Jammu: The Jammu and Kashmir Services Selection Board (JKSSB) will conduct the deferred computer-based written tests (CBT) soon, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha said on Wednesday, reiterating that transparent and merit-based selection is the top most priority of his administration.

He also welcomed the Rs 1.18 lakh crore budget announced by the Centre for Jammu and Kashmir and said this will help the "new J&K" to reach new heights of development.

India Invites Pak DM For SCO Meet Press Trust Of India

New Delhi: India has invited Pakistan Defence Minister Khawaja Asif for a meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) next month along with his counterparts from other member nations of the grouping, people familiar with the development said on Wednesday.

The invite to Asif for the April 28 meeting was sent by India in its capacity as current chair of the eight-nation SCO, weeks after a similar communication was sent to Islamabad inviting Pakistan Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari for a foreign ministerial conclave of the grouping that is scheduled to be held in May.

"The invites to ministers and officials concerned of the SCO member nations for respective meetings are being sent as part of laid down norms," one of the people cited above said. They said Pakistan defence

minister Asif was sent an invitation through the Indian high commission in Islamabad for the defence ministerial meeting.

India is also set to send separate invites to Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Chinese President Xi Jinping and Russian President Vladimir Putin for the annual SCO summit later this year.

Mild Fever May Help Clear Infections Faster Than Medicines: Study

It may be better to let a mild fever run its course rather than reaching for medicines, suggests a new animal study which found that slight temperature could help clear infections faster.

The study, published in the journal Immunology and Inflammation, shows that a mild fever helped fish clear their bodies of infection rapidly, controlled inflammation and repaired tissue damage.

"We let nature do what nature does, and in this case it was very much a positive thing," said immunologist Daniel Barreda, lead author of the study, from the University of Alberta in Canada.

"Moderate fever is self-resolving, meaning that the body can both induce it and shut it down naturally without medication," Barreda explained.

The researchers noted that health advantages of natural fever to humans still have to be confirmed through research, "but because the mechanisms driving and sustaining fever are shared among animals, it is reasonable to expect similar benefits are going to happen in humans."

The research showed that natural fever offers "an integrative response that not only activates defences against infection, but also helps control it," Barreda said.

The researchers found that fever helped to clear the fish of infection in about seven days --half the time it took for those animals not allowed to exert fever. Fever also helped to shut

down inflammation and repair tissues that had been injured, they added.

Admin Intensifies Market Checking In Srinagar Ahead Of Ramadan

Srinagar: The Food Safety Department Srinagar intensified market checking in various parts of the District and imposed fine on erring Food Business Operators (FBOs) violating FSSA standards and regulations.

A special team of officers headed by Assistant Commissioner Food Safety, Yameen Ul Nabi, Designated Officer under FSSA Srinagar on the directions of the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz conducted rigorous Asad market checking of various food business units including restaurants, fast food outlets, tea stalls and ethnic street food makers.

During the intensive market checking a fine of Rs 65000 was imposed on 34 Food Business Units operating in various areas of Srinagar for insanitary conditions and violation of Food Safety Regulations 2011.

In addition, 5 improvement notices were also issued to the dealers with the directions to take necessary steps to improve their premises/ food operations as per the stan-

Srinagar: Amid an increase in the footfall of visitors at the sprawling historic Badamwari garden in Srinagar's old city, Authorities on Wednesday said there is around 60 percent of flower bloom in the garden and that the peak is likely to be witnessed by 'next week'.

Imran Ahmad, an official at the department looking after the city parks said the full bloom is subject to weather conditions and that the flower bloom on almond trees at Badamwari garden started in the first week of March.

"So far, there is 60 percent

bloom in the garden and if the weather remains dry and warm, we can witness the full flower bloom by next week," he said, adding the life of the flower petals is very sensitive and if there is wet weather, the flowers may fall down from almond trees, thus cutting down the lifespan of the blossom.

Full Bloom By Next Week'

In an appeal, the official said the visitors should avoid littering in the green lawns and use dustbins instead. "Park is meant for people, and they can sit and enjoy but should avoid throwing any leftover food, empty bottles of cold drinks or juices or polythene inside the flower beds or green lawns as it takes us a full day to clean the area," he urged.

Badamwari garden is one of the major sources of attraction for nature lovers and tourists, especially during spring, when there is a bloom of flowers on almond trees here.

The garden is situated on the foothills of Koh-e-Maran and is spread around 300 kanals dotted with trees, flowers and cascades, providing a soothing experience to the visitors

In summer, families from across the valley, mostly from the Srinagar areas, often visit the park in the afternoon and have namkeen (salt) tea with large-sized parathas fried in oil and the famous 'Nader Monje' Kashmiri handmade snacks.

Vajpayee Is The Prime Minister

Srinagar- The soft spoken and moderate face of the right wing Bhartiya Janata Party, Atal Behari Vajpayee is the next prime minister of India. The president K Narayanan, late tonight formally appointed Vajpayee as the prime minister, after Congress president Sonia Gandhi expressed her inability to stake claim to the power as the party didn't have the requisite number to form a government on its own, though "informal consultations" were go ng on with the like-minded parties. However what seems to have prompted the president to invite Vajpayee to form the government was the statement made by United Front leader and president of Tamil Manila Congress (TMC) GK Moopanar, that the UF had "no role to play in the formation of the government at the center" as the Congress decided against staking the claim for the same.

"Right now OF has virtually no role" Moopanar told newsmen after an hour long meeting of the OF leaders held at prime minis-ter I K Gujral's residence, 7, Race Curse Road.

The swearing in ceremony of Vajpayee led government is scheduled to take place on Thursday, March, 19, the prime minis-ter designate told reporters after his meeting with the president. The president has asked Vajpayee to prove his majority within 10 days of being sworn in Last time Vajpayee was given 13 days' time to prove his majority, which he failed to do and had to resigr n a huff. Vajpayee said he would consult his party colleagues and allies on composition of his cabinet and its size.

The number of MPs supporting BJP led coalition comes to ust 264, which is short of the half way mark in the house of 539. However when seen in the context of the decision taken by Telgu Desam Party (TDP), to remain neutral when the heads will be ounted, the number of 264 does cross that limit required for a simple majority for the BJP led coalition.

Meanwhile, in a volte-face, AIADMK and two of its allies oday decided to join a BJP-led coalition ministry at the Centre clearing any last minute hitch which may come in the way of President K.R. Nayaranan inviting A.B. Vajpayee to head the next vernment

BJP prime ministerial candidate Vajpayee's special emissary aswant Singh, who air dashed to Chennai successfully persuaded AIADMK general secretary Jayalalitha to change her mind about not joining the government and extending unconditional support to the BJP.

Congress tonight "accepted" President K.R. Narayanan's decision to invite BJP leader Atal Bihari Vajpayee to form the govern-ment but made it clear that it would attempt to defeat the coalition luring the confidence motion.

Asked to comment on the development, party spokesman V.N. Gadgil said the president has gone by the text-book and as per Supreme Court judgement of inviting the single largest party to form the government.

We accept the president's decision. But we will try to defeat the government during the confidence motion.

Meanwhile CPM has charged BJP with going to "any extent" for the sake of power and said it would be difficult for BJP to run a government with its allies laying down various conditions.

Reacting to AIADMK supremo Jayalalitha's decision to join a BJP-led government, CPIM general secretary Harkishan Singh Surjeet said "it is clear that BJP is going to any extent for grabbing power." (Kashmir Observer, 16 March, 1998)

Pakistan On The Brink

akistan Police and supporters of former Prime Minister Imran Khan have been clashing outside his residence in Lahore over the last two days, ahead of his arrest. Khan is facing arrest after being convicted by the court in October last year for unlawfully selling gifts from Toshakhana (treasure house) to foreign dignitaries. But the reason for the arrest has become beside the point here. Truth is that Khan has become immensely popular in the country after he lost power in a vote of no-confidence last year. Khan has been claiming his government was toppled by the United States miffed with his growing closeness to Russia and China. He has been demanding the resignation of the government and the holding of the fresh elections. Last year, soon after his ouster, Khan has held successive mass rallies to force the government out of power. While the Pakistan government, backed by the military establishment, is unlikely to resign in the near term, Khan's stubborn political campaign has destabilized the country. At the same time, his popularity has skyrocketed and in case of an election, he is expected to return to power with a landslide majority.

However, Pakistan is not only facing a political turmoil. Over the last two years, the country has careened from crisis to crisis: political, economic and on a security front. Pakistan economy is on the verge of a default with agreement with the International Monetary Fund far from being concluded. The IMF is putting stringent conditions before it advances loan to bail out the country.

On the other hand, after a relative peace for some years, Tehreek Taliban Pakistan has again become a major security challenge for Pakistan. In recent months, the TTP has mounted several daredevil attacks on Pakistan's security installations. This, in turn, has also spoiled Pakistan's relations with the Taliban government in Afghanistan, otherwise considered Islamabad's allies. Ongoing economic and political turmoil have only compounded the country's mounting security challenges. This has created an alarming situation for Islamabad. And the resurgence of the TTP threatens to make things worse. Islamabad's dialogue last year with the TTP which was mediated by Afghan Taliban came to naught as the former refused to budge from its rigid position. There is no hope for a fresh engagement. So, the conflict looks set to continue. And considering the complexities involved, nobody expects a dramatic breakthrough in the near future. The existing situation looks set to continue for a long time before getting any better. But the TTP insurgency is only one part of the larger and layered security nightmare that is Af-Pak region. The scenario for the immediate future looks bleak. The region has already undergone a profound geo-political transformation following US exit from Afghanistan in 2021. This situation has some unsettling dimensions and unless the countries of the region especially India and Pakistan, come together and jointly address the problems that have arisen post US withdrawal, the new forces and factors which are likely to be unleashed could detrimentally impact the region.

ammu and Kashmir Service Selection Board is a staff recruiting board constituted by the Government of Jammu and Kashmir that conducts examinations to various departmental services or non-ga zette posts in the union territory of Jammu and Kashmir. It was established in 1992 as a constitutional body. The board is headed by its chairman who is responsible for the recruitment process, JKSSB policy formulation, and its implementation. The board Chairman including other members is appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. The LG has the right to determine the number of members as well as the members of the commission and their terms of service.

JKSSB: The

Incredibly Uncredible

JKSSB has done recruitment for almost every department of J&K in the past. The board is in news due to recent scams and corruption in the recruitment process of FAA, JE and JKPSI. The board has been in news for scams in the past as well but the elected governments never got those allegations investigated. One such scam was alleged in the list of Fire & Emergency Services in which people believed a mass corruption. The board got the biggest setback in June 2022 when a scam in the recruitment process of Jammu and Kashmir Police Sub Inspector (JKPSI), Finance Accounts Assistant (FAA) and Junior Engineer (JE civil) was alleged. LG Administration ordered a timely probe into the allegations and constituted a special committee for the purpose. All these exams were conducted by M/S Meritrac Pvt. Ltd. The said company was already blacklisted by ONGC (public sector undertaking) for paper leaks. In August 2022, all the three exams were cancelled and investigation was handed over to the CBI. It was recorded that OMR sheets were replaced to help candidates crack the exam. FIR was lodged and raids were conducted at more than 100 places in J&K and other states. This was for the first time in the recent past in J&K that a recruitment exam was cancelled due to corruption. The LG Administration was applauded for this bold move and everyone thought that it's the beginning of corruption free J&K. The only negative in the process was that no JKSSB official was arrested for their misconduct and no aspirant was debarred from appearing in further examination even after being part of daylight corruption. JKSSB's credibility was at stake and now the biggest challenge was to conduct re-exam of cancelled posts. Everyone was of the opinion that after such shame and backlash, JKSSB will take every move with utmost transparency. Yet, JKSSB was not looking for redemption. Tendering process to shortlist a firm to conduct exams was again started. In November 2022, JKSSB selected

M/S Aptech Pvt Ltd to conduct the exams of cancelled posts and other pending exams. Eyebrows were again raised on JKSSB's credibility as the selected company was blacklisted in UP for paper leak for 3 years. Aspirants alleged that JKSSB changed the tender clause to favour Aptech. Aspirants dragged this matter to court and Honourable High Court acknowledged the allegations. The High Court of J&K ordered judicial enquiry into the matter. The court also ordered to quash the tender given to Aptech and stop the recruitment process at whatever stage they were on 8th Feb 2023

JKSSB successfully got a stay on the Single Bench order in Division Bench on technical grounds that it was not given a chance to be heard. Honourable High Court passed direction to carry on with the recruitment process till a final decision is made. It further directed not to declare the result till further orders. Later on, the Supreme Court passed orders that the case should be decided within 3 months and heard on merit basis when SLP was filed.

Exams for JE and JKPSI were conducted from 5th Nov. to 20th Dec. 2022. The answer key of JK-PSI was leaked two days before its notified date which further dented the hopes of aspirants to believe in fair and transparent recruitment. The answer key leak was a high point for the aspirants to question the credibility of Aptech and JKSSB. Aptech also did not have a good record of transparent recruitments in the past. In 2018, Aptech conducted UPPCL(JE) exams and leaked papers in that exam. Due to this, Aptech was blacklisted for 3 years in UP. Aspirants protested from Kuthua to Kupwara in every district of J&K but JKSSB termed the Answer Key leak a mere tech-

nical error.

Aptech continued its tainted recruitment records even in 2023. In January 2023, Aptech conducted C-TET exams for CBSE. Papers of the exam were leaked in Meerut, Lucknow, Aara, etc. As per STF reports, a system mirroring software was used to clone the Aptech exam software and attempt papers remotely. Police have arrested a few people in this case.

In Feb, 2023, Aptech conducted KV PGT exams for KVS (All India Level exam). The papers of this exam were leaked in Patna, Amritsar, Haryana, etc. Several people were arrested with laptops and mobiles. They were helping candidates using some system mirroring software.

In Feb 2023, a centre supervisor of Aptech was involved in corruption in KVS exams in Ladakh. He helped some candidates to appear in exams from a desired centre in which the systems were already bug infected to attempt papers remotely.

All these observations are posing greater question marks on the credibility of the recruitment board of J&K. Candidates demand Judicial Enquiry into the matter and want Aptech to be removed from the recruitment process. De-

There are no losers this Oscar season

omplaining about Oscar winners is as much an annual ritual as obsessing over who wore what on the award ceremony's red carpet (or champagne carpet, as it was this year). Indeed, 2023 may be one of those rare years when there is almost unanimous agreement over the winners: Everything, Everywhere, All At Once, which won seven awards was a favourite in most of the categories it was in, while few cavilled at the honours won by All Quiet on the Western Front (the anti-war movie was a shooin, considering the Russia-Ukraine conflict which has just completed one year), Black Panther: Wakanda Forever and Women Talking.

But the day after the Oscars is a good time to reflect on the also-rans. For Indian cinema lovers, the biggest miss is likely to be the Documentary Feature award that eluded All That Breathes, one of the most impressive documentaries to have emerged from this country in recent times. Mournful tweets from around the world also expressed disappointment over the searingly poignant The Banshees of Inisherin not winning even the Original Screenplay award and Austin Butler losing the Best Actor trophy for his chameleon-like turn in the biopic Elvis.

There is some consolation in remembering that an Oscar win doesn't always guarantee classic status. Who, after all, remembers How Green Was My Valley, the movie that beat Citizen Kane for the Best Picture award in 1941? And is the power of Morgan Freeman's performance in The Shawshank Redemption diminished by his loss of the 1995 Best Actor trophy to Tom Hanks (for Forrest Gump)? There is also the relief of knowing that none of the choices this year come close to being considered a travesty of the process: Recall, for example, the hue and cry that greeted the hamfisted Crash winning Best Picture over Ang Lee's sublime Brokeback Mountain. The quality of this year's nominations shows in the fact that even the so-called losers have enriched the collective cinematic legacy.

Self-Styled Seminaries

hat if I tell you that Kashmir is turning into a paradise for religious business? You will be shocked to hear that many self-styled clerics have made darsgah (religious seminary) the centre of business.

Earlier, there were only a few Darasghahs in the valley which were well managed by the authorities and the facilities provided to the children were good enough especially for the students.

Every day we see a huge number of vehicles with loudspeaker asking for donations in city streets and villages too, have we ever wondered why people from one district go to another district to collect donations? Because new small seminaries are being built by self-made clerics to earn their livelihood as it costs no money to run your own seminary.

Children are being treated like animals in such seminaries. I once saw that children were washing their clothes with cold water on bank of a stream in the bitter cold in Bandipora district of North Kashmir. When I spoke to them, one of them said that they use the same cold water daily for bathing and wudu(ablution) etc as their Darasghah lacks proper infrastructure. The seminary they were staying in was poorly built and one of the student was standing on the road side with a receipt book from the same Madrasa to collect donations from commuters.

Who forced them to study there

when we have so many good Madarasas in the valley as well as in Bandipora district?

Every child has the right to live happily, self styled religious clerics treat students in such Madrasas like animals.

Recently, a case where teachers was booked for beating a minor student was reported. Thus, times have changed; corporal punishment is banned in schools, daycare and alternative child care institutions, but alas! no-one dares to talk about the hardships faced by minors un these seminaries.

Such Darasghah lack proper registration and get no funds from any Madrasa organizations. Self styled clerics force student to col-

lect donations.

Article 24 of the Indian constitution clearly states that, "No child below the age of fourteen years shall be employed to work in any factory or mine or employed in any hazardous employment."

not make any compromise on it," Sinha said.

Asked about People's Democratic Party (PDP) president Mehbooba Mufti's criticism of his statement that previous governments provided jobs to terrorists and their families. Sinha said he stood by his statement which is based on truth.

"I will not like to comment on some allegations. This is a reality that 47 people were dismissed from government service for anti-national activities. What I have said is based on reality," he said. Mehbooba on Tuesday hit back at Sinha

over his remarks that previous governments in Jammu and Kashmir provided jobs to terrorists and their families, saying this "is not our tradition" but giving employment to "hooligans" might have been a custom in Uttar Pradesh.

"LG sahab has come from Uttar Pradesh and was probably speaking about his experience there. There might have been a tradition to provide jobs to mafia and hooligans in Uttar Pradesh but that is not our tradition," she had said.

The lieutenant governor said the bud-get for Jammu and Kashmir for 2023-24, presented by Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman in Parliament on Monday, was praiseworthv.

"The budget should be looked into in totality. We have made our plan for holistic development with focus on all major sectors. The budget is commendable and it will help to take new J&K, the foundation of which was laid earlier, to new heights of development," he said.

He said 70 per cent of the population of Jammu and Kashmir is connected with agriculture and allied sectors and during the next five years, additional budget allocation of Rs 5.013 crore will be infused in this sector. "Security is a priority and so are other focus areas such as tourism, youth empowerment and education.' Earlier, the LG lauded the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and said that National Education Policy (NEP) is creating a progressive ecosystem for the students to translate their dreams into reality. "Sports nurtures both mind & body and enables students to become well-rounded across disciplines. NEP has given us an opportunity to promote Sports through multidisciplinary system and end fragmentation in education system," Sinha said. "Prime Minister's vision for FIT India, Khelo India, National Education Policy, start-up opportunities, is building a strong foundation for India's future," he said, while pointing out that the sports was deeply rooted in the ancient education system.

Justice Dhar, in his 13-page order, did not agree with the petitioner that he was "wrongly and false implicated" in the case and said it has been submitted by the respondent that another FIR related to the question paper leak of the finance accounts assistant examination conducted by the JKSSB has been registered and the role of the petitioner has surfaced.

"Not only this, even the report of the enquiry committee set up by the government is damning against the petitioner (Singh). In the report, it has been noted that the petitioner had managed to induct several candidates in the BSF against financial consideration and that he had advertised secretly that he would help prospective candidates in passing the medical tests," the court said.

It said the report further records that the petitioner has close links with some high and mighty politicians.

"In the face of the propensity of the petitioner to indulge in similar types of offences, it may not be appropriate to enlarge him on bail at this stage when the investigation relating to the larger conspiracy of

question paper leakage of sub-inspector posts is still underway," Justice Dhar said. In July last year, the Jammu and Kashmir administration headed by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha cancelled the selection of 1,200 police sub-inspectors, 1,300 junior engineers and 1,000 finance account assistants following allegations of paper leak and malpractices.

"The charges levelled against the petitioner can by no stretch of imagination be termed as ordinary charges. Economic offences constitute a class apart and need to be visited with a different approach in the matter of bail," the judge said.

"The economic offence having deep rooted conspiracies and involving huge loss of public funds needs to be viewed seriously and considered as grave offences affecting the economy of the country as a whole an thereby posing serious threat to the financial health of the country," Justice Dhar said. The high court also took note of the repeated bail applications moved by the accused over the past five months in the court of chief judicial magistrate, Jammu, additional sessions judge and the high court. There can be no dispute to the legal position that an accused can maintain a bail application before a superior court once his application for grant of bail by the subordinate court has been rejected without there being any change of circumstances but then the petitioner has not been to persuade this court to take a view different from the one taken earlier, Justice Dhar said.

Khan's party on Tuesday challenged the police operation in the Lahore High Court, requesting it to direct the government to end its bid to arrest the party chief.

"IGP Punjab Dr Usman Anwar appeared before the court and told it that police had to launch the operation as Islamabad police had brought an arrest warrant for Imran Khan in the Toshakhana gifts case. We had to implement this order under the law. He said some 59 policemen have been injured during the clashes with the PTI workers," a court official told PTI.

'The PTI advocate told the court that the sessions court Islamabad had issued the order to ensure the presence of Khan in the court on March 18 in the Toshakhana gifts case... why police operation was launched to arrest him four days before, requesting it intervenes to save human lives," the official said.

LHC's Justice Tariq Saleem Sheikh asked the PTI counsel whether the Islamabad High Court is hearing the PTI plea to cancel the arrest warrants of Khan in the Toshakhana case.

"The counsel informed the judge that the IHC is hearing Khan's petition. On this Justice Sheikh said let the IHC decide the matter and meanwhile the government stop the police operation forthwith," the official said

Meanwhile, a large number of lawyers also converged on Mall Road in Lahore to protest against the police operation.

The district and Ses Islamabad on February 28 issued nonbailable arrest orders against Khan in the Toshakhana case about the concealment of the proceeds from the sale of state gifts.

precious gifts given to rulers, parliamentarians, bureaucrats, and officials by heads of other governments and states and foreign dignitaries.

"Clearly 'arrest' claim was mere drama because the real intent is to abduct & assassinate. From tear gas & water cannons, they have now resorted to firing. I signed a surety bond last evening, but the DIG re-fused to even entertain it. There is no doubt of their mala fide intent," Khan said in a series of tweets on Wednesday. Khan's party claimed that live bullets

were fired at the party workers present on the roads leading to Khan's residence.

Fearing the worst, various PTI leaders including Khan himself Tuesday appealed to party workers to rush to Zaman Park, where they served as human shields and stood between Khan's residence and the police.

The PTI has declared that it would not let law enforcement agencies arrest Khan as it

paramilitary forces in the valley, especially in Srinagar, when the targeted killing of civilians rocked the city last year. The troop deployment was followed by setting up of a number of bunkers to prevent militants from carrying out further attacks.

"Drone is a medium. They have been using such methods before as well, which were controlled by us. For the last threefour years, they have been using drones. But, we have achieved good successes in combating drones whether it is to bring them down, or forcing them to turn back without dropping the payload or in seizing the dropped payload. "We are keeping good coordination with local police in the areas where such things happen. We have been able to arrest gangs as well. There has been a decline in such incidents, and I think, in the future, we will be successful in totally controlling it," the additional DG BSF said.

"Our Gurukuls had emphasized using sports as a tool to enable socio-economic change," he added.

The high court rejected Singh's bail application after hearing both sides, accepting the argument of senior additional advocate general and CBI counsel Monika Kohli that the investigation in the case is still underway.

The court directed the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to complete further probe in the case and file a supplementary charge-sheet, if any, expeditiously, preferably within a period of three months.

The officer was arrested by the agency on October 18 last year for allegedly using touts to get his son the question paper of the police sub-inspector recruitment examination conducted by the Jammu and Kashmir Services Selection Board (JKSSB) in March.

He was among 24 persons charge-sheeted by the CBI in the case on November 12 last year and it termed him the main accused and the kingpin of the conspiracy.

"I do not find any merit in the bail application (of the accused). The same is dismissed," the judge said.

India Invites

meeting is scheduled to be held in Delhi, the foreign ministerial conclave is set to take place in Goa in early May. India has already invited Chinese foreign minister Qin Gang for the meeting.

The defence ministers' meeting is set to delve into various issues relating to regional security including the threat of terrorism and the situation in Afghanistan.

The meeting will be chaired by Defence Minister Rainath Singh, they said.

There was no indication yet from Pakistan on whether Bilawal Bhutto Zardari and Asif will attend the respective meetings.

Khar is currently serving as the minister of state for foreign affairs.

There has been speculation that Pakistan may send Khar for the SCO foreign ministerial meeting.

In May 2014, the then Pakistani Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif visited India to attend Prime Minister Narendra Modi's

swearing-in ceremony. In December 2015, the then external affairs minister Sushma Swaraj visited Pakistan, and days later Modi made a brief visit to that country.

The ties between India and Pakistan came under severe strain after India's

The Islamabad High Court on Wednesday heard the petition by Khan against arrest orders. He also submitted an affidavit through his counsel that he would appear before the court at the next hearing on March 18.

IHC Chief Justice Amir Farooq ordered Khan to present the petition in the trial court and refused to suspend the arrest warrant.

On March 13, Additional District and Sessions Judge Zafar Iqbal issued an arrest warrant for Imran and instructed the police to present him before the courts on March 18.

Khan was disqualified by the Election Commission of Pakistan last year in October for not sharing details of the sales. The election body later filed a complaint with the district court to punish him under criminal laws for selling the gifts he had received as prime minister of the country. After Pakistan Rangers and police personnel retreated, Khan came out of his residence, donning a gas mask, and met the party workers. His supporters cheered "chasing the Rangers away"

In a tweet, the party said that more workers were reaching Zaman Park and vowed not to let the "impure intentions" of the coalition government succeed.

Earlier in the day, authorities deployed the elite Rangers outside Khan's residence, a day after clashes with police left over 70 people injured, including 59 policemen.

Lahore's Zaman Park area was turned into a battleground after Khan's defiant supporters engaged in pitched battles with policemen on Tuesday to stop them from arresting their leader in the Toshakhana case, resulting in injuries on both sides. Khan's supporters clashed repeatedly with police overnight.

The injured were shifted to Lahore's hospitals and police arrested dozens of Khan's pporters

Khan has been in the crosshairs for buying gifts, including an expensive Graff wristwatch he had received as the premier at a discounted price from the state depository called Toshakhana and selling them for profit.

Established in 1974, the Toshakhana is a department under the administrative control of the Cabinet Division and stores fears he may be given poison in jail.

Khan was ousted from power in April last year after losing a no-confidence vote, which he alleged was part of a US-led conspiracy targeting him because of his independent foreign policy decisions on Russia, China and Afghanistan.

Since his ouster, Khan has been asking for early elections to oust what he termed an "imported government" led by prime minister Shehbaz Sharif.

Sharif has maintained that elections will be held later this year once the parliament completes its five-year tenure.

Bunkers In Srinagar

Earlier, reports suggested a number of bunkers from various parts of the city were being removed by the administration.

The security bunkers manned by the Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs), including CRPF around Dalgate, Barzulla and Jehangir-Chowk flyover have been removed so far and many bunkers from other areas of the city are likely to be removed or relocated in the coming weeks.

However, Abhiram Pankaj, Public Relations Officer (PRO) of the CRPF, Srinagar sector, said that the removal of bunkers has nothing to do with the G-20 meeting and that Jammu and Kashmir police were reviewing the entire process.

"CRPF has nothing to do with it. It is the J & K police who are reviewing it. They have removed the fixed bunkers and placed mobile bunkers instead," Pankaj said.

Pertinently, India is hosting the G-20 (Group of 20) leaders' summit in New Delhi this year, after assuming the Presidency of the G20 for one year from December 1, 2022, to November 30, 2023. Over 200 meetings are expected to be held across the country, including J&K Union Territory.

Srinagar city-the summer capital is also going to host one of the G-20 events in May this year for which the administration is making advance arrangements by repairing major roads, drainage systems and beautification of the city.

"The face-lifting of the Srinagar city is going on in full swing. Various smart city projects are going on which will likely be completed next month," said an official from Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC).

CMOs Asked To Come Up With Micro Plan To Improve Sex Ratio

JAMMU: The Jammu and Kashmir administration has directed chief medical officers (CMOs) to come up with a micro plan to improve the sex ratio in the Union Territory.

The directions were passed by Secretary Health and Medical Education Bhupinder Kumar at a meeting convened to review the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (prohibition of sex selection) Act, an official spokesman said.

Kumar said gender bias and sex determination is a critical public health concern which can be regulated through effective implementation of the PCPNDT Act for which a comprehensive action strategy needs to be devised and monitored.

Instructing the directorates of health services in both divisions of Jammu and Kashmir to conduct an assessment of all the registered ultrasound clinics for their conformity to the PCPNDT Act. he said it must be ensured that all the provisions of the Act are strictly implemented in letter and spirit.

Kumar asked the CMOs to consider cancellation of those

entities which are found deficient in terms of any provision of the Act.

Director health services and CMOs were also asked to study the last five years of HMIS (Health Management Information System) data for districtwise trend analysis of sex ratio at birth, the spokesman said.

They were also asked to introspect and come up with a micro plan to improve the sex ratio, he said.

Delhi Police Disallows 'Media Blackout In **Kashmir' Event**

NEW DELHI: The Delhi Police has denied permission for a public meeting on Kashmir at the Gandhi Peace Foundation on Wednesday, citing the possibility of law and order disturbance, officials said on Wednesday.

The event was scheduled at 2 pm at the venue and the speakers at the event included Delhi University professor Nandita Narain, Hussain Masood, retired judge of the Jammu and Kashmir High Court, CPI (M) leader MY Tarigami, filmmaker Sanjay Kak, Mir Shahid Saleem, Chairman of United Peace Alliance, and Anil Chamadia, a senior journalist.

In a communication to the Gandhi Peace Foundation, the Station House (SHO) of IP Estate police station said, "Information/ local input has been received that some anonymous group is planning/ organising public meeting on 'Media Blackout in Kashmir' at 3 PM on March 15, 2023 at Gandhi Peace Foundation.

Efforts to get the details of members of the anonymous group have been made but the same could not be verified.

"There is discreet input of disturbance in law and order situation in view of organising this above public meeting. In view of the above, you are requested to cancel the booking and intimation may kindly be sent to the undersigned at the earliest."

According to Narain, one of the speakers of the event, the public meeting was organised by several student and teacher groups.

"The speakers were informed about the cancellation, just when they were about to leave for the event. It was not a protest but a public meeting. It was being carried out in a hall and the police had nothing to do with it. "This is what is happening. They are entering colleges to stop events. There was to be a discussion on media blackout in Kashmir but this cancellation shows that it is happening everywhere," she told PTI.

Narain claimed that the police had "tried the same thing" with the Bharat Bachao programme at HKS Surjeet Bhavan on March 11 and 12, but the organisers managed to get a court order allowing the programme to be held.

"This outrageous cancellation at the last minute only serves to reinforce the widely known fact about the suppression of free speech, not only in Kashmir but all over India, including in its capital Delhi," she alleged.

Last week, the Delhi High Court allowed the holding of a national seminar of the members of a collective called "Bharat Bachao" and asked the organisers to provide a list of participants

and their details to the police At that time, Gade Inna Reddy and Mondru Francis Gopinath, members of Bharat Bachao, a collective of scholars, had approached the court with a grievance that the Delhi Police unilaterally denied them permission to organise the private programme, titled "Understanding Fascism in Present India Context", two days before the event was to be held.

Justice Tushar Rao Gedela had asked the parties to cooperate with each other to ensure that the seminar is held in a peaceful atmosphere and there is no untoward incident.

Muslims Help Perform Last Rites Of KP Man In Pulwama

SRINAGAR: The local Muslims in South Kashmir's Pulwama district helped in performing the last rites of a 70-year-old Kashmiri Pandit, who died on Tuesday.

Setting an example of communal harmony and brotherhood, the local Muslims in Batapora Wahibugh village of Newa hamlet in South Kashmir's Pulwama came together to help perform the last rites of their Pandit neighbor.

According to reports, Pyarey Lal Pandit resident of Wahibugh village about 8 kilometer from Pulwama town was a known figure in the area as according to the locals, he used to help persons in need. As only a few of his family members were around, Lal's local friends and neighbours from the Muslim community took it upon themselves to help perform his last rites, locals said. HC Directs Govt To Hold Election For Numberdar In 28 Days

Case Again Listed On April 17, Locals Hail Judicial Intervention

SRINAGAR: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh has come to the rescue of villagers of Brenwar in tehsil Chadoora of district Budgam as their demand for holding a fresh election for the village Numberdar has been accepted by the top court.

The bench of Justice Wasim Sadig Nargal in an order issued on March 6th 2023 has directed the Secretary Revenue, Divisional Commissioner Kashmir and Deputy Commissioner Budgam to consider holding elections for the Numberdar in Brenwar village in 28 days.

Respondents are directed to accord consideration to the representation alleged to have been filed by the petitioners for holding election for the post of Lumberdar (Numberdar) in terms of Lambardari Act and rules framed thereunder within a period of 4 weeks. The consideration order which is likely to be passed be placed on record while filing the response" reads the order

Pertinently braving inclement weather, residents of Brenwar village of Chadoora Tehsil in central Budgam district had held several protests during the month of January and February against the Numberdar of village Saifudin Jahara alias Chowdhary who has been holding the post for last around 30 years. The locals have been alleging that the said numberdar was corrupt and was mistreating the people. The villagers

had held a massive protest not only in the village but in Press Colony Srinagar as well on several occasions. The locals have welcomed the order of the High Court
