Time Not Ripe For Army Pullout From Kashmir Hinterland: GOC

Srinagar: The situation in Kashmir has improved vastly over the last few years but the time is not ripe yet for the army to go back to the barracks, a senior officer said here.

The number of active militants in the valley is at its lowest in the last 34 years, General Officer Commanding of Chinar Corps Lieutenant General A D S Aujla told PTI TV in an exclusive interview

on Wednesday. "In Sha Allah, but I think the time is not ripe at this point in time. We still have to see a lot of good things happening before we can take a call. Let it be a deliberate one. I won't comment on the timelines per se, nor would I say that it is the wrong time or the right



time," Lt Gen Aujla said. The GOC said the army is just a tool in the plans of the government to ensure that Kashmir prospers, flourishes,

and blossoms. "We will work collectively

with the state administration, with the other agencies so that we can see the better Kashmir before we can take a call. It is a national call and it will be taken appropriately at the right time," he added.

Asked to compare the situation in Kashmir today with that of the time he arrived in the Valley as a young officer around 30 years ago, Lt Gen Aujla said things have now fallen into place.

"When we look back at the situation when I first came here, things were on the boil, they had to be controlled. Today, I can say with a certain amount of honesty that in the last 30 years, and particularly in the last three, three-and-ahalf years since August 2019, things have fallen into the right place," he said.
The officer said normalcy

and peace in Kashmir was achieved after a lot of "sacrifices" and hard work.

"Being a soldier myself, I

think this is the place where the sacrifices of More on P6

Intruder Shot Dead By BSF Along IB In Samba

Jammu: A suspected Pakistani intruder was shot dead by BSF troops along the International Border (IB) in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district in the early hours of Thursday, officials said

The incident took place near Mangu Chak border outpost (BoP) in Samba sector around 2:50 am, they said.

"In the early hours today, alert BSF troops noticed suspicious movement of a person, who crossed the IB from Pakistan's side, in Samba area," a Border Security Force spokesperson said.

He was challenged by the troops but the intruder kept advancing towards the border fencing. The troops opened fire, killing him, the spokesperson said.

The BSF has launched a search operation along the IB in Samba sector as the intruder's body is lying in the forward area.

This is the second such incident along the India-Pakistan border in Jammu division in two days.

On Wednesday, the Army foiled an infiltration bid with the arrest of three militants along the Line of Control (LoC) in Poonch district.

The militants, from whom a huge consignment of arms and narcotics was recovered, were arrested after an exchange of fire near the border More on P6

J&K Loses Control To Fix Mutton Prices

Govt Revokes Mutton (Licensing and Control) Order After 50 Years

Srinagar: The Union Territory administration on Thursday directed the Food Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Department to refrain from regulating prices of mutton and other livestock products, even as the tussle over mutton prices continues to rage on.

According to an order, a copy of which lies with Kashmir Observer, the Union Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution communicated to the J&K government that any order issued by quoting S.O 145(E) dated 15.02.1990 is based on an order that is no longer valid and applicable.



Army Bus Blown Up In Rájbagh

Nineteen Army Jawans Wounded

rinagar- Six militants and two security men were killed and 24 injured as militants blew up an army bus with an IED and attacked a convoy a convoy in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said on Friday.

Nineteen army jawans were injured in the I ED explosion in Rajbagh area of city. The 20 kg device, planted by the roadside along the banks of the Jhelum near a missionary school, targeted the convoy, on its way from Haft Chinar to Badami Bagh

The Hizb-ul-Mujahideen claimed responsibility for the blast, the first major strike by militants in the Valley this year. The blast smashed windowpanes of several buildings including the school, prompting authorities to close it for two days.

In the second incident, two militants, an army jawan and a policeman were killed and five, including four cops, injured near the Police Training School in Baramulla. Heavily-armed militants opened fire on an Army convoy passing through Sheeri, 65 km from here, triggering a shootout with the security men on Friday after¬noon

In the initial firing, one policeman was killed and four others were injured, a defence spokesman said. In the ensuing gunfight, both militants were killed.

An Army jawan was killed in the exchange of fire while another jawan sustained injuries. The Pakistan-based Lashker-e-Taiba has claimed responsibility for the attack. In the third incident, two suspected Al-Badr militants were

killed in an encounter with security forces in Khrew area of

And as was the case with his visit to Britain, his activities and utterances in the US are also generating some attention and controversy. And as the visit progresses, it looks set to stir up a hornet's nest back home. On his first day in America, Gandhi addressed a gathering of the Indian diaspora in Santa Clara, California, and said that the RSS and the BJP are controlling all the instruments of politics in India, including media. He also directly attacked Prime Minister Narendra Modi, drawing ire of the BJP. The party said that Gandhi was "insulting the country" on his foreign trips. "Is mud-slinging all that he has left to do?" asked union minister Anurag Thakur.

Gandhi in his interaction has come across as more aggressive in his criticism of the government. He highlighted the need for a united opposition, emphasizing the Congress party's successful approach in the recent assembly elections in Karnataka. His speech shed light on the Congress party's strategic approach in the Karnataka elections. He expressed hope that with a proper alignment of the opposition and a compelling alternative vision, victory is possible. As for the opposition unity, Gandhi said Congress party is working towards it and it is "coming along very nicely." It is true that in recent past there has been a concerted effort to unite the opposition and Gandhi together with leaders like the Bihar chief minister Nitish Kumar have been at the forefront. But as things stand, it is far from coming to fruition. And without a united opposition, it would be close to impossible to defeat the BJP whose victory in 2024 is seen as a foregone conclusion.

But it is true that since his cross-country yatra, Gandhi has become more vocal and pro-active in his politics. For once, his statements are carrying conviction. One good thing is that Gandhi has shown some promise to rise up to the political challenge, even though his image makeover is still a project in works. It is true that the yatra has generated immense goodwill for Congress and Gandhi but the political ground is still far from shifting. Prime Minister Narendra Modi continues to be the unstoppable and all-powerful leader, and no other national leader, let alone Gandhi, comes close. But in politics, situation sometimes can change dramatically. So coming weeks and months could be interesting.

Gandhi's engagement with the diaspora in the United States comes ahead of the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to the White House. So, their conduct, activities and utterances and the consequent attention they draw would be of a crucial political significance back home.

Uncertain Showers

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) earlier this week updated its monsoon outlook from April. The latest analysis from the weather models that the IMD relies on suggests near-certainty of the development of an El Niño, a cyclical phenomenon of warming in the Central Pacific that six in 10 years is linked to diminished rainfall in the west, northwest and western parts of central India, especially between July and August. However, despite the certainty of an El Niño, the IMD has chosen to retain its outlook of a 'normal' monsoon, at 96% of the 50-year long-term average of 87 cm. Anything below 96% would have been categorised as 'below normal'. Underlying its assessment is a calculation that another phenomenon, called the Indian Ocean Dipole (IOD) — a temperature swing between the western and eastern Indian Ocean — would favour rain development and offset the loss in rains from an El Niño. It is important to note that IODs are not as strongly linked to bountiful rains as the El Niño is to depressed rains. In 1997, India had a strong El Niño but received 2% excess rain because of a positive IOD. However, both have not appeared at the same time since that year, and this is the first time since then that both factors are expected to play out in the same monsoon season. The years India last reported a greater than 10% deficit in monsoon rainfall were 2014 and 2015 – both El Niño years.

The IMD update also underlines that rainfed-agriculture zones of the country would be between 92%-104% of the average. While this technically qualifies as 'normal', it is also a very large variation and could mean long, dry spells followed by a period of incessant downpours. This might help meet the region's rainfall 'numbers' but will not be helpful for agriculture. While every monsoon has its own peculiarities whatever the models might say, it would be crucial to watch out for the monsoon's distribution, both spatially and temporally. Sharp deficits during July and August, particularly in central India, are likely to influence agricultural output. More accurate assessments of rain during this month are available through the IMD's extended range forecasts that give a fortnightly prognosis; and these can be quite dynamic. The monsoon is forecast to reach Kerala by June 4, and whether it sticks to this date or arrives a tad early or late has little bearing on the quantity of rain during the core monsoon months. This year, States and the Centre must redouble efforts to convey accurate, timely information to farmers, using all available information channels, down to the block level.

What Does EU's Growing Engagement with India Mean for South Asia?

ndia and the EU are hosting the Global Gateway Conference in Meghalaya from June 1-2, 2023. The two-day event brings together Bhutan, Bangladesh, and Nepal with the North-East of India in an effort to boost commerce and economic growth in the area.

The Ministry of External Affairs stated that the conference would "explore possibilities of boosting connectivity investments in India's North-Eastern States and with India's neighbors." The three pillars of the connectivity initiative—improving digital, energy, and transportation links—seek to identify initiatives for joint implementation.

Utilizing the Bangladesh-Bhutan-India-Nepal (BBIN) project, connectivity issues in South Asia are being addressed in an effort to establish a smooth flow of people and cargo traffic. The two-day meeting will motivate India to take action on these issues. Connectivity between the four nations is expected to lead to regional economic integration and greater people-to-people exchanges, which have been constrained by tensions among the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) governments.

The India-EU Connectivity Partnership was formally established at the May 2021 India-EU Leaders' Meeting, which was attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, 27 EU Member States, the President of the European Council, and the European Commission. The ambitious "connectivity partnership" wants to increase connectivity in the fields of technology, energy, transportation, and interpersonal communication. It also takes into account supporting the connectivity aspirations of the Indo-Pacific region.

The connectivity agreement between the EU and India aims to strengthen sustainable digital, transportation, and energy networks in addition to promoting the mobility of people, goods, services, data, and capital. Investing prospects in the sectors of clean and renewable energy, health and education, and transportation connectivity, which includes roads, bridges, and railroads, will also be sought after during the Meghalaya conference. Along with representatives from India and the EU, participants from the commercial sector and ambassadors from the three South Asian nations will also attend the conference.

The connectivity agreement between the EU and India aims to strengthen sustainable digital, transportation, and energy networks in addition to promoting the mobility of people, goods, services, data, and capital. The EU's Global Gateway strategy, which was presented in December 2021, draws on the priorities of the Paris Agreement and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), in addition to connecting to its Indo-Pacific plan and specific connectivity partnerships with Japan and India. Along with the benefits of creating an Indo-Pacific framework, India will find the lessons learned from an integrated EU helpful in uniting South Asia.

As the world gears up for a post-Covid 19 phase, there is an increasing need for regional economic cooperation and integration among South Asian countries, particularly the Bangladesh, Bhutan India Nepal (BBIN) region. In fact, South Asia is one of the least integrated regions in the world, which has a significant negative impact on the economies of countries like Bangladesh and India. Bhutan and Nepal, both landlocked nations, have the potential to join this bloc. The pattern of cooptation can be altered through EU engagement.

Although the BBIN project is revolutionary, it must currently be realized in a certain length of time. India's infrastructure initiative is crucial as China constructs a multi-billion dollar BRI, boosting its economic and military might.

South Asia must be regarded holistically if it is to reach its full growth potential. Due to their geostrategic location, countries like Bangladesh and Nepal have a rare opportunity to participate in numerous regional projects. Before starting any regional projects, it is essential to comprehend the region's connection potential and the obstacles preventing it from connecting to South Asian countries.

To further social and economic development among these South Asian countries, sub-regional cooperation like the Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, and Nepal Motor Vehicles Agreement (BBIN MVA) is crucial for increasing connectivity.

After the South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (SAARC) failed to reach a consensus on a regional motor vehicle accord at the Kathmandu Summit in 2014, in part due

to Pakistan's resistance, the BBIN MVA connectivity project was proposed. The BBIN MVA's objective is to construct a road-based economic corridor connecting Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, and Nepal.

Bhutan has pushed the other three nations to ratify the agreement even though it has not done so. The BBIN MVA aims to promote unrestricted movement of people, goods, and vehicles within and between the BBIN nations. With only 5% of the total trade in the region, South Asia has some of the lowest intraregional trade rates in the entire world. There are major hurdles to clear before implementing massive connection schemes like the BBIN MVA. Typically, traders have more than 10 separate authorities where they must clear their papers.

Because there aren't enough accredited laboratories to approve export products, shipments routinely arrive weeks late. The prolonged border delays raise the already high trade costs among BBIN member nations. Infrastructure gaps, crowded borders, lengthy, detouring transport routes, and inadequate roads directly impede the movement of products and services, increasing trade costs and transit times. Along with these challenges, it's crucial to consider developing intermodal transhipment facilities, modern warehouse space, infrastructure that is inclusive of all genders, and jobs associated with

following Japanese engagement. Additionally significant pillars in the region are the connectivity partnerships with Japan (2020) and India (2021) and the Indo-Pacific plan of the European Union (EU). The magnitude, scope, and effect of Team Europe investments are intended to grow through Global Gateway. The EU's investment will be more advantageous to the regions. EU's involvement with these states is in its strategic and commercial interests. The EU is a significant participant in the Indo-Pacific strategy of the US and India. The latest announcement of Bangladesh's 15-point "Indo-Pacific outlook" is the opposite. We are also aware of the connections between Bhutan and India.

While focusing on industries including digital systems, environmental goods, and services, the recent EU engagement can Deepen Linkages between South Asia and Southeast Asia analyzes innovative tactics for restoring trade and economic links between the two regions.

Gains in the gross domestic product (GDP) of South Asia of about 17.6% and Southeast Asia of about 15.7% would be notable. Nepal would benefit from this regional South Asia and Southeast Asia collaboration through collaborating on high priority projects. The availability of electricity in Nepal poses significant obstacles to the country's economic growth.

commerce and transit.

Improving road and rail connectivity between India, Bangladesh, and landlocked Nepal and Bhutan is essential to ensuring a smooth flow of goods and services. By reducing paperwork, enhancing risk management strategies to do away with physical inspections, facilitating cross-border movement, and upgrading sanitary and phytosanitary standards, business processes can be made more effective.

India, Bangladesh, and Nepal can develop unified electronic gateways with assistance from the EU, allowing importers and exporters to online submit their documentation. If these National Single Windows are to shorten clearing times, they require strong implementation support.

The development of the roads between integrated check stations and inland container depots will increase the efficiency of significant volumes of cross-border trade.

In order to close infrastructure gaps, it is necessary to build and upgrade internal and transnational highways, extend multimodal transportation networks, including roads and rails, and modernize infrastructure, including integrated border crossings.

In order to provide small company owners and female traders access to the market, South Asian countries should also adopt regional concepts like the border "haat" used at the India-Bangladesh and India-Myanmar border points.

To increase connection in the near future, it should be emphasized to build high-quality road infrastructure. Currently, it is crucial for transportation connections to upgrade the eastwest highway that connects the three major land ports of Birgunj, Biratnagar, and Bhairahawa.

High-quality road infrastructure may have a high starting cost. The long-term advantages of funding such large projects, however, exceed the short-term expenses. Numerous studies in high-, middle-, and low-income countries show a positive relationship between the state of the transportation system and economic expansion.

Transportation infrastructure is therefore essential since it serves as the primary driver of economic growth. All area stakeholders will be able to access substantial regional markets if they can build cutting-edge road and rail infrastructure.

By utilizing their economic corridors and concentrating on important industries, the BBIN countries may support the EU's engagement while also fostering intimate ties amongst their peoples to foster regional unity and integration.

EU involvement

Bangladesh, Japan, and India assembled in Tripura on April 11 and 12 to talk about connection initiatives that will aid the area in achieving its commercial potential. Japan is steadily approaching the area. We can now see the EU's interest in participation in the region

velopments. Meetings between Nepal and Bangladesh are scheduled to discuss bilateral energy trade and Bangladeshi investment in Nepal's hydropower industry. Due to the bilateral power exchange, Nepal is able to buy electricity from Bangladesh in the winter and sell its monopoly during the rainier seasons.

This increases the likelihood of expanding energy trade with Bangladesh and India. In this sense, the Bangladesh-India-Nepal Partnership, which aims to improve the quality of highways, increase the availability and dependability of power, and enable cross-border electrical trade between India, Nepal, and India, may enter a new age. To improve the region's competitiveness and close development disparities, Northeast India, Nepal, Bhutan, and Bangladesh should improve their multimodal connectivity.

The Northeastern Region (NER) being connected to the Bay of Bengal and Bangladesh through the establishment of an industrial value chain by the EU may significantly alter the geopolitical environment of the area.

With the opening of the Padma Bridge, Bangladesh's northern and southern regions are now easily accessible, removing two significant structural barriers to the development of a cross-border value chain.

A deep-sea harbor is being constructed by the country in far-east Asia at Matarbari in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh. The project, which is in the Indian state of Tripura near the Sabroom border, is anticipated to be finished in 2026.

Because Bangladesh and India are already building the necessary transportation infrastructure to connect Tripura and the NER to Chattogram port, the EU's involvement is great.

Therefore, it will be vital for all parties that this increased cooperation is implemented successfully. The region's security and tranquility will ultimately prevail. As a result, the collaboration can prove to be a unique opportunity for everyone to benefit from the revised EU strategy.

Through the involvement of the EU and bilateral power trade with Bangladesh, Nepal will have the opportunity to strengthen its ties with and engage in power commerce with, respectively, India and Bangladesh. India, Bhutan, Bangladesh, and Nepal stand to benefit from stronger ties with the EU.

When creating programs like the BBIN MVA, all stakeholders should be impartial and act in the region's best interests. The region has to move fast to complete high priority connectivity projects since they will have major macroeconomic benefits and generate thousands of new employment.

Screen Addiction WHAT PARENTS NEED TO KNOW

hildren enjoy playing games on their parents' smartphones or watching YouTube videos on those devices. The use of screens increased manifold during COVID-19 pandemic as children used screen for educational purposes as well as for dealing with the boredom of lockdown. Parents also find it easier to manage their children for a long period if they provide mobile phones to them due to their own busy schedule. However, this seemingly harmless tactic of engaging children can have damaging effects on the brain of children. Children have a danger of eventually being addicted to screens.

Screen addiction is a group of negative behaviors with negative outcomes that can occur when we use technology excessively throughout the day. Constantly playing video games, watching TV, or scrolling through social media functions as a kind of digital drug for our brain.

Dopamine released by using a screen might impair impulse control. Screen time, it turns out, has a similar impact on the frontal cortex of the brain as cocaine. Screen usage triggers a pleasure/reward cycle that, like drugs, can have a negative impact on your life. They can develop screen addiction disorder.

SCREEN ADDICTION DISORDER:

It is an addiction to screens, such as a computer, a phone, or a television. It also includes addiction to video games. Children can't control how much time they spend on screens, which can result in poor sleep hygiene, delayed speech, and poor social skills. Due to screen addiction, many even forget the regular routine of eating, studying, and other activities.

They may struggle to focus and pay attention, which results in a decline in interest in their studies. Due to their dependence on technology, they also struggle to memorise the lectures. SOME OF THE ADVERSE EFFECTS OF SCREEN USE INCLUDE:

Behavior issues: Children in elementary school who spend more than two hours a day watching TV or using a computer are more likely to experience emotional, social, and attention issues.

- Effect on sleep: Children of all ages, but particularly those under the age of ten, suffer from inadequate sleep as a result of spending too much time in front of screens, particularly on portable devices. Because screen light disrupts the brain's natural sleep cycle, it can cause insomnia.
- Effect on physical activity level and childhood obesity: Excessive TV watching habits have been linked to childhood obesity in several
- Effects on cognition and brain development: Research indicates that children who use screens for more than two hours a day do worse on

tests of language and thinking and receive lower grades. Speech delay.

- Cyberbullying and exposure to predators.
- Lack of physical activity causes body weight problems and poor bone health, which over time can lead to heart disease and other health problems.

Given that kids need to explore their surroundings and develop their motor abilities, screen time has a major negative effect on kids. If kids are glued to an electronic device the entire time, this movement for exploration and curious behavior won't occur.

SCREEN TIME RECOMMENDATIONS FOR KIDS: Based on research, following screen

time recommendations have been but forth:

- No screen time for babies under 6 months old.
- Children between the ages of six months and two years should only connect socially with adults or use screens for video chats with loved

No more than 2 hour per day of screen time for children ages 3 to 8. School-aged children: there is no defined time limit, but parents

should restrict gaming and social

media use.

- Sit together in family and discuss with kids the adverse effects of excessive screen use.
- Discuss with them the various alternative ways of enjoying free time and help them in making those alternatives available to
- Devise a family media policy and stick to it: If kids do not respect the policy limit access to or remove TVs, tablets, gaming consoles, and cell phones.
- Find out how much time your child spends online and what she posts or reads on social media. Some kids watch R-rated movies, acquire drugs, access pornography, go into

sex chat rooms, send nude images to boyfriends and girlfriends, cyberbully other kids, or get cyber bullied themselves. If you found out that your kid is involved in any such thing, install parental controls on all the gadgets they use.

- Inform adolescents that whatever they put out there online can harm them one way or the other so that they share the information online responsibly.
- Children's bedrooms should not have TV. TV in your child's bedroom raise the dangers of drug abuse, obesity, and exposure to sexual content.
- Discourage using electronics at the dinner table. The benefits of eating meals together are diminished if everyone is glued to their smartphones. Put your personal phone away and listen to your children instead.
- Set up desktop computers in the living room or another public space so you can keep an eye on their online activity.
- Don't allow phone use around bedtime, so that children may get a good night's rest.
- Look over the cell phone bill carefully for any unnoticed use of the internet. Again, if necessary, set restrictions or remove the device for a set time.

SEEK SUPPORT FROM MENTAL HEALTH

PROFESSIONALS: If you child has developed screen addiction and if you have tried all the parenting tips that were discussed above, then it warrants consultation with a clinical psychologist, who can help you devise a more scientific strategy to help you and your child deal with it. A clinical psychologist may try to understand the various predisposing, precipitating and maintaining factors that have led to screen addiction in your child's case. They can also try to understand what measures you, as a parent, have already exhausted to deal with the problem. Based on overall assessment, they can develop a treatment plan and implement it with the cooperation of

If screen addiction has become severe and if it has built up anxiety or mood issues, then it may also warrant services of a psychiatrist who can recommend medicines to deal with severe mood issues or withdrawal issues.



Stanford: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi has said that he did not imagine his disqualification from Lok Sabha was possible when he joined politics but asserted that it has given him a "huge opportunity" to serve the

Gandhi, who is in the US for a three-city US tour, made the remarks on Wednesday night in response to a series of questions from Indian students at the prestigious Stanford University Campus in California.

Wayanad (Kerala) Member of Parliament was disqualified from Lok Sabha earlier this year after he was convicted by a Surat court in a 2019 criminal defamation case over his "Modi surname" remark.

In his remarks, Gandhi said that when he joined politics in 2000, he never imagined this is what he would go through. What he sees is going on now is way outside anything that he had thought when he joined politics.

Referring to his disqualification from Lok Sabha as a Member of Parliament, Gandhi, 52. said he didn't imagine that something like this was possible.

"But then I think it's actually given me a huge opportunity. Probably much bigger than the opportunity I would have. That's just the way politics works," he said.

"I think the drama started really, about six months ago. We were struggling. The entire opposition is struggling in India. Huge financial dominance. Institutional capture. We're struggling to fight the democratic fight in our country," he said, adding that at this point in time, he decided to go for the Bharat Jodo Yatra'

"I am very clear, our fight is ours fight," he said. "But there is a group of young students from India here. I want to have a relationship with them and want to talk to them. It's my right to do it," he said during his interaction with Indian students and academicians of Indian origin at the University here.

He also emphasised in his frequent foreign trips like this, he is not seeking support from anybody.

"Whatsoever we can do and whatsoever we want to achieve to make the others comfortable, I think we are in a great shape to look after the interests of security within the Valley at this point," he said.

(of concern) on this side as well in Kashmir but it never happened," Lt Gen Aujla told PTI in an interview on Wednesday.

A certain amount of chatter and a certain amount of signature was being reported on the other side in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK), but it never translated into reality onto this side, he said.

"So, there was no infiltration of any Afghani Taliban... To that effect, we have been able to control (things)," he added.

Asked about the current situation in Pakistan and its effect on Kashmir, Lt Gen Aujla said the crisis in the neighbouring country was bound to happen.

"We are all aware of what is happening and the crisis is immense whether it is on the political, economic, social or military front, you name a space and there is a crisis on the other

"It was bound to happen the way the country was going, it was just a matter of time," he said. However, Lt Gen Aujla said infiltration and smuggling of narcotics and ammunition through the border remain areas of concern.

"What worries us or concerns us at this point in time, majorly nothing. But other than that, when we look at what the dynamics of Kashmir are. The physical manifestation of infiltration is what worries us, the narcotics being pushed across (the border) is what worries us and the ammunition which is sent across is what worries us," said the GOC, who has served several tenures in Jammu and Kashmir.

The Army is prepared to deal with any eventuality along the Line of Control (LoC), he said. Asked if there has been any activity on the

other side of the LoC after the political crisis in Pakistan, Lt Gen Aujla said, "Negative. We have not seen any major change."

Asked about the infiltration of militants from PoK, he said the intent of Pakistanis has not changed.

"The intent still remains very much the same. Given the opportunity, he (Pakistan) does not hesitate to infiltrate militants. While the intent has not changed, we have put certain measures in place. We are pretty robust and strong along the LoC and can take care of such

events," he said. Lt Gen Aujla said last year saw the lowest in-

filtration into the valley.
"I can assure you that till date, it is zero. We will try and keep it to the lowest levels in the months to come," he said.

S.O 145(E) is based on a order that is no longer valid and applicable, as such, the Ministry advised the Food Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Department, J&K to issue necessary directions to all concerned authorities to refrain from issuing or enforcing any order.

Now, the department while taking opinion from the central government has directed the authorities to refrain from regulating prices of mutton and other livestock products.

The government also revoked the Jammu and Kashmir Mutton (Licensing and Control) Order, 1973 issued vide SRO-646 issued on December 12, 1973 with immediate effect, saying it was done on the clarification from Government of India and inter-departmental consultations on the matter.

However, the order has created a lot of confusion in the public who maintain that the unregulated price of mutton will hit their pocket. "Who will regulate and check the price now,"

said Bilal Ahamd, a shopkeeper from Karan Nagar area of Srinagar city. He further said the butchers will increase the

rates as much as they like, since there is no one to regulate the price of mutton. However, Khazir Mohammad Regoo, the

President of Mutton Dealers Association Kashmir told Kashmir Observer that this will benefit both consumers and the dealers. "Earlier under the Act, there used to be few

people who would do the trade and the dealer would only have to buy the livestock from them. now we have the choice, and every butcher can go to other states and buy the livestock on his choice," Regoo said. While responding to a question, he said it

was due to the monopoly of a few dollars that the rates would be high from their end—thus impacting the pocket of the common public. 'Now that will not be the case, the issue

stands resolved once for all as the buyer would get the livestock at lower rates from the other states," he added. It may be noted, the butchers usually defv

the government orders and sell the mutton at 650-700 rupees per kg against the government notified price of 535 rupees. The authorities in this year launched a mas-

sive crackdown against the butchers and more than 140 mutton shops were sealed.

On an average, the J&K consumes 600 lakh kilograms of mutton annually; over 800 truckloads of sheep were consumed during the holy month of Ramadan this year.

21 December 2022 and the same was dismissed again on the ground that only three witnesses have been examined by the prosecution and that the statement of the victim was yet to be recorded.

"The petitioner (Ravi) is facing trial for offence under section 8 of the POCSO Act. The said offence carries maximum punishment of imprisonment of five years," the court said, adding, "As already noted, the petitioner has been in custody in the instant case since 24.04.2020, meaning thereby that he has spent more than three years in custody as on date."

The consideration of petitioner's plea for bail, the court said, cannot be deferred indefinitely simply because the prosecutrix/victim is keeping herself away from appearing in court. JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Chief Justice N Kotishwar Singh will visit a cow shelter in Nagrota on Friday to ascertain its condition after a PIL highlighted its poor condition.

An order to this effect was issued by a division bench, also comprising Justice Puneet Gupta, while hearing the PIL on Wednesday.

'We will visit the gaushala situated in village Seri Khurd, Nagrota on July 2... officers are directed to remain present at 4:30 pm at the aforesaid gaushala," the court order stated.

The court granted the respondents' counsel a week's time to respond to a report submitted by the petitioner in connection with the PIL.

The administration may also respond to the allegations levelled by the petitioner, it said. Advocate Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed, appearing for the petitioner, said the petitioner and advocate Supriya Chouhan visited the cow shelter in Seri Khurd on April 8 and saw that it was in a dilapidated condition.

The petitioner also submitted video evidence in the court. Ahmed told the court that the animals were locked up during the day in four sheds and not left open for grazing.

Jammu's Jambu Zoo Welcomes **Inmates Of 17 Species**

JAMMU: Days after its inauguration, Jambu Zoo here has welcomed inmates of 17 different species, including leopard, black bear, deer and birds, according to officials.

Situated on the outskirts of Jammu and spread over 3,200 kanals, Jambu Zoo was inaugurated on Sunday by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha after several delays since its conception in 2016.

One acre is equal to eight kanals. "We have 3.200 kanals of land. As far as the area is concerned, we will be considered among the big zoos. We have started out with 17 species of animals," Jambu Zoo Wildlife Warden Amit Sharma told PTI.

These species include leopards, peacocks, deer, nilgai, wild boars, swans and monkeys.

"In the coming days, we will



be introducing several species, which will bring us on par with other prominent zoos in the country," Sharma said.

The Central Zoo Authority (CZA) of India approved the concept plan for Jambu Zoo back in 2016 but the execution faced delays due to various reasons, according to officials.

"The project made headlines when it commenced in 2016-17 with funding from the Compensatory Afforestation Fund Management and Planning Authority. However, the funding was halted and we received

"Unfortunately, work was stalled for two years due to the Covid pandemic. We were determined to complete it as soon as possible and now we have dedicated it to the public," Sharma said.

The zoo also includes an open amusement theatre, a children's park and a small water body. To facilitate easy movement, battery-operated cars and bicycles are available for visitors

Rs 7 Cr Worth Narcotics Seized In Baramulla In 5 **Months: Police**

Says 217 Drug Peddlers Also Arrested

SRINAGAR: As many as 217 drug peddlers have been arrested and narcotics worth over Rs 7 crore recovered so far this year in Baramulla district of Jammu and Kashmir, police said on Thursday.

As part of its crackdown on drug peddling, the Baramulla police has registered 144 cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act in the first five months of this year, a police official said.

So far, 217 drug peddlers have been arrested. Twentythree of them, who are habitual drug peddlers, have been booked under the Prevention

of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PITNDPS) Act and the Public Safety Act (PSA).

Contraband worth crores of rupees in the black market has been recovered, according to the police.

The police official said 2.625 kg of brown sugar worth about Rs 3.41 crore and 2.419 kg of heroin worth Rs 3.14 crore in the black market have been recovered. Charas, poppy straw and cannabis powder have also been recovered.

The police also seized Rs 43.90 lakh in cash and 15 vehicles, he said. The total value of the recoveries made so far stands at Rs 7,69,91,000, the police said.

J&K Extends Timeline For Filing Of Property Tax Returns

SRINAGAR: Amid controversy over imposition of property tax in Jammu & Kashmir, the administration of Union Territory has extended the deadline for filing of property tax returns.

The Housing & Urban De-Department velopment (H&UDD) has amended the rules governing imposition of property tax in Jammu & Kashmir after the deadline for furnishing of property tax returns elapsed.

The amendment in the Rules governing imposition of property tax in Municipal Corporations and other Municipal Bodies state that the particulars of the property and the tax due thereon for the financial year 2023-24, shall be furnished by July 31, 2023.

"Provided that the particulars of the property and the tax due thereon for the financial year 2023-24, shall be furnished in Form-1 by July 31, 2023," reads proviso added to Rule 5 of "The Jammu and Kashmir Property Tax (Municipal Corporations) Rules 2023 and "The Jammu & Kashmir Property Tax (Other Municipalities) Rules, 2023".

The proviso has been added as the deadline for filing of property tax is May 30 of the financial year to which the returns pertains.

WTC Final: 'Aussies Should Be Wary Of Kohli'

LONDON: Australia will have to guard against the "thorn in their side" Cheteshwar Pujara and a "back at his best" Virat Kohli if they are to counter India in the World Test Championship final at The Oval next week, feels legendary cricketer Ricky Ponting.

India's Test batting mainstay Pujara could provide valuable insights to his teammates, having played extensively at Sussex in the English County Championship, while Kohli is at his absolute best having cracked two centuries and six half-tons for Royal Challengers Bangalore in the recently-concluded Indian Premier League.

"The Australian team will be talking about Virat, no doubt about it, and they'll be talking about Pujara. They're the two," Ponting said on 'The ICC Review'.

Pujara is known to relish the challenges thrown at him by Australian bowlers, having scored more Test runs and centuries against them than any other side, and his contribution would be crucial to India's chances of lifting the

WTC trophy in their second

"Pujara has been a thorn in their side a lot in the past, and in Australia, and this wicket will potentially be a lot more like an Australian pitch. They know that they'll have to get him early," opined the former Australian captain.

Pujara, who bats at No. 3, has 2,033 runs and five centuries in 24 Tests against Australia, and skipper Rohit Sharma will hope he makes a couple of more vital contributions for the side in the WTC final.

Kohli, apart from his sparkling form in the IPL, had smashed 186 in the fourth Test against Australia in March during the Border-Gavaskar Trophy and would be itching to have a go at the Pat Cum-

mins-led side.

"They also know that Virat over the last few weeks is probably just about back to his absolute best, albeit in T20 cricket. He told me that the feeling he's getting right now is that he's almost back to his best, and that's an ominous warning for the Australians going into a one-off game," said Ponting.

Ponting is also mightily impressed with young Shubman Gill's performance in the IPL and the 23-year-old's exploits in the last two Tests of the Border-Gavaskar series.

Gill hit three centuries for Gujarat Titans in IPL.

"He looks like a terrific young guy. He's got that bit of attitude about him as well. He's got a bit of swagger. He has some serious class. That sort of front-foot pull shot that he plays against the fast bowlers will be a shot that he'll probably need against this Australian attack," said Ponting.



Lionel Messi Set To Leave PSG, Confirms Coach

PARIS: Lionel Messi will leave Paris Saint-Germain at the end of the season after two years at the club, coach Christophe Galtier said Thursday.

Galter said ahead of PSG's game against Clermont on Saturday that it would be Messi's last match at the Parc des Princes. Messi's contract expires at the end of June.

"I had the privilege of coaching the best player in the history of soccer," Galtier said. "This will be his last match at the Parc des Princes, and I hope that he will receive the warmest of welcomes." PSG recruited Messi in August 2021 with the ambition to finally win the Champions League. The team is still waiting.

Although PSG won its 11th French league title this year, it again exited Europe's top tournament in the round of 16.

Messi's adventure in France has been bitter sweet. In spite of pretty good statistics, he has been embodying the team's shortcomings in the view of many PSG fans who have repeatedly whistled and booed his name in recent weeks.

After struggling to adapt to the French league — the seventime Ballon d'Or winner scored only six league goals in his first 26 games — Messi has improved this season as he developed an efficient understanding with forward Kylian Mbappe.

MS Dhoni Undergoes Successful Knee Surgery In Mumbai
