How Solar-Powered Refrigerators Slow Down Climate Change

The Conversation

Food loss and waste are major problems around the world. When food is tossed aside or allowed to spoil, it makes economies less productive and leaves people hungry.

It also harms Earth's climate by generating methane, a potent greenhouse gas. Food loss and waste accounts for 4% of global greenhouse gas emissions. If food waste were a country, it would be the third-largest emitter in the world, ahead of India and behind only China and the US.

Worldwide, 1.3 billion tons of food are lost or wasted every year. Earth's population is projected to increase from 8 billion today to roughly 10 billion by 2050. Feeding that many people will require nations to increase agricultural production by more than 70% and reduce food loss and waste.

Expanding food cold chains to the world's least-developed countries can have enormous impacts. But it also raises concerns if it's not

done in a way that avoids contributing to climate change.

Existing refrigeration systems release hydrochlorofluorocarbons, or HCFCs, and hydrofluorocarbons, or HFCs, which are extremely potent greenhouse gases. Producing electricity with fossil fuels to power these systems also worsens climate change. For these reasons, exporting traditional cold chains to developing countries is not environmentally and socially sustainable.

Instead, developing countries need cold chains that run on renewable energy and use alternative refrigerants with lower climate impacts. As a scholar focusing on sustainable development, green growth and climate change, I believe that expanding cold chains in the developing world particularly sub-Saharan Africa will not only benefit the environment but also provide important social benefits, such as empowering women.

Spoilage and contamination

To understand why cold chains are so im-

portant, think about how food travels from the farm to your table. First it is harvested and shipped to a wholesaler. Then it might go straight to retail stores, or to a food processing company to be cooked, frozen or canned. At each stage it may sit for periods lasting hours to days. If it is not held at a safe temperature, the food may spoil or become contaminated with bacteria that cause foodborne illnesses.

In 2021, over 700 million people were hungry around the world 425 million in Asia, 278 million in Africa and 57 million in the Caribbean and Latin America. Many countries in these regions have minimal cold storage capacity to keep food from spoiling before it can be eaten.

Seafood, meat, milk and vegetables are highly reliant on cold food chains. Countries mainly in the developing world lose 23% of their perishable products before they reach markets.

Loss of cereal crops, which also benefit from cold storage, are equally staggering. For instance, Ethiopia loses about one-third of

its stored corn after five weeks due to lack of proper storage. In 2019, India's Ministry of Food Processing Industries estimated that the country had lost or wasted 56 million tons of food, worth about US\$10 billion, mainly due to lack of cold storage.

Inadequate postharvest management can lead to crop contamination and pest infestation. In Uganda, where most corn is grown by small farmers who lack proper facilities to dry and store it, contamination with fungi that produce dangerous substances called aflatoxin has been a significant human and animal health concern.

Social benefits from cold storage

Nearly 150 countries have adopted the Kigali Amendment to the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer. This measure, negotiated in 2016, is driving changes in the cooling energy sector by requiring nations to phase down use of HFCs.

The global cold chain market is worth \$160

billion today and is projected to reach \$585 billion by 2026. Solar-powered cold storage is a niche market today, but is poised for growth.

In addition to minimising food loss and waste, increasing incomes, curbing land degradation and reducing greenhouse emissions, sustainable cold storage offers great benefits for women, who produce 60% to 80% of crops and are responsible for postharvest activities in most developing countries.

Research in climate finance shows that women may be disproportionately burdened by poverty because they have less access than men to assets and financial resources in many countries. However, since women play key roles in farming and managing food supplies, they are positioned to participate in the food cold chain business in remote and rural areas if the international community provides financial and technical support, thus improving their economic status and livelihoods.

'Booster Dose Of Covishield Offers Best Immune Response'

booster dose of Covishield offers the best immune response, irrespective of whether the primary doses were of Covishield or Covaxin, according to a new study conducted in India and published in The Lancet Regional Health Southeast Asia iournal.

According to the study, even though homologous and heterologous boosting with Covishield or Covaxin in Covishield or Covaxin primed individuals are immunogenic and safe, boosting with Covishield produced better binding and functional antibodies, irrespective of whether the primary vaccination series used Covishield or Covaxin.

Primary SARS-CoV-2 vaccination has been shown to wane with time and provide lower protection from disease with new viral variants, prompting the World Health Organisation (WHO) to recommend the administration of booster doses.

The study, conducted by researchers from Christian Medical College, Vellore, Tamil Nadu and Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology, Hyderabad. Andhra Pradesh, determined the safety and immunogenicity of homologous or heterologous boosters with ChAdOx1 nCoV-19 (Covishield) or BBV152 (Covaxin), the two vaccines used widely for primary immunization in India, in participants who had already received two primary doses of these vaccines, it said.

Covishield and Covaxin are the two vaccines used in the majority of the Indian population. The four permutations for a booster dose evalu-

ated in this study are primary immunization with Covishield followed by a homologous booster or a heterologous Covaxin booster and primary immunization with Covaxin followed by a homologous booster or a heterologous Covishield booster, the study said.

Participants primed with two doses each of Covishield or Covaxin 12 36 weeks previously, were randomised to receive either Covishield or Covaxin booster in a 1:1 ratio, the study said.

The primary outcome was day 28 post-booster anti-spike IgG seropositivity and secondary outcomes were anti-spike IgG levels and assessment of safety and reactogenicity. The results of 90 days intentionto-treat analysis are presented, the study said.

In the Covishield primed group with 200 participants, the seropositivity 28 days post booster in the heterologous Covaxin arm was 99 per cent and noninferior to the homologous Covishield arm, which was also 99 per cent, the study said.

The geometric mean concentration (GMC) of anti-spike antibodies following heterologous Covaxin boost on day 28 was 36,190.78 AU/mL while the GMC following homologous Covishield boost was 97,445.09 AU/mL, the study said.

In the Covaxin primed group with 204 participants, the seropositivity 28 days post booster in the heterologous Covishield arm was 100 per cent and non inferior to the homologous Covaxin arm which was 96 per cent, the study said.

The GMC following heterologous Covishield boost was 241,681.6 AU/mL compared to homologous Covaxin boost, which was 48,473.94 AU/mL, the study said.

The day 28 geometric mean ratio (GMR) of the anti-spike IgG between the heterologous and homologous boosted arms was 0.42 in the Covishield primed group and 5.11 in the Covaxin primed group, the study said.

There were no related serious adverse events reported in any group, the study said.

Based on study results, homologous and heterologous boosting with Covishield or Covaxin in Covishield or Covaxin primed individuals are immunogenic and safe. The study found that a heterologous boost with Covishield after Covaxin prime offers the best immune response among the four combinations evaluated.

For both binding and functional antibodies, in participants primed with Covishield, homologous boosting with Covishield offers better immune responses than heterologous boosting with Covaxin; and in those primed with Covaxin, heterologous boost with Covishield offers the better immune response.

Fresh Snowfall Hits Air Traffic, Closes Highway

14 Flights Cancelled At Srinagar Airport, Shooting Stones Kill Driver In Ramban

Srinagar: Fresh snowfall and incessant rains on Wednesday disrupted air traffic to and from the Kashmir Valley and blocked the strategic Srinagar-Jammu highway, where a driver was killed after his vehicle came under shooting stones.

Light to moderate snowfall was recorded at most places of Kashmir while the higher reaches witnessed heavy snowfall, officials said. They said Gulmarg received 3 ft of fresh snowfall till 1800 hours, Tangmarg 1.5ft, Srinagar 4mm of rain and 1 cm snow, Kokernag 20cm snow, Pahalgam 24cm of snow. Banihal

20mm rain, Batote 25mm rain, Qazigund 15cm, and

Kupwra 3.3mm of rain. Fresh snowfall in most places of Kashmir also brought down visibility to 500 metres, affecting air traffic to and from the Valley. All flights at the Srinagar airport were delayed. Although snow accumulation was not much at the airport, low visibility -- which was down to 500 metres -- affected flight operations, officials said.

NEW DELHI: India and Egypt today decided to elevate their ties to the level of strategic partnership with Prime Minister Narendra Modi and visiting Egyptian President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi vowing to broadbase the relations in a time-bound manner in areas of defence and security, trade, counter-terror cooperation and culture.

Air Passengers To Be Reimbursed For Ticket Downgrades By **Airlines From February 15**

NEW DELHI: Airlines will reimburse 75 per cent of the ticket costs to passengers whose do-mestic flight tickets have been downgraded, with aviation regulator DGCA putting in place new norms.

For downgrade of international tickets, the reimbursement amount will vary from 30 per cent to 75 per cent of the ticket costs, including taxes,

its Civil Aviation Requirement (CAR) pertaining to facilities to be provided to passengers by airlines due to denied boarding, cancellation of flights and delays in flights.

"The amendment will allow the passenger, who is downgraded involuntarily and is carried in a class lower than that for which the ticket is purchased, to be reimbursed by the airline," DGCA said in a statement on Wednesday.



depending on the distance covered by the particular flight. The new norms will be effective from February 15, a senior official at the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA)

said on Wednesday. The regulator decided to amend the norms against the backdrop of complaints from air travellers about their tickets booked for a particular class being downgraded by airlines. In December last year, DGCA had proposed that airlines

should have to refund the full value of such tickets, including taxes, and also that affected passenger will be flown free of cost in the next available class. However, those proposals have been modified now in line with international practices,

The watchdog has amended

the official said.

For the downgrade of a domestic flight ticket, the passenger concerned will get 75 per cent of the cost of ticket, including taxes, from the airline. In the case of downgrade of an

international ticket, a passenger will receive 30 per cent of the cost of ticket, including taxes, for flights flying 1,500 kilometres or less. Inclusive of taxes, the amount will be 50 per cent if the flight covers a distance between 1,500 and 3,500 kilometres, as per the statement.

The reimbursement amount will be 75 per cent of the cost of ticket, including taxes, for flights covering more than 3,500 kilometres.

The changes have been done to strengthen the rights of air travellers affected by downgrading of their tickets, the regulator said.

Court Okays Marriage Under Hindu Marriage Act Of Bride **Below 18: Report**

BENGALURU: The High Court of Karnataka has held that a marriage under the Hindu Marriage Act cannot be termed void even if the bride is below 18 years of age, Press Trust of India reported. A lower court had declared a marriage void under Section 11 of the Act but the High Court pointed out that this section does not include the condition

of the bride being 18. According to news agency Press Trust of India, overturn ing the Family Court order, the High Court Bench of Justice Alok Aradhe and Justice S Vishwajith Shetty, in their judgement, on January 12, said, "Section 11 of the Act deals with void marriages. The Act provides that any marriage solemnised after the commencement of the Act shall be void and the court may on the petition presented by either of the parties thereto, declare the same to be nullity if it contravenes the provisions of Clauses (i), (iv) and (v) of Section 5 of the Act. Thus, it is evident that clause (iii) of Section 5 of the Act, which provides that the bride has to be 18 years of age at the time of marriage, has been omitted from the pur-

view of Section 11 of the Act." Setting aside the trial court order passed on January 8, 2015, the High Court said. "The trial court has, however, failed to appreciate the aforesaid aspect of the matter." Sheela from Chennapatna Taluk had approached the High Court in 2015 against the order of the

Family Court. She had married Manjunath on June 15, 2012. After the wedding, Manjunath realised that Sheela's date of birth was September 6, 1995 and she was a minor at the time of marriage. So, he filed a petition before the Family Court to declare the marriage null and void under Section 11 of the Hindu Marriage Act. The Family Court held that on the date of marriage, Sheela was 16 years, 11 months, and 8 days old and had not completed 18 years of age as was required under Clause-3 of Section-5 of the HMA. It, therefore, declared the marriage void under Section 11 of the Act. However, her appeal before the High Court was admitted as it found that Clause-3 of Section-5 was not applicable to Section 11 which deals with void marriages.

Authorities Announce Traffic Diversions On Republic Day

Srinagar- The authorities on Wednesday issued an advisory regarding movement of traffic in Srinagar on January 26.

According to the advisory, various diversions have been ordered in view of the main R-Day function being held at Sher-i-Kashmir Stadium Sonwar here.

It said that no traffic shall be allowed from Panthachowk towards Dalgate and all motorists shall use highway-Nowgam-Natipora-Nowgam-Sanatnagar-Hyderpora Bypass to reach their destinations.

"No traffic shall be allowed from Dalgate towards Sher-i-Kashmir Stadium Sonwar. Motorists shall use Khonakhan-SRTC Bridge-Sangermal Road to reach their destinations," it said,

adding, "No vehicle shall be allowed towards Panthachowk via Dalgate Sonwar route. All motorists shall adopt M.A Road/Residen-Road/HSHS/Jahangir CV flyover-Rambagh-Chowk Natipora or Bhagat-Sanath Nagar route to reach their respective destinations.

It said no vehicle will be allowed from Radio Kashmir, Dalgate, Hotel Lalit, Sonwar and Rajbagh near Bridge towards the venue except for those carrying valid invitation cards and passes.

"General Public/Tourists are requested to adopt alternative routes to reach the Srinagar Airport to avoid any inconvenience," the advisory said, adding, "Commuters are requested to plan their movement diversion will be in place from 06:30 AM till 12:30 PM." However it said, medical emergencies will be facilitated.

City Records 1689 Accidents With 225 Deaths In Last Five Years

Srinagar: An average 337 accidents in a year claimed 45 people in Srinagar, showed official data

According to the figures accessed Srinagar witnessed 1689 accidents with 225 fatalities from 2018 till November 2022.

The official figures state that a total of 1739 people were injured in accidents in Srinagar during the period with June 2022 recording the highest number of fatalities comprising 11 deaths, and 39 injuries in 40 accidents.

The official data showed that 2018 recorded 375 accidents which resulted in 46 deaths and 383 injuries.

The subsequent year, which was marked with lockdown for months together after the abrogation of Article 370 in August 2019, recorded 310 accidents which resulted in the death of 45 persons and

323 injuries.

The year 2020 recorded 275 accidents of which 45 deaths were reported and 275 injuries.

The year 2021 recorded 331 accidents with 40 deaths and 347 injuries while the year 2022 till November witnessed a spike and recorded 398 accidents in which 49 fatalities and 411 injuries were reported.

Srinagar has been witnessing a spike in bike stunts by youngsters, underage driving besides other traffic violations. Srinagar Traffic Police said that they started a series of awareness programmes to sensitize youth towards adhering the traffic rules.

Last week, the Traffic Police authorities said that they are conducting a study on accidents in Srinagar and have so far identified some 'black spots' witnessing frequent mishaps. The report will be submitted to DC Srinagar-(KNO)

LoC Flare Up Leaves 19 Dead

AL.ANWALA- Some 17 Pakistan soldiers and two Indians were killed in one of the worst border flare-ups since a bloody battle fought by the two armies last year in Kargil, officials said on Saturday.

A frontline Indian commander said the fighting erupted at the Chamb sector late Friday, shortly after Pakistan thrashed India in a cricket tournament in Australia.

Brigadier Jasbir Singh told reporters a junior officer and a soldier of the Indian army were killed when they came under heavy firing and shelling. "Just as soon as the match got over, which Pakistan won, the Pakistanis started attacking our post. We then began, attacking them Singh said. "Until then the border was very quiet."

Brigadier Singh said his troops in retaliation destroyed a Pakistan army bunker across the border in the Chamb sector and killed at least 15 Pakistani soldiers:

Army spokesman Colonel Sruti Kant in New Delhi said 25 Pakistanis launched the raid which sparked the fighting, among the worst since the 10week clash that claimed 1,000 lives on both sides in Kashmir between May and July last year.

Two other Pakistani soldiers were shot in a separate clash in Sunderbeni, which is located close to Palanwala in Kashmir's southern region, Kant said.

Palanwala is on Kashmir's border with Pakistan and is located 85 kilometers (53 miles) northwest of Jammu, the state's winter capital.

Singh said the Indian troops had seized identity cards and Pakistani currency from the dead soldiers and that shelling was going on at Palanwala in an area nearly 10 kilometers (6.25 miles) long.

'We have also seized mortar launchers, medium machine guns and 20 boxes of ammunition from the Pakistani side. The identity cards show the dead Pakistani soldiers are from the Baluch regiment."

Dialogue In Offing

'n a surprise development. India has invited Pakistan foreign minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari to the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) foreign ministers' meeting in Goa being held in May. According to reports, the invite was sent through the Indian High Commission in Islamabad. Last week, Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif said in an interview to an Arab television channel that his country had learnt its lesson from three wars with India and wanted to live in peace with its neighbour. The invite to Bilawal is an attempt to build upon Sharif's overtures and see if relations with Pakistan can be normalized. No Pakistani foreign minister has visited India since 2011 and if the neighbouring country accepts the invitation, it can go a long way in improving their relations.

The relations between the two neighbours have fallen to their lowest since New Delhi withdrew Article 370 in August 2019. Before Sharif made his conciliatory remarks, there was an acrimonoius exchange between the foreign ministers of the two countries at the United Nations with Bilawal using uncharitable words against the prime minister Narendra Modi. After the bitterness of the exchange, it seemed hardly possible that the neighbours could reach out to each other let alone institute a dialogue. But here we are again. New Delhi has reached out to Islamabad despite Bilawal's intemperate comments. And we can all keep our fingers crossed about the direction, the relations between the two countries takes from hereon.

True, there have been attempts by the two countries to engage over the last three years. They reportedly talked on the back-channel and went back to observing ceasefire along the Line of Control since February 2021 which has since been holding. According to the defence ministry figures, only three minor incidents of "violations" have been recorded along the LoC since then. In comparison, 4,645 ceasefire violations were recorded during its peak in 2020.

The LoC truce holds out a hope that the two countries are in a position to resume their long-stalled dialogue. However, it won't also be easy. Pakistan wants to only discuss Kashmir and also seeks a reversal of the withdrawal of Article 370 which is not going to happen. India desires normal neighbourly relations with Islamabad in an environment free of terror, hostility, and violence. The positions of the two countries have thus become too irreconcilable to start a dialogue. But it is still possible that PM Modi and Sharif could take steps to break ice. In the interest of regional peace, the two neighbours need to transcend their differences and talk to each other. This alone will change the situation in the region for the better.

The State Of The Opposition And Bharat Jodo Yatra

n a recent column for the Indian Express, Pratap Bhanu Mehta reiterated a guiding maxim of democratic politics: "The fate of democracies often rests on the quality of the political Opposition." Ever since BJP assumed the reins of government in 2014, India's Opposition has been characterised by a conceptual and ideological chaos. It has been running around its tail because its intellectual capacities and political imaginations have been unable to process the explosion of uncontrolled forces unleashed by BJP's spectacular triumphs. Its response to BJP's onslaughts has been an odd mixture of reactionary politics, calculated expediency and, at times, uncomfortable quiescence. The Congress has been forced to recede into an unending winter of political irrelevance.

The Bharat Jodo Yatra is the first serious attempt by the Congress to arrest its decline. Currently in the last leg of its journey, the yatra will end on 30th January in Srinagar where it has invited twenty- one "like minded" parties, perhaps as a show of strength.

Since long, Rahul Gandhi, the scion of India's grand old party, has been reeling under the burden of his inheritance. Castigated by BJP as a privileged and indecisive politician. bereft of the common touch of his political adversary, Gandhi has struggled to steer his party out of troubled waters. The once mighty Congress has seen its prospects diminish in the face of high ranking defections, messy scandals and infighting.

During the course of the yatra. Rahul Gandhi has complained that the government has used all its institutional power to disadvantage the opposition and has pushed them out of platforms where they can reach the masses

In the face of this dour context, the Bharat Jodo Yatra is an innovative attempt to create a fresh political space. It seeks to invent a new language of political engagement suffused with a vocabulary of empathy, love and harmony. It seeks to contemporize a forgotten political truth - fraternity - a political ideal that has been summarily emptied out of "New India's" zeitgeist.

Detractors of Rahul Gandhi, along with cynical political pundits, have looked at the Bharat Jodo Yatra merely as the last-ditch attempt to revive the fortunes of the Congress party and to bolster its weakening national image. However, no political outfit should be expected to shun the considerations of realpolitik. In fact, linking party politics to politics in the larger sense is a rare sight in the Indian political theatre. Through an unrelenting campaign, Modi's BJP has been peddling its own worldview as the only legitimate form of national self-identification. Quite inventively, the yatra is being styled as a national movement, dissociated from immediate political calculus, to recapture a sense of collective identity amid plurality. In India, politics is often reduced merely to a periodic exercise of popular authorization. To the yatra's credit, it is expanding the category of the "political" beyond the electoral and opening space for new possibilities for the articulation of dissent and the creation of new axes of mobilisation in a political context dominated by sharp divisions, growing hate and rising inequalities. The act of reaching out to citizens and not voters is aimed towards widening social reach. In this context, the Bharat Jodo Yatra, seen as an act of political improvisation, holds the potential to create new forms of self-identification that are egalitarian and inclusive rather than exclusivist. While it is audacious to not reduce politics to elections, to restrict it to a moral pursuit is plain naivety. Whether we like it or not, the fate of India as a multiparty democracy is inextricably tied with the fate of the Congress party. As of now, it seems that the momentum generated by the yatra has reenergized the comatose carders of the Congress. Will this newfound energy be enough to make a differ-

ence in the electoral calculus? This question will remain salient because any new idiom of resistance cannot remain indifferent to electoral outcomes if it seeks to transform into a durable and alternative brand of politics. The logic of numbers is structurally woven into the systemic fabric of electoral democracies. Will the yatra then, rejuvenate the Congress?

The yatra has managed to put some wind in Congress's sails. It is already witnessing a reversal of fortunes in its favour, at least in Jammu and Kashmir. Many founding members of the Democratic Azad Party have jumped ship again and re-joined the Congress where they have been welcomed back with open arms. The return of the defectors is indicative of the positive change in

cloud of doubt.

Having said that, the success of the yatra must not be judged on the endorsements of other political parties alone. It must also be assessed from the new refrains that it inserts into the discursive space.

BJP's uncontested triumphs and Modi's imprint on India's political culture is so deep that its idiom has become the default language of political engagement. India's social and political climate has metamorphosed under Modi. Standards of acceptable discourse in public and social life have significantly deteriorated over the years. The line in the sand between popular authorization and majoritarianism has become faint with the passage of time. The opposition has watched helplessly as the imposing wave of strongman

politics that is decent, sobering and reciprocal – a welcome change from the shouting matches that define the soundscape of our public discourse. But there are reasons to worry.

The Congress and the liberal anglophone commentariat often respond to the crisis of our present moment by seeking comfort in the mythical certainties of a past that never was. During his long march, Rahul Gandhi has raised pertinent issues that adversely affect the quotidian lives of people - inequality. unemployment and inflation. But neither him, nor his party, make any attempts to figure out why the crisis of democracy emerged against the backdrop of obscene inequalities, unchecked liberalisation and an ever-expanding precariat at a time when cold numbers suggested a

The lack of internal democracy within the party has resulted in crippling factionalism and incoherence. The brisk traffic of defectors from the Congress to the BJP is an indication of the absence of a comprehensible ideological framework. This is perhaps why the future of the Congress as the fulcrum of opposition unity remains under a

n January 19, Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan announced on social media that the state government will grant menstrual leave for female students in all state universities under the Department of Higher Education. The announcement came shortly after the Cochin University of Science and Technology (CUSAT) decided to provide menstrual leave to all its female students after a representation made by the students' union. Vijayan has described the government's decision as part of its "commitment to realising a gender-just society". The government's claim should inaugurate a wider conversation.

Making period leave available to students — and, going forward, to women in the workforce, perhaps - would be an important step towards acknowledging and addressing the often debilitating pain and discomfort that so many are often forced to work through. Instituting period leave would help create workplaces and classrooms that are more inclusive and more accommodating. Yet, the context within which such policy decisions are taken matters. In a traditional society like India, where menstruation remains a taboo topic, it is possible that a special period leave could become another excuse for discrimination. The examples of similarly traditional societies like South Korea and Japan are not encouraging: Both countries have laws granting period leave, but recent surveys showed a decline in the number of women availing of it, citing the social stigma against menstruation. There is also the risk of medicalising a normal biological process, which could further entrench existing biases against women, as well as the possibility that the perceived financial and productivity cost of mandatory period leaves could make employers even more reluctant to hire women.

What is not in doubt is the necessity for a sustained conversation around menstrual leave - and menstrual health in general. There are some encouraging signs that governments have recognised this. In 1992, Bihar introduced period leave for working women, while the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare's Menstrual Hygiene Scheme, first implemented in 2011, seeks to increase access to sanitary napkins for adolescent girls in rural areas. The stigma around menstruation remains a challenge — the Menstruation Benefits Bill, first introduced in Parliament in 2017 and then in the Arunachal Pradesh Assembly in 2022, was withdrawn from the latter because the subject was deemed unsuitable for discussion in the "holy" institution. The task for governments would be to negotiate such obstacles while ensuring that the goals of gender justice and equality are met.

legislative assembly elections, they have continued to fail at stalling the rise of the BJP because they have not been able to get a grip on the national discourse. They have miserably failed at steering a national conversation that provides an alternate vision for India. Instead, they have, at their best, blurted incoherent ad-hoc reactions. At their worst, they have helplessly remained silent.

It is possibly for the first time in many years that the ruling party isn't setting the narrative but responding to the one designed by the Bharat Jodo Yatra. Using the political thrust of the yatra, Congress needs to rediscover itself and fashion its own voice. It needs to invent a durable language in which it can meaningfully offer a healthy expression to the immense reserve of resentment harboured by those who have been pushed to the margins of India's stumbling growth story. It must carry forward the momentum and energy from the yatra to cure the deep-seated blight within its organisation. It needs to invent an ideological repertoire for itself, and for the perusal of other parties opposed to the BJP, so that they can draw from its reserves to present a national counterpoint to the politics of the current regime. If the yatra's impact manages to enhance the Congress's capacity to facilitate the unity of the opposition, it will have achieved more than it had set out to do.

The greatest achievement of the yatra so far has been that Rahul Gandhi has decimated the tag of "pappu" stuck on his back by his detractors to paint him as an ignoramus dynast. He has proven that he isn't an entitled political dilettante and that he means serious business. His well-crafted videos that appear on our social media timelines seem to suggest that he practices a style of Congress as a coterie of disconnected technocratic elite isn't entirely misplaced either. After all, we did not arrive here in a day. All political parties – including the Congress must share the responsibility of ushering in a socio-cultural order that created an insatiable appetite for a strongman to emerge. Parties on the centre, and towards the left of the centre on India's political spectrum, emptied out of our zeitgeist a vocabulary through which the marginalised could make sense of their dispossession. They left the discontent of furious majorities unaddressed who felt betrayed by liberal India's failed promise of general prosperity. A nation shaped by the Congress set the stage for BJP's grand entry. As long as the Congress party and its allies don't look back at history with greater honesty, they will find themselves running on a political hamster wheel.

The task that lies ahead is to find a more acute diagnosis of the crises of our present moment. The Bharat Jodo Yatra must resist being frozen into a moment in India's political timeline. It has to continually strive towards transforming itself into a movement. The arduous work of translating the moral and ideological critique into sustainable politics will begin after the yatra ends on 30th of January. Until then, all eyes must remain on Srinagar.

Antibiotics and The Next Big Danger

S India struggles with the growing Omicron wave of COVID-19, another pandemic is gathering force that could someday be equally lethal. While India — and the rest of the world — was caught flat-footed by COVID-19, there is still time to prepare for this looming public health threat, if political and healthcare leaders act now.

Antibiotics have been hailed as the wonder drugs of the last century, helping nations conquer infections that once killed people in the millions. Yet over time, bacteria build up resistance to these wonder drugs, rendering them less effective and making new infections more deadly — a biologically dictated race for survival that leads to antimicrobial resistance or AMR.

How serious is the problem? According to a new Lancet report, AMR kills an estimated 1.27 million people every year. The same report found there were nearly 22 AMR-attributable deaths per 100,000 annually in South Asia, the second highest of all the regions examined. Already, more than 58,000 newborns in India succumb to neonatal sepsis each year. By 2050, the total annual death toll from AMR could hit 10 million globally, nearly double the number of COVID-19 fatalities since the pandemic began nearly two years ago.

Historically, new antibiotics were developed to protect people from mutating bacteria and the resulting infections. Today, the pipeline for antibiotics is nearly empty, a result of poor government policy, lack of awareness and skewed marketplace incentives.

Inappropriate use and overuse of antibiotics accelerate this process, making it harder and harder to defend against infections. Between 2000 and 2015, consumption of antibiotics more than doubled in India. Further, there are concerns that without appropriate policy action, global usage is projected to continue to increase by 2020, especially in LMICs. A report by the Public Health Foundation of India found that many prescriptions are handed out for illnesses that can't be treated by antibiotics at all. Even worse, antibiotics are routinely sold over the counter in India without a valid prescription.

A recent report by the Global Coalition on Aging found that India still has room for improvement when it comes to addressing AMR. Beyond the misuse of antibiotics, the report also cites a lack of funding both for AMR research and for implementation of India's National AMR Action Plan (NAP), which expired at the end of 2021.

There are, however, several important steps India can take to alleviate the deepening AMR crisis and position itself at the front of tackling the AMR challenge.

First, the Indian government needs to fully fund the core plans of the NAP and ensure the plan is being properly implemented. As part of this effort, the government must improve plan oversight, promote greater coor-



dination among stakeholders, and strengthen antibiotic stewardship programs to limit inappropriate use. Further, as only three states (Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, and New Delhi) have developed standalone action plans to date, the national government should compel all state governments to develop their own AMR action plans. In the coming year, India should also continue its work to develop its new National Action Plan, ensuring the new document is robust and comprehensive, yet practical and actionable.

Second, the government should build on current efforts to raise awareness by running large-scale campaigns to educate both care providers and patients about the growing danger of AMR. By educating providers about the dangers of overprescribing and the tradeoffs associated with inappropriate prescribing, and by informing patients about the need to use antibiotics more judiciously, India can make important strides in helping to optimize existing antimicrobials, while also curbing rates of resistance.

Third, India must work to strengthen infection prevention and control by improving water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) infrastructure and behavior, particularly in rural areas. Antibiotic waste from inadequately treated sewage (from human, veterinary, agricultural, manufacturing, and other sources) presents another serious concern that could also exacerbate AMR, and India should work to formulate a more effective regulatory framework to manage these issues.

Further, to play their part, more Indian manufacturers could consider adopting the AMR Industry Alliance's recently published AMR standard, a framework for good environmental management of the production of antibiotics, and science-based discharge targets. Additionally, the government should integrate environmental criteria, including AMR-relevant considerations, into its process for evaluating vendors and suppliers for contracts and tenders, to encourage sustainable manufacturing practices more in line with Nordic countries. Finally, Indian judicial bodies, like the National Green Tribunal, can continue to compel state and federal agencies to enforce existing manufacturing and discharge standards.

In the coming years, India also has the opportunity to show its global leadership in one area critical to fighting AMR: antibiotic innovation. India has a rapidly growing economy and a strong corps of trained scientific researchers, which it can leverage to spur antimicrobial development. To help achieve this, the government should create a national innovation fund, modeled off the successful CARB-X and AMR Action Fund programs. The government can also pass regulatory reforms to expedite approval of newly developed antibiotics. Moreover, the Indian government can continue to pursue AMR research partnerships — like the one recently forged with the United Kingdom — to develop the next generation of treatments to defeat-drug resistant infections

AMR has the potential to rival COVID-19 in terms of death and devastation. But this future path is not inevitable. India should act now to curb overuse of current antibiotics and restock the pipeline with new innovations that could emerge as the wonder drugs of the 21st century.

Bad Weather Halts Rahul's Yatra In Ramban

JAMMU: Bad weather and landslides on Wednesday led to the cancellation of the second leg of Rahul Gandhi's Bharat Jodo Yatra that was scheduled to start this afternoon in the nearby highway town of Banihal.

Amid incessant rains, Gandhi resumed the march from Ramban Wednesday morning but inclement weather forced its suspension. The march will now resume on Friday as tomorrow is a rest day.

The journey from Ramban to Banihal along the 270-km Jammu-Srinagar national highway - the only all-weather road linking Kashmir with the rest of the country -- is the most challenging due to several problematic stretches, including Panthiyal, Mehar and Magerkote which are prone to shooting of stones from the hillocks overlooking the arterial road.

Traffic on the highway was suspended Wednesday morning after heavy rains triggered shooting of stones at a few places in Ramban district that left a truck driver dead and two others injured.

"Due to poor weather conditions and landslides in the area, the afternoon leg of#Bharat Jodo Yatra in Ramban & Banihal has been cancelled. Tomorrow is a rest day and the Yatra will resume day after, January 27th at 8 am," Congress General Secretary and in-charge communication Jairam Ramesh tweeted.

Earlier in the day, J-K Pradesh Congress Committee spokesperson Jahanzaib Sirwal said the yatra resumed around 9 am from Bathi after an hour-long delay due to heavy rains and completed the first leg on day 131, covering the old alignment road via Maitra in Ramban town.

Govt Orders Creation Of 20 Posts For Setting Up TMG

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir administration on Wednesday ordered creation of 20 posts in different categories for setting up Terror Monitoring Group (TMG) to take action against hardcore sympathisers among government employees, including teachers for providing overt or covert support to militancy in the Union Territory.

According to an order, the sanctioned posts for TMG include that of a Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP), six posts each of Deputy Superintendent of Police (DySps), Inspectors and Head Constables besides one post of follower.

The creation of TMG comes over a year after the government formed State Investigation Agency (SIA)within the Iammu and Kashmir Police for speedy investigation and prosecution in militancy-related cases as well as coordinating with central agencies.

CHANDIGARH: Digital currency will further bolster the digital economy, make payment system more efficient, reduce cost involved in physical cash management and also contribute to further financial inclusion, RBI Executive Director Ajay Kumar Choudhary said on Wednesday.

Chaudhary was addressing an outreach seminar on 'Central Bank Digital Currency: The India Story' organised by the Reserve Bank of India. The event was organised ahead of a two-day International Financial Architecture Working Group meeting of G20 slated to take place on January 30 and 31 here.

The RBI has already launched pilots of CBDC (Central Bank Digital Currency) in wholesale and retail segments last year.

Chaodhary said the CBDC is just a digital form of the physical currency and will have all its characteristics.

It is non-remunerative that is it does not carry any interest like any currency, noted Choudhary, adding, "E-rupee is also expected to offer features of physical cash like safety and settlement of transactions.'

Govt To Sell 30 Lakh Tonnes Of Wheat From Buffer Stock

NEW DELHI: The government will sell 30 lakh tonnes of wheat in the open market from its buffer stock to control rise in prices of wheat and wheat flour (atta), sources said.

The average prices of atta have risen to around Rs 38 per kg. The food ministry will offload 30 lakh tonnes of wheat under the Open Market Sale Scheme (OMSS), they said. Wheat stocks will be sold to flour millers

and traders among others.

On January 19, Food Secretary Sanjeev Chopra had said the retail prices of wheat and wheat flour (atta) have increased and the government will soon take measures to control the rising rates.

Under the OMSS policy, the government allows state-run Food Corporation of India (FCI) to sell food grains, especially wheat and rice, at pre-determined prices in the open market from time to time to bulk consumers and private traders. The purpose is to boost the supply during the lean season and moderate the general open market prices.

Even the flour millers have demanded the government to offload wheat stocks from the FCI.

"We are finding that there is an uptick in the prices of wheat and atta. We are aware of the issue. Various options are being explored by the government and very soon we will come up with our response," Chopra had told reporters last week. PTI

Govt Raises Rs 8,000 Cr Via Maiden Auction Of SGrBs

MUMBAI- The first tranche of Sovereign Green Bonds (SGrBs) worth Rs 8,000 crore was subscribed fully on Wednesday.

As per the auction details provided by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), SGrB 2028 maturing in 2028 will have a coupon rate of 7.10, while SGrB 2033 maturing in 2033 will carry a rate of 7.29 per cent.

Coupon rates of Sovereign Green Bonds are very much in line with the G-Sec.

As announced in the Union Budget 2022-23, the central government as part of its overall market borrowings will be issuing SGrBs for mobilising resources for green infrastructure.

The second auction of another Rs 8,000 crore will be conducted on February 9.

SGrBs will be issued through uniform price auction and 5 per cent of the notified amount of sale will be reserved for retail investors, the RBI said, adding these papers will be reckoned as an eligible investment for SLR purposes.

These bonds will be eligible for trading in the secondary market.

The proceeds from the green bonds issuance cannot be used for extraction, production and distribution of fossil fuels or where the core energy source is fossil-fuel based, and nuclear power projects. PTI

Air India Offers Nearly 98 **Crore Shares To Employees**

MUMBAI/NEW DELHI- Air India has offered around 98 crore shares of the company to its permanent employees as part of a stock option scheme. The shares are also being offered to the permanent staff of Air India Express as part of the Employees' Share Benefit (ESB) Scheme 2022, according to a document.

The Tata group took over the control of Air India and Air India Express from the government on January 27, 2022.

An airline official told PTI that around 8,000 employees will benefit from the scheme.

"In accordance with the share purchase agreement signed as part of the disinvestment process, Air India has initiated the Employee Share Benefit Scheme for eligible employees who were in service with the airline on the date of privatisation.

"We will be working with the relevant employees to help them understand the long term benefits and avail of the same," an Air India spokesperson said in a statement.

Those who were permanent employees at the two carriers -- Air India and Air India Express -- at the time of the takeover will be eligible to participate in the scheme where the share is offered at a price of 27 paise apiece, as per the document sent to the staff.

A source said the price is at a discount compared to the book value of 87-90 paise per share at the time of acquisition. PTI

Sensex, Nifty Tumble More Than 1% On F&O Expiry

MUMBAI- Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty tanked more than 1 per cent on Wednesday due to heavy selling pressure in banking and financial shares amid unabated foreign capital outflows.

The 30-share BSE barometer plunged by 773.69 points or 1.27 per cent to 60,205.06 as 22 of its scrips declined while eight advanced.

The index opened lower and later fell nearly 900 points during the day to touch a low of 60,081.36 as investors closed their positions on the last day of derivatives expiry.

The broader Nifty of the National Stock Exchange declined sharply by 226.35 points or 1.25 per cent to close below the 18,000 level at 17,891.95. As many as 35 of its scrips ended in the red and 15 gained.

"Indian equities witnessed a significant sell-off as the market appeared apprehensive ahead of the upcoming Union Budget and Fed meeting next week," Vinod Nair, Head of Research at Geojit Financial Services. said.

"Sentiments were dampened by persistent FII selling, where funds are being shifted to other EMs as a result of attractive valuations. Furthermore, a weak economic growth outlook that stoked recession fears pulled down global markets," Nair said. PTI

'India Should Consider Reducing TDS Rate On Crypto Trade

NEW DELHI: India should consider lowering the 1 per cent TDS on cryptocurrency trade as a high rate is causing a flight of capital and users to platforms in foreign jurisdictions and the grey market, a report said on Tuesday.

The 'Impact Assessment of 1 per cent TDS on VDAs' report by Chase India and Indus Law said the crypto platforms/exchanges must also perform customer due diligence which can help uncover any potential future risk.

"The existing 1 per cent TDS on crypto trade, combined with the absence of comprehensive regulations, is causing a flight of capital and users to platforms in foreign jurisdictions and the grey market," it said.

The government, from April 1 last year, has brought in a 30 per cent income tax plus surcharge and cess on transfer of virtual digital assets (VDAs), including cryptocurrencies, like Bitcoin, Ethereum, Tether and Dogecoin.

Also, to keep a tab on the money trail, a 1 per cent TDS has been brought in on payments over Rs 10,000 towards virtual digital currencies.

It also suggested that for the purpose of safety and oversight, the government must ask all crypto exchanges/platforms to conduct a detailed e-KYC authentication on all investors/traders in line with the Aadhaar rules. PII

Women's Premier League: BCCI Earns Rs 4669.99 Crore From 5 Teams

MUMBAI: The BCCI on Wednesday earned a Rs 4669.99 crore windfall for the sale of five teams in the inaugural Women's Premier League (WPL) with Adani Sportsline shelling out a massive Rs 1289 crore for the Ahmedabad team, which emerged the most expensive franchise.

IPL team owners Mumbai Indians, Royal Challengers Bangalore and Delhi Capitals made successful bids of Rs 912.99 crore, Rs 901 crore and Rs 810 crore respectively to enter the WPL.

Capri Global Holdings got the Lucknow franchise for Rs 757 crore.

"Today is a historic day in cricket as the bidding for teams of inaugural #WPL broke the records of the inaugural Men's IPL in 2008! Congratulations to the winners as we garnered Rs.4669.99 Cr in total bid," BCCI secretary Jay Shah tweeted.

Earlier this month, the BCCI sold

the media rights of the Women's Premier League to Viacom18 for Rs 951 crore, getting a Rs 7.09 crore per match value for five years.

Adani Group, which had failed to buy an IPL team when the Lucknow and Ahmedabad franchises were up for sale in 2021, has made its official entry into Indian cricket by securing a women's team for WPL. Many were already calling the

league Women's IPL but BCCI secretary revealed the name on Wednesday.

"The BCCI has named the league Women's Premier League (WPL). Let the journey begin. "Today is a historic day in cricket

This marks the beginning of a revolution in women's cricket and paves the way for a transformative journey ahead not only for our women cricketers but for the entire sports fraternity. "The #WPL would bring



necessary reforms in women's cricket and would ensure an allencompassing ecosystem that benefits each and every stakeholder," Shah said in a series of tweets. The eight franchisees in the men's IPL were sold for USD 723.59 million before the maiden edition in 2008. The WPL player auction will take

place next month with the first edition to be played in March.

The BCCI on Monday had cleared 17 technical bids for the closed door bidding that was held in a five star hotel here on Wednesday. As many as seven IPL franchisees were in the race and the ones to miss out were Punjab Kings, Kolkata Knight Riders, Rajasthan Royals and Sunrisers Hyderabad. Among the outsides, multinational sweets and snacks company Haldiram's too had sub-

mitted its bid on Monday. The BCCI had not set any base price for the sale of teams.

A total of 22 games will be played in the inaugural season with the top-ranked team in the league stage qualifying directly for the final. The second and third placed teams will battle out for a place in the title clash.

Each team will have a purse of Rs 12 crore at the players' auction next month and will need to buy a minimum of 15 players and maximum of 18. Up to five overseas players, including one from associate, will be allowed in the playing eleven. "India's women cricketers have always made the nation proud in the global sporting arena - be it the World Cup, Asian Cup or the recent Commonwealth Games! "This new Women's League will once again shine a global spotlight on the talent, power, and potential of our girls. I'm sure our Women's MI team will take the Mumbai Indians brand of

fearless and entertaining cricket to a new level altogether," said Mumbai Indians owner Nita Ambani.

Mumbai Indians also have their presence in the ongoing ILT20 in UAE and SA20 in South Africa.

The Diageo-owned RCB franchise said it was patiently waiting to become part of women's cricket.

"We held back all our investments in overseas teams to own a team that aligns with this philosophy and core value, and it gives us immense pleasure to have marked this accomplishment positively," said RCB chairman Prathmesh Mishra in a statement.

Cong Begging Regional Parties For Crowds For BJY In J&K: DAP

Jammu: Alleging that the Congress is "begging" for crowds from regional parties for the success of the Bharat Jodo Yatra in Jammu and Kashmir, the Democratic Azad Party (DAP) headed by Ghulam Nabi Azad on Wednesday said the local leadership of the national party are misleading Rahul Gandhi on the ground reality.

The DAP's remarks came a day after Gandhi said 90 percent of Azad's colleagues have returned to the Congress fold and now he has been left alone.

"The Congress leader is mis-led by the people surround-ing him about the facts and ground situation. The reality is that the DAP has white washed Congress in J-K," DAP general secretary and former minister R S Chib said in a statement here.

Referring to former deputy chief minister Tara Chand and former MLA Balwan Singh who returned to the Congress, Chib said they, along with former minister Manohar Lal Sharma, were expelled from the party by the DAP chairman.

"While one (Sharma) who holds the constituency later reioined the DAP, the remaining two have no political constituency," he claimed.

Chib said the desertions in the Congress after the formation of the DAP has rattled the grand old party at the core and is now working in damage control mode. "Ever since the Bharat Jodo Yatra entered Jammu and Kashmir, the local



leadership (of Congress) has been begging for the crowds to local political parties. They have lost their ground in Jammu and Kashmir and that is the reality.' Accusing Gandhi of faking his love and sympathy for the people of J-K, Chib said the Congress is maintaining a "deliberate silence on issues like Article 370 abrogation, land, jobs and the recent terror strikes in Jammu and Kashmir." "Even he is walking alongside

the leaders who spoke against the Indian Army. Taking along such anti-national elements reflects the mindset of the Congress towards the nation,' the DAP leader, apparently referring to Congress leader and former Madhya Pradesh chief minister Digvijaya Singh who triggered a controversy by questioning the surgical strikes. Gandhi himself had snubbed Singh, termed his comments "ridiculous" and said the armed forces are doing their job "exceptionally well" and do not need to give any proof.

Substantial Increase In Project Completions: CS

JAMMU: Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta today remarked that J&K has come a long way in improving both the quality and magnitude of expenditure in the last couple of years which has resulted in five fold increase in number of projects completed. He made these remarks

while speaking in a meeting to review the expenditure out of Capex budget 2022-23 by different departments.

The meeting was attended by the Administrative Secretaries, Directors of Finance and other concerned officers from different departments. Srinagar based officers

participated in the meeting through video conferencing. At the outset, the Chief

Secretary impressed upon the Administrative Secretaries to look out for the projects that are nearing completion so that funds are provided for their early culmination. He urged them to accelerate the pace of expenditure so that no part remains to be unspent before the given period.

Dr Mehta maintained that J&K has improved on many indices continuously from the last few years. He gave out that the developmental curve has seen an upward trend with enhanced focus on both quality and quantity of work

done on ground. Chief Secretary The stressed on continuing this pace and momentum of development and reforms in



administration so that the objective of less government more governance is achieved effectively. He enumerated that the UT has been successful in moving up the ladder on number of developmental parameters. He elucidated that whether it is digitization of land records, construction of roads under PMGSY, tourist arrivals, sports infrastructure or activities, industrial Investments etc, J&K happens to be an example in fast tracking development.

In terms of reforms, he observed that the UT has done a transformative job. He stated that a year or so before, it was unimaginable to think of Digital J&K, which is a reality today. He reiterated that no goal fixed ever has remained too far for J&K to achieve. He stated that the reforms taken by the LG administration had been first of their kind in the history of J&K.

He said that be it District Good Governance Index, Departmental Deliverables, saturation of individual programmes, beneficiary Aspirational blocks.

Aspirational Panchayats, introduction of e-office or other measures, J&K has attained a distinction in moving towards a more vibrant, responsive, transparent and accountable system in these years.

The Chief Secretary urged the officers to make preparations for effectively implementing the next year budget. He advised them to have ambitious targets and achieve them efficiently. He made out that each of these set targets should be followed dedicatedly by all of them. He directed for conducting monthly meetings to assess the progress at apex level besides departmental meetings regularly by the respective Administrative Secretaries to achieve the targets efficiently on time.

The Chief Secretary also said that number of projects likely to be completed in 22-23 is likely to be around 65,000 which shall be more than seven times of number of projects completed in 18-19, reflecting the emergence of new work culture in J&K.

Devotees Rejoice As Wait For Snow Ends On Kanchoth **Festival In Bhaderwah**

Bhaderwah: The wait for snowfall in this picturesque valley of Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district ended on Wednesday, coinciding with the local 'Kanchoth' festival -- a symbol of the ancient Nag culture.

Believing it to be a good omen for humanity in general and their community in particular, women devotees dressed in their colourful best thronged temples in the snow and, as per tradition, broke their fasts.

The festival is celebrated by Nag devotees across the Chenab Valley -- Doda, Kishtwar and Ramban districts, besides some parts of Udhampur and Kathua districts in the Jammu region and Himachal Pradesh's Chamba district.

Followers of Lord Vasuki Nag believe that on this day of 'Gouri Tritiya', Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati got married and the latter insisted on a throne made of snow as a wedding gift. As a result, snow during the festival is considered a good omen.

The main programmes were reported from Mathola, Ghata, Khakhal, Gupt Ganga, Chinnote, Jatani, Katyara, Hanga and Chinchora where women prayed for long lives for their husbands, officials said.

"The occasion has great significance in the life of every married woman. The day is considered pious for women as they can pray to Goddess Gauri for the long and healthy lives of their husbands," said a local priest

Kanchoth is essentially a one-day event but the

operations started after the visibility improved, they added.

Incessant rains also triggered shooting stones at a few places in Ramban district leading to the closure of the vital highway.

An official of the traffic department said the shooting stones from the hillocks overlooking the highway at a couple of places between Charkote and Banihal forced suspension of traffic.

Shooting stones rolled down at Magarkote area of the Ramban district during wee hours hitting a tanker (JK02BL-8177) and truck (JK18A- 6968), the official said.

He said that the driver of the truck identified as Muneeb Tak of Supat Kulgam died on the spot. The two injured persons were immediately evacuated to Sub district hospital Banihal.

the world properly knows just how close the India-Pakistan rivalry came to spilling over into a nuclear conflagration in February 2019. The truth is, I don't know precisely the answer either; I just know it was too close," Pompeo writes.

India's warplanes pounded a Jaish-e-Mohammed training camp in Balakot in Pakistan in February 2019 in response to the Pulwama militant attack that killed 40 CRPF iawans.

"I'll never forget the night I was in Hanoi, Vietnam when - as if negotiating with the North Koreans on nuclear weapons wasn't enough - India and Pakistan started threatening each other in connection with a decadeslong dispute over the northern border region of Kashmir," Pompeo says.

"After an Islamist terrorist attack in Kashmirprobably enabled in part by Pakistan's lax counterterror policies - killed forty Indians India responded with an air strike against terrorists inside Pakistan. The Pakistanis shot down a plane in a subsequent dogfight and kept the Indian pilot prisoner," he said. "In Hanoi, I was awakened to speak with my Indian counterpart. He believed the Pakistanis had begun to prepare their nuclear weapons for a strike. India, he informed me, was contemplating its own escalation. I asked him to do nothing and give us a minute to sort things out (sic)," Pompeo writes in his book, which wrongly refers to Swaraj as "he". "I began to work with Ambassador (then National Security Advisor John) Bolton, who was with me in the tiny secure communications facility in our hotel. I reached the actual leader of Pakistan, (Army chief) General (Qamar laved) Baiwa, with whom I had engaged many times. I told him what the Indians had told me. He said it wasn't true," Pompeo says. "As one might expect, he believed the Indians were preparing their nuclear weapons for deployment. It took us a few hours - and remarkably good work by our teams on the ground in New Delhi and Islamabad - to convince each side that the other was not preparing for nuclear war," the 59-year-old top former American diplomat wrote in his book.

Meanwhile, the minimum temperatures improved across the Valley.

The mercury in Srinagar settled at a low of zero degree Celsius -- up from minus 2.3 degrees Celsius. Qazigund, the gateway to the Kashmir Valley, registered a low of minus 0.2 degrees Celsius, the officials said.

According to the traffic department, there were some incidents of shooting stones amid rains at some places along the Srinagar-Jammu national highway, but the traffic was through.

It also advised people not to take the highway between Nashri and Banihal till the Congress' Bharat Jodo Yatra passed through.

"In view of the Bharat Jodo Yatra from Ramban towards Banihal, no vehicular movement shall be allowed from Qazigund towards Banihal-Ramban and from Nashri towards Ramban-Banihal," the traffic department said.

Kokernag in south Kashmir recorded a low of minus 0.7 degrees Celsius, while the minimum temperature in Kupwara settled at minus 0.6 degrees Celsius.

In Gulmarg, the minimum temperature was minus 4.6 degrees Celsius up from minus 9.5 degrees Celsius. It was the coldest place in Jammu and Kashmir.

Pahalgam recorded a minimum temperature of minus 2.6 degrees Celsius, up six notches from the previous night.

Meanwhile, the meteorological department forecast a brief spell of rain and snowfall on Thursday morning and mainly dry weather on January 27 and 28.

"On January 26, the weather is expected to be generally cloudy with the possibility of a brief spell of light rain and snow in the morning hours," a MeT official said.

He said on January 27-28, mainly dry weather (80%) was expected while there is possibility of light to moderate snow/rain likely from 29th night -30 (60%).

The MeT department urged people living or commuting in snowbound areas not to venture out, unless in an emergency. He said there are possibilities of avalanches as hilly areas of J&K and Kargil district of Ladakh have already received very heavy snowfall.

In an order, Union Home Secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla issued several amendments in the Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Act, 2000 and Jammu and Kashmir Municipal Corporation Act, 2000 carried through the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization (Adaptation of State Laws) Order, 2020.

The National Conference and the People Democratic Party (PDP) were earlier up in arms about the Centre's decision. Following the controversy, LG Manoj Sinha stated that the government will not levy any property tax in the Union Territory.

"Speculations are rife that property tax will be levied from people of Jammu and Kashmir. I am assuring you in clear terms that no such tax would be levied in J&K by the UT administration", he told reporters in Baramulla.

However, sources said the government has finally decided to go ahead with the policy and that a proper SRO will be issued shortly.

"There are a number of centrally sponsored schemes that are meant for states and UTs, however they aren't applicable to those regions where the property tax is not collected. So the government has decided to impose the Act now," said an official, wishing not to be named.

He said that the tax of residential and commercial properties will be different which will be decided by the government in the SRO.

"Ofcourse the tax on commercial building will be high than residential building," he said, adding "The officials from the revenue department will decided after evaluating the rates of the land and the property of the area,

He further said that the Government will be imposing property tax through urban local bodies (Municipal Corporation, Committees) in their respective areas across Union Territory.

Principal Secretary, Housing and Urban Development Department, Dheeraj Gupta did not respond to repeated calls from the reporter.

India-Pak Were

There was no immediate comment from the Ministry of External Affairs on Pompeo's claims.

We all shared the view that America had to make a bold strategic effort to tighten our ties with India and break the mold with new ideas," Pompeo writes in his book.
