5 Killed After Bus Rolls Into Gorge

Jammu: Five people, including a woman, were killed and 15 others sustained injuries after a mini bus skidded off the road and plunged into a deep gorge in Kathua district of Jammu and Kashmir on Friday, police said. The accident took place at Sila village of Billawar in the evening when the driver lost control of the private bus while negotiating a blind curve, they said.

According to police, the bus was on its way to Dhanu Parole village from Mondli village.

Four people including a 60-year-old woman were found dead at the spot by rescuers, while 16 others were rushed to a hospital where one of them succumbed to injuries, they said. (PTI)

J&K Slowly Heading Towards Peace, Stability: HM

New Delhi: Asserting that Jammu and Kashmir is slowly heading towards peace and stability, the Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday said the amount of investment that has come in the last four years is more than what it had come to the erstwhile state in the last 70 years.

"In Jammu and Kashmir, terror incidents, deaths and terroristdominated areas have drastically diminished," Shah said at the inaugural session of a three-day conference of DGPs and IGPs here.

"Today, we can say that Jammu and Kashmir is slowly heading towards peace and stability," he said. The home minister said a record tourist footfall in Jammu and Kashmir was recorded last year.

The number of tourists who visited the Union Territory was 1.80 crore, which shows that the entire nation is convinced that peace is returning to the region, he said. "I congratulate the Jammu and

'Star Visibility Falls As Light Pollution Enhances Night Sky Brightness'

eople around the world are seeing fewer and fewer stars in the night sky, owing to an increase in the night sky brightness due to light pollution, according to a study.

The change in star visibility can be explained by an increase in the sky brightness of 7-10 per cent per year, the study said.

The rate of change is faster than satellite measurements of artificial light emissions on Earth would at first suggest, the study said.

The study analysed more than 50,000 naked-eye observations by citizen scientists around the world from 2011 to 2022 as part of the "Globe at Night" Citizen Science Project. The results show that citizen science data are an important supplement to previous measurement methods.

The findings of the study have been published in the journal Science.

Over a large part of the Earth's land surface, the sky continues to glow with an artificial twilight long after sunset. This "skyglow" is a form of light pollution

that has serious effects on the environment and should therefore be the focus of research, as Constance Walker, co-author of the study and head of the Globe at Night project of US National Science Foundation's NOIRLab since its inception, emphasised.

After all, many behaviours and physiological processes of living creatures are determined by daily and seasonal cycles - and thus influenced by light.

'Skyglow affects both diurnal and nocturnal animals and also destroys an important part of our cultural heritage," says Walker.

The appearance of the night sky is changing, with negative effects on stargazing and astronomy, the study said.

The change in skyglow over time has not previously been measured globally. While it could in principle be measured by satellites, the only current sensors that monitor the entire Earth do not have sufficient accuracy or sensitivity, the study said.

A promising approach is therefore to use the observational power of people using the human eye as a sensor, and in doing so - within the framework of Citizen Science experiments - to rely on the power of the crowd.

The "Globe at Night" project, initiated by the US National Science Foundation's NOIRLab, has been running since 2006. People all over the world can participate in this project.

Participants look at their night sky, and then report which of a set of eight star charts best matches what they see using an online form. Each chart shows the sky under different levels of light pollution, the study said.

"The contributions of individual people work together as if they were a global sensor network, making new science possible," said Christopher Kyba from the GFZ German Research Centre for Geosciences in Potsdam and the Ruhr University Bochum.

Kyba's team has analyzed data from 51,351 participants around the world taken on cloudthe number of visible stars can be explained by increases in night sky brightness. In Europe, they found a 6.5 per cent increase in brightness per year matched the data; in North America, it's 10.4 per cent.

To put these numbers into a more understandable context, Kyba explains the consequences for seeing stars in a place with a 9.6 per

and moon-free nights between 2011 and 2022. They were obtained from 19,262 locations worldwide, including 3,699 locations in Europe and 9,488 locations in North America.

In order to calculate a rate of change in sky brightness from this data and to take into account that the observers were also at different locations over the years, they made use of a global model for sky brightness based on satellite data from 2014.

"The rate at which stars are becoming invisible to people in urban environments is dramatic," summed up Christopher Kyba, lead author of the study.

The researchers found that the change in

cent per year increase, which was the average over all locations worldwide.

"If the development were to continue at that rate, a child born in a place where 250 stars are visible will only be able to see 100 stars there on

his 18th birthday," said Kyba. Based on the slower growth in upward emissions seen in satellite data, the researchers were surprised by the speed of this develop-

ment in skyglow. In fact, for the locations of the observers, the artificial brightness measured by satellite had slightly decreased - by 0.3 percent per year in Europe, by 0.8 percent in North America.

Srinagar: The Rehabilitation therapists have urged the government to provide them with jobs. The BRT graduates said they had pursued their degrees with high hopes but in absence of jobs they have been left to fend for themselves.

Speaking to Kashmir Observer, the 'unemployed' Rehabilitation therapists said specially-abled people from lower middle class families in Kashmir cannot afford to visit private clinics and are not able to get proper treatment or rehabilitation therapy because of the high treatment costs.

PDD Now Says Power Only For 2.5 Hours

RINAGAR- With break-downs in two major transmis-sion lines, the valley shall have to do with just 2.5 hours of electricity in every twenty four hours for some time to come. The near round-the-clock curtailment shall continue till such time as the tower, total damage to which has been cited as the cause of the crisis, has been re-erected.

Bomb blasts at transmission towers in Qazigund and Wagoora have reduced power supply to the valley by 90 per-cent, a chief engineer of the PDD said today in Srinagar.

Addressing a press conference summoned ostensibly to explain away unprecedented power cuts, the chief engineer, Abdul Majeed Mattoo, denied reports that power supply from the northern grid had been cut off following non-payment of dues by the state. "Power has not been cut off. There is a fault is the transmission line," he said. Mattoo said that efforts were on to re-erect the tower but declined to set a specific time-frame for the complete restoration of power supply. The chief engineer said that a mere 85 MW of power were available to the valley as against a requirement of 750 MW. Out of this 85 MW, thirty went to essential services like hospitals, telephone exchanges, army and broadcasting institutions, he said.

Abdul Majeed Mattoo said that on the night intervening the 13th and 14th of January a breakdown of the 220 KV Kishenpur-Pampore line and the 132 KV Udhampur-Srinagar line occurred because of a blast in one special 220 KV tower in Qazigund. completely damaging the tower. This, he said, had deprived the valley of 230MW of peak power and about 50 lakh units of energy. The chief engineer claimed that the department had quickly swung into action and restored the 132 KV Udhampur-Srinagar line thereby ensuring supply of about 60MW of power and 12 to 14 lakh units of energy

Custodial Death Among Worst Crimes In Civilised Society: Bombay High Court

MUMBAI: Custodial death is one of the worst crimes in a civilised society and the police cannot torture citizens in an inhuman manner under the guise of power, the Bombay High Court observed while asking the state government to pay ₹15 lakh as compensation to the mother of a man allegedly killed in police custody.

The Aurangabad bench, comprising Justices Vibha Kankanwadi and Abhay Waghwase, on Wednesday passed its judgment on a petition filed by one Sunita Kute who alleged that her 23-year-old son Pradip had died after being tortured and assaulted by two policemen attached to the Solapur police.

Kute sought a compensation of ₹40 lakh from the police and disciplinary action against the errant policemen.

"Custodial death is perhaps one of the worst crimes in a civilised society governed by the rule of law," the bench said

Though the police have the power to control the actions of people and the crime, it was not unfettered, it said. "Under the guise of exercise of the said power they cannot torture or deal with a citizen in an inhuman manner," the judgment said.

The state is the protector of the life of its citizens and if its employee undertakes torturous acts under the guise of power, then it has to compensate such a citizen," the court said. The bench noted that in the present case, the victim was a 23-year-old man who had married just four months before his death.

The bench directed the Maha-

rashtra government to pay a compensation of ₹15,29,600 to the victim's mother.

"It will be open to the state to recover the amount from respondent 4 and 5 (the two errant policemen), as they have been revealed to be the persons responsible for the death of Pradip," the court said.

As per the plea, the petitioner's son Pradip, who was a sugarcane harvester, was stopped by the police when he was driving a tractor in November 2018.

The policemen started assaulting Pradip and others in the tractor for playing music, the petitioner claimed, adding that while the others managed to flee, Pradip died on the spot.

A FIR was then lodged by the petitioner against the policemen who had assaulted Pradip.

The errant police officials, however, refuted the allegations and claimed that they did not have any motive to kill the victim, who suffered from a brain disease and was feeling dizzy. He was taken to a hospital, where he was declared dead.

"We would like to say that there was no reason for the police to intercept the tractor driven by Pradip, even if they were having some objection regarding the sound, they could have told the same to Pradip in a dignified manner," the court said in its judgment.

LONDON: The BBC conceded Friday it was wrong for writing about Jacinda Ardern's shock resignation as prime minister of New Zealand with the headline: "Can women have it all?" The since-deleted headline was posted Thursday on Twitter with a link to an article by BBC World, the UK broadcaster's global newsroom.

Angry commentators contrasted it with BBC headline writers' ungendered coverage of male politicians including Boris Johnson, the thrice-married father of seven who quit as UK prime minister last year. One labelled it "staggering sexism" while others accused the BBC of "misogyny".

The headline was later changed to say: "Departure reveals unique pressures on PM." The story mentioned Ardern's life as a working mother of a small child.

"We quickly recognised the original headline wasn't suitable for the story and changed it accordingly. We also deleted the associated tweet," a BBC spokesperson told AFP. The 42-year-old Ardern



who steered New Zealand through natural disasters, the Covid pandemic, and its worstever terror attack -- said she no longer had "enough in the tank"

While Ardern has not shied away from discussing the strains of office, she has been quick to shoot down sexist lines of questioning.

"Do You Receive Fresh Vegetables," Xi Asks Troops At India-China Border

BEIJING: Chinese President Xi Jinping has held a video conversation with the soldiers stationed along the India-China border in eastern Ladakh and inspected their combat readiness, official media here reported on Friday.

Xi addressed the troops from the People's Liberation Army (PLA) headquarters here on the border defence situation in Khunjerab under the Xinjiang Military Command.

Xi, who is also general secretary of the ruling Communist Party of China and the commander-in-chief of the PLA, in his remarks to the troops, referred to how "in recent years, the area has been constantly changing" and how it had impacted the



Army, according to the video shown in the official media. During the call, he "inspected their combat readiness", the report said.

One of the soldiers replied that they were now carrying out "dynamic" and "24-hour" monitoring of the border. Xi asked about their condition and whether they were able to "receive fresh vegetables" in the inhospitable terrain. The official media reported, Xi had asked the border troops "about their border patrol and management work" and "hailed the soldiers as models of border defence and encouraged them to persist in their efforts and make new contributions." Eastern Ladakh is the region where a stand-off erupted on May 5. 2020 between India and China following a violent clash in the Pangong lake area.

The two sides have held 17 rounds of high-level military talks on the eastern Ladakh border stand-off, but there was no significant forward movement in resolution of the remaining issues.

India has asserted that peace and tranquillity along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) are essential for overall development of bilateral relationship with China.

he Russia-Ukraine war is now in its 11th month, and there are no signs of it 'going- slow ' as new war plans unfold with every passing day. Russia has been slapped with economic sanctions by the West in their overall strategy to bring Russia on its knees. But, Russia has not shown signs of fatigue and is raging with war against Ukraine. Iran which has been overtly supportive of Russia's war, too has been reeling under economic sanctions from around five-decades, and no wonder, both the nations have come together to fight-the-economic-isolation, this time with India's help.

News in Asia.Nikkei has informed about Russia-Iran-India coming together. 'Russia and Iran are working on a new shipping corridor that cuts Europe and its sanctions out of the picture, and are looking to partner with India, which has kept its distance from the Westernled isolation campaign against the two countries. The plan is an answer to the U.S.-led push for "friendshoring," an effort to relocate supply chains to allies and friendly countries.

This bonhomie between Russia, India and Iran is quite understandable as despite the sanctions on Russia, India has greatly benefitted from the purchase of heavily discounted oil from Russia, which kept afloat the Russian economic fortunes, and also made India cater to the needs of more than a billion people. But, ironically, the government in India did not relax the oil prices domestically! Iran too is into selling its oil to India, mainly through the grey-market, as India, due to US pressure, has almost stopped buying Iranian oil, since mid-2019. What however is also worth to speculate is despite the US sanctions on Russia and Iran. Russia remains to be the ninth largest economy while Iran retains an 11th rank on it.

Considering the weight and lure of the Indian market, it is quite a natural corollary for both Russia and Iran to look towards India, more so particularly, when both the nations have been handicapped by the US sanctions. The big question is will India become a partner to it? This probable trade-route or corridor is now almost complete, as construction is underway on 3,300 kilometers of railways throughout Iran, and 560 km of new track is set to open for operation by March. Completing all of these projects would expand the country's (Iran) rail network by 20%. Iran seeks to leverage its potential as a transport hub between Asia, Russia and Europe. Moscow, New Delhi and Tehran signed an agreement back in 2002 laying out plans for the International North-South Transport Corridor, which would connect India and Russia through Iran and Azerbaijan, bypassing the Suez Canal. When Russian

How Ukraine War Is Shaping A New Axis

Will there be a Moscow-New Delhi-Tehran trade corridor sans US?

President Vladimir Putin visited Iran in July, he and counterpart Ebrahim Raisi agreed on the need to finish the Rasht-Astara rail link in northern Iran, part of the proposed route.' However, what seeks to be answered is the intention of India to start to supply its missiles to Armenia, a foe of Azerbaijan and Iran alike!

It is worthy to note that Russia-Iran idea of mutual trade has been into for more than two decades and it is only now that India is entering this conglomerate, which has been strengthened by India's neutral stand vis-à-vis the sanctions particularly on Russia, and hence, this shipping-corridor with India, which would bypass European sanctions, is now almost on the anvil. This coming together of these three nations is getting • going to respond to this effort to relocate supplychains is yet to be seen. India has restrained itself from 'punishing' Russia due to pressures from the West, and has also by-andlarge remained neutral to the anti-Hijab protests inside Iran since September 2022, hence, India has gained in its stature for both countries considered an-answer to US sanctions, but will the US be able to endure it? India through this move, will however, be able to placate Russia, if in case, things spill-out between China and India. However, in this new built scenario Iran is likely to get benefitted which is one of the worst bête noir of the US. Will the US not try to make India follow its line on Iran? These are the questions which are still in uncertain waters.

Iran has openly supplied its drones to Russia against Ukraine, inviting an ire from US, and now Iran has announced that it would import 9 million cu. meters of Russian natural gas a day through Azerbaijan. Iran's national oil company and state-owned Russian energy giant Gazprom (have) signed a memorandum

of understanding on energy cooperation last year worth \$40 billion. A key issue will be winning over New Delhi, a strategically important player for the democratic camp in dealing with Russia and China. Iran's Chabahar Port in its south would connect India with the rest of the corridor. Tehran and Moscow argue that the route would benefit New Delhi politically and economically. It would open up the possibility of more trade with resource-rich Central Asia through Iran, as well as further India's goal of developing alternatives to the Belt and Road (BRI)link between China and the Pakistani port of Gwadar that New Delhi has opposed,' elaborates the Asia.Nikkei report.

India and US have both been against China's BRI project, from the day-one, but given this new developing situation, where India is also to cater to its large populace, such trade corridor with Russia and Iran, will help make India reach to the outside world i.e. Central Asian republics etc more openly, irrespective of US reservations. Moreover, this will also help India to make Russia remain 'neutral' if China and India are to be at war. Here the US is slated to help India, but will then Russia also remain neutral, particularly when China has remained supportive of Russia throughout the last 11 months of war against Ukraine. In fact Russia has in the past one year become the highest exporter of its oil to China and both the countries have started to trade in Rouble and Yuan, in order to De-Dollarize their economies!

How New Delhi is going to respond to this effort to relocate supply-chains is yet to be seen. India has restrained itself from 'punishing' Russia due to pressures from the West, and has also by-and-large remained neutral to the anti-Hijab protests inside Iran since September 2022, hence, India has gained in its stature for both countries. Russia is all likely to go ahead with its exports to reach Asia nations via Iran, will India also make use of Iran to reach the Asian market as well as to Central Asian nations, is all yet to unfold. Will the US make it happen under its nose? Will India step up to take the cudgels despite the US is all to be seen. However, for geo-political and economic wizards India is now on a threshold of new vistas of economic avenues. Let's see what happens next.

Inequality Hits Davos

One particularly urgent step must be the elimination of tax havens. By allowing superwealthy corporations and individuals to avoid paying their fair share of taxes, tax havens are denying governments revenue that could and should be spent on schools, health care, and other essential services Sixty-two. That is how many of the world's wealthiest people own as much as the poorest 3.6 billion, down from 388 people in 2010. This shocking figure has made the rounds at this week's annual meeting of the World Economic Forum (WEF) in Davos, as political and business leaders debate how to improve the state of the global economy. The question is whether the global elite attending Davos will take action to combat damagingly high (and growing) economic inequality.3

World leaders have been worried about the rise in inequality for several years now; last September, they agreed to a Global Goal to reduce it. Yet the gap between the richest and the rest has continued to grow. This time last year, Oxfam predicted that the wealth of the top 1% would overtake that of the rest of the population by 2016; that milestone was reached two months ahead of schedule.

The longer we wait to take action, the more serious the consequences will be. Economic inequality is a corrosive force that undermines economic growth, hampers the fight against poverty, and sparks social unrest. In 2012, the WEF's global risk report highlighted severe income inequality as the single greatest threat to social and political stability. Oxfam estimates that, without strong efforts to tackle inequality, the much-heralded goal of eradicating extreme poverty by 2030 will be impossible to reach.1

The very real damage inequality does to people's lives is evident across the globe. For example, garment workers in Myanmar told Oxfam that, even with overtime, they could not afford housing, food, and medicine. At the other end of the retail chain, the CEO's of the clothing companies enjoy multimillion-dollar pay deals.

As World Bank President Jim Yong Kim noted last year, wealth is not trickling down; it is being sucked up by a powerful – and very small – minority. And this is not a blip; it is hard-wired into our economies. Today's global inequality crisis is the result of 30 years of unchecked deregulation, privatization, financial secrecy, and globalization.1



Large companies and wealthy individuals use their power and influence to capture and retain an ever-increasing share of the benefits of economic growth, while the poorest get by on a persistently shrinking piece of the pie. Over the last five years, the wealth of those richest 62 people on the planet has increased by a staggering \$542 billion, or 44%, while the poorest 3.6 billion people have lost over a trillion dollars, or 41% of their wealth.

In this context, tackling inequality will require fundamental changes to the way we manage our economies. Action must be taken to ensure that all workers receive a living wage; more progressive tax systems must be introduced; governments must increase spending on public services; policymaking must be more transparent; and financial regulations must be strengthened.

One particularly urgent step must be the elimination of tax havens. By allowing superwealthy corporations and individuals to avoid paying their fair share of taxes, tax havens are denying governments revenue that could and should be spent on schools, health care, and other essential services. Almost a third of all African financial wealth – a total of \$500 billion – was held offshore in tax havens in 2014, costing African countries an estimated \$14 billion per year in lost tax revenues. This is enough money to pay for health care that could save the lives of four million children on the continent and employ enough teachers to get every African child into school.1

G-20 governments agreed on steps to curb tax dodging by multinational companies last year. But these measures largely ignore the problems posed by tax havens, and do little to help poor countries claim their fair share of taxes. With tax havens becoming an ever more common way of doing business – 109 of the WEF's 118 partners have a presence in at least one tax haven – it's time to put a stop to this practice.

That is why I am pressing political leaders, CEOs, and other participants at Davos this year to act. I'm asking wealthy individuals and business leaders to commit to bringing their money back onshore, and I will urge politicians to work together to agree on a robust new global approach to end the era of tax havens.

After years of talk about income inequality, the WEF's annual meeting should be a moment for action. Participants must recognize that helping the poorest get a foot on the ladder also means stopping the extremely wealthy from pulling it up behind them. If the men and women in Davos take strong action to address tax havens, 2016 can be a turning point, when we begin to create a new global economy that works for the majority – not just the top 62.

SOME TRUTHS ABOUT ISLAM IN INDIA GHAZALA WAHAB

As India confronts the demons of communal discord and watches in horror the distorted reinvention of its timehonoured traditions, Ghazala Wahab's *Born a Muslim* will help us understand the full dimensions of the catastrophe. —Talmiz Ahmad

🗖 hazala. Wahah starts her book 'Born a Muslim:Some Truths about JIslam in India' with a striking proposition: "Is it not possible to be Muslim and forward looking at the same time?" In her book, she probes into the fears and insecurities which confront Indian Muslims and comes up with a two fold analysis that explains the pathology of this fear and the concomitant underdevelopment that India's largest minority has faced since partition. In a searing forty two-page-long introduction, she lays bare an archetype and a path that the reader would undertake in the next 8 chapters of her book. The point of departure in her narrative is the assumption that for 'Indian Muslims' the source of their understanding of Islam does not come from a rational and an educated study of their religion but is rather handed down to them in their families and later concretised by semiliterate mullahs operating from single room madrassas. In a bid to reconcile with the changing realities of a 21st century world, a template that is set in the 7th century often misses the mark. By misunderstanding the rationality of their faith 'Indian Muslims' tend to prioritize afterlife by paying a hefty cost of backwardness and underdevelopment in the present world. She talks of a double edged sword that a moderate and a progressive muslim has to face in such a socio-political set up. tions of Islam and aspires towards bettering his lot in the present world. On the other, he cowers and shrinks under the threat of being ostracized by the relatively conservative society he lives in.

Gazala Wahab delineates the factors that have been central in the depredation of Indian Muslims from the past 70 years and the most pivotal among them has been the partition of India. She cites a pathbreaking paper written by Prashant Bhardwaj, Asim Khawaja, and Atif Mian for Yale university which suggests that

The reason that she cites is their disdain towards secular and modern education. the outflow of a creamy layer of Muslims to Pakistan and the inflow of a well to do population of Hindus and Sikhs to India had a huge impact on the literacy rate of Muslims in India. The best had migrated and what had remained was a poor lot, disadvantaged both socially, politically and economically. It's these Muslims who had to start from zero and rise up the socio-economic ladder in India which they did to some extent but still fumble on this upward march of theirs.

Apart from many external factors responsible for this downfall, Gazala Wahab also rests the blame with the community itself. She talks of Wajahat Habibullah's doctrine of 'Perception of Exclusion' among Indian Muslims and explains the existence of an inertia and reluctance in the community itself to even try and claim their space in a competitive socio-political milieu.

The author cites Hamid Ansari, the ex-vice president of India, who has argued along the same lines and said, "Of course there is prejudice, but despite that the Indian system has room for people to find their own place, provided you go out and claim it. If you start with the conviction that you wont get a fair deal, you will not get it."

Many Muslims, she says, make it as an excuse to not make an effort although the real reason for their lack of success might lie elsewhere.In her section on the evolution of Islam in India, Ghazala Wahab tracks a trajectory of the religion that was completely alien to India and how it got assimilated in the country with the coming of Mohammad Bin Qasim, a commander of the Umayyad Caliphate in early 8th century to the later and much established empire of Mughals that was deeply rooted in the cultural ethos of this country. Mughal emperors, she says, never went for Hajj and instead patronized the Sufi shrines, and the sufis in turn accorded spiritual and moral legitimacy to the emperors.

In the later part of the book, she talks about the different schools of Islamic thought that pervade the length and breadth of the country. She examines how these divergent interpretations of the same religion have had tremendous consequences on moderate muslims of the country who somehow want to get on with their lives. Of all the minorities living in India, Muslims, says the author have been the least capable of availing governmental ameliorative schemes and scholarships. The level of education among muslims is the poorest in the country in proportion to their population. The reason that she cites is their disdain towards secular and modern education. Non-Islamic education has not attracted the community much and in the case of women it has been even a sorry affair. The women are generally expected to be only Quran literate and any exposure of theirs to modern education is considered to be rebellious.

Knitting together a wide range of scholarship, reportage, interviews and her personal accounts, the author entirely humanizes the account and gives to the readers a panoramic view of the predicament of Muslims in India. By examining and analyzing all these issues in depth she paints an extraordinarily compelling portrait of one of the largest and the most diverse communities in India.

High BMI May Metabolise Vitamin D Differently, Could Diminish Supplement Effects: Study

Scientists have uncovered new evidence that vitamin D may be metabolised differently in people with an elevated body mass index (BMI), diminishing the impact of supplementation in such individuals, according to a new study.

The study, by researchers from Brigham and Women's Hospital, US, is a new analysis of data from the VITAL trial, a large nationwide clinical trial led by Brigham researchers that investigated whether taking vitamin D or marine omega-3 supplements could reduce the risk of developing cancer, heart disease, or stroke, it said.

"The analysis of the original VITAL data found that vitamin D supplementation correlated with positive effects on several health outcomes, but only among people with a BMI under 25," said first author Deirdre K. Tobias.

"There seems to be something differ-

ent happening with vitamin D metabolism at higher body weights, and this study may help explain diminished outcomes of supplementation for individuals with an elevated BMI," said Tobias.

The study appears in the Journal of American Medical Association (JAMA) Network Open.

Vitamin D is an essential nutrient involved in many biological processes, most notably helping our body absorb minerals, such as calcium and magnesium.

While some of the vitamin D we need is made in the body from sunlight, vitamin D deficiencies are often treated with supplementation. Evidence from laboratory studies, epidemiologic research and clinical research has also suggested that vitamin D may play a role in the incidence and progression of cancer and cardiovascular disease, and it was this evidence that prompted the original VITAL trial, the study said.

The VITAL trial was a randomized, double-blind, placebo-controlled trial in



25,871 U.S. participants, which included men over the age of 50 and women over the age of 55. All participants were free of cancer and cardiovascular disease at the time of enrolment, the study said.

While the trial found little benefit of vitamin D supplementation for preventing cancer, heart attack, or stroke in the overall cohort, there was a statistical correlation between BMI and cancer incidence, cancer mortality, and autoimmune disease incidence, the study said.

Other studies suggest similar results for type 2 diabetes.

The new study aimed to investigate this correlation.

The researchers analyzed data from 16,515 participants from the original trial who provided blood samples at baseline (before randomization to vitamin D), as well as 2,742 with a follow-up blood sample taken after two years, the study said.

The researchers measured the levels of total and free vitamin D, as well as many other novel biomarkers for vitamin D, such as its metabolites, calcium, and parathyroid hormone, which helps the body utilize vitamin D, the study said.

"Most studies like this focus on the total vitamin D blood level," said senior author JoAnn E. Manson.

The researchers found that vitamin D supplementation increased most of the biomarkers associated with vitamin D metabo

lism in people, regardless of their weight. However, these increases were significantly smaller in people with elevated BMIs.

"We observed striking differences after two years, indicating a blunted response to vitamin D supplementation with higher BMI," said Tobias.

"This may have implications clinically and potentially explain some of the observed differences in the effectiveness of vitamin D supplementation by obesity status," said Tobias.

"This study sheds light on why we're seeing 30-40 per cent reductions in cancer deaths, autoimmune diseases, and other outcomes with vitamin D supplementation among those with lower BMIs but minimal benefit in those with higher BMIs, suggesting it may be possible to achieve benefits across the population with a more personalized dosing of vitamin D," said Manson.

"These nuances make it clear that there's more to the vitamin D story," said Manson.

Study Reveals Key Reason Behind Spread Of Fake News On Social Media

SC researchers may have found the biggest influencer in the spread of fake news: social platforms' structure of rewarding users for habitually sharing information.

The team's findings, published Tuesday by Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences, upend popular misconceptions that misinformation spreads because users lack the critical thinking skills necessary for discerning truth from falsehood or because their strong political beliefs skew their judgment.

Just 15 per cent of the most habitual news sharers in the research were responsible for spreading about 30 per cent to 40 per cent of the fake news.

The research team from the USC Marshall School of Business and the USC Dornsife College of Letters, Arts and Sciences wondered: What motivates these users? As it turns out, much like any video game, social media has a rewards system that encourages users to stay on their accounts and keep posting and sharing. Users who post and share frequently, especially sensational, eye-catching information, are likely to attract attention.

"Due to the reward-based learning systems on social media, users form habits of sharing information that gets recognition from others,' the researchers wrote. "Once habits form, information sharing is automatically activated by cues on the platform without users considering critical response outcomes, such as spreading misinformation." Posting, sharing and engaging with others on social media can, therefore, become a habit. "Our findings show that misinformation isn't spread through a deficit of users. It's really a function of the structure of the social media sites themselves," said Wendy Wood, an expert on habits and USC emerita Provost Professor of psychology and business. "The habits of social media users are a bigger driver of misinformation spread than individual attributes. We know from prior research that some people don't process information critically, and others form opinions based on political biases, which also affects their ability to recognize false stories online," said Gizem Ceylan, who led the study during her doctorate at USC Marshall and is now a postdoctoral researcher at the Yale School of Management. "However, we show that the reward structure of social media platforms plays a bigger role when it comes to misinformation spread." In a novel approach. Cevlan and her co-authors sought to understand how the reward structure of social media sites drives users to develop habits of posting misinformation on social media. Why fake news spreads: behind the social network Overall, the study involved 2,476 active Facebook users ranging in age from 18 to 89 who volunteered in response to online advertising to participate. They were compensated to complete a "decision-making" survey approximately seven minutes long. Surprisingly, the researchers found that users' social media habits doubled and, in some cases, tripled the amount of fake news they shared. Their habits were more influential in sharing fake news than other factors, including political beliefs and lack of critical reasoning.

Pee-Gate: Air India Fined 30 Lakhs, Pilot's **Licence Suspended**

NEW DELHI: Aviation regulator DGCA on Friday imposed a penalty of Rs 30 lakh on Air India as well as suspended the license of the pilot-in-command of the New York-Delhi flight in which a person allegedly urinated on a female co-passenger.

In the incident, which happened on November 26, 2022, the watchdog has also slapped a fine of Rs 3 lakh on Air India's Director of in-flight services for failing to discharge her duties.

The enforcement actions for violation of applicable norms come nearly two months after the incident, which came to the notice of the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) only on January 4.

This is also the first time that DGCA has penalised an airline for unruly passenger behaviour onboard a flight. In a statement, an Air India spokesperson said it is in receipt of the DGCA order and studying it.

"We respectfully acknowl-edge the gaps in our reporting and are taking relevant steps to ensure that the same are addressed. We are also strength-

ening our crews' awareness of and compliance with policies on the handling of incidents involving unruly passengers," the airline spokesperson said.

On Thursday, Air India had imposed a four-month flying ban on Mishra, who is in jail now. Earlier, the airline had barred him from flying for 30 days.

In its statement on Friday, the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) said enforcement actions have been taken in the incident, which came to the notice of the regulator on January 4. The watchdog had issued show cause notices to Air India's Accountable Manager, Director in-flight services, all the pilots and cabin crew members of that flight as to why enforcement action should not be taken against them for dereliction of their regulatory obligations.

DGCA examined the written replies of Air India and the personnel involved and decided on the enforcement actions.

A "financial penalty of Rs 30,00,000 has been imposed on Air India for violation of applicable DGCA Civil Aviation Requirements (CAR)," the regulator said.

Retail Inflation For Rural Workers Eases 6.6% In Dec

NEW DELHI: Retail inflation for farm and rural workers sequentially eased to 6.38 per cent and 6.6 per cent, respectively, in December 2022, mainly due to lower prices of certain food items.

"Point-to-point rate of inflation based on the CPI-AL (consumer price index for agricultural workers) and CPI-RL (rural workers) stood at 6.38 per cent & 6.60 per cent in December 2022 compared to 6.87 per cent & 6.99 per cent, respectively, in November 2022, and 4.78 per cent and 5.03 per cent, respectively, during the corresponding month (December 2021) of the previous year," a labour ministry statement said.

Similarly, it stated that food inflation stood at 5.89 per cent and 5.76 per cent in December 2022 compared to 6.19 per cent and 6.05 per cent, respectively, in November 2022. It was 2.99 per cent and 3.17 per cent, respectively, during the corresponding month of the previous year.

The all-India Consumer Price Index Number for Agricultural Labourers for December 2022 remained stationary at 1,167 points and for rural labourers increased by 1 point to stand at 1,179.

The CPI-AL was at 1,167 points in November 2022, while CPI-RL was at 1,178 points in the previous month. **PTI**

EPFO Adds 16.26 Lakh Net Subscribers In Nov, 2022

NEW DELHI: Retirement fund body EPFO added 16.26 lakh subscribers on a net basis in November 2022, which is 16.5 per cent higher compared to a year ago, the labour ministry said on Friday.

The provisional payroll data of Employees' Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) released on Friday by the ministry highlighted that the EPFO has added 16.26 lakh net members in the month of November 2022.

The data indicate a 25.67 per cent increase in net additions compared to the previous month in October 2022, a labour ministry statement said. Of the total 16.26 lakh members added during the month, around 8.99 lakh new members came under the ambit of EPFO for the first time thus, showing that new members joining EPFO has increased by 1.71 lakh, from 7.28 lakh in October 2022.

Among the new members, the highest enrolment is registered in the age-group of 18-21 years with 2.77 lakh members, followed by age-group of 22-25 years with 2.32 lakh members.

The age group of 18-25 years constitutes 56.60 per cent of the total of new members during the month. This shows that first-time job seekers are largely joining the organised sector workforce of the country. PTI

Rupee Gains 19 Paise To Close At 81.17 Against US Dollar

MUMBAI: The rupee appreciated by 19 paise to close at 81.17 against the US dollar on Friday on broad dollar weakness.

HC Raps CBI For 'Casual' Arrest Of Dhoot In Loan Case, Grants Him Bail; Bizman Walks Out Of Jail

Mumbai: The ground cited by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to arrest Videocon Group founder Venugopal Dhoot in a loan fraud case was "quite casual and without any substance", ruled the Bombay High Court on Friday as it granted interim bail to him, days after his two co-accused got similar relief.

Stating that an investigating officer cannot arrest an accused as per his "whims and fancies", the HC also rapped the special court - which had earlier rejected Dhoot's plea for release from jail - saying it did not make any "serious efforts" to scrutinise the (CBI) remand application as well as the case diary.

A division bench of Justices Revati Mohite Dere and P K Chavan noted there has been a calculated move by the CBI to "concoct non-attendance and non-cooperation" in the probe by Dhoot, but in face the material placed before the court demonstrated Dhoot's diligence and bona-fide.

Dhoot, arrested in the

Videocon-ICICI Bank loan fraud case on December 26, 2022, walked out of central Mumbai's j Arthur Road Jail, where he was lodged under judicial custody, in the evening, hours after securing interim bail.

This is the second time the CBI has received flak from the HC in the high-profile case. The same bench had on January 9, while granting interim bail to co-accused Chanda Kochhar, former MD and CEO of ICICI bank, and her businessmanhusband Deepak Kochhar - had come down heavily on the premier probe agency for arresting the couple in a "casual and mechanical manner and without application of mind".

The bench granted interim bail to Dhoot on a surety of Rs one lakh. It permitted the 71-year-old businessman to furnish cash bail and deposit the surety amount two weeks thereafter. The order was passed on a pe-

tition filed by Dhoot seeking interim bail and to quash the CBI FIR (first information report). The HC would hear on February 6 the petition on the main issue

of quashing the FIR.

The bench, in its 48-page judgment, said arrest is not mandatory in each and every case, and added that in the present case the ground of arrest mentioned by the CBI was "quite casual and without any substance".

"The investigating officer cannot arrest the accused at his whims and fancies. Noncompliance of section 41 of the CrPC (Code of Criminal Procedure) is apparent," the court said.

Section 41 of the CrPC mandates a police officer to first issue a notice to an accused for questioning and to make arrest only when the custody of the accused is necessary. The HC noted in the present

case, the CBI had issued summons to Dhoot and in two such instances, the summonses were sent to someone else or pasted on the wall of Dhoot's former office building. "Prima facie, this seems to be

nothing but a calculated move by the CBI to concoct non-attendance and non-cooperation by the petitioner," the HC said. It added that despite all this, Dhoot wrote emails to the CBI in response to the summonses issued.

"The diligence and bona-fide of the petitioner (Dhoot) can be demonstrated from the email. From the language of the email, it appears that the petitioner had already handed over all the documents and co-operated with the investigating agency by appearing in its office on several occasions despite his deteriorating health," the HC noted.

The court refused to accept the CBI's arguments that Dhoot intentionally did not appear to avoid confrontation with the co-accused in the case - Chanda Kochhar and Deepak Kochhar and said this argument is to be "accepted with a pinch of salt."

"There is no satisfactory answer from the investigating agency as to why for a period of three years, it has neither confronted all the accused before one another or demonstrated the progress of the investigation," the HC said.

The court noted that the grounds of arrest mentioned by the CBI in the arrest memo is without any particulars as to

how Dhoot's statements were inconsistent and how he had not co-operated with the investigating agency.

ing agency. The high court further held that even the special CBI court, while remanding the accused (in the CBI custody), has not adhered to the provisions of law.

"Merely mentioning in the arrest memo that the petitioner (Dhoot) has been inconsistent in his statements and has kept on changing his versions and has not co-operated with the investigation in disclosing full and true facts, is not sufficient and the same cannot be a ground of arrest as it is unacceptable," the HC said in its judgment.

It added that merely because an accused does not confess does not "ipso facto" (by the fact itself) mean that the accused is not co-operating with the investigation.

The court also dismissed an application filed by an advocate seeking to intervene in the matter and for the bench to recall its earlier order granting bail to the Kochhars. The bench imposed a cost of Rs 25,000 on the advocate.

Kashmir's Cricket Bat Industry Stares Into Oblivion Amid Growing Willow Cleft Shortage

SRINAGAR: The 102-year-old cricket bat industry in Kashmir has upped its standards over the years to compete with manufacturers that work with the fabled English willow. But bat-makers fear a shortage of clefts might force closure of the ₹300-crore enterprise that provides livelihood to over 1,00,000 people.

"We have been manufacturing cricket bats for the past 102 years. The quality of our bats is good and approved by the International Cricket Council (ICC). So quality-wise, we are not lacking. We are at par with (manufacturers that use) English willow, if not better," Fawzul Kabir, spokesperson for Cricket Bats Manufacturing Association of Kashmir.

"This was evident from the fact that the longest six in the recent ICC Men's T20 World Cup in Australia was hit using a Kashmir willow bat," Kabir told PTI.

The UAE's Junaid Siddique hit the 2022 ICC Men's T20 World Cup's longest six against Sri Lanka using a bat manufactured by Anantnagbased GR8 Sports.

However, the 400-odd bat manufacturing units are staring at an uncertain future as they fear a shortage of willow clefts might force



their factories to close within five years. "Willow produce is dwindling fast and we fear that it might become extinct within the next five years. We have been requesting the government to go for a willow plan-

Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology provided them 1,500 willow saplings last year for replacement, each unit needs a supply of around 15,000 clefts a year. "As cricket is growing fast, the demand for bats will also increase. We had a dozen countries playing cricket two decades ago. Today, that

number has gone up to around 160." "Ten years ago, 2.5 lakh to 3 lakh bats were manufactured in Kashmir. These days, 30 lakh bats are made every year," he said, adding that the industry's annual turnover was over ₹300 crore.

Kabir suggested that the government should consider allowing sapling plantations in the wetlands and on the riverbanks where willow trees used to be grown earlier.

"If willow trees are planted in these places again, the bat industry can survive," he said.

GR8 Sports Production Manager Mohammad Niyaz said the government had taken steps for plantation of willow saplings but it was not at the scale required to support the industry.

"More and more cricket leagues are coming up around the world and the demand for bats is only going to increase. While the industry can provide employment to artisans, finished bats can keep youngsters involved in sports and away from evils such as drug abuse," he added. An Industries and Commerce Department official said while there was no dearth of willow in Kashmir. the main issue facing the units was a lack of modern seasoning technology and smuggling of clefts to factories outside Kashmir. "In Kashmir, seasoning of clefts is still done in the traditional way and it can take anywhere between six months to a year. It blocks precious capital of the unit holder and puts strain on his financial situation. This has, in some cases, led to the closure of a unit," the official, who is not authorised to speak to the media, said on the condition of anonymity.

The official said a proposal to set up a seasoning plant was approved a few years ago but was shelved due to the outbreak of COVID-19. "A new proposal to set up an electric or solar plant that will reduce the seasoning time to just 15 days is under consideration of senior officials," he added. Steps had to be taken to curb cleft smuggling from the Valley to factories in other parts of country, mainly in Punjab and Uttar Pradesh, the official said.

He said land measuring 20 hect-ares had been earmarked to growing willow trees that have been developed by scientists at Sher-e-Kashmir University of Agricultural Sciences and Technology.

Dani Alves Jailed In Spain For Alleged Sexual Assault

BARCELONA: Brazilian soccer player Dani Alves was arrested Friday after being accused of sexually assaulting a woman in Spain and a judge later denied bail for the former Barcelona defender. The alleged assault took

place on Dec. 31 at a night club in Barcelona, police told The Associated Press.

Alves was taken into custody after he answered a police summons. State prosecutors had asked for him to be held without bail, and a judge agreed after charging him with sexual assault following several hours

of testimony. A charge of sexual assault in Spain can mean anything from unsolicited and unwanted sexual groping to rape. Police said they could not give any details on the case.

Alves denied the allegations last week in a video he sent to Spanish television channel Antena 3. While acknowledging he had been at the club, he said he did not know the woman and added "I have never invaded the personal space of anyone."

The 39-year-old Alves is one soccer's most successful players, winning major titles with several elite clubs, including Barcelona, Juventus and Paris Saint-Germain, over his long career. He currently plays for Mexican club Pumas.

The defender was a key part of Barcelona's golden years playing between 2008-16 on the team's right flank behind Lionel Messi. He won the Champions League three times with the Catalan club, which he briefly rejoined last season.

Chennai: Tamil Nadu BJP President K Annamalai has defended party colleague Tejasvi Surya, facing flak over the Indigo Airline emergency exit issue, saying the incident involving the Bengaluru South MP was "accidental" and "by mistake." Though it was accidental, Mr Surya wanted to "set an example" and explained to the other passengers on what happened, as he was an MP, Mr Annamalai told reporters here late on Thursday.

Mr Surya has come under criticism from the Congress over the incident, which happened on December 10 last year at the Chennai airport where he opened the emergency exit of a Tiruchirappally-bound IndiGo plane and apologised for it. Mr Surya was seated near him

that day, Mr Annamalai recalled, adding he was adjusting the airconditioner vent and also constantly getting up as some fellow passengers came over to meet them, with a few clicking selfies.

The BJP youth wing leader then told Mr Annamalai to take a look at the emergency exit saying it was "slightly open", following which the matter was reported to the crew which in turn summoned the engineer to inspect, the state BJP leader said. After the technical inspection, the cabin was pressurised again and the Indigo personnel got an incident report form from Mr Surva, Mr Annamalai said.

Since many passengers from an earlier flight that was cancelled were accommodated in this one and had already suffered delay, Mr Surya explained to them what happened "though he was not the reason" for the delay of the aircraft in contention, Mr Annamalai said.

This was to "set an example" as he was an MP and in public service, the former IPS officer said.

"Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya scindia has said clearly that the door opened accidentally. Tejasvi apologised for the incovenience...the DGCA and Indigo have said the same thing," Mr Annamalai said referring to their statements.
