on Friday.

India's Ambassador to the UAE Sunjay Sudhir said that the concept paper for trade in local currencies was shared by India.

The central banks of both the countries will discuss the standard operating procedures and modalities, he told reporters here. The objective of the exercise is to reduce

the cost of transactions, he added. India and the UAE had already signed a free trade agreement (FTA) in February to give a fillip to bilateral trade and economic ties.

The free trade agreement was aimed at providing significant benefits to Indian as well as UAE businesses, including enhanced market access and reduced tariffs.

Following the free trade pact, bilateral trade is expected to increase from the current USD 60 billion to USD 100 billion in the next five years.

Bilateral trade between India and the UAE stood at USD 43.3 billion in 2020-21. Exports were worth USD 16.7 billion and imports aggregated at USD 26.7 billion in 2020-21. The two-way commerce stood at USD 59.11 billion in 2019-20. PTI

India Doesn't Believe In World Order Where Few Are Considered Superior To Others: Rajnath Singh

curity becomes a truly collective enterprise, then we can think



of creating a global order that is beneficial for all of us," Singh said.

The defence minister said that now "we require to elevate the paradigm of collective security" to a level of shared interests and shared security.

"India believes in a multialigned policy which is realised through diverse engagements through multiple stakeholders so that views and concerns of all can be discussed and addressed for prosperity for all," Singh said. To talk of the security para-

digm, national security should not be considered a zero-sum game, and "we should strive to create a win-win situation for all," he added.

The defence minister also asserted that "a strong, prosperous India wouldn't be built at cost of others. Rather, India is here to

help other nations realise their full potential".

'India doesn't believe in a world order where a few are considered superior to others. India's actions are guided by the essence of human equality and dignity, part of our ancient ethos and its strong moral foundation," Singh said at the IPRD 2022.

"While it's good that we are part of the Ouad (seen as a counterweight to China in the Indo-Pacific region), it will be in our interest that we move cautiously with the US, because Washington has never made itself trustworthy in its dealings with any of its strategic and defence allies," he told the SBI Banking & Economic conclave here on Thursday evening.

Border Violence: Low Attendance In Meghalaya Offices; Assam Police Issues Travel Advisory

Guwahati/Shillong: Attendance in government offices in Meghalaya was thin' on Friday in response to a call by various organisations for a non-cooperation movement in protesting against the November 22 violence along the border with Assam, which left six people dead, officials said.

Assam police officials on Friday issued a fresh advisory asking its citizens not to travel to Meghalaya as the situation is still "not very good" in the neighbouring state where police vehicles were torched and several people were injured during protests on the previous night.

In a relief to the people Meghalaya, the Assam Petroleum Mazdoor Union (APMU) decided to resume transportation of fuel to that state, which it has suspended on Thursday, following assurance of security of tankers and crew from the neighbouring state. Violence had broken out at

Mukroh village near the disputed border between the two states in the early hours of Tuesday after a truck allegedly laden with illegally felled timber was intercepted by forest guards from Assam. Six people, including five tribal villagers from Meghalaya a forest guard from Assam, were killed. Meghalaya Chief Minister

Conrad Sangma called on Union Home Minister Amit Shah in New Delhi on Thursday. Shah assured him that a CBI probe will be initiated into the border violence. Several social organisations

and student associations of Meghalaya, including the influential Khasi Students Union (KSU) and the Federation of Khasi Jaintia and Garo People, declared a "non-cooperation movement' following the incident.

"We urged our brothers and sisters working in both central and state governments to support us by not attending offices on Friday as a mark of respect to the victims of extra-judicial firing at Mukroh by Assam Police," KSU general secretary Donald V Thabah said.

In the Meghalaya capital Shillong, attendance was thin in both central and state government offices, officials said.

The situation is the same in the seven districts of Khasi Hills and Jaintia Hills region, senior officials of the districts told PTI.

"Yesterday in Shillong, public burnt police vehicles. The situation is not very good. That's why we are advising people not to travel (to Meghalaya)," Deputy Commissioner (East) of Guwahati Police Sudhakar Singh told PTI.

Cachar Superintendent of Police Nomal Mahatta also said a similar restriction on people and vehicles from Assam entering Meghalaya through his district also is in force.

Violence erupted in a portion of the Meghalaya capital shortly after a demonstration and a candlelight vigil concluded on Thursday night.

Police had to use tear gas shells to bring the situation under control as unidentified miscreants lobbed petrol bombs at a police bus and a jeep besides pelting the police personnel with stones injuring four of them. Three civilians were also assaulted nearby.

Shops and business establishments run by non-tribals in Khyndailad, Lewduh and certain other areas in Shillong remained shut since Thursday, apprehending violence.

Security in areas, identified as

vulnerable, in the city was tightened, a senior district official told PTI.

The violence had led to the suspension of fuel supply from Assam to Meghalaya.

Assam Petroleum The Mazdoor Union had sent letters to IOC, HPCL and BPCL, informing them of its decision to not load fuel in tankers meant for Meghalaya following attacks on trucks supplying non-petroleum products in the last two davs. However, the decision was

changed on Friday. "We have received assurance from the Meghalaya authorities that safety and security of the tankers, our drivers and other staff will be ensured. But we

have also told them that if any untoward situation happens, we will immediately stop the vehicles once again," APMU general secretary Ramen Das told PTI.

Meghalaya Chief Minister Conrad K Sangma on Friday said there is no shortage of petrol and diesel in the state and requested all citizens not to resort to panic buying of any essential commodities.

Food and Civil Supplies director Pravin Bakshi directed the deputy commissioner of seven districts bordering Assam to arrange for police escorts to vehicles coming from Assam after APMU announced that it has stopped transporting fuel to Meghalaya fearing violence.

When did town planning begin in Kashmir?

It started somewhere in the 1960s. As far as I remember, Mr. Muhammad Sultan Pampori was the first Chief Town Planner in Kashmir. He has done quite good work. I'm the fourth Chief Town Planner in Kashmir.

Basically, a town planner is responsible for the preparation of master plans of towns and cities, regional development plans, tourism development plans, traffic and transportation schemes, town planning schemes, urban development related policy documents, etc.

Earlier, there used to be one chief town planner in Jammu and Kashmir. Now, there're separate town planners for Jammu and Kashmir.

How has been your journey as a town planner in Kashmir?

As a native of Downtown Srinagar, I grew up watching urban evolution over the time. I was quite receptive about the change since my school days at SSI Mission School Mallaratta, Srinagar.

Later, I did Bachelors in Civil Engineering from Regional College (REC)-now Engineering National Institute in Technology (NIT) Srinagar, but I was not able to fit in the system.

So, I decided to shift to something that is allied with Civil Engineering and went into Planning.

In 1988, I went to the School of Planning and Architecture, New Delhi and did Masters in Planning.

A total of 412157 requests for deletion were received out of which 358222 were accepted and 53935 were rejected," the spokesperson said.

He further said it resulted in a net increase of 772872 electors in the Final Electoral Roll, i.e. a 10.19% net increase of the registered electors over the Draft Roll.

"The final Electoral Rolls have a total of 8359771 electors, out of which 4291687 are Male, 184 are Third Gender and 4067900 are Females. The Elector Population Ratio has increased from 0.52 to 0.58 during this SSR. The Gender Ratio of the Final Electoral Roll has increased from 921 to 948," the spokesperson added.

"When people write about a bridge that is coming up or a village that is coming up, please remember these were in areas that you lost in 1962. If that had not happened this would not have happened. The loss in 1962 is still a handicap that we carry. We may regret it, it does not reverse it,"

DOHA: England fans will be barred from Friday' match in Qatar against the United States and future World Cup games if they wear crusader replica costumes which are considered culturally insensitive in a Muslim country, FIFA has said. England supporters have used imitation chain-mail armour, plastic helmets and toy weapons as a fancy dress for games for years.

But images of some fans dressed as crusaders at Monday's 6-2 win over Iran in the Qatari capital Doha were criticised online, prompting the

sport's world governing body to crack down on the costumes. These costumes in an Arab or Middle Eastern context can be perceived as being offensive so that's the reason for them not being permitted in stadiums,'

a FIFA spokesperson said. For many Arabs, the word crusade summons up a painful history of violent invasion by Christians seeking to capture Jerusalem and nearby areas under Islamic rule in the 11th to 13th centuries. Issues around culture and rights have been in focus almost as much the soccer at the World Cup in Qatar. Some Wales fans were ordered to remove hats with the rainbow colours of the LGBT community at their team's first match of the tournament against the United States earlier this week. Same-sex relations are illegal in Qatar.

Welsh football authorities said on Thursday that FIFA had confirmed that supporters with rainbow-coloured hats and flags would be allowed entry to the stadium for Wales' match against Iran on Friday, which Wales lost 2-0. The captains of England, Wales, Belgium, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Germany and Denmark this week dropped their plans to wear armbands to back gay rights under pressure from FIFA.

DOHA: Brazil duo Nevmar and Danilo will miss their country's remaining two World Cup group games and face a fight to be fit for the knockout stage after sustaining injuries in Thursday's 2-0 win over Serbia, a source close to the team told Reuters on Friday. Brazil top Group G and next face Switzerland and Cameroon, without their most famous player Neymar and ever-reliable fullback Danilo, though the team's doctor confirmed only that they would miss the Swiss game.

"Neymar and Danilo went through an MRI on Friday afternoon and we found ligament damage in the ankle of both of them,"

Rodrigo Lasmar told reporters.

'They will miss the next game for sure and we will be cautious as they will undergo treatment in order to try to get them in shape so they can play again in the World Cup."

Neymar has had problems with his right foot and ankle for several years and looked distraught when he left the pitch late in Thursday's match.

In the 2014 World Cup he suffered a back injury in the quarter-final victory over Colombia, ruling him out of the 7-1 semifinal defeat by Germany. Adding to Brazil's problems, winger Antony and midfielder Lucas Paqueta are both ill and could also miss the match against Switzerland on Monday.

As this grisly case develops in the nation, several gender-rights activists and researchers have urged Indian policymakers to pay heed to intimate partner violence.

The UN report reveals that women and girls in all regions are affected by gender-



dangerous place is the home. A 2021 World Health Organisation (WHO) report revealed that globally, one in every three women experience physical or sexual violence from their intimate partners across their lifetime,

making intimate partner violence the most prevalent form of violence in the world.

The report revealed that women who experienced violence were 1.3 times more likely to report mental and emotional stress than those who had not. Seven in 10 said they thought verbal or physical abuse by a partner became more common during the pandemic, and three in 10 were of the opinion that violence against women, in their community, had increased.

The latest report suggested that violence starts early for women (aged 15-24 years). One in four women who have been in a relationship will have already experienced violence by an intimate partner by the time they reach their mid-twenties.

The WHO also highlights that the likelihood of women undergoing intimate partner violence in their lifetime is at a higher range in the Global South than in the Global North.

Elon Musk Hires George Hotz, Who Hacked iPhones As A Teen, To Fix Twitter Search

ver since Elon Musk completed ■ \$44 billion deal to take over Twitter at the end of October, the company's headcount has decreased through layoffs and resignations to a tiny fraction of its original number. Now amid this, the "Chief Twit" has hired Geroge Hotz, the man who rose to instant fame for hacking iPhones in 2007, as a Twitter intern for 12 weeks.

According to a Twitter conversation between Mr Musk and Mr Hotz, the former iPhone hacker has been hired to fix the "broken" search feature on the platform and remove the non-dismissible login

pop-up that appears if one is trying to browse. Mr Hotz received the offer from Twitter's new boss after he appreciated Mr Musk's ultimatum to Twitter employees to go "extremely hardcore" or leave.

I'm down for a 12 week internship at Twitter for cost of living in SF. It's not about accumulating capital in a dead world, it's about making the world alive," he added in a separate tweet. To this, Mr Musk responded with an offer to talk. "Sure, let's talk," he wrote.
