Bandipora Explosion Kills 4 Civilians, Injures 24

rinagar- Five persons, including three women and a BSF jawan were killed in two separate explosions in Bandipora town of Baramulla district since last evening, while five BSF personnel and two dozen civilians were injured. Reports said a grenade explosion inside the Bus Stand at Bandipora today left four persons dead and some two dozen others injured. The condition of most of the injured is stated to be serious. Some of them have been shifted to Srinagar for treatment in various hospitals, reports said.

As per the available information unknown persons hurled a grenade towards a bus, when passengers were coming out of it at exact 2-15 p.m. The bus had come from village Arahgam, when the unidentified persons struck.

Reports said all the four died on the spot. They have been identified as Noor Din, 20, of Arin, Ban.dipora, Nighat wife of Manzoor Ahmad Ganai, Bushra Begum of Dachigam Bandipora, Mogli wife of Ghulam Rasool of Kraletang, Bandipora. The grenade exploded with a bang and sparked panic among the people, who ran helter skelter. Shopkeepers brought down their shutters and traffic was disrupted. It is not known who were behind the blast and what the exact target was.

Police blamed militants, however no group has owned responsibility so far.

Earlier last evening suspected militants fired rockets at a BSF convoy near Matrigam village in Bandipore killing a constable and injuring five others, including an inspector.

Reports said militants fired rockets at the convoy at 10-30 p.m. last evening and followed it by firing from their automatic rifles. Reinforcements that reached the scene later shifted the injured to the hospital. The condition of two personnel is serious. While the identity of the slain BSF personnel could not be 'ascertained, sources identified the injured inspector as S. S. Chauhan. Security forces this morning sealed the area for conducting house-to-house searches

Why Emmanuel Macron Must Be Listened To About Russia

The world is in the midst of deep uncertainty- politically, economically and in terms of world politics. If the drift of things is allowed to continue, then Cold War 2.0 that is in the offing but at an incipient stage could become a horrifying reality with unintended consequences for the world at large ike any human , the French president Emmanuel Macron is a flawed being but he may not be faulted for remarkable maturity and leadership. In his latest overture, he has suggested that Russia be accorded the security guarantees that the county seeks- precisely the ones that were on the table when talks between Russia and the West broke down. While Macron has copped blame (of a vicious variety) for his suggestion, but if the war over Ukraine is to be stopped, Macron must be listened to.

The reasons are manifold.

One major reason is that it blows the wind out of Vladimir Putin's sails. If the war that he started was really over the rationales he stated-NATO expansion, Russia's overall insecurity and so on- then the Russian president no longer has any justification to pursue his war. The question is why would Putin be amenable to these guarantees and stop the war?

Because he is losing. The choices or options before the west are : should the proverbial screws be tightened against Russia? Should the war be expanded? Should regime change in Russia be the ultimate goal?

The answer to these questions must be a resounding No. Why?

First consider the denouement of the war. What was assumed to be a cakewalk for Putin has turned to be a quagmire primarily because of Ukrainian resistance and mostly because of Western support- advice and materiel- to Ukraine. In the whole schemata, while Putin sought rhetorical escalation of the war by implied use of tactical nukes, he and his generals have been careful not to seek any entanglements with NATO- all for very obvious reasons. Now given that Putin is in a situation where he is not entirely losing the war, but surely he has not won it. The referendums he held in Russian occupied regions appear to be in the nature of creating a fait accompli mostly for tactical reasons- seek concessions at some point during and in the negotiations. If Putin is neither winning but almost losing, why create a monster out of Russia by pushing the war further?

This is not a rhetorical question but one fraught with practical implications. One is , in an inversion and reformulation of the Cold War 'domino theory'. If the war by the West with NATO at the forefront is expanded and extended into regime change, surely military victory will be the West's. But there will be political prices. If, to stretch the hypothesis further, the Russian

regime is decapitated, China will be watching. The country will draw obvious conclusions. It may or may not attack Taiwan but its suspicions of the West will be heightened. The corollary will be the hardening of its stance and solidification of Cold War 2.0.

There are then linkages with broader international politics and world order and peace thereof.

Macron is then being a statesman if the ultimate goal of statesmanship is forging peace.

But what about European security?

Macron's statement can be construed as augury of a distinct European security order. (In fact, he has explicitly said so). This may be a good beginning. European foreign, defence and foreign policies have fallen victim, one to the nature of the European Union construct and two its dependence on NATO and by extension the United States. The Ukraine war and the multiple crises it engendered could well turn out to be that silver lining wherein France is belling the proverbial cat. For all intents and purposes, the United States is making a pivot(not in the sense that Obama envisaged) to Asia. This from a SWOT analysis perspective is not a threat but an opportunity that Europe must grasp.

The world is in the midst of deep uncertainty-politically, economically and in terms of world politics. If the drift of things is allowed to continue, then Cold War 2.0 that is in the offing but at an incipient stage could become a horrifying reality with unintended consequences for the world at large. It needs to be stemmed, stanched and ameliorated. The path toward this starts from Ukraine in a way that addresses the legitimate concerns of Ukrainians, gives them back their nationhood but at the same time addresses legitimate concerns of Russia. War as a hoary institution has its purposes but in the final analysis contra Clausewitz ' all war is bad politics'. Let peace be given a chance. To repeat, the path begins from Ukraine.

Alors Monsieur Le Macron!

'Hardcore': The Mars of Elon Musk

Twitter CEO's next big goal is to build a city on Mars. So what

exactly might a Muskian Mars-scape look like?

ot long after commandeering Twitter in October for a sum of \$44bn, Elon Musk – who is also the CEO of SpaceX and the self-branded "Technoking" of Tesla – dispatched an ultimatum to Twitter employees giving them two options. The first was to commit to being "extremely hardcore" and working "long hours at high intensity". The second was to quit.

Musk had already fired approximately half of Twitter's workforce – since anyone with a mere \$44bn to spare on buying a social media platform is clearly in the business of pinching pennies.

And so it is that my editors have forced me to go back on my promise to never write about Elon Musk again. But, hey, this is capitalism, and we're all hardcore.

On the surface, writing about Musk should be like shooting fish in a barrel. The 51-year-old US-based South African live-tweets his bowel movements, makes penis jokes, gets off on anti-Black racism, and builds not-so-selfdriving electric cars that crash into parked emergency vehicles. Unfortunately, this particular fish happens to be the richest person on the planet, who wields disproportionate control over terrestrial matters like the stock market and Donald Trump's Twitter presence and who is now determined to make humanity a "spacefaring civilisation" as well - whether we like it or not.

As Musk told Time magazine, which shamelessly crowned him "Person of the Year" in 2021, the "next really big thing is to build a self-sustaining city on Mars and bring the animals and creatures of Earth there". According to Time's obsequious writeup, Musk predicted colonising Mars within five years. Eventually, rocket ships would shuttle 100 people at a time to the Red Planet and then travel back to Earth, powered by Made-in-Mars fuel.

Of course, it is not immensely reassuring that the man who is leading the conquest of outer space is the same man who once tried to bribe a college kid \$5,000 to take down a Twitter account that tracks Musk's private jet using publicly available data. When the bribe didn't work, Musk resorted to blocking the teenager.

But in the event Musk's cosmic experiment succeeds, what exactly might a Muskian Mars-scape look like? Even leaving aside logistical matters like respiration, it's safe to assume the environment would be fairly, um, hardcore.

For starters, workers' rights would likely be nonexistent. Musk has already blissfully violated earthly labour laws, threatened workers wishing to pursue unionisation, spied on employees, and been bombarded with allegations that his behaviour encourages sexual harassment and racism in the workplace. And he reopened one of his California factories in May 2020 in defiance of local coronavirus pandemic restrictions, leading to hundreds of COVID-19 cases.

On Mars under Musk, taxes would also likely be nonexistent – at least for multigazillionaires like him who have traditionally been loath to contribute even the tiniest fraction of their wealth to US government taxes ostensibly collected on behalf of the public good. Naturally, Musk and his companies have never hesitated to receive billions of dollars in public subsidies and government contracts. **Of course**, it is not immensely reassuring that the man who is leading the conquest of outer space is the same man who once tried to bribe a college kid \$5,000 to take down a

once tried to bribe a college kid \$5,000 to take down a Twitter account that tracks Musk's private jet using publicly available data As for the composition of the selfsustaining Martian city, the 2021 "Person of the Year" explains that it will be "sort of like a futuristic Noah's ark" - but with more than two of each animal because "it's a little weird if there's

only two". Back in 2020, he reckoned that "a million tonnes" of vitamin C would be required to make human life sustainable on Mars, where a system of "direct democracy" and self-governance would also be implemented.

Never mind that Musk's conception of "democracy" is basically whatever Musk himself thinks should happen in any given situation – just as his selfidentification as a "free-speech absolutist" pretty much means that Musk and only Musk can say absolutely whatever he wants.

To be sure, "free speech" hardly applies to the antifascist journalists and activists who are currently being purged from Twitter in order to allow right-wing extremist delusions to more efficiently take flight and orbit the digital world. For an example of Muskian "democracy", meanwhile, consider his reinstatement of Trump's banned Twitter account, which transpired following a 24-hour "poll" of Musk's Twitter followers.

A narrow majority of respondents voted in favour of Trump's return, whereupon Musk tweeted: "The people have spoken... Vox Populi, Vox Dei" – a Latin expression meaning that the voice of the people is the voice of God.

One guess who's playing "God" in the equation (hint: it's not Trump).

But what, in the end, would anyone actually do on Mars, aside from manufacture fuel for Musk's rocket ships and ingest massive quantities of vitamin C? Time magazine informs us that Musk foresees a future in which all labour is performed by robots and goods and services abound: "There's, like, plenty for everyone, essentially,' he says. 'There's not necessarily anyone who's the boss of you.'"

There were no doubt plenty of Twitter employees wishing for just such an arrangement in mid-November when boss-man Musk sent his "hardcore" threat. It remains to be seen how a human race that is rapidly killing itself and the Earth with capitalism will spontaneously face an overabundance of resources and worker-robots to boot – or how you go from having to work "long hours at high intensity" to not having to work at all.

And who knows what "plenty for everyone" means coming from someone whose net worth has reached nearly \$300bn. What will the eight billion humans who are not Musk have to accept as "plenty"?

In other words, the details of Muskian fantasy need some ironing out.

Ultimately, though, the futuristic colonisation of Mars that Musk envisions would simply entail launching into space everything that is wrong with the Earth. Expansion, after all, is the name of the game in capitalism – and what better place than the universe to expand astronomically?

Musk gravitates towards Mars because it's tabula rasa: a place where laws, taxes, and other pesky phenomena won't interfere with megalomaniacal, narcissistic tyranny. Obscene earthly wealth just doesn't cut it; Musk is shooting for the stars – or to be CEO of Mars.

But as everyone's favourite "Technoking" works at expanding his intergalactic CV, it seems that, at the end of the day, he just wants to be the god of the cosmos. And if Musk's Martian wet dream pans out, rest assured nothing will ever be down to earth again.

he history of Islamic religious, spiritual and intellectual tradition in the Indian subcontinent impressively spans over a millennium. The studies exploring varied dimensions of Islam, Muslims and their religious/intellectual traditions have not only fascinated the Muslim scholarship (like I.H. Qureshi, I. H. Siddiqi, Aziz Ahmad, K. A. Nizami, M. Noor Nabi, A. Rashid, S. M. Ikram,) but a majority of non-Muslim Western Orientalists like Elliot and Dowson, Eaton, Arnold, Murray Titus, C. Ernst and Bruce Lawrence to count a few. However, in this regard, only few instances have been recorded from the Muslim intellectuals outside the Indian subcontinent. Of these sparse attempts, Dr Abdul Kader Choughley's (b. 1955, renowned Muslim scholar and educationist based in Springs, South Africa) works reflect a noticeable endeavor in underscoring the contribution of the scholars from the subcontinent to the Quranic and Seerah studies, Islamic intellectual tradition and biographical compendia. With this backdrop. K. A. Nizami Centre for Quranic Studies AMU has brought out his Commemorative Volume, entitled Islamic Intellectual Tradition in the Indian Subcontinent: Essays in the Honour of Dr Abdul Kader Choughley, to recognize his contribution for 'enhancing and enriching' the study on Islamic intellectual and religious tradition of the Indian subcontinent. The volume has been edited by two budding scholars from Kashmir, (Dr) Tauseef Ahmad Parray and Muhammad Yaseen Gada (PhD, AMU).

STRUCTURE OF THE VOLUME

The volume contains three main sections apart from preliminary contents that include a foreword by Prof A. R. Kidwai (renowned Indian Academician and an expert on Quranic Studies from AMU/Honorary Director, K. A. Nizami Centre), an "Introduction" by the editors

introducing the works of Dr Choughley as well as the contents of the book. While Section/Part-I, consisting five chapters, deals with 'Ouranic and Seerah Studies'. Section/Part-II, in its four chapters, takes in hand the 'Islamic Intellectual Tradition Vis-à-vis Sub-Continent.' Finally, a bio-note on and a bibliography of Dr Choughley compiled by the editors and an essay related to his academic career and adventures as "Strav Reflections" by Chougley and Parray fill the concluding Section/Part-III or Appendix of this work. Finally, a copious list of works cited in the book prepared by the editors concludes the volume.

CRITICAL EVALUATION OF THE VOLUME

The "Introduction" as usual helps in estimating the subject matter of the book although the opening portion on Dr Chougley seems a reiteration of Prof Kidwai's foreword.

Prof Kidwai's "English Translations of the Qur'an: Trends and Issues" (Ch.1/ Section-I) exhibits a meticulous and expertly academic and critical treatment of the English Translations of the Our'an by Orientalists, Qadiyanis, some deviant translations, sectarian translations by Muslims, the English versions of Urdu translations and recent forms of translating the Qur'an in English. The author's critical evaluation greatly helps in alarming the general readers of the Qur'an of the obnoxious designs, misinterpretations, interpolations and distortions jampacking their translations. However, major portion of Kidwai's write-up depicts a reiteration or summary of his previous works especially published in the Muslim World Book Review. Furthermore, Kidwai's selective attitude while analyzing the "sectarian trend in translations" seems prejudiced or partial as he exclusively marks out the Shia and Barelwi (who consider themselves as Ahl-al-Sunnah and as per Kidwai have the largest following in the subcontinent) translations in this section surprisingly sparing other

Muslim sects/ideologies like the Deobandis, Jamat-i Islami, Ahl al-Hadith, modernists etc. Also, his disparaging remarks on the Barelwi translation that it carries "Prophet Muhammad's (#) or Saint/Awliya' 'disproportionate' (p.38) veneration seems questionable and need to be revisited (given the fact that a scale that would determine the justified level of Prophet's maise/veneration is vet to be formulated by the Muslims). Although, his proposition of the features of producing a 'Standard English translation' reflects his profundity and decades-long engagement and understanding of the field of English Translations of the Quran (ETQs).

Dr. Tauseef Ahmad Parray's attempt in "Words Divine, Interpretations Human: An Analytical Study of Kidwai's and Choughley's Selected Works on Qur'anic Studies" (Chapter 2/Section I) at analyzing (Prof) Kidwai's and Choughley's works on Quranic Studies is exhaustive although by major the subject matter reflects a typical narrative articulation. His analysis that Kidwai's critical appraisal of the Orientalists' Translations is 'unbiased and objective' stands indisputable.

A thematic piece related to Quranic studies by Juneefa Bilal marks the presentation of Indo-Pak Muslim scholars' approaches/views on the concept of the I'jaz al-Qur'an (Miraculousness of the Quran) meanwhile reflecting a thematic, informative and comprehensive endeavor. Although a thematic piece yet bereft of a deep analytical or critical method, the discussion "Recent Approaches to the Concept of I'jaz al-Qur'an: A Study of Muslim Scholars of the Sub-continent (Ch.3/Sec.1)" by

Juneefa Bilal follows a descriptive and narrative style unfurling the views of the traditional as well as some modern Muslims scholars' views on the concept of I'jaz al-Quran. The author's assessment pertaining this issue seems fitting and this chapter adds a significant addition to the opening section on the Ouranic studies.

"Writing Seerah in the Light of the Qur'an: A Study of Abdul Majid Daryabadi's 'The Prophet Muhammad's (PBUH) Life in the Light of the Qur'an" (Ch.4/Sec.1) by Adil Hussain Malik furnishes an interesting theme for the readers. Malik's summary and extensive description, though lacking an analytical treatment (except for a few statements). of Abdul Majid Daryabadi's works on Seerah appears helpful in understanding the Seerah in light of the Qur'an.

"Modern Trends in the Seerah and the Contribution of Yasin Mazhar Siddiqui: An Appraisal of Selected Works" (Ch.5/Sec.1) by Dr Parray is an academic endeavor to highlight Prof. Y. M. Siddiqui's (AMU) remarkable contribution to the Seerah Studies posthumously. Parray's assessment that Siddiqui's works on Seerah accrue a unique position with regards their themes, objectivity, analyses and methodology is indisputable and his selection of Siddiqui's works is timely and highly relevant. Although Parray reviews the works in his own capacity, he frequently seems to rely on the statements of other reviewers of these works.

Discussion on the studies related to Islamic intellectual tradition of the subcontinent would be deficient without mentioning Abul Hasan Ali Nadwi's

nently, Dr S. Jameil Ali and T. A. Parray's "Mawlana Abul Hasan Ali Nadwi's Educational Thought and Philosophy" (Ch. 6/ Sec.2) and Dr Samee-Ullah-Bhat's (Ch. 7/Sec.2) "Sayyid Abul Hasan Ali Nadwi's Contribution to Islamic History: An Analytical Study of his Tarikh-i-Dawato-Azeemat" embellish the volume with an exhaustive discussion on Nadwi. The Dr Jameil & Parray have maintained a descriptive and analytical delivery while accentuating Ali Miyan Nadwi's educational philosophy. Their content offers a coherent style emphasizing initially on Nadwi's espousal of modern educational pedagogy alongside the religious and moral education followed by his critical appraisal of the Western worldview, philosophies and education system. Dr Samee-Ullah's chapter spreads out a content summary of Nadwi's celebrated five volume Tarikh-i-Dawat-o-Azeemat (Saviors of the Islamic Spirit). The author delivers the content with a narrative and preaching style and the discussion lacks in proper academic analysis or critical investigation of this voluminous title by Nadwi. However, the write-up would be of substantial help for the readers in comprehending the methodology as well as the comprehensiveness of the themes discussed in the volume.

With a direct bearing on the title (under review). Dr M. Yaseen Gada exerts at analyzing Choughley's works on Fazlur Rahman Ansari (d.1974) a renowned Islamic scholar of the Indian subcontinent. (Ch. 8/Sec.2) in "Abdul Kader Choughlev's Works on Fazlur Rahman Ansari: An Analysis". The author draws on Choghley's works selecting few themes and regurgitates Chougley's understanding of Ansari's works without any meticulous or critical observation except for assessing that Choughley's approach toward Ansari is "panegyric".

With a narrative style and comparative methodology, Dr. M. Younus Kumar's "Contextualizing Jihad (Striving

in the Path of God): A Study of the Approaches of Wahiduddin Khan and Javed Ahmad Ghamidi" (Ch. 9/Sec.2) represents a descriptive thematic study among few such endeavors contained in the title. Kumar's description of Ghamidi's and Khan's views on the concept of Jihad seems a recurrent emphasis on their monotonous stance and departure from the interpretations of the traditional 'Islamist' scholars (like Mawdudi and Outb) on Jihad. The chapter, although bereft of a profound critical or analytical examination (of the views of Khan and Ghamidi), helps in estimating the similarity as well as the expanse of difference of opinion among the Muslim scholars/intellectuals pertaining the crucial concepts like Jihad in the modern era.

CONCLUSION

In an overall valuation, the work appears as a compilation of loosely correlated academic writings by researchers, scholars and experts of different branches of Studies on Islam. The work marks a genuine academic contribution to the studies on Islamic intellectual tradition with some novel and insightful additions pertaining to Quranic and Seerah studies. Besides, the volume adequately acknowledges and brings to limelight Choughley's contribution to the Islamic intellectual tradition of the subcontinent. However, a critical and analytical treatment of Choughley's works is wanting and the sequence of the contents/ themes discussed considerably lacks coherence. Markedly informative, furnishing some novel, relevant and academically significant pieces for the deliberation of readers, the work is strongly recommended for researchers, academics and intellectuals especially those interested in exploring Islamic Intellectual tradition.

UAE 'Sandwich Maker' Job Ad For Nationals Sparks Local Fury

Abu Dhabi- An advert inviting Emiratis to apply for a "sand-wich maker" job has sparked a storm with citizens decrying purportedly humiliating attempts to provide employment - and authorities launching a probe.

The UAE Public Prosecution office said on Saturday it was opening an "immediate investigation" following a "contentious" job advert and was even "interrogating the CEO of the business"

It did not specify the firm or CEO but the statement came after the Kamal Osman Jamjoom Group – a retail giant – advertised the position at the Subway fast food chain, tailored specifically for Emirati nationals "to support the state's efforts to localise jobs".

The vacancy announcement later retracted — came ahead of a looming January deadline for private UAE-based companies with more than 50 employees to ensure that two per cent of their staff are UAE nationals, on pain of fines.

"This is mockery," one Twitter user said in response to the Subway vacancy. Another Twitter post shared

by hundreds, read: "The lack of administrative, financial and technical jobs has led to 'sandwich maker'... Oh, what an

age!" Even Emirati academics were drawn into the conversation. "This post-oil transition period is proving difficult," said Emirati

researcher Mira al-Hussein. Others, however, said there

is no shame in such jobs, with one Emirati noting on Twitter that billionaire Jeff Bezos started out as a McDonald's employee.

In a post on Saturday, the UAE Public Prosecution office said "the job ad has broken both Emiratisation regulations and media content standards as it included contentious content".

The Kamal Osman Jamjoom Group has apologised for the ad, saying a "translation error" led to the faulty formulation.

According to the International Labor Organization (ILO), more than 90pc of the UAE's private sector labour force is comprised of expatriates.

UAE nationals are mainly employed in stable and relatively well-paying jobs in the coun-try's vast public sector, the ILO says.

As part of a push to boost Emirati employment, the UAE government this year launched mandatory 'Emiratisation' drive that obliges most major private sector companies to hire nationals in skilled positions.

As of January 1, 2023, noncompliant firms can face fines of up to 6,000 dirhams (\$1,633) for each position they have failed to fill with an Emirati national.

Last month, the UAE's linister of Human Minister Resources and Emiratisation Abdulrahman Abdulmannan al-Awar said that more than 14,000 Emiratis have entered the job market in 2022.

SC To Hear On Dec 13 Bilkis Bano's Plea **Challenging Remission To Convicts**

New Delhi: The Supreme Court is scheduled to hear on December 13 a plea filed by Bilkis Bano, who was gangraped and seven members of her family killed during the 2002 Gujarat riots, challenging the remission of sentence of 11 convicts in the case by the state government.

A bench of justices Ajay Rastogi and Bela M Trivedi is likely to take up the plea of Bano, who has also filed a separate prayer seeking a review of the apex court's May 13, 2022 order on a plea by a convict.

The top court had asked the Gujarat government to consider the plea for premature release of the convicts in terms of its policy of July 9, 1992 about deciding a remission petition within a period of two months.

In her plea against the grant of remission which had led to the release of the convicts on August 15, Bano said the state government passed a mechanical order completely ignoring the requirement of law as laid down by the Supreme Court.

"The enmasse premature release of the convicts in the much talked about case of Bilkis Bano, has shaken the

conscience of the society and resulted in a number of agita-tions across the country," she said in the plea.

Referring to past verdicts, the plea said enmasse remissions are not permissible and moreover, such a relief cannot be sought or granted as a matter of right without examining the case of each convict individually based on their peculiar facts and role played by them in the crime.

"The present writ petition challenging the decision of the state/central government granting remission to all the 11 convicts and releasing them prematurely in one of the most gruesome crimes of extreme inhuman violence and brutality by a group of human beings upon another group of human beings, all helpless and innocent people - most of them were either women or minors, by chasing them for days together persuaded by hate towards a particular community," it said. The plea, which gave minute

details of the crime, said Bano and her grown-up daughters were shell-shocked with this sudden development.

"The decision of the government came as a shock to the citizens, nationally and internationally, and the society across segments showed anger, disappointment, distrust and protested the clemency shown by the government.

"When the nation was celebrating its 76th Independence Day, all the convicts were released prematurely and were garlanded and felicitated in full public glare and sweets were circulated and this is how the present petitioner along with the entire nation and the whole world came to know about the shocking news of premature release of all the convicts (respondents no. 3-13) of one of the most gruesome crime this country has ever seen of multiple time gang rape of a preg-

nant woman," it said. It referred to wide-virtual public protest in each city, on all social media platforms and news channels, portals.

It was also reported heavily that Muslims of the area started fleeing away from Rahimabad in fear after release of these 11 convicts, the plea said.

The separate review plea said Bano was not made a party to the petition by a convict who along with others was released under the state's remission policy which is not in force.

the wildlife department of Jammu and Kashmir along with several NGO's have formed various teams to understand the presence and abundance of snow leopards in the region.

The surveys are being collaborated with National Conservation Foundation (NCF) and are being conducted under the Snow Leopard Population Assessment of India (SPAI) project funded by the Ministry of Environment Forests and Climate Change.

"The teams have been conducting surveys around Gurez, Thajiwas, Baltal-Zojila, Warwun, and Kishtwar landscapes for a year now," said Nagash.

He said they used three methods to locate the Snow Leopard population.

1) Occupancy (based on interview and survey), 2) Camera trapping and 3) Gene based (Sample collection and analysis)

Naqash said they have roped-in the Wildlife division of Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology (SKUAST) and Zoology department of Kashmir University as knowledge partners.

He said the potential snow leopard habitats in J&K were installed with grids, based on a randomized grid search approach.

The department in its interim report of Kashmir region noted that given the topography, accessibility, and habitat heterogeneity, a uniform grid size of 5 x 5 instead of 15 x 15 km was unanimously adopted for SPAI surveys.

"Then we assigned the grids to different rencies for assessment of snow leonards

In Kashmir region, there are 44 grids in Gurez and Thajiwas landscape and 38 grids in the Pir Panjal range that, according to the department, will be covered in the coming months using questionnaire-based surveys, camera trapping and scat collection from October onwards. In the Jammu region, the department notes that there are still 120 sampling grids that need to be sampled.

It further added the entire study area (12000 km2) was divided into 491 sampling units (grid-cells) of 5 km x 5 km each.

"Camera trapping and key informant interviews, using structured questionnaires were used to document the presence of snow leopard in the region," the report said.

The report further revealed that the camera traps or genetic surveys in a spatial capture recapture framework will be carried out for intensive sampling at randomly selected areas across the state that represent different snow leopard habitats and variations in snow leopard density.

The department conducted several workshops for the volunteers and other partners to understand how to conduct the survey.

More media workers were killed covering the war in Ukraine 12 in total than in any other country this year, according to the IFJ. Most were Ukrainian but also included those of other nationalities such as American documentary filmmaker Brent Renaud.

Many deaths occurred in the first chaotic weeks of the war, though threats to journalists continue as the fighting drags on.

The IFJ said "the rule by terror of criminal organisations in Mexico, and the breakdown of law and order in Haiti, have also contributed to the surge in killings." 2022 has been one of the deadliest ever for journalists in Mexico, which is now considered the most dangerous country for reporters outside a war zone.

The group recorded five deaths of journalists amid this year's political crisis in Pakistan, and warned of new threats to journalists in Colombia and continued danger for journalists in the Philippines despite new leadership there.

It also called out the shooting of Al Jazeera journalist Shireen Abu Akleh as she was reporting from a Palestinian refugee camp. The Arab network this week formally asked the International Criminal Court to investigate her death.

The Brussels-based IFJ represents 600,000 media professionals from trade unions and associations in more than 140 countries. The report was released on the eve of the United Nations' Human Rights Day. (AP)

"The ECI is holding elections in other states but is silent on the (assembly) polls in Jammu and Kashmir," Singh, who is also the chairman of the party's State Coordination Committee, told reporters

Maintaining that the elections continued to be denied on one pretext or the other, the AAP leader said flimsy excuses were being given from time to time to deprive

the people of J-K of their right to have a democratic government and to continue the proxy rule of the BIP

The BJP believed that if it could hold the reins of power and run the affairs of state without elections, why at all should it take the risk of seeking peoples' mandate?" Singh claimed

"There is no hope of democracy getting restored in the downgraded state under the BJP regime."

Pointing towards the constitutional provisions and the rulings of the Supreme Court, Singh said the top court of the country had categorically observed that fresh Assembly elections in all states, wherein the legislatures were prematurely dissolved, needed to be conducted and completed within a period of six months.

Vaishno Devi Pilgrimage Footfall In 2022 Highest In 9 Yrs: Official

JAMMU: Nearly 87 lakh pilgrims have paid their obeisance at the famous Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine atop Trikuta hills in Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir so far this year, the highest in the past nine years, an official of the shrine board said on Saturday. The inflow of the pilgrims is expected to pick up further in the coming days as the year

draws to close, the official said, hoping that the figure may surpass 90 lakh by the end of December. "Till December 6 this year, 86.40 lakh pilgrims visited the

cave shrine for the blessings of Mata Rani - a manifestation of the Hindu mother goddess, Durga or Adi Shakti - which is highest annual figure in the past nine years," a shrine board official told PTI.

He said about 13,000 pilgrims on an average are visiting the shrine at present on a daily basis but the number is likely to go up in the coming weeks ahead of the new year celebrations.

The official said the highest number of more than 11.29 lakh pilgrims visited the shrine in June, while the lowest number of 3.61 lakh pilgrims offered their prayers at the temple in February. Despite a stampede at the

shrine on the New Year's Day that left 12 pilgrims dead and 16 others injured, January recorded a turnout of more than 4.38 lakh pilgrims.

More than 7.78 lakh pilgrims visited the shrine in March, 9.02 lakh in April, 9.86 lakh in May, 9.07 lakh in July, 8.77 lakh in August, 8.28 lakh in September, 7.51 lakh in October and 6.01 lakh in November, the official said.

Only 17 lakh pilgrims, the lowest in more than three decades, visited the shrine in 2020 when the shrine, for the first time in its history, remained closed for five months due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and reopened for visitors on August

16 (2020). From 13.95 lakh in 1986 when the shrine board took over the affairs of the shrine for better management, there has been a steady increase of pilgrim footfalls with each passing year, touching an all time high of 1.04 crore turnout in 2012 against 1.01 crore the previous year (2011).

The pilgrim arrivals at the shrine touched 31.15 lakh in 1991 and reached 74.17 lakh in 2007. However, the number dropped to 67.92 lakh in 2008 which was attributed to the two-month long Amarnath land row agitation but again went up to 82 lakh in 2009 and 87.2 lakh next year (2010).

The pilgrim arrivals dropped from 93.24 lakh in 2013 to 78.03 lakh in 2014 and further to 77.76 lakh in 2015 and 77.23 lakh in 2016. It increased to 81.78 lakh in 2017 and 85.87 lakh in 2018 but again dropped to 79.40 lakh in 2019 the year when the central government revoked special status under Article 370 of the constitution to Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcated the erstwhile state into the Union Territories of Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh.

When contacted over the development, Deputy Commissioner Kupwara Dr. Doifode Sagar Dattaray responded in affirmative about the receipt of application for recounting for votes. "We have received the application today only, once we verify it, a decision will be taken accordingly", he said.

Notably, Independent candidate Advocate Aamina Majeed defeated her nearest rival, a Peoples Conference candidate Shabnam Rehman by a thin margin of 39 votes.

It is also worth to mention here that the polls were held afresh after a hiatus of almost two years as the State Election Commission declared the then held elections as null and void over 'dubious credentials' of two contesting candidates
