'Structure Of 'Live' Virus Successfully Reconstructed, Could Help Reduce Threat Of Anti-Bacterial Resistance In Humans'

researcher has created the first ever computer reconstruction of a virus, including its complete na-Live genome, according to a study. Although other researchers have created similar reconstructions, this is the first to replicate the exact chemical and 3D structure of a 'live' virus, the study said.


The breakthrough by Dmitry Nerukh. from the Department of Mathematics at Aston University, UK, could lead the way to research into an alternative to antibiotics, reducing the threat of anti-bacterial resistance.

The study is published in the journal Faraday Discussions.

According to the study, the research was conducted using existing data of virus structures measured via cryo-Electron Microscopy (cryo-EM), and computational modelling which took almost three years despite using supercomputers in the UK and Japan.

The breakthrough will open the way

for biologists to investigate biological processes which cannot currently be fully examined because the genome is missing in



the virus model, the study said.

This includes finding out how a bacteriophage, which is a type of virus that infects bacteria, kills a specific diseasecausing bacterium, the study said.

At the moment it is not known how this happens, but this new method of creating more accurate models will open up further research into using bacteriophage to kill specific life-threatening bacteria,

the study said.

This could lead to more targeted treatment of illnesses which are currently treated by antibiotics, and therefore help to tackle the increasing threat to humans of antibiotic resistance, the study said.

"Up till now no one else had been able to build a native genome model of an entire virus at such detailed (atomistic) level," said Nerukh.

The ability to study the genome within a virus more clearly is incredibly important. Without the genome it has been impossible to know exactly how a bacteriophage infects a bacterium," said Nerukh.

"This development will now allow help virologists answer questions which previously they couldn't answer," said Nerukh.

This could lead to targeted treatments to kill bacteria which are dangerous to humans, and to reduce the global problem of antibiotic-resistant bacteria which are over time becoming more and more serious," said Nerukh.

DC Reviews Progress Of Works Under JJM

Srinagar: To review the progress of water supply projects taken up under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) to ensure all the household in the district have access to safe and adequate drinking water facilities, the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz Asad Saturday chaired a meeting of concerned Officers at the Conference Hall of DC Office Complex, here.

At the outset, the DC took a detailed review of the physical and financial progress of works on Aparpora and Poshpathri Water Supply Schemes (WSSs) being implemented under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) in Khonmoh block of the district.

While majority of the works have been completed under JJM, DC reviewed the progress of balance undergoing works at few places.

With regard to execution of work on Aparpora Water Supply Scheme being executed at a cost of Rs 3.93 crore, the DC was apprised that pace of work on the project is in full swing and as many as 306 households in habitations of Rather Mohalla, Dar Mohalla, Waripora, Bhat Mohalla, Mir Mohalla, Kokerpora, Joo Mohalla and Ganji Mohalla are being covered under the project in order to provide safe and adequate drinking water.

On the occasion, the DC stressed the concerned Engineers to complete the process of groundwater works allotment by the end of January and start physical work by 15th of February to make the project operational by March 15, 2023 in order to benefit about 2000 souls in the area.

Similarly, the DC was also given first hand appraisal about status and execution of work on Poshpathri water supply scheme being carried out at a cost of Rs 2 crore.

The DC was informed that Poshpathri WSS is also nearing completion and will benefit 23 households comprising 208 souls under JJM in Poshpathri and Ramzan Mohalla habitations.

The DC asked the concerned Officers and Engineers to accelerate the pace of all works to ensure their time bound completion. He also exhorted the officers to put in coordinated efforts to achieve the target so that people are benefited from the schemes.

Meanwhile, the DC took a review of progress achieved with regard to set parameters and indicators under Jal Jeevan Survekshan (JJS) including Har Ghar Jal certification by Gram Sabhas, Water Quality Testing/Monitoring & Surveillance and Institutional Arrangements. He also took a firsthand appraisal of water quality testing at HHS and PWS source, besides training imparted to women for FTK testing for a sustained surveillance on quality of water by the community itself.

The DC asked them to complete skill training/ programmes of the resources including members of Panchayat Raj Institutions through proper handholding. He also laid emphasis on encouraging the local communities to take over the rural water supply system for operation & maintenance.

The DC further asked the concerned Officer to work with added zeal and determination to ensure all pivotal criteria for evaluation of performance in JJS-2023 is maintained to achieve top position in the country un-

Prices Of Fruits Skyrocket In City Markets

Srinagar: While the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs department (FCS&CA) department is actively taking action against the mutton dealers for not adhering to the government fixed rates, the exorbitant rates of fruits here have pushed the people to the wall as the authorities concerned have failed to check the market rates of fruits and other eatables, leaving the consumers to lurch at large

The consumers from Srinagar are lamenting the concerned department's inaction for not ensuring the implementation of set rates on fruits, saving that skyrocketing prices are beyond the reach of a common man.

'Not just the healthy people, the fruits are also meant for most of the patients at homes or at hospitals, but given the high prices of fruits, purchase has become very difficult for a common man," said a group of aggrieved people in Srinagar.

People say that to afford fruits for an average family has become beyond the reach, and that the government announced fruit rates exist only in papers.

Questioning the high prices of fruits, Mohammad Ramzan, a Carpenter by profession said, "If Srinagar-Jammu national highway continues to remain open for vehicular movement for the maximum time this winter, then why the rates of essentials especially the fruits have increased suddenly.

In retail markets, oranges are sold at as high as Rs 250 per dozen, while Pomegranates are sold at a Kilo from Rs 150 to 250, Bananas are sold at the rate of 100 per dozen, and the price of grapes ranges from 150 to 300 per Kilo.Similarly, there are other fruits that are sold in the market at exorbitant rates, making it difficult for common man to purchase.

According to the latest rates issued by the department of Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs department on 29 December 2022 on their website, the price per Kg of pomegranate is Rs 150 a Kg while the rate of green grapes is set as Rs 120 a Kg and that of Red Grapes rate is set as Rs 270. Similarly, the rate for first-grade oranges is set at Rs 130 and the rate for second-grade oranges is fixed at

"It is very difficult for me to buy a kilo of Pomegranate or oranges as the price of the fruits is out of reach for me. It is not even easy to purchase other fruits easily as the prices are so high," said Nazir Ahmad, a salesman.

"There is no enforcement of government rates as far as the sale of fruits is concerned in the retail market, a fruit seller makes no scope for any bargain, and says the fruit rates are higher from the Mandi," he said.

Responding to the reports Director of FCS&CA, Dr. Abdul Salam Mir said that their teams are already checking the rates in the market, however, he assured that they will intensify the inspection in the markets to curb illegal profiteering, if any.

"There are already teams constituted across the valley who regularly check the market rates of fruits and other commodities, but since this is coming to our notice, we will intensify the market checking and those who will be found selling fruits or other commodities at high rates, action will follow against them", he said—(KNO)

Govt Blocks Access To BBC Documentary On 2002 Gujarat Riots

NEW DELHI: The Centre has issued directions for blocking multiple YouTube videos and Twitter posts sharing links to the BBC documentary "India: The Modi Question", sources said. The directions were reportedly issued by Apurva Chandra, Secretary, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting on Friday using the emergency powers under the IT Rules, 2021. Sources said senior officials of several ministries, including external affairs, home affairs, and information and broadcasting, examined the documentary and found it to be an attempt to cast aspersions on the authority and credibility of the Supreme Court, sow divisions among various Indian communities, and make unsubstantiated allegations

regarding actions of foreign governments in India. They said the documentary was found to be undermining the sovereignty and integrity of India, and having the potential to adversely impact friendly relations with foreign states as also public order within the country.

Orders have also been issued to Twitter for blocking of over 50 tweets containing links of the YouTube videos concerned, they said, adding that social media platforms have complied with the directions.

Earlier, the Ministry of External Affairs had described the BBC documentary as a "propaganda piece" that lacked objectivity and reflected a colonial mindset. The two-part BBC documentary claims it investigated certain aspects relating to the 2002 Gujarat riots when Prime Minister Narendra Modi was the chief minister of the state.

"Let me just make it verv clear that we think this is a propaganda piece designed to push a particular discredited narrative. The bias, the lack of objectivity, and frankly a continuing colonial mindset, are blatantly visible," External Affairs Ministry spokesman Arindam Bagchi had said on Thursday responding to questions on the documentary.

On comments made by former British Foreign Secretary Jack Straw on the riots, Bagchi said he seemed to be referring to some internal report of the UK government.

"How do I have access to that? It is a 20-year-old report. Why would I just jump on it now? Just because Jack Straw says it, how do they lend it that much legitimacy?" he wondered.

SYDNEY: New Zealand's former COVID-19 response minister Chris Hipkins will replace Jacinda Ardern as prime minister after receiving the only nomination from fellow MPs, the ruling Labour Party said Saturday.

The 44-year-old senior politician must be formally backed by Labour members of parliament on Sunday to take over as the country's 41st prime minister, following Ardern's shock resignation on Thursday.

The police and education minister will lead his party's uphill battle to win general elections on October 14 as the party lags in opinion polls, criticised by opponents over rising

prices, poverty and crime rates. 'The Labour Party caucus will meet at 1pm on Sunday to endorse the nomination and confirm Chris Hipkins as Party Leader," said a statement by senior Labour Party member Dun-



can Webb.

As leader of the governing party, Hipkins will also become prime minister when Ardern steps down.

Ardern, a global figurehead for progressive politics, stunned New Zealand when announcing her abrupt exit from office, less than three years after securing a second term in a landslide election win.

The 42-year-old -- who steered the country through natural disasters, the Covid pandemic, and its worst-ever terror attack -- said she no longer had "enough in the tank".

Tough and capable Ardern said her decision to step down was "tinged with sadness" but after having made the announcement she had

"slept well for the first time in

a long time".

Political commentators have lined up to condemn the social media abuse that was increasingly directed at Ardern before her resignation.

Former New Zealand prime minister Helen Clark said Ardern had "faced a level of hatred and vitriol" that was "unprecedented in our country".

Her successor is widely seen as a safe pair of hands with more than 14 years in parliament.

Political commentator Josie Pagani has described Hipkins as "sensible, likeable, tough and capable". There was no immediate reaction to Hipkins' win from the country's main opposition National Party.

The right-wing ACT Party urged him to "deliver on substance instead of snowing New Zealand with spin", criticising his party's record on the number of welfare recipients, rising food prices and a tight labour market.

The Green Party said it looked

forward to working with him to "end poverty, take bold climate action and protect our native Hipkins' appointment also

quashed speculation that Justice Minister Kiri Allan, one of Labour's senior Maori MPs, might have become the country's first Maori prime minister. 'Incredibly strong'

But Allan praised Hipkins as decisive and said she believed he would be "an incredibly strong prime minister".

Hipkins won plaudits for his near two-year term as the Covid response minister in a country that shut down its borders to keep the coronavirus out, only fully reopening in August last year.

He conceded last year that people were fed up with the strict pandemic restrictions, describing the border closures as "tough going". Hipkins describes himself as an "outdoor enthusiast" keen on mountain biking, hiking and swimming.

UK PM Rishi Sunak Gets Fined By Police For Not Wearing Seatbelt

Anti-Encroachment Drive

Anantnag Admin Retrieves 4200 Kanals Of Land In 3 Days

ANANTNAG: The District Administration Anantnag has removed encroachment on more than 4200 kanals of state/ kahcharai land in the last three days, totaling more than 40000 kanals of land retrieved so far from encroachers in the district.

Speaking on the occasion, Deputy Commissioner (DC) Anantnag, Dr Basharat Qayoom said that encroached lands in various tehsils have been identified and the anti-encroachment drive shall continue in full force. He said that focus is on retrieving large chunks of encroached land which can subsequently be utilized for public purposes. He said that nearly 50% of the encroached land stands retrieved and another 50% will be retrieved soon.

Giving details, it was given out that in tehsil Anantnag nearly 1600 kanals of state land and 1550 kanals of Kahcharie land has been retrieved. Similarly, in tehsil Bijbehara, 2887 kanals of state land and nearly 1511 kanals of Kahcharie land have been retrieved till date. The teams of revenue officials, led by Tehsildars are continuously removing encroachments and the remaining encroachments will be re-

moved in the coming days. It is in place to mention that in the last two days, nearly 950 kanals of Kahcharie land and 500 kanals of state land have been retrieved in Anantnag sub In Pahalgam sub division,

nearly 7300 kanals of state land and around 4000 kanals of kahcharie land have been retrieved. In Kokernag sub division, more than 2100 kanals of state land and nearly 2000 kanals of Kahcharie land have been retrieved. In sub-division Dooru, 5500 kanals of state land and 5400 kanals of Kahcharie land have been retrieved from encroachers.

The DC appealed to people to cooperate with revenue officials removing encroachments. He said that directions have been passed to revenue teams to ensure that notice boards are displayed on retrieved lands. He said that he has also issued directions for initiating legal action against anybody obstructing the functionaries from performing their duties.

It is worth mentioning here to mention that 305 kanals in tehsil Pahalgam, 389 kanals in tehsil Bijbehara and 336 kanals in Tehsil Kokernag were removed in a single day.

"Ideological and political differences apart, he (Gandhi) will show his leadership qualities and will be a big challenge (for the ruling BJP in 2024 general elections). He will make a miracle," the Member of Parliament told reporters here.

Raut, who walked for nearly 13-km alongside Gandhi between Hatli Morh and Chandwal amid rain on Friday, said the BJP has spread a wrong notion about the Congress leader but this Yatra has busted all their myths about him.

"Why not?" he said when asked whether Gandhi is capable of becoming the prime minister of India. "Not everyone can walk from

Kanyakumari to Kashmir, covering a distance of over 3,500 kms. It needs a lot of determination and love for the country. He has shown his concern for the country and I do not see any politics in this Yatra," the Shiv Sena (Uddhav Balasaheb Thackeray) leader said.

However, he said Gandhi



himself has been saying that he is not willing to be the prime minister but "when people want to see him on the top post, he will be left with no choice".

Rejecting the idea of a third front without the Congress, Raut said the grand old party has a lot of weight and has presence in every nook and corner of the country. "No third front can be successful without Congress, this time it has a low number of MPs but the situation is going to change in 2024. Without the Congress, no front can be successful is a reality and this needs to be taken into account.'

"The main purpose of my visit to J and K was to join the Gandhi-led Yatra at the direction of my leader and I had a good experience walking alongside Gandhi. It is not a political Yatra," he said.

Raut, who reached here on January 19 and also visited protesting Kashmiri Pandit and Dogra employees seeking relocation from Kashmir over the past six months following the targeted killings, said he was surprised to find out that J-K is faced with the same issues which were discussed by him

over a decade ago. "Governments changed and so the politics but whether it is an issue of Kashmiri Pandits, refugees, law and order situation, security concerns of the people and terrorism, the questions are still same," he said, slamming the BJP for its "failure to turn Kashmir back into paradise" over the past eight years.

He said four years have passed but there is no assembly election even as Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government promised large scale investment, creation of jobs for unemployed and return and rehabilitation of Kashmiri Pandits.

About the party's strategy for the next assembly elections whenever held in J-K, Raut said his party is open to a grand alliance provided it gets a respectable place. "Otherwise, we will go for polls alone as J-K is full of public issues which have remained unresolved for years."

He said the BJP under Modi is a big party but "If you see barring a few states, it is dependent on other parties or divided its own coalition partners to stay in power."

400 KM Road Length **Macadamized In** Bandipora In 2 Years

The Fall of Research Culture

N the absence of platforms that channelise, highlight and vocalise their concerns, Kashmiris have taken to "democratic" online platforms to flag issues that concern them. Recently, on a Club House discussion on social science research in Kashmir, speakers were of the view that Kashmir, as a society, lacks research culture and hence Kashmiris are not producing good scholarship in social sciences. Only a handful of Kashmiri social science researchers have produced books and published in international journals, and many of them are based in American and European universities, and some in mainland India. One speaker, a PhD scholar based in Jamia Millia Islamia, was of the view that while these scholars have done a good job, they have not moved beyond the theme of the 'Kashmir conflict'. And even then, they have not built theories that could challenge the euro-centric paradigms and, more importantly, counter the statist theories/perspectives that some Indian scholars have propagated on the Kashmir situation. Another speaker, also a research scholar, raised an equally important issue: that Kashmiri researchers must remain cautious while publishing their findings because their research might end up being (mis) used. Consensus of the Club House room discus-

sants was that universities have the primary role and responsibility of coming up with socially relevant research that could serve as the guide for public policy and critique of the policies. How our universities have failed in their primary responsibilities were highlighted by citing how they did not care to respond to the economic crisis brought by the back-to-back lockdowns in Kashmir since August 2019. It was not publicly-funded institutions Kashmir University, IUST or CUK but a banker, Ejaz Ayoub, whose research helped the Kashmir Chamber of Commerce and Industries (KCCI) to come up with a loss assessment report in 2019 and 2020. Ayoub also wrote a series of articles on the state of Kashmir economy (between August 2020 and May 2021) for Kashmir Observer.

I think conversations like these, where constructive criticism is shared, are a must for things to improve. Because when we acknowledge a problem, that is the first crucial step towards the redressal of the problem. But while Kashmiri scholars in general understand and have tried to highlight where the problem lies as far as the social science research in Kashmir is concerned, those at the leadership positions have shied away from taking necessary measures. Those who have power to do something have sometimes tried to impose their own policies without consultation with the larger academic community. A senior academic once told me that a bureaucrat who was holding the charge of higher education asked them to implement the existing research



and bring out a monthly journal where all college lecturers would publish their latest research. What the bureaucrat did not understand was that things do not work that way in academia. How possibly can college academic staff implement the existing research? They don't have autonomy to even design the syllabus of the modules they are supposed to teach. They can hardly implement the academic calendar. Teaching load on academic staff (especially contractual college lecturers and assistant professors) is huge, and they can barely spare any time for a rigorous and time-consuming process of academic publication.

One speaker in the Club House discussion shared an interesting anecdote. He talked about how his friend (a historian by training) joined a university in Kashmir as an assistant professor but finding that he was not able to produce any research work in the university's suffocating environment he decided to leave the job. This tells us how the problem is actually systemic. Only when the system gets reformed can we expect better performance and results in social science research from individuals.

Yet, there is another issue. Once getting a permanent position in higher education, most assistant professors tend to take it easy. Job security leads to disinterest in research. It seems that once they become APs, they stop reading. That is to say

that they stop caring about research. But, is research a primary job of an AP? We cannot be sure, because we don't know what roles and responsibilities are delineated in the employment contract of an AP. In Europe or the US, when you join a university (whether tenure-track or contractual) you sign a contract which runs over several pages. There are different components in the contract which clearly spell out your duties and responsibilities. And, they usually balance between teaching and research, and some administrative work. But in Kashmir, things are different, rather unprofessionally run. Those who joined the Cluster University Srinagar in 2020 as contractual lecturers were not even asked to sign the contract. They were in limbo. Can we expect them to know what they were supposed to do except for being an 'academic arrangement?' (a rather denigrating term). An employee usually molds himself/herself into the culture of a workplace to fit in. That culture will determine how the employee will behave. If the culture of a workplace is bereft of work ethic, can we expect the employees to be any different?

022 has been an awfully eventful year for Britain. It witnessed the death of its longest serving monarch, the departure of its shortest serving prime minister, the election of its first non-white premier and the onset of the worst economic crisis it faced in over four decades. Clearly, an 'Annus Horribilis' on all fronts - po-

litically, economically and even culturally.

After Boris Johnson and Liz Truss faced the music of the post-COVID aftershock, Rishi Sunak took over, promising to turn things around for the better.

However, what lies ahead for him are two herculean tasks - stabilize a broken economy and unite the most factionalized political party in the UK. But can a rich, Oxford-educated, traditionalist handle such an ultra-sophisticated political task is the question that concerns many.

There is no doubting Sunak's credentials as a minister. He has a great resume, a robust background in finance and a great understanding of the British Economy. One would even assume he is the perfect person for the job, given the economic turbulence UK is under right now. But when you are the third prime minister to take charge in seven weeks, it is only natural that your confidence takes a bit of a nosedive.

Sunak's judgement and leadership had already fallen under the scanner when he appointed Sir Gavin Williamson as a Cabinet Office Minister in October.

Williamson has the dubious history of being expelled twice from the cabinet - once in 2019 following reports that he had leaked sensitive information and then in 2021, due to inappropriate handling of exams during COVID-19.

His selection for a third time raised eyebrows among many, but quite predictably, Williamson fell into another controversy in a week's time and had to abruptly resign in November; exposing Sunak's weak judgement and decision-making skills.

But an error in judgement isn't the only sticky situation he is facing right now.

Inflation:

With the world still enduring the after-effects of COVID-19 and the Russia-Ukraine war, several nations are experiencing an inflationary drift, Sadly. Britain has been one of the hardest hit, with rates exceeding 11% this October. Food prices across the UK have spiked, energy bills and gas prices have

skyrocketed but wages have remained the same. putting many under a terrible cost of living crisis.

If IMF projections are any indication, UK is expected to only grow a meager 0.3% this year. Sunak's longevity in office largely depends on how he tames inflation and injects growth into a slow growing economy.

Strikes, Protests and Social Unrest:

When the living cost goes up drastically, it is only natural that people would demand higher wages. Everyone from Nurses, Teachers, Postal Workers, Railway Staff, Barristers, Civil Servants and Local Government Staff either have or are planning to go on strike for better pay, pensions and working conditions. And the consequences are starting to show.

While the rail strikes in December alone have cost the economy a loss of nearly 1.5 billion pounds, the transport strikes resulted in a flurry of cancellations of planned Christmas functions, the cost of which is pretty hefty as well.

In fact, over 1.1 million working days were lost between June and October this year, the highest ever for a 5-month period since 1990.

Energy Crisis: The rapid surge in gas and electricity prices is not only strangulating households, but threatening business productivity and putting government policy to test. With the arrival of winter and a subsequent increase in energy requirements, the crisis is only expected to get worse.

While it is fair to argue that pulling out of trade deals with Russia was a strategic choice, managing the consequences is where Britain failed miserably. The result? Domestic gas and electricity prices shot up by 130% and 66% respectively, resulting in businesses and households grasping at straws in desperation.

With the 'bomb cyclone' wreaking havoc in the US, gas supply from the States may also be interrupted, resulting in a crisis so bad that Households will have to choose between either cooking a meal or heating the house to survive the winter.

Immigration:

Britain, like most European nations, has bore the brunt of providing asylum to illegal immigrants - a scenario that it can no longer lavishly afford. But in the age of compassion and inclusivity, it is interesting to see how Sunak will tactfully deal with this issue.

He recently introduced a 5-step plan for curbing illegal immigration and bringing a cap on the number of refugees allowed, along with announcing a new agreement with Albania - a relatively safer nation, whose asylum claims were all rejected last year by every other European superpower except the UK.

The new law will mean that if you reach Britain illegally, you will first be detained and then returned to a home country or a safe country where your claim could be considered. Once removed in such a way, you will have no right to re-entry, settlement or citizenship in the UK.

Assistance to Ukraine:

Even amidst the crisis in 2022, Britain provided military assistance amounting to 2.6 billion USD to Ukraine, making them the second largest donor after the United States. Judging from Sunak's campaign speeches, the monumental funding process is likely to continue in 2023 as well.

But given the current economic emergency, Sunak would either have to discontinue generously spending on Ukraine or give a serious justification to his people, as to why he is expending such a large chunk of money on helping Ukraine, when his own nation is in dire straits.

Managing the Intra-Party Dissent:

With the election approaching in less than two years, the conservative party cannot afford to be separated in interest or divided in purpose. It has already lost a fair amount of voters owing to maladministration and controversies during COVID-19. Oddly enough, there are now members within the party who believe that a defeat in 2024 is inevitable and are virtually just 'doing their time'.

As high as 15 MP's have already confirmed they will not be standing in the next election, and many others are poised to do the same.

Even during the New Year speech, Sunak's tone sounded a tad pessimistic - nearly hinting that the UK may not recover in 2023. Knowing how diplomatic UK leaders generally are in public addresses, there is every chance he is lowballing.

In contrast, Labour Party leader Keir Starmer struck more of a sanguine tone, vowing to set out the "case for change" for a brand new Britain.

Unsurprisingly, the recent polls indicated that the Labour Party is way ahead in popularity - with a whopping lead of 26 points - signifying that if an election were to happen today, the Labour Party would make a clean sweep.

The GB News poll also found that the public has little confidence that Rishi Sunak's cabinet will ease the cost of living burden in 2023.

Even the popularity poll for 'minister of the year' had Sunak at the fifth place, trailing behind Former PM Boris Johnson, Defence Secretary Ben Wallace and two other cabinet ministers, indicating just how

unpopular he is, even among party fanatics. That being said, it is too early to write off Mr. Sunak. A few bold decisions may help him turn the boat around, and if he does, he will not only save the British Economy, but help the Tory Party pull off an unlikely win in 2024.

The Secret Intelligence of Parenting

How executive functioning leads to secure attachment.

xecutive functioning is an umbrella term that refers to our ability to take action on behalf of our thoughts, feelings, motivations, and goals. It's a buzzword in education and is often thought of as a set of cognitive skills that leads to high SAT scores and promotions in the workplace. While a CEO has to have good executive functioning, there is another, often overlooked population that requires the same exceptional coordination of cognitive, social, and emotional skills: parents.

If you were to ask a mother (or father)—in the midst of juggling her groceries and a crying babyhow she does it, it wouldn't be out of the ordinary for her to reply with a self-deprecating remark. "I have no idea what I'm doing!" she might say, as she fumbles with the car seat, popping a pacifier into the mouth of her baby at just the right moment. Her gaze lingers on her little one, stroking her cheek until she settles into a state of calm, at which point the mother returns to the conversation. "I'm just taking my cues from her," she says.

It turns out, taking cues from your infant is truly the gold standard of parenting in the first year. The past two decades of neuroscience research have shown that while a child needs basic necessities to survive, they also need emotional care and support if they are going to thrive. The importance of affection and comfort is not just a sweet sentiment, it is central to our sense of well-being. The field of attachment shows how a sense of safety with our caregivers shapes our ability to regulate our emotions and manage the natural anxiety of life (Schore, 2005). Many psychological disorders are correlated with a lack of attachment security, highlighting how attachment has the power to either set us up for optimal development or severely set us back (Set et al., 2019). So, how does one create secure attachment with their child? We think the answer might be good executive functioning.

While the mother at the grocery store might feel as if she doesn't know what she's doing, she's actually engaging in a highly complex mental process. Taking cues from your infant is a lot more nuanced and precise than it might seem. There are many factors that must converge in order to effectively soothe one's baby in the midst of a chaotic moment. A mother's ability to intuit her child's needs and to execute them quickly and effectively reveals a dynamic intelligence that hinges on excellent executive functioning.

In her influential attachment research, Mary Ainsworth studied mother-child interactions which revealed patterns in the mother's behavior toward the child that lead to either attachment security, or one of the various forms of non-secure attachment (avoidant, ambivalent, and the later discovered disorganized category). The main parental characteristics that lead to secure attachment were summarized by Ainsworth in the following four measures of her Maternal Sensitivity Scales. In the outline below, we conceptualize how each scale represents the coordination of several executive functions-a useful tool for parents and clinicians, alike.

Sensitivity vs. insensitivity to a baby's signals

A sensitive parent enlists multiple executive functions in order to be aware of their child's signals, accurately interpret them, and respond appropriately and promptly. They have an ability to manage their own emotional states and cope with them without transferring those feelings onto the child or taking on their child's emotions as their own. From a cognitive standpoint, sensitivity also includes the ability of the parent to recognize that their child's tantrum about having to leave the park, while not serious to the adult, is very real to the child. This includes having realistic expectations of the child's developmental stage and abilities and supporting them accordingly. This is a delicate balance considering the anxiety and overwhelm that often accompanies parenting, and it requires social awareness and empathy for the child.

Cooperation vs. interference with baby's behavior

A cooperative parent views her baby as an autonomous person, whose wishes and activities have validity of their own. When their baby is involved in play or activities of their choice, the parent consciously limits interruption. Cognitively, this requires executive functions such as delayed gratification, putting their baby's needs first, and creating strategies to use when interruptions are necessary. In order to do this, the parent must also have the ability to manage their anxiety around their own schedule and desire for control when it is in conflict with the wishes of their child. This level of cooperation must also be grounded in a strong sense of social intelligence and emotional regulation on the part of the parent.

Physical and psychological availability vs. ignoring

and neglecting An available parent is one that is accessible and emotionally attentive to their child such that they are always, at least peripherally, on the parent's mind when in their care. The parent is never too absorbed in their own thoughts, feelings, or activities to shift attention to their child when necessary. In order for this to happen, a parent must be flexible in their attention and alert to the child's whereabouts and needs. Other important executive functions required for this level of attunement include having a selective filter to tune into the child's sounds, signals, and bodily cues. Like a good CEO, an available parent is strategic in the way that they manage competing needs and responsibilities while remaining present.

Acceptance vs. rejection of the baby's needs

An accepting parent is able to balance conflicting feelings about parenthood, both positive and negative. They do not harbor resentment for the ways that their lives have been turned upside down and accept the responsibility wholeheartedly. The parent is able to tolerate frustration about the baby's behavior without taking it personally. They support the child's individual sense of self, encouraging them to fully express themselves even if it's triggering. They are not reactive to the child's behavior because they have coping skills to help them process difficult emotions in the moment. When there is a rupture, they move swiftly through frustration to repair the bond. They use reflection and an inner equilibrium to extend compassion and adjust to the child's developmental capacity.

'Hybrid Immunity Offers **More Protection Against Severe Covid Than Infection Alone'**

'ndividuals with hybrid immunity had the highest magnitude and durability of protection, and may be able to extend the period before booster vaccinations are needed compared to individuals who have never been infected, according to a new study.

Hybrid immunity refers to immunity developed through a combination of SARS-CoV-2 infection and vaccination.

The effectiveness of hybrid immunity against hospital admission or severe disease was 97 4 per cent at 12 months with primary series vaccination and 95 3 per cent at 6 months with the first booster vaccination after the most recent infection or vaccination, the study said.

The effectiveness of previous infection against hospital admission or severe disease was 74.6 per cent at 12 months. The effectiveness of previous infection against reinfection waned to 24.7 per cent at 12 months, the study said.

The study, published in The Lancet Infectious Diseases, reported that all estimates of protection waned within months against reinfection but remained high and sustained for hospital admission or severe disease.

Eleven studies reporting the protective effectiveness of previous SARS-CoV-2 infection and 15 studies reporting the protective effectiveness of hybrid immunity were included, the study said.

Against reinfection, the effectiveness of hybrid immunity following primary series vaccination waned to 41.8 per cent at 12 months, while the effectiveness of hybrid immunity following first booster vaccination waned to 46.5 per cent at 6 months, the

Estimates of vaccine effectiveness, i.e., vaccinated vs unvaccinated, against the omicron variant were obtained from the dataset of a systematic review and meta-regression involving 19 studies of both primary series and booster vaccination, of which 18

Study Identifies Neighbourhood Characteristics That Promote Walking And Cycling

ow people perceive their neighbourhoods may have a lot to do with whether they choose to walk and cycle, according to a global study of nearly 40,000 adults.

Simon Fraser University health sciences professor Scott Lear says those most likely to walk more than 150 minutes a week for commuting or leisure purposes reported their neighbourhoods had more desirable features.

The likelihood of cycling and walking was associated with land use mix-diversity (amenities such as stores or parks within a

20-minute walk), street connectivity (number of three and fourway intersections) and safety from crime.

"Cycling and walking are two excellent ways to weave exercise into daily life and meet those fitness goals outlined in many New Year's resolutions," says Lear, who was part of an international team whose research, published in Cities, spanned 21 countries. "We sought to understand how factors in the built environment can either promote or discourage a person from engaging in these forms of physical activity.

Study participants were between the ages of 35-70 living in more than 350 urban communities from low, middle and highincome countries as classified by the World Bank.

"Levels of physical inactivity are rising globally and in highincome countries such as Canada, over 70 per cent of adults are

physically inactive," says Lear. "One in four adults do not meet the globally recommended activity level of at least 150 minutes per week of moderate-intensity

New Protein Target Found Which Pancreatic Cancer Cells Leverage To Resist Therapy: Study

cientists have found a new protein target, leveraged by pancreatic cancer cells usually to suppress tumours, but here instead to help them evade therapy and, thus, grow more quickly, according to a new study.

Scientists revealed that this is another way in which the most-resistant pancreatic cancer cells defy treatment, the study said.

The international team of researchers was led by University of California San Diego School of Medicine and the Sanford Consortium for Regenerative Medicine, the study said.

Previous research has shown that pancreatic cancer treatment resistance is caused by differing responses to conventional agents, fuelled by the heterogeneity, or diversity, of tumour cells - and in particular, stem cell characteristics that


10 per cent, the study said.

"Pancreatic cancer stem cells, which are aggressive cancer cells that can resist conventional therapies and drive tumour relapse, rely upon epigenetic regulation to protect themselves and promote survival and growth," said Reya, Columbia University.

"We wanted to identify the underlying tools and mechanisms that cancer stem cells use to better understand treatment resistance - and perhaps how they might be circumvented," said Reya.

According to the study, Reya and colleagues zeroed in on SMARCD3, a member of the SWI/ SNF family of proteins that regulate chromatin, a mixture of DNA and proteins that form chromosomes and are required for stem cell function in development.

But while SWI-SNF subunits often act as tumour suppressors, the researchers found that



encourage therapy resistance. In this study, senior author Tannishtha Reya and colleagues investigated how shifting epigenomics, or the multitude of proteins that tell the genome what to do, rather than genomic changes might be driving resistance. Genomic changes are changes specific to the genes themselves.

The paper is published in the journal Nature Communications. Pancreatic cancer is the third deadliest cancer in the United States, after lung and colorec-

tal, though far less common. It is also among the hardest to effectively treat, with pancreatic cancer stem cells quickly developing resistance to conventional and targeted treatments, such as chemotherapy and emerging immunotherapies.

As a result, the 5-year survival rate for people diagnosed with pancreatic cancer is just SMARCD3 was amplified in cancer, notably abundant in pancreatic cancer stem cells and upregulated or increased in the human disease, the study said.


And when researchers deleted SMARCD3 in models of pancreatic cancer, the loss of the protein reduced the growth of tumours and improved survival, especially in the context of chemotherapy, the study said. "Importantly, we found that

SMARCD3 helps control lipid and fatty acid metabolism, which are associated with therapy resistance and poor prognosis in cancer." said Reva.

"Our data suggest that therapy resistant pancreatic cancer cells depend upon SMARCD3 to help ensure a metabolic landscape in which they can avoid anti-cancer treatments and grow aggressively. That makes SMARCD3 an exciting new target for potential therapies," said Reya.

Urination Incident: AI Pilots' Body Mulls Legal Course Against Suspension Of Pilot

MUMBAI: Air India pilots' body IPG is considering legal recourse and other options, regarding aviation regulator DGCA suspending the licence of the pilotin-command of the flight where a passenger allegedly urinated on a female co-passenger onboard last November.

A senior member of the Indian Pilots Guild (IPG), which represents the airline's pilots who fly wide-body planes, said it will take up the issue of suspension of the pilot concerned

The urination incident happened onboard New York-Delhi flight on November 26, 2022 and it came to the notice of the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) only on January 4.

For various violations, DGCA, on Friday, imposed a fine of Rs 30 lakh on Air India, Rs 3 lakh penalty on the airline's director of in-flight services and suspended the licence of the pilotin-command for three months.

"We are considering all options, including taking legal action for the pilot's licence suspension. We are talking to our lawyers on the issue and will soon take a call," the IPG member told PTI on the condition of anonymity.

The member claimed that the pilot concerned had acted



very maturely. "It has all been reported to the company at that time. If after all of this you still think that the pilot has not acted, then we need to understand what you are talking about and why you find him at fault." The member also alleged that there is a lot of "pressure to find a scapegoat in the entire case.

There was no immediate comment from Air India.

According to reports, Air India's senior management was informed about the urination incident hours after the flight landed on November 26.

The incident of passenger misbehaviour occurred on AI-102 flight from New York to Delhi on November 26 last year, wherein a male passenger conducted himself in a disorderly manner and allegedly relieved himself on a female passenger, according to DGCA.

The watchdog had issued show cause notices to Air India's Accountable Manager, Director in-flight services, all the pilots and cabin crew members of that flight as to why enforcement action should not be taken against them for dereliction of their regulatory obligations.

'J&K Apiculture Sector Buzzes With Anticipation Of Big Boost To Beekeeping'

JAMMU: The J&K Apiculture sector is eagerly awaiting the launch of a mega project, approved by the UT administration, aimed at promoting apiculture with investment of Rs 47 crore in next three years.

The prestigious project is expected to significantly increase honey production in the UT.

Efforts are underway to introduce apitherapy to a wider audience. The sector is projected to grow from its current annual output of Rs 69 crore to Rs 682 crore within five years, resulting in gainful employment for 8122 persons and creation of 82 private sector enterprises.

The project, which is being carried out by the Agriculture Production Department, has been allocated a budget of Rs 46.65 crore with an avowed objective of increasing honey production three-fold, the bee population by 333 percent and crop production of cross-pollinated crops by 20-25 percent.

"Beekeeping is an important source of income and livelihood for many rural youth, landless farmers, and small and medium- farmers in J&K. The honeybees not only produce honey but also play a crucial role in pollinating thousands of flowering plants, thereby contributing to food security", Additional Chief Secretary, Agri-culture Production Department Atal Dulloo said

The decline in pollinating bees poses a danger to the natural en-



vironment and agricultural sustainability, and the biodiversity of the Himalayan region can be restored through bee activity.

The "Promotion of beekeeping in UT of J&K" project is one of 29 projects approved by the J&K administration and recommended by the UT Level Apex Committee for the holistic development of agriculture and allied sectors.

For this purpose, a committee has been constituted under Dr. Mangala Rai, Former DG ICAR, which comprises other experts in agriculture, planning, statistics and the administration.

The major constraints faced by the beekeeping industry in J&K included degradation and deforestation, the use of pesticides, lack of infrastructure, lack of standard migration practices, traceability, and changes in the blooming patterns of crucial forage plants. The project aims at addressing these issues by increasing the number of colonies through cluster formation, encouraging bee-preneurship and bee-startups, besides developing infrastructure for postharvest management, value addition, and marketing.

After implementation of the project, the number of bee colonies is expected to increase from 1.43 to 3.085 lakh, the number of beekeepers from 4526 to 7396, and honey production from 23050 to 66100 quintals. In addition to honey production, income from bee by-products such as royal jelly, bee venom, pollen, and wax worth Rs. 474 Crore per annum will also be realised. An amount of Rs. 4.4 Cr has been allocated for research and development.

The Agriculture Production Department will implement the project in collaboration with SKUAST-J/K, which will lead to holistic development of apiculture, generate employment opportunities, provide livelihood sources and create entrepreneurship opportunities for landless, small and medium-sized farmers resulting in an overall improvement in their

FTA Negotiations With India 'Well Advanced': UK

LONDON: Negotiations between Britain and India for an ambitious Free Trade Agreement (FTA) are "well advanced", with the next round of talks set to commence very soon, a UK Foreign Office minister told peers in a debate in Parliament here, asserting that a strong deal could boost the country's economy.

Lord Tariq Ahmad, the UK Foreign Office Minister for South Asia, also said Britain's relationship with India is central to its foreign policy and as one of the world's biggest economies it is a key partner.

Ahmad was responding to the debate entitled "The Importance of the Relationship Between the United Kingdom and India" in the House of Lords on Thursday, tabled by British Indian peer Baroness Sandy Verma.

He confirmed that negotiations for a bilateral free trade agreement (FTA) are "well advanced", with the next round of negotiations set to commence very soon. "It is true that, as we set up and strengthen this relationship, the United Kingdom's relationship with India is central to UK foreign policy," said Ahmad.

"As one of the world's biggest and fastestgrowing economies, India is a key partner to the UK We are also looking at lowering nontariff barriers on medical devices to benefit British exporters, and are well advanced in our negotiations for an ambitious and balanced free trade agreement," he said. PTI

ISLAMABAD: Shipping agents have warned the cash-strapped Pakistan government that all exports could come to a halt as foreign shipping lines are considering stopping their services for the country after banks stopped remitting freight charges to them due to a lack of dollar availability, according to a media report on Saturday.

Apart from bordering countries, almost all the international logistics from Pakistan are catered by sea and any disruption could create serious issues for the country's international trade, Pakistan Ship's Agents Association (PSAA) chairman Abdul Rauf warned Finance Minister Ishaq Dar through a letter.

"If the international trade is stopped the economic situation will worsen," the association warned, adding that the foreign shipping lines are already considering winding up their services in Pakistan due to reduced cargo volumes.

The PSAA chairman also wrote letters to State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) Governor Jameel Ahmed, Commerce Minister Syed Naveed Namar, and Maritime Affairs Minister Faisal Sabzwari, the Dawn newspaper reported.

Rauf requested the ministries and departments concerned to intervene to ensure continuity in Pakistan's seaborne trade by allowing outward remittance of surplus freight amounts to respective foreign shipping lines forthwith. PTI

'Japan Offers Huge Biz **Opportunities For Indian Apparel Exporters'**

NEW DELHI: Japan offers huge business opportunities for Indian apparel exporters and the industry should explore that market, AEPC said on Saturday.

Apparel Export Promotion Council (AEPC) said it is organising the first edition of Upnext India 2023, starting with a Reverse Buyer Seller Meet with Japan.

The fair will be held in Gurugram during February 10-11. Over 50 Japanese buyers and traders have confirmed their participation, it added. Naren Goenka, Chairman, AEPC, said in

light of the fact that Japan is the fourth largest garment importer in the world, with its apparel imports being stable even during pandemic times and Indian apparel having duty-free access under the Indo-Japan trade agreement as against 9 per cent for Turkey and 9.5 per cent for China, it makes business sense for Indian readymade garment manufacturers and exporters to participate in this opportunity. With total garment imports of Japan of USD 23 billion, against India's exports of USD 0.22 billion, a strong Indian garment industry with its unique offerings has a huge scope for Japanese trading companies to source from India, it added. PTI

Forex Reserves Zoom By USD 10.417 Bn To USD 572 Bn

MUMBAI: India's forex reserves zoomed by USD 10.417 billion to USD 572 billion as on January 13, making it one of the biggest weekly jumps in the kitty in recent times. In the previous reporting week, the over-

all reserves had dropped by USD 1.268 billion to USD 561.583 billion. In October 2021, the country's forex kitty

reached an all-time high of USD 645 billion. The reserves have been declining as the central bank deploys the kitty to defend the rupee amid pressures caused majorly by global developments.

In October 2022, the reserves had swelled by USD 14.721 billion during a week.

For the reporting week, the foreign currency assets, a major component of the reserves, increased by USD 9.078 billion to USD 505.519 billion, according to the Weekly Statistical Supplement released by the RBI on Friday.

Expressed in dollar terms, the foreign currency assets include the effect of appreciation or depreciation of non-US units like the euro, pound and yen held in the foreign exchange reserves.

The gold reserves continued to rise, jumping by USD 1.106 billion to USD 42.89 billion, the RBI said. The Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) were up by USD 147 million to USD 18.364 billion, the apex bank said. PTI

Drunk IAF Officer Arrested For Making Hoax Bomb Call To Delay Train Departure

leave for Mumbai at 4.55 pm. The Bomb Disposal Squad of the railways and the central district were called. The Railway Protection Force also joined the operation, but no explosive substances were found, police said.

"The mobile number was tracked and it was found that Sunil Sangwan (35), a Sergeant in the Indian Air Force, made the call," Deputy Commissioner of Police (Railways) Hareesh H

A police officer said an FIR under relevant IPC sections and the Indian Railway Act was registered against Sangwan and he was later arrested.

According to police, Sangwan was scheduled to board the train

to go to his place of posting at Airforce Station in Santacruz, Mumbai. He got late and drunk dialled the railways to delay the departure of the train from Delhi.

The caller was traced from coach B-9 seat number-1. His identity was established through his Indian Air Force Id card. The mobile handset which he used to make the PCR call has also been recovered." the DCP said.

Nepal Plane Crash: Relatives Of 4 Indians Yet To Receive Dead Bodies

Kathmandu, Jan 21 (PTI) The relatives of four Indians who died in a plane crash in Nepal are still waiting to receive the dead bodies of their family members despite spending their third day at a hospital here on Saturday.

Nepalese authorities on Tuesday started handing over to family members the bodies of those killed after Yeti Airlines' aircraft with 72 people crashed minutes before landing in a river gorge in the resort city of Pokhara on Sunday.

Fifty-three Nepalese passengers and 15 foreign nationals, including 5 Indians, and four crew members were on board the aircraft when it crashed. The five Indians, all reportedly from Uttar Pradesh, have been identified as Abhisekh Kushwaha, 25, Bishal Sharma, 22, Anil Kumar Rajbhar, 27, Sonu Jaiswal, 35, and Sanjaya Jaiswal.

The body of Sanjaya Jaiswal was handed over to his family on Friday and taken back home. However, the relatives of four other Indian nationals have been waiting for three days to receive the dead bodies of their kin.

Sonu Jaiswal's father Rajendra Prasad Jaiswal was among the relatives waiting at Tribhuvan University Teaching Hospital to receive the bodies.

One of the relatives said they want to take back all four bodies of the Indians in a single consignment. The body of Bishal Sharma was identified on Saturday, the hospital sources said. The hospital completed postmortem on 49 dead bodies on Friday. Twenty-two dead bodies of Nepali nationals have been handed over to their families in Pokhara

While a total of 12 dead bodies, including one of an Indian national, were handed over to their family members on Friday, on Saturday, the hospital authorities handed over 15 more dead bodies to the

According to a doctor involved in identifying the bodies, the signs provided by the family members were not sufficient to identify the dead

"We will try to verify the fingerprints of the dead bodies on Sunday," the doctor said.

The Nepal Army said on Saturday it continued the search operation at the Seti River gorge and the surrounding areas on Saturday to find the remaining one body.

Meanwhile, a team of the European Union (EU) team that was planning to visit Nepal to undertake an 'on-site evaluation' of aviation safety has postponed its trip.

According to a statement issued by the Civil Aviation Authority of Nepal (CAAN), the planned visit of the EU's technical team has been postponed for the time being.

In a joint statement issued on Friday, Director-General of the CAAN Pradeep Adhikari and EU's Ambassador to Nepal Nona Deprez said that the scheduled visit of the on-site evaluation team to Nepal has been put off.

"Given the current context, related to the terrible accident and in mutual agreement, the EU and CAAN have reached the conclusion that it would be in our best interest to postpone a planned on-site assessment visit mandated by the EU Air Safety committee for the time being," the statement said.
"The primary focus for CAAN

at this time is on dealing with the aftermath of the accident. The European Union will continue to assist CAAN in its efforts to improve the aviation safety situation in Nepal," it

Earlier in October last year, a team of the EU undertook a study on the aviation safety of Nepal and concluded that notable progress had been made in the country's air safety.

RAIPUR: India's relentless pace attack ran through a fragile New Zealand batting line-up as the hosts cantered to an eight-wicket win in the second ODI to seal the three-match series here on Saturday.

The Mohammed Shami-led attack produced an incisive effort to bowl out New Zealand for a meagre 108 before India knocked off the runs in 20.1 overs. Rohit Sharma hit a sublime 50 off 51 balls while Shubman Gill remained unbeaten on 40 off 53 deliveries.

It was an emphatic win but the sea of fans that had flocked the remotely located Shaheed Veer Narayan Singh Stadium for Raipur's first international game was left wanting for more due to the early finish.

Shami (3/18) and Mohammed Siraj (1/10) made life tough for the batters with their high-quality seam bowling reducing New Zealand to a dismal 15 for five after Rohit opted to bowl. The odd ball stopping made the New Zealand batters' job tougher though the Indian openers made batting look easy in the evening.

The third and final ODI will be

played in Indore on Tuesday.

New Zealand opener Finn Allen was the first to depart after missing a full ball that came back in late to clip the pads and shatter the stumps. Siraj then got one to seam away from good length inducing an outside edge from number three Henry Nicholls with Gill doing the rest in the slips.

Two brilliant return catches from Shami and Hardik Pandya (2/16) put New Zealand in further trouble. Shami got one to shape away and Daryl Mitchell, in his attempt to flick it on the on-side, ended up mistiming it back to the

Hardik's one-handed catch to get rid of Devon Conway in the 10th over was sensational. Shardul Thakur (1/26) got himself into the wicket column in the following over by drawing a thick edge from Tom Latham's bat. It was a loose shot from the New Zealand skipper, ending with an easy catch to Gill in the slips.

New Zealand were in dire straits but all hope was not lost with last match's centurion Michael Bracewell (22) and the equally dangerous Glenn Phillips (36) in the middle.

Bracewell made his intent clear



by stepping out to whack Shami over cover. After getting hit for consecutive fours in the 19th over, Shami bowled a sharp bouncer and Bracewell went for the pull

only to edge it back to the keeper. Mitchell Santner (27), who scored a fifty in Hyderabad, joined Phillips and the duo took the team past 100 with a 47-run stand for

the seventh wicket. However, both were dismissed in a space of six balls to end New Zealand's hopes of a recovery.

While Santner played a well-

disguised slower ball from Hardik on to the stumps, Phillips gave a regulation catch to Suryakumar Yadav at deep midwicket off a long hop from Washington Sundar

Kuldeep Yadav (1/29) trapped number 11 Blair Tickner in front to end the New Zealand innings in 34.3 overs.

India were clinical in the run chase with Rohit enthralling the crowd with his trademark pull shots. One of them went for a six, the first maximum of the game, as he hooked Lockie Ferguson over

Wrestlers Call Off Protest After Sharan Asked To Step Aside As WFI President

NEW DELHI: The aggrieved grapplers called off their protest late on Friday night after getting assurances from the government that their grievances would be addressed, the first step of which was the stepping aside of under-fire Wrestling Federation of India chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh.

wrestlers, including Vinesh Phogat, Bajrang Punia, Sakshi Malik and Ravi Dahiya, decided to end their protest after a breakthrough was achieved during a marathon second round of talks with Union Sports Minister Anurag Thakur.

The government decided to form an oversight committee which will investigate the allegations of sexual harassment of women wrestlers by the WFI president. The committee, members of which will be named on Saturday, will also oversee the day-to-day affairs of the federation.

Making the announcement, Thakur said the committee will submit its report in one month's time. Talking to media, Bajrang Punia said they never wanted to

take the protest route but they

were "pushed to limit". "The protest is over. We did not want to sit on dharna but 'paani sar se ooper chala gaya tha'. The government has assured us safety and security, we have been threatened by the WFI president in the past also,"

the Tokyo Olympics bronze

medallist said, adding that 2023 was a crucial year for them as the Asian Games and Olympic Qualifiers are approaching.

Neither the sports minister nor the wrestlers took questions from media. The wrestlers had earlier in

the day said that they would lodge multiple FIRs against the



WFI chief, but did not do so eventually.

It can be termed a considerable, if not major, victory for the agitating wrestlers, who had said that they would continue their 'dharna' until the WFI president is sacked and the federation is disbanded.

However, under the IOA constitution a National Sports Federation (NSF) can't be dissolved unless it has violated the IOA rules and regulations, or has been de-recognised by the world body of the sport.

It must be mentioned that the wrestlers have not yet provided strong evidence that suggests sexual harassment of women

Earlier in the day the wrestlers reached out to the Indian

Olympic Association (IOA) demanding a probe.

In their letter, addressed to IOA president PT Usha, the wrestlers alleged financial misappropriation (of funds) on part of the WFI and claimed that the coaches and sports science staff at the national camp are "absolutely incompetent".

The wrestlers also reiterated their demand that the WFI be disbanded and its president

"A new committee should be formed to run the affairs of WFI in consultation with the wrestlers." they wrote in their fourth and last demand. Responding to it, the IOA

formed a seven-member committee, headed by M C Mary Kom, to probe the charges. The IOA panel includes wres-

tler Yogeshwar Dutt, archer Dola Banerjee and Indian Weightlifting Federation (IWLF) president and IOA treasurer Sahdev Yadav. The committee also has two advocates -- Talish Ray and Shlok Chandra -- besides former shuttler and IOA joint secretary Alaknanda Ashok, who is its vice chairperson.

The decision was taken during the IOA's emergency Executive Council meeting, which was attended by the likes of Olympic champion shooter Abhinav Bindra, Olympic bronze medallist Yogeshwar, along with IOA president PT Usha and joint secretary Kalyan Chaubey.

Most of the committee members are affiliated to the ruling Bharatiya Janata Party.

Juventus Hit With 15-Point Penalty For False Accounting

ROME: Italy's most storied soccer club, Juventus, was hit with a massive 15-point penalty for false accounting Friday following an appeal hearing at the Italian soccer federation. The punishment could elimi-

nate the club's chances of playing in Europe next season. A record 36-time Italian champion, Juventus was third in Serie A and the penalty drops the Bianconeri to a midtable position - 25 IUVENTUS points behind leader

Also, former Juventus president Andrea Agnelli and former club CEO Maurizio Arrivabene were each banned for two years from soccer activities and more bans were handed out for nine other members of Juve's staff or former board, which resigned en masse in November following an investigation by Turin public prosecutors into alleged false bookkeeping.

The longest ban of 2 ½ years was handed out to former Juventus sporting director and current Tottenham managing director Fabio Paratici, while current Juventus sporting director Federico Cherubini was

given 16 months and former Juventus player turned board member Pavel Nedved was given eight months.

The bans prohibit those individuals from engaging in soccer activities in Italy, "with the request that the ban be extended to UEFA and FIFA activities."

Iuventus has denied wrongdoing and was initially cleared by the sports court in April. But an appeal was made after the federation collected papers from the Turin

prosecutors.

At the start of the pandemic, Juventus said 23 players agreed to reduce their salary for four months to help the club through the crisis. But prosecutors claim the players gave up only one month's salary.

Turin prosecutors have also apparently discovered more alleged secret payments to former player Cristiano Ronaldo that were not reported by

In September, Juventus reported a record loss of 254.3 million euros (\$276 million) for the 2021-22 financial year. It was the fifth consecutive year that Juventus reported a loss, and it was 44.4 million euros (\$48 million) more than in 2020-21.

A preliminary hearing for the investigation by Turin prosecturs is scheduled for March.

"Netaji Was Leftist; BJP **And RSS Don't Reflect** His Attitude": Daughter

Kolkata: Amidst the fanfare over Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh's plans to celebrate Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's birth anniversary in the city on January 23, his daughter Anita Bose-Pfaff has said that it is being done to "partially exploit" her father's legacy.

RSS's ideology and the nationalist leader's ideas of secularism and inclusiveness are "poles apart and do not coincide",

As far as ideology is concerned, the Congress has a lot more in common with Netaji than any other party in the country, Ms Bose-Pfaff said.

RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat will address a public programme at Shahid Minar ground in the city to commemorate Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's birth anniversary.

Ms Bose-Pfaff said the BJP and RSS do not reflect the idea of respecting all religions as preached by Netaji, who was a devout Hindu but believed in respecting other faiths. He was in favour of a productive cooperation between members of different religions, she said.

"RSS and BJP do not necessarily reflect this attitude... If you want to put a simple label, they are rightists, and Netaji was a leftist," she told PTI over phone from Germany, where she lives.

"From what I hear about the RSS ideology, I would agree that it and Netaji's ideology are poles apart. The two value systems do not coincide. It will certainly be good if the RSS felt it wanted to embrace Netaji's ideals and ideas. Many different groups want to celebrate Netaji's birthday in different ways, and a number of them necessarily agree with his ideas," Ms Bose-Pfaff said.

She agreed that the fanfare over the celebration of her father's birth anniversary is to "partially exploit his legacy".

Asked whether Netaji was a critic of the RSS, she said, "I don't know any quote (of Netaji) which I can give you. He may have

made critical statements about RSS members. I know what his (Netaji's) views are and about RSS. The two value systems do not coincide. RSS and Netaji's ideology of secularism do not coincide with each other," she said.

Speaking on the recent pomp and fanfare over Netaji's birth anniversary celebrations, she lauded the BIP-led government at the Centre for taking a "lot of initiatives" to honour him.

"This has two aspects. After Independence, the official Congress stand on Netaji was reserved and not shared by all Congressmen. It wanted to keep the narrative that it was only the civil disobedience movement that led to the country's freedom. But after Netaji files were declassified, we came to know that Indian National Army (INA) played a very key role in it," she said.

On the second aspect, Ms Pfaff wondered whether BJP would have honoured Netaji if he had held divergent views from that of the present-day government. "The BJP has made a lot of effort to honour Netaji. With any politician, you have first to allow them to look at his/her interest. If Netaji was alive today and held a different view from that of the government, then the BJP would not have honoured him. So (in this case) it is their interest that is served," she said.

The Trinamool Congress and BJP had locked horns to appropriate Netaji's legacy on his 125th birth anniversary ahead of the assembly polls in 2021. In 2015, the West Bengal government released 64 files on the leader held by the home department. The Narendra Modi government at the Centre released 100 files on him the next year.

After Independence, Centre had formed three inquiry commissions to unravel the mystery of Netaji's disappearance.

Two of them -- the Shah Nawaz Commission, and the Khosla Commission -- were formed by the Congress governments and concluded that Bose died in an air crash on August 18, 1945, soon after taking off from Taihoku airport in Taiwan.

Amid Tension With China, Air Force's Massive Exercise **Near LAC In Northeast**

New Delhi: The Indian Air Force will carry out Exercise 'Pralay' involving all its major air bases in the northeast including the recently moved drone squadrons amid the ongoing standoff with China, informed officials.

The massive air exercise planned to be held in the next few days also comes at a time when the Indian Air Force has deployed and activated the S-400 air defence squadron in the area which can take on any enemy aircraft or missile from a distance of up to 400 km.

According to officials, the exercise would see major combat assets of the Air Force including the Rafale and Sukhoi Su-30 fighter jets activated along with the transport and other aircraft.

The Air Force recently moved a squadron of drones from other bases to the northeast to augment its capabilities of monitoring adversary activities along the Sikkim and the Siliguri Corridor sector.

The Chinese have also been

increasing their activities along the Doklam area and are under the constant watch of Indian security agencies, as per officials.

This is the second such command-level exercise carried out by the Air Force in recent months. The Indian Air Force's Eastern Command in Shillong has the entire northeast air space to look after along the China border and frequently scrambles its fighters the moment the Chinese try to fly too close to the LAC or move in a direction

towards Indian locations there.

Thousand 'Bad Apples' Placed Outside London Police Headquarter As A Sign Of Protest

London: London police were confronted by the sight of 1,071 plastic rotten apples outside their headquarters on Friday, in a display seeking to mark the high number of staff facing investigation for sex offences or domestic abuse.

Refuge, a British domestic abuse charity, placed the imitation red and green apples outside the Metropolitan Police's New Scotland Yard building in central London, alongside a sign saying: "1071 bad apples. How many more?"

The demonstration comes days after a serving London police officer admitted to 24 counts of rape in a campaign of abuse against women - news that appalled the nation and shone a light on the issue of falling public confidence in law enforcement.

In an effort to regain public

trust, the Met police said on Tuesday it was investigating sexual and domestic abuse cases involving 1,071 officers and staff, and that hundreds were likely to be sacked as a result.

"This is not one bad apple; this is a systemic problem across Refuge CEO Ruth policing," Davison said. "How have these perpetrators of abuse been allowed to enter and remain in positions of power for so long?"

"What happens next must change the culture of policing for good. A force which breeds violent misogyny is not a force which can even begin to protect women and girls."

The Met, which has faced a string of scandals in recent years revealing a culture of corruption, racism and misogyny, is Britain's biggest police force with more than 43,000 staff and responsibility for issues such as

Centre Issues New Rules For Influencers, Up To ₹50 Lakh Fine If Not Followed

New Delhi: The government on Friday made it mandatory for social media influencers to disclose all "material" interest such as gifts, hotel accommodation, equity, discounts and awards when endorsing any products, services or scheme, failing which strict legal action, including ban on endorsements can be taken.

The disclosures should be in simple and clear language, should be of duration that is hard to miss, must be run with endorsements, including live streams and should be platform agnostic.



The regulations are part of continuing efforts to curb misleading advertisements as well protect the

interests of consumers amid the expanding social influencer market which is projected to be grow 20

per cent annually to reach 2,800 crore by 2025.

The new guidelines named 'Endorsement Know Hows for celebrities, influencers and virtual media influencers (Avatar or computer generated character) on social media platforms' has been issued by the Department of Consumers Affairs.

In case of violation, the penalty prescribed for misleading under advertisement Consumer Protection Act 2019 will be applicable.

Central Consumer Protection Authority (CCPA) can impose penalty of up to 10 lakh on manufacturers, advertisers and endorsers. For subsequent offences, penalty of up to 50 lakh can be imposed.

The CCPA can prohibit endorser of a misleading ad from making any endorsement for up to 1 year and for subsequent contravention, prohibition can extend up to 3 years.

Launching these guidelines at a press conference, Consumer Affairs Secretary Rohit Kumar Singh said the guidelines have been issued under the ambit of the CCPA that provides framework for the protection of consumers against unfair trade practices and misleading advertisements.
