

## **How Archaeologists Can Help Us Live With** Wild Animals

#### **The Conversation**

For thousands of years, people in the British Isles lived with and depended on wild animals for food and clothes. The land teemed with species such as deer, boar, wolves, lynx and beavers. Then came farming, population growth and industrialisation. Many species were hunted to extinction and their habitats were lost.

Archaeological research reaches back in time to understand how humans and wild animals interacted. Ancient bones and teeth reveal these complex relationships.

Today, interactions between wild animals and people are often in the news, from urban foxes to tree-felling beavers and wild boars. Even the red deer the monarch of the glen, celebrated as a symbol of wild Scotland is facing widespread calls for population control and, on the Hebridean island of South Uist, total eradication.

Deer were a mainstay of British diets before farming and, out on the islands, my research demonstrates they remained an important food source beyond the 15th century. It was only in the middle ages that deer became the preserve of royal hunts and later the favoured prey of feepaying hunters.

Today they are often viewed as pests by the communities they impact. A combination of factors, including COVID-19 and climate change, has seen deer numbers increase and affect both landscapes and gardens. They also cause accidents on roads and carry the ticks that pass on Lyme disease.

As wild animals, they are not owned and only become someone's property when they are captured or killed by persons entitled by law to do so. This is usually the owners of the land they inhabit. Land owning estates manage most herds and may provide hunting access for a fee. The venison can be sold, but often

goes to waste due to a lack of sufficient trained staff to check carcasses and markets for the meat. Hides are generally not valued and antlers are sold as dog chews. South Uist

In March 2023, the tensions between red deer and locals reached a crisis point on the Scottish island of South Uist. There was a call to eradicate an entire herd of 1,198 animals, as their behaviour was negatively affecting locals. Arguments on either side focused on their history, use and value.

As an animal archaeologist, my research has shown that red deer were taken to Scottish islands for food more than 5,000 years ago.

In the absence of any predators, their numbers were controlled through the killing (and eating) of both red deer calves and adults. Hides were worked and the valuable antlers, shed annually from stags, were used to create beautifully crafted tools and adornments. Red deer are represented in early art, both on and off the islands. A recent find of spectacular rock art on mainland Scotland has highlighted their cultural importance during this period.

Unlike on most of mainland Britain, deer remained an important island food and thrived up until recently. In the 20th century, new animals were introduced from the mainland. Genetic analysis suggests these deer supplemented existing populations and the herds became reestablished.

Over the past decades deer numbers across the UK have exploded from 450,000 in the 1970s to 2 million today the highest level for 1,000 years.

A recent count found that South Uist deer numbers have increased by a third, from around 800 in 2015 to 1,200 today. This pattern is repeated elsewhere, such as the Isles of Lewis and Harris. At the same time, the prevalence of ticks and the disease they carry has increased.

Management

Deer herds clearly need to be managed, but there is a cost. Culling them requires trained individuals, as well as care to ensure animals do not suffer. Paying hunters provide some income, but the value of deer is not clear to all who live in deer-impacted communities.

As in the past, venison, antler and hides are all valuable items. Investment in resources and training by Stras Uibhist, the community-owned company that manages the 93,000 acre South Uist Estate, is producing venison. That's both as a low-cost local food and a high-value delicacy. Antler is also a sustainable resource, grown and shed each year.

Archaeological initiatives are demonstrating to islanders, and beyond, how easy it is to work with this material. With only simple tools, saleable items inspired by island heritage and culture can be produced. On South Uist, the estate is looking to process and sell hides, while wildlife focused deer stalking with cameras can provide new tourist activities.



## **Alligator Gar' Fish** Found In Dal Lake

Srinagar: The Jammu and Kashmir Lake Conservation and Management Authority (LCMA), during the ongoing cleaning of Dal Lake on Thursday, discovered a rare kind of fish for the first time, which is said to be an "Alligator Gar" fish.

Known for its crocodile-like head and razorsharp teeth, 'Alligator Gar' fish is native to North America.



Masood Ahmad, an expert from J&K LCMA's research and monitoring department said they are going for an analysis of the fish with the help of fisheries and SKUAST-K's fisheries department.

'We are going to seek help from the fisheries department and SKUAST-K so as to find out the effects of this type of fish on our existing fish species in Dal Lake," he said.

The official said that during the normal deweeding routine in Dal Lake, they found a rare kind of fish on the con-



Videos of the rare fish found during the cleaning of the Dal Lake went viral on social media, where the fish was displayed and exhibited. The netizens expressed surprise with many saying that the fish type is an invasive species and a threat to aquatic life.

Dr Farooz Ahmad Bhat, Dean at the Faculty of Fisheries, Shere-Kashmir University of Agricultural Science and

Technology - Kashmir (SKUAST-K) said the fish that was seen in the Dal Lake is an alligator gar fish, which has been sighted for the first time in Kashmir.

"This fish is not harmful, but we don't have any research on it as this is the first time

it has been seen here in Dal Lake," Dr Farooz said. He said in 2016, grass carp fish were seen here in Dal Lake. "Later, our team also found another in the Manasbal Lake, but this alligator gar has been heard for the first time in Kashmir," he said, adding, "We will look into how and where it came here in Kashmir and how

long it has been here.' Dr Farooz said that proper research will be done on how it reached here or whether it is dangerous for the local fish

varieties in Kashmir.

## **Uk Gives Cruise Missiles** To Ukraine; Kyiv Delays **Counteroffensive As It Waits For More Weapons**

**KYIV:** The British government announced Thursday it was giving long-range cruise missiles to Ukraine to help drive out Russia's occupying forces, just as Kyiv delayed a possible counteroffensive more than 14 months after the Kremlin's full-scale invasion as it awaits the delivery of more Western weapons.

UK Defense Secretary Ben Wallace told lawmakers in the House of Commons that Britain is donating Storm Shadow missiles, a conventionally-armed deep-strike weapon with a range of more than 250 kilometers.

That means it can hit targets deep behind the front line, including in Russia-occupied Crimea. UK media reported that Ukraine has pledged not to use the missiles to attack Russia itself.

Wallace said the missiles "are now going into or are in the country itself."

He added: "This will give Ukraine capability to make Crimea untenable for Russian forces" and would force a Russian rethink of where to position its Black Sea fleet.

The British move gives another boost to the Ukrainian military after it received other advanced Western weapons including tanks and long-range precision artillery.

The announcement came shortly after Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky said his country's military needs more time to prepare an anticipated counteroffensive aimed at pushing back Russian occupying forces and opening a new chapter in the war more than 14 months after the Kremlin's full-scale invasion.

Zelensky said in an interview broadcast Thursday by the BBC that it would be "unacceptable" to launch the assault now because too many lives would be lost.

## **Pakistan Supreme Court Declares** Imran Khan's Arrest 'Illegal', **Orders His Immediate Release**

ISLAMABAD: In a major relief for Imran Khan, Pakistan's Supreme Court on Thursday declared the former prime minister's arrest "illegal" and ordered his immediate release after he was produced before a bench on its orders. The order to produce 70-year-old Khan was issued

by a three-member bench, comprising Chief Justice of Pakistan Umar Ata Bandial, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar and Justice Athar Minallah. The bench, which heard

Tehreek-e-Insaf Pakistan chairman's plea against his arrest in the Al-Qadir Trust case, expressed anger at the way Khan was taken into custody from the premises of the Islamabad High Court. The bench had directed the

National Accountability Bureau (NAB) to produce Khan by 4:30 pm (local time) when the court would reconvene.

Khan was produced before the court amid tight security. As he entered the courtroom, it was closed, and subsequently, the bench resumed the hearing of the case.

"It is good to see you," Chief Justice Bandial told Khan. "We believe that Imran Khan's arrest was illegal," the

top judge said. He said that the Islamabad High Court should hear the case on Friday. "You will have to accept whatever the high court decides," the judge added.



Bandial also said that it is every politician's responsibility to ensure law and order. Earlier in the day, Bandial

asked how an individual could be arrested from the court premises. Justice Minallah observed that Khan had indeed entered court premises. "How can anyone be denied the right to justice?" he asked.

The court also observed that no one could be arrested from the court without permission of the court's registrar. It observed that the arrest tantamount to denying access to justice without fear and intimation, which was the right of every citizen.

It also said that by entering the premises of a court means surrendering to the court and how a person could be ar-rested after surrender. "If an individual surrendered to the court, then what does arresting them mean?" the chief justice said.

Khan's counsel Hamid Khan informed that court that his client had approached the Islam-

abad High Court (IHC) seeking a pre-arrest bail but was arrested by paramilitary Rangers. "Rangers misbehaved with Imran Khan and arrested

him," the lawyer said. The court also took note

of about 90 to 100 Rangers personnel entering the court to arrest Khan. "What dignity remains of the court if 90 people entered its premises? How can any individual be arrested from court premises?" the chief Justice asked.

Chief Justice Bandial also at point observed that the National Accountability Bureau had committed "contempt of court". "They should have taken permission from the court's registrar before the arrest. Court staffers were also subjected to abuse," he said.

Khan was arrested on Tuesday from the Islamabad High Court and an accountability court on Wednesday handed him over to the National Accountability Bureau for eight days in connection with the Al-Qadir Trust case.



HELSINKI: Finland's outgoing Prime Minister Sanna Marin has filed for divorce jointly with her husband of three years Markus Raikkonen, they said on Instagram on Wednesday.

"We are grateful for the 19 years together and our beloved daughter. We will remain best friends," they said in separate Instagram stories. Marin and Raikkonen, who until recently worked at a venture capital firm, share a 5-yearold daughter. They married in 2020 while Marin was in office dealing with the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

"We have lived our youth together, entered adulthood together and grown into parents for our dear daughter together," Marin wrote on Instagram after her August 2020 wedding to Raikkonen.

Marin and her Social Democratic Party lost Finland's election for parliament last month, trailing the right-wing National Coalition Party as well as the na-

tionalist Finns Party. Marin, 37, the world's youngest prime minister when she took office in 2019, is considered by fans around the globe as a millennial role model for progressive new leaders, even as voters at home opted for a new government.

## **Dalit Groom Attacked For Riding Horse In UP**

AGRA: A 22-year-old Dalit groom was allegedly beaten with rods and sticks, and forced to dismount the horse, while several women in the wedding procession were attacked and molested by a group of upper caste men here.

Though the incident took place on the night of May 4 in Sohalla area under Sadar Bazar police station of the city, an FIR was lodged on Tuesday on a complaint by the groom's motherin-law, Geeta Devi.

"When my son-in-law, Ajay Kumar, along with other guests entered the Radhakrishna marriage hall where the wedding was to be held, they were attacked by around 20-25 men, mainly Thakurs, who hurled casteist slurs and said 'Dalit grooms in our village do not ride horses, how dare you?' They also snapped the power supply three-four times and molested women at the venue," Geeta stated in the FIR.

A case has been registered against four named accused and several unidentified persons under the SC/ST Act.

On Thursday, a senior police official said that the matter was being investigated and action would be taken accordingly.

UNNAO (UP): A teenage couple was allegedly killed by the girls' relatives and the bodies hung from a tree in a village here to make it look like suicide, police said on Thursday.

When she raised hue and cry, the accused tied a rope around her neck and gagged her mouth. Later she raised an alarm and some people came on spot while the accused fled away. and a case (FIR No.33/2006) was registered. On 30 December 2006, trial court framed charges for offences under 354, 376/511 RPC and the accused was put to trial. Later on 23 February 2017, the accused was acquitted and the then State government challenged the

order before the High Court. "It is a settled position of law that the prosecutrix in a case relating to sexual assault is the most important witness. It is also a settled position of law that testimony of a victim of sexual assault has to be ordinarily relied upon unless there are compelling reasons necessitating the need for its corroboration," a bench of Justice Sanjay Dhar, Judge, adding, "If the Court finds that testimony of the prosecutrix in a case relating to sexual assault is reliable, conviction can be based upon it without insisting for corroboration.

As per the evidence on record, the court said, charge for offence under Section 354 RPC has been established against the accused.

"In the instant case, ....the trial

Court has ignored and excluded

the relevant material, as such, the judgment of acquittal deserves to be reversed," the court said and allowed the appeal by holding the accused guilty for offence under Section 354 RPC.

However, having regard to the fact that the convicted person faced trial before the trial court for more than ten years and keeping in view the fact that there was nothing on record to show that he has any criminal background, the court said that he does not deserve to be sentenced to maximum punishment.

While awarding punishment, the court said, it has to be noted that the accused happens to be the cousin brother of the prosecutrix and having regard to their relationship, the prosecutrix had reposed trust and confidence in him and accompanied him to a secluded place.

"By indulging in an abhorrent act of outraging modesty of the prosecutrix, the accused has shattered the trust and confidence of the prosecutrix," the court said, adding, "Therefore, an adequate and appropriate punishment is required to be awarded against the accused." Subsequently the court sentenced him to undergo simple imprisonment for a period of four months and to pay a fine of Rs.10,000. "In default of payment of fine, the accused shall undergo a further imprisonment of

## **Two Killed As Car Falls Into Deep** Gorge In Doda

JAMMU: Two men died after their car skidded off the road and fell into a 200-ft-deep gorge as the driver lost control of the vehicle while negotiating a curve in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district on Thursday evening, police said.

Locals along with police launched a rescue operation. The two men were shifted to the Government Medical College (GMC), Doda, according to the police.

'Two people travelling in a private car were on their way to Jammu from Doda's Premnagar area. When they reached Malhori, the driver lost control of the vehicle while negotiating a curve due to overspeeding," said Senior Superintendent of Police, Doda, Abdul Qayoom.

"Both were shifted to GMC, Doda, where doctors declared them brought dead," he said, adding the bodies will be handed over to the family members of the deceased after postmortem examination.

In another incident, a 58-year-old man was killed after he was hit by a speeding car on the Doda-Bhaderwah national highway on Thursday afternoon, the police said

The incident took place when the man, Mir Din from Massri village, was walking towards his home, they said.

Superintendent of Police, Bhaderwah, Kameshwar Puri said the police were informed that a man's body was lying in a pool of blood near the Senai bridge on the Bhalla-Bhaderwah stretch of the Doda-Pathankot highway -- 16 km from Bhaderwah town.

During inquiry, it was found that Din sustained multiple injuries after he was hit by a speeding car and died on the spot, the SP said.

The errant vehicle has been identified through CCTV footage. Efforts are being made to arrest the culprit, he said. The body was handed over to the family of the deceased after post-mortem examination, the police said.

## **Jobless Growth Risk**

itch Ratings has revised down India's GDP growth forecast for 2023-24 to 6 percent from 6.2 percent, due to factors such as inflation and interest rates. This comes after the World Bank also lowered its growth forecast for India to 6.3 percent and called for a more inclusive labor market. The world has been severely impacted by the ongoing war in Ukraine and India has also been affected - albeit, not to the extent other countries have been. In the neighbourhood, Pakistan's economy has been the hardest hit, bringing the country to the brink of economic ruin. But India is pulling along well and remains one of the world's fastest-growing economies.

Despite the Fitch Ratings downgrade, India is expected to be a stable economy, thanks to its resilient investment prospects. The private sector seems poised for stronger investment growth.

One of India's biggest advantages is that its large domestic market makes it an attractive destination for foreign capital. The country has also been bidding for capital looking for new destinations following the disruption in global supply chains triggered by the Ukraine war. And India is likely to become a go-to place for major global corporations. Recently, Apple set up shop in the country. It has launched its first retail store in India, located in Mumbai, and will open another store in Delhi shortly. Until now, Apple products have only been available in India through a vast network of resellers or online. The move comes as Apple tries to deepen its retail push in India, which is the world's second-largest smartphone market.

This is a big development at a time when global supply chain disruption triggered by the Ukraine war and the west's developing antagonism towards China is forcing countries to shift their bases toward more stable markets. To top it all, India also offers a lucrative market as it boasts a burgeoning middle class that has money to spend. So, India's growth prospects have brightened, although this year's growth is expected to be slower than the 7 percent expected in 2022-23. Nonetheless, the country's economy is expected to rebound to 6.7 percent in 2024-25, indicating a steady recovery in the long run.

Recently, India has also overtaken China as the world's most populous nation, according to United Nations data. The country's demographic profile, therefore, presents a competitive advantage in terms of workforce, with a relatively young population. But this young population needs jobs which only a growing economy can provide. So, the government needs to ensure that while the economy grows, it shouldn't be a jobless growth.



## **Pakistan's Reservoir of Rage**

yperbole is something that comes easy to Pakistanis, especially when it comes to politics, and in the political lexicon of Pakistan, the word 'unprecedented' has been overused to the point of becoming meaningless. Every once in a while

though, it fits. After the dramatic arrest of wheelchair-bound former prime minister and chairman of the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf Imran Khan from the premises of the Islamabad High Court by a large contingent of paramilitary troops, it was as if a reservoir of rage had burst open, spilling red onto the streets with the floodwaters inundating hitherto sacrosanct shores.

The rage isn't new. We have seen many violent protests and will no doubt continue to see them, but the targets this time were those who have historically been offlimits to even the angriest of mobs: the symbols and strongholds of the powerful military establishment.

Protesters ransacked the official residence of the Lahore corps commander, piling his furniture onto the lawn before setting it ablaze and posting the footage on social media. Many were seen walking away with the spoils of their victory, ranging from strawberries stored in the fridge to paintings and golf clubs. One protester was even seen making off with the peacock that graced the garden. Then the entire building was set ablaze. Even more significant was a crowd, led by a sole woman, that shook the gates of the nerve centre of the military, the general headquarters in the garrison town of Rawalpindi. Surprisingly, they met no initial resistance, leading many to wonder whether the protesters were allowed to wreak havoc in order to lay the groundwork for a wider crackdown on the party that, not too long ago, was considered to be very close to the military establishment and had been helped into power by the very forces it was now so bitterly opposed to. It seems that many PTI lead-

ers are aware of this and are thus taking pains to distance their party from the violence. Others perhaps even more ominously, attribute the lack of resistance to what may be a split in the ranks of the military, though at this point there is no real evidence to sup port that supposition.

A more likely explanation is that authorities may have wanted to prevent a bloodbath, but in the byzantine world of Pakistani power politics, it is often impossible to tell what is shadow and what is substance. In other parts of Pakistan, public buildings, buses and toll booths were set ablaze by party supporters, and at least one school was reduced to ashes

In many places, there were violent confrontations between protesters and security forces, with the death of several protesters and injuries on both sides now confirmed. Many of Khan's senior colleagues in the PTI have been arrested and the crackdown appears to have intensified.

At the moment it is difficult to verify many claims given that electronic media is practically barred from displaying footage of

of the PTI.

However, a dethroned Khan proved to be a tricky opponent who, after initially blaming the United States for being part of the 'conspiracy' to remove him from office, turned his guns onto then Chief of Army Staff, General Qamar Javed Bajwa, whom he had previously taken pains to defend and extol.

From being a key partner and ally, Bajwa became a traitor and the target of the PTI's incredibly vocal supporters, who relentlessly attacked him on social media and in public rallies, calling on all and sundry to stand with them against the establishment's machinations.

Such a stance would be laudable f it wasn't also rather hypocritical.

That's because not too long ago, too many of these newly minted revolutionaries would label far milder and far more cautious critique of the military (one tries not to stick one's neck out too far around here) as treason and would either look the other way or actually cheer when critical journalists were attacked, abducted and sometimes even shot.

Khan himself has made the jailing of his political opponents something of a policy point, calling for strict sentences for his adversaries and directing state institutions to prosecute them on sometimes flimsy charges, all with the blessings of the establishment

Now, as is often the case in Pakistan, the roles have been reserved, and Khan himself has become another entry in the shamefully long list of sitting and former prime ministers who have found themselves out of favour and thus on the wrong side of a rather malleable judicial system.

While the case against Khan may or may not have merit - opinion is typically divided - there is little doubt that the actual reason for his incarceration is the relentless campaign he has waged against his former benefactors, a campaign that became far more pointed after the assassination attempt on him, which he openly accuses a serving major general of masterminding.

The fact is that just about every Pakistani prime minister has faced some version of this sort of victimisation at the hands of the establishment, which doesn't like it when civilian leaders start to imagine that they actually wield power.

The tragedy is that, despite this history, those very civilian politicians eagerly wait for scraps to fall their way from their master's table in order to taste a semblance of power and, crucially, to cut their opponents down to size. And so, what should be an opportunity for truth and reconciliation and a minimal political code of conduct simply becomes an opportunity for the victimised to become the victimiser.

That's a script that has been played out time and again since the birth of this country. Now, we stand at a critical crossroads: Will the

## Maruti's Catch-Up Drive

Even a year ago, Maruti Suzuki was not convinced electric vehicle (EV) technology had much of a future in India. Chairman RC Bhargava went on record to explain why he thought the market conditions were not conducive. About 75% the energy consumed, he said, was coming from cokefired plants, which would make EV vehicles much less cleaner than desired. Bhargava also noted that India had limited reserves of lithium and cobalt needed for EV batteries and imports would be costly. At that point, Maruti felt compressed natural gas (CNG) was a more acceptable fuel for small cars and that the prospects of using hydrogen should also be explored.

In less than a year, however, the company made a U-turn, showcasing an EV at the auto show—a mid-size electric SUV, eVX, fitted with a 60kWh battery and having a range of 550km. The vehicle is to be rolled out in 2025, followed by six more launches by 2030. It was a clear change in strategy, possibly prompted by the speed at which rival Tata Motors was moving and also the realisation that EVs, while accounting for just 1.5% of the market today, are finding buyers in good numbers.

To be sure, the tipping point, when EVs will sell more than internal combustion engine (ICE) vehicles, is probably a good 10 years away. But the fact that Tata Motors was going full steam ahead must have jolted Maruti out of its complacence. Today, having sold 45,000 units in 2022-23, Tata Motors now commands 70% of the EV car market, having invested in new products and the value chain. As an early mover, it would also have garnered a fair bit of experience; the 600-million-odd kms that its EVs have clocked on Indian roads must have given it valuable insights. All of which means Maruti will need to work extra hard to build an EV portfolio and also put in place the supply chain and dealerships.

The Maruti management also conceded in January this year it had ceded market share in the passenger car market because it was late to roll out sports utility vehicles (SUV), now a popular segment. The company has tried to make up for lost time by rolling out the compact Brezza SUV and the mid-size Grand Vitara, both of which have done reasonably well. Maruti gained 370 basis points of market share in the SUV segment sequentially in Q4FY23. More recently, it launched Fronx and the Jimny, which haven't exactly set the market on fire and analysts believe the Fronx could cannibalise sales of the Baleno.

## **Strategic Significance of 6th Indian Ocean Conference**

The sixth international Indian Ocean Conference is set to begin in Bangladesh capital city Dhaka from May 12 which will be attended by about 150 delegates, including high-level representatives from 25 countries.

The theme of this year's conference is 'Peace, Prosperity and Partnership for a Resilient Future' due to the post-Covid situation and the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war.

Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina will inaugurate the conference. She will also host a dinner in honour of the guests who will participate in the conference.

Speaking about the two-day conference, Foreign Minister of Bangladesh AK Abdul Momen said that the event was mainly organised for the coastal countries of the Indian Ocean, but in the changing global context, various important and relevant issues are expected to be discussed.

The Mauritius president, Maldives vice-president and Indian External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar are among the dignitaries who will attend the conference. "Foreign Ministers of Bhutan, Nepal, Bahrain and Singapore alongside the ministerial representatives of Seychelles, Sri Lanka, Madagascar will also participate in the conference," Momen said.

The conference is being organised by the India Foundation in association with the Bangladesh Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

The Indian Ocean Conference (IOC) was started in 2016 and in the last six years it has emerged as the "flagship consultative forum" for countries in the region on regional affairs.

The conference endeavours to bring critical states and principal maritime partners of the region together on a common platform to deliberate upon the prospects of regional cooperation for Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR).

However, the 6th Indian Ocean Conference in Bangladesh, most importantly, is taking place at a time when the Bangladesh government has recently set an 'Indo-Pacific Outlook' officially. The overarching goal of Bangladesh's recent Indo-Pacific Outlook is to enhance the country's ties with the USA and West, India for engagement in this region, accelerate economic growth, and address common issues shared by the other nations. Despite Indo-Pacific Strategy's widespread support, some countries have claimed that it's only likely to serve to escalate regional instability, slow China's growth



and Bangladesh's lean towards the US. Bangladesh is hesitant to take any sides in the conflict between the US and its allied countries and China. For instance, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Bangladesh had announced a fresh Indo-Pacific Outlook to highlight Bangladesh's geopolitical standpoint on the region as well as its objectives to move forward as a nonalignment foreign policy. In other words, Bangladesh will likely clarify its own stance in the Indo-Pacific region through Indo-Pacific Outlook to take the position of regional leader, rather than joining any political bloc. In this way, India-US-Bangladesh relations would reach a new level. Bangladesh could gain trust from the Indian government because India is an active member of the Indo-Pacific alliance. Bangladesh, on the other hand, is handling the Chinese predicament intelligently because its goal is to engage structurally rather than militarily. Chinese ambassador to Dhaka has already stated that Many of Bangladesh's Indo-Pacific outlook concepts are similar to China's.

The world has dramatically changed in the past few years. When the block was formed, the regional and global political landscape was relatively peaceful and harmonious. China, USA, India, Russia and the European Union had minimal conflict of interests. It was a time when multipolarity enjoyed a positive vibe in international relations despite their underlying competition. Today, the world has gradually become polarized and divided on issues of power, resources, and hegemony. The Quad-China confrontation and Ukraine War has been the ultimate test of strategic visions that the West has against China and Russia.

Against this backdrop, India has been promoting the idea of 'net security provider' in South Asia and the Indian Ocean region. Again, the geopolitics of Indian Ocean region is now brewing through new strategic and security initiatives such as the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) of China, Quadrilateral Security Dialogue (QUAD), Indo-Pacific Strategy (IPS), Indo-Pacific Economic Framework (IPEF) and Australia, UK and US (AUKUS) let by the USA and its allies. Besides, India also announced SAGAR vision (Security and Growth for all in the Region, India and its Neighborhood).

The alliance has recently been reactivated by the rise in smuggling, arms trade, and human trafficking in the Indian Ocean Region. Maritime Safety and Security, Countering Terrorism and Radicalization, Combating Trafficking and Transnational Organized Crime, Cyber Security, Protection of Critical Infrastructure and Technology, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief. Maritime security and countering terrorism and other crimes in the Indian Ocean have emerged as a focus area for India as part of its Indo-Pacific strategy and the doctrine of Security and Growth for All in the Region (SAGAR).

The main task of this grouping will be to maintain security in the sea area and stop human trafficking and smuggling. The members of the alliance may also work on providing mutual humanitarian assistance. To this end, they will provide mutual training to their Navies and Coast Guards for the next one year. Member States should conduct Naval exercises that would be a milestone for the IOR.

The Indian Ocean gets its strategic significance for various reasons. It was a great maritime route for Asian, European and African States for many years. The Indian Ocean has been considered as a hub of the maritime connectivity project. China's 'String of Pearls' and Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) project and India's International North South Transport Project (IN-STP) go through this Ocean. Even the US Government has transformed its strategy from the Asia Pacific to the Indo Pacific to include the Indian Ocean. The Japan and India proposed 'Cotton Route' is also a big issue that can be taken into consideration. Japan-India-Bangladesh strategic troika is also a consideration in recent times.

But there are some problems too. Transnational crimes such as illegal narcotics trade, weapons and human trafficking issues, piracy, armed robbery, drug smuggling, illegal fishing, terrorism, environmental degradation issues are some issues. The Indian Ocean has been used as a safe passage by some evil players. States on the Indian Ocean face these serious challenges every day.

Illegal drug trafficking from India and Afghanistan, Iran through the Indian Ocean route is known to all. According to some sources, the UNODC has estimated that 54 per cent of the heroin in India is produced domestically, while 45 per cent originates from Afghanistan. India is particularly vulnerable to the Southern route due to its Western border with Pakistan. Near this border, in the Western Indian States of Punjab and Haryana, is where many of the heroin seizures occur. In 2012, 105 kg of drugs were seized, which had been trafficked from Pakistan along rail routes. In 2013 alone, the Indian Narcotics Control Bureau reported seizures totaling 4.609 kg. Data collected through seizures by various authorities has confirmed India as a transit country for Southeast Asia,

West Africa and North America. Marine resources

Many fishermen from Myanmar and India are involved in illegal fishing in the jurisdictional area under Bangladesh. So, Bangladesh faces economic losses in terms of marine resources. Some armed groups kidnap Bangladeshi fishermen for ransom. Basically, fishing in the Sundarbans region has become very dangerous.

Sri Lanka has also faced an increase in heroin use within the country, as well as becoming a transit country for trafficking destined for other places. Much of the heroin entering Sri Lanka arrives on fishing boats or by air, often coming through India or Pakistan. The numbers of seizures which Sri Lankan authorities have conducted remains relatively small, meaning that the data collected is not always reliable. Smugglers in Sri Lanka have come from a variety of countries, including Pakistan, India, Iran and the Maldives.

Environmental degradation in the sea is common now. Climate Change and the rise in sea levels are among other issues. The transnational terrorist threat is seen as a serious threat.

Not only Bangladesh, countries like India, Sri Lanka, Maldives and all States across the Indian Ocean face the same problems. In the disaster period, regional cooperation is much needed. In the past, regional countries helped each other through various operations during disasters.

Now Bangladesh as a host country has got a regional platform to address these problems. To ensure better maritime security, all regional countries should work together to tackle the problems. India and Sri Lanka have given their full support to this alliance. They have promised to hold bilateral or joint military exercises with each of the countries in the alliance. This is such a platform. Bangladesh expects cooperation from the other stakeholders and wants to help others to face the challenges.

Thus, there are some opportunities to focus on countering terrorism and extremism, transnational crimes such as narcotics, weapons and human trafficking, humanitarian assistance and disaster relief and protecting the maritime environment.

## 2023 The Likely End Of Conventional And Dawn Of New Creator Economy?

The world has witnessed a largely gloomy past few years from 2020 onwards due to pandemic, geo-political tensions, long Russia-Ukraine war and an impending recession but however the silver lining has been the creator economy. Last year, the unexpected folks like the corn kid and 'kacha badam' became viral sensations allowing the creators behind them to encash on their short-loved yet humongous popularity.

The creator economy has been constantly and criticized for being overhyped and overfunded with no future. On the contrary it has been reinventing itself and evolving into something more significant through emergence of newer models and opportunities for the creators, communities and brands.

Year 2023 is likely to witness big shifts as brands are moving away from being dependent on 1% of creators and the rise of creator communities that help 99% monetise early, added to this the power of IP Selling.

The advent of smartphones, accessible and affordable data plans has led to the decentralisation of media. Creators have existed for a long time, people who pursued their passion and created content, but it is only in the last decade that they have been able to monetise it. According to Kalaari Capital, the total size of the global creator economy is pegged at \$104 billion and more than 50 million people worldwide consider themselves creators.

The creator economy landscape is an important pillar of the emerging Gig Economy. According to a study by Oxford Economics, video sharing platform YouTube's India creator economy was pegged at Rs 10,000 crore in 2021, up from Rs 6,800 crore in 2020. One of the pioneer's in the space, YouTube's



Partner Program launched in 2007, allowed creators to earn revenue through advertisements. All major global platforms and many emerging India Startups are now seemingly following the same path, wherein creators are allowed to put advertisements and earn a share of the revenue.

As they become more established and gain a following, creators are looking beyond sponsored content and merchandise to create their own IP. This shift allows creators to have more control over their content, generate more revenue, and build a lasting brand giving rise to filmmakers, script writers, screenplay specialists finding more opportunities and importantly livelihoods.

Globally, there are over 200 million creators and India is set to have the largest base of social media content creators with the figure crossing 100 million this year, according to a report by influencer marketing firm Zefmo. The report predicts that the "organised influencer marketing" sector is expected to reach Rs 3000 crore by 2024 and the revenue share of micro influencers is set to rise from 9% to 14% by 2024.

In the past, it was challenging for creators with fewer followers to monetize their content, as most opportunities were reserved for those with massive followings. However, this is changing rapidly, and creators with small but engaged audiences now have more opportunities than ever to earn a living from their content. There are platforms that offer a revenue-sharing model based on the creator's engagement rate, rather than their follower count. This approach is a departure from the traditional model, where revenuesharing was based solely on follower count, a significant step towards creating a more equitable creator economy.

Platforms like Patreon, Ko-fi, and Buy Me a Coffee allow creators to set up a subscription-based model where fans can support them directly. This approach allows creators to earn a steady income, regardless of the size of their following. Other platforms like Tip Jar and Brave Rewards enable fans to tip creators for their content, which can be a great way for creators to earn some extra income. Indian Startup platforms like Pluc. tv are helping creators harness better relationships with brands and businesses by enabling great storytelling, IP Selling and innovating creator communities.

Brand campaigns are more likely to put a larger amount of their marketing budgets into influencer campaigns than traditional television campaigns. For long, creators were not experimenting, and were relying mostly on platform based revenue and most creators use at least two different platforms. A Deloitte survey revealed that creators, in general, are not satisfied with the performance of the platforms that they use. Most brands now frequently rely on affiliate marketing to leverage influencers on social media. Health, wellness, fast moving consumer goods, sports and entertainment are some of the top segments where creators can break easy. As per reports, in 2022, affiliate market spending in the US is predicted to reach \$8.2 billion and is expected to grow throughout this decade.

According to Teachable, creators earned a total of \$456.7 million through 1,83,744 new courses and 17,686 coaching products in 2020. The average price of a coaching product was \$167 and the platform hit the milestone of having \$1 billion in creator sales in 2020.

Year 2023 will put the creator at the centre of everything. Apart from revenue, leveraging the content for different platforms and customising it as per the market requirements is the way forward. Looking at platforms beyond social media will be a game changer for creators. For instance, Pluc.tv has developed tools that help a creator to monetise early on. There exists a gig corner that has the right tools that allow creators to sell digital products like stock and experiences , and offer exclusive content such as courses or even make their shows for brands or platforms.

Therefore reinvention was inevitable in the creator economy space with the market also learning what, how and from whom to expect. The relationship between Brands and new creators has never been this intimate.

## **Restoring Key Brain Rhythm In 'Smell' Region Of Brain Could Treat Depression**

esearchers have found restoring certain signals, or gamma oscillations, in a brain region associated with processing smells to counter depression in a new study in mice and rats.

The study, led by researchers from New York University (NYU) Grossman School of Medicine, US, and Hungary's University of Szeged, said a certain brain rhythm of communication between brain regions, called gamma and repeating 30 times or more in a second, was an important timing pattern for the encoding of complex information, potentially including emotions.

While causes of depression remain unclear. these gamma oscillation changes act as markers of the disease in brain regions that manage the sense of smell, which have also been tied to emotions. The study is published in the journal Neuron.

The researchers in this study first shut down the olfactory bulb, one of the brain regions managing smell and thought to be a source and conductor of gamma oscillations, in study rodents.

They observed a related spike in depressionlike behaviours in the subjects, following which they reversed these behaviours by boosting gamma signals of the brain at their natural pace.

"This work demonstrates the power of gamma enhancement as a potential approach for countering depression and anxiety in cases where available medications are not effective," said corresponding study author Antal Berenyi, adjunct assistant professor in the Department of Neuroscience and Physiology at NYU Langone Health.

Disease-causing changes in the timing and strength of gamma signals, potentially caused by

infections, trauma, or drugs, from the olfactory bulb to other brain regions of the limbic system, such as the piriform cortex and hippocampus, may alter emotions, even as the team is not sure why

In one theory, depression arises not within the olfactory bulb but in changes to its outgoing gamma patterns to other brain targets.

Using several standard rodent tests of depression, including measures of anxiety that is one of its main symptoms, the team studied the behaviour of rodents to show the effect of the loss of gamma oscillation in the olfactory bulb.

The researchers measured anxiety by observing how long the animals spent in an open space and despair by observing if they stopped swimming earlier when submerged. Similarly, stopping drinking sugar water betrayed a sign of taking less pleasure in things, while refusing to enter

a maze suggested avoidance of stressful situations. Next, using a custom-made device which

recorded the olfactory bulb's gamma oscillations, the researchers suppressed and then amplified the oscillations in the rodents' brain.

Suppression of gamma oscillations in the olfactory lobe induced behaviours resembling depression in humans. In addition, feeding an amplified olfactory bulb signal back into the brains of depressed rats restored normal gamma function in the limbic system, and reduced the depressive behaviours by 40 percent, almost back to normal.

"Moving forward, we will be working to better understand this link in the bulb, and in the regions it connects to, as behaviour changes," said senior study author Gyorgy Buzsaki, professor of Neuroscience in the Department of Neuroscience and Physiology

**NEW DELHI:** The government has decided to re-allocate the Haj flights that were to be operated by crisis-hit Go First from 10 Indian cities to IndiGo and two Saudi Arabian airlines, a senior official said on Thursday.

The decision comes against the backdrop of the uncertainty over cash-starved Go First, which has cancelled all flights since May 3. The budget airline's plea for voluntary insolvency resolution proceedings has also been admitted by the National Company Law Tribunal.

After discussions in the wake of the Go First crisis, the civil aviation ministry has decided to reallocate the flights for the Haj pilgrimage that was to be operated by the carrier.

Go First is scheduled to operate the flights from 10 embarkation points in different parts of the country and now those flights will be operated by IndiGo and two Saudi carriers --Saudia and flyadeal, the official told PTI.

For this year's Haj pilgrimage, the official said there will be a total of 22 embarkation points. Out of them, Go First was to operate from 10 embarkation points, SpiceJet from 4 points, Saudia from 2 points, Air India, Air India Express and Vistara from 2 points each, the official said.

## Tehran-Riyadh Détente: Iran's **Finance Minister Arrives In** Saudi Arabia

**RIYADH:** Iran's Finance Minister Ehsan Khandouzi has arrived in Saudi Arabia, becoming the first Iranian official to visit the Arab kingdom following a China-brokered reconciliation agreement between Tehran and Riyadh.

Khandouzi arrived at the airport of Saudi Arabia's southern city of Jeddah on Thursday and was welcomed by Saudi officials, Islamic Development Bank managers, and members of the Iranian Consulate General in the city. The Iranian finance minister. who is heading a high-ranking

economic delegation, is scheduled to take part in bilateral meetings with Saudi officials and deliver speeches at meetings of the Islamic Development Bank, a Jeddah-based multilateral development finance institution focusing on Islamic finance for infrastructure development. Khandouzi said last month

that Tehran aimed to raise its

annual trade with Riyadh to \$1 billion in the first step of resuming economic ties.

He said the target was set by the Trade Promotion Organization of Iran (TPO) based on the two countries' capacities. On March 10, Îran and Saudi

Arabia agreed to restore diplomatic ties seven years after they severed relations. According to the agreement, the two sides committed to reopening embassies in Tehran and Riyadh by May.

The landmark agreement, mediated by China, also included the implementation of a security cooperation agreement signed in 2001 and a 1998 pact to boost bilateral cooperation on trade, investment, technology, and culture.

## **State Taxes Deptt** Enforcement Realises Rs. 25.34 **Lacs From Erring**

SRINAGAR- The State Taxes Department Enforcement (Central) Kashmir has realised a penalty amount of Rs. 25,34,808, which is by far the highest single penalty realised by the office under the Jammu and Kashmir GST Act, 2017 against one loaded goods vehicle for failing to produce any documents as required to be accompanying the goods on movement/ transit.

The vehicle bearing No. JK01AD 3557 was apprehended on a tip-off by a team of officers lead by Assistant Commissioner Enforcement (Central) Kashmir, Shabnam Rashid and comprising of inspectors, SIs/ Guards of the central Enforcement Wing, during a Nakka laid on NH-44 between Hyderpora Bye-Pass and Batamaloo Bye-Pass.

The team of Officials was constituted by the Deputy Commissioner State Taxes Department Enforcement (Central) Kashmir, Parveez Ahmad Raina.

The Driver/ Person in Charge of the vehicle disclosed that the loaded goods are cigarettes only but failed to

produce any documents as required to be accompanying the goods on movement/ transit. Accordingly, FORM GST MOV- 01 and MOV- 02 were issued to the driver/PIC on spot and vehicle was detained at Excise and Taxation Complex, Solina, Rambagh, Srinagar.

Further proceeding U/s 129 of JK GST Act, 2017 were initiated and physical verification of the goods was conducted on the same day under the supervision of DC/AC Enforcement (Central) Kashmir and accordingly penalty was calculated under aforementioned section.

On 10 May, 2023 the owner of the goods appeared before DC Enforcement (Central) Kashmir and moved an application for release of goods. The goods were released after realising of penalty amount of Rs 2534808.00.

Meanwhile, the Commissioner State Taxes Department Jammu and Kashmir Dr. Rashmi Singh and Additional Commissioner State Taxes Department (Adm. & Enf.) Kashmir Shakeel Maqbool (ICAS) expressed their satisfaction and applauded the efforts of the team.

### **Govt Waives Duty** And Agri Cess On Crude Soya Bean, **Sunflower Oil Imports**

NEW DELHI: The finance ministry has exempted imports of crude soya bean and sunflower oils from basic customs duty and agriculture infrastructure and development cess till June 30, subject to certain conditions.

The duty exemption is applicable only for importers holding TRQ (Tariff Rate Quota) licence for 2022-23 fiscal.

Under TRQ, a certain volume of imports are allowed at relatively low tariffs. Once the volume limit is reached, a higher tariff applies to additional imports. TRQ is allotted to importers by the Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT).

Through a notification, the finance ministry allowed imports of crude soya bean oil and crude sunflower oil at zero basic customs duty and zero AIDC for TRQ licence holders for FY23 up to the June 30, 2023.

"This notification shall come into force on the 11th day of May, 2023, and nothing contained in this notification shall apply after the 30th of June, 2023," the ministry said.

## **Spicejet Says No Plans To Seek Insolvency Proceedings**

**NEW DELHI:** Budget carrier SpiceJet on Thursday said it has no plans to file for insolvency proceedings and has also started the process of reviving its grounded fleet with USD 50 million.

The statement from SpiceJet comes at a time when a lessor has filed an insolvency resolution plea against the airline and crisishit rival Go First being admitted for voluntary insolvency resolution proceedings by the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) on Wednesday.

While citing the recent developments in the Indian aviation market, SpiceJet said it has no plans whatsoever to file for insolvency.

'We want to scotch any speculation that may have arisen due to the filing by another airline. The airline is firmly focussed on its business and remains in active talks with investors to raise funds," it said in a statement.

On May 8, the NCLT issued a notice to the budget carrier on



the insolvency plea filed by lessor AirCastle (Ireland) Ltd and the matter is scheduled for a hearing

next week. Besides, lessors have sought the deregistration of three planes of Spicelet.

'There is absolutely no question of filing for insolvency. Any rumour regarding the same is completely baseless. We are focused firmly on reviving our grounded fleet and getting more and more planes back into the air. Work on this front has already begun, and the company is using the USD 50 million ECLGS funds and our own cash," Spice-

Jet Chairman and Managing Director Ajay Singh said.

SpiceJet also said that it has initiated the process of reviving its grounded fleet with the USD 50 million funds received by the airline from the government's Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) and internal cash accruals. Shares of the airline fell 1 per cent to Rs 29.62 in the afternoon trade on the BSE.

Last week, the airline announced plans to revive 25 grounded aircraft. The airline has around 80 planes in its fleet and is looking to revive 25 grounded Boeing 737 and Q400 aircraft.

Pulwama: The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Pulwama, Dr Basharat Qayoom on Thursday convened 8th meeting of the District Level Committee of Narcotics Coordination (NCORD).

At the outset, the DC discussed various issues related to menace of drug addiction, areas of concern, age group of addicts, hot spots of drug peddling, abuse, besides, cultivation of illicit poppy and cannabis in the district. He said that collective efforts are needed to curb the drug menace and all stakeholders shall have to work in tandem to enhance the rehabilitation of per-

The DC directed all concerned officers for immediate completion of mapping of land used for bhang and poppy cultivation and submission of action taken in destruction of poppy and Cannabis. He also directed CAO and CHO to explore avenues for growing alternative crops in these areas besides providing valuable inputs to land owners.

He asked officers of all line departments to make coordinated efforts to contain the drug peddling and break the supply chain besides taking stringent action against the persons involved in this dangerous trade. The DC said in order to combat this rising societal problem, multi-pronged rehabilitation, counseling and guid-ance policy is being implemented on ground to monitor drug abuse and take remedial measures to curb the menace.

He sought cooperation from the elected representatives, religious heads, families particularly from parents to overcome the menace among the vouth which also leads to other social evils and crimes.

Dr Basharat assured the departments that all requisite support will be provided by the District Administration for saving youth from the ill effects of the drugs. The DC directed Assistant Drug

Controller Pulwama and CMO Pulwama to get CCTV cameras installed at all medical shops, clinical establishments and chemist/ druggist shops for overall surveillance with regard to the containment of drug sales is enforced.



## **ICC Rankings: India Slip** To 3rd Spot; Australia No. 1

**DUBAI:** India dropped to third position behind Pakistan and three points adrift off world number one Australia in the latest ICC ODI Men's Team Rankings announced on Thursday.

Five-time world champions Australia improved their rating from 113 to 118 following the annual update, maintaining a slender lead over Pakistan (116 points) and India (115 points). According to the ICC release,

"Prior to the annual rankings update, Australia were at the top with 113 points with India behind them on decimal count.

'Pakistan were ranked third with 112 points, and briefly went to the top of the charts after their victory in the fourth ODI against New Zealand this month."Pakistan could have stayed at the top position had they managed to complete a 5-0 clean sweep against New Zealand.

With only three rating points

now separating the top three teams, an interesting battle at the top of the rankings is imminent in the year of the World

Cup. The ICC's annual rankings considered all ODI series completed since May 2020 "with series completed before May 2022 weighted at 50 percent and all subsequent series weighted at 100 percent".

"This means that Pakistan have now pipped India in the second spot, with their 4-0 away series defeat in England no longer being counted. Their 3-0 series loss in England in 2021 also has a reduced weightage, helping them leapfrog India in the charts," the ICC said.

India have been heavily impacted by their 2-1 series loss at home against Australia this year. Among other teams, New Zealand are placed fourth with 104 points followed by England, who have 'witnessed a massive 10-point drop in their rating' are at fifth with 101 points.

## Sports Ministry, BCCI, SAI Served Notice From NHRC

have an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) or a properly functional ICC as required by law, according to a statement issued by the

The notices come at a time when several wrestlers. are protesting at Jantar Mantar in New Delhi demanding the sacking and arrest of WFI president and BJP MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh over charges of sexual harassment of women grapplers. The NHRC has taken "suo motu cognisance of a media report that there is no Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) in the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) as mandated by the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (PoSH) Act, 2013".

The Commission has observed that the contents of the media report, if true, amount to a violation of the law, and thus is a matter of concern as it may impact the legal right and dignity of the sportspersons.

## Premier League Season Reaches Final Weeks With Man City Leading Arsenal In Title Race

he title race between Manchester City and Arsenal is headed to the wire. The fight for Champions League qualification has tightened up. It's surely down to two from a group of four teams for relegation.

There's so much still to play for in the Premier League with only two weeks remaining.

Here's a look at the state of play at the top and the bottom:

#### **TITLE RACE**

As many expected, defending champion Manchester City has produced its trademark end-of-season burst to move into first place ahead of long-time leader Arsenal, which stuttered just when a first title since 2004 was looming into view.

City – enjoying a 10-match winning run in the league – leads by one point with four games left, one more than Arsenal

It's far from over, however. City has the tougher run-in, with games to come at an Everton team fighting relegation, at home against Chelsea, and then at Brighton and Brentford – two of the more surprising teams this season with good home

records. City also has the second leg of the Champions League semifinals against Real Madrid to plan around next week

Arsenal is at home against Brighton, at Nottingham Forest and closes with a home match against Wolverhampton.

If Arsenal wins its final three games, City will need three victories in its final four games to guarantee retaining the title.

#### **TOP FOUR**

It has looked for some time that Newcastle and Manchester United would secure the two automatic Champions League qualifying places behind City and Arsenal, but Liverpool's six-match winning run has made things interesting.

Liverpool has climbed to fifth and is one point behind fourth-place United and three behind third-place Newcastle, having played one more game than both of them.

Liverpool likely needs to win its remaining three games - at Leicester, at home against Aston Villa and at last-place Southampton – and hope either Newcastle or United slip up.

Newcastle finishes the season



with games against Leeds, Brighton, Leicester and Chelsea, and probably requires two wins to get into the Champions League for the first time since 2002-03.

United appears more likely to be reeled in by Liverpool, having won only one of its last four league games.

United has a kind final stretch on paper, though, with three of its four matches at home (Wolverhampton, Chelsea and Fulham) along with Bournemouth away.

#### **EUROPA LEAGUE**

The teams finishing in fifth and

sixth place will qualify for the Europa League, and they are currently Liverpool and Tottenham. Brighton is their main challenger, with Aston Villa having an outside chance, too.

With Liverpool almost assured of fifth place or higher, it should end up being a three-team shootout.

Tottenham is two points ahead of Brighton, which has five games still to play – because of various postponements during the season. Tottenham has three. Brighton has a very difficult closing stretch of games, including trips to Arsenal and Newcastle and the visit of City.

Tottenham still has Aston Villa, Brentford and Leeds to play. Villa, which is three points behind Tottenham ahead of the teams' meeting on Saturday, then plays Liverpool and Brighton.

The team that finishes in seventh place will secure a spot in next season's Europa Conference League.

#### RELEGATION

Last-place Southampton is eight points from safety with three games to go and is surely going down, ending its 11-year stay in the Premier League. Relegation will be confirmed as early as Saturday if the team doesn't beat Fulham.

Two more teams will also be demoted and three points separate Nottingham Forest in 16th and Leeds in 19th, with Everton and Leicester in between. Wins might be hard to come by for all four teams in their final three matches

Leeds and Leicester occupy the two relegation berths, and might have the most difficult schedule.

Leicester, in particular, has it tough with a home game against Liverpool on Monday followed by a trip to Newcastle. The easiest game will likely be West Ham at home on the final weekend, by which time Leicester might yet be relegated.

Leeds, now under survival specialist Sam Allardyce, hosts Newcastle and Tottenham on either side of a match at West Ham.

Everton, which has been in the top division since 1954, climbed out of the bottom three with a surprising 5-1 win at Brighton on Monday and has games remaining against Man City, Wolves and Bournemouth.

Forest might just need one more point to be safe but even that won't be easy with matches ahead at Chelsea, at home against Arsenal and at Crystal Palace. (AP)

## **IT Ministry To Send** Notice To WhatsApp Over International Spam Calls

New Delhi: The IT Ministry will send a notice to WhatsApp on the issue of spam calls from unknown international numbers, Minister of State for IT Rajeev Chandrasekhar said today, asserting that the onus of ensuring user safety lies with the digital platforms.

The digital platforms are responsible and accountable for ensuring the safety of 'digital nagriks', the minister said, adding that the government will respond to every instance of alleged misuse or alleged breach of users' privacy.

The minister's comments assume significance as WhatsApp users in India have reported a massive surge in incoming international spam calls over the past few days. Many users complained on Twitter that a major chunk of these spam calls had country codes belonging to Indonesia (+62), Vietnam (+84), Malaysia (+60), Kenya (+254) and Ethiopia (+251).

Mr Chandrasekhar on Tuesday said the ministry is taking note of the matter and will send a notice to WhatsApp on the issue.

'The Ministry is taking note of it, they will send them a notice," he told reporters on the sidelines of an event organised by the Public Affairs Forum of India (PAFI).

He also said that the government is mulling guidelines on what should be permissions for preloaded apps. The minister made it clear that the platforms are responsible for ensuring the safety and trust of users.

"I have said repeatedly that openness trust, safety and accountability are the responsibility of platforms who deliver to digital nagriks," the minister noted.

If there is an issue of spam, it is certainly an issue WhatsApp should look at or any messen-ger platform should look at, he added.

"Government will respond to every alleged misuse or alleged breach of privacy," he said.

One of the problems being examined at this point is also how these numbers are accessed by scammers.

"How are they able to identify which numbers are on WhatsApp...are they doing it blindly...is it some database they have got? If there is a database it is a violation of privacy, or if not are they are doing it through a bot... sending messages to random numbers... But that is certainly something platforms will be asked to look at," he said.

Chandrasekhar tweeted on Wednesday that the government will investigate a claim that WhatsApp accessed the microphone of smartphone users while the phone was not in use.

In a tweet, the minister had said the government will examine the alleged breach of privacy even as the new Digital Personal Data Protection Bill was being readied.

This followed a claim that WhatsApp accessed a user's microphone while he was sleeping. WhatsApp responded saying it has been in touch with the Twitter engineer over the last 24 hours, who posted an issue with his Pixel phone and WhatsApp. "We believe this is a bug on

Android that misattributes information in their Privacy Dashboard and have asked Google to investigate and remediate,"

WhatsApp said in a tweet. The company also claimed that users have full control over their

mic settings. To a question on some online gaming platforms opposing any idea of the self-regulatory organ-isation (SRO) backed by the association IAMAI, the minister said it has already been clarified during the consultation process that no existing industry organisation

can be an SRO. "SRO has to be notified by the Ministry, which means SRO has to be approved by the Ministry as meeting criteria laid down in online gaming rules. There will be SRO that will be formed...100 will apply, and three will be selected based on who is most transparent, inclusive and who represents most stakeholders and who is more credible," the minister said.

## **More Than 71 Million People Internally Displaced** Worldwide In 2022

Geneva, Switzerland: A "perfect storm" of overlapping crises forced tens of millions to flee within their own country last year, sending the number of internally displaced people to a record high, monitors said on Thursday.

An unprecedented 71.1 million internally displaced people (IDPs) were registered in 2022 -- up 20 percent from a year earlier -- amid mass displacement for Russia's war in Ukraine, as well as by the monsoon floods that drenched Pakistan. A full 60.9 million new in-

ternal displacements were meanwhile reported in 2022, with some people forced to flee multiple times during the year, according to a joint report by the Internal Displacement Monitoring Centre (IDMC) and the Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC). That marks an all-time high

for new internal displacements, and an increase of 60 percent compared to the some 38 million fresh displacements seen in 2021.

That number is "extremely high", IDMC chief Alexandra Bilak told AFP. "Much of the increase is

caused, of course, by the war in Ukraine, but also by floods in Pakistan, by new and ongoing conflicts across the world. and by a number of sudden and slow onset disasters that we've seen from the Americas all the way to the Pacific."

'Very volatile' Last year, new internal

displacements from conflict surged to 28.3 million -- nearly doubling from a year earlier and three times higher than the annual average over the past decade.

Beyond the 17 million displacements inside Ukraine last year, eight million were forced from their homes by Pakistan's monster floods.



Sub-Saharan Africa saw around 16.5 million displacements -- more than half of them due to conflict, especially in the Democratic Republic of Congo and in Ethiopia.

The global internal displacement figures are only expected to grow this year, driven in part by fresh conflicts like the violence ravaging Sudan forcing hundreds of thousands to flee.

More than 700,000 people have already become internally displaced by the fighting that erupted on April 15, while another 150,000 people have fled the country, according to UN numbers.

"Since the start of the... most recent conflict in April, we've already recorded the same number of displacements as we did for the whole year in 2022," Bilak said.

"Clearly, it's a very volatile situation on the ground," she said, pointing out that those being newly displaced by the fighting were joining the ranks of more than three million people already displaced across Sudan. 'Food security crisis'

While internal displacement is a global phenomenon, nearly three quarters of the world's IDPs live in just 10 countries: Syria, Afghanistan, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Ukraine, Colombia, Ethiopia, Yemen, Nigeria, Somalia and Sudan.

Many of them remain displaced due to unresolved conflicts that have dragged on for years and continued to force people to flee their homes last year.

And even as conflict-related displacement surged, natural disasters continued to account for most new internal displacement, spurring 32.6 million such movements in 2022 -- up 40 percent from a year earlier.

NRC chief Jan Egeland described the overlapping crises spurring ever more displace-ment around the world as a "perfect storm".

"Conflict and disasters combined last year to aggravate people's pre-existing vulnerabilities and inequalities, triggering displacement on a scale never seen before," he said in a statement.

"The war in Ukraine also fuelled a global food security crisis that hit the internally displaced hardest," he said.

"This perfect storm has undermined years of progress made in reducing global hunger and malnutrition.

One year after veteran Al Jazeera journalist Shireen Abu Akleh was killed by Israeli forces, nobody has been brought to justice for her murder

The Palestinian American jour-nalist – beloved by viewers across the Middle East and the world was killed by an Israeli sniper on May 11, 2022, while covering an Israeli raid in the Jenin refugee camp.

Shireen joined Al Jazeera in 1997 as a field journalist, one of a few female Palestinian journalists at the time, and her career has blazed a trail for many young women aspiring to be journalists. Demands for justice for Shireen's killing have so far re-

mained unanswered. In December, Al Jazeera Media

Network asked the International Criminal Court (ICC) to investigate but no action has been taken. The network conducted a sixmonth investigation to gather evidence for the request, which in-

cluded witness accounts and video footage, among other material. The United States has had a shifting position on the killing of

one of its citizens, with State Department spokesman Ned Price telling reporters at the time: "We oppose it in this case ... We maintain our longstanding objections to the ICC's investigation into the Palestinian situation."

The US position has been that the killing of Shireen was by Israeli gunfire and that it has "no reason to believe that this was

Several memorial services are taking place on Thursday to honour her unique style of journalism and mark the anniversary of her murder.

In Doha, Oatar, Al Jazeera staff attended a memorial event where her legacy as a reporter with the 24-hour Arabic news channel was commemorated.

In the occupied West Bank, a foundation stone will be laid for a museum dedicated to her in Ramallah. Bir Zeit University will soon announce three winners of a media award named after Shireen. On Tuesday, hundreds attended a cultural memorial organised by the Popular Art Center (PAC), a Ramallah-based Palestinian cultural organisation. On Sunday, hundreds of Shireen's friends and family gathered in Beit Hanina. occupied East Jerusalem, for a

memorial mass in her honour.
