Meteorites Found In Antarctica, Could Hold Answers To Earth's Formation

ew Delhi- Scientists have found meteorites from the depths of Antarctica Blue Ice, an area with strong winds where the glaciers get ablated, with one of them weighing 7.6 kg.

An international team of scientists went on a reconnaissance mission to Antarctica with the objective of finding new areas of meteorite accumulation around the Belgian Princess Elisabeth Antarctica (PEA) Station, according to a statement.

The exploration was from December 11, 2022 to January 11.

"Meteorites are rocks fallen from space as a shooting star. Previously, three successful Belgian-Japanese missions to the Nansen Blue Ice Field near the Belgian station in Antartica collected more than 600 meteorites. Using satellite images and GPS coordinates, the team set out to discover the potential of several areas of interest by searching them for meteorites," said professor Maria Schoenbaechler, department of earth sciences at ETH-Zurich in Switzerland, told PTI.

The blue ice zone of Nils Larsen, about 60 km from the station, has been recognized



as an accumulation zone worthy of revisiting, the statement said.

"But above all, the team returns with a very nice surprise in its luggage: a 7.6 kg meteorite! Such big meteorites are very rare in Antarctica," it said.

"At the moment it looks like an ordinary chondrites. This type of meteorite comes from the asteroid belt and ended its travel in the Antarctic blue ice, waiting several tens of thousands of years in the ice before discovery.

"It belongs to the oldest material that can be found on Earth and is similar to the

building block of the Earth," said Schoenbaechler. So, what does this mean

for the Earth science research? "This means we can study planet Earth's formation with this type of meteorite," said Schoenbaechler. The meteorite were found

on the blue ice or in the moraines. The scientists documented them without touching them and packed them directly into plastic bags or aluminium foil to avoid contamination, she said in an email. Differentiating between

meteors and meteorites, Schoenbaechler said, "The rocks, which we found, are called meteorites. The shooting star is the trail which it generates while falling onto the Earth and is called a meteor."

When asked how the meteorites were identified as such, she said, "The meteorites were first identified by looking at them - our big meteorite has a very typical dark fusion crust, which is formed during the fall of the rock onto earth.

"This generates a shooting star (meteor), in which the upmost surface of the rock is heated by aerodynamical friction and melted. We also used a handheld tool to test the magnetic properties of the rock."

So, what will the meteorites be analysed for?

"We will take a small sample and analyse the minerals that it contains to determine which type of meteorites it is," explained Schoenbaechler.

When asked if there was something else that they would like to share, she said, "We also took some sediments samples and in there, we will search for micrometeorites. These are very small meteorites and their size is the same as that of a dust particle. They too are scientifically very valuable."

Along with Schoenbaechler, the team included scientists from Field Museum of Natural History, University of Chicago in the US, and Universite Libre de Bruxelles (ULB) in Belgium, was led by Vinciane Debaille, ULB and guided in the field by Manu Poudelet, International Polar Guide Association.

What lies ahead for the meteorite? "Next step? The meteorite will go to Brussels, travelling in a cold box, for thawing under controlled conditions at the Royal Belgian Institute of Natural Sciences, before being analysed for their chemical composition and becoming available for scientific studies," the statement said

Researchers Develop Organic Crystalline Material For Highly Sensitive Pressure Sensors

Education and Research (IISER), Bhopal, and the University of Queensland have developed a new flexible organic crystal that shows great potential for use in highly sensitive pressure sensors.

According to the team, the device fabricated with this material has high sensitivity to pressure when compared to existing materials, making it a promising component for future development of the technology of pressure sensors.

The findings of the research have been published in the prestigious journal "Small".

"There is a growing interest in the use of organic materials for electronic applications. The flexibility of organic materials makes them ideal for creating flexible electronic devices such as displays and sensors that can be bent or curved, providing a new level of design freedom. Organic crystals in particular have immense potential in the field of electronics due to their few defects and minimal grain boundaries," said Deepak Chopra, Professor at Department of Chemistry, IISER Bhopal.The researchers have developed a new organic crystal - 4-trifluoromethyl phenyl isothiocyanate (4CFNCS) - that is flexible enough to be bent, twisted, and coiled, he said. "We thoroughly analyzed 4CFNCS using sophisticated computational and challenging experimental techniques such as synchrotron microfocus X-ray diffraction measurements to understand as to why these are so flexible.

"The in-depth analysis of the crystal structure showed that the way the atoms of this molecule are arranged in solids allows it to bend and stretch without breaking when subjected to mechanical stress. This helps to keep the crystal structure intact even under high pressure and impact. The slippage of molecules in multiple directions enables complex coiling motion in crystals," he said.

The researchers propose to optimize the synthesis and study variations of the basic molecule in the future.

"These materials can be made without harmful chemicals or high-energy conditions, making them better for the environment. Apart from the applications of touch screens, such materials will be of great use in the design of flexible electronic devices, such as those used in healthcare, intelligent systems, wearable devices, and self-powered devices," said Mitradip Bhattacharjee, Assistant Professor, Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, IISER Bhopal. the clinic as well as in online mode

Proportion Of Children Enrolled In Private Schools In J&K Highest In India: Report

The proportion of children enrolled in private schools in Jammu and Kashmir is quite high (43.6%) compared to other states, the Annual Status of Education Report (ASER)-2022 has revealed.

The report was released on Wednesday in New Delhi by Ajay Piramal, Chairman of Piramal Group and Pratham Education Foundation.

As per the report, in J&K only 0.5% children aged 6-14 years are not enrolled in the schools. It says that the Government school enrolment fell and is

currently 55.5% in the erstwhile state while all India government school enrolment rose up to 72.9%.

"4.8 percent of children in the age group of 15-16 year olds in J&K are not enrolled in schools," the report said. The report has thrown light on gender gaps in older children in terms of their enrolment in schools.

"15-16 year old girls are more likely to be out of school than boys," it reads.

The survey that was conducted in September-November 2022 further highlights that government school children are facing learning drops prepandemic, while private school



children were making progress before 2022. Regarding the school facilities,

the report revealed that 86.9% of surveyed primary schools in J&K were small schools, i.e. had

The report suggested that most of the children in J&K need urgent help in acquiring foundational skills in literacy and numeracy. "The children require a big push in early grades to help them reach NIPUN Bharat goals in the next few years," the re-

port reveals. "In 2022, about 40 percent of all children in Grade III were at grade level in math and about 20 percent in reading," ASER report reads.

The survey team maintained that a great deal of efforts are being made towards achieving goals for the foundational stage (age 3-8) as outlined in the NEP 2020. It says that the rising enrolment in pre-school classes, few-

No Polls In Sight

n a statement that gives people in Jammu and Kashmir little hope for early polls, Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar said on Wednesday that the assembly elections in the union territory will be held with various factors in mind, including weather and security concerns. The CEC said that the delimitation process and the revision of electoral rolls in the union territory has been completed. Similarly, returning officers and additional electoral registration officers have also been appointed.

Previously, the election commission invited representatives from eight recognised national and 57 regional political parties to a demonstration of a modified version of the M3 Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) that allows migrants to vote at polling stations outside their home constituencies. Major J&K parties such as National Conference and the PDP who also participated in the meeting made a strong pitch for the polls in the union territory.

As for the weather and security, the concerns cited by the CEC for being factors in holding polls in J&K, this is not an opinion shared by J&K political parties or for that matter people in the region. True, Kashmir is in the middle of winter, but if the polls are announced now, they can only be held by March-April, which is the spring season. And as for the security, Kashmir is now a considerably more peaceful place, a surprising turn of events which government boasts as its singular achievement following the withdrawal of the region's special status in August 2019. So, now is, in a sense, the ideal time for the Assembly polls.

J&K has not had an elected government since June 2018, when Governor's rule was imposed after the PDP-led coalition government lost its majority following the withdrawal of support by the BJP. The last four years have witnessed a drastic political makeover of the state-turned-union territory, so much so that in many aspects, the current J&K bears little resemblance to what it was pre-August 2019.

This should normally pave the way for the polls but this doesn't seem to be the case. For some reason, the elections keep getting deferred. More so, at a time when there is a palpable desire for polls in the region. There is thus hope that the central government will take steps towards holding the long delayed exercise. If deferred further, there will be little scope for the polls considering general elections are due to be held in May 2024.

Will a Recession Hit India This June?

Technically a recession means that the total output in the economy — measured by the Gross Domestic Product or GDP — comment by Union Minister for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Narayan Rane on Monday (January 16) has created controversy. "There is a global recession and it is in many countries. This is what I have gathered from the discussion in the meetings of the Union government. The recession is expected to hit India after June," Rane said after giving an inaugural speech at the two-day G20 Infrastructure

Working Group (IWG) meeting in Pune. Responding to the Minister's remark, the Congress on Tuesday sought to know what the Prime Minister and Finance Minister were "hiding from the country".

So, is India heading for a recession?

The short answer is no. Technically a recession means that the total output in ruled out because the GDP is expected to continue to grow at around 7% (according to the latest RBI projections).

In other words, far from contraction, India's economy is likely to grow, albeit at a slightly muted rate right through 2023 and 2024.

Why did Narayan Rane say that recession will hit India?

It is important in this context to note what Rane said. "As I am in the Cabinet, some information is available to us and whatever advice we get from PM Modiji, on that basis, we can say that there is an economic recession in big countries. It is a reality," news agency PTI quoted the minis-

countries. It is more likely that Rane perhaps meant that the effect of that recession will hit India by June. It is a fact that India's economic growth will be dragged down by the global recession.

hat India is a deeply unequal society is no se-cret. Still, a recent report by the global non-profit group, Oxfam, has revealed that the income gap between the ultrarich and the rest of the country has reached stunningly unhealthy levels. According to the report, the richest 1% of the population own more than 40% of the country's total wealth. The top 5% are holding 62% of the national wealth. Meanwhile, of the total wealth generated in India between 2012 and 2021, only 3% has gone to the bottom 50% of the Indian population. That demolishes any notion that India's economic rise in recent years has led to any meaningful trickle down effect for the vulnerable sections of its society. The widening income gap in India is in keeping with global trends: the Oxfam report found that globally, the richest 1% grabbed twice as much of new wealth generated since 2019 as the remaining 99% of the world's population. Yet India is unique: no other country boasts two multibillionaires among the 10 richest people in the world while also having 200 million people living in poverty.

This growing inequity is not just a consequence of global challenges like the Covid-19 pandemic and the Ukraine war but is also an indictment of government policies. The Oxfam report concludes that the richest 10% of the population contribute only 4% to the nation's goods and services tax collections while the bottom 50% pay 64%. Under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, India has also slashed its corporate tax rate from 30% to 22%, and for new manufacturing companies from 25% to 15%. Those moves were meant to promote a business-friendly image and encourage investment. But India's investment rate has also dropped in recent months. Mr Modi came to power in 2014 with the promise of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas'. Nine years later, his policies appear to have had the polar opposite effect, helping those already at the top of the wealth pile while widening the income gap. That is bad economics — an economy needs more people capable of buying commodities and services. It also leaves India's future in peril, far too dependent on a few individuals with unimaginable wealth and the clout that it brings. Governments will come and go. India will have to live with the consequences.

It's normal to feel sad and disturbed when circumstances don't go the way you expected. We humans have a tendency to have very high expectations for how events should turn out, which compromises our ability to cope with situations successfully if something goes wrong.

One frequently falls short of achieving the desired grade, getting a crucial job, or occasionally losing something that required all of their labor, sweat, and tears. It is a really depressing experience, and it wouldn't be inappropriate to comfort someone in such a situation by urging them not to cry over the spilled milk.

However, it is important to realize that such a failure leads to the development of a range of emotions, not only sadness, and that these emotions may or may not be cellence in such people's lives. Numerous studies have been done that demonstrate these difficult emotions have a wide range of positive effects. Some of the most wellknown difficult emotions include "Sadness," which can help you focus on details, "Anxiety," which can inspire you to think of issues and challenges in new ways, "Jealousy," which can spur you on to work harder, and "Guilt," which can help you stop acting in unhealthy ways. Avoidance tactics can cause more harm than good, so it's better to be aware of all of these difficult emotions and accept them as a natural part of life rather than suppressing them and moving on.

It's always darkest before the dawn, and it would be accurate to assume that all the negativity that arises from unpleasant events and poor outcomes is wearing the veil of darkness. The morning would

> interconnected. It is perhaps much more important to make all of these negative feelings and difficult emotions conscious when you are going through such a difficult moment. These feelings, after all, are what might eventually fuel growth and ex

then be the success that comes after. And the most important step is along this route to achievement. For a while, you may feel disturbed and discouraged by the circumstances, but you must also acknowledge their complexity and the reasons behind your mistakes before you can begin to take steps to overcome them. Because pain (not suffering) is a big motivating force, it must be acknowledged, recognized, and valued. As reasonable as it is to suppose that "whatever happens in the past, should stay in the past," it is also reasonable to acknowledge that, if the past is used properly to learn lessons, it might become the guiding post for the future.

The benefits of having a pleasant and upbeat attitude are numerous and go unspoken in society. However, it might cause a lot of mental burden on the mind and might force one to put on a phony smile, and hence this toxic positivity might compel one to be unnaturally happy in the face of grief and failure. The pressure from society and ourselves that causes most people to mask difficult emotions they don't completely feel is what leads to toxic positivity. As a result of this need to be happy, people frequently turn to unhealthy coping mechanisms like drinking and substance abuse. These are all short-term fixes and avoidance tactics that temporarily improve one's mood but are seriously harmful over the long run.

In all such circumstances, all that is required is the space to mourn in silence, to reflect calmly, and not to be pressured to carry on with life. These brief periods of sadness should be used effectively because they not only provide us a chance to reflect but also give us the necessary reality checks. They give us the time we need to take care of ourselves and learn better coping skills. They teach us the value of each and every emotion on the emotional spectrum, including those that we frequently try to avoid and suppress.

My personal failings in life (that includes my leaving Ph.D in plant sciences after two years due to my ill physical health) have taught me that if I had let them overwhelm me, I could have become severely depressed, but instead I accepted them as challenges and learned from them. I also discovered that once you accept bad news not as a bad thing but as a sign that you need to change, you aren't defeated by it since you are learning from it. Therefore, it all depends on how you handle failures.

Therefore, we must understand the significance of experiencing all the emotions, reflecting on our mistakes and failings, learning from them, and then getting ready to go on with our lives. The urge to immediately let go and put the incident behind you is a very temporary solution, and if we don't learn to handle difficult times and difficult emotions appropriately, they may will reappear in our life at some point in the future with more ugliness.

Occasionally things don't work out as planned, and while it's necessary to feel it in the moment and take lessons from it, it's also crucial to understand that these moments of discouragement and sadness are usually supposed to pass quickly. However, if such moments and the associated thoughts and feelings have a significant and longlasting effect, they might trigger certain psychological problems and call for help from mental health professionals such as clinical psychologists and/or psychiatrists.

Last but not least, we all want to lead happy and meaningful lives, and the way to that is through accepting all of the setbacks and associated emotions that may initially seem to be obstacles but ultimately serve as the catalyst for growth and excellence. Stay safe sane and productive!

In New Social Media Guidelines, CRPF Asks Personnel To Not Comment On Controversial, Political Matters

New Delhi: The country's largest paramilitary force CRPF has issued a fresh set of social media guidelines for its personnel, asking them not to comment on controversial or political matters that may come back to "haunt" them later.

The two-page instructions were issued last week by the headquarters of the force in Delhi after it was noticed that the "force personnel were taking recourse to social media platforms to vent their personal grievances which is in violation of CCS conduct Rules 1964 and may attract disciplinary action".

A circular issued in this context has been accessed by PTI and it states that the new guidelines are being issued to make aware the personnel against "cyber bullying and harassment" and also to sensitise them.

The guidelines suggested some "don'ts" including not revealing the exact posting and nature of work if working in a sensitive ministry or organisation.

The guidelines also have some "do's" for the CRPF personnel like being "sure to know the difference between fact and opinion." "Make sure to clarify (over social media platforms) that you are not representing the position of the government; always remember that you are personally responsible for the content you publish on blogs, wikis, or any other platform or in any form of user-generated content," it said.

The personnel have been asked to "protect the privacy" of their family and friends, as carefully as their own, and they should use "utmost discretion while commenting on sensitive issues, gender issues and controversial issues online".

"Carefully consider the implications of making friends, linking, following or accepting requests from unknown persons," it said.

New Delhi: Amid controversy over a BBC documentary on Prime Minister Narendra Modi, India on Thursday dismissed it as a "propaganda piece", saying it is designed to push a particular "discredited narrative" and that the continuing colonial mindset is "blatantly visible" in the series.

External Affairs Ministry Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi also wondered about the purpose of the documentary and the "agenda" behind it and said "frankly we do not wish to dignify such efforts".

The two-part BBC documentary "India: The Modi Question" claims it investigated certain aspects relating to the 2002 Gujarat riots when Modi was the chief minister of the state.

"Let me just make it very clear that we think this is a propaganda piece designed to push a particular discredited narrative. The bias, the lack of objectivity, and frankly a continuing colonial mindset, are blatantly visible," he said.

Why would I just jump on it now? Just because Jack Straw says it, how do they lend it that much legitimacy," he asked.

"I heard words like inquiry and investigation. There is a reason why we used the word colonial mindset. We do not use words loosely. What enquiry? They were diplomats here ... investigation, are they ruling the country. I do not agree with that characterization."

The external affairs ministry spokesperson also noted that the documentary has not been screened in India.

"Do note that this has not been screened in India. So I am only going to comment in the context of what I have heard about it and what my colleagues have seen," he said in his initial remarks.

To a question on claims of deaths of UK citizens, Bagchi said if there were deaths in India, legal procedure of the country has to be followed. Whether they took up in 2002, I do not have an idea, he said there have been a lot of legal processes against deaths that have happened during that time.

It was the first major protest against the -K governor administration's order issued on January 4 asking all illegal occupants of the state land to leave the places within seven days or face action.

The protestors assembled at Bidhard in Larnoo and raised slogans against the administration for issuing eviction notices to them, officials said.

They said the protestors submitted a memorandum to local authorities, demanding the Lt Governor administration revoke the order.

"The order has created panic among the people as it will make them homeless and landss. The land was provided to the people for making homes and cultivation. Many houses have been constructed on these lands under the PMAY," Chaudhary Haroon Khatana, a local activist spearheading the protest, said.

"The Lt Governor took on the spot appraisal from the concerned departments and directed for speedy implementation of related projects," he added.

drive on Thursday was carried out in Bandipora district, where around 1571 kanal of government land was retrieved, an official spokesperson said. So far, he said, 28000 kanal land has been retrieved in the district, which includes 13217 kanal of state land and 15471 kanal of kahcharai.

"It was informed that in the last one week around 3000 kanals of land was retrieved from the land grabbers including 500 kanals of land in Sumbal lying adjacent to Highway having industrial utility," the spokesperson said.

The retrieved land, he said, is also being earmarked for various public purposes like developmental projects, playgrounds, village centric amenities, industries, etc. by the revenue officials in consultation with concerned villagers/ PRIs and sign boards are also erected immediately after the eviction drives.

He said that out of total 20887 of Kahcharai land, 15471 kanals of land has been retrieved amounting to 75% of Kahcharai land in the district and the concerned Tehsildars have already issued notices to the encroachers and the efforts for removal of encroachments on the rest of the land are underway in full-swing.

Deputy Commissioner, Bandipora, Dr. Owais Ahmad said that the District has created a land bank of around 25000 kanals out of which around 1550 kanals have been earmarked for Industrial Estates, 2000 kanals for Industrial Use (Out of which around 1377 Kanals stand already transferred), around 100 Kanal for Handloom/ Handicraft and other agri-based activities and around 200 Kanals for setting up of Housing Colony in Watpora Bandipora.

Robot-assisted surgery uses specialized technology that enhances the capabilities of surgeons. It allows surgeons to perform procedures in hardto-reach areas through small incisions. The specialized technology also enables precise movements and enhanced magnification. Several doctors said that the

Robotic Surgical System is the need of the hour at GMC Srinagar as it has multiple benefits during surgical procedures. Dr Sajad Nazir Head of Department Urology Department at GMC Srinagar said that depart-

ment has seen a lot of people visiting urological related problems in the last few years due to the quality and latest technology based procedures. Earlier, patients would go outside the state for such procedures. The department started Kid-



nev transplantation last year and now it lacks Robotic surgeries for which patients have to go outside the state, he said. Prof (Dr) Syed Sajjad Nazir has done fellowship in Robotic surgeries in 2018 from one of the best centres of the world

Roswell park Cancer institute USA while many other faculty members also had hands-on experience in robotic surgery in India during their training.

The department had already submitted the demand of Robotic equipment since 2019 and even tenders were floated by JKMSCL but due to some technical issues it didn't mature till now, Dr Sajad said.

He said that presently the best results for urological malignancies are treated with Robotic surgeries in the entire world as the Robotic surgeries have been beneficial to Urological related Cancers worldwide and hence its acceptance in Urology, he said.

Dr Sajjad along with his department requested the government for procuring the Robotic equipment which will place GMC Srinagar at par with other top rated institutes of the country.

He said that one of the main advantages of robotic surgery is that it enables surgery through smaller incisions besides greater precision, better visualization and ability to do surgery inside the body–(KNO)

Arsenal, West Ham United, Leicester City, Leeds United, Everton and Newcastle United were all on the list as the Premier League clubs made up 11 of the top 20. City posted a Premier League record commercial revenue of 373 million euros in euros from the previous season.
