10 Vaishno Devi Devotees Killed In Bus Crash

57 Others Injured As Bus Falls Off The Bridge, LG Sinha, Others Express Grief

Jammu: Ten Vaishno Devi pilgrims, most of them from Bihar, were killed and 57 injured on Tuesday as the bus they were travelling in skidded off the road and rammed into the railing of a bridge before falling off it, officials said.

The death toll may go up as Government Medical College Hospital Principal Shashi Soodan said two of the injured admitted there are critical.

The officials said the bus, which was on its way to Katra from Amritsar, met with the accident in Jhajjar Kotli area on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway between 6.30 and 7 am. Katra is a base camp for the pilgrims visiting the famous shrine atop the Trikuta hills.

They said most of the travellers were members of an extended family from Bihar's Lakhisarai and were on pilgrimage to Vaishno Devi temple for a ritual of a child.

"The accident took place at Jhajjar Kotli bridge. Ten people have died. Rescue operation is almost complete," Jammu Senior Superintendent of Police Chandan Kohli told PTI. "We are investigating the reasons behind the accident.

Local residents, CRPF and police personnel rushed to the spot and launched the rescue operation.

"The troops of 137 CRPF battalion carried out the rescue operation to evacuate injured driver and passengers from the bus, which turned turtle and fell down from Jhajjar Kotli bridge on highway," the force said in a tweet.

"Two persons were brought dead while others died on the spot," said GMC hospital principal Soodan.

Jammu and Kashmir DGP Dilbagh Singh said prima facie, the cause of accident appeared to be human error or over speeding. "It is possible that the driver

might have dozed off on the wheel. It's a high flyover kind of road from where the bus fell off, so the reason could also be overspeeding. It is part of our investigation," he told reporters.

moved to his remote Thial village in Udhampur district where it was received by villagers amid anti-Pakistan sloganeering. The body was later tak-

en to a nearby cremation ground where the last last rites were performed. The pyre was lit by Kumar's nephew in accordance with family tradition and rituals.

"This is a very unfortunate incident which shames humanity. His father is on the death-bed and his elder brother is blind. He was the only bread earner for the family," said Raina, who was among several BIP workers who joined the last rites of the deceased.

He said the perpetrators of the gruesome crime have done a great injustice to the poor family. More on P10



Former Cricketer Booked For 'Forging' Birth Certificate

Says J&K, Goa Enjoy Special Relationship

Srinagar: The Economic Wing of Crime Branch Kashmir has filed an FIR against a local cricketer for allegedly producing a forged birth certificate to secure his place in Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) sponsored domestic first class cricket tournament twelve years ago. A formal case was registered

against the former cricketer at Economic Wing of Crime Branch Kashmir in this regard, after the probe agency established prime facie during a preliminary investigation. The case was registered following a complaint filed by the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Jammu and Kashmir Cricket Association (JKCA) in March 2021, wherein it was alleged that the accused Majid Yaqub Dar (ex-cricketer) son of Mohammad Yaqub Dar of Ishber Nishat had submitted a forged birth certificate to secure his place in the Ranji Trophy tournament way back in 2012-13.

Govt Okays 400 Sat Phones For Amarnath Yatra

Srinagar: The Jammu and administration Kashmir on Tuesday approved utilisation of 400 satellite phones for better communication during the forthcoming Amarnath Yatra.

It also proposed setting up a State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) for better management of the annual pilgrimage.

The yatra to the Amarnath shrine, located at a height of 3,880 metres in south Kashmir Himalayas, will begin on July 1 and conclude on August 31.

To address the communication needs during natural disasters or emergencies, the State Executive Committee (SEC) approved utilisation of 400 satellite phones during Amarnath



Yatra, an official spokesman said. The SEC also considered a proposal for procurement of rescue equipment, including excavators, fire-fighting material, signal units and drones, with an estimated cost of Rs 8.91 crore, which is to be financed through the SDRF, he said.


Court Convicts Rapist Of Minor After 11 Years

Srinagar: A court here has convicted a man for raping a minor girl in Soura area of Srinagar in 2012, holding it to be "definitely crime against the society".

According to the prosecution, police received a complaint from the girl's father that he took his daughter for check after she complained of abdominal pain and upon tests by the doctors she was certified to be pregnant.

Upon enquiry by him and his wife, the minor girl disclosed that the person who resides in their neighborhood as tenant, namely Irshad Ahmad of Malik of Ahlan Gadwak Kokernag, raped her several times, the prosecution



said based on the statement by the complainant.

After receiving the report, the prosecution said, a case (FIR No 33/2012) for the commission of offence punishable under Section 376 RPC was registered in police Station Soura and the investigation

started. During investigation, it said, the victim girl's age certificate was obtained and she was found to be 14 years old.

Subsequently, the accused was arrested and on the basis of the facts and evidence collected, it said, a charge sheet under Section 376 RPC was filed on 23 June 2012. Subsequently the trial ensued and culminated in conviction of the accused, Irshad Ahmad of Malik of Ahlan Gadwak Kokernag, at present Anchar Soura.

Srinagar: The Jammu and Kashmir government has made 'life saving jackets' mandatory for Shikara boats in Dal and Nigeen lakes besides other water bodies of the region.

An order issued here today in this regard reads, "In order to ensure the safety of tourists taking Shikara rides in Dal and Nigeen Lakes and other water bodies and to prevent any untoward incident in view of inclement weather conditions or any other reasons, it is hereby ordered that as provided in the J&K Tourism Policy guidelines, each Shikara boat registered under J&K Tourist Trade Act, 1978 shall maintain the availability of a minimum of three Life Saving Jackets of recommended quality and specifications in the boat, at all times, failing which the registration under the said Act shall be cancelled".

No Let Up In Protests **Against Smart Meter Installation In Srinagar Parts**

Srinagar: Protests against the installation of smart meters hardly seem to be dying down in Srinagar after the Power Development Department (PDD) intensified the process of snapping electricity to the areas resisting the move.

On Monday, the residents from the Batamalloo area of Srinagar, while protesting against the installation of smart meters said the electricity in their area has been snapped for the last several days. They had resisted the move by the Power Development authorities.

Opposing the installation of smart meters, the protesters, mostly women, said they cannot pay "hefty" bills generated by smart meters, citing poor financial conditions.

'We cannot afford the smart meter billing. Our income is very nominal as the majority of the people in our area are either working as salesmen, auto-rickshaw drivers or roadside vendors. We hardly manage the school fee of our children," said a group of protesting ladies.

the electricity. Resisting the move of installation of the smart meters in Srinagar areas, multiple protests have been reported so far in the city. The protestors have been citing low income and unemployment as reasons to oppose the move.

However, reacting to the public opposition to the installation of smart meters, Kashmir Power **Development Corporation** Limited (KPDCL) authorities have resorted to the

snapping of electricity. Meanwhile, the Chief Engineer PDD Kashmir zone said they only snap electricity to the areas that resist the installation of smart meters. "It is not just always that people are resisting the move. The snapping of electricity is only in the nressed



Faith Moves Mountains. Stops Rain In Kashmir

RINAGAR - Jabbar Mir 56, has walked barefoot with a pitcher full of water to the shirne of saint Sheikh Hamza Mukhdoom in Srinagar. It's an age old custom that he is sure will pull his village out of a "do or die situation". Mir, a resident of Ganderbal, 22 km from Srinagar, has

climbed the Koh-e-Maran hillock in the middle of the city with hundreds of villagers, all travelling on foot and carrying water Filled earthen pitchers from various parts of the Kashmir valley

They are seeking saint Mukhdoom's blessings so that the intermittent rains lashing the

valley stop and the bright sunny days return. " It's a do or die situation for us. Our paddy nurseries are turning vellow because of the cold and rain. Unless we have

bright, warm sunshine there would be hardly any paddy saplings left to be transplanted into the rice fields." Mir said According to a local tradition, water collected from parts of

the valley and brought here in earthen pitchers by barefooted devotees is poured into the large pond outside the saint's shrine so that saint Mukhdoom is pleased and blesses the people.

However, the devotees must walk all the distance from their homes to the shrine.

'This is a practice that the people have resorted to whenever excessive rains, floods and other natural calamities have visited

Kashmir.' Asked if it works, Ghulam Nabi. 48 gives a stare. "It is a heretic's question. The custom always works. It is my experience of over four decades that whenever Kashmiris visit the shrine, their prayers are answered," says Nabi, who has come from Anantnag district. 54 kin away. Nabi's 20-year-old son is an epileptic whose seizures have

become frequent in recent days.

"I won't say a doctor is not needed to cure my son. But finally it is somewhere else that the outcome of our efforts is decided. Whether a doctor succeeds or not in curing my son would be decided at the sheikh's shrine." Nabi says.

Mukhdoom who lived in the 15th century, is also reverred as the saint who was instrumental in ending the rule of local king Yusuf Shah Chak.

Mukhdoom is believed to have written to Mughal king Akbar about the oppression of the people under Chak. This led to the invasion of Kashmir by the Mughals and the end of Chak's reign.

Visiting shrines and seeking the blessings of dead saints is an old practice in Kashmir.

A little away from saint Mukhdoom's shrine is the temple of Hindu deity Sharika Devi.

Before the migration of Kashmiri pandits following the insurgency in the valley, Muslims and Hindus could be seen buy-ing flowers from the same vendors for their saints.

There are very few visitors to the temple these days, yet a semblance of the eclectic Kashmiri culture is recreated "when the lone priest at the temple rings the bells - the' sound blends perfectly with the voice of the muezzin calling the faithful to praver at Mukhdom's shrine.

"Overnight, the PRC (the People's Republic of China) informed the US that they have declined our early May invitation for [Defense] Secretary [Lloyd] Austin to meet with PRC Minister of National Defense Li Shangfu in Singapore this week," the Pentagon said in a statement to the Journal.

The new development came after on Thursday, the US military expressed frustration for being repeatedly snubbed by Chinese officials in its efforts to make such official contact possible.



Soon after the Soviet Union launched Sputnik in 1957, Chinese leader Mao Zedong pronounced: "We too will make satellites."

It took more than a decade, but in 1970, China launched its first satellite on a Long March rocket.

Human spaceflight took decades longer, with Yang Liwei becoming the first Chinese "taikonaut" in 2003.

Gurugram Woman Cheated Of ₹1.8 Crore By Nigerian Man She Met On Instagram

GURUGRAM: Two Nigerian nationals were arrested for allegedly swindling a woman for ₹1.80 crore on several pretexts after befriending her through Instagram, police here on Tuesday said.

According to police, the victim was a local woman who reported the matter on April 10 at Manesar Police Station.

In her complaint, the woman said she was cheated of 1.80 crore by a man who she had met on Instagram last year. The man had introduced himself as a British Airways pilot, she told police.

"The accused talked to me regularly. One day last year he said he was sending a gift parcel for me which contained an iPhone, jewellery, and other items. Later, on December 6, a man called me saying a parcel had arrived in my name and I have to pay ₹35,000 in tax to get it," the woman said in her

complaint, according to police. The victim deposited the money

in a bank account shared by the man, but was kept being asked for more money by his so called friend, who demanded it in name of different fees such as 'United national anti terrorist clearance' or some penalty, police said.

By the time she realised it was a fraud, she had paid ₹1.80 crore to the man, police said after her complaint, a team of Cyber Crime investigated the matter and arrested two men from Delhi's Nihal Vihar Phase-2 area on Monday

The accused were identified as Nigerian nationals Ebuka Felixi and Chukwaka Ewere who were living in the outer Delhi area from where they were arrested.

A check book, 16 bank passbooks, 25 ATM cards, seven mobile phones with as many SIM cards, one laptop, one scooter, and ₹10,000 cash found in their possession were seized by police.

Supreme Court Grants Protection To UP Woman Who Alleges Threat From Family

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday directed the Delhi Police to grant protection to a 20-year-old woman who allegedly ran away from home and is apprehending threat to her life from her family members.

The top court passed the order while declining to interfere with a Madhya Pradesh High Court order cancelling the anticipatory bail granted to a man accused of kidnapping her.

As the matter was being heard by a vacation bench of Justice Bela M Trivedi and Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra, the woman appeared via videoconferencing and requested the court to permit her to appear in-person.

After being granted permission, she appeared before the bench and expressed apprehension that there is a threat to her life from her family members and alleged that her brother is following her.



The woman expressed apprehension that she will be forcibly taken back to her home, where she does not want to go. According to her, she stays in Varanasi and wants to return there. However, she sought protection.

When the women told the court about her condition, the bench said the high court had cancelled the anticipatory bail granted to the man by observing that he was not cooperating with the investigation and not responding to the investigating officer despite being called.

SRINAGAR: Union Minister Jitendra Singh on Tuesday condemned the killing of a civilian by militants in Jammu and Kashmir's Anantnag district and sought strict security measures to prevent such targeted killings

Singh, the Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office wrote on Twitter, "While on a visit to Chennai, I was extremely shocked to learn about the brutal killing of young Deepu who hailed from Majalta, district Udhampur and was earning meagre livelihood in Anantnag. BJP Karyakartas have already reached the house of the bereaved family to provide all possible help.

"While strongly condemning the killing of this youth from a poor family, it is strongly urged that strict security measures be enforced to prevent such target killings and also to act as deterrent against terror activities."

Kumar hailed from Udhampur district, represented in the Lok Sabha by Singh.

Jammu and Kashmir Lt Governor Manoj Sinha also condemned the attack and said the government and the entire nation is standing shoulder to shoulder with the family.

"Our security forces remain committed in their resolve to thwart the designs of terrorists and all efforts will be made to bring the perpetrators to justice," he said in a statement late on Monday.

Leaders of all political parties also expressed their condemnation.

Peoples Democratic Party chief Mehbooba Mufti said in a tweet, "Deeply anguished by yet another attack on an innocent civilian in Anantnag. Deepu eked out his living by working at an amusement park. My heart goes out to his family in this hour of grief. This speaks volumes about GOI's

policy which have been a monumental failure in I-K."

National Conference leader Omar Abdullah tweeted,

"Pained by the news of yet another targeted attack against a civilian in Anantnag area of South Kashmir. The murder of Deepak who worked with a travelling circus to earn an honest living is an abomination and I condemn this militant attack unreservedly. May Deepak's soul rest in peace.'

Condemning the killing, Democratic Progressive Azad Party chief Ghulam Nabi Azad said "terrorism is a menace that needs to be fought by all collectively".

Safe Social Media

ocial media has revolutionized the way people communicate, share information and connect with each other. However, as its use has grown exponentially, so have concerns about its potential negative effects on mental health, especially in young people. In response to this, the American Psychological Association (APA) recently issued a health advisory on social media use in adolescence, emphasizing the importance of adult guidance and limit-setting in the use of social media by teenagers.

The advisory's importance is universal. We live in a time when social media is increasingly becoming a bane than a boon. And it is not just for its massive potential to spread misinformation and disinformation but also for its role in manipulating minds at an impressionable age. In Kashmir, as anywhere else, the parents allow their children unhindered access to social media on their smartphones so that they don't disturb them or are persuaded to have food. So, in a sense, social media is used as a pacifier in our homes. And as the children add some more years to their life, they are given separate smartphones and the freedom to use it in whatever way possible.

This is why the APA report needs to be taken seriously by parents everywhere including in Kashmir. The report is timely, given the growing evidence of the negative impact of social media on young people's mental health, including depression, anxiety, and loneliness. The advisory aims to provide actionable advice to help parents, teachers, and policymakers navigate this complex issue and reduce the potential psychological harm caused by social media.

The APA report recommends that adolescents should receive adult supervision and limit-setting, with increasing autonomy as they develop digital literacy skills. Parents and other adults should monitor teenagers' social media feeds, talk to them about social media, encourage them to take breaks from their devices, and train them in social media literacy. This training should begin even before teenagers start using social media platforms.

One significant finding of the report is that exposure to "cyberhate" can lead to increased anxiety and depressive symptoms in adolescents, particularly those from marginalized groups. Therefore, adolescents should receive training to recognize and critique racist messages online to reduce psychological distress.

The report also highlights the negative impact of using social media for social comparison related to physical appearance. The researchers suggest that adolescents should receive training in social media literacy to develop psychologically-informed competencies and skills that promote safe and meaningful social media use. And this is important if we want to nurture a new generation that is not only healthy in their body but also in their mind.

Old Foes, New Friends: Syria Back in the Arab-fold

After more than a dozen years of ostracism by regional Arab and western leaders, Syrian President Bashar al-Assad is officially back in the Arab fold, he was warmly embraced by regional

pparently, it seems that the Arab League has lost its meaning and purpose and it is demonstrated by the manner in which member states take its sessions in a non-serious manner. Morocco declined to host a summit in 2016, calling the event a waste of time. The Saudi crown prince Muhammad bin Salman, skipped last year's gathering in Algeria on medical grounds. Heads of state are sometimes spotted falling asleep at the fora meetings.

But it seems that at the moment no one would relish the regional Arab body more than the Syrian dictator Bashar al-Assad, who seemed euphoric to be invited to the Arab summit, last week. Syria was suspended from the league in 2011, when Assad began a brutal crackdown on anti-government protests that plunged the country into a civil war

Assad's deployment of chemical weapons against his own people along with mass arrests, torture and disappearances and killing of more than 3 million civilians in the country have no parallel elsewhere. This is a legacy, which he inherited from his father, Hafez al-Assad, who reportedly massacred more than 10,000 people in the city of Hama during a 1982 siege

On 7th May, however, the regional Arab body agreed to readmit Syria to its fold. Though an invitation from a dull talking shop crammed with dictators may seem unappealing to many but to Assad, it is the culmination of a long effort to end his Arab isolation - and, he may hope, another step towards acceptance in the West.


However, Assad's regional Arab acceptance creates a "problem" for the United States, which continues to oppose any sort of normalising ties with the Syrian government but has not been able to force its Arab partners from restoring ties with Damascus. US officials maintain that though they do not back normalisation with al-Assad, they share the objectives that restored relations could bring, including expanding humanitarian access to conflict-torn regions, combating ISIL/ISIS, reducing Iran's influence and countering the trafficking of the drug Captagon. Mona Yacoubian, vice president of the Middle East and North Africa centre at the US Institute of Peace (USIP), a think tank funded by the US Congress, told Al Jazeera that the US position under President Joe Biden reflects a "tricky, gnarly, complex challenge"

she added, Washington will not normalise its relations with Damascus or ease its heavy sanctions, including the blocking of foreign reconstruction funds. Making the US stand quite

clear, the US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said last week, "We do not believe that the Assad Anti-Normalisation Act, which aims to "hold the Assad regime, and its backers, accountable for their crimes against the Syrian people and deter normalization with the Assad regime"

Global Downturn

ata released last week showed that the German economy has slid into a recession. GDP fell by 0.3 per cent in the January-March quarter, after a drop of 0.5 per cent in the October-December quarter of the last year, as households cut back on spending due to high inflation and aggressive monetary policy tightening. Considering that the German economy is the largest in Europe, some analysts are now estimating that the entire Euro region slowed down significantly during this period, perhaps just barely managing to escape a recession. This grim economic picture is not just limited to the Euro zone.

With the US economy seen to be losing steam, some analysts are expecting it to tip into a recession later this year. The minutes of the last US Federal Reserve meeting, released a few days ago, revealed that as economic risks had increased, the Fed officials were "less certain" about the need to raise interest rates further. Fed Chairman Jerome Powell has, in fact, previously acknowledged the possibility of the US entering a mild recession. The UK, however, might just avoid entering into a recession this year. The International Monetary Fund, which had earlier projected the economy to contract by 0.3 per cent, now expects it to grow at 0.4 per cent in 2023, driven by falling energy prices, and healthy demand, though with inflation being sticky, interest rates are likely to remain high. Then there are concerns that China's economic recovery is losing momentum with some recent data coming in considerably below expectations. Some analysts have already begun to factor in additional support by the authorities. With the Chinese economy sputtering, and the global economic outlook weakening, Singapore, a major entrepot of trade and capital flows, contracted in the first quarter (on a quarter-on-quarter seasonally adjusted basis). The effects of a slowing global economy on India are already evident. After growing by 17 per cent in the first half of 2022-23 (April-September), the country's merchandise exports plummeted in the second half of the year (October-March), contracting by 3.7 per cent, with global demand coming under pressure. In April 2023, goods exports contracted further by 12.7 per cent, with most of the non-food product categories witnessing declines. AGELESS WONDER What Makes Dhoni a **Megastar of Indian Cricket**

Rainfall ruined the possibility of play on Sunday. Monday, the reserve day, saw the revival of expectations of a thrilling summit clash of Indian Premier League between the Mahendra Singh Dhoni-led Chennai Super Kings and Gujarat Titans captained by Hardik Pandya.

CSK were eyeing their fifth IPL title to equal the record held by Mumbai Indians. GT, which had debuted in and emerged as the winners last year, were chasing their second successive title. The match began on time in Narendra Modi Stadium, Ahmedabad. but cricket fans continued to pray for uninterrupted play before the deserving team won the title.

Dhoni was playing in his 11th IPL final, among them ten for CSK, while Pandya was appearing in his fifth final. Although the match took place in the home-ground of GT, CSK's yellow overshadowed the former's dark blue inside the stadium. The sight of so much support for the outsiders surprised nobody, considering Dhoni is one of the most popular megastars in the history of Indian cricket.

Batting first, GT amassed 214 for 4, a big score in a final. Chasing a revised target of 171 runs in 15 overs in a rain-curtailed match, CSK won a last-ball thriller by five wickets, courtesy Ravindra Jadeja's six and four off the last two deliveries of the match. Dhoni's individual performance was limited to a first-ball duck, and an extraordinary stumping to dismiss the in-form Shubman Gill for his 300th T20 dismissal in his 250th IPL match.

While the battle for the trophy was being fought in Ahmedabad, many cricket lovers would have been anxious. 'What if the CSK skipper bids goodbye to the game as a player with a formal announcement today?' His fans would have been restless until he spoke



to Harsha Bhogle during the post-match presentation ceremony. "The tough thing for me is to work hard for another nine months and come back and play at least more season of IPL...A lot depends on the body...It will be more like a gift for them (CSK fans) from my side," he told Bhogle. The stadium erupted in joy when he said these words at close to 3 am on Tuesday. It was the best news his fans could have hoped for.

The bike-loving Ranchi-born cricketer, who once made headlines because of his changing hairstyles, will turn 42 on July 7 this year. He preferred to bat in the lower order this year. He was not hundred per cent fit because of a sore knee. He often remained unbeaten with few runs under his belt, although he did entertain his fans by hitting ten sixes during the course of the tournament.

As a skipper, however, his smart bowling changes, excellent field placements and the ability to inspire teammates such as Shivam Dube. Each time CSK played, their fans started wondering whether Dhoni will play in IPL for one more year. Placards inside stadiums and tweets in thousands revealed their unconditional love for the cricketer, whose eventful career is a collection of stories we fondly remember from time to time.

Who can forget that day in 2006 when Pervez Musharraf, the then President of Pakistan, praised his long-haired look during a presentation ceremony after a one-day match between India and Pakistan in Lahore? Musharraf also told Dhoni, the man of the match in India's win, "May I congratulate Dhoni on being the architect of the victory. May I tell Dhoni, I saw a placard asking you to get a haircut. If you want to take my opinion, you look good in this haircut. Don't get a haircut."

Who can forget his aggressive batting from the start of his career, which led to famous knocks like his 148 off 123 deliveries against Pakistan in April 2005, in Visakhapatnam? Or, his knock in October, also in 2005, when he scored an unbeaten 183 off 145 deliveries against Sri Lanka in Jaipur?

Who can forget the 2007 ICC World Twenty20 final against Pakistan in Johannesburg? Pakistan needed 13 runs from the last over. Misbah-ul-Haq was on strike. Dhoni, the then young captain, handed over the ball to the inexperienced Joginder Sharma. Misbah hit a Sharma full toss over long-off for a six off the second legal delivery of the over, which brought the title within Paki-

stan's reach. He attempted to paddle-scoop the following delivery over fine leg, did not get the desired result, and S Sreesanth took a simple catch at short fine leg. India had snatched a victory from the jaws of defeat, and Dhoni and his men returned home from South Africa with the prestigious trophy.

Who can forget that day in 2011 when he stepped out to bat ahead of an in-form Yuvraj Singh and smashed an unbeaten 79ball 91 to guide India to a six wicket win over Sri Lanka in the final of the 2011 Cricket World Cup in Mumbai? Had he failed in that all-important match, Indian cricket lovers would have showered criticism on him. What happened was the exact opposite, resulting in a great victory.

The Dhoni story, in short, is a tapestry of unforgettable memories. He captained India to three ICC tournament triumphs: the 2007 World Twenty20, the 2011 Cricket World Cup and the 2013 ICC Champions Trophy. He led the team to Asia Cup wins in 2011 and 2016. Under his captaincy, India attained the number one position in Test rankings for the first time in 2009.

Moreover, India won the 2010 and 2011 Test Mace and the 2013 ICC ODI Championship under his captaincy. A better captain in the shorter formats, he captained CSK to IPL triumphs in 2010, 2011, 2018 and 2021. The team also won Champions League T20 twice, in 2010 and 2014, under his captaincy. His record as a skipper is nothing short of phenomenal, which makes him an idol for the younger lot seeking to emulate his feats someday.

Dhoni's journey is a fascinating fairytale. It is possible he will play in 2024 for the one last time. His millions of fans must be hoping that happens before he bids that inevitable final goodbye.

More Trees, Taller Buildings Next To Thin Streets Could Reduce "Urban Heat Island" Effect

hancing tree canopy, reflective pavements and constructing taller buildings adjacent to thinner streets could help mitigate the "urban heat island" or the UHI effect, according to a new research.

The tendency of cities to trap heat, termed the UHI effect, can lead to dangerous temperatures during summers.

However, this research from Pennsylvania State University, US, published in the journal Buildings, has suggested certain urban factors that can reduce this effect.

The study found that trees had a cooling effect on outdoor air temperature, mean radiant temperature, or or the heat given off by buildings and other infrastructure, and predicted mean vote index, a measurement designed to evaluate thermal comfort levels.

Further, the researchers determined that both a higher building adjacent to thinner streets, thus creating shade for the streets, as well as higher 'albedo' pavements or pavements better at reflecting sunlight led to lower mean radiant temperature and greater comfort levels. They are both urban morphological factors.

The researchers said that heat island hotspots and mortality rates tended to be greater in urban blocks with a socially disadvantaged population owing to a combination of physical factors, such as impervious surfaces and lack of vegetation, and social factors, such as vulnerability to heat-related health effects.

"Global warming makes some human habitats unbearably hot, but more so for socially and historically disadvantaged communities," said Guangqing Chi, professor of rural sociology, demography and public health sciences.

"This interdisciplinary project provides an effective, equitable urban design solution for enhancing resilience against extreme heating," said Chi.

The research was based in the US city of Philadelphia that, according to the researchers, experiences high rates of both poverty and extreme weather, a combination of socioeconomic and climate factors that made it an ideal location for investigation.

Quoting a 2021 study, this study said



that Philadelphia had the highest poverty rate out of the most populated cities in the US, with 22.8 per cent of the urban people

living below the poverty level. The city also has experienced its snowiest winter, two warmest summers, wettest day and two wettest years on record since 2010.

For the study, the researchers used the social vulnerability index, or SVI, from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, along with data about tree coverage to identify two neighbourhoods in the city.

While one of them had the lowest SVI and high tree coverage, the other had the highest SVI and the lowest tree coverage.

The researchers ran 24-hour simulations for six scenarios - winter, spring, summer, fall, extreme hot and extreme cold - on digital 3D models of these neighbourhoods, which incorporated information on construction materials, land cover, albedo and heat generated by human activities, along with environmental factors, such as air temperature and mean radiant temperature, and urban morphology.

The researchers found that while trees can create a cooling effect, these benefits are limited to their immediate surroundings. Areas without trees had significantly higher mean radiant temperatures, and the effect of trees on air temperature decreased as distance from the tree canopy increased.

New Gene Editing Tool May Help Reduce Spread Of Antimicrobial Resistance

Scientists have developed a new gene editing tool which could help reduce the spread of antimicrobial resistance.

Antimicrobial resistance is a major global threat, with nearly five million deaths annually resulting from antibiotics failing to treat infection, according to the World Health Organisation.

Bacteria often develop resistance when resistant genes are transported between hosts. One way this occurs is via plasmids – circular strands of DNA, which can spread easily between bacteria, and swiftly replicate. This can occur in our bodies, and in environmental settings,

such as waterways. The researchers at can specifically target the resistance gene for Gentamicin – a commonly used antibiotic.

In laboratory experiments, the research, published in the journal Microbiology, found that the plasmid protected its host cell from developing resistance.

The researchers also found that the plasmid effectively targeted antimicrobial resistant genes in hosts to which it transferred, reversing their resistance.

"Antimicrobial resistance threatens to outstrip Covid in terms of the number of global deaths. We urgently need new ways to stop resistance spreading between hosts," said study lead author David Walker-Sünderhauf, of the

Pilots Offered Extra Rs 1,00,000 A Month To Stay At Go Air

NEW DELHI: Go Airlines India Ltd. plans to raise salaries of captains by 100,000 rupees (\$1,211) a month and by 50,000 rupees for first officers as it tries to salvage its operations after filing for insolvency on May 2.

The additional pay, which the airline calls a retention allowance, will come into effect on June 1, according to an email to pilots seen by Bloomberg News. It will also be offered to those who have left the company but are willing to withdraw their resignations by June 15. The airline, which rebranded as Go First two years ago, said it will also soon reintroduce a "longevity bonus" for longserving staff.

Go's captains currently earn about 530,000 rupees a month on average, according to data on AmbitionBox, compared with 750,000 rupees at Spice-Jet Ltd., which has increased wages twice in recent months. Last week, the aviation regu-

lator gave Go Air 30 days to sub-

mit a revival plan, including details on how many pilots it has. "If things shape up as per the present progress plan, it won't take long before we will be fly-

ing again which will also enable us to be regular on salary payments," the airline said in the email to pilots. A representative for the company didn't respond to request for a comment.

serve Bank data released on Tuesday. Frauds occurred pre-dominantly in the category of digital payments (card/internet), in terms of number, said Reserve

Bank's Annual Report 2022-23. However, in terms of value, frauds have been reported primarily in the loan portfolio (advances category). A total of 9,097

frauds had taken place in 2021-22 involving Rs 59,819 crore. In 2020-21, the number of frauds was 7,338 and amount involved was Rs 1,32,389 crore.

"An assessment of bank group-wise fraud cases over the last three years indicates that while private sector banks reported maximum number of frauds, public sector banks continued to con-tribute maximum to the fraud amount during 2022-23," the report said.

MUMBAI: The Reserve Bank on Tuesday said the scope of the Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) pilot is being expanded gradually to include more banks and locations

The first pilot in the Digital Rupee -Wholesale Segment (e rupee-W) commenced on November 1, 2022. It was followed by the first pilot for retail digital

rupee (e rupee-R) was announced on December 1, 2022. Retail digital rupee offers features of physical cash like trust, safety and settlement finality in digital mode.

It can be held or used to carry out transactions, similar to how currency notes can be used in physical form, the RBI said in its annual report.

The pilot was launched in Mumbai, New Delhi, Bengaluru and Bhubaneswar, comprising participating customers and

merchants in a closed user group (CUG).

Other locations, including Ahmedabad, Chandigarh, Gangtok, Guwahati, Hyderabad, Indore, Kochi, Lucknow, Patna and Shimla are also being added to the pilot in phases. The pilot began with four banks -- State Bank of India, ICICI Bank, Yes Bank and IDFC First Bank -- while four other banks -- Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, HDFC Bank and Kotak Mahindra Bank have joined subsequently.

approved an ex-gratia of Rs 5 lakh each for the next of kin of those who lost their lives and Rs 50,000 each for those seriously injured. Condoling the deaths, he said in a tweet, "Extremely pained by the loss of lives in a tragic bus accident in Jhajjar Kotli, Jammu. My heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families & prayers for speedy recovery of the injured. Directed district administration to provide all possible assistance & treatment to the injured."

Ravinder Panday, one of the travellers, said they felt that something hit the bus. "It lost balance and rolled down," he said.

The accident site looked horrific with bodies trapped under the mangled remains of the bus.

Describing the accident, witnesses said the bus was in the left lane, but it crossed over to the right side after the driver lost control, hit the railing of the bridge and fell down into a gorge.

The front wheels came off and got stuck in the parapet of the bridge.

"We were going to pay obeisance at the Mata Vaishno Devi temple and perform 'mundan' (rituals related to shaving a baby's hair for the first time). We were several families together," said Ramesh Kumar, who escaped unhurt.

For the journey to Katra, the vehicle, carrying a registration number of Uttar Pradesh (UP 81 CT 3537), should have taken a left turn nearly two km before the spot of accident, but passengers said the driver seemed to have lost the direction and was probably going to the Udhampur-Srinagar side of the highway.

Chief Secretary Arun K Mehta, DGP Singh, ADGP (Jammu Zone) Mukesh Singh and other senior officials visited the Jammu GMC Hospital to enquire about the condition of the injured.

Speaking to reporters, Mehta said all possible help and the best of treatment are being provided to the injured.

This is the third big accident in Jammu and Kashmir this month. On May 24, seven persons were killed and two others critically injured after a vehicle ferrying workers of a power project rolled down a hill in Kishtwar district.

On May 21, a 27-year-old woman was killed and 24 people were injured when a Rajasthan-bound bus carrying Vaishno Devi pilgrims overturned in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district.

Condoling the loss of lives, BJP J&K president Ravinder Raina said, "We stand by their families in times of grief."

The Apni Party also expressed grief over the accident and said "may Almighty give the grieving families, who lost their loved ones in this horrible accident, enough patience to cope with the pain."

Chairman of Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP) Ghulam Nabi Azad asked party leaders and workers to visit the spot and provide all assistance to the injured and victims.

"What was his crime for which he was brutally killed? An innocent blood was shed and those who have done this have committed a great sin," Raina said, adding "the culprits cannot escape the law here and the creator too will not forgive them". the court complex in Jammu, Bar president Vikram Sharma appreciated the offensive mounted by security forces against the perpetrators of crime to bring them to book.

"The act of omission and commission on the part of the accused Majid Yaqub Dar prima face disclose commission of offense punishable u/s 420, 467, 471, RPC. Man Sentenced

However, the court said the offence under section 420 IPC has not been established against the accused.

'Therefore, accused Mohammad Shafi Bhat is convicted for commission of offence u/s 138 Negotiable Instruments Act only. Accordingly, accused is sentenced to undergo simple imprisonment for a period of one year and is also sentenced by way of fine to the tune of Rupees cheque amount plus half of the cheque amount as the case is of the year 2021 only, therefore discretion is exercised in awarding lesser sentence instead of double the cheque amount," the court said, adding, "Accused shall also pay an amount of Rs. 3 lakhs as compensation to the complainant. The total amount to Rs. (73,50,000/-) Rupees Seventy Three Lakhs and fifty thousand only."

The accused, the court said, stands already lodged up in Kotbalwal Jail. "The fine imposed shall be recovered by issuance of levy warrant to be executed by District Collector Srinagar authorising him to realize the total amounting to Rs. 73,50,000 (Seventy Three lakhs and fifty thousand only) by execution /attachment through civil process against both movable and immovable property of the accused," the court said and directed compliance report to be filed by District Collector regarding the execution within one month.

Court Convicts

for playing with younger brother of the accused who was also putting up with them there," presiding officer of 2nd Additional Session Judge Srinagar, Renu Dogra Gupta said after hearing the counsel for accused and additional Public Prosecutor Farooq Ahmad Malik. "The accused had gagged her mouth and committed heinous and barbaric crime of rape with her there and also threaten not to disclose the same to anyone," the court said and convicted him for the offence under 376 RPC (rape).

The accused being a major and married person, the court said, was fully aware of the consequences of his "barbaric act.

"On the other hand the victim girl, being innocent and unaware of the consequences, kept silent due to the threat given by the accused, resulting into her pregnancy. ...The (victim) might have suffered so much which cannot be expressed in words and has lost everything including honour, dignity, education etc. She became a helpless victim of a diabolic person whose only sin was that she used to go to the accused's rented residence for playing with his younger brother....an innocent child was made prey of lust by accused". The Crime of this nature against the child girl is definitely a crime against the society, the court said.

"This court is of considered opinion that prosecution has successfully proved the guilt of the accused beyond any reasonable doubt. Therefore the accused is liable to be convicted for the offence punishable under Sections 376 of RPC," the court said and sent him to Judicial custody in Central Jail Srinagar. The court has listed the case for quantum of punishment on May 31. 22,000 as bribe for withdrawal of application and settlement," the spokesperson said.

On this, he said, the complainant approached ACB and lodged complaint in Police Station ACB Rajouri for taking legal action against Kumar.

Since the contents of the complaint disclose demand of bribe by alleged accused public servant, the spokesperson said that the same was verified through verifying officer who reported that prima facie commission of offences under section 7 of PC Act 1988 is made out against the accused Forest Guard.

Accordingly, he said, a case FIR No. 02/2023 was registered at PS ACB Rajouri and investigation started.

"During investigation a trap team was constituted. However, during the trap proceedings, another forest official Sat Pal, I/c Block officer Thakrakote was also found involved in the conspiracy with the said Forest Guard Abneet Kumar," the spokesperson said.

Both the accused, he said, were caught red-handed while demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs15,000 from the complainant.

"Both of them were arrested on spot after completing necessary legal formalities. Searches were also conducted in the houses of the accused persons situated at Pouni, Reasi and Gurha Jagir, Akhnoor," the Bureau spokesperson added.



come so near and yet miss out. Remember Old Trafford where he was setting it up ala

Dhoni style. That's why Dhoni is special and eminently relatable.

He can relate with failures as much as he can with success. Mohit is someone who learnt the ropes of top-flight bowling under Dhoni at CSK before fad-

ing into oblivion and then making a grand re-entry this IPL. In the meantime, Jadeja does

a TV interview and dedicates his performance and win to "MS

Dhoni" The Motera stand, resembling a sunflower, erupts, but is it a hint that the end is near.

The question has followed Dhoni to every city and different people had asked him in a different manner. The street-smart player that



he is, he always gave a cheeky reply, like one to Danny Morrison where he joked that he is already forcing him to retire, or at a promotional event where he said that any announcement would make things go haywire.

Have we seen the last of him? Maybe or maybe not. Only time will tell how he

copes with a damaged knee when is nearing 43. "If you circumstantially see, it's the best time to announce

the retirement. The easy thing for me to say is thank you and retire. But the hard thing to do is to work hard for nine months

and try to play one more IPL season. The body has to hold up. The amount of love I have received from CSK fans, it would be a gift for them to play one more season," Dhoni said before receiving his fifth trophy.

The love of Chennai fans has been unconditional and Chepauk has been his amphitheatre, and he has been the hero as well as the main protagonist for them.

"The way they've shown their love and emotion, it's something I need to do for them. It's the last part of my career. It started over here and the full house was chanting my name. It

was the same thing in Chennai, but it will be good to come back and play whatever I can," Dhoni assured all those who braved rain, changed itinerary, burnt hole in their pockets, and were present to hear him speak well past midnight.

So will it be a practical decision or an emotional one if Dhoni, who would be pushing 43 next year, decides to play another season of a gruelling twomonth tourney? It is easier said than done in professional sport but Dhoni wants to bide time.

On the face of it, it might seem emotional because CSK isn't just another team for

Dhoni, which pays him a fat pay cheque.

It is an emotional investment. Going into the next decade, he will only be making all cricketing decisions and as a quick learner, work alongside Rupa Gurunath to also understand the business of running a franchise.

But those who have seen Dhoni, they know that N Srinivasan, the venerable CSK owner, is the former India captain's life coach and he has learnt one thing from him: if possible, always bide time, and take it deep, on and off the field. So if another IPL is 10

months away and he has to keep himself cricket-fit for at least three months in the leadup to the next edition, he will try and do it.

"The kind of cricket I play, they feel they can play that cricket. There's nothing orthodox about it and I like to keep it simple," Dhoni said.

As Stephen Fleming pointed out after the match.

Dhoni's training sessions are on need basis. "I can assure you that he

has done no wicket-keeping practice during the IPL. It is all natural. He tried to do a keeping session with Devon Conway, who is an international wicketkeeper, and it was almost comical," Fleming said.

"Today was phenomenal, the style he does it with is awesome. That stumping is MS Dhoni at his best. It is nature, he has learned from tennis-ball cricket and it is just pure skill," Fleming added.

The impact player rule will give Dhoni a chance to maybe keep wickets for 20 overs but not use himself as a batter save a few occasions.

"Look, he knows, his powerhitting game is long gone. Like on Monday, he came ahead of Ravindra Jadeja. You could say it's because of maintaining the left-right combination but even then he took a chance because 15 balls were left. Had Jadeja gone out before him and got a first-ball duck, Dhoni might not have been able to finish the game," a former CSK player told PTI when asked how the skipper thinks.

So will he play next season? "My hunch is that he won't play as a batter any more.

He would perhaps still play a few games and check if he can run the team from dugout without being on the field.

The moment, he cracks that code, he won't play anymore. For that if you read Fleming's

words, he would try to fit in Devon Conway in that slot," the former player said.



Still, Mourinho fans can point to that being a classic performance by one of his teams – doing exactly what was needed to win.

'Kosovo Is The Heart Of Serbia', **Djokovic Writes At French Open**

🥆 erbian world number three Novak Djokovic risked stirring up a political controversy at the French Open on Monday after writing a message about Kosovo following his first-round victory. "Kosovo is the heart of Serbia. Stop the violence," 22-time Grand Slam champion Djokovic wrote on a camera lens in Serbian.

Around 25 NATO peacekeeping soldiers defending three town halls in northern Kosovo were injured in clashes with Serb protesters on Monday, while Serbia's president put the army on the highest level of combat alert. The incidents came a day after NATO chief Jens Stoltenberg called on Kosovo to tone down tensions with Serbia following clashes between Kosovan police and protesters who are opposed to Albanian mayors taking office in ethnic Serbian areas.

Serbian President Aleksandar Vucic said that 52 Serbs were injured on Monday, three



of them seriously, while Kosovo President Vjosa Osmani accused his Serbian counterpart of destabilising Kosovo. Serbia and its traditional ally Russia do not recognise Kosovo's independence, and Moscow has blocked the country's bid to become a member of the United Nations. Serbia still considers Kosovo part of its territory.

"Kosovo is our cradle, our stronghold, centre of the most important things for our country... There are many reasons why I wrote that on the camera," RFI radio quoted the 36-year-old Djokovic as saying

to Serbian media. The French tennis federation (FFT), which organises the event, told Reuters that there were "no official Grand Slam rules on what players can or cannot say. The FFT will not be making any statement or taking any stance on this matter."

Djokovic will hope to avoid another political distraction at a Grand Slam after he defended his father at the Australian Open in January when a video emerged showing him posing with some fans holding Russian flags amid the war in Ukraine.
