'People Shouldn't Fear Police': Interview With SSP Srinagar

mid the intensifying anti-drug campaign in the Kashmir valley, the Srinagar police chief has asked people to wake up to the monstrous reality consuming young lives and socially boycott the

drug peddlers. "In the war against drugs, the public support is not up to the expectations," Rakesh Balwal, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) said. "People can't leave everything to the police. They

should come forward and support us to get rid of this menace. They should socially boycott drug peddlers."

In an exclusive chat with Kashmir Observer, the city police chief said that cops aren't merely for operational things in Kashmir, but for resolving the plethora of issues such as drug menace and social crimes.

"I'm continuously trying to remove the police-public gap and all the apprehensions common people have about us," SSP Balwal, who recently completed



one year in office, said. "My point is that anti-militancy operations will carry on till we've active militants, but

grievances of the public in no way should suffer due to this. People should come to the police

to get any of their issues resolved.

People shouldn't fear us." The officer termed the 'militancy-free' urban landscape as his continuous priority. "You can witness a relatively calm city now," he said. "We'll try to maintain the peace, come what may. No school has been shut for a single day due to law and order problems this year. Even incidents of stone pelting have almost disappeared now."

Talking about new redlines, the SSP said that police fully democratic accommodates protests regarding roads, water and electricity as per standard

SOPs, but those which cross redlines of challenging integrity and sovereignty of the country are unacceptable. "We're okay with people coming to the Press Enclave to protest for their basic rights, but they can't cross the red-line," he emphasised.

Regarding the recently-held funeral prayers of two separatist leaders, SSP Balwal said that police is fully professional in dealing with these situations and was sure that nothing untoward would happen.

PAN Invalid If Not Linked With Aadhaar By Mar 2023

New Delhi: The Income Tax department Saturday issued an advisory that those permanent account numbers (PAN) which are not linked with Aadhaar by the end of March next year will be rendered "inoperative".

"What is mandatory, is necessary. Don't delay, link it today!" the department said in a public advisory.

"As per Income-tax Act, 1961, it is mandatory for all PAN holders, who do not fall under the exempt category, to link their PAN with Aadhaar before 31.3.2023. From 1.04.2023, the unlinked PAN shall become inoperative," it said.

The 'exempt category', according to a notification issued by the Union Finance Ministry in May 2017, are those individuals residing in the states of Assam, Jammu and Kashmir and Meghalaya; a non-resident as per the | More on P10

How Body Regulates Temperature And Why Knowing That Is Good For You

cientists have identified the neurons responsible for regulating the body temperature of mammals, but what is body temperature and how is it controlled? Body temperature in humans and many other mammals is regulated at around 37 degrees Celsius, or 98.6 degrees Fahrenheit, which optimizes all regulatory functions. When their body temperature noticeably deviates from the normal range, the functions are impaired, which could lead to heat stroke, hypothermia, and, in the worst case, death.

However, these conditions might be treated if body temperature can be

A research group at Nagoya University in Japan has reported that a group of neurons, called EP3 neurons, in the preoptic area of the brain play a key role in regulating body temperature in mammals. The preoptic area is a part of the hypothalamus that controls the body's vital functions.

They found that activating these neurons led to a decrease in body temperature, whereas suppressing their activity led to its increase.

The study also showed that EP3 neurons in the preoptic area play a key role in regulating body temperature by releasing GABA, or gammaaminobutyric acid, to send inhibitory signals to dorsomedial hypothalamus

(DMH) neurons to control sympathetic responses. GABA is a a major inhibitor of neuronal excitation, the study explained.

The sympathetic nervous system is constantly active at a basic level to maintain homeostasis, which is the condition of optimal functioning for the organism and includes many variskin to facilitate the radiation of the body's heat to prevent heat stroke.

However, in a cold environment, signals are reduced to activate sympathetic outputs, which promote heat production in brown adipose tissue and other organs to prevent hypo-

Furthermore, at the time of infec-



ables, such as body temperature and fluid balance.

The study explained that in a hot

environment, signals are augmented to suppress sympathetic outputs, resulting in increased blood flows in the

tion, PGE2, a mediator called prostaglandin E produced in response, acts on EP3 neurons to suppress their activity, resulting in activation of sympathetic outputs to develop fever, explained the study.

mulation on higher education." He said the upcoming RUSA 3.0 will focus on enhancement of employability, creation of new model colleges, multidisciplinary research, besides including nonaccredited institutions in hilly and remote areas for funding.

Dr Asif Iqbal, Coordinator AISHE State Unit, said "J&K UT recorded 100% uploading of data with regard to universities, over 90% with regard to colleges and over 80% with regard to standalone institutions, thereby placing the UT among top 10 performing States/UTs of the country.

He said with RUSA interventions, the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) increased from 24.8 in 2016-17 to 32.4 in 2019-20, while the Gender Parity Index (GPI) of J&K is 1.05, above the national average of 1.01. However, Dr Asif said the concerns related to the student-teacher ratio, which is 35 as per the 2019-2020 data, need to be addressed by making more recruitments in the regular mode.

Nodal Officer AISHE and Director DIQA Prof Manzoor A Shah said the AISHE data is baseline for national and international accreditations, funding and policy-making on higher education in the country.

He said the quality of data and its 100 percent submission before January 19 are therefore very important for further funding of higher education institutions under RUSA 3.0.

Ritesh Patel, Assistant Director AISHE, MoE New Delhi, also shared his views on the occasion.

Deputy Director DIQA Showket Shafi conducted proceedings of the inaugural session, while Wasim Hussain, Assistant Nodal Officer, AISHE, delivered a vote of thanks.

A detailed presentation on the data capturing system for AISHE in the technical session was followed by a hands-on session in the lab of the Management Studies Department.

Guns Fail To Fall Silent

RINAGAR: Hours after the Ramadhan ceasefire an¬nounced by the Prime Minister, Atal Bihari Vajpayee, came into effect, reports of escalated violence have come in from various areas shattering the prospects of unilat¬eral truce. Eighteen people, including six security person-nel, were killed and 23 others were injured in separate in¬cidents across the state since early morning today.

In a major incident, four security personnel were killed and 14 others were injured when a powerful explo¬sion ripped apart the vehicle they were travelling in at Nowpora-Dooru, 74 km from here on Srinagar-Verinag road in the south Kashmir district of Anantnag this afternoon, official sources said. Condition of most of the wounded sol-diers were reported to be crtitical. The incident took place around 2 p.m.

Officials said militants detonated the improvised explo¬sive device (IED) immediately after the army vehicle car¬rying jawans of 36 Rashtriya Rifles (RR) passed over it. The explosion was possibly triggered by using a remote control device. The vehicle was blown up killing four jawans and injuring 14 others. All the wounded soldiers were rushed to the base

Soon after the incident, the security forces laid scige to the entire area after which fear gripped the people. But no searches had been carried out till the reports last came in. No Jet up in Begaar, frisking

Assam Woman Murdered, Her Baby Stolen By Couple To Give To Daughter: Cops

GUWAHATI: Four persons have been arrested for allegedly murdering a woman and kidnapping her 10-month-old baby in Upper Assam, police said. The four accused involve a couple, their son, and the victim's mother.

According to the police, the couple arrested in the case was attempting to hand over the baby to their daughter who is childless.

The body of the woman, Nitumoni Lukhurakhon of Kenduguri Bailung village, was recovered from a drain at Rajabari Tea Estate in Charaideo district Tuesday morning. The woman had reportedly gone missing from a market in Simaluguri Monday evening. The baby was rescued from the inter-state bus terminus in Jorhat the following evening after a joint operation by police teams from Simaluguri, Sivasagar, Charaideo and Jorhat.

According to the police, the baby was supposed to be transported to Himachal Pradesh where the arrested couple's daughter lives. However, acting on a tip-off, the police apprehended a woman named Pranali Gogoi, alias Hiramai, of Tengapukhuri, and her husband Basanta Gogoi from Simaluguri railway junction on Tuesday. The next day, the police arrested the couple's son, Prasanta Gogoi, and the victim's mother, Boby Lukhurakhon, for their involvement in the case.

"The family abducted Nitu-moni and her child with the intention to send the baby to their daughter in Himachal Pradesh, However, by the time the couple was arrested, their son had already boarded a train with the child. But he was arrested on the train. It was a preplanned murder. The Gogi couple committed the crime to fulfill the dream of their married daughter who stays in Himachal Pradesh but does not have kids," Sivasagar senior police officer Subhrajyoti Borah said.

"The couple invited Nitumoni and her baby on the pretext of some work but tried to snatch away the baby from her. When Nitumoni resisted, the couple attacked her with some blunt object and killed her," Mr Borah added.

All four accused have been sent to police custody by a lo-

"BJP Should Govern **Instead Of...": Congress As Yatra Enters Delhi**

NEW DELHI: Nothing can prevent the Bharat Jodo Yatra from moving forward, the Congress asserted asking the BJP to "stop playing politics in the garb of the Covid pandemic" and try-ing to "stall" the march, which entered the national capital Saturday morning.
Congress leaders alleged

the BJP has made and failed in its every attempt to defame Rahul Gandhi and derail the yatra somehow as people from across the country including Delhi are overwhelmingly extending their support.

'Covid and health are serious issues and the BJP should not make them a tool of their politics," AICC media and publicity in-charge Pawan Khera told reporters at the Ashram Chowk.

"If you have the courage to stop the Yatra, do so. We will follow all rules and protocols, if any with regard to Covid.

"We know our responsibili-ties and the BJP should govern instead of giving us advice or directions. They are not declaring norms but their concern is Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra which is getting the support of people," Mr Khera said.

Rahul Gandhi accused the

RSS/BJP of spreading fear in the country and said they convert this fear into hatred but



the Congress will not allow that to happen.

Addressing a gathering as the Bharat Jodo Yatra entered Delhi, he said, "They spread hatred, we spread love and embrace all Indians".

There is Hindustan and 'Mohabbat' (love) in this Bharat Jodo yatra, which does not see any caste, creed, religion, rich or poor and all embrace each other," he told the gathering.

"RSS/BJP's all policies are to spread fear. They want that everyone should have fear in them and they convert this 'dar' into 'nafrat' (fear into hatred). If there is no 'dar', it will not be converted into 'nafrat'. We say 'daro mat'. We spread Mohabbat. We embrace all Indians," he said.

Delhi Congress in-charge Shaktisinh Gohil said the BJP is scared of the Bharat Jodo Yatra and not Covid.

He said Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his government should follow rules and norms rather than playing politics.

"Using corona politically is sending the wrong message to the people of the country," he

alleged.

Mr Khera added, "They are in government and they should not need the opposition to remind them before acting. If they are so concerned, why don't they stop their yatra in Rajasthan. Instead of creating fear in the minds of everyone, they should announce steps on Covid with the advice of experts."

"The prime minister visits Parliament wearing a mask but attends weddings in the evening without a mask. They should focus on governance not politics," he said

Allahabad High Court Reserves Verdict In Gyanvapi Mosque Case

PRAYAGRAI: The Allahabad High Court on Friday reserved its judgement on a civil revision petition filed by the Gyanvapi mosque committee challenging a Varanasi court order turning down its objections to the maintainability of a plea seeking permission to offer regular prayers to idols of deities in the mosque compound.

Justice J J Munir reserved its order after hearing the counsel of both sides at length.

On Friday, the counsel for the petitioner, Senior Advocate Places of Worship Act, 1991, which bars filing of a suit for conversion of any religious place as existed on August 15, 1947.

The present suit is barred by the Act of 1991, Limitation Act and Waqf Act, Naqvi submitted.

He pointed out that even if the claim of Hindu side is accepted, why they did not file suit in 1993 when they were so restrained or thereafter. Hence, this suit filed before the Varanasi court is barred under the Limitation Act, which bars filing of suit for declaration after three years of incident.

Earlier, at one stage the coun-



contended before the court that the claim of the Hindu side that the devotees were restrained from worshipping Shringar Gauri and other deities on the outer wall of Gyanvapi in the year 1993 is an artificial claim and an example of clever drafting.

According to him, no order was passed by the then state government in writing in 1993. According to him, the aforesaid claim has been made only to avoid the application of the

side had taken the plea that old maps showed the existence of Hindu deities on Gyanvapi mosque and the Hindu devotees were regularly worshipping Shringar Gauri and other deities on the outer wall of Gyanvapi since long and it was only in the year 1993, the then government restrained regular worship.

Hence, the Act of 1991 is not applicable to them. Further, they claim that the place in dispute is not a Waqf property.

"Like Caged Birds": Afghan Women **Anguished Over Taliban's University Ban**

KABUL: Women university students across Afghanistan were in disbelief, barred by the Taliban from studying and condemned to a life of feeling "like caged birds".

In Kabul, home to the country's largest universities, students gathered outside campuses dressed in the black cloaks and tight headscarves imposed by the Taliban since they took control last year.

Elsewhere, students sought consolation from friends and family as they digested news of the university ban.

"We all felt like caged birds, we hugged each other, screamed, and cried 'why is this happening to us'?" Amini, in Kunduz, told AFP.

She was with her three sisters -- two already barred from secondary school and another studying for a degree -- when social media exploded with the news of the latenight order. Faculties across the country were already closed for the winter break, but students had been able to access campuses for exams or to study in libraries.

In Kandahar, the cradle and spiritual heart of the Taliban



male students movement, were able to sit exams in classrooms still segregated with screens, which until the day before made it possible for women to study.

some women had not been aware of the exclusion until the morning.

"My sister is studying computer science... I didn't inform her last night. I know she would be traumatised," said a young male law student in Kabul, who asked not to be named for fear of reprisals.

"It really expresses (the Taliban's) illiteracy and poor knowledge of Islam and human rights. If the situation continues like this, the future will be

worse. Everyone is scared." In the eastern city of Jalalabad, some male students walked out of their exams in protest against the decision.

Upon their return to power, the Taliban had promised to be more flexible, but they quickly re-enforced a harsh interpretation of Islam that had marked their first stint in power between 1996 and 2001.

The restrictions on women have multiplied in recent months. They are banned from most government jobs or paid a pittance to stay at home, not authorised to travel alone outside their city, and are excluded from parks and gardens.

"We have no power to do anything and there is no one to listen to us," said one 29-yearold, who is doing a masters in Pashto literature in Kabul.

Supreme Court Seeks Centre's Response On Caste-**Based Census For OBCs**

plea filed by advocate Krishan Kanhaya Pal who said that the governments are unable to share the benefits of the welfare schemes with all sections among backward classes due to a lack of caste-based survey and a caste-based census of the OBCs is of 'vital necessity'.

The petition had contended that concrete policies cannot be formulated in the absence of



concrete data.

Pal had stated that despite the announcement made by the then Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh in 2018, there would be a census of the OBC population during the 2021 Census, however, the government refrained from tabling the report of the Rohini Commission that was established in 2017.

Indian, Bangladeshi Fined ₹90 Lakh For Car Crash That Killed 2 Dubai Women

DUBAI: Two 48-year-old men, one Indian and one Bangladeshi, have been ordered to pay a total of approximately ₹90,18,436 (AED 400,000) for causing the death of two Saudi women in a road accident in Dubai

in July. A court in Dubai found them guilty. "The driver from India was fined AED 2,000 (approximately ₹45,092) and ordered to pay AED 80,000 (approximately ₹18,03,683) in blood money. The Bangladeshi has been told to pay the rest.

According to a local newspaper report, the two men have been ordered by a court in Dubai to pay the blood money to the family of the victims who were killed in a car accident in the Al-Barsha area of Dubai on July 3.

"Dubai Traffic Court was told the men, one from Bangladesh and the other from India, both 48, drove their



cars recklessly on the day of the incident," The National report said, adding that both women died shortly after the collision.

Tara Chand Regrets Leaving Congress For Azad

JAMMU: Resigning from the Congress in support of Ghulam Nabi Azad was a "blunder", former Jammu and Kashmir

deputy chief Minister Tara Chand said on Saturday - two days after he along with former minister Manohar Lal Sharma and former legislator Balwan Singh were expelled from the Azad-led Democratic Azad Party (DAP)

More than 100 office bearers and founding members of the DAP announced their resignation from the party in support of the three leaders, who decided to reach out to the people before taking a decision on their next course of action.

Chand, however, said they will remain secular till their last breath and would have no objection in joining the Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Yatra when it enters Jammu and Kashmir.

"The decision of the DAP to expel us without any reason or justification came as a big surprise to us. Today, we feel that our decision to resign from the Congress in support of Azad was a blunder," Chand, flanked by the leaders and activists, told reporters here.

He said they have a long association with Azad and when he resigned from the Congress, "we felt we should stand with our leader and extend moral support to him".

'The Congress gave me a mandate, made me Congress legislative party leader, speaker and deputy chief minister...We repent our decision today as we feel we betrayed our party, while DAP betrayed us," Chand said.

Asked about their sacking from the DAP, he said "We have not seen such a type of dictatorship in our decades long political careers. Azad rebelled against the Congress leadership, set up a G23 group and even shot letters but he was not sacked by the (Congress) party which believes

in internal democracy." "We opposed the Pradesh Congress Committee (J&K) president at his behest but the party did not serve us any notice. We were working to strengthen the DAP, the party which is yet to get recognition, and we were accused of anti-party activities and sacked without any intimation." he said.

Azad's deci-Welcoming

sion, Chand said it had further strengthened them and they are getting support from all across Jammu and Kashmir.

"Many more leaders from Kashmir including former ministers and legislators from DAP and others are joining our group to strengthen the secular vote bank and work for the restoration of the people's rights including the special status

under Article 370 of the constitution and statehood.

"Restoration of pre-August 5, 2019 status to Jammu and Kashmir is the popular demand of the people from both the regions of Jammu and Kashmir,"

Without naming Azad, he said a "big leader" is saying that it cannot be restored but "we want to tell him that nothing is impossible. It is the popular demand of both the regions and we appeal to the Prime Minister to accept this demand and restore our identity. He is the Prime Minister of the whole country and should hear the voices from J&K.'

Chand said he had enjoyed good friendly relations with all parties as he did not consider any party "untouchable".

"We are secular and will die as a secular," he said when asked whether he would like to join BJP.

"The leaders inclined towards BJP or Congress or any other party should join any of these parties without hoodwinking the public. We have leaders here who are misleading the public and are dividing the secular votes to benefit one particular party," he said in a veiled attack on the DAP chairman who is being accused by Congress of working at the behest of BJP.

"We will not betray the public and we won't play as an 'A' or 'B' team of any party. We will meet the public and after their consultation, will join a party which is secular and going to form the next government in Jammu and Kashmir," he said.

On Bharat Joda Yatra, he said when National Conference leaders Farooq Abdullah and Omar Abdullah and leaders of other secular parties have expressed their desire to join the yatra which is meant to unite the country, "we do not have any hesitation to be part of it."

New Assessment, Evaluation Scheme To Take Effect from Next Academic Session: Govt

SCERT To Implement Scheme For All Government, Recognized Schools

JAMMU: The government has decided to implement the Student Assessment and Evaluation Scheme (SAES) starting with the upcoming academic session, which will require the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) to develop uniform question papers for all government and government recognized schools.

This decision represents a significant change that will put an end to the traditional examination system.

As per the NEP-2020 examination reforms, the purpose of assessment will change from one that is summative and primarily tests rote memorization skills to one that is more regular and formative, is more competency-based, supports our students' learning and development, and tests higher-order skills like analysis, critical thinking, and conceptual clarity.

The pupils would receive a multidimensional report card or a holistic progress card in place of a grade sheet, which would reflect each learner's individuality and progress in detail. Software assisted by artificial intelligence would create a 360-degree perspective of a student's progress and help them choose the best careers would also be used.

With the new curriculum and pedagogical structure of 5+3+3+4 dopted as per the NEP-2020 guidelines replacing the 10+2 pattern in school education, the new assessment and evaluation scheme takes effect right from the foundational stage.

The 'Foundational'



is comprised of the first five years of education, the next three are 'Preparatory' followed by another three years in the 'Middle' stage. The final four years included the grades 9th and 10th in Phase-I and 11th and 12th in Phase-II under the head 'Secondary' stage.

The contents of the evaluation mechanism at every level, including the standard operating procedures, are detailed in a 12-page document signed by Alok Kumar, Principal Secretary Education who also serves as the Director of SCERT.

The foundational stage's evaluation and assessment procedures are to be carried out by the heads of the schools using the models outlined in the school-based assessment (SBA) document by the NCERT/SCERT.

The evaluation and assessment of the Preparatory and Middle stages would also be conducted by the heads of the

stage, which includes classes

9th through 12th, and will be administered in accordance with NEP-2020 criteria.

For the formative assessco-curricular ponent, and summative assessment, respectively, the weighting of the marks shall be allocated as 30, 20, and 50 with a qualifying percentage of 33% in each. Recitation, art and craft, role playing, painting, group songs, discussion, debates, health and hygiene, environmental awareness, and IT awareness are some of the activities that form the co-curricular component.

Students who have been designated as potential learners will be promoted to the next class on a proviso basis with plans for extra courses for two to three months during the vacation or at the start of the next session, followed by another assessment of grade-appropriate competencies. Only when the student is unable to meet the eligibility requirements in this reassessmen tool may they be held back.

He termed the Democratic Azad Party headed by Ghulam Nabi Azad branch of the BJP and claimed it is "collapsing under its own weight".

He said all like-minded people, NGOs, political parties and oth-

ers are welcome to join the Rahul Gandhi-led Bharat Jodo Yatra being held against the "politics of hate, record unemployment and unprecedented price rise and other issues the common people are suffering from".

Wani said the Congress has taken strong exception to the approach of the Centre and the Jammu and Kashmir administration towards the agitating migrant Kashmiri Pandit employees and Jammu-based reserved category staffers.

Wani accused the Centre and the Union Territory administration of taking an "unsympathetic approach" towards the issues of these employees.

"These employees were performing their duties for the past 10 to 12 years after the UPA government announced a package for their rehabilitation without raising any such demands as now since they were not targeted," he claimed.

diatribe, Azad has generally chosen not to speak much about Vikar, which is a probable tactic of him downplaying Vikar. He rarely mentions him but on the sidelines, keeps attacking the Congress in almost all of his programmes he has held ever since he floated his own party.

Recently, Azad, while being interviewed by a national news channel, was seen making explosive claims yet again. Ghulam Nabi Azad told the interviewer that during his time as the Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir, he had compiled a report of ministers working in tandem with insurgents and sent it to the then Prime Minister Mr. Manmohan Singh and Union Home Minister Shivraj Patil who, according to Azad, took no note of it. Following this, in a press statement, one of the DAP spokespersons alleged that Vikar was also involved in it besides being involved in corruption; a charge Vikar refuted and warned of an initiation of legal action against Azad and his party. Vikar even went on to the extent of blaming Azad for compromising national security.

The war of words and its escalation beyond verbal spats or a legal tug of war is yet to be seen but it surely is relentless from both sides and doesn't happen to affect Azad as much as Vikar and his JKPCC.

The Azad factor and Vikar's Weak Defense

Azad is an accidental politician who has faced humiliating defeats at home state, yet the legend of his capabilities, substantiated by the grace of the central leadership of Congress, keeps going.

Yet, the decision to form his own political party when the sun should've set in his political career, leaves him with a tainted legacy - one of a political opportunist who always preferred power instead of politics. Today, he has stationed himself at an uncomfortable position to gain back what he felt was taken away from him owing to his rebellious behavior in the Congress party, and for which he has chosen to walk over the line of ideological demarcations.

This however isn't much of a challenge or a matter of concern for Azad since there is rarely a mainstream leader in Jammu and Kashmir who has this distinction.

What this brings for Vikar Rasool is. however, a grave concern for Congress. It is an unconquerable duel in which Vikar seems to fail in offering even a fair contest to his rivals. He now has to battle Azad besides BJP, the arch nemesis of Congress, nationally, relying only on his limited popularity, a narrow political understanding and his awry style of working.

Even with estimated or overestimate merits, sidelined allegations and a fair chance, Vikar Rasool is only going to bring congress a morbid defeat in J&k. Since day one, he has sidelined all senior leaders who otherwise used to have a decisive role in the party. He has replaced them with his select "coterie", in the name of changing the dynamics of his party.

Congress under Vikar Rasool in J&K is set for disaffection, anarchy and total chaos.

The Bumpy Road Ahead for Congress

The political developments in India have forced the principal opposition party, the Indian National Congress, to have a non-Gandhi AICC Chief after over two decades. It has also pushed the Gandhi scion, Rahul Gandhi, to partake in a foot march from Kanyakumari which is to culminate in Kashmir. While it is visibly engaged in an overhaul, its fate cannot be seen in isolation with respect to Kashmir, which is a sensitive spot for average Indian voters. For instance, it's worth recalling that Congress, in its 2019 Lok Sabha election manifesto, had boldly vowed to strengthen Article-370 and Article-35a, whereas BJP had promised their removal. Amongst other promises, this stood out and appealed to the Indian electorate the most, resulting in BJP securing over 300 seats and restricting Congress to 52.

In the current scenario, with a strong BJP. Kashmir and Ladakh will play important roles. Nationally, Congress is trying hard to consolidate and strengthen itself by pulling out different tricks out of its hat but their ignorance and negligent behavior towards Jammu and Kashmir has them sitting on a powder keg which will bemuse them when the match is lit.

AICC selected Vikar Rasool Wani as the JKPCC Chief after Azad recommended his name despite knowing Azad's friction with the Congress this got approved; the word doing rounds in the political corridors is that the Rajya Sabha M.P and the current AICC, Jammu and Kashmir in-charge Rajani Patil personally lobbied for Vikar. He replaced Ghulam Ahmed Mir who is a fairly more known face. Additionally, Vikar's thoughtless public speeches, the usage of unparliamentary and objectionable vocabulary, is fairly and squarely earning the BJP some fair points which they will use to their benefit.

Notably, BJP by far, has largely maintained silence on JKPCC Chief Vikar Rasool. Its leadership has a reputation of smartly taking up issues at an appropriate time and then translating them into votes in elections, a tactic often referred to as the "Chanakya Neeti" in the current Indian electoral scope.

Modi Ignores West's Sanctions On Russia

rime Minister Narendra Modi's call with Russian President Vladimir Putin on Friday marks a new stage in the bilateral relationship between the two time-tested friends, both contextually and from a long-term perspective.

The media may find it alluring to link Modi's call to Ukraine developments despite the Indian and Russian readouts (here and here) making it clear that Russian-Indian bilateral relations dominated the conversation.

Nonetheless, it is very significant that Modi was not deterred by the fact that although this is not era for wars, the Ukraine conflict in all probability will only escalate, and there is a greater likelihood than ever before that Russia may be compelled to seek a total military victory, as the US is leaving it with no option by doggedly blocking all avenues for a realistic settlement and is furtively climbing the escalation ladder.

Without doubt, the Biden Administration's reported decision to deploy Patriot missile in Ukraine is a major escalation. Moscow has warned of "consequences." Again, Moscow has confirmed that the US planned, masterminded and equipped Ukraine with the military capability to attack deep inside Russian territory — hundreds of kilometres, in fact including against base at Engels where Russia's nuclear-capable strategic bombers are stationed. The two superpowers never before targeted each other's nuclear assets.

So, there is no question that Modi's initiative at this point in time to discuss "the high level of bilateral cooperation that has been developing on the basis of the Russian-Indian privileged strategic partnership," including in key areas of energy, trade and investments, defence & security cooperation, conveys a huge message in itself.

It quietly underscores a medium and long term perspective on the Russian-Indian relationship that goes far beyond the vicissitudes of the Ukraine conflict. Put differently, India will not allow its long-standing ties with Russia to be held hostage to Western sanctions.

For India, the reorientation of Russian economic diplomacy toward the Asian region presents huge business opportunities. Who would have thought nine months ago that Russia was going to be the largest supplier of oil to India, leapfrogging Iraq, Saudi Arabia and the US? According to Reuters, India purchased about 40% of all export volumes of Russian Urals grade oil transported by sea in November, when European countries accounted for 25%, Turkey 15% and China 5%.

The figures speak for themselves: in November, while Russia supplied 909,000.4 barrels of crude oil to India per day, the corresponding figures were for Iraq (861.000.4), Saudi Arabia (570.000.9), and the US (405,000.5) Suffice it to say that when Modi upfront listed energy as his talking point with Putin, it reas a potentially significant "trans-shipment" state for Russia's "parallel imports" — that is, Russia can buy not only Indian goods from India but also products from third countries.

Meanwhile, turning away from the European market, Russia also seeks business opportunities for its export basket that includes mineral products. precious metals and products made from them, aluminium and other non-ferrous metals, electric machines, vehicles, pharmaceutical, chemical, rubber products, etc.

Clearly, there are systemic issues to be addressed such as transportation logistics; payment mechanism, collateral sanctions. However, for the near term, all eyes are on the Russian oil exports to

confirms that India is giving a wide berth to the G7's hare-brained scheme to impose a price cap on Russian oil exports.

But all good things have a flip side to it. As the volume of India-Russia trade shoots up with Russia emerging as India's seventh largest trading partner, rising from 25th place — the imbalance in the bilateral trade is also widening, as Moscow prioritises India (and China) as preferred trading partners.

EAM Jaishankar's recent Moscow visit focused on a list of 500 items that Russia would be keen to source from India. Importantly, this is also about a supply chain for Russian industry / economy. Jaishankar reportedly gave an interim reply of India's readiness to start supplying spare parts necessary for airplanes, cars and trains

Some Russian experts have talked about India

The Russian government daily Rossyiskaya Gazeta reported on Tuesday, "It is expected that Russia, in response to the price ceiling, will adopt an official ban on selling oil under contracts where the "ceiling" will be mentioned or the marginal price for our oil will be indicated." That is, Moscow will insist on an embargo on supplies basically restricted to the G7 and Australia.

China and India are not affected, as they haven't joined the price cap. The following excerpts from the Moscow daily outlines the state of play:

"There are no real mechanisms that could enforce these [G7] restrictions... already, about a third of Russian oil exports leave Russian ports without indicating the final destination. That is, a so-called "grey trade zone" is growing before our eyes, which allows traders to purchase Russian raw materials without the risk of falling under secondary sanctions... discount [ie., fair prices] allows the Asia-Pacific countries, primarily China and India, to increase purchases of Russian raw materials.'

The fascinating part is that not only is the socalled "grey zone" expanding steadily but alongside, other suppliers have begun to adjust to the prices of Russian oil in the Asia-Pacific region that is, to the real equilibrium prices or discounted prices. Curiously, even Western countries are in a position to receive relatively inexpensive Russian oil through third parties.


The bottom line is that the Biden administration's goal was not to limit the volume of Russian oil exports but focused on the revenues of the Russian budget from oil production and the world oil market. Rissyiskaya Gazeta concludes: "In fact, so far what is happening does not contradict either our aspirations or the desires of the United States. [See my article Race for Russian oil begins, The Tribune, Nov. 28, 2022]

This new-found pragmatism in the US calculus about the limits to sanctions took a curious turn in Thursday when the US blacklisted the Russian billionaire-oligarch Vladimir Potanin but exempted two of his biggest assets from the purview of sanctions — MMC Norilsk Nickel and Tinkoff Bank — on the specious ground that his holdings are less than 50% in these two companies [but are only 35%!]

Why so? Because, MMC's share in the world market of high-grade nickel is 17%, palladium 38%, platinum 10%, rhodium 7%, copper and cobalt 2% each; and, sanctioning the Russian company could sharply aggravate the world market for non-ferrous metals and can hurt US manufacturers.

Clearly, the law of diminishing returns is at work in the continued weaponisation of sanctions against Russia. Indian business and industry should pay close attention to Modi's far-sighted initiative on Friday.

In an interview with Kashmir Observer, SSP Srinagar talks about the civil society, conflict and crime in the city.

mid the intensifying anti-drug cam-Apaign in the valley, a top cop has exhorted civil society to wake up to the monstrous reality consuming precious young lives and socially boycott drug-peddlers.

"In the war against drugs, the public support is not up to the expectations," Rakesh Balwal, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) said. "People can't leave everything to the police. They should come forward and support us to get rid of this menace. They

should socially boycott drug peddlers."

In an exclusive chat with Kashmir Observer, the city police chief said that cops aren't merely for operational things in Kashmir, but for resolving the plethora of issues such as drug menace, normal policing and social crimes.

"I'm continuously trying to remove the police-public gap and all the apprehensions common people have about us," SSP Balwal, who recently completed one year in office,

"My point is that anti-militancy operations will carry on till we've active militants, but grievances of the public in no way should suffer due to this. People should come to the police to get any of their issues resolved. People shouldn't fear us."

The officer termed the 'militancy-free' urban landscape as his continuous priority. "You can witness a relatively calm city now," he said. "We'll try to maintain the peace, come what may. No school has been shut for a single day due to law and order problems this year. Even incidents of stone pelting have almost disappeared now."

Talking about new redlines, the SSP said that police fully accommodates democratic protests regarding roads, water and electricity as per standard SOPs, but those which cross red-lines of challenging integrity and sovereignty of the country are unacceptable. "We're okay with people coming to Press Enclave for protests for their basic rights, but they can't cross the red-line," he emphasised.

Regarding the recently-held funeral prayers of two separatist leaders, SSP Balwal said that police is fully professional in dealing with these situations and was sure that nothing untoward would happen.

"We were in touch with the organizers and put on aerial and other surveillance," he said. "We're satisfied with the results. The people fully cooperated with the police. The trust in policing is slowly coming back."

When the gap between police and public won't be there, he said, people will trust police and their honest intentions.

"But there'll always be black sheep among the peace-loving people," SSP Balwal said. "We don't want to touch them but will definitely go after miscreants. There were only two minor stone pelting incidents in the city in 2022, we tactfully managed the protesters at the ground and then later on we identified them one by one with our latest technologies. They were booked for

their wrongdoing. Likewise, the people are fully aware that if they do anything wrong, there's no way out to save themselves while no innocent will ever be touched.'

When the baton was passed to you a year ago, what challenges were there for you as SSP Srinagar?

My term started in December 2021 when Srinagar was a little turbulent with sporadic attacks, targeted killings, grenade attacks, etc. The city all of a sudden witnessed a number of killings in October last year. So, my immediate challenge was to bring a sense of security among the common

At the same time, I had to remove the trust gan between police and public. The people wouldn't approach the police in the top, middle and lower levels – which I found very strange because this rarely happens in other states of the country. Police aren't merely for operational things; it's there to resolve the issues of people even if it is a minor domestic issue. We all get salaries out of tax paid by citizens and it is the responsibility on the shoulders of police to take care of genuine grievances and problems of the public. During my one year stint, I've continuously tried to remove this gap and the apprehensions people have about working in the police. My point is that we should carry on the anti-militancy operations but at the same time, people should come to the police without any hesitation to get their issues resolved.

Another challenge was to deny safe passage and safe havens to militants in the urban landscape of Srinagar. Then there were other law and order issues, like some incidents of stone pelting earlier, but now we all can witness a calm city. We will try to maintain the peace, come what may. The schools didn't shut for a single day this year because of no law and order problem.

So with this 'urban peace' that you're talking about, can we see security ease-out measures, like omission of bunkers and

We've already given a lot of relaxation in terms of security measures. Even during 15th August and 26 January, or during the VVIP visits, the frisking is relatively less now in Srinagar. The markets remain open and the internet works uninterrupted.

We've gone to the next level now where we're using drones, CCTV cameras to monitor the situation. It was for this reason we asked people to install high-security number-plates so that crimes are cracked easily.

We're doing smart work to minimise the public inconvenience. These things helped us to redefine our ways of checking and frisking. We mostly frisk and check when there is actionable intelligence input about the militant movement.

But the talk of the town is that there is

a lot of surveillance in Srinagar and then there is an issue of "intruding the privacy" of the people.

We fully respect the privacy of the people but drones and CCTVs are only used to check suspicious movement in public spaces. It's like this everywhere in the world and the whole country also and they don't intrude into anyone's private space. This is for the security of the people and larger public

We don't use CCTVs to see who's inside a house or shop, doing what, or who's inside

At the end of the day, if you want a less aggressive posture of security forces in the city, then we've to go to the next level of po-

But can we expect a possible end of Kashmir's escalating drug problem in the face of this intensified police campaign?

See, there's a whole system with handlers across the border behind this. The drugs come from Pakistan via North Kashmir. Kashmir valley historically was only the route for drugs, but now the youth here slowly have become users as well. And the money that is made out of it is being used for the purpose of terrorism as well. But we're keeping a full vigil on it and many smugglers and peddlers have been arrested and put behind bars.

In this year only, we've lodged about 160 FIRs against the peddlers in the city, 250 people have been arrested in cases and around 60 individuals have been booked under Public Safety Act/ PIT and other relevant laws. Large number of recoveries has also been made of drugs/narcotics.

Police have also opened a Drug de-addiction & rehabilitation centre at Srinagar's Eidgah area for drug addicts. We try to give a new lease of life to the young people. Several steps are also afoot to establish more such centers which is in-line with Nasha

mukt Abhiyaan of UT government. However, the public support is still minimal. The level of cooperation at the level of giving information to police is also very poor. People have to understand that police works at the best level with public cooperation only. People should come forward and support us fully in getting rid of this menace. They should socially boycott the narcotics smugglers/ drug peddlers. People at times have alerted us about the situation at the locality level but this is very less.

But since Kashmir is beset with turmoil, how does it affect normal policing?

See, if terrorist attacks and targeted killings are happening and when grenades are thrown in public places every now and then, the top priority of police will be to ensure a sense of security. We'll focus more on saving the lives of the people and try to mitigate the threats. As security situation improves, like it is now, our approach and priorities evolve and we will keep focusing more and more on social issues and on public outreach at par with that in Scandinavian countries.

Having said that, we've started organising Thana Diwas every week in every police station in Srinagar, where the police officials led by a gazetted officer interact with the locals and try to resolve their issues. At all levels, the time between 12 noon to 2 pm is kept for grievance redressal. Even I meet all visitors who come to the SSP office. We're able to do this only because the security situation has improved.

But does the combatant role of police due to the situation pose a challenge in maintaining the cordial con-civilian rela tionship?

Our combatant role is directly proportional to the level of violence and terror incidents that happen. If the terror incidents remain low as it is now, we'll get more and more time for public outreach. The primary job of police is to give the public a sense of security. We've to safeguard the life, property and honour of the public. If the lives of citizens are not safe, then police can't fully focus on the other two duties of it-safeguarding property and honour.

Also, I always believe that the police is just a reflection of society at a particular time. In countries like Denmark, Norway, Sweden, you'll find fully public-centric policing. The reason is that society has less terror/crime graph. But here in the valley, due to long years of tryst with violence, sub-consciously violence is acceptable. Even small kids like to buy toy-guns rather than traditional toys. This is because society has seen and sub-consciously made peace with violence for so long which has affected all generations since 1989.

What do these renewed threats to media-persons indicate? Is the capital back on militancy radar?

See, we've only very few categorized terrorists left in the whole Kashmir valley right now. There is only one resident terrorist in whole Srinagar district. Their numbers have come down drastically, recruitment into terror ranks isn't happening. They've lost their edge to do big attacks. And now, handlers based in Pakistan have come-up with an anonymous blog providing low risk and high profit. They're creating shadowy posters and naming people to create fear psychosis. This creates more noise and hype amongst society, media and in national news channels. And this strategy has proved highly rewarding for them than doing any terror attack for which they have lost capability.

It's a ploy to create fear among reasonable and rational sections of society including those in journalism. This is a low-cost and high reward thing as it sends alarm

bells across the media fraternity and in the security establishment. But we're fully aware of this, cases have been registered and many revelations have come forth dur-

Talking of challenge, we lately saw the funeral procession of top two separatist leaders being allowed in Srinagar. Was it a calculated move or a step to test waters?

We knew how to deal with it and were sure that nothing wrong would happen. We were also in touch with the organizers and had put on aerial and other surveillance. We're very satisfied with the results. The people cooperated with the police and I am happy that slowly trust in policing is com-

When the gap between police and public won't be there, people will trust the police and their intentions. But there'll always be black sheep among the peace-loving people. We always respect common people but miscreants and habitual offenders can never be spared. There were only two minor stone pelting incidents in the Srinagar district in 2022 and we managed the protesters at the ground during that time and then later on we identified them one by one with our latest technology. They were booked for their wrongdoing. Likewise, the people know if they do anything wrong, there's no way out to save themselves.

Are there any redlines for people now, given how police are vigilant about peace at the moment?

The people shouldn't indulge in violence and take law and order into their own hands. We always accommodate protests regarding roads, water and electricity under our SOP. It is part of democracy and we are okay with it, but you can't cross the line. You can't say things against the sovereignty and integrity of the nation.

What about the city's crime graph?

The nature of crime in Srinagar has changed. The crimes happening in big cities of the country are happening here as well. There're more cybercrimes as well, land frauds, property crimes, blackmailing, etc. There are criminal gangs operating — luring gullible youth for jobs.

Over 50 per cent of the people coming to my office for grievance redressal are related to property crimes/land issues. 30 per cent relate to women related crimes/ family and matrimonial issues, while the rest 20 per cent come for other issues.

But we're ready for it and have created different cells to monitor different cases. We've the capability to prevent and investigate any type of crime in Srinagar.

My long term objective is to have publiccentric policing in Srinagar leading to drastic reduction in crime resulting in a vibrant and peaceful capital city in my tenure as SSP here.

What Are Remote Fear Memories? How **Are They Stored And Retrieved?**

mouse study demonstrated that remote fear memories formed in the distant past are permanently stored in connections between memory neurons in the prefrontal cortex, or the PFC.

But what are remote fear memories? A remote fear memory is a memory of traumatic events that occurred in the distant past - a few months to decades ago.

"It is the prefrontal memory circuits that are progressively strengthened after traumatic events and this strengthening plays a critical role in how fear memories mature to stabilized forms in the cerebral cortex for permanent storage," explained the lead researcher Jun-Hyeong Cho.

How are remote fear memories stored and retrieved? According to the UC Riverside study, the brain uses distinct mechanisms to store recent versus

remote fear memories. Previous studies have suggested that while the initial formation of fear memory involves the hippocampus, it progressively matures with time and becomes less dependent on the hippocampus.

The researchers focused on the PFC, a part of the cerebral cortex that has been implicated in remote memory consolidation in previous studies.

"We found a small group of nerve cells or neurons within the PFC, termed memory neurons, were active during the initial traumatic event and were reactivated during the recall of remote fear memory," said Cho.

Could we prevent the recall of these remote fear memories? "When we selectively inhibited these memory neurons in the PFC, it prevented the mice recalling remote but not recent fear memory, suggesting the critical role of PFC memory neurons in the recall of remote fear memories," explained Cho.



"Interestingly, the extinction of remote fear memory weakened the prefrontal memory circuits that were previously strengthened to store the remote fear memory," Cho said.

"Moreover, other manipulations that blocked the strengthening of the PFC memory circuits also prevented the recall of remote fear memory," said Cho.


Covid Vaccine Protects Patients With Blood Cancer: Study

eople with blood cancer usually have a weak immune system, putting them at an increased risk of becoming very ill from Covid-19. Furthermore, several cancer treatments cause these individuals to develop little or no antibodies against SARS-CoV-2 after Covid-19 vaccination. On the other hand, vaccination can activate T cells, which are responsible for the long-term immune response.

A team led by physicians Dr Andrea Keppler-Hafkemeyer and Dr Christine Greil from the Medical Center-University of Freiburgand virologist Prof. Oliver T. Keppler from LMU Munich has now characterised in detail the course over several months of the immune response of patients with blood cancer who had received a total of three vaccinations against Covid-19. The results allow inferences to be made about the protection that vaccination gives these patients against serious illness from SARS-CoV2.

Strong T cell response to Covid-19 vaccination The study focused on patients with two kinds of blood cancer: B-cell lymphoma and multiple myeloma. results show that almost all study participants had a strong T cell response to Covid-19 vaccination," explains Dr. Andrea Keppler-Hafkemeyer. "This could be one reason why breakthrough infections turned out to be mild to moderately severe even in study participants who had been unable to form any specific antibodies after vaccination because of their therapy," adds Dr. Christine Greil. The co-principal investigators and lead authors regularly look after blood cancer patients in the Department of Medicine I at the Medical Center -- University of Freiburg.

The research group led by Prof Oliver T. Keppler is specialised not only in analysing the concentration of antibodies after

vaccination, but also their quality.

This depends particularly on the strength of the bonds between antibodies and the viral spike protein. In addition, the ability of antibodies to neutralise different SARS-CoV-2 variants in cell cultures plays a major role. As the next step, therefore, the scientists compared the quantity and quality of antibodies and T cell responses to the spike protein among blood cancer patients and healthy study participants after two and three Covid-19 vaccinations.

High-quality antibodies against different SARS-CoV-2 variants The study revealed that patients who can form antibodies tend to produce antibodies of partic-

ularly high quality. After their second vaccination, they are already able to neutralise and thus deactivate different SARS-CoV-2 variants. This ability is considerably more pronounced in this patient cohort than in vaccinated healthy people.

'Covid-19 vaccination can generate very broad antiviral immunity -- including highly potent neutralising antibodies -- in patients with various types of blood cancer. Consequently, multiple vaccine doses can be recommended for patients with B-cell lymphoma or multiple myeloma without interrupting therapy," summarises Prof Oliver T. Keppler.

During the past decade, Aadhaar number has emerged as a universally accepted proof of identity of residents in India. More than 1,100 government schemes and programs, including 319 run by the central government, use Aadhaar based identification for delivery of services.

The products for which J&K would push for GI tagging includes Apple (Ambri), Apple (Maharaji), Pear (Naak-Tang), Grapes (Repora), Walnut, Kala Zeera, Red Rice, Shallots (Pran), Kashmiri long chilli, Nadru water chestnut, apricot, Haanz Haakh, Khanyari Haakh, Kuth, Goazaban, Pumbe Challan, Kod, Meat products like Harissa, Gustabha, Tabakhmaaz, Dried Fish (Hogaad), Smoked Fish (Phar), Mountain Garlic, Pine Nuts (Chilgoza), Red Rice, Milk Cake (Abdullian, RS Pura), Gatia Thom (Hill Garlic), Moth (Poonchi), Chandak Basmati (Poonch) and olive.

According to an order issued by the Department, these committees shall collect all the rel-

NEW DELHI: With increasing steel production in the country, the focus in 2023 will be on boosting raw material supplies and producing more special grade steel, according to Union minister Faggan Singh Kulaste.

India produced 113.43 million tonne of crude steel in January-November 2022, which is 10 per cent higher compared to the year-ago period. The government aims to double the country's annual crude steel making capacity to 300 MT from 150 MT at present.

In an interview to PTI, Kulaste, the Minister of State for Steel, said more initiatives to boost steel sector will be taken in 2023.

Last year, the government introduced the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme for specialty steel to enhance the production of the high-end alloy.

Special grade steel is used in various sectors, including power, shipping, railways and auto. The demand for this steel is being met through imports.

'With 8-9% Growth, It Takes 20 Years For India To Become **Developed Nation'**

HYDERABAD: Noting that the achievement of USD 5 trillion economy is a short term 'aspirational goal,' former RBI Governor C Rangarajan on Saturday said even after that India will still be known as middle income country with per capita income USD 3472.

Rangarajan further said in order to reach the level of an upper middle-income country, it will take another two years and to be classified as a developed country, the per capita income will have to be at a minimum of USD 13,205 and that will take more than two decades of strong growth of between 8 to 9 per cent to achieve it.

Speaking at the 12th Convocation of ICFAI Foundation for Higher education here, he said at aggregate output level, India is the fifth largest economy in the world now. That by itself is an impressive achievement. But in terms of per capita income. India's rank

according to IMF is 142 out of 197 countries. "The immediate focus of policymakers must be to raise the growth rate of the economy. Achievement of a USD 5 trillion economy is a good short term aspirational goal. This will take a minimum five years of sustained growth of 9 per cent. Even then, at the end of it, India's per capita income will be only USD 3472 and we will still be classified as a lower middle income country," he noted.

tificate courses in 10 disciplines. "As part of the Centre's modernisation initiative under the Nirman Se Shakti' we are setting up 23 new 100-bedded hospitals across the country. We are also setting up over 60 dispensaries that will ensure the delivery of quality medical care service to insured workers and their dependents in the vicinity

of their residences," Yadav said. "This ESIC Medical College has provided Out Patient Department service for 5,76,329 beneficiaries with a daily average OPD Census of 2,153 since January this year. Today, we are working towards Pan India coverage under ESIC and are constantly creating more infrastructure and capacities. We have introduced a cathlab at ESIC hospitals in three cities in India," he said.

No Amount Of Money, Material Compensation Can Erase Trauma Of Accident Victim: SC

New Delhi: While no amount of money or other material compensation can erase the trauma and suffering that a victim undergoes after a serious accident, monetary compensation assures restitution, the Supreme Court has said.

A bench of justices Krishna Murari and S Ravindra Bhat said taking the type of disability into concern, just compensation should be awarded to the person aggrieved.

"Whilst no amount of money or other material compensation can erase the trauma, pain and suffering that a victim undergoes after a serious accident, (or replace the loss of a loved one), monetary compensation is the manner known to law, whereby society assures some measure of restitution to those who survive, and the victims who have to face their lives," the bench said.

The observation from the top court came while awarding a compensation of Rs 9.30 lakh to a woman labour who was injured during construction of government hospital at Bidar in Karnataka

On July 22, 2015, the appellant fell down from second floor to ground floor when the centering plate collapsed on her head.

The top court noted that the doctors who treated the appellant have held that she sustained fracture of spinal bone and compound fracture on various parts of the body.


The apex court said ideally, the compensation should be provided to the employees against the hazards of employment to which an employee is exposed.

"This also includes any occupational disease or industrial accident that the employee may encounter arising out of or during the course of employment which leads to disability or death," the bench said.

"The position of the appellant after the accident, incapacitated her from carrying out her vocation as a labourer, we are of the opinion that the impugned order passed by the High Court is not liable to be sustained.

"The functional disability of the appellant is liable to be assessed as 100 per cent and, accordingly, the compensation is to be determined," the bench said.

Centre Asks States To Ensure Availability Of Oxygen, Functional Life Support Equipment At Hospitals

New Delhi: With some countries witnessing a surge in Covid cases, the Centre on Saturday urged states and union territories to ensure the availability of Liquid Medical Oxygen, adequate inventory of cylinders and functional life support equipment such as ventilators at hospitals to face any challenge.

The health ministry asked them to ensure Pressure Swing Adsorption (PSA) oxygen generating plants are kept fully functional and regular mock drills are conducted to check them.

In a letter to all states and UTs, Health Ministry Additional Secretary Manohar Agnani said the operationalisation and maintenance of these medical infrastructure is of utmost importance to meet any eventuality even though the number of cases in the country is low now.

He said medical oxygen is an important resource in all clinical settings, particularly during pandemic and reliable oxygen supply is critical

for saving lives.

In the letter, the official requested additional chief secretary/principal secretary, secretary (Health) of all states and UTs to direct departments concerned to ensure that PSA plants are kept fully functional and regular mock drills are conducted to check them.

"The availability of Liquid Medical Oxygen (LMO) in the health facilities and uninterrupted supply chain for their refilling should be ensured. Adequate Inventory of Oxygen Cylinders along with backup stocks and robust refilling system is maintained," the letter said.

States have also been urged to ensure the availability of functional life support equipment such as ventilators, BiPAP and SpO2

systems along with their consumables.

Oxygen control rooms should be reinvigorated at states and UTs level for prompt resolutions of oxygen-related issues and challenges, the letter said.

"On-boarding of all healthcare facilities utilizing oxygen to ODAS platform for daily oxygen demand and consumption be monitored for implementation," the letter stated.

During the COVID pandemic, the Centre supported States/UTs by installing and commissioning PSA plants, oxygen concentrators, cylinders, and other oxygen-related infrastructure to ensure availability of medical oxygen at a cost effective and reliable manner in public health facilities across the country, the letter said.

The support for ventilators was also extended by Gol to ensure better patient management, it added.

Dense Fog Cover Over Delhi, Cold Wave In Ridge Area

New Delhi: A dense layer of fog engulfed parts of the national capital Saturday morning reducing visibility to 100 metres, and affecting road and rail traffic, while the Ridge area recorded a cold wave.

The Safdarjung Observatory, the national capital's primary weather station, recorded the minimum temperature at 5.4 degrees Celsius, three notches below normal, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

The mercury dropped to 4 degrees Celsius, four notches below normal, at the Ridge weather station, making it the coldest place in the capital.

Aynagar recorded a minimum temperature of 4.4 degrees Celsius and Mungeshpur 4.1 degrees Celsius.

Foggy weather delayed 14 trains by 1.30 to 3.30 hours, railway officials said.

At 5:30 am, visibility was 100 metres at Palam and 200 metres at Safdarganj, two Delhi weather stations. Among other cities, it was 25 metres at Patiala (Punjab) and Ganganagar (Rajasthan), and 50 metres at Churu.

IMD officials said a layer of fog was seen mainly over Punjab,

north Rajasthan, Haryana and Delhi. Another layer is seen over some parts of Bihar, while regions in Uttar Pradesh are free from the fog cover, they said.

According to the IMD, 'very dense' fog is when visibility is between 0 and 50 metres, 51 and 200 is 'dense', 201 and 500 'moderate', and 501 and 1,000 'shallow'.

the national capital stood at 364
at 9 am, the Central Pollution
Control Board (CPCB) said.

An AQI between zero and 50 is considered "good", 51 and 100 "satisfactory", 101 and 200 "moderate", 201 and 300 "poor", 301 and 400 "very poor" and 401 and 500 "severe".

In the plains, the IMD declares a cold wave if the minimum temperature dips to 4 degrees Celsius. A cold wave is also expected when the minimum temperature is 10 degrees Celsius or below and is 4.5 notches below normal.

A "severe" cold wave is when the minimum temperature dips to two degrees Celsius or the departure from normal is more than 6.4 degrees Celsius.

When the minimum temperature is less than or equal to 10 degrees Celsius and the maximum temperature is at least 4.5 degrees Celsius below the normal, it is said to be a 'cold day'.

A circular issued by the Central Board of Direct Taxes (CBDT) on March 30 said once a PAN becomes inoperative, an individual shall be liable to all the consequences under the I-T Act and will have to suffer a number of implications.

The person shall not be able to file I-T return using the inoperative PAN; pending returns will not be processed; pending refunds cannot be issued to inoperative PANs; pending proceedings as in the case of defective returns cannot be completed once the PAN is inoperative and tax will be required to be deducted at a higher rate.

"In addition to the above, the taxpayer might face difficulty at various other fora like banks and other financial portals as PAN is one of the important KYC (know your customer) criterion for all kinds of financial transaction," the circular said.

The CBDT frames policy for the Income Tax department.

While Aadhaar is issued by the Unique Identification Authority of India to a resident of India, PAN is a 10-digit alphanumeric number allotted by the IT Department to a person, firm or entity.

The chances of snowfall are the most frequent and maximum during this period. Most areas, especially in the higher reaches, receive heavy snowfall.

'Chillai-Kalan' begins on December 21 and ends on January 30. The cold wave continues even after that with a 20-day-long 'Chillai-Khurd' (small cold) and a 10-day-long 'Chillai-Bachha' (baby cold) following it.

The SIA spokesperson said that the ground floor of the house comprising four rooms with kitchen and 2 bedrooms for residential purposes as per rent deed has been occupied by one Shahzada Aurangzeb of Shopian since November 2018.

"Shahzada Aurangzeb is himself a permanent Rukn of Jel and has also served as Amire-Zila District Shopian. He is presently working as Academic Officer at Jamait-u-Banaat (a women college affiliated with JKBOSE and University of Kashmir) Lal Bazar, Srinagar since 2020. BAN vs IND: Mehidy Mauls India To Spice Up Mirpur Test

MIRPUR: Bangladesh spinners, led by their talismanic skipper Shakib Al Hasan and young Mehidy Hasan Miraz, forced Indian batters to press the panic button in a tricky chase of 145 as the visitors ended an engaging third day's play, tottering at 45 for 4 in the second Test here on Saturday.

Having dominated for the better part of two and half days, Bangladesh's lower middle-order, led by Litton Das (73 off 98 balls) and supported by Nurul Hasan Sohan (31 off 29 balls) and Taskin Ahmed (31 off 46 balls), counter-attacked to take their second innings score to 231, giving their bowlers something to defend.

If India happen to lose this game, the 118 runs scored by the last four Bangladeshi pairs would haunt them as much as not using a third spinner in Kuldeep Yadav on a track that became increasingly venomous as the match progressed.



If they overhaul 145, it will be third highest successful fourth innings chase at this ground as the top three winning scores are 209, 205

KL Rahul (2), who had a horrendous game as a skipper as well as batter, would like to forget this game in a hurry while the stodgy Cheteshwar Pujara (6) suffered his downfall because of his anxiousness to negate any turn on offer. Shubman Gill (7) had his worse day on the tour, increasing India's worry.

In case of Rahul, he tentatively poked a Shakib (1/21 in 6 overs) delivery that turned enough to kiss the outside edge of his bat into the keeper's gloves. Pujara, for the second time, came out to play the delivery from Mehidy Hasan Miraz (3/12 in 8 overs) before it could turn. The ball hit his bat and pad before a crawling Nurul effected a smart stumping.

However, the pitch was showing its true colours and there was turn and bounce with the ball skidding occasionally as well as keeping low, making batting that much more difficult.

In fact, India's head coach Rahul Dravid, with his tactic of sending night watchman Axar Patel (26 batting) with more than 15 overs left, made it clear that there was a certain sense of nervousness as to what happens if Virat Kohli (1 off 22 balls) would get dismissed in the third evening itself.

While Gill was stumped off a doosra, becoming Miraz's second victim. Kohli had no choice but to come out late in the evening as the pitch, at times, was starting to resemble a snake pit with deliveries hissing past the willow.

Just like it happens on turners, the close-in fielders started applying more pressure on batters as well as umpires with Kohli needing a DRS to save himself from getting adjudged leg before to Taijul Islam.

But he was just a delivery away from getting dismissed as Miraz bowled a lovely flighted delivery drawing Kohli forward and got a classical bat-pad dismissal for Mominul Haque standing at forward

With Kohli not inspiring highest level of confidence, Rishabh Pant, who has shown how to bat on this track, could again play the decisive role and help India manage to log home full points and prevent Bangladesh from winning their first game against India in 22 years of bilateral Test cricket.

have had it all sorted. From the CA point of view, I didn't really have any support.

"My teammates and the staff in our team were absolutely amazing, and my family and friends - they really got me through that period," he

Warner, who has recently come under fire for his Test form, was out for 0 and 3 in the Perth Test last week. He hasn't scored a Test century since January 2020.

The opener said he was un-

able to understand why the process had taken so much time.

'We reached out in February. So we have no idea how it went on this far and only CA can answer that and they'll probably give you the same thing that they always give everyone else, they don't really give an answer," Warner said.

Despite his struggle in the longest format, Warner backed himself to do well in the Boxing Day Test.

They also said that a fresh outbreak of severe Covid cases and hospitalisation is unlikely as people in India have the advantage of 'hybrid immunity' that is natural immunity due to infection reinforced by vaccination.

"Overall, there is no increase in Covid caseload and India currently is in a comfortable situation. Under present circumstances, there is no need to restrict international flights or impose a lockdown," Dr Randeep Guleria, a former AIIMS director, said on Friday.

Past experiences show that banning flights is not effective in halting the transmission of infection, he said. "Moreover, data suggests that the Omicron subvariant BF.7, which is driving the surge in China, has already been found in our country."

Asked whether a lockdown could be needed in the coming days, Dr Guleria said, "A fresh outbreak of severe Covid cases and hospitalisation is unlikely

egy," he told PTI. He also opined China comparatively is more vulnerable right now possibly because of low natural immunity, "poor vaccination strategy where young and healthy people were prioritised rather than older and vulnerable population, and lower vaccine efficiency".

"Their population may be less immune and more vulnerable also due to the country's strict lockdown mechanism," he said. Dr Chandrakant Lahariya, a phy-

sician and an epidemiologist, said the experience of last three years has shown that while travel restrictions delayed the transmission of virus, it has no role anymore.

In fact, it cannot stop the transmission and moreover, by the time a new variant is detected, it already reaches to different parts of the world, he said.

"We had seen this a year ago with the Omicron variant. Clearly, travel bans have no role anymore. And secondly India has over 250 sub-variants of Omicron already. And, therefore, the most rational approach is to random sampling - with no mandates and minimal inconvenience to passengers for incoming international passengers. The purpose would be to keep track of emerging Covid sub-variants," he said.

The current Covid situation in India is under control and there are no reasons to panic, said Dr N.K. Arora, the chairperson of National Technical Advisory Group on Immunization (NTAGI).

Europium Molecule's Rotation Shows Promise For Quantum Computers



cientists at the US Department of Energy's (DOE) Argonne National Laboratory report they can precisely rotate a single molecule that could lead to new technologies for microelectronics, quantum computing and more, according to a study.

The key ingredient is a single atom of europium, a rare earth element. It rests at the centre of a complex of different atoms and gives the molecule many potential applications, it said.

"Our primary mission is to understand at the level of atoms the properties of rare earths, which are critical materials to US industry," said Saw Wai Hla, physicist at the Center for Nanoscale Materials (CNM), a DOE Office of Science user facility at Argonne, and a physics professor at Ohio University.

The term ?"rare earth" is deceptive. The rare earth elements are not exactly rare but are critical materials used in many electronic devices, such as cellular phones, computer hard drives, solar panels and flat screen monitors.

"We are able to rotate this europium complex by 60 or 120 degrees to the right or left," said Hla. "The ability to control the motion of a rare earth complex such as this could impact a wide spectrum of technologies.'

The capability to rotate this europium molecule on demand could expand their applications

into next generation microelectronics that run with relatively low power, quantum computers and more, according to the study.

Rare earths readily combine with other elements in the Earth's crust. It is thus difficult and costly to produce pure rare earths for devices. It is also expensive to harvest them from rare earth containing waste. The team's europium complex would reduce the amount of rare earth needed for a particular device and would be much less expensive to manufacture in mass quantities, the

study said. Key components in the complex are a single europium atom with positive charge and two small molecules with negative charge. The europium atom sits at the centre of the complex, while one of the small molecules is on the side and the other at the bottom, the study said.

According to the study, because opposites attract, these negative and positive charges keep these components together without the need for a chemical bond. And the small molecule at the bottom anchors the complex to a sheet of gold. This sheet acts like a table to hold the whole complex in one place, just as you need a flat solid surface to spin a bottle.

"Normally, if you attach a complex like ours with positive and negative charges to a metal sheet, the charges dissipate, said Hla. "So, we were thrilled when that did not happen here.
