Millions Bid Tearful Adieu To Month Of Fasting

Devout Muslims thronged mosques and shrines across Kashmir on the last Friday of Ramazan bidding the holy month a tearful farewell during congregational prayers.

Largest gatherings were witnessed at Srinagar's Dargah Hazratbal and the historic Jamia Masjid.

Large congregations were also witnessed in Khanqahe-Maula, Ziarat-e-Makhdoom Sahib and other Waqf Board controlled shrines and different Imambargahs.

Jamia Masjid, Srinagar was jam-packed with devotees who offered congregational Friday prayers at the historic mosque, which remained closed for the prayers last Friday due to government curbs.

The biggest congregation was, however, witnessed at Hazratbal shrines where the devotees from different parts of the Valley participated in the Friday prayers. Prayers were followed by display of the holy relic of the Prophet (pbuh) during which emotional scenes were witnessed all around. Many of the devout, including a large number of women, were

seen praying with moist eyes. big congregational prayers were also witnessed at several other shrines in different districts, including shrine of Alamdar at Chararisharief, Khiram Sirhama, Kabamarg in Anantnag district, Ahm-e-Sharief in Bandipora district and other mosques as well. During the special prayers, the religious clerics threw light

Srinagar: Amid decrease in precipitation and forecast for scattered to fairly widespread light rain and thunderstorm in next 24 hours, the minimum temperature recorded a drop in Jammu and Kashmir below normal on Friday.

A meteorological department of-ficial said that "mainly dry weather to isolated very light rain and thunderstorm" was expected during two subsequent days.

Reliance Insurance 'Scam' **CBI Summons Ex-J&K Guv Malik For Questioning**

New Delhi: The CBI has asked former Jammu and Kashmir governor Satya Pal Malik to answer certain queries in connection with an alleged insurance scam in the Union Territory, officials said on Friday.

This is the second time in seven months that Malik, who completed his terms as the governor of various states, will be questioned by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI). He was questioned in October last year after he concluded his gubernatorial responsibilities in Bihar, Jammu and Kashmir, Goa and finally, Meghalaya.

The CBI move comes barely a week after Malik's interview to "The Wire", in which he made critical remarks about the BJPled Centre, especially regarding its handling of Jammu and Kashmir where he served as the last governor before the erstwhile state was bifurcated into Union territories.

Reacting to the development, Malik told PTI that the CBI has asked for his presence at the agency's Akbar Road guesthouse here for "certain



clarifications"

"They want certain clarifications for which they want my presence. I am going to Rajasthan, so I have given them dates from April 27 to 29 when I am available," he said.

The CBI registered two FIRs in connection with corruption allegations levelled by Malik in the awarding of contracts for a group medical scheme for government employees and civil work worth Rs 2,200 crore related to the Kiru hydroelectric power project in Jammu and Kashmir.

Malik had claimed that he was offered a Rs 300-crore bribe for clearing two files during his tenure as the Jammu and Kashmir | More on P6

Deep Drug Nexus Aimed At Destroying Kashmir Youth: LG




KPDCL Collects Rs 1550 Cr Revenue In FY 2022-23



Genetically Modified Houseplants Are Coming to Clean Your Air

t an old shoe factory on the outskirts of Paris, new life is taking shape. Behind a heavy door, a bank of PCR machines multiplies plant DNA molecules by hundreds of billions every few hours. Inside a gleaming white chamber, tiny emerald shoots are coaxed from single cells, unfurling in millimeters over a period of months.

"It's like a biologist's wet dream," says Patrick Torbey, chief technology officer of Neoplants, a Parisian startup taking a multimillion-dollar punt on the air we breathe. Torbey grabs one of the small, plastic receptacles from inside the chamber and squints at his verdant creation: Nestled in a jelly-like growing medium, it looks like a canapé-or, possibly, the future.

This is the Neo P1—a genetically modified houseplant that the company claims could help combat indoor air pollution. P1 is a modified form of golden pothos—more commonly known as devil's ivy—one of the world's most ubiquitous and easy-going houseplants. Although its yellow-green hues appear familiar, P1's DNA has been tweaked to enhance its ability to extract volatile organic compounds (VOCs) from the air, including formaldehyde, benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene, and xylene, which are prevalent in indoor spaces.

These genetic adjustments also-crucially in the case of the P1—allow the plant to convert the VOCs it absorbs into substances like sugar and CO2 that it can use to carry on growing. Once it's outgrown the agar, P1 will be planted in soil enriched with biochar (a common gardening additive) in a pot designed to maximize airflow, and sold with a pack of three Power Drops (bacteria, to be added to the soil each month to help the plant metabolize the VOCs it absorbs). Due on shelves later this year, P1 will retail for \$179, or around £145—roughly 10 times the cost of an ordinary golden pothos plant, or comparable to that of a keenly priced Honeywell HEPA purifier.

So far, Torbey, who has a PhD in genome editing, and his cofounder Lionel Mora, an ex-Google product marketer, have collected \$20 million in venture funding from firms including True Ventures and Collaborative Fund.

Much of the money has gone toward fitting out Neoplants' new space on the north side of the French capital. Over the past two years, it's been stripped and gutted, whitewashed, and then refitted to spec with every gadget Torbey could tick off his wishlist. There are mass spectrometers, fume cupboards, and growth chambers. Magnetic stirrers fidget next to cabinets stocked with glass flasks and petri dishes.

There are two rooms whose insides are coated in a greenish non-adsorbent material (meaning organic compounds won't stick to it). In the months to come, they'll be used to mimic bedrooms, for a more accurate measurement



of how well Neo P1 strips toxins from the air.

Neoplants' proposition is an attractive one: neatly pairing something that looks nice in people's homes and brings them joy (houseplants) with one of the biggest existential challenges facing humanity at large (slowly choking to death from pollutants). But proving that it actually works is where things get thorny.

Browse most plant shops and you'll be met with the promise of purified air: peace lilies and snake plants and ivy with little tags—pale blue or white, or some other color suggestive of purity-declaring that "this plant cleans air." Patch, a popular online retailer, reserves an entire section of its website for "air-purifying indoor plants." Another vendor, Plantler, offers an Air So Pure package of spider plants, palms, and ferns.

Much of the support for these marketing efforts stems from 1989, when NASA worked with the Associated Landscape Contractors of America to assess the ability of houseplants to remove toxins from the air. The resulting Clean Air Study suggested that, yes, houseplants could absorb certain pollutants-including VOCs like benzene, formaldehyde, and trichloroethylene. Less touted was the fact that these results mostly could not be applied to the houses these plants are often placed in. Putting a plant in a sealed chamber, blowing pollutants over it for multiple hours (or days), and then recording the results, the researchers admitted, was not an accurate replication of normal houseplant conditions. This has not stopped many researchers since from conducting almost exactly the same experiment.

In 2019, however, researchers at Drexel University concluded that, in order for the effects measured in these chamber experiments to be reproduced at any livable scale, and to even match the rate of toxin removal already achieved by just opening a window, you'd need anywhere between 10 and 1,000 plants per square meter.

Richard Corsi, dean of the College of Engineering at UC Davis, also takes umbrage with what he calls these "little glass chamber studies." The issue, he says, is that to get their results, researchers exaggerate the amount of air that would ever flow over a plant in normal conditions. The industry's standard metric for the effectiveness of air filters is clean air delivery rate, or CADR, which combines separate measures for airflow and how efficiently particles are removed. The idea is that, by combining these measurements into a single metric, consumers are less likely to be misled by, for instance, an air filter that is incredibly efficient at removing toxins, but only for a small amount of air.

Using data from past plant studies and calculations based on the best case scenario for CADR, Corsi says that a bedroom of approximately 200 square feet would need as many as 315 individual plants to bring formaldehyde (and other VOC) levels down by 50 percent. To get a 90 percent reduction would require more like 2,800 plants. Scale that up to a whole flat or house, and you're nurturing a dense jungle.

So is Neoplants' genetically modified houseplant any better? The company's sales materials reference the 1989 study, and claim the P1 is "30 times better than top NASA plants" when it comes to removing VOCs. But this was a lab-based study: Neoplants pumped formaldehyde, benzene, toluene, and xylene over a P1 sample contained inside a 35-liter glass chamber, and then compared the outputs. Field tests are yet to yield reliable results, but the hope is that the new lab, with its specially designed non-adsorbent rooms, will allow more true-to-life testing in the future.

There's no CADR measurement to compare the P1 with mechanical air purifiers either. Instead, Neoplants offers a "CADR by weight" to reflect the varying sizes of different plants. Even if the P1 is 30 times better than a traditional houseplant, you would still need a lot of them to clean the dirtiest air.

A new metric might be required for this product category, Mora argues, because plants—unlike traditional air purifiers—don't get switched on and off (although they do have extended dormant periods in most years). Neoplants has hired two people to devise a measurement that better suits its purposes.

Right now, P1 amounts to trays of tiny shoots stored in growth chambers. It takes six months to take each plant from a single cell to a shoot of a few inches in height. More than 30,000 people have signed up for a waiting list via the Neoplants website; interested parties include hoteliers and real estate developers. Mora is cutting deals with growers in Florida who'll be able to reproduce their plants at scale. (The US, where the regulatory process for clearing genetically modified products is more straightforward, will be Neoplants' launch market).

The lab move-in isn't quite complete—a workman's brush props open the front door, fresh tarmac is being flattened into potholes in the courtyard—but the new facilities will enable Mora and Torbey to run more rigorous, realistic tests. P2 is already in the works, and the business is already exploring how its gene-editing technology could be deployed in carbon capture or phytoremediation, through which plants are used to absorb toxins from contaminated environments.

The company is banking on a bit of patience and a dose of belief-green shoots need time to grow. "It will be the first time in history that such a product exists," says Mora. "The first computers, they weren't so great. But they were

As Earth Warms More 'Flash Droughts' Suck Soil Plants Dry

Climate change is making droughts faster and more furious, especially a specific fast-develop-ing heat-driven kind that catch farmers by surprise, a new study found.

The study in Thursday's journal Science found droughts in general are being triggered faster. But it also showed that a special and particularly nasty sudden kind called flash droughts by experts is casting an ever bigger crop-killing footprint.

It comes only in the growing season mostly summer, but also spring and fall and is insidious because it's caused not just by the lack of rain or snow that's behind a typical slow-onset

drought, hydrologists and meteorologists said. What happens is the air gets so hot and so dry that it sucks water right out of plants and soil.

It's the increasing thirstiness of the atmosphere, said UCLA and National Center for Atmospheric Research climate scientist Daniel Swain, who wasn't part of the study. Swain called the issue very relevant in a warming climate.

The term flash drought was coined around 2000 but it really took off in 2012, when a \$30 billion sudden drought struck the central United States, one of the worst droughts since the infamous Dust Bowl devastated the Plains in the 1930s, according to the study.

Because it occurs very, very fast people started to focus on this new phenomenon, said study lead author Xing Yuan, dean of the School of Hydrology and Water Resources at Nanjing University of Information Science and Technology in China. For the 2012 drought, actually the drought just developed in a very severe condition just within a month.

Most of China's Yangtze River basin last summer was struck by a flash drought that developed within only a month due to high temperatures, which also triggered wildfires, Yuan said. Parts of the river dried up and there was an energy shortage in southern China because hydropower wouldn't work, he said.

It developed very fast so you don't have enough time to prepare for this drought,

Another sudden drought happened in the U.S. Southeast in 2016 and was a factor in devastating wildfires in Gatlinburg, Tennessee, said Iason Otkin, a study co-author and an atmospheric scientist at the University of Wisconsin, Madison.

The current drought in the Oklahoma-Texas panhandle and Kansas started two years ago as a rapid onset drought, said Joel Lisonbee, a climatologist at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Integrated Drought Information System in Colorado. He wasn't part of the study but praised it, saying essentially a warmer world allows for faster onset of drought.

Yuan, Otkin and their research team looked back at droughts, how fast they occurred and what kind they were, across the globe since 1951 and found flash droughts are happening more often in nearly three-quarters of the climate regions of the world. They also found droughts of all kinds happening faster

Although they couldn't quantify how much faster because of the variability in places and times. Yuan said it would be fair to say droughts are happening weeks earlier than they once did.

Yuan said some of the bigger increases in sudden droughts have been in Europe and Australia. Outside experts pointed to the Amazon as prone to them.

We have to pay attention to this phenomenon because it's increasing, Yuan said.

Yuan's team also used computer simula-

tions both with worst-case warming and more moderate warming and projected that the proportion of flash droughts will increase in a warmer world and droughts will continue to keep happening faster.

Canine Horror: Demand For Dog Sterilization, Segregation Of Waste Grows

Srinagar: With dog bite cases on rise in Kashmir, the demand for sterilization and proper disposal of waste to prevent such incidents is growing in Kashmir with each passing day.

Doctors said that sterilizing and vaccinating the dogs would effectively control their population, prevent rabies and reduce canine attacks.

They said that sterilization is the only scientific birth control measure for bringing the stray dog population under control.

"Everyday a large number of people are falling prey to dog bites. The canines are storming streets, chasing cars, pulling down bicycle riders and often attacking pedestrians and school children," they said.

A few days ago, a minor boy was mauled by dogs in Beighpora Awantipora in Pulwama.

Doctors treating him said that the wounds were so deep that even his lungs were injured and the incident is enough to show the gravity of dog bites menace

They said that the minor boy was brought to SMHS Hospital in critical condition with multiple injuries including scalp, chest, shoulder, thigh and



Udhampur Toll Massacre Reaches 26

ammu- At least 22 people were gunned down at Prankot village in Udhampur district on Friday night, Jammu and Kashmir-chief minister Farooq Abdullah said today. Abdullah, who visited the village along with state

DGP Gurbachan Jagat, told the state assembly they found 22 bodies, four of them under the debris of a gutted house. Police yesterday said 13 people, including two women and

three children, of two families were killed in indiscriminate firing by militants. In a suo moto statement, Abdullah sought cooperation of the members in fighting militancy in the state. He regretted the BSF did not respond to state request to launch a joint operationn following intelligence reports about the presence of foreign militants in the area.

The chief minister said the IGP (Jammu) wrote twice to BSF officials regarding the presence of militants and migration of people but the BSF did not initiate any action.

"If our forces cannot contain them, the situation can become grim for us", he said. Abdullah said vigil at borders should be intensified to check infiltration of militants from across the border.

Earlier, Speaker Ali Mohammad Naik turned down the opposition plea to suspend the question hour and allow a discussion on Udhampur prompting a walkout by Congress MLAs and Panthers Party members.

 $\label{eq:meanwhile} \mbox{Meanwhile the number of people killed by suspected}$ militants in two villages of Udhampur district on Friday was feared to cross 26 mark though the toll was yesterday given as only 13, officials said here today. So far 25 bodies, including of eight women and nine children, had been recovered while efforts were on to trace the body of minor, official sources said. Among the survivors was one girl, who was burnt below her waist, they said. Meanwhile, reports available from the locals indicated that two militants each had camped in the houses of affected families a day earlier without, causing any harm.

However, during the night they, along with their accomplices, poured kerosene on the houses and set them afire, the sources said adding the militants also indulged in clubbing and butchering the inmates of the houses without using firearms. The Coordination Committee on Kashmir (CCK), an

organisation comprising eminent human rights activists and intellectuals, today condemned Friday's massacre of 13 Hindus in Jammu and said the act was apparently aimed at communalising the Kashmir situation. "It appears to us that the attack on entirely innocent Hindus was deliberate attempt to communalise the Kashmir struggle... so long as militancy continues in Kashmir. he blessed Ramadan is now over; but its impact, importance and implications should remain as 'guiding principles' for the months to come

Ramazan, the 9th month of Islamic calendar, is over now. Indeed, Ramazan is a month of countless blessings, and some of them are: it is the month of Sawm/ fasting so that Muslims may be mindful of God, or achieve Taqwa; it is the month in which the Quran—the Last Divine Revelation, and Guidance, for the humankind—was revealed (Q. 2: 183, 185); and it the month in which Laylatul Qadr (Night of Glory/ Power) falls, which has been described by the Quran as a Night "better than a thousand months" (Q. 97: 03).

In addition to this, in his "Ramazan Sermon" the Prophet (peace be upon him) is reported to have said: "Allah has decreed this month the best of all months. The days of this month are the best among the days, the nights are the best among the nights and the hours during Ramazan are the best among the hours" (Baihaqi on the authority of Salman al-Farsi [RA]).

Moreover, this month is 'Shahr al-Muwasaat' (the month of sympathy/ compassion); that is, "it is a month for human beings to show kindness and concern for each other to help each other, and share their problems".

A blessed month, it teaches us patience, persistence, humility and spirituality. Muslims ask forgiveness for their past sins, pray for guidance and help in refraining from everyday evils and vices, and try to purify themselves through self-restraint and good deeds in this month.

Therefore, this blessed month brings a

Therefore, this blessed month brings a change in Muslims' in their usual way of living and behavior. It acts as a period of training and self-assessment.

Moreover, the month of Ramazan, which is full of blessings, acts as a period of training, learning, preparation, etc., for the believers; and the purpose of any kind of training/learning is to apply it in one's life after the training is over.

Same is the purpose of the 'training period' through which believers pass through in this blessed month, so that the same is applied in months to come. Therefore, Muslims should strive utmost to learn the lessons from the month of Ramazan, get the proper training that



it provides, and apply it in their lives as well.

This month, as a period of training and selfassessment, teaches us a lot. It teaches us about spiritual reflection, prayer, charity, and doing good deeds. It teaches us the effective lessons in applied moderation and will-power; and the principle of sincere love. It equips us with a creative sense of hope and an optimistic outlook on life. It imparts self-discipline, self-restraint and generosity. It reminds us of the suffering of the poor, who may rarely get to eat well. It grounds us in discipline and healthy survival. It originates in us the real spirit of social belonging, unity and brotherhood, of equality before God as well as before the law. It reminds us of being preoccupied with materialistic and superficial pursuits and how much deprived we are of the moral and spiritual needs of the human soul. It imbues in us the genuine virtue of effective devotion, honest dedication and closeness to God. It cultivates a vigilant and sound conscience in us. Last, but

not the least, it is "a Godly prescription for self-reassurance and self-control".

Performing righteous deeds, giving charity, reciting and contemplating on the Qur'an, performing Qiyam al-Layl/ Taraweeh (night prayers) or offering nafl (additional) and tahajjud prayers, etc.,—the acts Muslims' do abundantly in this blessed month—should not be restricted to Ramadhan only but should be continued in other months as well. That is what the true message of Ramazan is; that is how one can achieve real 'Taqwa; and that is the true import and imprint of the spirit of this blessed month.

So, let's try to refresh ourselves with the message of Ramazan and get the proper lessons from it, for it is part of our Faith.

Reflections On Love and Suffering

he term d n is not understood in our Tradition as the term "religion" is throughout Western religious history, but rather carries four primary significations: (1) indebtedness; (2) submissiveness; (3) judicious power; (4) natural inclination or tendency.1

The verb d na, which derives from the term dn, conveys the meaning of being indebted. A d in, that is to say, one in debt, finds himself subjected to the ordinances governing debts and to the creditor himself. Such, naturally, involves judgments — ones that are carried out in organized societies and cities, denoted by mudun or mad in. The existence of a set of laws must presuppose a manner of acting consistently with what is reflected therein, thus embracing a mode of acting that is considered natural with regard thereto. Such signifies the final implication derived from the term dn: one's natural

tendency, or fi rah.2

While the fi rah yearns to submit to its Creator and is harmoniously in a state of submission, it is not just a matter of man's natural tendency to submit to God as it is of loving Him. It is an element of the fi rah that it loves God; it wishes to see its beloved content with it, and despises discontentment on His part. Should we resort to contemporary poetry that captures the essence of the matter, we may cite Ma m d Darw sh, who writes:

Some say that love is the essence of life, And others, that it is a lie. Both are truthful—

For the first has met his soul, While the other, of it, is deprived.

It is the very essence of man's nature to be in love with His Creator and submit to His Commandments, be delighted in committing that which contents Him, and be displeased by what displeases Him. It is the highest virtue for the attainment of happiness in this worldly life.1 To be just is to act with wisdom, wherein wisdom entails knowledge of the proper place of a cer-

tain thing, and man is just to himself when he realizes his own status before God and submits his soul to Him through devotion and immersion. It is in such a state that the meaning of love is clarified.

It ought not to be forgotten that it is a woman who completes and fulfills a man, as it is she who completes the paired order, in the case of a man, through which God created everything. ("And of everything, We have created pairs.") As such, it is natural that fulfillment of the heart be attained through the completion of this pair, and such a notion is portraved in language as well. The Arabs are known to have called their women innah, referring to what — or who — the heart craves, thus indicating a degree of emptiness that takes hold when it is away from its beloved.3 It is reflected as well in the very names of Layl and Majn n, their stories being an allusion and an elaboration of the concepts that are deeply embedded into their very names. Wine, for example, was known to the Arabs by the name of Umm Layl 4 (lit. "the mother of Layl"), for its induction of a state of ecstasy, and it is not a matter of coincidence that "wine" (khamr) itself is one of the names that love carries. Ibn al-Qayyim lists a plethora of others for the state — haw, abwah, sadam, uzn, kamad, istik nah, uraq, and suhd, among others — all of which fundamentally revolve around yearning, suffering, and burning, portraying that the term, lexically, is inseparable from the emotions experienced by lovers upon separation.

It is not only in the Arabic language that the concept of love appears in such a ripe manner, but its reflection in the Qur n itself is evident. The Book of God describes spouses — who are going to be construed as lovers, in this case, due to the clear allusion to love between them — as "garments" for one another. The term has been interpreted by some to refer to the residence of the heart, in that the object of love resides in the heart of the lover, as al-abar writes. 5 On a similar note, it is suggested that the term lib san (gar-



ments) has been employed to refer to embracement, through which the lovers become one, both physically and what transcends the physical realm.6 Al-Qushayr dedicates a section in his Ris la to a discussion on love as it pertains to God, although its implications similarly apply in the case of a man's mortal beloved:

God then adds to the description of the lovers, saying they are "humble before the believers," since they sacrifice their hearts for the Beloved without animosity, and sacrifice their spirits to protect the Beloved, without holding back even a tiny sliver for their own comfort. He then says of them, "They strive in the path of God, and they do not fear the blamer's blame," since they strive within themselves to carry out all religious injunctions, strive in their hearts to curb wishes and desires, strive in their spirits to eliminate attachments, and strive in their inner hearts to stand straight and firm in contemplation at all times. He then says, "They do not fear the blamer's blame," since they pay no attention to

the company of friends, nor seek personal fortune, nor feel the burden of fate or fortune, while never swerving from the path of fidelity.7

The strife that man will be willing to undergo for any particular thing will be contingent upon his love for it. The Prophet said, "Actions are by intentions, and every man shall have that which he intended [to attain]. Should one emigrate for the sake of God and His Messenger, his emigration will be for God and His Messenger, and whoever emigrates for the sake of the duny or to marry a woman will likewise have emigrated for what he sought.' Emigration itself is an initiative that requires strife. (It is indeed under cruel circumstances that God's Emissary was forced to undertake it.) And if we are to use the terms interchangeably and synonymously — "emigration" and "strife" — the adth itself would seem to portray the love we may have for a certain thing over another, for one may indeed ascribe greater importance to his beloved than God, or to some material gain over his beloved, thus, in both cases, thwarting the attainment of the purest and the highest form of love, and being led astray by an unrefined form thereof.

Regardless, for those who have attained the state of love, regardless of its purity and depth, while it may appear to be elementary for observers to make effortless assertions regarding how the victim of love may escape the pangs of his love-stricken heart, this approach of his would prove faulty, and fundamentally arise from a state of ignorance. Even if we should entertain the notion that the speakers have in fact been in the position of the audience, we cannot forget that our experiences and stances are not only based on the nature of an event itself, but are tied in with our resilience, sensitivity, knowledge, wisdom, and prior experiences that have shaped our perceptions.

It is particularly love that defies external comprehension.

Bachchan to Rahul Gandhi: Twitter removes verified blue ticks for those not paying subscription fee

New Delhi; Indian celebrities and top politicians ranging from Amitabh Bachchan, Shah Rukh Khan and Salman Khan to Congress leader Rahul Gandhi lost verified blue ticks on their Twitter accounts after Elon Musk's microblogging site started removing check mark icons from accounts that did not pay a subscription fee.

Twitter has begun removing the check mark, which had for years meant that Twitter had verified the identity of the user behind an account, from the profiles of thousands of celebrities, politicians and journalists on Thursday.

This led some of the biggest names in Bollywood -- from Bachchan to Shah Rukh Khan and Salman Khan, several chief ministers including Yogi Adityanath, and top cricketers such as Sachin Tendulkar and Virat Kohli losing the blue tick mark on their Twitter handles.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi and his sister Priyanka Gandhi as well as cricketers Virat Kohli and Rohit Sharma too lost their verified blue ticks from their Twitter accounts.

Theirs and that of several other prominent personalities, which had the blue tick, did not show the verified icon on

Bachchan tweeted that he has paid the money and sought the blue tick back.

The blue tick was considered something of a status symbol but under Musk, who bought Twitter for USD 44 billion in October, the social media



service is now charging individuals a monthly fee of Rs 650 on the web and Rs 900 on mobile devices to maintain their verification status.

The microblogging platform also offers a discounted annual plan of Rs 6,800 per year.

Musk had previously stated that those who did not pay will lose their check marks.

Among those whose accounts no longer had blue tick was the Twitter handle of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, who has 27 million followers on the microblogging website. Rahul Gandhi with 23.3 million fol-

lowers too lost his blue tick. Ironically, a parody account that went by the profile name of 'Rofl Gandhi 2.0' and sporting Rahul Gandhi's picture continued to host the blue tick.

The account '@RoflGandhi ' tweeted pics of its account, with 801,000 followers, with a blue tick and Rahul Gandhi's without the tick. "Ye kaisi duniya bana raha hai bhai tu @ elonmusk (what kind of world

are you creating Elon Musk)," it

Several other chief ministers, including Mamata Banerjee of West Bengal, Yogi Adityanath of Uttar Pradesh, Eknath Shinde of Maharashtra, M K Stalin of Tamil Nadu, and Nitish Kumar of Bihar, too lost their verified icons.

Legendary cricketer Sachin Tendulkar, who has 38.6 million followers on Twitter, also lost

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and his ministers as well as Twitter handles of political parties including BJP and Congress continued to display verified marks.

Congress Malikarjun Kharge as well as BJP chief Jagat Prakash Nadda sported a grey checkmark, which indicates that an account represents a government/ multilateral organisation or a government/multilateral official.

Other celebrities whose blue ticks were removed included Ajay Devgn, Aia Bhatt, Akshay Kumar, Kajol, Madhuri Dixit, Anushka Sharma and Anil Kapoor, among others.

Some celebrities said they would abandon Twitter altogether, while others shrugged off the change but refused to

pay. Twitter introduced the blue check mark system in 2009 to help users identify that celebrities, politicians, companies and brands, news organisations and other accounts "of public interest" were genuine and not impostors or parody accounts. The company didn't previously charge for verification.

Musk had initially proposed charging USD 20 monthly for verification, but later lowered it to USD 8 after blowback. He had previously stated that verified accounts would lose their badges in early April, but pruning has begun only now.

"Tomorrow, 4/20, we are removing legacy verified checkmarks," the company said in a statement on Twitter. "To remain verified on Twitter, individuals can sign up for Twitter

It also gave link for organisations to sign up for verified organisations.

Ever since acquiring Twitter, Musk has been grappling to revive the dwindling revenues of the platform. His push for subscription fee is seen as a step in this direction.

He had been critical of the management at previous Twitter that doled out free verification to journalists and other elites. He had pledged to eliminate what he called a "lords & peasants system" and to offer the blue badge to anyone willing to pay a fee.

Former US President Donald Trump, Microsoft Co-Founder Bill Gates and reality TV star Kim Kardashian were among those who lost their badges.

With several celebrities refusing to pay, Musk is "personally paying" for the Twitter Blue subscription of basketball star LeBron James, author Stephen King and Star Trek star William Shatner.

"I'm paying for a few personally," he tweeted. "Just Shatner, LeBron and King."
Separately, Twitter ditched

its "state-affiliated" and "gov-ernment-funded" labels for media outlets. While China's Xinhua and the Global Times, and Russia's RT were as of Friday no longer identified as state-affiliated media, publicly funded Western outlets including National Public Radio (NPR) in the United States, the BBC in the UK, and Canada's CBC no longer had a "governmentfunded" label.

Scattered rainfall expected in eastern India; temperature likely to remain high in north

New Delhi: Scattered rainfall in eastern India through the weekend is likely to offer some relief to people from severe heatwave conditions, the weather office has predicted, but the temperature is expected to hover around 40 degrees Celsius in the northern and central plains.

The meteorological department predicted widespread rainfall in the Northeast and isolated rainfall in West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand and Odisha over the next three days. It said the maximum temperature is likely to fall by up to 5 degrees Celsius due to the formation of a cyclonic circulation over central Uttar Pradesh and moisture incursion from the Bay of Bengal.

For Delhi, the weather office forecast partly cloudy skies for Saturday with a maximum temperature of around 37 degrees Celsius. Despite its forecast for light rain on Friday, no rain was recorded in the city.

In Western India, Maharashtra government has ordered all schools affiliated with the state board to remain closed in view of the prevailing heatwave conditions. Schools of other boards can take a decision about closure after considering their curriculum and activities, the School Education Department said in an order.

Except for Vidarbha, schools in the state will reopen on June 15. Those in Vidarbha will resume on June 30.

Mumbai, Thane, Navi Mumbai and a few other parts of Maharashtra have been experiencing heatwave conditions for the past few days. Earlier this week, Mumbai's temperature had peaked at 38.5 degrees Celsius while Navi Mumbai sizzled at 42 degrees Celsius, according to the India Meteorological Department. Heatwave conditions have been prevailing in Gangetic West Bengal for the last 10 days. In districts like Bankura, where the mercury soared 44.3 degrees Celsius this week, the water lev-

el in rivers has gone down. Bankura was followed by Panagarh air force station with a maximum of 43.9 degrees Celsius on Thursday.

A partly cloudy sky, however, lowered temperatures in parts of the state on Friday.

In Kolkata, the mercury settled at 38 degrees Celsius, and 39.7 degrees Celsius in neighbouring Salt Lake.

The tea planters of Darjeeling are already staring at a crop shortage in the ongoing first flush season due to a prolonged dry spell along with relatively high temperatures in the hills. Due to adverse weather conditions, wilting of tea leaves and pest attacks on bushes are also noticed, the planters said.

"The adverse weather conditions are resulting in depleting soil moisture. We have seen that the mercury level was hovering around 25 degrees Celsius this season, which is unprecedented. The first flush production is down by 20-25 per cent this season so far," Darjeeling Tea Association principal adviser Sandip Mukherjee said.

Exporters' Indian Tea Association chairman Anshuman Kanoria, who also owns Goomtee Tea Estate in Darjeeling, said the rains in late March brought some respite but this has been followed by a very hot and dry spell in April.

Thunderstorms with lightning and gusty winds are likely at one or two places in West Bengal between April 22 and April 25, the weather office said.

SHOPIAN: Union minister Nitin Gadkari's announcement that a tunnel would be built at Peer Ki Gali on Mughal Road has brought cheer to the residents of Jammu and Kashmir's Shopian.

Despite Shopian being located at a distance of only around 85 km from Bafliaz in Poonch, commuters have to travel more than 450 km when the stretch of road connecting the two places is closed for almost six months during heavy snowfall at Peer ki Gali.

Shopian and the twin border districts of Poonch-Rajouri have historical ties that have

tains, including at Pir ki Gali. The residents have appealed to the local administration for

POONCH ATTACK

Families Of Soldiers From Punjab Inconsolable

CHANDIGARH: Grief and anger echoed through the villages of four soldiers from Punjab who were among the five killed in a militant attack in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch, with their family members demanding that the Army give a befitting

reply to the "cowardly act".

The soldiers' families were inconsolable as they waited for them to come home one last time.

Havildar Mandeep Singh, Lance Naik Kulwant Singh, Sepoy Harkrishan Singh and Sepoy Sewak Singh, all from Punjab, were killed after their vehicle came under fire from unidentified militants and caught fire because of likely use of grenades.


The fifth soldier killed in the attack hailed from Odisha.

In Moga district's Charik village, Kulwant's brother told reporters that the government and the Army should give a befitting reply to the attack.

Holding Kulwant's fourmonth-old son in his arms, he said his brother loved his family and had asked him to ensure timely vaccination of his son.

Kulwant, who had recently visited his family, also leaves behind a one-and-a-half-yearold daughter and his wife.

Villagers said Kulwant's fa-

Bakshish Singh, a former village head of Charik, said the entire village is pained by the loss of their brave son but at the same time, is proud of the supreme sacrifice he has made for the country.

A villager, who was among the mourners, demanded that the Army give a befitting reply to the "cowardly act" of militants.

At Sepoy Harkrishan Singh's house in Talwandi Barth village in Batala, villagers hailed his supreme sacrifice for his motherland.

Harkrishan had recently vis-

ited his family. Hours before he was killed, he spoke to his wife and two-year-old daughter on a video call, villagers said.

Havildar Mandeep Singh belonged to Ludhiana district. According to the family mem-

bers of the soldiers, their bodies are expected to arrive once necessary formalities have been completed by the authorities.

Speaking to reporters in Moga district, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann announced an ex gratia of Rs 1 crore each to the kin of the four soldiers.

"We received the very sad news of five soldiers being martyred in the incident (terrorist attack), out of which four were from Punjab," he said.

During the country's freedom struggle, Punjabis contributed 90 per cent, he said.

SRINAGAR: Manging Director (MD), Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Ltd (KP-DCL), M Yasin Choudhary test charged 33/11 KV, 1x 6.3 MVA Nihalpora Receiving Station thereby addressing the long pending demands of the people of Patan and Tangmarg.

The Nihalpora Receiving station outgoing feeder will feed power to the people of Patan which will decrease the overall demand on the already existing Patan Receiving Station thud bringing respite to the people of the Patan and Tangmarg by providing better and reliable power to both the sections of the society through load division.

It is worth mentioning here that before commissioning of Nihalpora Receiving Station, part of Tangmarg and Patan was being fed from the existing Patan Receiving station due to which the outgoing 11KV feeder was heavily overloaded specially during winters with a peak demand of 12 MWs lead-

ing to forced curtailments. With addition of Nihal-

pora Receiving Station to the system, the total load stands equally segregated between the two parts of the society by way of creation of two separate 11KV outgoing feeders instead of one, which in turn will provide better and reliable power supply to the people of Patan and Tangmarg specially during winters. tor, KPDCL also visited Shopian on 19th April and took review of progress of various electrical works being executed by Power Grid Corporation of India Ltd (PGCIL).

These include Augmentations/ Upgradations of already existing 33/11 KV Receiving stations at Landoora, Batpora and Reshipora of District Shopian under PMDP Scheme.

The MD KPDCL on spot directed the officials of PGCIL and KPDCL to complete the augmentations within shortest period of time, so that the people of district Shopian will be provided with a better quality of power supply round the clock and meet their long pending demands.

KARACHI: The PCB has proposed that India can play their Asia Cup matches at a neutral venue while Pakistan and other competing teams play in the host country, its chief Najam Sethi revealed on Friday. Sethi said they have sent a proposal to the Asian Cricket Council (ACC). The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) had refused to travel to Pakistan due to political tension between the two nations and demanded the shifting of the continental tournament to a neutral venue.

"We have decided on this hybrid model that Pakistan plays its Asia Cup matches at home and India their matches at a neutral



venue and that is our proposal to the Asian Cricket Council," said Sethi, who took over as the PCB chairman from former cricketer Ramiz Raja, during a press conference.

The Asia Cup, involving six teams, will be played from September 2 to 17, though the exact schedule of matches is yet to be announced due to uncertain-

for the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's (SCO)
Council meeting will help thaw relations between the two nations.
"We have been told that,

maybe, the ice will keep on melting. If this happens when the Champions Trophy is held in Pakistan in 2025, India would consider playing in Pakistan. We have been advised to play the Asia Cup at a neutral venue and also go to India for the World Cup," said Sethi but did not say exactly who has advised them.

Indian coastal city of Goa

Sethi indicated the public mood in his country is that Pakistan should play cricket with India on level terms.

"Our government has imposed no restrictions about playing against India. But I can say right now that public mood is, we are not needy and we can stand on our own feet financially and we want to play cricket with India honourably. We are also negotiating with the ACC," Sethi said.

The PCB chairman, however, did not specify who in the government was advising the PCB on the issue.

Sethi said that if Pakistan decides to shift all India matches in the Asia Cup to a neutral venue, the neighbours should also apply the same hybrid experiment during the 50-over World Cup in October-November this year.

India are hosting the World Cup and there is talk across the border that Pakistan's matches be moved to neutral venues.
